MATCH PREVIEW

Sounders FC 2 (3-10-2, 11 points) and Reno 1868 FC (8-3-7, 31 points) on Sunday will play the second of two matches this season (1:30 p.m. PT / ESPN+). The clubs played to a 1-1 draw on May 19 in Reno.

In the first meeting, with the away side down 1-0, David Estrada netted the equalizer in the 71st minute, his fourth goal of the season. Jesse Daley was credited with the assist, his first with the club in just his second appearance. The result snapped a two-game losing streak for Seattle. Jerry van Ewijk scored the lone goal of the match for Reno in the 60th minute.

S2 is in 16th place in the Western Conference, while Reno sits in fourth. Seattle on Sunday will attempt to snap a three-game losing stretch, while Reno is riding a three-game winning streak.

LAST MATCH RECAP

Sounders FC 2 (3-10-2, 11 points) controlled possession by a 66 percent margin on Thursday evening, with goalkeeper Calle Brown saving his first penalty kick of the season, but the home side fell to the visiting Swope Park Rangers (9-4-4, 31 points), 2-0, at Cheney Stadium.

Swope Park took an early advantage in the 10th minute when Felipe Hernandez received the ball just beyond the 18-yard-box, flicked it off the ground and volleyed it into the near side of the net to give Rangers a 1-0 lead. S2 created plenty of chances in the first 45 minutes, with three shots, three corners and owned the majority of possession, but were unable to find an equalizer.

Swope Park had an opportunity to extend its lead in the 60th minute, but Brown instinctively dove to his right, parried Hadji Barry's shot wide and kept the first penalty attempt he had seen all year out of the back of the net. Rangers were awarded another penalty in the 65th minute and Barry converted it to make it 2-0 Swope Park.

S2 continued to dominate possession and created constant pressure during the final segment of the match, but the home side couldn't capitalize.

NARBON UNDERGOES SUCCESSFUL SURGERY

Following an injury suffered in Thursday night's match in Tacoma versus Swope Park Rangers, S2 midfielder Francisco Narbón underwent surgery at Virginia Mason Medical Center in downtown Seattle on Friday evening to repair fractures to his right tibia and fibula. The procedure was performed by Dr. David J. Belfie of Virginia Mason Orthopedics and Sports Medicine.

Narbon, 23, is in his second season with S2 and has made 11 appearances with the club in 2018, including 10 starts. He has played 35 games over the last two seasons for S2 and recorded one goal and one assist. A native of Panama City, Narbon has made two appearances for Panama's national team.

CHENKAM ENTERS USL LOAN AGREEMENT

Ahead of S2's home match this Sunday vs. Reno 1868 FC (1:30 p.m. PT / ESPN+), MLS has entered into a Standard USL Loan Agreement for forward Felix Chenkam. This agreement contains a right of recall for MLS, which enables Chenkam to play for a USL side and MLS club throughout the duration of the loan period, subject to MLS roster compliance guidelines.

Chenkam signed a First Team contract with Sounders FC on May 25 after scoring four goals in 19 appearances for S2 in 2018, and this USL Loan Agreement now makes the Cameroonian forward eligible once again for selection by Head Coach John Hutchinson.

S2 HEAD COACH JOHN HUTCHINSON

On Thursday's match against Swope Park:

“It was a really tough one for our players. The elephant in the room is obviously [Francisco] Narbon. The poor guy has got a broken leg, pretty horrible tackle to be fair. I don't know how many of our players have actually played on a field where someone's broken their leg. You could see they were affected by it. We tried to change things at halftime, it just wasn't meant to be. The second penalty was outside the box, it's clear as day. Probably the only mistake the referee made, to be fair to him. He had a good game today.

“The game kind of takes a side step away because we've lost a player for the season, a real good guy, good teammate to the players. They all called him 'Papa' because they all looked up to him. He's one of our older players at 23 years old. It's just devastating. You've seen the boys' faces, when they went over they knew what happened to him. It was pretty real for them. For the majority of my squad, it was their first time seeing someone break their leg on the park. All the boys are devastated for Tito. The coaching staff are hurting. For me, the game just takes a back seat today.

“The result is not what we wanted. We played okay in patches. We tried to create, we tried to go for it. But you could see they were just a little bit off tonight after Tito went down. Their first goal kind of just came against the run of play. And then after it happened, you just kind of wish take them all off and move on to Sunday.”

S2 MOVES TO TACOMA

Seattle Sounders FC and the Tacoma Rainiers announced on November 1, 2017 that beginning in 2018, Sounders FC 2's previously-announced transition to Tacoma is accelerating, allowing S2 to play its home matches at Cheney Stadium, while progress continues toward a new soccer-specific facility. Earlier in 2017, the two clubs reached a historic agreement to build a 5,000-seat facility in Central Tacoma on the footprint of Cheney Stadium. While that process moves forward, South Sound soccer fans are now able to see their USL side play in Tacoma several seasons ahead of schedule.

"Our organization was already thrilled to be moving ahead with the Rainiers and the City of Tacoma on the new stadium project, but when we learned of the opportunity to begin playing USL games as soon as 2018 in a facility like Cheney Stadium, we embraced the chance," said Sounders FC Owner Adrian Hanauer. "From Rainiers leadership to the many civic officials in Tacoma that are working hard to deliver professional soccer to their city, we're humbled to have such willing partners in this effort. As soon as next season, fans can enjoy a first-class experience at Cheney, allowing the club to make a tangible connection to the City of Tacoma earlier than expected."

Originally announced in May of 2017, the partnership brings together two of the Northwest's premier professional sports organizations to reach a first-of-its-kind relationship in USL within the same regional market. The Tacoma Rainiers are an award-winning franchise that has been a staple of the South Sound community for over 50 years, operating as the top affiliate of Major League Baseball's Seattle Mariners. They will operate the business side of the new era of the USL club, taking advantage of the decades of experience operating a professional organization in the Tacoma market, while Sounders FC is set to maintain leadership over soccer operations and sporting infrastructure. With key details coming together - including a name for the organization that is representative of its new home - it was announced today that much like the naming of the Sounders FC First Team, Tacoma fans will have influence over the identity of their new club. Details for that process are forthcoming, with the team to play under the S2 brand in the near-term during this transition.
