PREVIEW

Indiana's Team started the season on the front foot after downing Memphis 901 FC 4-2 on the road in the regular season opener on March 7. Memphis took an early two-goal lead in the first stanza, but Eleven defender Ayoze managed to narrow the deficit after burying a shot from outside Memphis' penalty box three minutes into first-half stoppage time. That proved to be the catalyst for a comeback in the second half, with forward Tyler Pasher putting two goals past Memphis goalkeeper Tim Howard in the 69th and 72nd minutes, both of which were assisted by newcomer Nick Moon. Defender Carl Haworth hammered in the final nail in the coffin with Indy's fourth goal of the evening, his first since joining the squad last December, in the 83rd minute.

Saint Louis FC also found success in their 2020 opener, touting a 4-1 win at home against league newcomers The Miami FC. Much like Memphis, Saint Louis gained an early lead with goals from Kyle Greig (10') and Russell Cicerone (21') before conceding one at the edge of the first half. However, a comeback was not in the cards for the visitors, as Tyler Blackwood (77') and Cicerone (90+2') tacked on two more for STL. After finishing last year in the first spot out of the Eastern Conference's 10-team postseason, the strong start was just what Saint Louis needed – especially considering the tough Group E draw that will see only two teams advance to the 2020 Playoffs.

NEWS & NOTES

2020 USL Championship Regular Season Records Table

Indy Eleven: 1W-OL-OD, 3 pts. (+2 GD), 2nd in Group E Saint Louis FC: 1W-OL-OD, 3 pts. (+3 GD), 1st in Group E

SERIES HISTORY: IND: 1W-1L-0D STL: 1W-1L-0D

The two-game series against Saint Louis FC last season ended in a split decision, with each side taking the spoils while holding homefield advantage, 1W-1L-0D.

Indiana's Team traveled to St. Louis for the 2019 season opener last year, falling 2-1 at full time. Neveal Hackshaw opened the game, but one goal would not be enough to get a result after two quick-hitters from St. Louis came in the last 20 minutes of the contest.

Indy welcomed Saint Louis FC to Lucas Oil Stadium for the return fixture on August 18. Fortunes were swapped this time out, with Indiana's Team deemed the winners by the same 2-1 scoreline. Indy opened the scoring late in the game via substitute striking pair Tyler Pasher and Dane Kelly. Saint Louis spoiled Indy's chance for a clean sheet when Lewis Hilton collected an unassisted goal at the death.

Newton USLC's Victory & Shutout King (and "Save-ior")

With every outing this year, goalkeeper Evan Newton will look to pad his USL Championship career leads in a trio of categories. The Virginia Beach native enters Saturday night as the league's all-time leader with 47 shutouts, 447 saves, and 64 wins (career record 64W-44L-38D).

A Comeback for the Ages

Indy Eleven did itself no favors by going into a 0-2 hole within the first 20 minutes in its season-opener at Memphis 901 FC back on March 7 ... but it did set Indiana's Team up for some club history. The 4-2 win allowed the club to rewrite a few club records, including:

- Most goals scored during the USL Championship era (72 regular season & postseason games)
- Most goals scored in an away match in club history
- First win in club history after being down two goals

The game was also the first in 121 regular season and postseason league outings in which Indy Eleven notched at least four goals in a game, dating back to a 5-2 win over Jacksonville Armada FC on Aug. 3, 2016. In fact, the only two other times in which the Eleven scored at least four goals also came during that 2016 NASL campaign – a 4-2 win over Minnesota United FC on May 21, 2016, and the "Miracle at the Mike" 4-1 triumph over the then-Carolina RailHawks (now North Carolina FC) on June 11, 2016.

Familiar faces, familiar places

Indy Eleven midfielder Drew Conner's name has appeared on Saint Louis FC's roster in recent history, having made 12 appearances for the Cave State side in 2016 while on loan from Chicago Fire SC (MLS).

Pasher on Front Foot

Since we mentioned Pasher, the Canadian attacker lived up to the lofty expectation heaped upon him prior to the 2020 campaign by scoring the equalizing and winning goals in the season opener at Memphis. Pasher is one of four players in the USL Championship sitting on a pair of goals (including Saint Louis FC striker Russell Cicerone) and sits one behind league leader Rufat Dadashov of Phoenix.

Moon Shot Assists

It took just 27 minutes off the bench for Nick Moon to register a pair of assists (both on Tyler Pasher finishes). The former Lansing Ignite midfielder is one of just three Championship players with multiple assists heading into the league's restart, joining reigning MVP and assist leader, Phoenix Rising FC forward Solomon Asante, and one of this weekend's foes, Saint Louis FC midfielder Todd Wharton.

A Glass Two-Thirds Full

For the first time in his three seasons with Indy Eleven, Head Coach Martin Rennie enters a campaign with more familiar faces than new ones, as 16 of the 24 rostered players on Opening Day 2020 are returning from the 2019 edition. With that, the bulk of the production is also back for Indiana's Team...

Minutes: The 16 returning players represent 77% of the minutes logged in 2019 (28,516 of 36,822 played, to be exact). Only two Boys in Blue that played over 1,000 minutes last season – Dane Kelly (2,258) and Thomas Enevoldsen (1,716) – are not returning in 2020.

Goals: Players tallying 30 of the 48 goals scored last year return in 2020, including breakout leading goal scorer Tyler Pasher (13). While Kelly and Enevoldsen combined for 15 of the 18 goals lost, Indy does bring back five players other than Pasher who tallied multiple goals last year – Ayoze (3), Karl Ouimette (3), Drew Conner (2), Ilija Ilic (2) and Neveal Hackshaw (2). Assists: A total of 70% of Indy Eleven's contributed assists (26 of 37) return, including co-leaders Ayoze and Kenney Walker (5 each). Pasher (4), Macauley King, (3), Paddy Barrett (3), Ilic (2) and Tyler Gibson (2) are other multi-assist men who are returning from a year ago.

Coaching Staff: Consistency on the sideline is just as important as it is on the field, and to that extent Indiana's Team will be returning 100% of its braintrust. Head Coach Martin Rennie and Goalkeeper Coach Andy Swift are both back for their third seasons on the Eleven sideline, while Assistant Coaches Juan Guerra and Phil Presser return for their second seasons on the Indy bench.

After making his Boys in Blue regular season debut on March 9 in Indy's 2019 season opener against Saint Louis FC, Newton was head coach Martin Rennie's first call between the posts throughout the season, finishing with nine clean sheets and an impressive 0.94 goals against average in 27 starts. After earning back-to-back clean sheets in early May against North Carolina FC and the Tampa Bay Rowdies, Newton tied and surpassed Odisnel Cooper's record of 40 career USL Championship career shutouts and eventually ended the season with 47 career clean sheets - a mark that could have been improved upon were his season not ended due to injury in September.

GOALKEEPER

After missing most of 2018 recovering from a shoulder injury. Farr experienced his first professional minutes with Indy Eleven in 2019 - beginning with a surprise early substitute appearance in Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup action on May 15 that saw him shut down Lansing Ignite FC for the final 70 minutes of a 1-0 win. Farr would go on to make 12 appearances (10 starts) in USL Championship action, starting 10 games and posting an incredibly efficient and impressive five clean sheets, 80 percent save rate and 0.66 goals against average. Farr second stint in place of the injured Newton include the final three starts of the regular season and stints between the posts for all three USL Championship Playoff contests, during which he shut out New York Red Bulls II and Nashville SC and blanked Louisville City FC deep into stoppage time of the Eastern Conference Final, an eventual 3-1 defeat.

Ayoze notched three goals and a team co-leading five assists in 31 starts en route to playing the third most minutes (2,839) among his teammates. The wily veteran was at his best when setting up his teammates, finishing fifth in the league on chances created (87). The steady left-sided maestro joined Tyler Pasher as the squad's only three-time USL Team of the Week honorees (Weeks 4, 11 & 28). In his first year with Indiana's Team, Ayoze was just as effective, scoring four times and assisting on eight goals across 29 appearances (28 starts) in helping the Eleven to the USL postseason.

Ouimette built off his solid first season with Indy Eleven by being a fixture in the Starting IX in 2019, finishing sixth on the team with 29 starts. Quimette remained a dominant defender, leading the team in duels won with 230, along with finishing in second in clearances (94) and blocks (17). The Canadian also finished in the top-five for the team in interceptions (36) and tackles (53). Ouimette was also a surprising help on the offensive end, his three goals including a side-winding effort against New York Red Bulls II that sealed Indy's 1-0 victory in the USL Championship Playoffs Eastern Conference Quarterfinals at Carroll Stadium on Oct. 26. The three goals equaled Ouimette's offensive output during his first season with Indy in 2018, during which he started 32 of the squad's 35 contests.

Antley made 26 starts for USL League One's South Georgia Tormenta FC in 2019, earning the USL League One's Defender of the Year award. The 24-year-old enters his first season with Indy Eleven after an exciting first full professional season with Tormenta FC, in which he recorded six goals, six assists and 34 chances created. The athletic defender showed his skills with 49 interceptions, which finished tied for third among USL League One defenders.

A graduate of Mercer University, Antley led the Bears to two Southern Conference championships and NCAA Tournament appearances, along with being named to the conference's All-League First Team twice. A former member of Sounders FC U23, the affiliate of MLS squad Seattle Sounders, Antley moved to Tormenta FC's USL League Two side in 2018 before his recent Defender of the Year season with their USL League One outfit.

A Trinidad and Tobago native, Hackshaw gave Indy Eleven fans quite the first impression in 2019, scoring in his debut on March 9 at Saint Louis FC. Hackshaw made 30 starts during his first year with the club, finishing fifth on the team in minutes (2,730), third in clearances (88) and tied for second in interceptions (41). The defender also made an impact offensively with two goals and one assist.

Hackshaw made 82 appearances with USL Championship side Charleston Battery from 2016-18, starting 32 of 33 appearances, scoring one goal and two assists during his last season in Black and Yellow in 2018. 

INDY ELEVEN HEAD COACH MARTIN RENNIE - JULY 9, 2020

On returning to play for the first time since March 7 ...

"It's exciting to be back. I think this week's been fun preparing for a game and actually knowing we have a game. Obviously during this lockdown, we have haven't had a friendly game against another club or anything, we've just been training internally. It's kind of like the beginning to the season again I suppose, but even better than that because of all of the uncertainty we've had for months."

On the squad progression since lifting the training moratorium...

"The players have progressed well over the last few weeks. When we had a break, when we were in absolute lockdown, the guys really did work hard on their own. So, when we were able to start training a little bit, they were already quite fit for the most part. That helped us a lot to be strong, be ready and to train quite hard."

"We played an inter-squad scrimmage last weekend and the data we collected was as high as a normal game would have been in terms of the players' running, high intensity running, sprints and recovery times. We are in a good place and we're looking forward to the game on Saturday."

On the behind the scenes work of the performance staff...

"(Head Athletic Trainer) Meeja Kinsey and (Athletic Performance Manager) Sam Joyce have had really important roles to play. I think a lot of what we've worked on is prevention of injuries and making sure everyone is as healthy as they can be – that the players don't get sick or pick up any injuries. We have done a lot of strength work, so [Meeja and Sam] have to do a lot of prehabilitation work so the players are ready to go out on the training field. They have also been individualizing some of the workouts for guys that need help or extra work."

"Meeja has spent a lot of time testing, recording temperatures, collecting questionnaires and all sorts of other things related to our COVID-19 procedures. They have both been busy and doing much more work than they would normally have to do; I suppose everybody has. It has been a lot of work for everyone, but it's starting to pay off."

On Group E pairing...

"I think it's an exciting group, one of the strongest groups in the league. It gives us a good balance of competitive games, a lot of home games – which is very nice – and fairly well-spaced out games considering how short the season is. Overall, I think it's going to be a good group, one we're looking forward to"

"We have high hopes and expectations for the season. The season's been disrupted from where we were planning in the beginning, but now we're just excited to get the chance to play again."

"The thing that's interesting about this season is that it's a 'squad' game, the whole squad is going to be really important. We are playing a lot in a short space of time, so it's important that everyone in our squad is excited and ready to play, which they all seem to be. We have a lot of players that can come in and help us, that is a key factor."
