TONIGHT'S OPPONENT

Houston Dynamo

After missing the playoffs for the first time in club history last year, the Houston Dynamo have had an up and down start to the 2011 campaign, their first in the Eastern Conference. Under the stewardship of Dominic Kinnear, the Dynamo have proven to be a difficult team to break down defensively while some timely goal scoring has kept them in games all season long.

The primary source of goals this year has been Will Bruin, Houston's first round SuperDraft pick out of Indiana. A big and physical presence in front of goal, Bruin burst onto the scene with a hat trick in his team's 4-1 win over D.C. United last month, shooting to the top of the league's scoring chart. He has spent much of the season paired alongside Cam Weaver, another physical forward who scored against the Galaxy in this game last season, giving Kinnear a pair of bruising forwards to lead the attack.

That attack could be further bolstered by the return to health of Brian Ching, the Dynamo's original battering ram of a forward, and the leading scorer in club history. Limited to just a handful of games because of injury this season, the Hawaii-native remains a threat despite turning 33-year-old yesterday. Houston also recently acquired Spanish forward Koke, who scored his first goal for the club on Saturday vs. New York, from Greek club Aris, giving them a quartet of forwards that can strike fear into opposing defenses throughout MLS.

While that group is in charge of getting the goals, their task has been aided greatly by the form of Brad Davis. Possessing one of the best left feet in the history of the league, Davis has been in fine form this year collecting six assists and a goal in his first 11 games. No longer an out and out winger, Davis is not afraid to take on defenders or even strike the ball from distance in order to get the ball onto his preferred left foot, meaning that Sean Franklin and the rest of the Galaxy defense will need to be cognizant of where he is at all times.

The same can be said of midfielder Geoff Cameron, the Dynamo's driving force in the center of midfield. Now in his fourth season, Cameron is finally settled in one position, he was used in defense and up front as well as in the midfield in the past, and appears to be returning to full form after suffering a serious knee injury early last year.

At the other end of the field, Tally Hall has been one of the top goalkeepers in MLS this season, allowing more than one goal just twice while producing a series of sensational saves. In front of Hall, the quartet of Corey Ashe, Andre Hainault, Bobby Boswell and Hunter Freeman has been nearly ever-present, with that group starting nine of the first 10 games of the year.

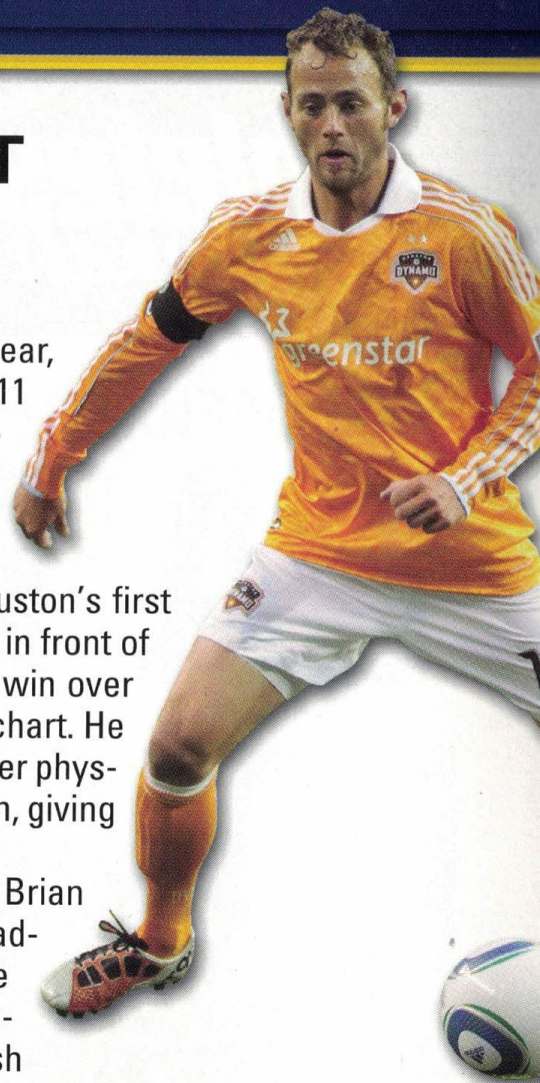
Games between these sides are typically close, physical encounters and tonight's matchup is shaping up to be just the same.

Key Man: Brad Davis

Few players possess a more lethal left foot than the Dynamo's dynamic midfielder and now in his 10th MLS season, Brad Davis is starting to take full advantage of that weapon. The 29-year-old set up all three of his team's goals in the 3-1 win over Vancouver and had another two assists against D.C. United to set the early pace for the most assists in MLS. While Davis is a threat whipping crosses in from the wing, he is also a threat on set pieces, both crossing the ball and shooting at goal. However, he has not experienced much success of late against the Galaxy, scoring just one goal and failing to tally an assist in his last eight games against LA. •

The LA Galaxy continued their dominance of Chivas USA with a 1-0 win in the first leg of the SuperClasico on Saturday night at The Home Depot Center. Chad Barrett scored the game's only goal midway through the first half to help the Galaxy stretch their regular season unbeaten streak against Chivas USA to nine games and 11 games in all competitions.

Playing in front of a capacity crowd, the Galaxy maintained possession for much of the opening 20 minutes, limiting the chances that Chivas USA had at one end of the field while Omar Gonzalez went close with a header in the 15th minute.

Donovan Ricketts, back after missing a game because of an illness, made his first save of the game in the 22nd minute, reaching out to corral Alejandro Moreno's low, left-footed shot from close range.

Barrett put the Galaxy in front four minutes later with his third goal of the season. A.J. DeLaGarza was fouled 30 yards from the Chivas goal on the left wing, giving David Beckham an opportunity to whip a freekick into the box for Barrett, whose flicked header beat Dan Kennedy inside his left post, giving LA a 1-0 lead.

Barrett nearly had his second early in the second half when Juan Pablo Angel put him through alone on goal. Barrett did well to round Kennedy, but he could not put his shot on frame and the score stayed 1-0.

The closest that Chivas would come to equalizing was in the 65th minute when Ben Zemanski beat Ricketts with a left-footed volley from the top of the box, only to see his shot carom off the post and out for a goal kick. Despite going close, the hosts could not find a breakthrough and were shutout by the Galaxy for the fifth time in the last six meetings.

Considered to be one of the Galaxy's most athletic, versatile and consistent defender since arriving at the club in 2008, Sean Franklin has been the epitome of that in this his fourth season. One of just three players to appear in all 13 of the club's games this season, Franklin has shown his versatility by playing in both the midfield as well as at right back, he has shown his athleticism by marauding up and down the right flank all season, terrorizing opposing defenders while also helping to contain some of the league's top wingers such as Joel Lindpere of New York, Seattle's Steve Zakuani and many others.

Now preparing for another of the league's top wide players in the Dynamo's Brad Davis, we caught up with Franklin to see what he thought about his season so far, the club's upcoming run of games and of course, tonight's game.

Here is what he had to say...

We're just more than a third of the way through the season, how do you feel that your season has gone so far?

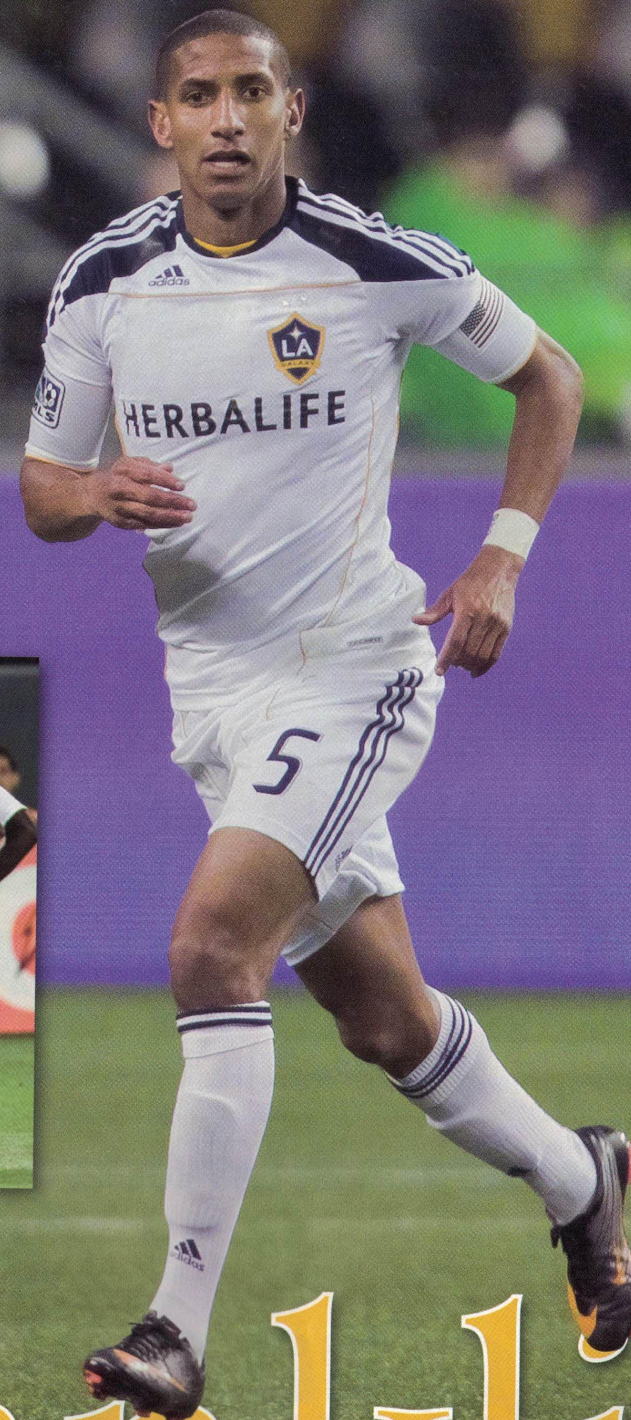
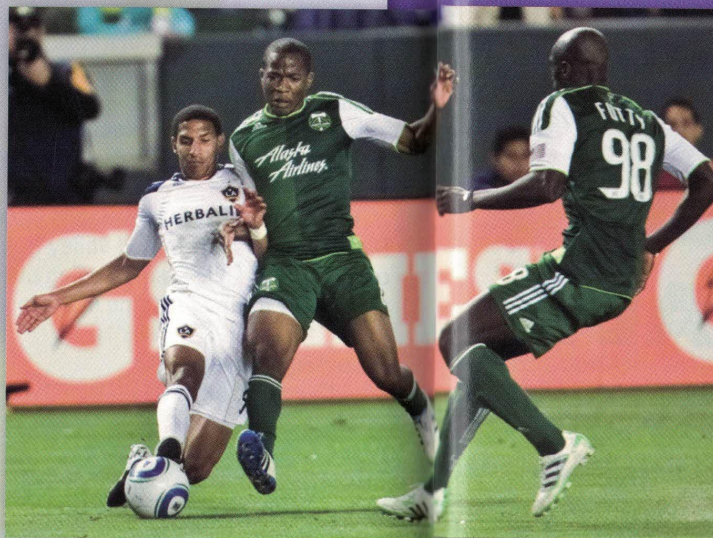
"It's going okay. It's not as good as I would like it on a personal level, I feel that last year I started off really well, got a couple of assists, and that got me going. This year's it's been a bit of a slow start but I'm hoping to begin to pick it up."

At this point of the season last year you already had a handful of assists. Are you surprised that you still do not have one this year?

"I feel like I'm getting forward as much if not more than I did last year, it's just once I get there, being more productive and being more accurate with my passing. Hopefully if I can do that, an assist or two will come."

You played a few games earlier this season on the right side of midfield, do you prefer that to right back?

"I like both spots. I like being in the midfield because it gives me a chance to get into a scoring position more often. I actually had a few chances to score earlier this year, chances that I should have out away, but that is something that over time I need to get better at."

Ever since Leonardo's injury the team has used the same back four with you on the right, Todd on the left and Omar and A.J. in the middle. How much has that consistency helped?

"When you play with the same set of guys over a certain period, you start to know each other's movements and read each other. Our back four has been playing well all season and even when we have made changes and brought guys in, they've been on the same pace. I feel that collectively, we're all there with one another."

Donovan Ricketts will be playing his final home game with the club tonight before departing for the Gold Cup. How much faith do you and the rest of the team have



in Josh and what is the difference between having him or Donovan back there?

"The only difference is skin color! They're both outstanding goalies. I believe that Josh could start on any team in this league and it's true that we don't have a number one and a number two goalie, we have two number ones. For him to come in [against Kansas City] having

not played since the beginning of the season, he was right there and played well. He is a confident guy and we have confidence in him."

What will the team need to do in order to be successful while Landon and Donovan are away for the Gold Cup?

"It's going to be important for guys to come in and step up and I feel that we have a roster that we can bring guys in and they will show well. As much as we would love to have those guys here with us, they're going to be representing their countries and we wish all the best to them. But their absence just gives another opportunity to the next guy to come in, get some minutes and play well."

Coming off the emotional win over Chivas USA, do you think that it will be hard to get up for tonight's game?

"It's important to get up for every game. We were up for and hyped for the game against Chivas, but now we have to stay focused for the next game. But I don't think that will be a problem tonight. This is a home game, we're playing in front of our fans and if you get up for your fans then you shouldn't be playing. We'll be ready for this one."

Finally, you had three assists in two games against the Dynamo last season including two at The Home Depot Center. Do you think that you have might get your first of the season tonight?

"Hopefully. It would be nice." •

Who spends the most time in the training room and the gym: Besides me? I'd say Juan in the training room and it's between Brian Perk and Michael Stephens in the gym.

Funniest teammate: I enjoy the comedy that surrounds Jovan. There is always something with him.

Loudest teammate: Jovan.

Quietest teammate: Ricketts. He says a bunch of nonsense so that he can be heard, but he's usually pretty quiet.

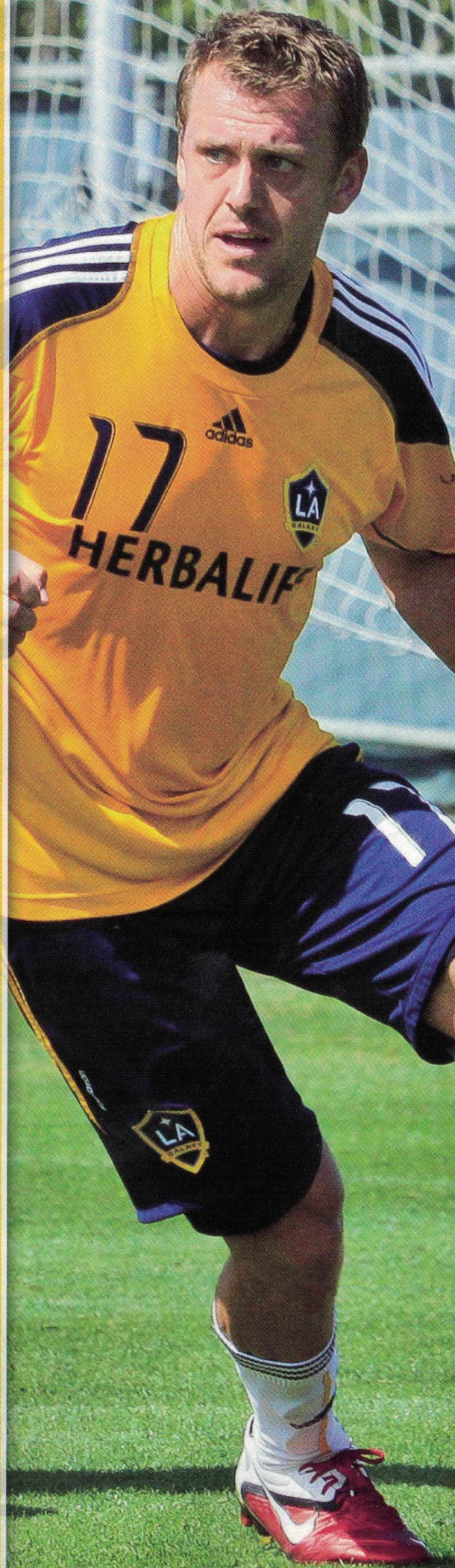
Last song played on your iPod: Probably something from the Kooks. The whole Inside Out album is good, especially Seaside and Naïve.

Toughest defender that you have faced: I hate playing against Chad Marshall. He a big, strong guy and when you try to post him up he is tough to get around.

Toughest part of being injured: You're not fully connected to the team and dealing with the frustration of wanting to be on the field playing. There is a certain rhythm that you get into during the season and it's harder to get into that when you're not going to be on the field.

Biggest difference between the East Coast and West Coast: The whole California soft idea is starting to kick in. People's expectations of the weather are crazy, they think they should be able to go to the beach every day. It rains a couple of days all year here where I'm used to it raining a couple of times a week. Everything is also so subtle and the history and culture are different with Colonial America vs. Westward Expansion.

Reaction to being traded to the Galaxy: I was very excited. It was an opportunity to play with a lot of great players for a great team in an environment that is probably the most professional in terms of the stadium, training staff and how the team is taken care of. All of that made for an exciting move and now I just want to get out on the field. •



In the span of just a few days earlier this month, the Galaxy announced that the club would host Real Madrid and Manchester City in friendlies this summer, but also that MLS Cup would once again return to The Home Depot Center this fall.

The first game to come up on the calendar will be a rematch against Real Madrid on Saturday, July 16 at the Los Angeles Coliseum. Fresh off their Copa del Rey championship and a semifinal berth in the Champions League, Jose Mourinho will bring his

star-studded lineup back to Southern California to face the Galaxy for the second straight season. Madrid erased a 2-0 halftime deficit to beat the Galaxy 3-2 last year in front of more than 89,000 fans at the Rose Bowl and this

year's game promises to be just as exciting.

Eight days later, the Galaxy will face one of the new, up-and-com-

ing powers of world soccer, Manchester City, at The Home Depot Center. The first Premier League team to play the Galaxy since Chelsea did in 2007, City won the

FA Cup this season and qualified for the Champions League for the first time in club history. Led by manager Roberto Mancini and a plethora of top international stars, City will be looking to unseat their bitter rivals Manchester United at the top of the table next season and win the Premier League title for the first time in club history.

Both games are part of the Herbalife World Football Challenge.

Finally, the 2011 MLS season will come to an end in Carson for the fourth time as MLS Cup returns to The Home Depot Center on Saturday, November 20. The league's 16th champion will be crowned with the Galaxy aiming to become the

first team to lift the Cup in front of their home fans since 1997.

Tickets for all three games are available now through select ticket three-packs which start at just \$71. Single game tickets for the Real Madrid match at the Coliseum are on sale now with the other two games scheduled to go on sale soon.

One of the original members of the Galaxy Academy, midfielder Riley Wolfe has played in more Academy SuperClasico's than just about anybody. But with high school graduation on the horizon and a scholarship to play college soccer at Duke University in hand, the Manhattan Beach native and U.S. Under-18 National Team veteran played Chivas USA for the final time before heading off to start his college career.

We caught up with Wolfe before last Saturday's game to talk about what it means to represent the Galaxy against Chivas USA and to reminisce about some of his favorite memories from past SuperClasicos.

What is your best memory from a SuperClasico?

"It was away at their place and I crossed the ball to Reed Williams for a goal. I remember his parents were sitting next to my parents and all their fans were just heckling me the entire time. I was playing right mid, picked him out with a cross and whacked it home hard, into the back of the net, just beyond their goalie.

He hadn't scored in quite a while so for him it was a big goal. We actually won that game, it was a huge win for us and it felt great. That was probably one of my best memories.

"I also remember in a [U-18] game that I was not playing in, our keeper actually scored a goal, which is flukiest thing I could ever think of. It was over on University 2. Billy Thompson, he goes to LMU now, kicked it and their goalie was off his line too far bounced right over and it went in. That was a pretty funny, fluke goal that I'll always remember. It was embarrassing for them, but it felt good for us."

Do you remember your first SuperClasico?

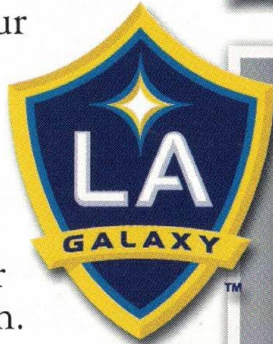
"That was the first time that I can remember being in the Academy and really feeling a rivalry. We had played a few games like that, but nothing compared to the intense crowd, and the feeling that everything mattered so much. Everyone was so involved.

People had shirts made with the SuperClasico logo, the fans were making all kinds of noise and heckling every person they can in Spanish and English and everything. I would say that's one of my bigger learning experiences. When you have that environment, you have people really competing like that and really feeling that you have to beat these guys because they're your biggest rivals. It kind of puts everyone in this whole different mode where everything is done without thought. Everything has to be done right and you have to beat these guys. It's more of a battle and everything is so much more extreme. Every tackle is harder and everything just feels more intense. It's really a big learning experience."

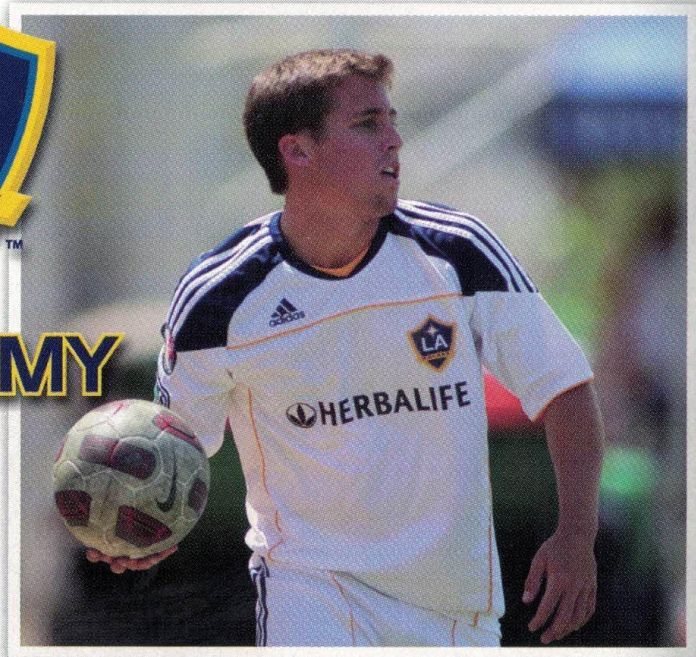
Do you have to raise your game to a new level with each SuperClasico?

"I think I've been around long enough that I've actually learned a lot. I know most of their players, I know who I'm going to be playing against. I know that he's going to be playing left

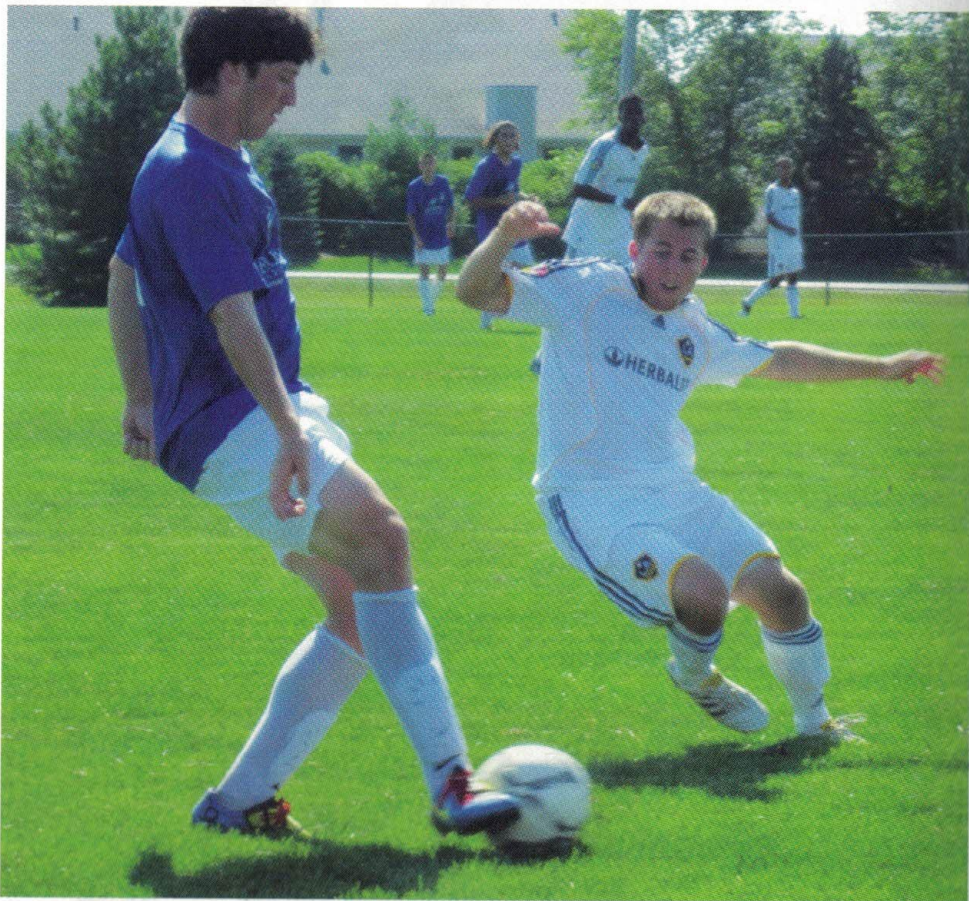
back and I'm going to be playing right midfield and we're going to be battling it out again. We've done it for three years. I know the guy, he knows me, we know each other's name, we shake each other's hand when we see one another. But I think being around longer has been advantageous to me more than anything. I'm more excited about this one, simply because our last meeting it didn't go as planned I would say."

In that last meeting your team scored twice in the final 10 minutes to go up 2-1 only to give up an equalizer with the final kick of the game. How difficult was that?

"It's about as bad as it gets considering the fact you get a result, you have a tie, it felt like losing more than anything. I think they felt a lot better than we did, walking off that field, considering that they came back and made something happen and they got themselves a result. We still got a result getting a point, but the fact you go from the edge of winning like that, it felt like a failure, it makes you feel like you actually lost the game even though we got a point."

Does that make this, your final SuperClasico, that much more important?

"There's a lot left that had not been said yet that's going to come out in this game. Not only for me, but for the entire team. We know that it's "Chivas week". It's time to drive, time to work and time to really put everything into it. Our preparation for this game started as soon as Sunday's game was over. That's the mindset and it's not like that for most games, you don't normally think about who you're playing the whole week prior, But for this one, you're so excited for it, yet you're kind of worried at the same time. You know that this game you have to be at your best, this has got to be the one. And for a lot of us this is our final meeting and you want to go out with a bang and on a good note."



What is the feeling like when you walk off the field having won the SuperClasico?

"It's having all those emotions built up over the entire week and knowing that everyone has been working so hard and to be rewarded with a win because of all that work and because of how much you put into it, it's a huge sigh of relief and excitement. You're way more excited to win that game than you are with any other game because this rivalry is so strong. You see their stuff every day you come out here and it makes me want to work that much harder. You just want to obliterate them every time you step on the field. So getting that win is extremely rewarding and a real weight off your shoulders."

Looking back, what has it meant to you to be a part of this rivalry?

"This rivalry has taught me so much, which is only going to help me later in life. They're some of the most emotional and energy filled games that I have played in and that is something I don't take for granted and something that not many people get to experience at an age like that in an environment like that. The physicality and demand that people expect of us when we're out there it's pretty special and something that I don't think I will ever forget." •

It remains to this day one of the most unfathomable games in MLS history and for the more than 25,000 fans that were at The Home Depot Center, it remains a night that will never be forgotten. The fact that it was played on Friday the 13th should not have surprised anyone.

It was November 13, 2009 and the Western Conference Championship was on the line between the Galaxy and the Houston Dynamo. The Dynamo had won two of the previous three MLS Cup championships while the Galaxy had missed the playoffs for three straight seasons, temporarily shifting the balance of power in the Western Conference to south Texas.

The two teams finished tied atop the Western Conference standings with 48 points but the Galaxy won the head-to-head series, meaning that The Home Depot Center would host the Conference Championship.

Eighteen minutes into the game, the stadium lights failed, sending the stadium into near complete darkness. Neither team had scored to that point of the game and while both teams would go close following the 18-minute delay, the score would remain 0-0 at halftime.

Just six minutes into the second half, the power would go out once again, thrusting The Home Depot Center into darkness. This delay would also last 18 minutes and the temperature soon plunged into the 50's, only further adding to the tension that was building up inside the stadium.

With 10 minutes left in regulation, Houston finally got the ball past Donovan Ricketts, as Andre Hainault headed the ball home off a Brad Davis corner kick only for referee Terry Vaughn to call a foul and rule out the goal, keeping the game scoreless. It would remain

that way until the end of 90 minutes meaning that extra time would be needed to determine Western Conference champion.

There were 22 potential heroes on the field and with 30 minutes left, 22 men who knew that one goal would change the course of their season. Good or bad. The only question was who would that hero be?

In the end, the game's turning point came from perhaps the most unexpected source.

Brought in to help shore up the LA defense, Gregg Berhalter had just six shots in the regular season, none of which were on goal. But in the 103rd minute, the veteran defender was in the right place to stab home a loose ball in the center of the box, giving LA a 1-0 lead and sending The Home Depot Center into hysterics.

Shortly after the start of the second half of extra time, Alan Gordon was cut down in the box and Landon Donovan stepped up to convert the penalty and seal the victory for LA and ensure that the celebrations would continue throughout the night in the Southland.

One week later, the Galaxy would fall on penalty kicks at MLS Cup in Seattle, narrowly missing out on the third championship in club history. But the disappointment of that defeat could not taint the memory of that special November night in the dark at The Home Depot Center. •

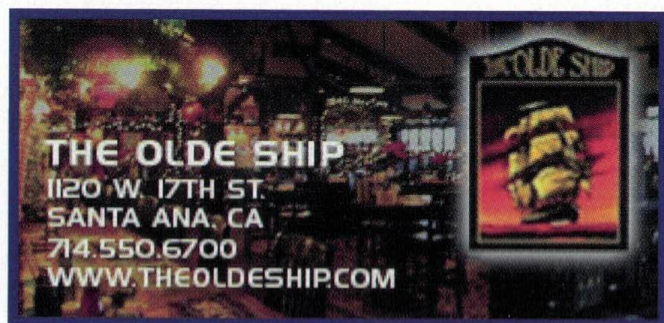

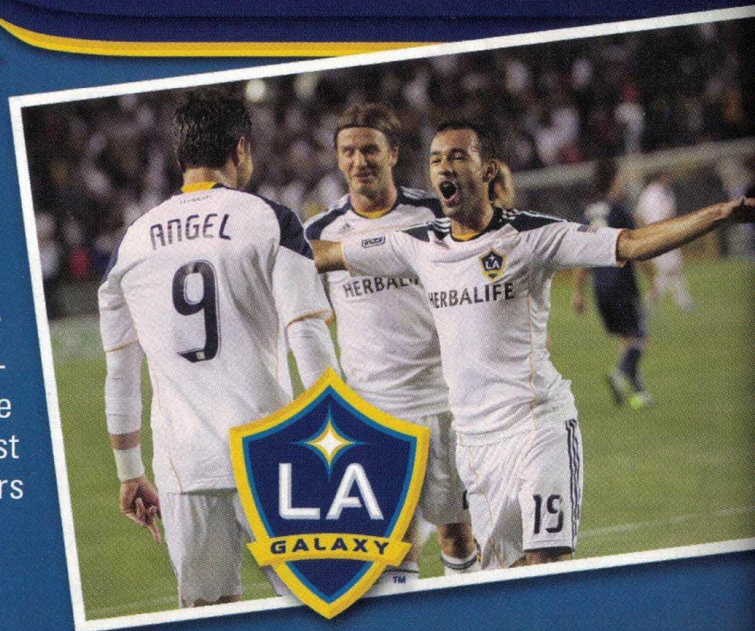

3 – Galaxy Designated Players that Scored vs. Sporting Kansas City on May 14

Landon Donovan scored twice while Juan Pablo Angel and David Beckham each added second half goals as the Galaxy scored four goals in a game for the first time this year to beat Sporting Kansas City 4-1. LA trailed 1-0 late in the first half of that game before scoring four straight to seal the win. This was the first time in MLS history that three Designated Players scored for the same team in a single game.

7 – Consecutive goals scored by Landon Donovan

The Galaxy captain scored seven consecutive goals for his club from April 23 until May 14. He scored in all five of his team's games during that stretch, setting a new personal record for the most consecutive games with a goal. Carlos Ruiz holds the club record for most consecutive goals scored with nine, which happened in the 2002 and 2003 seasons, scoring the club's final seven goals of 2002 and the first two of 2003.

BEHIND the NUMBERS

110 and 199 – Games played by Todd Dunivant

Galaxy defender Todd Dunivant played the 110th regular season game of his Galaxy career against Chivas USA on Saturday, playing the full 90 minutes at left back. That game was also the 199th regular season game of his MLS career, which began in 2003. If he plays tonight, he will be the 64th player in MLS history to appear in 200 regular season games.

30 – Number of players on the Galaxy roster

With the signing of defender Kyle Davies on Friday, the Galaxy now have the full allotment of 30 players on their roster. However, the club does have one roster spot available with Leonardo on being placed on the club's Season Ending Injury list.

20 – Number of players that have appeared in a game for the club this season

Twenty of the 30 players on the Galaxy roster have appeared in a league game this season, including Chad Barrett, Todd Dunivant and Sean Franklin who have played in all 13 of their team's games. Of the 20 players that have seen action, only one, Jovan Kirovski, has not started a game this year. Additionally, Gregg Berhalter, Adam Cristman and Brian Perk have all dressed for games this season but have not seen any action.

4 – Maximum number of games that could be missed by Landon Donovan and Donovan Ricketts

Tonight's game will be the final home game for both Landon Donovan and Donovan Ricketts before they depart for the CONCACAF Gold Cup. Both players are expected to travel to Boston for Saturday's game against the Revolution before joining up with the U.S. and Jamaican national teams respectively. The Gold Cup begins on June 5 in Dallas and ends with the Final on June 25 at the Rose Bowl, meaning that if both the U.S. and Jamaica reach the Final, Donovan and Ricketts would miss home games against D.C. United (June 3) and Toronto FC (June 11) as well as road games against Colorado (June 18) and San Jose (June 25). •
