TONIGHT'S OPPONENT

Philadelphia Union

Following an up and down inaugural season in 2010, the Philadelphia Union return to The Home Depot Center on tonight with renewed hopes after a strong start to their 2011 campaign.

A surprising season opening win in Houston and last weekend's 1-0 win in their home opener against Vancouver have left the Union at the top of the Eastern Conference standings heading into tonight's game.

Manager Peter Nowak has bolstered his roster significantly during the offseason and his team is now seeing the benefits. Perhaps the most important addition to the squad was also the oldest, with veteran Colombian goalkeeper Faryd Mondragon arriving over the winter. A member of Colombia's team at the 1998 World Cup in France, Mondragon played professionally in Argentina, France, Germany and Spain before joining the Union.

In front of Mondragon will be an experienced group that includes former Galaxy center back Danny Califf, who scored the game's only goal in the Union's season opening 1-0 win in Houston, Colombian international Carlos Valdes who is in his first year with the club, as well as outside backs Jordan Harvey and Sheanon Williams.

Another new face to the Union this season is two-time MLS Cup winning midfielder Brian Carroll, who was acquired in a trade with Columbus. His pairing with Stefani Miglioranzi gives Philadelphia experience in the center of the park and allows for more freedom going forward for some of their young and talented attacking players.

Heading up that group is 2010 MLS Best XI selection Sebastien LeToux, who scored or assisted on 25 of the Union's 35 league goals last season and was named the club's MVP. Capable of playing up front or wide on the right, LeToux can collect the ball in a number of different positions, causing problems for opposition defenses. He is joined by exciting young talents such as Danny Mwanga, Kyle Nakazawa and Roger Torres who can all play up front or in the midfield, as well as former U.S. National Team midfielder Justin Mapp and 18-year-old Jack McNerney, who scored against LA at The Home Depot Center last season.

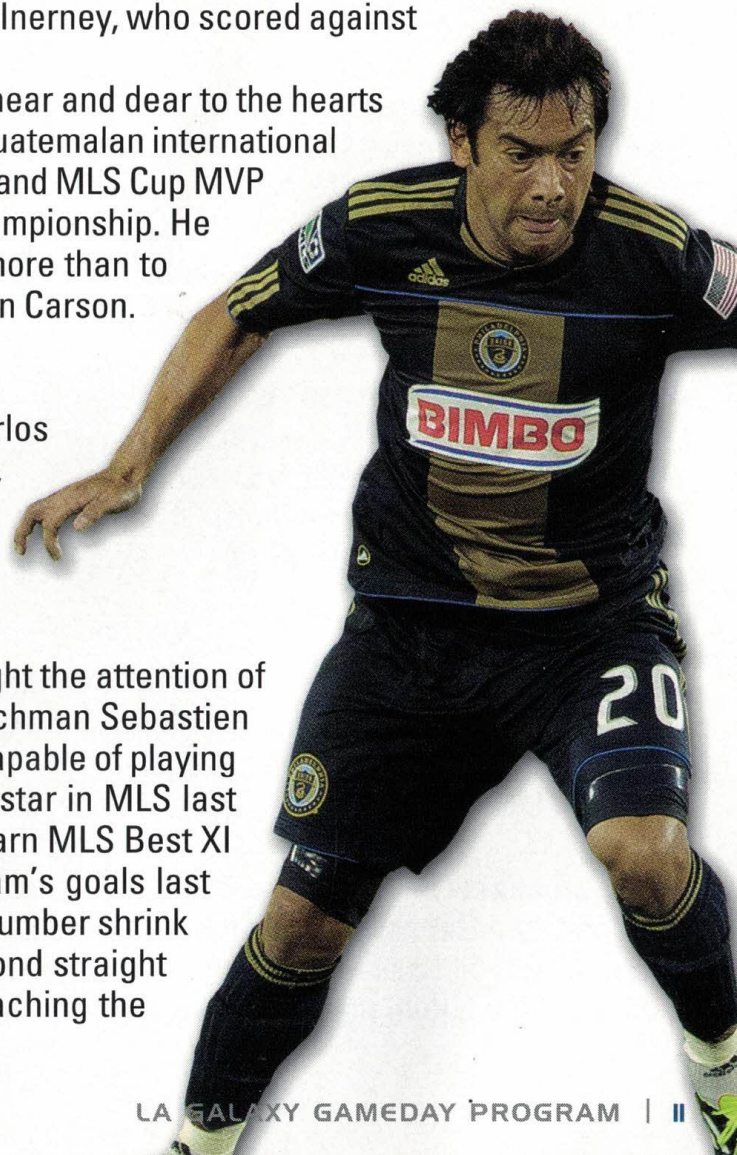
Rounding out the Union's attacking corps is a man near and dear to the hearts of a number of longtime Galaxy fans, Carlos Ruiz. The Guatemalan international scored 50 goals for LA from 2002-04, winning MLS MVP and MLS Cup MVP honors in 2002 as the Galaxy won their first league championship. He joined the Union in February and would love nothing more than to score for the second straight game for the Union here in Carson.

Key Man: Sebastien LeToux – Forward

While the Union's signing of Carlos Ruiz no doubt caught the attention of Galaxy fans everywhere, it is the club's fantastic Frenchman Sebastien LeToux who is at the heart of the Philadelphia attack. Capable of playing up front or wide on the wing, LeToux was a breakout star in MLS last season, scoring 14 goals and setting up 11 others to earn MLS Best XI honors. He scored or set up more than 70% of his team's goals last season and while Peter Nowak would like to see that number shrink somewhat in 2011, it is clear that LeToux having a second straight All-Star caliber season is paramount to the Union reaching the postseason for the first time in club history this year. •



LA GALAXY'S LAST GAME

LA Galaxy 1, Real Salt Lake 4
Saturday, March 26, 2011
Rio Tinto Stadium – Sandy, Utah

The LA Galaxy suffered their first defeat of the 2011 season last Saturday night, falling 4-1 to Real Salt Lake at Rio Tinto Stadium in a rematch of the 2009 MLS Cup. Juan Pablo Angel scored the Galaxy's only goal 10 minutes before the final whistle to open his goal account with the club, providing the evening's lone bright spot for LA.

Just as they had a week earlier against New England, the Galaxy went behind early when Andy Williams beat Josh Saunders from 10 yards out just 84 seconds into the game, giving the hosts a 1-0 lead. Things only got worse for LA eight minutes later when Saunders pulled Paolo Jr. Down in the box for a penalty, which Javier Morales converted, doubling the RSL lead just 10 minutes into the game.

Morales added his second just before halftime to give his team a commanding 3-0 halftime advantage. Making his MLS debut as a halftime substitute, Miguel Lopez nearly cut into the lead early in the second half, only to see his shot hit the post from six yards out.

Paolo Jr. scored RSL's fourth in the 68th minute before Angel pulled one back for LA, finishing a David Beckham freekick, in the 80th minute. However, that would be as close as the Galaxy would get on the evening as they fell to 1-1-1 on the season.

If Juninho burst onto the scene last year, then he is in the process of bringing down the house this season.

More relaxed, better adapted and infinitely more comfortable speaking in English or Spanish, the Galaxy's 22-year-old Brazilian midfielder has had a flying start to the 2011 season. His two goals in the first two games of the campaign were crucial in the Galaxy getting a win in Seattle and a draw at home against New England.

We recently sat down with Vitor Gomes Pereira Junior to talk about how he is adjusting to life in L.A. and his pair of wonder-goals, which is a perfect place to start this Q&A.

Juninho, you seem to handle the Jabulani, the adidas ball used throughout MLS better than a lot of players. Why is that?

"I've been practicing a lot, getting to know the ball, and doing everything possible so that I can score on the field on game day. I do lots of repetitions and I think that's helped a lot. I don't know if I dominate it, but I've had a lot of success scoring from long distance, both this year and last year."

Give us your impressions on the start you've had to the season.

"I'm very happy. It's been phenomenal. We've gotten off to good a start and I've scored two very important goals for the team. All I want to do is play for the Galaxy. Whether we win or lose, I just want to play."

You obviously seem to have fun when you play and enjoying life right now. Your goal celebration is a blend of everything. Where did your dance come from?

"My principal celebration, the samba, is because I'm Brazilian and I like to dance a lot. I miss Brazil, a lot, but I'm very happy to be here. I dedicate it to them in Brazil."

You celebrated your goal in the home opener a little bit differently. Why no samba?

"That one was in honor Sean Franklin. I did it for him. Sean said if I scored a goal that he wanted to dance with me during my celebration, and that's what I did. We did a Rap, or Hip-Hop as they call it here, and he was very happy."

During preseason, Bruce singled you out and said you were one of the biggest surprises in camp. What's been different for you from last year to this year?

"I feel great, I feel good in my play and I feel good talking to people, sometimes in English, even. I'm honored that Bruce said those things. I will continue to give it my all so that he continues to think highly of me on the field."

Did the way last season ended motivate you?

"On one side, we're happy, but the season was somewhat soured because we were not able to win the Western Conference Championship. We were so close, but couldn't do it. But this year we are going to shoulder the responsibility of winning MLS and the other competitions. We're conscious that we need to do a good job."

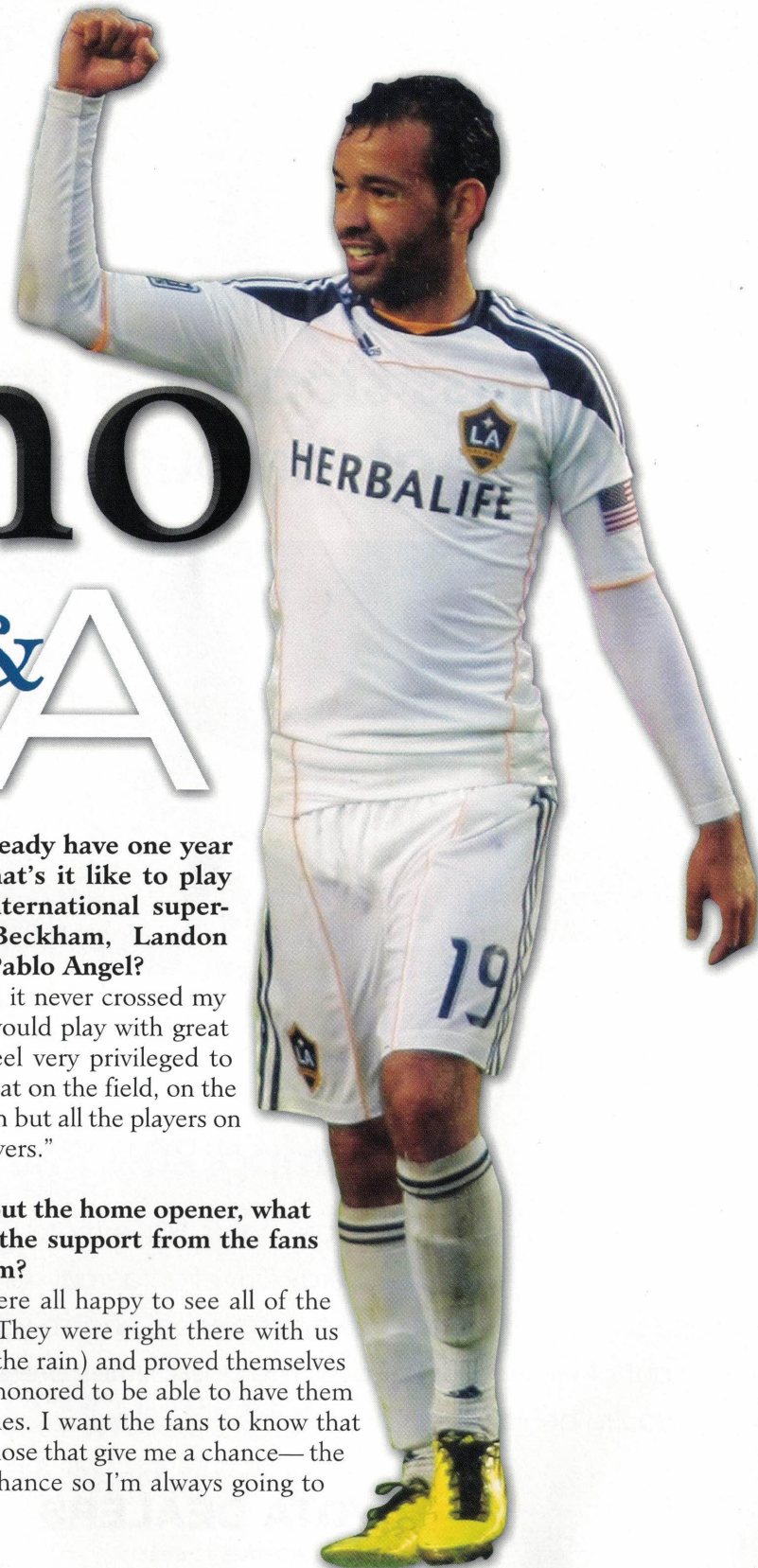
Q&A

Even though you already have one year under your belt, what's it like to play with the likes of international superstars like David Beckham, Landon Donovan and Juan Pablo Angel?

"I never dreamed of it, it never crossed my mind that one day I would play with great players like them. I feel very privileged to have teammates like that on the field, on the team, and not just them but all the players on this team are great players."

We spoke earlier about the home opener, what was that like to see the support from the fans who braved the storm?

"All the players, we were all happy to see all of the fans. It was exciting. They were right there with us (standing out there in the rain) and proved themselves as true fans. And, I'm honored to be able to have them alongside us in all games. I want the fans to know that I'm going to fight for those that give me a chance—the Galaxy gave me this chance so I'm always going to give it my all." •

The Galaxy swept the season series with Philadelphia in 2010, winning 3-1 at The Home Depot Center on May 1 and winning 1-0 at PPL Park on October 7. Edson Buddle had three of the four LA goals with A.J. DeLa-Garza claiming the other. Michael Stephens set up two of the four goals, while Landon Donovan and David Beckham each had one assist.

Juninho scored in each of the Galaxy's first two games of the season, becoming the fifth different player to score in the first two games of the year. Carlos Ruiz achieved the feat in each of his first three years with the club (2002-04), while Welton did so in 1998, Cobi Jones did in 2000 and Edson Buddle scored in the first two games of 2010. Of that group, only Welton did not finish as the team's top scorer after scoring in the first three games of the year. He had a career-best 17 goals in 1998 but finished second on the team to Cobi Jones who had a career-high 19 goals.

The Galaxy played Saturday's game without their captain, Landon Donovan, who was in action for the U.S. National Team earlier in the day against Argentina. Since the start of the 2009 MLS season, Donovan has missed a total of 11 games while on international duty. In those 11 games, the Galaxy have a 6-4-1 record, including a 3-3-1 mark on the road.

David Beckham made the 50th regular season appearance of his MLS career in LA's home opener against New England, playing the full 90 minutes in the 1-1 draw with New England. Beckham, who has started in each of LA's three games this season, has now played in 51 games, making 46 starts as a member of the Galaxy, scoring nine goals and adding 17 assists. In those 51 games, the Galaxy have a 19-19-13 record, including 17-17-12 when he starts.

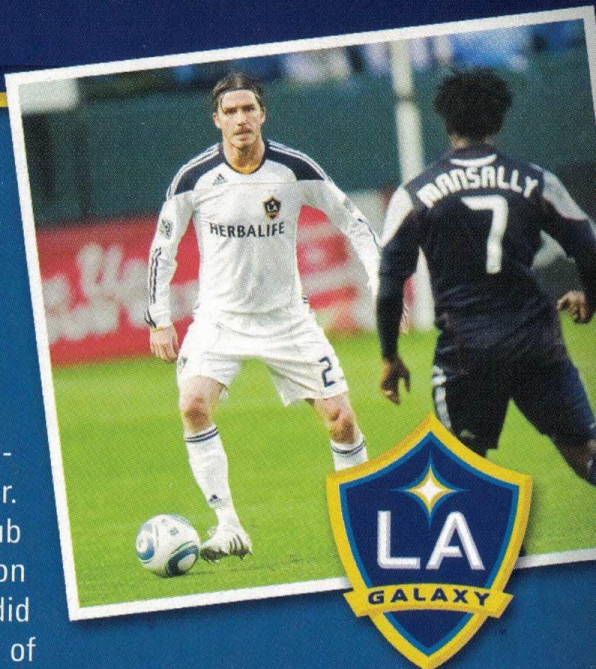
With Landon Donovan playing for the U.S. National Team last Saturday, David Beckham donned the captain's armband for the first time since 2008.

David Beckham has scored 15 goals for the English National Team. The first of those came in the 1998 World Cup with a freekick that beat Colombia goalkeeper Faryd Mondragon, who is now the goalkeeper for Philadelphia.

Juan Pablo Angel and Michael Stephens were added to the starting lineup for last weekend's game against Real Salt Lake, each making their first start of the season. After using six different lineups through the first six games of 2010 and 10 different lineups through the first 10 games of 2009, Bruce Arena used the same starting lineup in each of the first two games of this season.

The Galaxy have given up at least one goal in each of their last 13 regular season and postseason home games. In those games, LA is 6-5-2, allowing 22 goals. In the 13 previous home games, dating back to June 2009, LA was 10-2-1, keeping nine clean sheets and allowing just 10 goals.

Three former Galaxy players will be making a return to The Home Depot Center tonight as members of the Union. The Galaxy's Defender of the Year in 2000, Danny Califf helped LA win the 2001 U.S. Open Cup and the 2002 MLS Cup during his five years (2000-2004) with the club. Carlos Ruiz was also a member of the 2002 MLS Cup winning team, scoring the game-winning goal to beat New England and give LA their first league championship. The MLS MVP in 2002 and the club's third-leading scorer all-time, Ruiz re-joined the Galaxy in 2008 before being traded to Toronto that summer. After spending time in Mexico and Greece, Ruiz joined the Union during the offseason. Like Ruiz, Stefani Miglioranza had two stints with the Galaxy and is an MLS Cup winner. He originally joined the club in 2006, playing in three games for the club before joining Columbus for the start of the 2007 season. He won an MLS Cup with the Crew in 2008 and nearly helped LA win one in 2009, playing 23 games for the club before being selected by Philadelphia in the Expansion Draft in November 2009. He was sent off just before halftime of Philadelphia's visit to Carson last season for a foul on Juninho. •

Best player in practice: It changes everyday. The best guy one day can be the worst the next. That's a tough one, it's always changing.

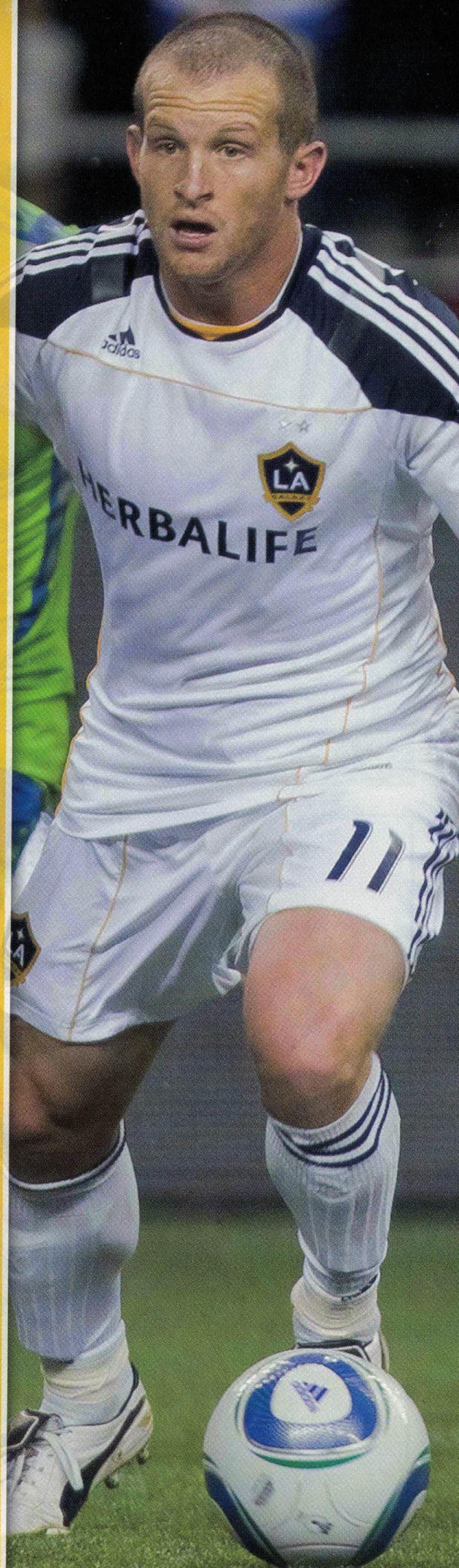
Worst dressed teammate: I'd have to say Dusty Baker (Dustin McCarty). I don't think that I've ever seen him wear jeans.

After 12 seasons in MLS, former Galaxy midfielder Chris Klein announced his retirement from professional soccer at the end of last season. However, his time away from the club was short, and in December he was named the Senior Director of the Galaxy Academy. In this role, Klein is responsible for overseeing the long-term financial and technical plan for the Academy, while building a strong presence in the local soccer community.

With the Galaxy's Development Academy season resuming last weekend, we caught up with Klein to get his take on the season ahead and his outlook for the Academy going forward.

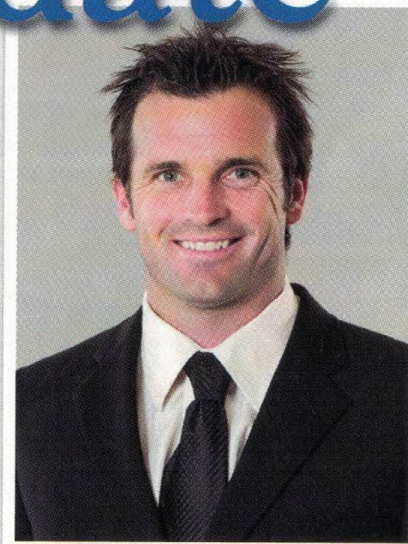
There are two new Academy teams this year with the debut of the U-12's and U-13's. What is the thinking behind spotting players at younger ages?

"When I came in here, I looked at the entire program and what we aimed to do and the glaring need that I thought we had was the need to get younger. The Galaxy need to start to develop kids over a period of time, not just 2-3 years as we've done in the past. Therefore, with the addition of an Under-12 and Under-13 team we have started that process. To do that and be able to take a kid from the time he is 11 until the time that he is 18 when we hopefully still have him, we will have had a significant impact on him not only as a soccer player, but him as an individual."

The Academy Coaching Staff has grown significantly recently, what do all of your coaches bring to the program?

"The coaches with our older teams, Eddie Soto with the U-18's and Kenny Arena with the U-16's have been around the game for a long time and have coached in the college game. Then we have Craig Harrington who is overseeing the younger programs and he is a guy that has a tremendous amount of experience in the youth soccer game, which is important because that is a whole different animal than the professional game, so we're hiring coaches that have experience in that. We brought in Billy Bizarro to coach our U-13's and Sal Diaz to coach of U-12's, so we feel very good about the staff we have put together. The objective of the Galaxy Academy is not to win tournaments and to win games, it is to change the model. It is to develop soccer players and individuals, not for when they are 12, 13 or 14, but when they are 18 and ready to contribute to the first team. That is what we are trying to do."

Academy Update



While winning is not the primary objective, it must be nice to have a team like the U-16's who have started their season so brightly?

"Our U-16 team is very good and they have won a lot of games. The thing that impressed me when I got here is that Kenny [Arena] has done a very good job of getting them to play the right way and that's what was important to me. They have played in an attractive style, the players were respectful and on the back of that, they won. What I have done to change that a little bit is that I've told Kenny and Eddie [Soto] is that we want to start challenging these players a bit more. We are pushing players that in the past were with our U-16's, we're pushing them to play with our U-18's. Younger players from our U-14 and U-15's, we're pushing them to play with our U-16's. Once a player has reached a point that he needs a new challenge, I've told the coaches that they need to move them on and they've done a really good job of accepting that, knowing that while it might hurt their team, it is the right thing to do for the individual player and the Academy."

Before last weekend it had been almost four months since any of the Academy teams had played a game, how excited were those players and the coaches to get back on the field?

"The coaches and our staff feel that training is more important than the games, but these are kids and they love to play and the reason that they have gotten to where they are is because they love to play the game. You could see it in their faces, they were tired of training against one another and they were ready to get out onto the field and play games." •

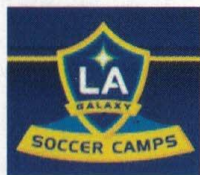
There will be three separate age divisions for children 1-3, 4-6 and 7-10.

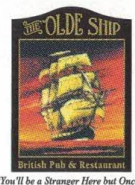
