



till adjusting to new head coach Aron Winter, Toronto FC come to The Home Depot Center looking for their first win in more than a month. TFC have a league-worst goal difference of -10, but remain in the hunt for a postseason berth as they approach the midway point of the season thanks in large to a string of draws of late.

After relying on former Galaxy forward Alan Gordon and Javier Martina for goals at the start of the season, Maicon Santos has started to come into his own of late with a teamhigh five goals. Santos had never before scored more than four goals in a season before the current campaign, but he has found success as the central figure in Toronto's threepronged attack, even getting the game-winning goal in his team's last win, a 2-1 victory over Houston on May 7.

With Julian de Guzman at the Gold Cup with Canada, former Galaxy first round draft pick Nathan Sturgis will be looked to hold down the center of midfield. He will likely be paired with Tony Tchani, who TFC acquired in April as part of the trade that

sent Dwayne DeRosario to New York. His size can cause problems on set pieces, while he also has the technical ability to break down a defense with the ball at his feet.

Despite all of those pieces, TFC have struggled for much of the season thanks in large to a suspect defense. Goalkeeper Stefan Frei continues to grow in his third season with the club, but the defense in front of him has struggled, most noticeably in a recent 6-2 loss to Philadelphia. Toronto have allowed 26 goals in 14 games this season and with the recent injury to Adrian Cann, help does not to be on the horizon. As a result, Winter must hope that his current stable of defenders such as Richard Eckersley, Nana Attakora, Ty Harden and Danleigh Borman can right the ship themselves.

This is the second and final meeting of the season between the two sides, following a 0-0 draw at BMO Field on April 13. The Galaxy were disappointed not to take the full three points from that one and will be fully expecting to do so tonight.

While Toronto FC have struggled for much of the season, things could be much worse if not for the play of their young goalkeeper Stefan Frei. Now in his third season with TFC, Frei has kept four clean sheets, including one in last week's 0-0 home draw with Sporting Kansas City, despite playing behind an ever changing defense. An excellent distributor of the ball, the former star at Cal is facing nearly five shots on goal per game this season, but has managed to help TFC earn a point in three of their last four games. •

LA Galaxy 0, D.C. United 0 Friday, June 3, 2011 The Home Depot Center - Carson, Calif.

he LA Galaxy extended their unbeaten streak to seven games following a disjointed 0-0 draw with D.C. United at The Home Depot Center on Friday night. Despite seeing their four-game winning streak come to an end, the Galaxy were able to keep their fourth consecutive clean sheet, extending their streak of not allowing a goal to 411 minutes.

After taking a season-high 17 shots in each of

their last two games, the Galaxy managed just eight shots on the night with only one forcing a save out of United goalkeeper Bill Hamid. Chris Birchall tested United's young goalkeeper early with a awkward rightfooted shot that nearly caught Hamid off balance, forcing him to parry the ball out for a corner kick.

While the Galaxy struggled to create chances in the attacking third, they also limited them at the defensive end of the field. With Donovan Ricketts away with the Jamaican National Team, Josh Saunders got his fifth start of the season and kept his second clean sheet, making three saves. United pressured Saunders' goal for much of the first half with Chris Pontius the main threat, but they were unable to find a breakthrough.

United's best chance of the game came in the 81st minute when second half substitute Charlie Davies was played in behind the Galaxy defense. Omar Gonzalez chased back to pressure Davies as he attempted to round Saunders and put the striker off enough, forcing him to put his shot wide of the target.

Five minutes later, Andy Najar would go close to finding a winner, only for Saunders to make the save and earn his team a share of the points.

ne of the Galaxy's three Designated Players and the top goalscorer in MLS from 2007-2010, Juan Pablo Angel was supposed to fill much of the scoring void that was created with the departure of Edson Buddle. However, a series of injuries have limited Angel's impact over the first half of the season, as he has scored just two goals in 13 games. But with the regular season just reaching the midway point and games remaining in the Open Cup, Champions League and perhaps the MLS Cup Playoffs, Angel has time to turn his season around. More importantly, he has the confidence that he will do just that.

The former Colombian international was back on the training field this week after missing the 0-0 draw with D.C. United because of a calf strain and is looking to getting his name back on the scoresheet tonight against Toronto FC a team that he has seven goals in 12 career games against.

We spoke to Angel after training on Tuesday to see what he thought of the game ahead and his first season with the Galaxy.

Is it frustrating the way that the season has gone for you personally so far?


"It's tough. The season has not gone how I hoped or how I expected, but I am looking forward to having a good second half of the season. I feel more settled now, so hopefully things will change and I can forget about this first part."

There are still six months and a lot of games left in the season, does that help at all, knowing that there is time to find your form in front of goal?

"I knew from the beginning that there were going to be a lot of games and that we were going to be involved in a number of competitions. There are still a lot of games left, but having said that, I would have wished that the start of the season would have been a bit different in terms of goals. There are some good games that I have played but there have also been games that were not too good. But we as a team, especially in the last 8-10 games, we have been on a good run we are in a good position going forward. I would be more worried if the team were not playing well and not getting results. But we are and that gives us a little bit of an advantage to look forward to the next part of the season."

What does it say about the depth of this squad to be able to overcome all of the injuries, suspensions and other things that have come up this season?

"That is what a good team is about, to be able to replace





players that are unavailable through injuries, suspensions, national team call-ups or performance and not be hurt. That is what is happening this year. For a number of games we have been without top players but we've held up very well. There are still a lot of games left and we have to keep improving and getting better as a team."

How important was it to get that first goal at The Home Depot Center last month? "It was good. My confidence is still there. Obviously I would have liked to score more goals, but my confidence is still there and I am hopeful that over the second half of the season, things will change. Not just for me, but for the team to play better than we are playing and


to keep getting good results."

After a packed May schedule, things are significantly lighter here in June, does that help this team as you try to get your legs back?

"We have to adjust to the circumstances. We have played more games than any other team in the league and sometimes that can effect the level of the team. Especially the last game against D.C., in general the team was a bit tired and slow, but now we have some time to recover and get everyone back. It is important for me to get some time to recover and get into form, but it is also important for the team to recover, work on the things we have to work on, and keep getting better ahead of the next few games."

What do you expect from Toronto tonight?

"Toronto is going to be a tough game. They did not get off to a good start this year,



but now they have changed their style of play a little bit and I am sure that they are going to be sitting back and waiting for us to make a mistake and try to get us on the counterattack. Being without Juninho and Landon, they are very important players for us, everyone knows that, but I am confident that we will be able to replace those players with individuals that are here and up for the match."

How does your calf feel this week and do you think that you will be able to play? "It's been good so far. It still is not 100% but I am taking it day by day and I hope to be able to play a part against Toronto." •

laimed off waivers from FC Dallas and signed in early May, Kyle Davies has spent the majority of his time in a Galaxy uniform regaining his match fitness after a lengthy spell on the sidelines and getting accustomed to his new team. Now a month into his Galaxy career, Davies has bigger goals in mind, specifically getting on the field and helping the Galaxy return to MLS Cup. He made his Reserve League debut on Monday, and while he was forced to exit 17 minutes in because of an ankle injury that is not believed to be serious, Davies is ready for the road ahead, no matter how many speed bumps there may be.

We caught up with him after Monday's game to see what he thought of his time with the Galaxy...

How has it been adapting to life with the Galaxy?

"It hasn't been too bad. Everyone has been helpful and welcoming. It is always stressful getting adjusted into a whole new team and trying to get back into the swing of things, but all in all I think that things have gone pretty well."

You were born and raised on the West Coast (in Oakland) are you glad to be back?

"I'm really happy to be back. I love everything about California, the weather, the people, especially here in Southern California. I'm more than happy to be back."

How much has it helped you to have former teammates like Brian Perk and Michael Stephens already established here?

"That definitely helps because you have someone that you already know and are comfortable with to ask some of the questions that you don't want to ask other guys, the little things. That said, everyone has been really helpful and nobody has made me feel out of place."

You made your Galaxy debut in the Reserve League on Monday but had to leave early with an ankle injury. What happened?

"What happened is hopefully not a setback, just the breaking up of more scar tissue. Outside of that, I feel good. The fitness is getting there and the training staff here that has been working with my ankle is excellent and probably the best that I have ever worked with. I've been focused on my fitness, doing extra running and anything I can. When I first got here I was out of shape, but all the coaches and all the guys have been willing to help me out and keep pushing me through training."

How disappointing was it to have to leave Monday's game with the injury?

"It's disappointing because it is the only real setback that I have had since I have been here, but it is part of coming back and I'm pretty confident that it is not going to be a setback as much as it is something that I needed to go through in order to progress. The biggest disappointment is that this was the first time I've had a chance to play in a long time so I was hoping to put more minutes in, but we've got another game next week so I'll hopefully be ready to go for that one and get at least a half in." •

The 10th Annual COPA LA Youth Soccer Tournament



We caught up with him before he returned to Los Angeles to see what he thought of the experience and his goals for the upcoming Academy Playoffs. Here is what he had to say...

What was it like training with the reserves ahead of Monday's game?

"The speed of play and just the quality of play is a few steps up from the Academy. The effort that is demanded of you in practice is just that much more physically, technically and mentally. It's a whole new level and just training with them for a short time is going to make me that much of a better player. You realize that you can't take any plays off or take a break. You have to stay focused the entire time."

How was it to see what the team is like on the road and what is asked of the players and how is that different than with the Academy?

"With the reserves it is a lot more independent than with the Academy. You have your


schedule and you have to make sure that you are where you need to be when you need to be there, but outside of that, you're on your own. It is up to you to make sure you get to where you need to go. It's a completely professional environment.

How much do you think that this experience will help you when you return to Academy play this weekend?

"A tremendous amount. Just the demand of what is asked of you with the reserves pushes me to play at a higher level and I can carry that with me into the Academy. If I can do that, I am confident that my game will improve significantly. The entire experience with the reserves is going to help me greatly this weekend and the rest of the season."

How much are you looking forward to the upcoming Academy **Playoffs?**

"This will be my first trip to the Academy Playoffs. Since the end of last season, I have wanted nothing more than to win a championship for the LA Galaxy and now we have that opportunity. We want to enjoy the experience, but we know that we have a job to do and I feel that we have the ability and the mentality to do that.".

Tonight's game is the Galaxy's 17th of the season, meaning that after the game's conclusion, they will officially be at the halfway point of their season. With 30 points already, the Galaxy have reached the 30 point plateau at the halfway point of the year for the second straight season and the fourth time in their history. The Galaxy had a record 40 points at the midway point of the 1998 season, 36 points last vear and 32 points in 1996.

The Galaxy were the first MLS team to reach 30 points for the second consecutive season. The club achieved the feat on June 3 this year after doing so on June 5 last year.

The Galaxy were shutout for just the second time this season last week against D.C. United. The only other time the Galaxy were shutout in 2011 was in a 0-0 draw with tonight's opponent, Toronto FC, at BMO Field. Bruce Arena's team followed that result with a 2-1 road win over Chicago.

The Galaxy have kept four straight clean sheets and have gone 411 minutes without allowing a goal. That streak is the third longest in MLS this season and the third longest in club history. If LA

do not allow a goal in the first 52 minutes of tonight's game, they will have the

second longest shutout streak in club history, bested only by a 521 minute streak that began late in the 2009 season and ran until the fourth game of 2010. FC Dallas have the longest shutout streak in MLS this season at 531 minutes, meaning that the Galaxy would need to shutout Toronto FC tonight and then keep Colorado off the scoreboard in the first 30 minutes of next weekend's game in order

to eclipse that mark.

Tonight's game will be the second and final meeting of the year between the Galaxy and Toronto FC.


They join D.C. United, New England and Philadelphia as the first four teams to complete the season series with the Galaxy. LA still have not faced Colorado, Columbus, San Jose and Vancouver this season in the league. The Galaxy are yet to lose to any of the teams that they have finished their season series with.

The Galaxy have not allowed a second half goal at home all season. In seven home games, the club has allowed just three goals while keeping four clean sheets, which are one more than they kept all of last season.

Juninho will not play in tonight's game after returning to Brazil earlier in the week for his wedding, which took place today near Sao Paulo.




