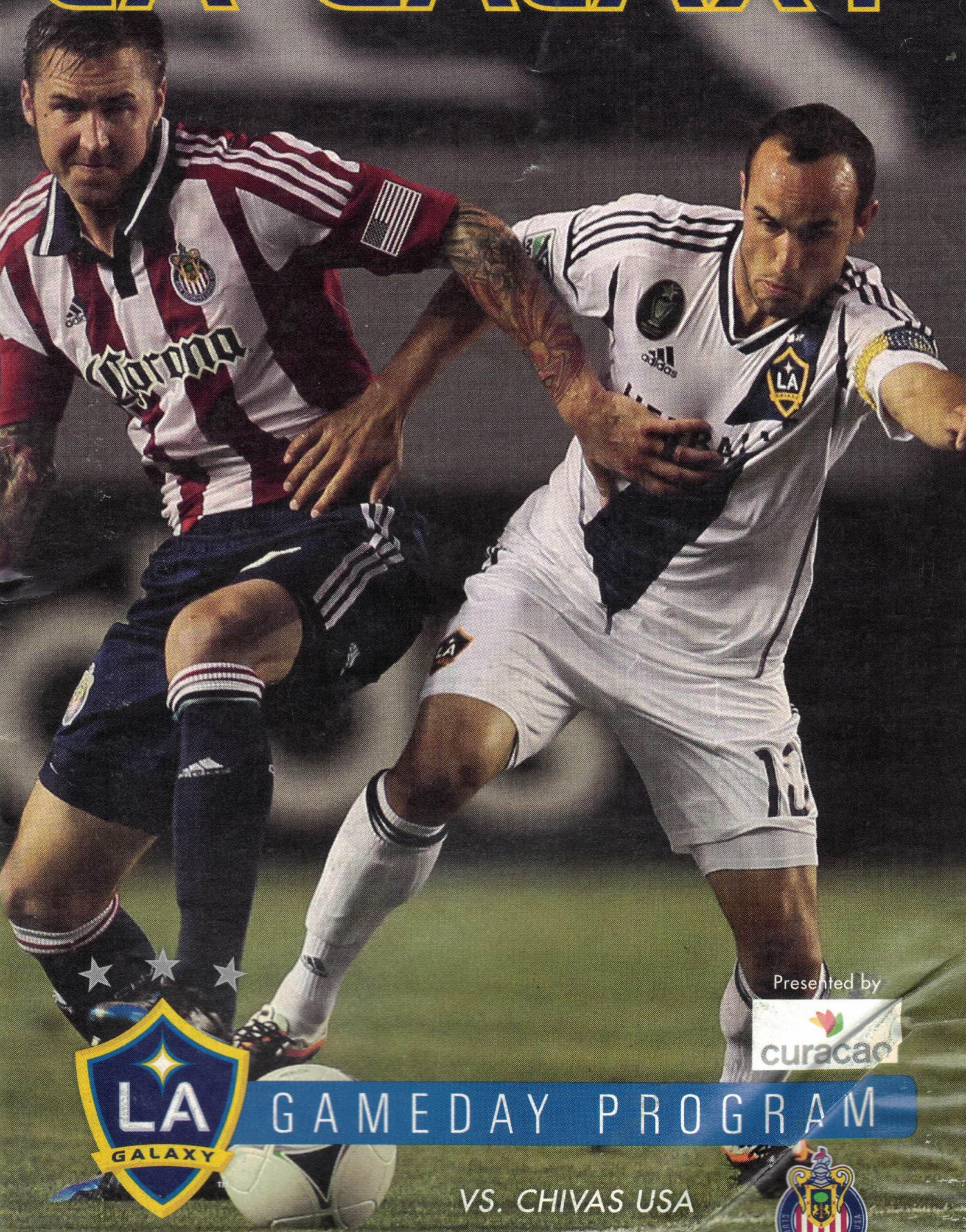

CHIVAS USA

There is never need for added motivation in a rivalry game, but with all nine Western Conference teams still in the hunt for playoff spots, Chivas USA enters the season's second-leg of the SuperClasico looking to gain ground on their rivals. Chivas has been stingy in defense, but struggled offensively. Still, the HDC co-tenants are just four points back of the Galaxy and the Western Conference's final playoff spot.

The defense is led by All-Star goalkeeper Dan Kennedy who has started all 187 games and played all 1,620 minutes this season. The only other player to log every minute this season is defender James Riley who has also added two assists. Acquired in a May trade with Philadelphia, former Galaxy center back Danny Califf has also become a mainstay in the Chivas backline. Chivas' 18 goals allowed are the fewest in the Western Conference and second fewest in all of MLS.

Chivas will be without the defensive midfield presence of Oswaldo Minda who dislocated his shoulder in training. Minda has been a strong defender for Chivas while also adding a goal in his 14 games this season.

Despite allowing an average of 1.06 goals per game, Chivas has a minus-seven goal difference because of a struggling attack. The club has scored only 12 goals, the fewest in MLS. Forward Juan Pablo Angel leads the team with three goals, the only other players with multiple goals are Jose Correa and Alejandro Moreno with two a piece. US National Team forward Juan Agudelo has scored once since arriving from New York in May.

The last time that the inter-stadium rivals met, Chivas came away with its first SuperClasico win in five years. In the second half of a scoreless game, David Junior Lopes was shown a red card for denying a goal-scoring opportunity with a handball. Correa converted the penalty kick to give Chivas the 1-0 lead they would hold on to for the victory. It was Chivas' fourth victory in SuperClasico history.

Chivas comes into the rivalry contest after a win at home against the Portland Timbers, 1-0. Despite sitting in seventh place in the Western Conference, Chivas has only lost once in the last five matches. With a 6-7-5 record, Chivas has 23 points, two short of sixth place Colorado.

KEY MAN: DAN KENNEDY

A key factor keeping Chivas in the Western Conference playoff race has been the play of goalkeeper Dan Kennedy. Kennedy was recently named to the All-Star roster for the first time in his five-year career with Chivas USA. He will be the MLS' backup keeper when the all-stars take on Chelsea. After becoming the regular starter last season, Kennedy has only improved in 2012, starting all 18 games in goal for Chivas and playing every minute thus far. In those 18 games, Kennedy has allowed 18 goals and made 58 saves, while keeping five shutouts. His 1.06 goals against average is third best in the league among keepers who have started at least 10 games.





LAST GAME LA GALAXY 2, VANCOUVER WHITECAPS 2

Just when it looked like the LA Galaxy were going to lose a game for a second time this month, the club came roaring back with two goals in the final 10 minutes to get a 2-2 draw with the Vancouver Whitecaps at BC Place. David Beckham scored his sixth goal in the season and Academy Homegrown Product Jose Villarreal scored his first career goal in MLS to help the Galaxy get the point.

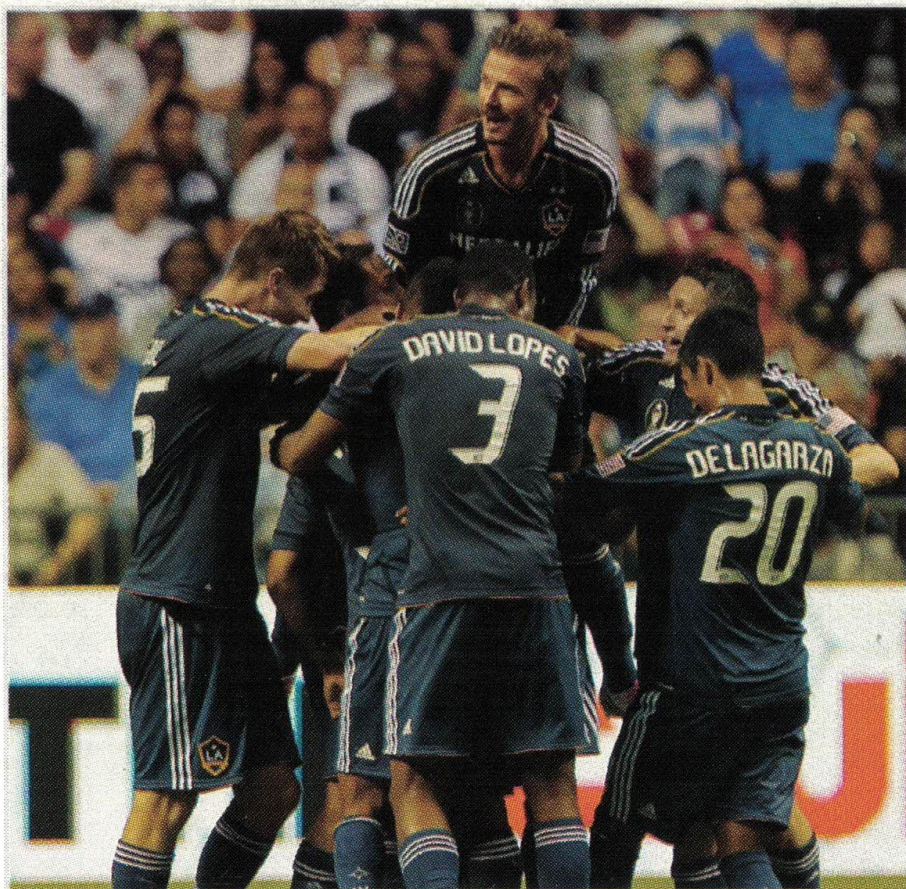
The result allowed the club to extend its unbeaten streak to three games, only the second time LA has gone three games without losing a match this season, and gave the Galaxy a crucial point, permitting the club to keep a firm hold on the fifth spot in the Western Conference standings and stay close to Seattle and Vancouver, who are in third and fourth place, respectively, with 31 points. With the draw, the Galaxy record is now 8-10-3 for 27 points.

LA did not look good in the first half of this game. Errors and mistakes put the club in a 2-0 hole before reaching the half-hour mark. Camilo started things off for Vancouver on their first goal by dispossessing David Beckham in the midfield. The Brazilian then made a run through the middle of the field, where Marcelo Sarvas intercepted his run, but the play was waved on as the ball fell to Vancouver's Gershon Koffie. The Ghanaian took three touches and then fired off a left-footed shot that just beat the outstretch hand of Josh Saunders in the 18th minute.

The Whitecaps kept the pressure on the Galaxy and nine minutes were rewarded with their second goal of the match. The play started on a throw-in by Lee Young-Pyo near the corner flag. After throwing the ball in, the South Korean defender got the ball back and sent in a good cross in to Barry Robson in the middle of the box. Robson, Vancouver's Designated Player who was playing a BC Place for the first time, sent the home crowd into a frenzy by scoring his first-ever goal in a Whitecaps uniform with a classy header that gave the Canadian's a 2-0 lead.

Things didn't get any better for the Galaxy as Todd Dunivant needed to come out of game due to a right calf injury and was replaced by Bryan Gaul in the 31st minute.

In the second half, Galaxy began to get more of



the possession and started to create chances. The team was unlucky not to get a goal just before the 70th minute mark on back-to-back corner kick that found the woodwork each time.

It was in between corner kicks, however, that 18-year-old Jose Villarreal entered the game, replacing Hector Jimenez in the 70th minute. Making only his second appearance as a professional, Villarreal's speed and agility opened up the spaces on the field for the Galaxy—and set up the stage for the dramatic finish.

In the 81st minute, Beckham got one back for LA to cut the lead to 2-1. The goal was his sixth of the season, a career-high for the Englishman. The play was set up by Gaul, who's shot on goal bounced off the crossbar and fell to Landon Donovan, who laid off the ball to Beckham. The assist was Donovan's eighth of the season.

The Galaxy continued their attack and were rewarded for their persistence in the 87th minute, when Beckham found Juninho making a run across the field and fed him a perfectly lobbed ball in between four players. Juninho one-timed a pass to Villarreal, who received the ball and then cut it back to his left foot. The Inglewood-native then unleashed a curling shot that beat Joe Cannon and tied the game up at 2-2. The goal, a beauty and Goal of the Week candidate, was Villarreal's first in the professional ranks. Juninho was credited with an assist on the play, so was Beckham, who now has eight assists in the season, tying him Donovan for the team lead.



FIVE QUESTIONS WITH JOSE VILLARREAL

This has been a great week for Jose Villarreal. At just 18 years of age, Villarreal made his professional debut and scored his first goal in MLS on his first-ever road trip. The Inglewood-native stepped onto the field for the first time in an MLS game in the closing minutes of the Galaxy's 5-3 win over the Portland Timbers and just five days later scored his first-ever goal as a professional, an amazing left-footed shot in the club's 2-2 draw with the Vancouver Whitecaps. Villarreal became the Galaxy's second homegrown player to appear with the first team and also score a goal in just less than a year, joining teammate Jack McBean. Despite having his MLS arrival delayed by a preseason injury, Villarreal has starred in the club's lower levels. Villarreal scored three goals in five games with the Galaxy Reserves, as well as being a standout for the U-18 Academy side that won the SoCal Division title. With the Academy U-18's Villarreal scored 10 goals and was recently named to the U-18 Western Conference Best XI.

Before the Galaxy took on Vancouver, we caught up with Villarreal to ask him about his debut and his move to the first team...

HOW WAS YOUR FIRST EXPERIENCE TRAVELING WITH THE TEAM? WAS IT DIFFERENT THAN YOU EXPECTED?

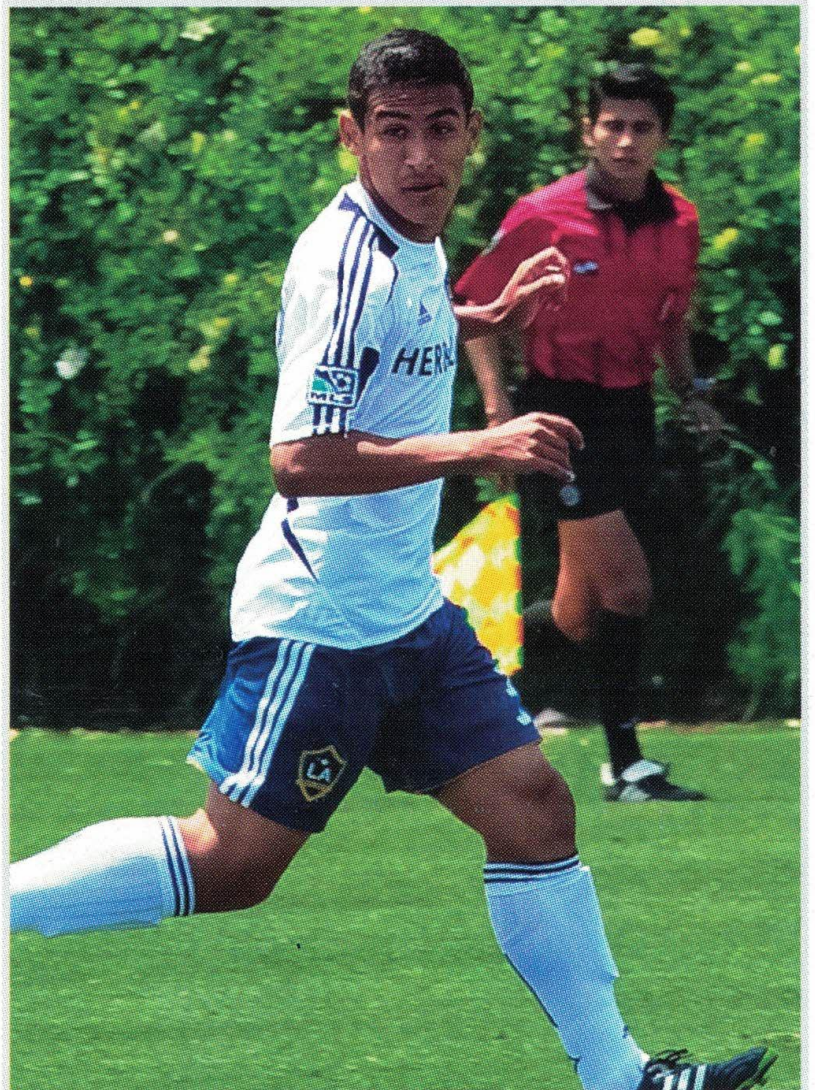
JV: It was fun, you know, traveling with most of the veterans and the team. The way that everyone's professional about it and they take everything more serious. It helps me out.

ONCE YOU KNEW YOU WERE COMING IN, WHAT WAS GOING THROUGH YOUR MIND?

JV: I was just hoping I can do something to help the team out in that moment. Of course I was feeling a little bit nervous, just because the stadium was erupting and stuff, but other than that I just felt overwhelmed. When (Assistant Coach) Curt (Onalfo) told me I was coming in, I was pretty happy.

BEING OUT ON THE FIELD FOR THE FIRST TIME IN SUCH AN INTENSE ATMOSPHERE, HOW DID THAT FEEL?

JV: It was something I never expected as a little kid



when I was playing soccer, I just never expected it. To be 18 years old and to be going into a game like that, being subbed in, you know, I'm proud of myself for what I've been doing and I just gotta keep going.

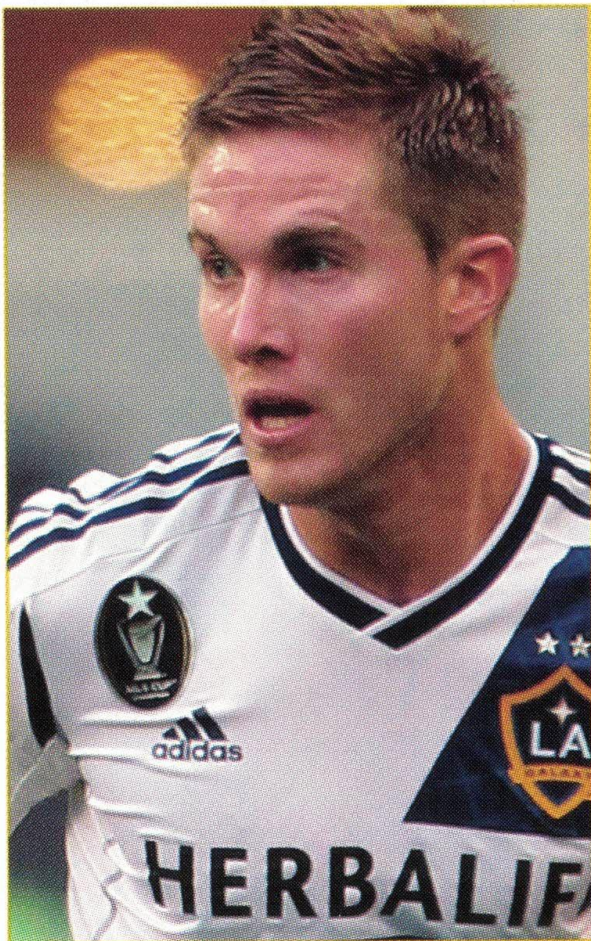

JV: Motivation and fitness. And getting a rhythm with the guys. Knowing how they play, knowing where I can fit in to help them out.

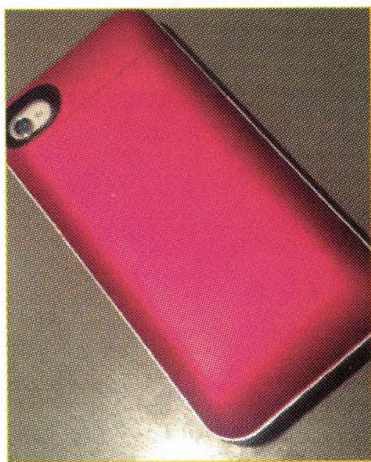

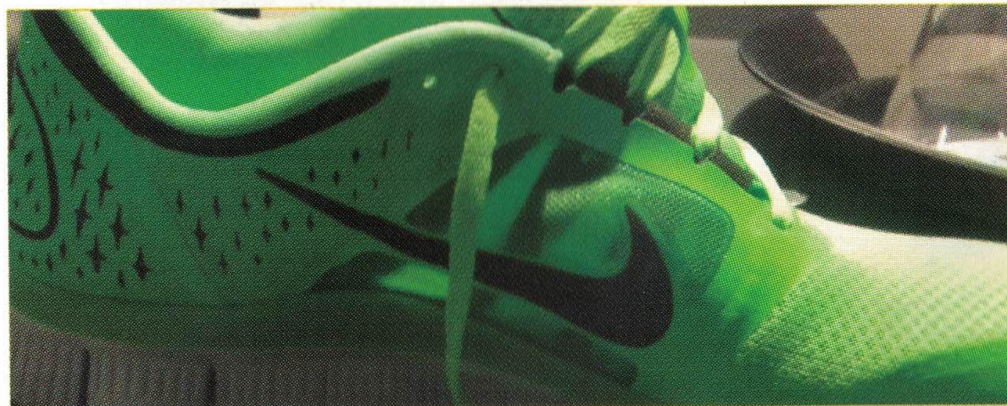
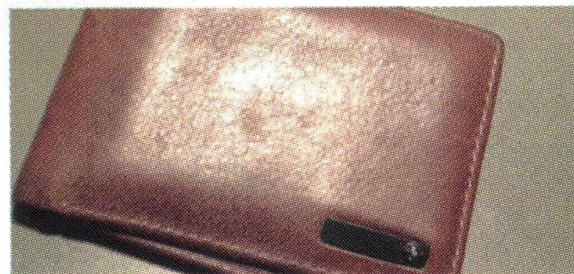

THE RIVALRY IS BACK

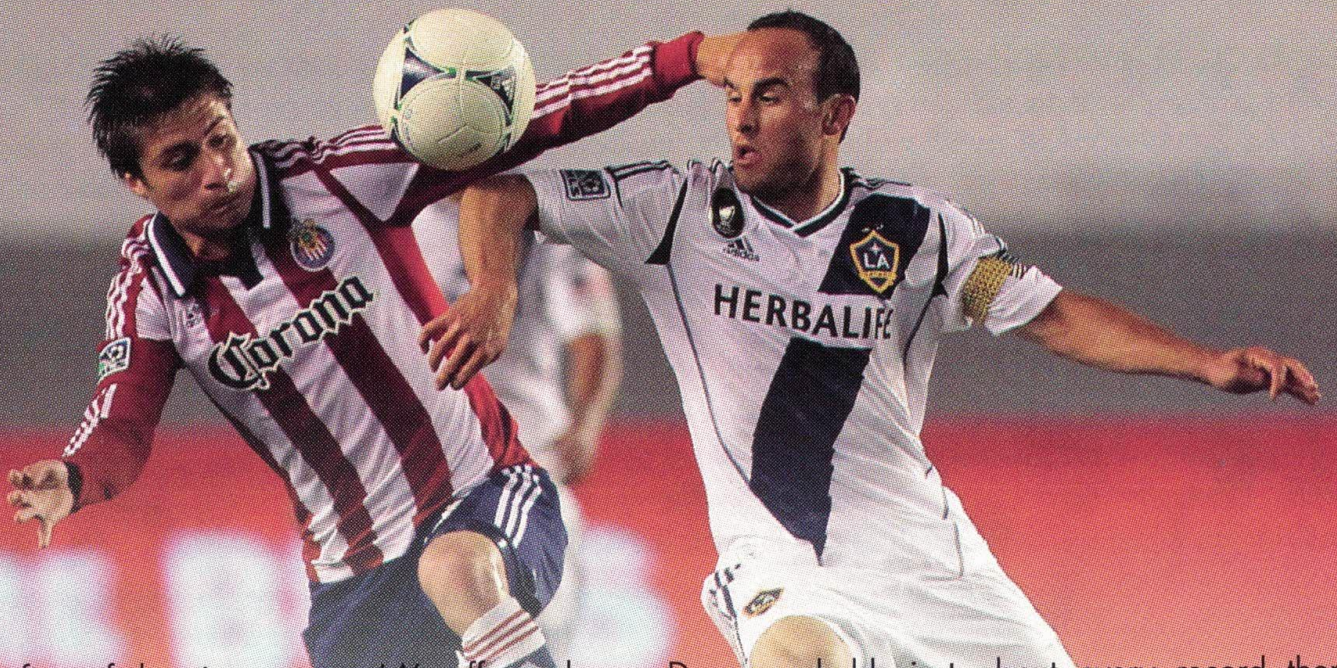
Rivalries can be born from any number of reasons, but none of them probably as powerful as proximity. Two teams and passionate fan bases occupying the same region or city can't help but develop some animosity. Now, magnify that hostility by putting the two teams in the same building and having one dominate with bigger names and a bigger trophy case and you have the SuperClasico, the rivalry developed over the last seven years between the LA Galaxy and CD Chivas USA.

Since Chivas joined MLS in 2005, they have played the role of little brother to the Galaxy. They have had to occupy the same space and see their rivals every day. The relatively young Chivas has never won a trophy, while, in contrast, the Galaxy are a storied franchise, one original club in MLS, and have won three MLS Cups, four Supporters' Shields, two US Open Cups and a CONCACAF Champions Cup.

Over the course of the rivalry, the Galaxy hold a 14-4-5 advantage. They've also won the season

series five of the six seasons. LA's offense has dominated the rivalry as well. The Galaxy have almost doubled Chivas' scoring total, netting 34 goals while conceding only 18.

Entering the 2012 season, the Galaxy had been on an especially dominant run in the SuperClasico. The defending MLS Cup champs had not lost to their in-house rivals since September 13, 2007, going 12 games unbeaten by Chivas with wins in the previous six straight meetings.

In the season's first meeting, however, Chivas broke the Galaxy streak and came away with a 1-0 win, its fourth ever. With 20 minutes left in the May 19th match, David Junior Lopes, who had been traded from Chivas to the Galaxy earlier in the year, was shown a red card for a handball on the goal line. Chivas' Jose Correa converted the resulting penalty kick for the game-winning goal. The victory marked the first time that Chivas has taken the series' opening match.

Only once, in 2007, did the Galaxy lost the season series with Chivas. After winning the first meeting, then splitting the points in the second, the Galaxy lost the season's final two matchups. After those two losses, the Galaxy went on that streak of 12 straight games without losing to their rivals. Now, after being on the losing side for the first time in almost five years, the Galaxy get a chance to be the "home" team and even the series.

Since the teams last met, Chivas have gone 2-1-4 in MLS games while also advancing to the semifinal round of the US Open Cup before being eliminated. After a midweek win, the Goats sit in sixth place in the Western Conference standings, one spot behind the Galaxy.

The Galaxy have gone 4-4-1 since losing to their rival back in May, breaking out of their disappointing start and moving up into the playoff picture. After a midweek draw with Vancouver, the Galaxy are firmly in the fifth and final Western Conference playoff spot and clear of Chivas by four points.

In his time with the Galaxy, captain Landon

Donovan holds just about every record there is against Chivas. Donovan has seven goals and eight assists all-time against the rivals, three of those scores came in one game when Donovan tallied a hat trick in the April 26, 2008 SuperClasico.

While LA still has Donovan to lead the way, Chivas is largely without their best players from SuperClasico history. Chivas' leader in both SuperClasico goals and assists, Ante Razov and Sacha Kljestan, are no longer with the club. Instead they will hope to find offense through the likes of leading scorer and former Galaxy designated player Juan Pablo Angel or US international Juan Agudelo who has only scored once since joining Chivas in May.

Two crucial additions to the Galaxy lineup in this SuperClasico will be the insertion of Robbie Keane and Josh Saunders who both missed the first meeting. After scoring twice last week against Portland, Keane is the team's leading goal scorer in 2012 with eight. The Irish striker has never taken the field in the rivalry; he was an unused substitute twice in 2011 and was left out of the first 2012 SuperClasico due to hamstring tightness. Saunders has faced Chivas USA twice, winning both while facing just seven shots total and keeping shutouts in both games.

The two teams will meet once more in the 2012 regular season. The final leg of the 2012 SuperClasico will be a Chivas "home game" on August 12.

SuperClasicos have produced games with everything from three red cards to eight goals. In a rivalry that has amassed so much history in seven seasons and counting, there is no way to predict what the newest installment will hold. Even though both teams are battling in a playoff race, the spoils of a SuperClasico victory are more than just three points. 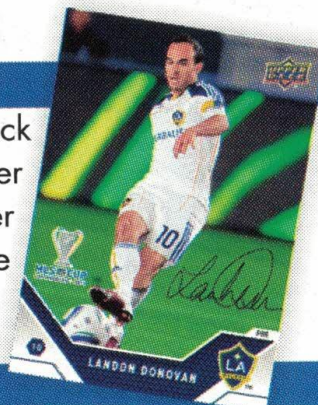

TOTTENHAM PREVIEW

Tottenham Hotspur, affectionately known to their rabid North London supporters as "Spurs," arrive in Los Angeles eager to get back to simply playing soccer after some uncertain and stressful time off.

Though historically a mid-table club, Tottenham have recently established themselves as a new force in English football, finishing 5th place or better in each of the last three seasons. Two years removed from a thrilling Champions League run that included exciting victories over Milan giants Inter and AC, the club from White Hart Lane looked set to return to football's grandest stage when they bolted out of the gate to start the 2011-2012 Premier League Season. Following back-to-back losses to Manchester United and Manchester City to start the season, Tottenham ripped off a 10-game unbeaten streak in EPL play

and won 14 of their next 17 matches to set up seemingly permanent residence in the league's top 3. But February arrived to cool the white-hot Spurs off, and after suffering a shock 5-2 defeat at the hands of bitter rivals Arsenal FC, Tottenham found themselves scrambling to hold off the hard-charging Gunners and cling to third place.

Alas for Spurs, it was not to be.

A winless stretch in April doomed the club to a fourth place finish, where they could only watch helplessly as Didier Drogba buried his penalty kick against Bayern Munich in the Champions League Final to clinch an unorthodox automatic bid into next year's tournament for the sixth-place Blues and relegate Spurs to the significantly less lucrative Europa League.

Now, Spurs enter The Home Depot Center as a team

in flux. Chairman Daniel Levy sacked charismatic manager Harry Redknapp and replaced him with Portuguese prodigy Andre Villas-Boas, but that transition is just the beginning. The stunning last-second loss of their Champions League berth means Spurs have to sell top players who want to return to top European competition while compensating for the loss of extra revenue. Though Spurs fans will miss departing stalwart defender Verdran Cor Luka and Russian forward Roman Pavlyuchenko, the key expected loss will come from midfield maestro Luka Modric, who badly wants to return to Champions League football and has heavily linked with a move to upcoming LA Galaxy opponents Real Madrid. In response to this potential loss, Spurs are heavily pursuing Portuguese International Joao Moutinho as a replacement to pair with central midfielder Scott Parker and Northern Irishman Gylfi Sigurdsson, a recent signing from Hoffenheim who flourished on loan with Swansea FC this past year.

Despite the midfield turmoil, Spurs have the potential to score in bunches. Either Modric or his replacement Joao Moutinho will join forces with former Real Madrid man Rafael Van Der Vaart to direct an attack featuring budding superstar winger Gareth Bale, recently signed and forward Emanuel Adebayor, and Mexican National Team star Giovanni Dos Santos, who's still under contract with Tottenham. Though Van Der Vaart can control possession and create a fair share of chances, Tottenham will be even more dangerous on a counterattack where long passes

from Benoit Assou-Ekotto and Bale's tremendous pace create room for crosses in to Adebayor and Dos Santos. Spurs are also bolstered by the available options of quick-footed forward Aaron Lennon and reliable England international Jermaine Defoe.

Spurs didn't finish third in the EPL with a goal differential of plus-25 simply because of offense, however, and management now attempts to fill the spots left by Modric's fellow Croatian Cor Luka and American goalkeeper Brad Friedel. Most notably, the front office has made heavy overtures to Lyon goalkeeper Hugo Lloris and Inter Milan's Julio Cesar in an attempt to make way for the 41-year old Friedel's impending retirement. In addition to keeper, Spurs have made several moves this summer to shore up the impending gap in their defense, and much is expected of young Dutchman Jan Vertonghen, a recently signed product of the famed Ajax Academy who stood out as one of the few bright spots for the Netherlands in their otherwise gloomy Euro 2012 campaign. Vertonghen will join defenseman Younes Kaboul in the center, to be flanked by fan favorites Kyle Walker and Benoit Assou -Ekotto.

Though Spurs will likely enter the contest as a team uncertain of their identity under a new manager, the squad boasts multiple world-class talents who are sure to shine through regardless of formations and locker-room chemistry. The London outfit are sure to give the Galaxy all they can handle. So, in other words, sit back and enjoy some of the best the English Premier League has to offer.

CATCHING UP WITH ROLANDO MUÑOZ

ACADEMY

The LA Galaxy's future is just as bright as the shine from the 2011 MLS Cup trophy. LA's U-16 and U-18 teams both qualified for the U.S. Soccer Development Academy playoffs, and both teams won their SoCal divisions this past year to follow up a championship season.

One of the bright young talents leading the charge is Rolando Muñoz, a Rancho Cucamonga native and the Captain of the LA Galaxy's U-16's squad. Muñoz was recently named to the USSDA U-16 Western Conference Starting XI for his work this season in the midfield, where he helps direct and control possession when he isn't scoring goals.

Muñoz' play in the USSDA, which included four goals, led to his first-ever call-up to the US Men's Under-17 National Team and an opportunity to shine at the international stage. Muñoz traveled to Costa Rica to represent his country in the Copa Saprissa Internacional tournament where he led the squad with a team-high three goals. The U.S. made it all the way to the championship game of the tournament, losing to rival Mexico, 1-3.

We sat down with Muñoz this to get to know him better and discuss his ascension through the US Development ranks...

WHO IS YOUR FAVORITE PLAYER AND WHY? WHAT PROFESSIONAL CLUB PLAYS A STYLE THAT YOU LIKE?

RM: One of my favorite players would have to be David Beckham. He is one of my favorites because he plays my position and also plays my style, which is to find the open players and send balls to the forwards. Also, taking free kicks and corner kicks, which I also do with the LA Galaxy. The club I would like (to play with) would be Barcelona because they are an excellent passing team. They also work hard to get the ball back when they loose it.

YOU WENT FROM THE U-14'S TO THE U-17'S IN ONE YEAR WHILE STILL PERFORMING AT A HIGH LEVEL. CAN YOU DESCRIBE THE DIFFERENT CHALLENGES IN THIS AGE GROUP AND HOW YOU'VE MET THEM?

RM: It was a good year for me. First of all, I would like to thank the coaches for giving me the chance to play. There are a lot of challenges in this group because all the players are good, which makes me want to work even harder, and hard work pays off because I was captain for the U-15 to U-17 (teams).

YOU ARE ONE OF THE YOUNGEST PLAYERS ON THE U-17'S SQUAD. DO PEOPLE HAVE DIFFERENT EXPECTATIONS FOR YOU? HOW DO YOU GET ALONG WITH EVERYONE?

RM: Yes, I am one of the youngest players in the U-17 Galaxy team, and no, people don't have expectations. I just go out there and play my game. Everyone gets along great with each other, we have each others back if anything happens to anyone and it's like our 2nd family.

WAS IT FUN TO GO TO COSTA RICA IN YOUR RECENT TOURNAMENT? DID YOU GET TO DO



ANYTHING OUTSIDE OF SOCCER? HOW DO YOU FEEL THE TEAM PERFORMED?

RM: Yeah, it was fun--first time traveling to Costa Rica, very nice place to visit. We went out to tour a little bit of Costa Rica on our days off. The team performed great. I think we got a good place in the tournament, which was second. Would have been nice to get first, but hey, we lost to the number one team in the world, which is Mexico, since they won the world cup last year.

HOW HAS IT BEEN PLAYING WITH THE US DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM? DO YOU LIKE INTERNATIONAL PLAY? DO YOU WANT TO PLAY FOR THE USMNT SOMEDAY?

RM: Playing in the development program was a good experience because we won league this year, both the U-16 and U-18's. It also gave me the chance to be scouted for the National team. I like playing internationally because it's a good felling knowing you are representing everyone from the U.S. It's also a faster type of soccer, which makes you better. One day I would love to play with the USMNT because that's every ones dream to represent your country.

WHAT PART OF YOUR GAME ARE YOU LOOKING TO IMPROVE MOST? WHAT DO YOU ALREADY DO WELL?

RM: The things I need to improve on is to be a little more accurate with my long passes and short passes and also work on my right foot. One thing I'm already doing well is picking my head up and checking my shoulder to see who is around me and also controlling the tempo of the game.

ARE YOU LOOKING TO PLAY COLLEGE SOCCER? OR WOULD YOU PREFER TO WORK TOWARDS A PROFESSIONAL CONTRACT WITH THE CLUB LIKE JACK MCBEAN OR JOSE VILLARREAL? IF YOU DO GO TO COLLEGE, WILL YOU STAY CLOSE TO LOS ANGELES TO POTENTIALLY KEEP PRACTICING WITH THE GALAXY?

RM: I am still going to be playing with Galaxy and I really don't know what is going to happen in the future. If an opportunity like that is offered I would take it. It would also be nice to get my studies because I want something to fall back on if anything happens, but I would like to stay here, close to Los Angeles, if I do go to college.
