Major League Soccer and U.S. Soccer Sign Landmark Television and Media Rights Partnerships with ESPN, FOX and Univision Deportes

Eight-year Agreements Begin in 2015; Nationally-televised Matches will be Anchored on Friday and Sunday

Major League Soccer and U.S. Soccer have signed new television and media rights partnerships with ESPN, FOX Sports and Univision Deportes, reaching eight-year agreements with the networks to televise MLS and U.S. Soccer matches in the United States through the end of 2022. The announcement was made today by MLS Commissioner Don Garber, U.S. Soccer CEO/General Secretary Dan Flynn, ESPN, Inc. President and Disney Media Networks Co-Chairman John Skipper, FOX Sports 1 and FOX Sports 2 General Manager and Chief Operating Officer David Nathanson and Univision Deportes President Juan Carlos Rodriguez.

For the first time in Major League Soccer's history, all three television partners will feature an exclusive MLS Match of the Week, providing soccer fans throughout the country with a destination day and time for each network. The Univision family of networks will televise a game of the week on Friday evenings - primarily on UniMás - and a wrap-up show on Sundays. The Friday night match on the Univision family of networks will be the first time a Spanish-language television network will have its own exclusive night with a major professional sports league based in the United States.

Soccer fans will be able to enjoy a doubleheader of MLS action every Sunday, as ESPN and FOX Sports 1 will televise back-to-back MLS matches on Sundays at 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. ET, respectively. More than 125 MLS matches will be televised annually on the three networks.

The new agreements also will include extensive marketing and promotional support from all network

partners, including dedicated campaign support and cross-promotion across all three networks for upcoming MLS and U.S. Soccer matches. In addition, ESPN, FOX Sports and Univision Deportes will develop multi-platform initiatives to build the profile of MLS and U.S. Soccer players, including tune-in campaigns, digital content and shoulder programming, social media marketing and integration of MLS and U.S. Soccer stars in network programs such as the ESPYS and Premio Lo Nuestro.

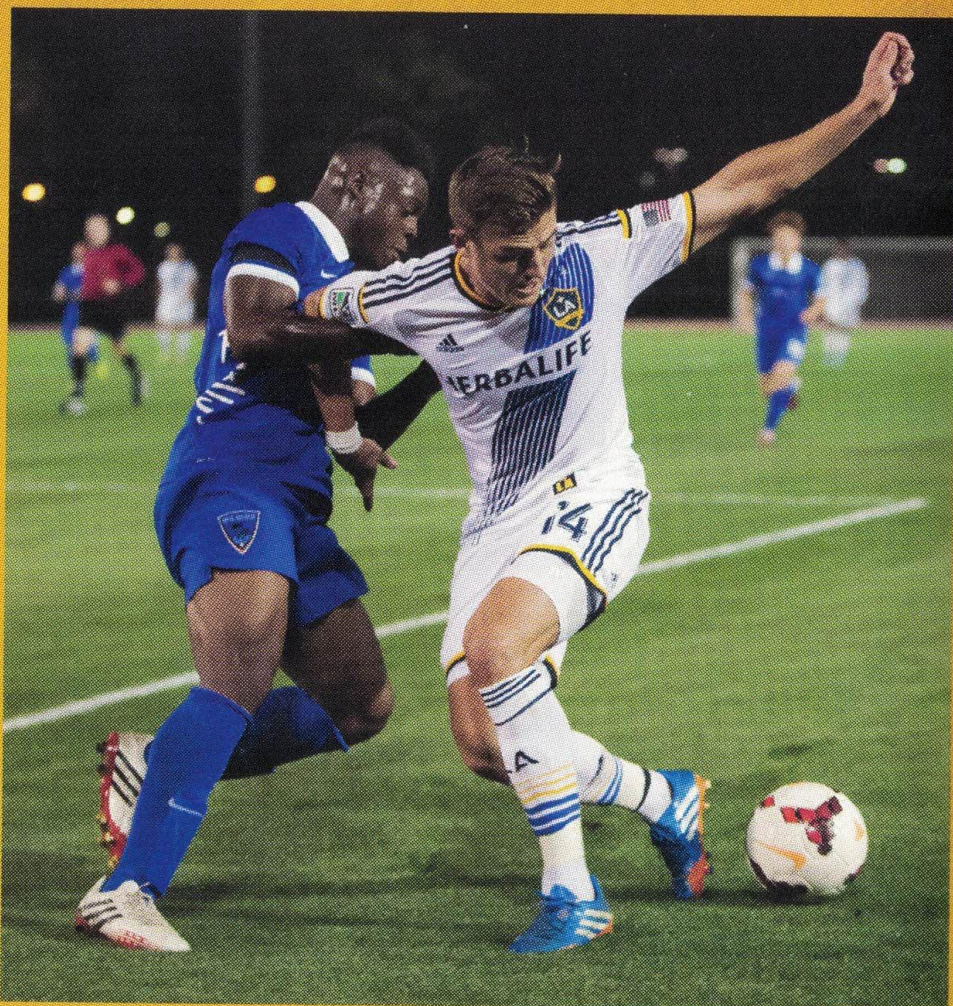
ESPN has broadcast MLS matches since the league's inception in 1996, and the new agreement will extend ESPN's partnership with the league to 27 seasons. Fox Sports returns to MLS after previously broadcasting the league's games from 2003 to 2011. Univision's new agreement with MLS will extend the relationship between the nation's top Spanish-language network and the league to 20 seasons.

With national television broadcasts anchored on Fridays and Sundays, MLS clubs will have exclusivity on Saturdays, allowing for additional flexibility to schedule games. All of the Saturday MLS matches will be available via the new out-of-market package on ESPN3 and WatchESPN.

"We are extremely pleased to have extended our partnerships with ESPN, FOX Sports and Univision," said U.S. Soccer President Sunil Gulati. "The commitment made by our television partners to broadcast such a wide range and quantity of games demonstrates the growing demand for soccer in our country and provides a platform for our growing fan base to follow the game both for club and country."

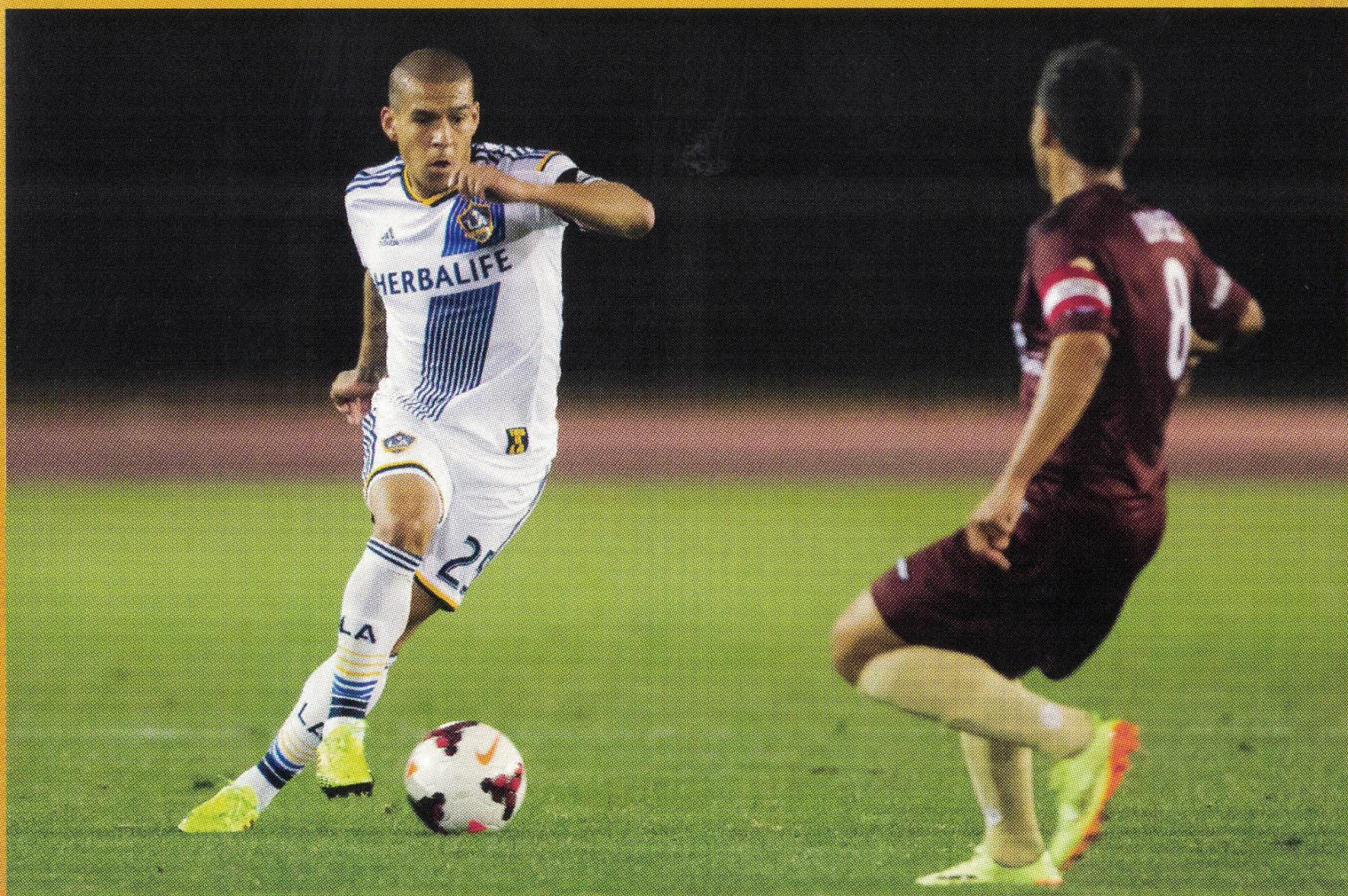

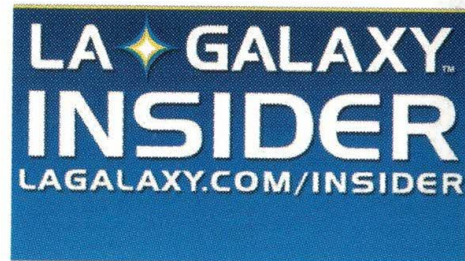

Q&A with Undefeated co-founder James Bond



LA Galaxy Insider Adam Serrano talks to James Bond about Undefeated's collaboration with the LA Galaxy

The LA Galaxy unveiled the LA Galaxy x Undefeated 2014 Field Collection in an exclusive collaboration with sports lifestyle brand Undefeated on April 10, 2014.

The collection will feature the combination of the Galaxy logo along with the Undefeated brand imagery as well as other iconic symbols from Los Angeles sports culture as well as the world of football.

LA Galaxy Insider Adam Serrano spoke to Undefeated co-founder James Bond about the collaboration between his brand and the Galaxy.

LA GALAXY INSIDER: What served as the inspiration for this collaboration with the LA Galaxy and Undefeated?

JAMES BOND: It's always important to work with professional organizations because it allows us to expand the scope of Undefeated and how we're perceived. The inspiration was our motto at Undefeated which is 'sport is war.' The scope is not just the actual playing of the game, but it's the before and it's the after. Most of the inspiration with the Galaxy collaboration was the preparation of going into battle and charting the course. It's about checking the stars and looking into the future while also remembering the past.

INSIDER: You redesigned the LA Galaxy crest in several of your products with a sword through the center. Can you explain this move?

BOND: If you think about some of the clubs in Europe, there's such a history of crests and shields and we gave our version of what that crest may look like.

INSIDER: What's your own connection to the sport of soccer?

BOND: My connection with soccer is still fairly young as I played football and hockey growing up, but I started playing soccer to keep fit as an adult. From there, I fell in love with it. All my kids play and I've developed a deep respect for the game. It's

a hard sport to learn in terms of the muscle memory required, but when you watch it, it's really quite elegant. We're just psyched being a part of it from beginning to end.

INSIDER: Throughout your catalog, there is a profound influence of Los Angeles and Southern California imagery; can you explain the reason for this?

BOND: We're a Los Angeles-based company and we want to make sure that we give back in the right way so even though we're sports-centric, we're L.A. driven in terms of our color ways, fonts and expression. We're fortunate to have some of the greatest teams in our city like the Lakers, Galaxy and the Dodgers, there's a great sports history.

INSIDER: Your brand's defining feature is the five stripes logo, can you explain what this particular logo means?

BOND: The five stripes mean multiple things to us: It is how we kept count when we were younger and during World War II when bombers completed successful missions they'd put the marks on their planes.

INSIDER: You have a prior relationship with the LA Galaxy through David Beckham. Did that help facilitate this collaboration?

BOND: It was a definite way in because they were familiar with my work. Even just walking around, I see people that I remember from when I was working with David and bringing stuff to him down at training sessions. It's very easy.

INSIDER: You use Galaxy defenders Omar Gonzalez and A.J. DeLaGarza as the models of the line, why did you choose them to represent your brand?

BOND: Both players are young and what Undefeated is all about. Watching David pass the torch to Omar as the next guy to lead the Galaxy and A.J. being the guy right behind him, we tagged those two as the players that represented us the best.



Juninho flourishing in new midfield role

The Brazilian midfielder has been asked to facilitate the attack from a more defensive position

Juninho began the season with dreams of becoming one of the Galaxy's main offensive weapons, but six games into the season, things have turned out quite differently for the Brazilian midfielder.

Juninho, who is one of just four players to start each of the team's five regular season games this season, has been routinely stationed at the bottom of Galaxy head coach Bruce Arena's new diamond midfield. From his position shielding the back four, the Brazilian's primary role is to break up opposition attacks and then quickly pass the ball forward.

"He's playing very well," said Arena. "He's a good player going forward as well, but I think that he's on the ball a bit more with the way that we're playing. He's a good possession player and he's in form right now."

Having a primarily defensive responsibility is not a new concept for Juninho as he has often been stationed as a defensive-minded central midfielder throughout his five-year stint with the club. Now his passing ability is central to LA's diamond midfield as he is able to connect with the likes of Stefan Ishizaki and Baggio Husidic.

The Brazilian says he owes his strong start to starting

the preseason with the Galaxy for the first time since joining the club. Injuries and trips to former club Sao Paulo caused him to miss significant time during the preseason in past years.

"[Defensive midfield] is not necessarily my best position, but I feel very comfortable playing behind our midfielders," said Juninho. "I know that I can pass the ball whether it's short or long which helps my team. It's a big advantage for us."

"I was expecting to go forward more this year, score a lot of goals, but you never know," Juninho added. "The coach has a different mentality in the beginning of the season... and the team did so well so far."

But ultimately no matter where Juninho plays in the center of the park, the Brazilian midfielder simply wants to have an impact on the field.

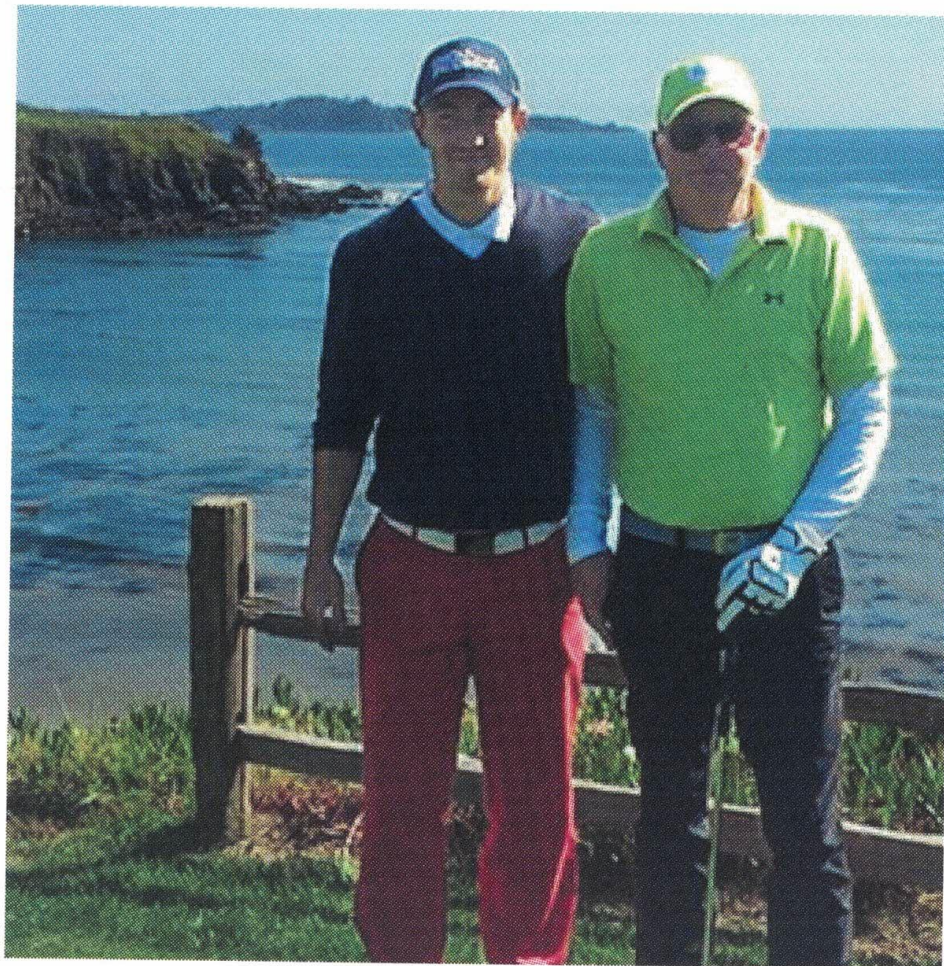
"The midfield is midfield," he says. "It doesn't matter if I have to hold or go forward, you just have to understand the game."

Stefan Ishizaki loving his time in California

The Swedish midfielder recently visited two of the state's most famous golf courses

CARSON, Calif. – It wasn't as if the LA Galaxy's Stefan Ishizaki needed a break from the MLS regular season.

But a trip to the Monterey Peninsula to play two of the most famous golf courses in the world during a bye week in April was something he had to make.

So he and a friend who flew in from his home country of Sweden headed north to play Pebble Beach Golf Links and Spyglass Hill Golf Course, and Ishizaki returned with an understandable grin on his face.

"I was very humbled by the experience," he said after training this week. "Sometimes you play a course and shoot a low score and you think you're a good player. Those two courses brought me back to earth."

Ishizaki, a native of Stockholm, Sweden who signed with the Galaxy as a free agent during the offseason, has been growing more and more acclimated to Southern California and the state in general.

"I've been pretty comfortable from the get-go," he said. "Everyone's so nice and helpful. I feel like that's the case in all of California."

"The transition from Europe has been very easy."

And what better way to add to his impressions of the West Coast than to venture to one of the world's golf meccas?

Ishizaki booked tee times a couple of months in advance and stayed at The Links at Spanish Bay, another of the more renowned courses on the peninsula. He didn't play that course – "But I got to watch golfers play the first hole," he said with a grin – but he was more than happy to play Spyglass last Saturday and Pebble Beach on Sunday.

At Spyglass, he said, he came face to face with a member of the area's wildlife.

He was preparing to tee off on his final hole when he looked up and notice a deer no more than 20 yards ahead of him right in his line. And it wouldn't move.

"I went up towards him to try and shoo him away, and he didn't go for that," Ishizaki said with a grin. "I had to go up with my driver and tap him on his back to get him to move."

Ishizaki, a solid player with a 6.9 handicap/index, finished with an 85, a highly respectable score on a course generally acknowledged to be one of the toughest in the U.S.

Then it was on to Pebble Beach, home to Jack Nicklaus' favorite shot in golf, the approach on the par-4 eighth – Ishizaki wound up with a disappointing bogey after what he thought was a perfect second shot rolled off the back of the green – and one of the most famous holes in the world, the par-five 18th.

There was just one problem. Ishizaki and his friend couldn't play it because it was too dark.

"But at least I got to have brunch by it and look out and see all the players play it," he said.

Ishizaki said his goal is to play some of the best courses in the world – the Old Course at St. Andrews, Scotland, Riviera Country Club in Pacific Palisades and Chicago's Cog Hill are high among his future destinations – but at least he can scratch Pebble Beach and Spyglass Hill off his list of must-plays.

"It was a dream come true," he said with a smile. "I want to go back ... next weekend, actually."

LA Galaxy Homegrown Players reunite for United States Under-21 camp at StubHub Center

McBean, Sorto and Villarreal start their Olympic dreams

The gang is back together.

LA Galaxy Homegrown Players Jack McBean, Oscar Sorto and Jose Villarreal were each called up to Tab Ramos' United States U-21 squad for a four-day long training camp, which began on April 20, 2014. All three participated in the U.S. U-21's friendly match against Club Tijuana at StubHub Center on April 23.

"It's a good group of guys here at this camp and it's great to see some familiar faces," said McBean. "I know a lot of these guys from past camps, but especially Jose and Oscar as we've played together with the reserves and the academy. I'm happy to play with them again"

After spending the 2013 season subsisting on limited first team minutes and reserve games, all three players were sent on loan with the hopes of earning significant playing time. McBean and Sorto were sent to LA's USL PRO affiliate LA Galaxy II where they have been regular starters for **Los Dos** head coach Curt Onalfo's side while Villarreal was loaned to Liga MX giant Cruz Azul.

Although Villarreal's Mexican sojourn has resulted in limited appearances with Cruz Azul Hidalgo, the Mexican club's second-division affiliate, and their U-20 side, the

Inglewood-native is pleased with the chance to return home for the brief camp.

"It's good to be back with the same group again that we played with in Mexico and in Turkey. I'm pleased that Tab called me up for the camp and I'm just happy to be here with my old friends," Villarreal said. "It's great to see Jack and Oscar too. I got to spend a lot of time with them while I was with the reserves and I went to visit my old teammates as well, so I'm enjoying my time back here."

While all three of the players said all the right things about being back together again just a stone's throw away from their old Galaxy training pitch, the focus is a simple one for all three: prove to Ramos that they deserve inclusion in future camps and, perhaps, the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro.

"The fact that Tab Ramos called me up lets me know that I've been doing my job with Galaxy II," said Sorto. "I'm hoping to play well so that Tab can keep calling me up for these types of camps. I want to convince the coaches that I'm ready for the Olympics and maybe one day, the next World Cup."

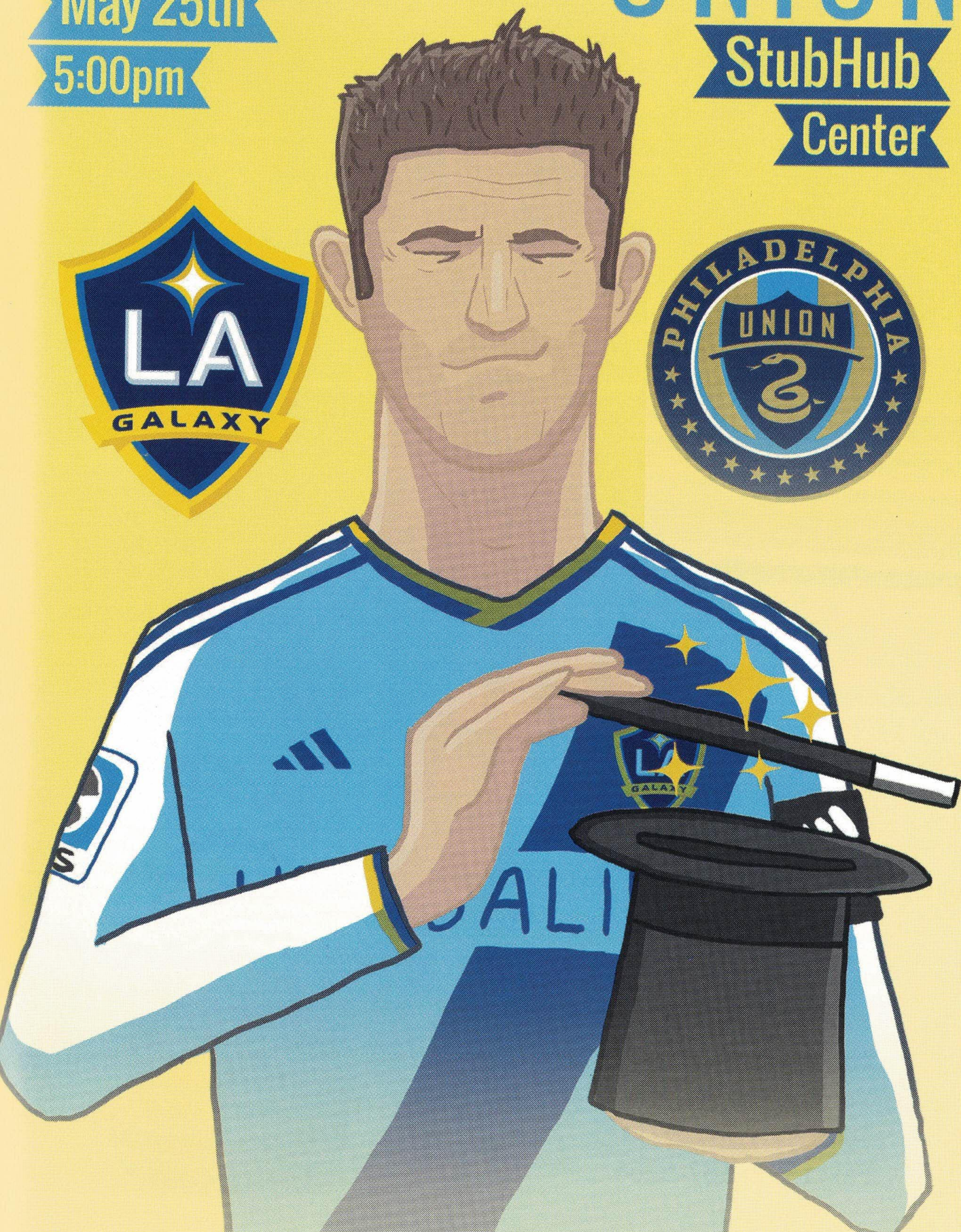
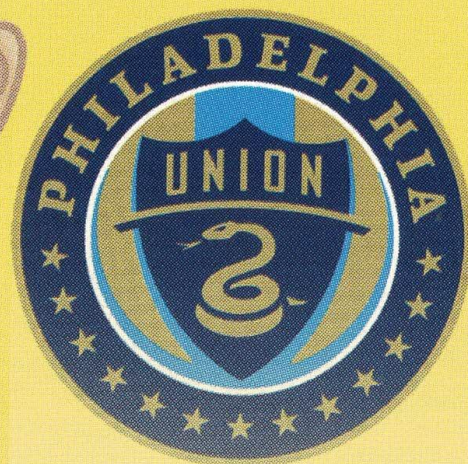

Landon Donovan says he's at his best as he departs for U.S. National Team World Cup training camp

Donovan feeling confident and ready for national team camp after strong performance in Portland

Landon Donovan's pursuit to reach his fourth FIFA World Cup is on.

On Monday, Donovan and Galaxy teammate Omar Gonzalez were named to the 30-man U.S. National Team preliminary roster ahead of the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

Donovan, who has shined at the World Cup with five goals in 12 games played, will be seeking to reach his fourth World Cup. Meanwhile, Gonzalez will hope to reach his first after bursting onto the national team scene a year ago.

After publicly stating his desire to go into camp with confidence, Donovan shined in LA's 1-1 draw with the Portland Timbers on May 11, 2014 as Galaxy head coach Bruce Arena went as far as to label him as the "best player on the field."

Donovan admitted that he's finally hitting his stride.

"I feel great. I feel fit and I feel sharp. I feel like I'm coming into form and I'm confident. I feel good and ready," said Donovan. "I'm excited [for camp]. It's a long month-and-a-half and there are a lot of pieces that go into it, but for me, it'll be nice to be in camp and that will be the sole focus for the next two months."

Although Donovan has yet to score his MLS regular season record-breaking 135th goal, the forward has started in seven matches this season for the Galaxy,

tallying two assists.

The Galaxy know that they'll need to step up in the absence of Donovan and Gonzalez.

"We have players that have to step up to the plate and take the opportunities that will come their way," said LA Galaxy forward Robbie Keane. "This is what it means to have a squad of players, we're certainly going to miss those two, but it's important that everyone pulls together. Whether you're starting or on the bench, everyone has to be ready. It's important that they all take advantage of the situation and make the most of it."

Donovan agrees.

"There are a lot of guys that have competed well and want minutes and this is their chance. We need to keep playing well and we need to get some results," said Donovan. "Fortunately, we have a lot of guys with experience who have been waiting for their turn and it's time to prove that they belong on the field."

Amid all the chatter that says that Donovan may not be a lock for Klinsmann's 23-man roster, the Galaxy and U.S. National Team stalwart is doing his best to stay focused on the task at hand—earning his spot on that plane to Brazil.

"I'm going to control what I can do," said Donovan. "I'm going to play well and I'm going to compete, I'm going to be good in every way and at the end of the day, it's not my decision, but I'll do my best to make the team."
