Experienced additions key to the LA Galaxy as they hope to recapture MLS Cup



Friend, Ishizaki, Husidic, Riley and Samuel bring the experience that was missing in 2013

return to MLS Cup in 2014, the LA Galaxy are betting heavily on experienced, battle-tested faces to restore the team's place at the summit of MLS.

Immediately after their disappointing Western Conference Semifinal defeat to Real Salt Lake, Galaxy head coach and general manager Bruce Arena wasted no time retooling his squad. Over the offseason, the Galaxy added Canadian forward Rob Friend, MLS veteran Baggio Husidic, Swedish international Stefan Ishizaki, league mainstay James Riley and talented Brazilian forward Samuel to the fold.

With the Galaxy hoping to challenge the likes of Real Salt Lake and the Portland Timbers, Arena believed that acquiring veteran leadership was vital.

"A big part of this team this year is that we're going to have good depth and experienced players that can play a lot of roles throughout the season," said head coach Bruce Arena. "We're hopeful that our team is a little bit better and a little bit more consistent because if there was a weakness last year, it's that we were inconsistent.

"We were one of the top teams in league in terms of scoring goals and one of the top teams defending. Yet, the results were inconsistent," Arena continued. "I'm hoping that we have a little bit more quality and a little bit more experience this year that will allow us to play more consistently."

During the ill-fated 2013 season, the Galaxy attack went as far as the play of Landon Donovan and Robbie Keane carried them with the duo accounting for 26 goals and 20 assists. And that was most apparent when the team fell to RSL as both failed to find the back of the net as the Galaxy missed out on qualifying for the Western

Conference Championship for the first time since 2008.

To help out the Designated Player tandem, Arena acquired a pair of accomplished target men in Friend and Samuel to supplement their output. Both bring an accomplished pedigree with Friend, 33, having spent the last 11-years in Europe while Samuel, 23, was a first team regular for Brazilian giants Fluminense.

"It gives us a lot of weapons. We haven't that kind of firepower since I've been here," said Donovan. "We have a lot of attacking players that can make real plays. The more players that you have like that on the field, the better it is."

The changes didn't stop there as the additions of Husidic and Riley provide needed depth at the defensive midfield and outside back positions, which were thin at times last season.

But perhaps more importantly, the Galaxy added yet another weapon on the flanks with the acquisition of Ishizaki. Wide play has long been a cause for concern for the Galaxy and the acquisition of Ishizaki—as well as the ever-maturing Gyasi Zardes—gives LA much needed width.

"[Ishizaki] is a very good passer. Very composed and experienced. He gives us a little something different in the midfield," said Arena. "He'll make plays that amount to something. We have a lot of players with a lot of energy with good intentions, but he's the player that will make the final pass."

Some of the faces may be different, but the end goal is the same: helping the Galaxy win an unprecedented fifth MLS Cup.

"I didn't move to L.A. to just play," said Ishizaki. "I'm here to win."



LA Galaxy and LA Galaxy II reap dividends in inaugural White vs. Blue match

Galaxy II get a valuable lesson in White vs. Blue game

andon Donovan said it best, the inaugural "White vs. Blue" game between the LA Galaxy and LA Galaxy II was a "win-win for everybody."

The Galaxy first team defeated their USLPRO counterparts 3-0 on February 22, thanks to a brace from Robbie Keane and a goal by Samuel in front of a boisterous crowd at StubHub Center.

The match served a valuable purpose for both sides as it allowed Bruce Arena's group to move forward in their preseason while Galaxy II received a first-hand look at what it takes to compete at the MLS level.

"We were pretty aware of what we were trying to get out of the game, but I thought [LA Galaxy II] played very well," said Arena. "I was very impressed with them. [Galaxy II head coach Curt Onalfo] has a good group to build a team from.

"We were okay on the night. It wasn't anything great," Arena added. "We weren't as sharp as we needed to be due to some mental lapses. We could have been better; I thought they did better than us tonight."

The first team's dominance was spearheaded by the play of Keane who started and went 70 minutes in the victory. A threat from the opening whistle, Keane needed just two minutes to find the back of the net after launching a ball from nearly 40 yards that caught Galaxy II goalkeeper Cody Laurendi way off his line. Looking ever sharper, LA's captain tallied again in the 24th minute and set up Samuel's 68th minute goal with a dicing run through the defense. Following his brace, it was no shock that the Irishman was all smiles.

"Tonight I felt very strong. It was a good run out for me today," said Keane. " [Meanwhile] for these younger players [with LA Galaxy II], it's a bit of a learning curve for them, but I thought that they did very well, especially when you think that [LA Galaxy Technical Director Jovan Kirovski] put this team together in the last month or so."

On the other side of the field, Galaxy II repeatedly tested their parent club with several dangerous opportunities that were spearheaded by Galaxy Homegrown Players Raul Mendiola and Jack McBean. It wasn't just the Galaxy Homegrowns that were dangerous however as newcomers Travis Bowen and Max Griffin each had chances to put one on the board, but were unable to find the back of the net.

Although the result wasn't a victory, Onalfo was overjoyed with the test that his group received in just their second ever match.

"The game was awesome. We had great fan support which was really fun to see. I was just disappointed that we couldn't give the fans a goal or two so we could have made it a closer game on the scoresheet," Onalfo said. "I think that they saw two good teams playing, but it would have been nicer to have a goal. It's a great step in the right direction for our club and something that we're going to look forward to every year."

And Onalfo isn't alone in that sentiment.

"I think that it was great. Hopefully it becomes a real fun tradition. It's great for those guys and it's great for our fans," said Donovan.



The LA Galaxy continue to add top local talent with the signings of Bradford Jamieson IV and Raul Mendiola

The Galaxy have now signed a total of seven Academy players in their history

he talent well produced by the rich Southern California soccer market is continuing to be tapped by the LA Galaxy.

On February 20, the Galaxy inked two new Homegrown Players, Raul Mendiola and Bradford Jamieson IV, just hours apart from one another. With the signings, the Galaxy have now signed a total of seven Academy players in their history, which is tied for second in MLS with the Columbus Crew. FC Dallas have signed a

Mendiola, 19, is a three-time Development Academy Starting XI selection and two-time U.S. Developmental Academy Player of the Year, who made nine appearances with the Galaxy Reserves a year ago. The attacking midfielder has split this preseason between the LA first team and LA Galaxy II.

total of 11 since the Academy's inception.

"It's been a long journey and I thank everyone that supported me on the way," Mendiola said. "This is just the beginning and I know that I still have to work but I'm excited to get to this point and be part of this team."

Not to be outdone, Jamieson brings his own shining resume.

A one-time NSCAA All-American selection, the 17-year-old Jamieson completed four semesters with the U.S. Under-17 team and made three appearances for the Galaxy reserve team in 2013. This season, Jamieson has made 11 appearances for the Galaxy U-18's

in U.S. Soccer Developmental Academy play, tallying three goals.

Jamieson has been a regular contributor for the Galaxy first team during the preseason with four appearances.


"This is just the start," he said. "I was barely scratching the surface and, yes, I broke out of the youth system, but now I'm right back to the bottom and I have to earn my way to the top again."


The attacking outside midfielder also holds another interesting distinction as the first Homegrown signing in club history that is younger than the team itself. The Galaxy Academy product was born on October 20, 1996, just two days before the LA played in the inaugural MLS Cup against D.C. United at RFK Stadium.

"It's a good sign for MLS that we're now signing players that are younger than the league itself. That's a great sign. We hope that it will continue," said Galaxy head coach Bruce Arena who led DCU to 3-2 victory over the Galaxy in the 1996 MLS Cup.

Where the former U.S. youth international fits in the Galaxy's system still remains to be seen, but Arena believes that he should receive minutes no matter where he's placed.

"We think that he's a fine young talent," Arena added. "We think that he has a good future and he has a great opportunity with the Galaxy and Galaxy II to develop over the next couple of years and chase his dream of playing for the Galaxy."


