As a result of the partnership, the Galaxy have a greater foothold and strengthen their presence in the soccer rich South Bay region.

The LA Galaxy South Bay Pre-Academy Program is designed to provide every participating Under-9 to Under-12 player with the opportunity to develop all of the necessary skills and abilities that will prepare them to one day be able to play in the LA Galaxy Academy.

Forward Kevin Negrete recently joined the LA Galaxy Academy Under-14 team after spending time with LA Galaxy South Bay's youth teams, exemplifying the way the player development process should work within the club's structure.

"The LA Galaxy Academy is excited to support all youth players in their quest to develop into quality players and people," said the LA Galaxy Academy Director Pete Vagenas. "We understand what it takes to be successful at the highest level and as a result want to share our resources and knowledge with our youngest players through LA Galaxy South Bay. We look forward to continuing to develop this Pre-Academy Program further in order that we may see more and more players like Kevin Negrete work their way into LA Galaxy Academy."

The LA Galaxy South Bay Pre-Academy Program has a comprehensive curriculum that is designed to develop the complete soccer player by implementing physically and mentally demanding training sessions, and off-the field education on things such as proper nutrition and game

analysis

The creation of the Pre-Academy Program expands the Galaxy's reach within the California youth soccer community, provides the club with a unique opportunity to develop players at a younger level and creates younger teams, allowing the club to a deeper player pool for the Galaxy Academy.

Additionally, the LA Galaxy also announced that current LA Galaxy South Bay Boys Director of Coaching and Interim Technical Director Michael Quigley has been named as the LA Galaxy Academy Under-13 head coach. Quigley will retain his position as the Galaxy South Bay Boys Director of Coaching in addition to his new duties as head coach of the LA Galaxy Academy U-13's.

"I am delighted to have been selected to work with the Under-13 LA Galaxy Academy team as this group of young players has a very bright future in the Academy program," said Quigley. "I believe the relationship that we have created and that is continuing to evolve will serve the needs our younger players as well as the LA Galaxy Academy and in time, the first team."

In addition to coaching the LA Galaxy Academy U-13's, Quigley's role is to oversee the development of the boys program from the U-7 to U-18 levels and also to serve as a direct liaison between the LA Galaxy South Bay Pre-Academy Program and the LA Galaxy Academy.

Quigley has been involved with the South Bay club for eight years and his achievements as both director and coach have been significant. In just the last several years, his teams have won State Cup (2010 & 2011), were semi-finalists (2013), and reached the quarterfinals (2012 and 2013).



## **Emotional Landon Donovan breaks** MLS goal scoring record and moves on from World Cup snub

t was the type of welcome home that a U.S. Soccer legend deserved. Fresh off a tumultuous week that saw him

excluded from the U.S. National Team's 23-man roster for the 2014 FIFA World Cup, Landon Donovan scored two goals in the LA Galaxy's 4-1 victory over the Philadelphia Union on May 25, 2104, to take sole possession of the MLS all-time regular season goal scoring record.

Inspired from the get-go, it took just 112 seconds for Donovan to give the Galaxy the lead as he launched a

pinpoint free kick in the direction of Leonardo that the Brazilian center back slotted into the back of the net. Following a slow end to the first half for the Galaxy, it was Donovan to the rescue with his record-breaking goal.

The goal came as so many of Donovan's had in the past as Robbie Keane launched a pass across the goalmouth to Donovan who tapped it into the back of the net. Clearly emotional, Donovan dropped to his knees before a mob of Galaxy teammates surrounded MLS' new all-time goal scoring king.

"It's been a long week. It's hard not to make it about me, and I don't necessarily want it to be that way, but you know that I've sacrificed a lot to be in the position that I'm in," said Donovan. "I was very happy for myself, I've dedicated a lot to this, and I thought I deserved what happened today.

"To be honest when I scored, I wasn't thinking of the record. It only occurred to me 10 seconds into the celebrating. It's great. I mean, it really is," he later added. "I think more importantly, I enjoy the rest of the season, keep helping our team. I want to get back to enjoying football. This has been a week where I had moments I fell out of love for it a little bit. I want to make sure I keep enjoying it."

With the Galaxy up three goals, Donovan added his second goal of the evening and his 156th overall in the 81st minute off a pass from who else but Keane.

Throughout the match, the home faithful showed their support of Donovan as the StubHub Center was awash in Donovan jerseys, banners adorning his name, U-S-A chants, and all fanfare imaginable. And it was at the 82nd minute that the crowd was at their loudest as Donovan received a standing ovation from all 20,010 in attendance at StubHub Center after his sterling performance.

For a player that has received an outflowing of support from many across the sporting globe, the warm reception was part of an overwhelming few days.

"It's incredible," said Donovan. "You have no idea how many messages I've received-literally, thousands of messages from people around the country, around the world. People who've said, I'm a diehard Sounders fan, I'm a diehard D.C. United fan—I've hated you all my life on the field. I'm so happy for you. I respect what you've done and all those things. The support has been overwhelming.

"It's funny the way things work out. I've said this many times in my life. I try to stay present. It's been hard," added Donovan. "All day today my mind was wandering on where else I could be today. I kept coming back to being present. Staying present, enjoy this game and do your best. I'm glad I was able to do that."

Bruce Arena and Robbie Keane did not shy away from their own compliments either.

"It was a great accomplishment. We're grateful for having him and it takes a little pressure off of him not having to worry about the record," said Galaxy head coach Bruce Arena. "Now others can chase him for the rest of his life."

Said Keane, who scored a goal of his own in the match, "I think that the script was already good enough for him before the game. He broke that record, we all knew that was going to be a matter of time. I think the timing of it couldn't have come any better for him.

But Donovan, who admitted that he was "exhausted" after a draining week, said that the challenge will be rebounding and iding the Galaxy in their push to make the playoffs. Although the 32-year-old knows that it will be difficult, he's confident that he can turn the page to help the Galaxy in their time of need.

"I'm glad today's done. I'm glad the record is done. My goal now and my challenge is don't stop playing now. We aren't even half way through the season," said Donovan.





# LA Galaxy fans flock to Hermosa Pier for U.S. National Team Viewing Party




Thousands adorned in USMNT and LA Galaxy kits lined the beach along the Hermosa Beach Pier to

# Omar Gonzalez shines in World Cup debut to help USMNT make the Round of 16

Pure and simple, Omar Gonzalez and the United States got the job done.

Making his first career start at the World Cup, the LA Galaxy center back was immense as he helped the United States largely shut down mighty Germany in a 1-0 defeat that helped the Americans advance to the Round of 16.

When word came down that the Gonzalez earned the nod over Geoff Cameron, many were surprised, but the U.S. center back was quick to repay U.S. head coach Jurgen Klinsmann's faith against Germany.

"I did my job," Gonzalez told reporters in Recife after the defeat. "I haven't been getting much luck since the very beginning of camp with my little injury, but I've always said I was going to stay ready. I got my opportunity today, and I'm just happy I could step on the field and do whatever I could to help this team go through."

From the opening whistle, Gonzalez's positioning and aerial ability were solid as he routinely shut down probing German runs up field while negating the influence of starting strikers Lukas Podolski and Thomas Mueller. Gonzalez's finest moment came early in the first half when he made a pair of back-to-back tackles in the 14th and

15th minutes respectively.

For all of Gonzalez's success, whether he has earned a permanent place in Klinsmann's starting XI remains to be seen according to the U.S. Boss.

"Everyone is so important in our group and we wanted to give Cam a break, and we don't kind of have the luxury to say that all the players can come and go every four days in games and be always on the highest level," Klinsmann said. "We were sure now with Omar coming in he was ready. He worked so hard the five, six weeks we had camp. And he was ready for it, and he showed that on the field."

It wasn't just his coaches and teammates in Brazil who were keeping a keen eye on Gonzalez's performance as his Galaxy teammate Landon Donovan was impressed by the center back's showing and backed him for a start against Belgium next week.

"I thought Omar was terrific. We've all been waiting anxiously to see Omar get a chance to play," Donovan said. "He played few minutes against Portugal, but I know he was really excited for the opportunity to play today. I think he did really well, he acquitted himself really well, he helped the team



# Curt Onalfo key to the growth of LA Galaxy Homegrown Player Bradford Jamieson IV

hen Bradford Jamieson IV scored his first professional goal on May 25, 2014, he knew just what to do.

Immediately following his stunning individual goal in

the 51st minute of LA Galaxy II's 5-0 victory over OKC Energy FC, the Galaxy Homegrown Player ran straight to Los Dos head coach Curt Onalfo and leapt into his arms. The moment was a celebration for the 17-year-old who



has become a sterling example of the player development plan that is seminal to Galaxy II's philosophy.

Once Onalfo spotted the young winger dribble through three defenders before lashing a confident strike past Energy FC's Jon Kempin and then score again minutes later, the Galaxy II boss couldn't help but crack a smile.

"I can't tell you how pleased I am with his progress over the last two and the half to three months. It has been remarkable," Onalfo said. "It's just the perfect example of why we have the Galaxy II because it provides that platform for the young players to accelerate their development. He has accelerated quicker than I expected him to do, to be honest with you.

"Back in February after we played against the Galaxy [in the White vs. Blue Game], we sat down and showed him how to really become a better professional, and he has taken it to heart," he added. "He was getting himself into a lot of chances. This week when we met with him it was all about production, so he has certainly produced."

That conversation with Jamieson IV paid major dividends on Sunday as the 17-year-old was lively in attack as his speed tested the Oklahoma City defense. Jamieson IV finally cashed in on his success in the 51stminute with his first goal USL PRO. He did not have to wait long for his second, as he tallied a near identical goal to his infamous strike in Dallas Cup earlier this year that truly sealed the win for Los Dos.

And after a successful evening, Jamieson IV did not downplay Onalfo's role in his growth.

"He has definitely told me to stay strong mentally," Jamieson said. "I've personally watched myself in games as replay just to make sure that I improved defensively, offensively and just the little things so that I can make an improvement in every game. I take everything he says to heart so I can improve as much as possible."

However, Onalfo is well aware that work is hardly done for the youngster.

"First of all he needs to have a better understanding of where to be defensively that gives him good position so he can be more effective offensively. It goes hand in hand," said Onalfo. "With each game, he has gotten more confident. Things are working better for him, [Sunday] was a perfect example where he got better as the game went along and got himself two great goals."

In light of players like Raul Mendiola, Tommy Meyer and Chandler Hoffman, who have been getting opportunities to suit up and in some instances play with the Galaxy first team, Jamieson IV believes that if he can continue his development with Los Dos, then a path to Bruce Arena's squad exists.

"I think I applied myself well with Galaxy II," Jamieson said. "When you have someone like Curt who genuinely cares about how my improvement turns out and he has given me a lot of good feedback. It's all very important to what I've done so far."
