

Match Poster Series

the LA Galaxy launched their 2015 season-long commemorative match poster series by unveiling the first poster of the Galaxy's 2015 MLS season. Each match-day poster will also serve as the cover for that match's game-day program.

Last season, the Galaxy launched the first-ever commemorative match poster series, which saw the club work with local, national and international artists to design unique posters for each home match, with a limited supply available for purchase to benefit the LA Galaxy Foundation.

Designed by artist Luke Barclay, a designer based in Torquay, England, the Galaxy vs. Fire poster depicts the Galaxy's 20-year history of trophies, including an MLS-record five MLS Cups. The Galaxy's five MLS Cup trophies are gold, with a four additional silver trophies shown for each year LA won the Western Conference Championship.

All of the proceeds from poster sales this season will go to the LA Galaxy Foundation. All commemorative match posters for the 2015 season will be available for purchase at www.lagalaxy.com/posters.


The limited edition scarf available for LA-Chicago match

The Many Evolutions Of Robbie Rogers

After a breakout year at left back in 2014, Robbie Rogers is looking to continue to grow

CARSON, Calif. – To understand the evolution of Robbie Rogers as a person and as a soccer player, one must recognize his ability to consistently reinvent himself.

Just two years ago, Rogers made international headlines when he came out and subsequently announced his retirement in a heartfelt letter that displayed the raw emotion of a man who had hid his true self for his entire life.

Less than six months later, Rogers was back on the field for the LA Galaxy en route to becoming the first openly gay athlete to play in a major American professional sport. Soon after making sports history, Rogers and noted author Eric Marcus set forth upon writing his autobiography Coming out to Play which hit finally bookshelves last November.

However, his first campaign with the Galaxy proved to be a difficult one as he was limited by injuries and inconsistent performances, which quickly turned him into the object of scorn among Galaxy fans after he was acquired for club favorite Mike Magee.

At the time, it seemed like Rogers' career in Los Angeles


was hanging by a thread.

But in 2014, the 27-year-old found new life after a successful transition from the midfield to left back, which allowed Rogers the chance to not only rediscover his form on the field but more importantly his peace of mind off of it.

"I feel happier now and more calm and peaceful. I've kind of recreated myself the past three years. I mean, three years of evolution, I'm like David Bowie," Rogers told LAGalaxy.com flashing a smile. "I just feel more peaceful now. I know who I am and so does everyone else."

The fact that Rogers' compares himself to a figure like Bowie is of little surprise as both musicians and athletes understand that their sense of reinvention is the primary key to longevity.

"Last year was insane. It is weird looking back because I had all these goals and a lot of them were accomplished. I won a championship, I contributed in a way that I want to contribute on the field, and the book for me was a success," said Rogers who embarked on a nationwide book tour just



hours after winning MLS Cup. "This year, I just really want to focus on soccer and become one of the best outside backs in the league. I know that everyone feels that we have such a good team with a strong core group. I want to continue to grow and become one of those core guys. I'm really enjoying myself."

Despite Rogers' fariy tale 2014 season, it's been a difficult journey for the now happy-go-lucky defender.

In Rogers' book, he details the years of introversion and denial that turned even moments of supposed happiness into frustration. Perhaps no moment best captures Rogers' own difficulties than his celebration after winning the 2008 MLS Cup with the Columbus Crew in his hometown of Los Angeles.

Whereas the rest of his team were partying till the wee hours of the evening, Rogers quickly excused himself from the party and found himself alone simply wondering what was missing from his life.

"I was home by 10 or 11 and in my bed at my parent's house sleeping. I remember thinking 'what is missing? This is one of the biggest nights of my career and I should be out partying, making bad decisions and being a goof.' But I was home in bed and ready to call it a night," Rogers remembers. "In 2014, it was different because when my family came onto the field, I was in tears and I was able to celebrate with them and just really be myself and be emotional and be in touch with all of that. Afterward, we went to the [team] party and I was dancing, having fun and

joking just totally comfortable with myself and who I am."

For those that know him best, like Rogers' college and club teammate, A.J. DelaGarza this change in his spirit has been a profound and welcome one.

"We were freshman and he was still one of the best players in all of college soccer. He always had that skill but I'm sure that everything off the field was driving him crazy," DeLaGarza said. "He wasn't playing much [in 2013] and was injured so when all that cleared, and there wasn't as many stories [in the media] about him then he was able to play—with a clear head—you saw the caliber of player that he is when he's got no weight on his shoulder. He's a pretty good player."

Veteran left back Todd Dunivant, whose frequent injuries in 2014 allowed Rogers to find his place on the field, added that Rogers' adaption to LA was always in the cards once he overcame the injuries that hindered him during his maddening first season at StubHub Center.


"How you integrate with a team is by being comfortable on the field. The more that he's done that then the more he's become a real part of the team," Dunivant said. "The biggest thing is that he's been healthy. When you're out of form like that and just constantly fighting to be healthy, it's just such a struggle to take your game to another level. Once he did that and found that rhythm then he was off and running again. He's always been a good player and it just took him a little bit to find that form."


A Look into the Galaxy's 2015 preseason

LA Galaxy Insider Previews the 2015 MLS Season

he LA Galaxy are preparing to enter the 2015 Major League Soccer regular season with a bull'seye on their back after housing MLS Cup for a fifth time a year ago.

But as 19 other teams prepare to try and knock the Galaxy off their perch, LA head coach Bruce Arena has issued a challenge to the rest of the league.

"Bring it on."

The Galaxy head coach has every reason to be bullish about his team heading into the season given that the club returns a majority of the squad that won the title.

While the two departures are very significant as Landon Donovan (retirement) and Marcelo Sarvas (traded to Colorado Rapids) will no longer don the blue, white and gold, LA made an immense splash this offseason by signing longtime Liverpool and England national team captain Steven Gerrard who will join the club in summer. With Gerrard not arriving until July, the Galaxy will lean on players like Baggio Husidic as well as youngsters Bradford Jamieson IV and Jose Villarreal to pick up the slack.

Given Arena's candor, it's no surprise that his players like Gyasi Zardes, who will be expected to build on his breakout 16-goal performance in 2014 carry the same swagger heading into the new season.

"I want to win trophies. I want to win the MLS Cup, the Supporters' Shield, and the U.S. Open Cup. I just want to win tournaments," Zardes said. "We have a great team here and we know that everyone wants to beat LA, but like Bruce said, we're ready for it. We're ready to take on each and every single team in this league."

But given that the Galaxy will be under considerable pressure this season, does Arena feel his team is ready?

"We prepare for this," Arena said with his signature grin. "We've been to four finals in five years. We know that we'll get each team's best shot."

While Arena may not be much for predictions, below are my prognostications for the upcoming 2015 MLS season.




