Energy FC takes on Portland Timbers FC 2 for the first time this season. The teams will meet again in Portland on June 16.

In Energy FC's last USL regular season match, the team earned a 1-0 win over Orange County SC on May 20. Playing at Taft Stadium for the first time since April 11, The Greens received a goal from **Alex Dixon** in the 35th minute. Energy FC also benefitted from a red card to Orange County defender **Oscar Sorto** in the 25th minute, allowing them to play one man up the remainder of the match. Energy FC fired a franchise record tying 21 shots toward the goal of OC goalkeeper **Charlie Lyon**, who made eight saves, the second highest total by an opponent in franchise history.

After an extended time between matches, Energy FC returns to play with a vengeance, playing three matches in the span of seven days. A Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup match on May 17 against Moreno Valley FC (UPSFL) followed by regular season matches on May 20 against Orange County and May 24 against Portland Timbers FC 2. Last week began a stretch for Energy FC where they will play two matches in any give seven-day period for the next four weeks.

Energy FC no longer owns the "title" of fewest matches played in the league. That honor goes to the Rochester Rhinos and Charlotte Independence, each with six matches played. Including Energy FC, five Western Conference teams have played only seven matches, including Swope Park Rangers, Orange County SC, Phoenix Rising FC and Reno 1868 FC.

This is the fourth ever meeting with Portland Timbers FC 2 and the first in Oklahoma City since to 2015 campaign. All-time, Energy FC owns a 2-1-0 mark, including a 1-0-0 mark in OKC.

It's that time of year when teams begin their play in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. Energy FC's next opponent in the competition is the Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC on May 31 in Colorado Springs.

A familiar face returns to Oklahoma City. Portland midfielder **Lamar Batista** is an alumni of Heritage Hall in OKC. Following a distinguished career with Heritage Hall and the Oklahoma Football Club (OFC), Batista went on to earn a roster spot at the University of California - Santa Barbara. Following a season there, he was signed by the Portland Timbers and is playing with the T2 squad.

Based on statistics, this match could feature its share of goals. Two of the three meetings all time have resulted in multiple entries into the Energy FC record books. Four individual or team records came against Portland in Energy FC's 4-3 win in Portland on August 8, 2015, including the first and only hat trick for Energy FC by **Danni Konig**. Part of that three-goal effort was a franchise record for fastest two goals at 3:21 apart. That four-goal game is the last time Energy FC scored four goals in a game and is tied for the most in franchise history. Not to be outdone in that match was Portland setting a record for fastest two goals by an individual at under one minute of play by **George Fochive**, two assists by **Michael Nanchoff** (the only time someone has registered two assists against OKC) and most goals allowed by a goalkeeper.

Energy FC has had some challenges scoring goals this season. Through seven matches, The Greens have mustered only five goals. Surprisingly, that is not the fewest in the league. The Richmond Kickers (2-4-3) and Portland Timbers FC 2 (1-7-1) have also scored only five goals through their matches. Toronto FC (1-5-3) has scored only three goals in nine matches.

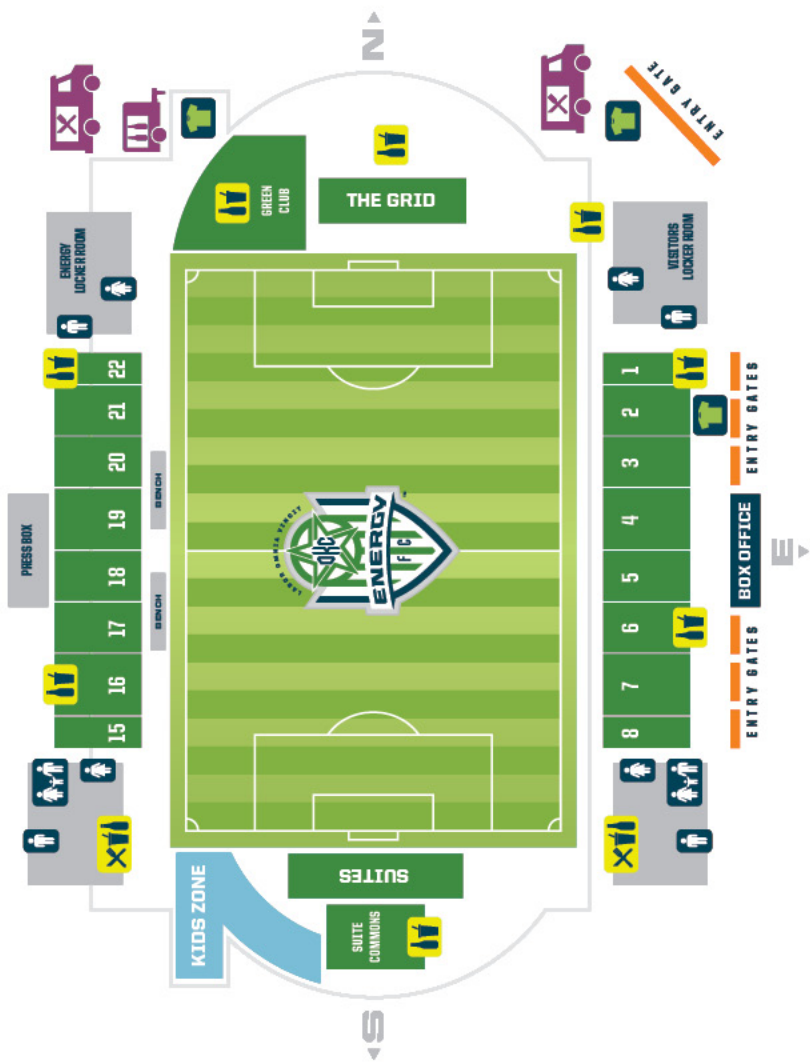

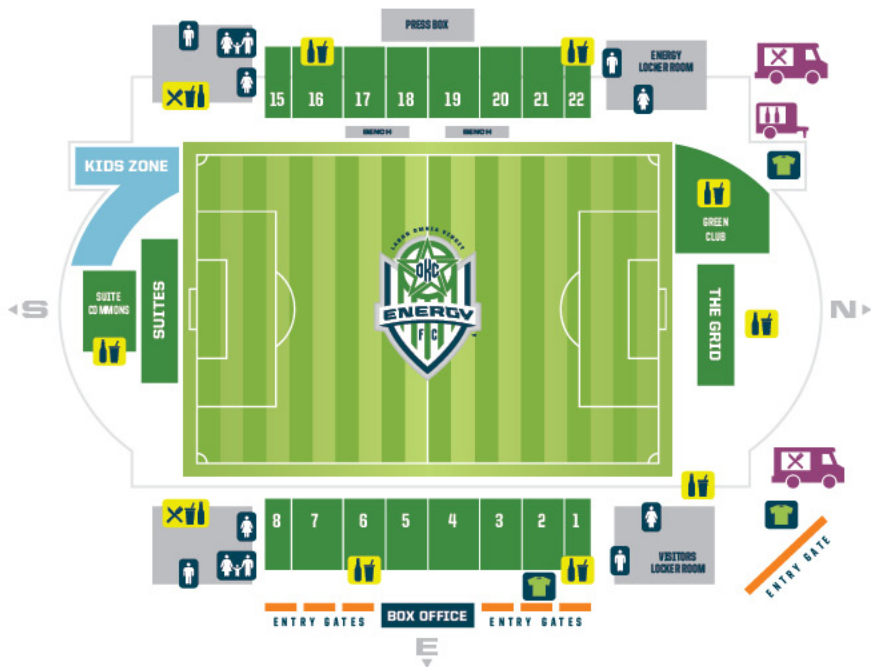

HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach-blonde locks earned him the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
