Energy FC takes on Phoenix Rising FC for the second and final time during the regular season. This marks the third match for OKC in the last seven days. Energy FC downed the Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC 2-1 on May 31 in the second round of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. That was followed by a 1-0 loss to the Switchbacks on June 3 in a USL regular season match.

In Energy FC's last USL regular season match, the team lost a heartbreaker to Colorado Springs1-0. In a back-and-forth match, Energy FC and the Switchbacks traded shots and saves. In the 3rd minute of stoppage time Rony Argueta was able to sneak one past Energy FC keeper Cody Laurendi. Energy FC and Colorado Springs meet for the final time this regular season on July 22 in Oklahoma City.

Energy FC is in the midst of a stretch where they are playing multiple games in a small stretch Including the team's match on May 31, The Greens will play six matches in a 17-day stretch. That includes home matches on June 6 and June 10, a Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup match on May 13 against the Colorado Rapids, and a road trip that starts in Portland on June 16.

The last time Energy FC played Phoenix Rising, the team suffered a heartbreaking loss, similar to their match Saturday. Energy FC trailed 1-0 as it approached stoppage time. Early in the extra time, Kyle Hyland converted a penalty kick to tie the match at 1-1. In the waning seconds of the match. Shaun Wright-Phillips converted to give Phoenix Rising FC a 2-1 win.

For the second straight season, Energy FC is moving into the 4th round of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. Their 2-1 win over Colorado Springs on May 31 advances them to the next round against the Colorado Rapids of the MLS. The match is slated to be played in Dick's Sporting Goods Park in Denver on Tuesday, June 13.

The loss last Saturday snapped Energy FC's four-match winnning streak. Prior to that match, the team had won two straight USL regular season matches and two straight U.S. Open Cup matches.

Wojeich Wojcik has scored six goals across all competition as a member of Energy FC. Each of those six goals have proven to be the game-winner. He has the game-winning tally in each of the last two U.S. Open Cup matches.





#### HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach-blonde locks earned his the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
