Energy FC takes on Tulsa Roughnecks FC for the first time this season. The two teams meet again August 12 in Tulsa and again September 17 in OKC. All time, Energy FC owns a 5-1-2 mark against Tulsa Roughnecks, including a 3-0-1 mark at Taft Stadium.

In Energy FC's last match, The Greens dropped a 3-1 decision to Real Monarchs SLC. After falling behind 1-0 in the 8th minute, Energy FC rebounded on a goal by Alex Dixon in the 26th minute. The goal earned the #4 spot on Sportscenter's Top 10 plays for the night. In the second half, Chandler Hoffman scored twice to put the match away for the top-ranked Monarchs.

Energy FC has been able to score goals in bunches recently. Entering this match, they have recorded a goal in four straight matches and eight of the last nine. The only match they have falled to record a goal was a 0-0 draw against San Antonio June 10.

The Greens are glad to be home. The match July 5 against Real Monarchs SLC was the team's fifth straight away from Taft Stadium. That includes a U.S. Open Cup match against the Colorado Rapids and four USL regular season matches, all against MLS "2" teams in Vancouver, Portland, Seattle and Real Saft Lake. Energy FC finished the four regular season matches with a 1-2-1 mark.

Tonight marks the official halfway point of the Energy FC season. Seven of the 16 matches have been played at home.

It's Black Gold Derby time! The annual cross-state rivalry between Energy FC and

Tulsa Roughnecks FC has been mostly onesided in the two brief years of the Derby. All time, Energy FC owns a 5-1-2 mark against Tulsa. That includes a 4-0-0 mark last season in which Energy FC outscored Tulsa 8-0. Tulsa's squad this season is far better than last as they have already eclipsed their 2016 win total in half the number of matches.

#### QUICK KICKS

Longest Tenured Coach - Energy FC Head Coach Jimmy Nielsen is knee-deep in his fourth season with Energy FC, making him the longest tenured coach in the USU's Western Conference. He owns a 38-35-29 mark in USL regular season contests and 42-39-29 mark that includes matches in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.

U23's in action - Energy FC's U23 squad, fresh off of clinching the MidSouth Division title, return to action Sunday afternoon. Their final regular season home match of the season is at 5 p.m. at the soccer complex on the campus of the University of Central Oklahoma.

Youth Soccer Success - Oklahoma Energy FC had a good showing at the U.S. Youth Soccer Region 3 tournament in Greensboro, North Carolina. Six of the nine teams advanced from bracket play. Four of those that advanced out of pool play made the semifinals and three of the six played in the finals.





#### HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach-blonde locks earned his the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
