Energy FC takes on Reno 1868 FC for the first time in franchise history. The teams will meet again on September 20 in Reno.

The last match for Energy FC was July 30 on the road against Los Dos. After a nearly scoreless first half, LA Galaxy II got on the board on a quick transition following an Energy FC comer kick. Ariel Lassiter would net the goal on an assist from Raul Mendolia. Energy FC pressed in the second half and were denied, twice by the post. In the second half, they would break through. After coming on as a sub in the 74', Andy Craven was fouled in the box and was awarded a PK. He converted to tie the score 1-1. The teams would each have chances late in the match but were unable to convert.

The goal by Andy Craven was his teamleading 5th tally of the season. All of those goals have come on PKs. He's taken five PKs this season and has conveted on all five opportunities. For the season, Energy FC has been awareded 10 PKs and has converted six. By way of comparison, opponents have been awarded six PKs and have scored on five.

Energy FC continues to be able to put the ball in the goal on a consistent basis. Including their match against Los Dos, they've recorded a goal in eight straight USL matches and 12 of the last 13 in league play. The eight straight games with a goal is the second longest such streak in franchise history. The best is 14 matches set during the 2015 campaign.

From the statistical oddity category...in the last match, LA Galaxy II attempted zero corner kicks. That marks just the second time in franchise history an Energy FC opponent has had zero comer kicks. The only other time was last season when Tulsa had none in the match on August 27, 2016.

The Reno 1868 FC side can score some goals. They lead the league in goals scored with 46 in 18 games, an average of 2.56 per contest. Four times this season, they have scored at least four goals in a match, have a six-goal match and a nine-goal match. In one stretch earlier this season, they scored 14 goals in three games, a 4-0 win on the road against Phoenix, a 6-0 win over Seattle at home and a 4-0 win over Tulsa at home. They also downed Los Dos 9-0 in early July. They're led by Dane Kelly who is tied for the league lead in goals with 14.

After two weeks of a "normal" schedule of just playing one game in a week, the team will have an "irregular" schedule. Starting last Sunday in LA, the team plays three matches in a seven-day period including August 2 at home against Reno 1868 FC and August 5 at home against Real Monarchs. Of the last 10 weeks of the season, Energy FC has a "normal" schedule nine of those weeks.





#### HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach-blonde locks earned his the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
