Energy FC takes on Real Monarchs SLC for the second and final time this regular season. In the first meeting, Real Monarchs downed Energy FC 3-1 at Rio Tinto Stadium in Salt Lake City. Including the meeting earlier this season, the teams have met four times with the home squad winning each match.

The last match for Energy FC was August 2 at home against Reno 1868 FC. The Greens were able to keep the highest scoring team off of the scoreboard in 1-0 win. In the 29th minute, the face of the match changed when Reno 1868 FC midfielder Fatai Alashe was issued a red card, causing the visiting side to play the remainder of the match with 10 men. After a pedestrian and scoreless first half. Energy FC came out in the second half and worked to take advantage of the outnumbered opponent. Jose Angulo finally broke through in the 62' with a left-footed strike from just above the penalty spot. The goal was his 6th of the season and 3rd as a member of Energy FC. Goalkeeper Cody Laurendi made three saves en route to his fourth clean sheet of the seson.

With the win on Wednesday, Energy FC accomplished two things. First, the win moved them ahead of Orange County SC into the #8 position in the USL's Western Conference. The top 8 teams make the playoffs. Second, it put them on the cusp of the .500 mark. Only once this season has Energy FC been at the .500 mark. After a win June 16 over Portland Timbers FC 2, Energy FC was 5-5-2. A win Saturday over Real Monarchs SLC moves them to 8-8-5.

The clean sheet for Energy FC was their fourth of the season, all recorded by Cody Laurendi. Interestingly, it marked the fourth

time that Reno 1868 FC had been shutout this season. Reno 1868 FC came into the match averaging 2.55 goals per match and had the second highest goal differential in the conference at +21.

Energy FC continues to be able to put the ball in the goal on a consistent basis. Including their match against Reno 1868 FC, they've recorded a goal in nine straight USL matches and 13 of the last 14 in league play. The nine straight games with a goal is the second longest such streak in franchise history. The best is 14 matches set during the 2015 campaign.

Finally some routine from the schedule maker. Saturday's match ends a week where EnergyFC played three matches in a seven-day stretch. This season has had its share oddities with one game in a 30-day stretch, 38 days between home games and lengthy road trips. For the next five weeks, Energy FC has only one match per week. Of the last 10 weeks of the season, Energy FC has a "normal" schedule nine of those weeks.

QUICK KICKS

Longest Tenured Coach - Energy FC Head Coach Jimmy Nielsen is knee-deep in his fourth season with Energy FC, making him the longest tenured coach in the USL's Western Conference. He owns a 39-36-31 mark in USL regular season contests and 46-40-31 mark that includes matches in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.





HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach-blonde locks earned his the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
