Energy FC welcomes San Antonio FC to Taft Stadium for the final time during the regular season. The teams last met on July 14 in San Antonio. Energy FC used a dramatic stoppage time goal to salvage a 1-1 draw with San Antonio. The other meeting this season between these teams was Jun 10 in Oklahoma City, a 0-0 draw. All-time, the teams have met five times with Energy FC holding a 1-0-4 mark. That includes a 0-0-2 mark in OKC.

The last match for Energy FC was August 12 on the road against Tulsa Roughnecks FC. At the end of the first half, Energy FC trailed 1-0. In the 46', Energy FC was awarded a PK and Jose Angulo converted to the the match 1-1. Just 10 minute later, Roughnecks forward lan Svantesson scored the game-winner on a header. The win for Tulsa was their second 2-1 victory over Energy FC this season.

In the match against Tulsa, Energy FC fired 17 shots toward Tulsa keeper Fabian Cerda. That marks the third highest single-game shot total fired by Energy FC this season. Cerda's six saves on the night is the second most by an opposing keeper this season. The highest was an eight-save performance by Orange County SC's Charlie Lyon on May 20.

Despite the loss, Energy FC still occupies the #8 spot in the Western Conference with a one point lead over Orange County SC. Energy FC will be eagerly watching the match on Friday between Phoenix Rising and Orange County. Both teams have games in hand on Energy FC and trall by one and three points respectively. A win for Energy FC this Saturday puts them back at the .500 mark for the season at 9-9-5.

Taft Stadium continues to be a safe haven for Energy FC. The team has registered a win in each of its last three home matches and has picked up points in eight of its last nine at Taft.
The exception is a 2-1 loss to Tuisa on July 8.
In those last nine matches at home, Energy
FC is 7-1-1. The last time Energy FC won four
straight at home was July 31 - August 29, 2015

The PK has been a constant for Energy FC this season...especially in the last three weeks. Energy FC has been awareded a PK in two straight and three of its last four matches. Incuding opponent's PKs and dating back to July 14, there have been PKs awareded in four of the last six matches.

Energy FC continues to be able to put the ball in the goal on a consistent basis. Including their match against Tuisa, they've recorded a goal in 11 straight USL matches and 15 of the last 17 in league play. The 11 straight games with a goal is the second longest such streak in franchise history and the second time that particular streak has reached double digits. The best is 14 matches set during the 2015 campaign.

Finally some routine from the schedule maker. For the final 10 weeks of the season, Energy FC plays just one game per week in nine of those weeks. The only week with multiple games is September 17 - 24 when they play three games in that stretch. One match is at home on September 17 against Tuisa while September 20, The Greens visit Reno and September 23 they take on Sacramento.

#### QUICK KICKS

Longest Tenured Coach - Energy FC Head Coach Jimmy Nielsen is knee-deep in his fourth season with Energy FC, making him the longest tenured coach in the USL's Western Conference. He owns a 39-36-31 mark in USL regular season confests and 46-40-31 mark that includes matches in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.







#### HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach-blonde locks earned his the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
