Energy FC hosts Vancouver Whitecaps FC 2 for the only time this regular season. This marks the second time this season the two teams have met. Their only other meeting this season was June 24 at Thunderbird Stadium in Vancouver. The teams played to a 2-2 tie. During that match, Juan Pablo Guzman and Andy Craven each scored for Energy FC. Cody Laurendimade three saves on the afternoon.

This is Energy FC's sixth all-time regularseason meeting with Vancouver. All-time, Energy FC is 1-2-2, with a 1-0-1 record in Oklahoma City. It is unlikely these teams will meet again during the 2017 season.

The last match for Energy FC was a 2-0 loss September 2 on the road against Swope Park. A questionable call that awareded a PK to Swope Park's Lebo Moloto put Energy FC on their heels early in the first half. Moloto converted the PK to give Swope the 1-0 lead. After Energy FC re-gained their footing, they had chances, including a late-half surge by Miguel Gonzalez that went just wide. Moloto would add his second of the night in the 49' to give Swope a 2-0 lead they wouldn't relenquish.

The playoff race in the West will come down to the wire. Real Monarchs SLC became the first team to clinch a playoff spot over the weekend. Safe to say the final spots will be earned in the

final week of the regular season. As of games completed on September6, Just nine points seperate the #5 seed from the #12 seed. Energy FC's loss put them outside the top 8 in the standings. The team with the most "cusion" is Phoenix Rising FC. They have 33 points and are in the #8 spot and they have at least two games in hand on the three teams above them in the standings.

Energy FC's schedule is favorable for them for the remainder of the season. With seven games left to play (Including this match), five will be played in the friendly confines of Energy FC Field at Taff Stadium. At home, Energy FC is 7-2-2, compared with 2-8-4 away from Taft. The Greens have picked up points in nine of its last 10 at Taff, going 7-1-2.

Energy FC's final two road matches come within three days of one another. The team travels to Reno on September 20 and finishes the road slate of games against Sacramento.





#### HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen Joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach-blonde locks earned his the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his piay that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and Joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.






