Energy FC hosts Tulsa Roughnecks FC for the final time this season. The previous two meetings have both finished with 2-1 scores in favor of the Tulsa side. In the last meeting, Tulsa took a 1-0 lead in the 20' on a goal by **Joaquin Rivas**. Energy FC tied at one with a PK goal by **Jose Angulo**. Just eight minutes later, Tulsa converted a **Jorge Corrales** service to **Ian Svantesson** for a header and the game winner. Tulsa has secured the Black Gold Derby trophy for the season.

This is Energy FC's 11th all-time regular-season meeting with Tulsa. All-time, Energy FC is 5-3-2, with a 3-1-1 record in Oklahoma City. It is unlikely these teams will meet again during the 2017 season.

The last match for Energy FC was a 0-0 draw with Vancouver. During the match, Energy FC fired a franchise record 25 shots toward the Vancouver goal and had a franchise record 15 corner kicks. Despite the two franchise records, they were unable to put one past Vancouver keeper **Sean Melvin** who made seven saves on the night. For his efforts, Melvin earned the goalkeeper spot on the USL's Team of the Week. From a positive perspective, Energy FC goalkeeper **Cody Laurendi** posted his sixth clean sheet of the season.

During the last match, Energy FC posted two new franchise records. The 25 shots fired goalward breaks the old record of 21. The 21 shots goalward had happened

twice. The first time was June 9, 2015 against Vancouver and most recently against Orange County on May 20, 2017. The other franchise mark set was 15 corner kicks. That bested the previous high mark of 12 set last season against Tulsa.

The playoff race in the West looks as if it will come down to the wire. Real Monarchs SLC and San Antonio have each clinched a playoff spot. A win by Reno 1868 FC will put them in a position to clinch a spot. As of games completed on September 13, just seven points separate the #5 seed from the #10 seed. Energy FC's draw keeps them outside the top 8 in the table. The team with the most "cushion" continues to be Phoenix Rising FC. They have 37 points and are in the #7 spot and games in hand on the two teams above them in the standings.

Energy FC's schedule is favorable for them for the remainder of the season. With six games left to play (including this match), four will be played in the friendly confines of Energy FC Field at Taft Stadium. At home, Energy FC is 7-2-3, compared with 2-8-4 away from Taft. The Greens have picked up points in 10 of its last 11 at Taft, going 7-1-3.

Energy FC's final two road matches come within three days of one another. The team travels to Reno on September 20 and finishes the road slate of games against Sacramento on September 23.

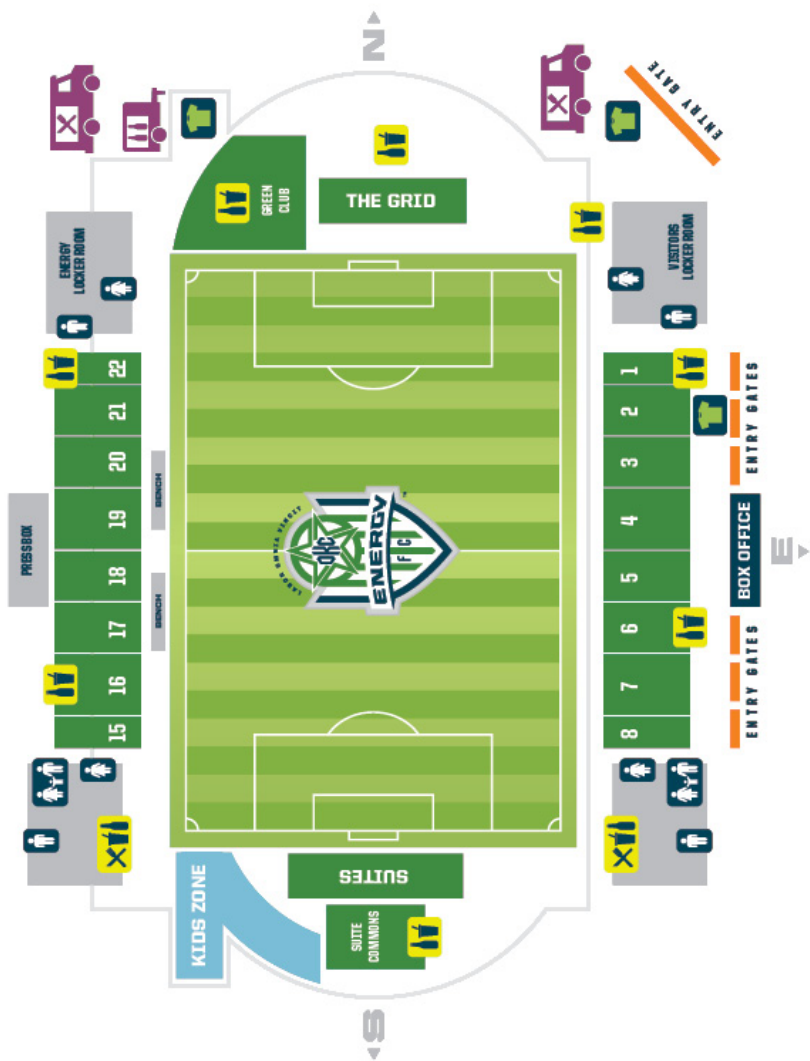

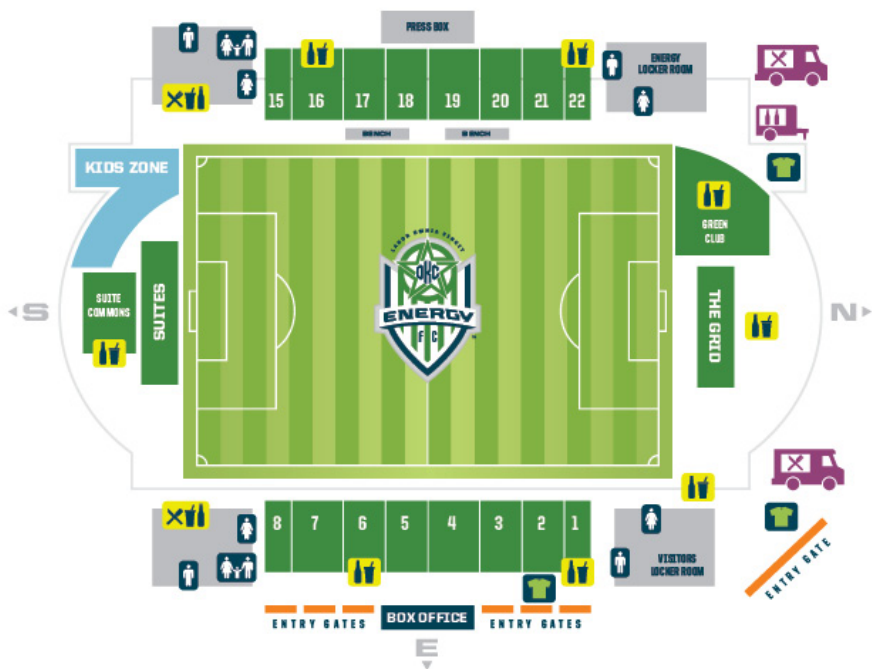

SOCCER OPERATIONS

HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach blonde locks earned him the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
