Energy FC begins its final three matches of the regular season with a Sunday tilt against LA Galaxy II (also known as Los Dos). In the previous meeting between these two clubs, Energy FC used a PK goal from Andy Crauen In the 75' to earn a 1-1 draw. Energy FC outshot Los Dos 19-11 in the match.

This is Energy FC's 9th all-time regular-season meeting with Los Dos. Energy FC has a 1-4-3 mark all time, including a 1-2-1 mark in OKC.

Energy FC completed their road schedule for the 2017 regular season over the weekend. The team redeemed themselves after a 3-0 loss to Reno earlier in the week with a 3-1 win over Sacramento Republic FC. Things got off to a good start when Jose Angulo scored in the opening minute of the match. That was followed by a tally by Jonathan Brown in the 9". Sacramento made it interesting with a goal in the 59". However, Miguel Gonz alez finished off the match with a marker in the 83". C.J. Cochran, making his first start since June made five saves in the win.

The win for Energy FC came at a great time and finished off their road slate of games. The Greens finished the road campaign 3-9-4. Only Toronto FC 2 have finished their slate of road games.

Early goals have been in the cards for Energy FC recently. In their last match, Energy FC was up 2-0 by the 9' of action. The goal by Jose Angulo in the 1' and Jonathan Brown in the 9' were the first and third fastest goals scored to start a game this season. Only Miguel Gonzalez's goal 4:40 into the match on September 17 against Tulsa was faster than Brown's tally.

Although Angulo and Brown's goals were early, they aren't the fastest two of the season. Andy Craven scored two goals on PKs just four minutes apart in June, while The Greens scored goals 7:34 apart against Tulsa on September 17 and 7:42 apart on July 22 against Colorado Springs.

Goalkeeper C.J. Cochran has stepped in admirably for Cody Laurendi who suffered an injury in the team's 3-0 loss to Reno on September 20. Laurendi is out for the remainder of the season. Cochran made a season-high tying five saves in the team's first-ever win in Sacramento. Chochran owns two of the three Energy FC road wins on the season. He earned a win on June 16 against Portland and the victory last Saturday against Sacramento.

Sacramento Republic earned a franchiserecord tying 11 corner kicks in the last game. That ties the mark for corner kicks by an opponent with the Tulsa Roughnecks on September 6, 2015. The Republic were also active shooting the ball as they sent a season-high 18 shots goalward.

A win over Los Dos would put Energy FC in a place they've not been all season. Above the .500 mark. Four different times this season, the team has been at the .500 mark, but has yet to push over the treshold.

Energy FC Field at Taft Stadium continues to be a great spot for OKC. They've collected points in 11 of their last 12 at home and are 8-1-3 in that span. In all, the team is 8-2-3 at home.





HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen Joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach blonde locks earned his the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his piay that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and Joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.




