Energy FC hosts Swope Park Rangers in the second-to-last match of the 2017 regular season. On this night, The Greens host the Swope Park Rangers. Energy FC has had their hands full with Swope Park this season, posting an 0-2-0 record and being outscored 5-1. The last matchup was September 2 in Kansas City where the Rangers won 2-0.

This is Energy FC's 7th all-time regular-season meeting with Swope Park. Energy FC is 3-3-0 in those matches, including a 1-1-0 mark in OKC. Energy FC hosted LA Galaxy II in the team's last match on October 1. Jose Angulo provided all the offense OKC would need with a hat ftick. He scored a PK goal in the 38th minute and followed that with tailles 1:42 apart in the 2nd half to complete the trifecta. C.J. Cochran made his second straight start and earned his second clean sheet of the season.

The win for Energy FC extended their streak of consecutive games with a point earned at home to seven straight and 12 of their last 13. The only blemish is a 2-1 loss to Tulsa on July 8.

During Energy FC's last match, Jose Angulo recorded just the second hat trick in franchise history and the first at Taft Stadium. Prior to last Sunday, Danni Konig had recorded the only other hat trick. Konig turned the trick on August 8, 2015 in a 4-3 win over Portland Timbers FC 2. Angulo's three goals were scored in an elapsed time of 29 minutes 12 seconds. Konig's hat trick was scored in an elapsed time of 14 minutes 59 seconds.

Angulo has made his way into the Energy FC record books for 2017 hwice in as many games. During the team's match on September 23 against Sacramento, he scored the earliest goal from the start of the match when he scored just 45 seconds in. In the last match, his 2nd and 3rd

goals of the hat trick came just 1 minute 42 seconds apart, the fastest two goals scored in Energy FC franchise history.

Goalkeeper C.J. Cochran has stepped in admirably for Cody Laurendi who suffered an injury in the team's 3-0 loss to Reno on September 20. Laurendi is out for the remainder of the season. Cochran has won both of his starts since then and has a 3-0-1 record on the season and was in goal for two of the team's three road wins on the season. He has posted clean sheets in two of those four games he's played.

Energy FC has scored six goals in their last two games, which ties a high water mark for goals scored in consecutive games. Including this two-game stretch, the team has turned this trick four times. The last was August 4 and 8 of the 2015 season. A 2-0 win over LA Galaxy II was followed by a 4-3 win over Portland Timbers FC 2. The other two occurences were during the 2014 season. A 3-3 draw with Harrisburg July 23, 2014 followed by a 3-0 win over Dayton July 26, 2014. The other was a 4-2 loss to LA Galaxy II April 7, 2014 followed by 4-0 win over Arizona United on April 12, 2014.

The win over Los Dos put Energy FC one game above the .500 mark for the first time this season. Any point against Swope Park guarantees them a record at .500 for the season.

The win also put Energy FC on the cusp of clinching a playoff berth for the third time in four seasons under the guidance of Jimmy Nielsen. Energy FC needs a combination of four points from points earned by the club and points not earned by Orange County and Colorado Springs to punch their ticket to the postseason.





HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen Joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach blonde locks earned his the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his piay that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and Joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.








