Energy FC hosts Seattle Sounders FC 2 in the final match of the regular season for both clubs. The teams met once earlier this season, on June 19 in Seattle. A 10-man Energy crew battled to tie the match 2-2 on a PK goal by **Andy Craven** in the 86'. The Sounders got a 90' goal from **David Olsen** to pull out the 3-2 victory.

This is Energy FC's 6th all-time regular-season meeting with Seattle. Energy FC is 1-2-2 in the previous five meetings, including a 1-0-1 mark in OKC.

Energy FC hosted Swope Park Rangers in their last match on October 8, winning 4-1. The victory clinched a playoff spot for the third straight season. **Miguel Gonzalez** got things going for Energy FC in the 25' with his 7th goal of the season. **Jose Angulo** continued his hot play with his 13th of the season in the 43' to extend the lead to 2-0. **Juan Pablo Guzman** converted on an **Alex Dixon** pass to give The Greens a 3-0 lead. Swope midfielder **Liam Doyle** broke the shutout bid of **C.J. Cochran** in the 87'. Angulo scored his second of the night in stoppage time to extend the lead back to three goals.

The win for Energy FC extended their streak of consecutive games with a point earned at home to eight straight and 13 of their last 14. The only blemish is a 2-1 loss to Tulsa on July 8. That includes wins in three straight at Taft.

During Energy FC's last match, **Alex Dixon** inserted himself in the Energy FC record books. He recorded the eighth two-assist match by an individual in franchise history. He and **Kyle Hyland** are the two players that have done that this season. When Hyland did so earlier this season, he joined **Adda Djedzri** as the only players to have multiple two-assist games in franchise history.

The four-goal outburst in the team's last match ties a franchise mark for most goals scored in a game. It is the fifth time they've

done so, the second time this season and the second time at home. In addition, the team registered a franchise record five assists in the match and a franchise best points total (goals + assists) in the match with 13.

Goalkeeper **C.J. Cochran** has stepped in admirably for **Cody Laurendi** who suffered an injury in the team's 3-0 loss to Reno on September 20. Laurendi is out for the remainder of the season. Cochran has won all three of his starts since then and has a 4-0-1 record on the season. Two of his four wins came on the road and he's had two clean sheets on the season.

Energy FC has scored seven goals in their last two games, which sets a new high water mark for goals in consecutive games. The previous mark of six had been accomplished four times, including back-to-back games on September 23 against Sacramento (3-1 win) and October 1 against LA Galaxy II (3-0 win). The 10 goals in a three-game stretch is the most in franchise history in any three-game stretch. The previous mark was nine in the three games between July 31, 2015 - August 8, 2015.

Jose Angulo's performance over the last two games has moved him up the charts in goals scored. He has 14 on the season (10 with Energy FC) and now sits 4th in the league in that category. He trails Reno 1868 FC's **Dane Kelly** by four goals in the race for the golden boot.

The win over Swope Park put Energy FC two games above the .500 mark for the first time this season. The team is assured of a better than .500 record for the 2017 season.

Energy FC's playoff opponent will be determined by the time the team begins play on Sunday. Energy FC can finish as high as the #6 seed and as low as the #8 seed. The #8 seed is guaranteed to play Real Monarchs SLC

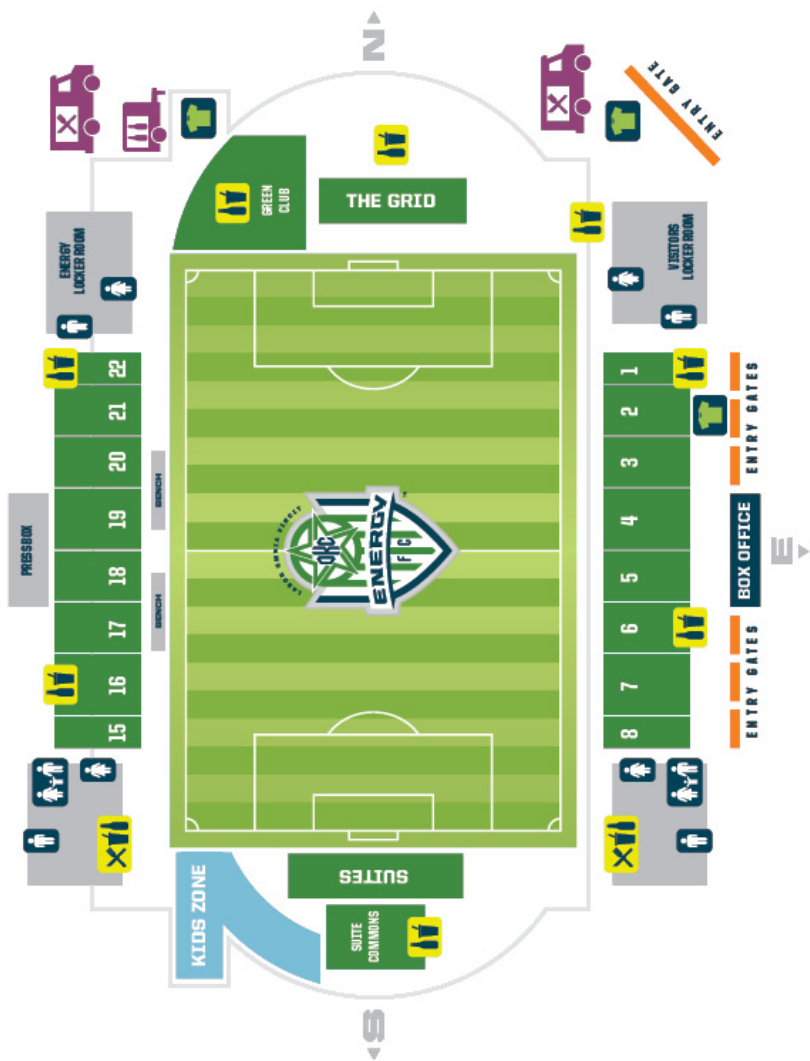

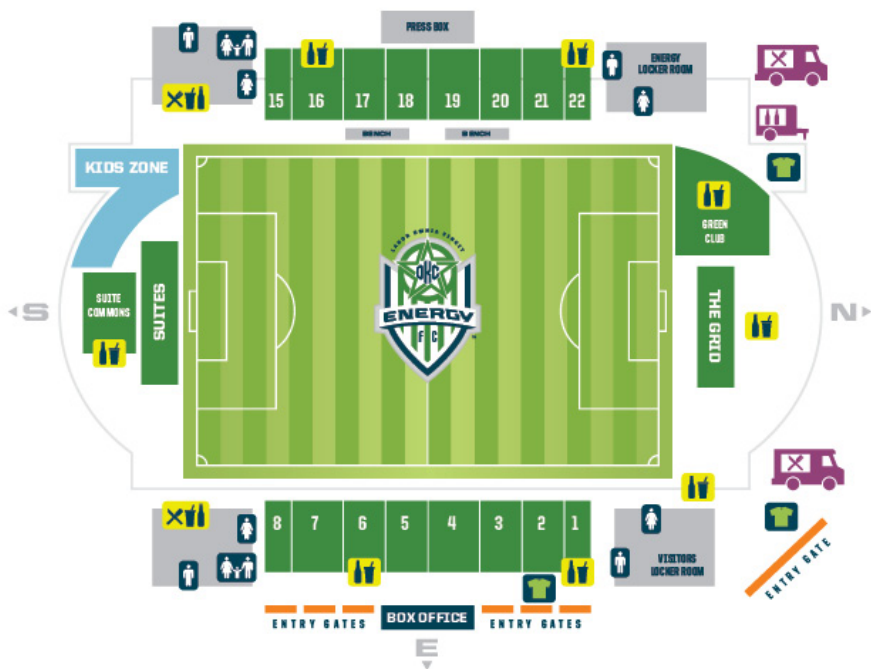

HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach blonde locks earned him the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
