Energy FC takes on Sacramento Republic FC in the first of their two regular season meetings on the season this Tuesday. Energy FC opened their home calendar of matches last Saturday with a contest against the Rio Grande Valley Toros FC. Energy FC dropped the match 1-0. After a pedestrian first half, the teams turned it up in the 2nd. At the 50th minute, Energy FC dodged a bullet when RGV hit a post and failed to bury the resulting rebound. During the 55th minute, Energy FC was awarded a penalty shot, but the try was stopped by RGV goalkeeper Calle Brown was up to the task. Then in the 66th minute, RGV was awarded a PK and they converted. The game was feisty as there were a total of three red cards issued as part of the seven cards issued on the night.

Sacramento enters the match as one of three teams in the league with a 3-0-0 mark. Saturday, they visited Tulsa and downed the Roughnecks 2-1. Former Roughneck Sammy Ochoa was key in both goals for Sacramento. He assisted on their first goal and provided the initial shot on goal for the team's second goal.

The game Tuesday is the first USL ESPN 3 Game of the Week. The match is also a quick turnaround for both clubs. Both played Saturday. Following this match, Energy FC's next match isn't until April 29 when they travel to Hidalgo, Texas to take on RGV.

This marks the eighth regular season meeting between OKC and Sacramento Republic FC. Energy FC are 3-4-0 in those seven matches. That includes a 3-1-0 mark in Oklahoma City. Both teams entered the league in 2014 and have experienced levels of success in their own right. Energy FC has qualified for the playoffs each of the last two seasons while Sacramento has made the playoffs in each season, including a USL Cup win in 2014.

The match against RGV, specifically the 2nd half, was among the most physical and feisty in franchise history. A total of seven cards were assessed, including three red cards. Jose Barril picked up a red card late in the 2nd half. That was his second red card of the season. Richard Dixon picked up two yellow cards in the match. Both are suspended for the match against Sacramento.

Energy FC head coach Jimmy Nielsen enters his fourth season with Energy FC, which makes him the longest tenured coach in the Western Conference. The only coach Energy FC has known, Nielsen owns a 31-27-27 mark in regular season contests and a 36-30-27 mark that included Lamar

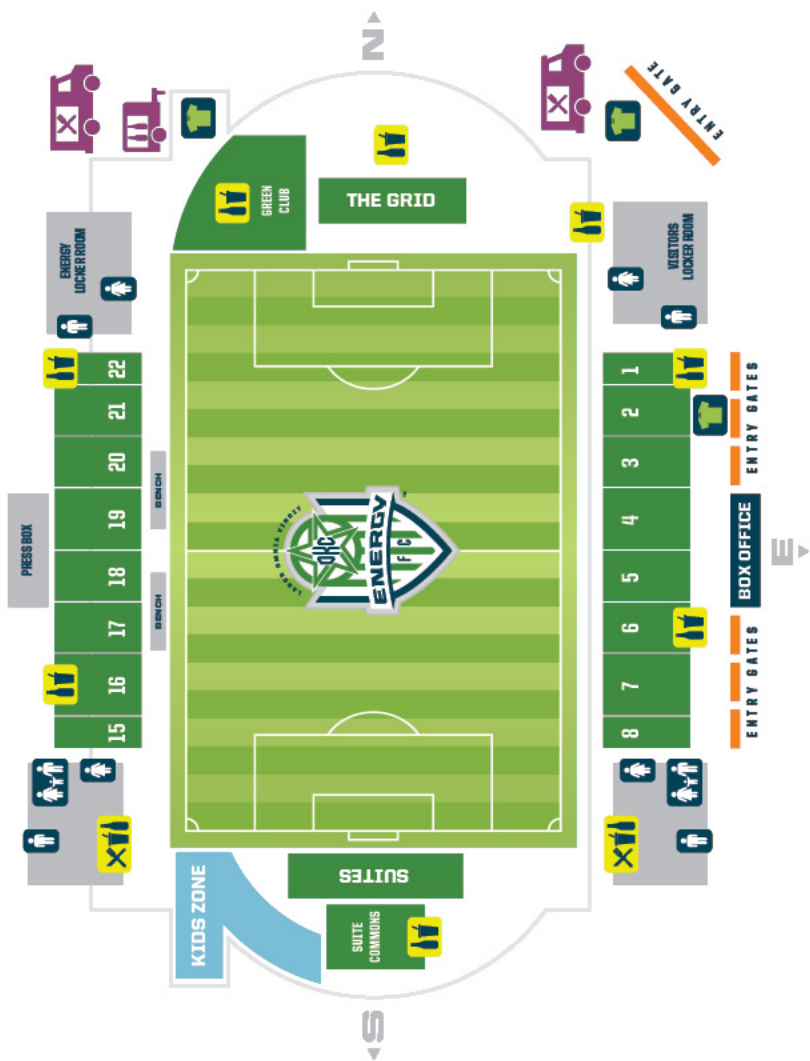

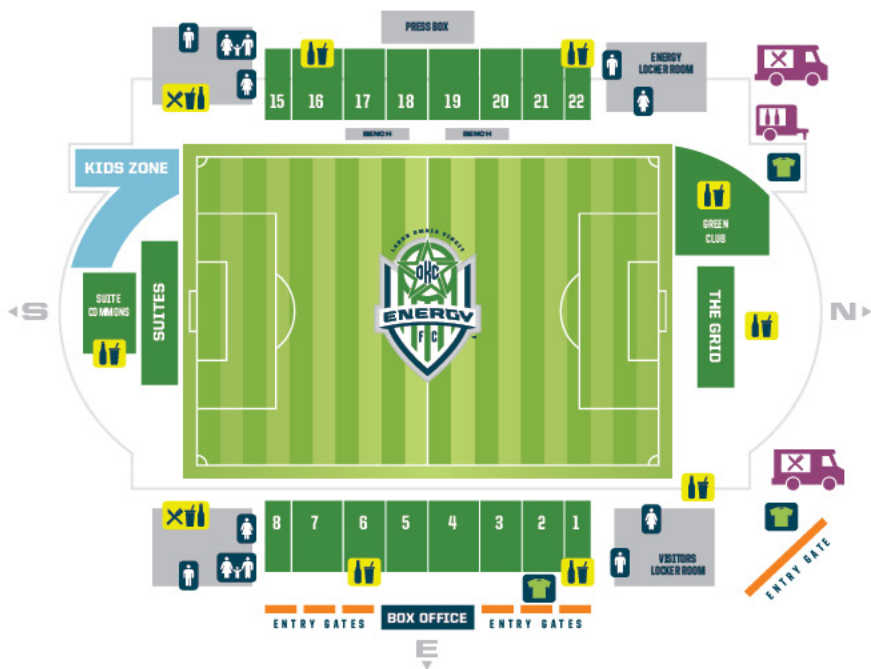

HEAD COACH JIMMY NIELSEN

OKC ENERGY FC INTRODUCED FORMER SPORTING KC GOALKEEPER JIMMY NIELSEN AS THE TEAM'S FIRST HEAD COACH ON DECEMBER 20, 2013.

Nielsen completed his final game as a professional, serving as goalkeeper for Sporting KC in their win over Real Salt Lake in MLS Cup 2013 on December 7. A veteran of nearly 600 professional games, Nielsen brings a wealth of experience to his new position.



Nielsen began his professional career with hometown club AaB Aalborg in Denmark, helping the team to the 1999 Danish Superliga championship. After a brief stint at Leicester City in 2007, he transferred to Danish club Vejle, for whom he made 63 appearances over two years. He was named Danish Goalkeeper of the Year in 1998 and 2004, and also represented his country at the U-19 and U-21 levels.

In February 2010, Nielsen joined Major League Soccer and became the starting goalkeeper for Sporting Kansas City. As a member of Sporting KC, Nielsen was a two-time MLS All Star, the 2012 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year, and goalkeeper for the 2012 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open championship club and the 2013 MLS Cup winning squad. He was named team captain prior to start of the 2012 season.

When Nielsen began his MLS career, he instantly became a fan favorite, whose signature bleach-blonde locks earned him the nickname "White Puma." But it wasn't just his play that endeared Nielsen to fans, though—it was his personality. He was known for stopping his car at local parks when driving by and joining in games with random children. Often, Nielsen would pull kids out of the crowd and have them kick balls at him as part of his pre-game warm-up.
