Energy FC opens the 2018 season at home against their in-state rival, Tulsa Roughnecks FC. The Greens finished the 2017 campaign with a 14-11-7 record, 49 points and in the playoffs for the third straight season. Tulsa finished the 2017 campaign with a 14-14-4 record, 46 points and qualified for the USL Playoffs.

This is the first of three meetings between these two clubs and the only meeting in Oklahoma City. Last season, the teams met three times, twice in OKC. Tulsa took the season series 2-1-0. The last meeting between these two clubs was September 17, 2017, a 2-0 victory for Energy FC.

Competition for The Wrench resumes with the season opener for both clubs. The Wrench is the trophy awarded to the winner of the season-long derby between Energy FC and Tulsa Roughnecks FC. Energy FC captured The Wrench in 2016 by downing Tulsa in all four matches. Tulsa rebounded last season and captured The Wrench. All time, Energy FC owns a 6-3-2 mark against

Tulsa in USL competition. That included a 4-1-1 mark at Taft Stadium.

The 2017 season was successful for Energy FC, as the club advanced to the playoffs for the third straight season. In addition to qualifying for the postseason, Energy FC reached the Western Conference Finals for the second time in the last three seasons.

The offseason went by quickly for Energy FC, but not without some change. None more so than at the head coach position. Jimmy Nielsen departed in mid-November. On December 19, Energy FC named Steve Cooke as head coach and technical director. Cooke joined the Greens after an eight-season run with the Rapids that began as technical director for their academy teams and ended with Cooke serving as assistant coach and eventually interim head coach during the 2017 campaign. Cooke is joined by assistant coaches Jon Pearlman, who will serve as head coach for the U23 team; Danny Stone, who worked with Cooke in Colorado;

and Lexi Vizarelis, who was goalkeeper coach at the University of Oklahoma.

Four Oklahomans are on the Energy FC's opening night roster. Christian Ibeagha, Shawn McLaws, Bryan Byars and Justin Chavez each have ties to Oklahoma City and the youth soccer programs in the city. This is the most number of Oklahomans on the Energy FC roster.

In addition to the new faces on the technical side, the club has several new faces on the player side, as well. A total of 12 players are new to the Energy FC lineup this season. New faces include goalkeepers Bryan Byars and Matt Van Oekel; defenders Christian Ibeagha, Max Gunderson, Shawn McLaws, Callum Ross, Juan Niño, Joseph Adjei and Justin Chavez; and forwards Jaime Siaj, Ema Twumasi and Francis Atuahene.

Not everybody is new on the roster.

There are 11 players on the roster that played with the 2017 squad. They include

defenders Richard Dixon, Kyle Hyland and Coady Andrews; midfielders Philip Rasmussen, Juan Pablo Guzman, Alex Dixon and Jose Barril; and forwards Jose Angulo, Miguel Gonzalez and John Brown. Coady Andrews enters the season as the player with the most experience in Energy FC green. He's played 67 matches with OKC and currently sits fourth on the list of all-time games played.

The Energy FC roster and technical staff continues to have an international flair as the team is represented by 11 different countries: United States, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha) brings the number of countries that have had players play for the Energy FC to 18.

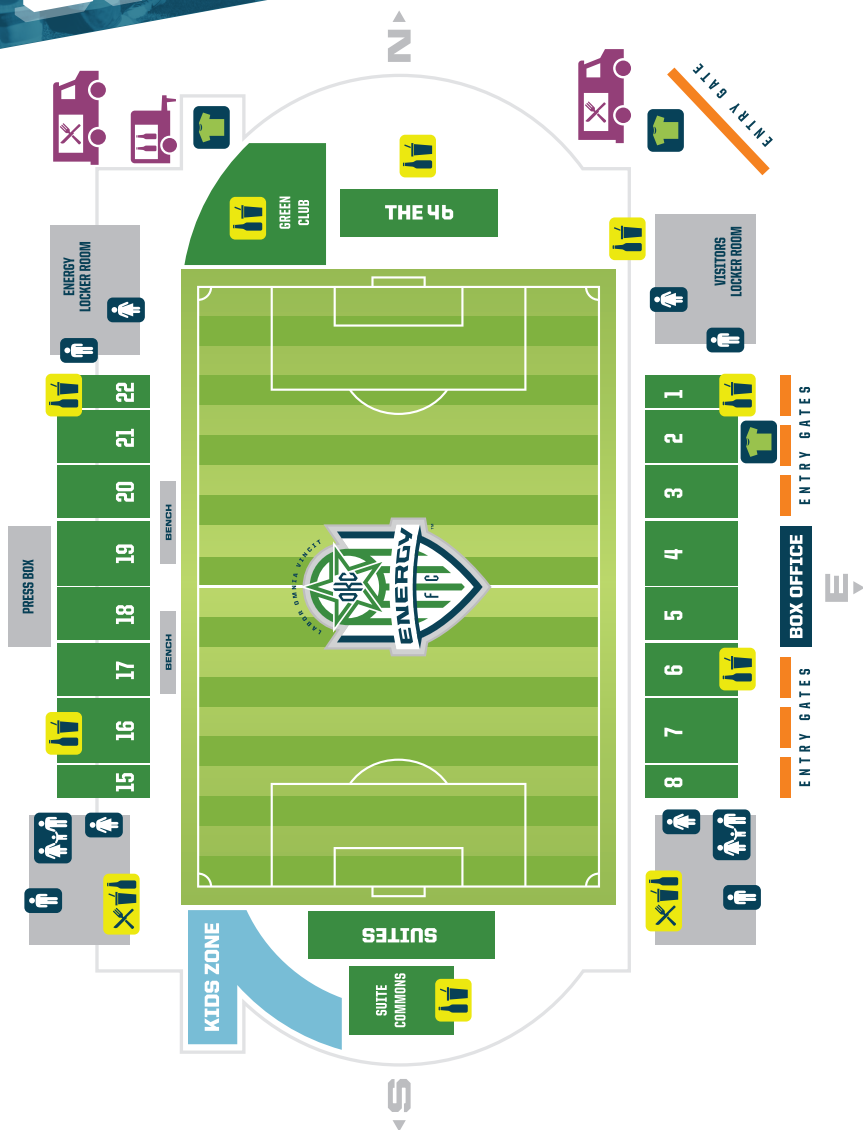

MLS Code of Conduct

Actions that are unacceptable include, but are not limited, to:

- » Physical harm or threats of physical harm to others
- » Disrespectful and/or hateful public speech (verbally or online)
- » Leading, participating, and/or encouraging in inappropriate chants
- » Throwing any objects onto the field of play during a match

Every Green should expect to:

- » Watch the game in a safe, clean and healthy environment.
- » Be treated in a courteous, consistent and professional manner.
- » Be treated with dignity and respect by other spectators attending the game and those organizing the event.
- » "Passionately support" the Energy, provided that the support is in good taste and neither adversely impacts the event experience of fellow spectators nor negatively impacts the game.
- » Displays of good sportsmanship.
- » Timely and accurate information related to the game.

It is up to every fan to display what it means to be a Green and to utilize the OKC Standard and to ensure everyone does, as well. If you see individuals acting in a way that violates the OKC Standard, please inform them and us of their unacceptable behavior. Everyone must be held accountable for their individual actions.

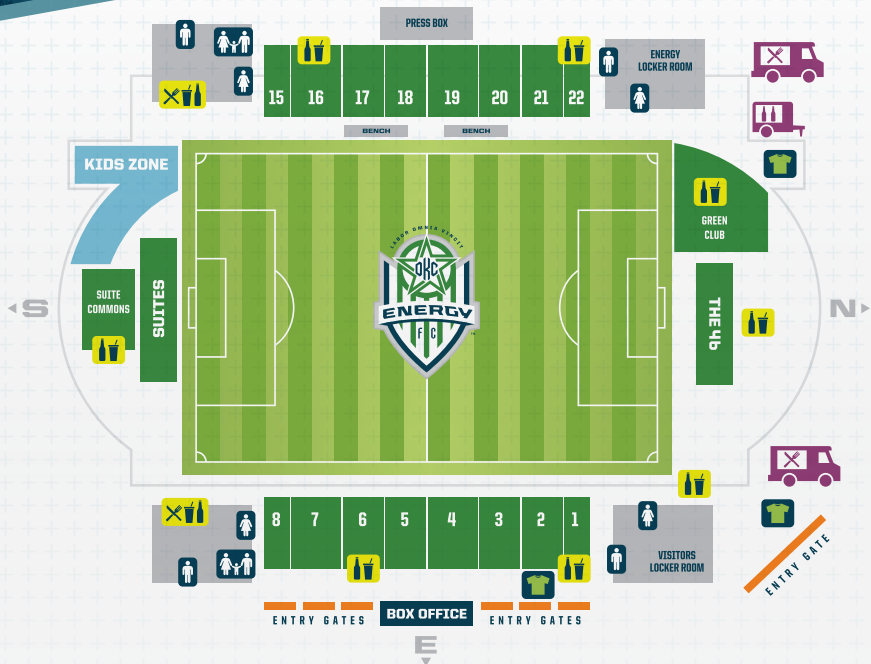

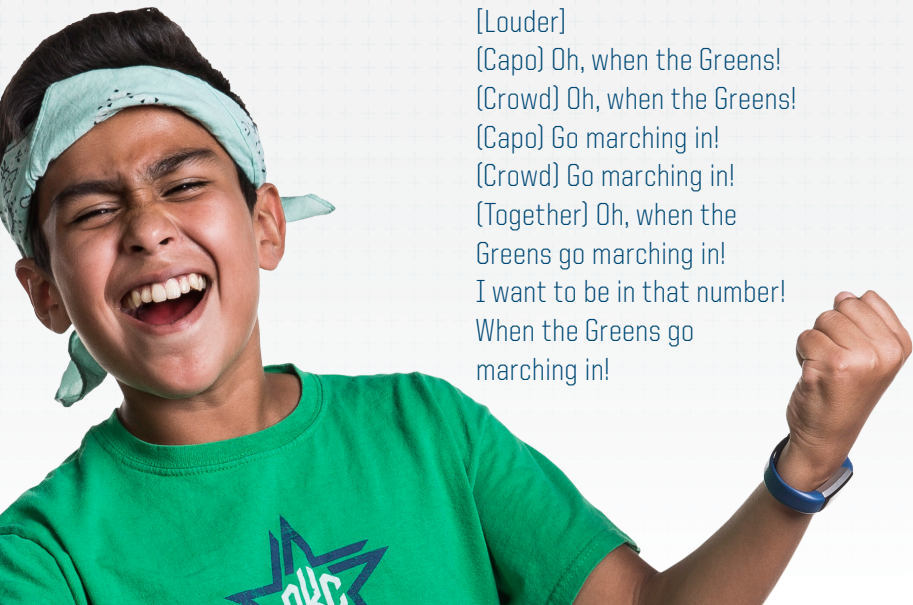

Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.

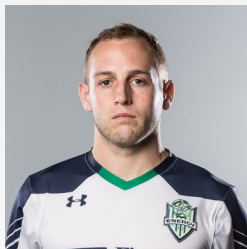

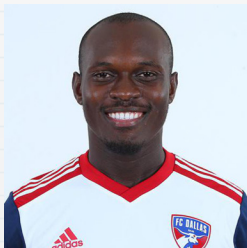
