Energy FC played their first road contest of the 2018 season and dropped a 4-1 decision to Phoenix Rising FC. Rising forward Chris Cortez notched a hat trick on the evening to pace the club from the Valley of the Sun. Christian Ibeagha scored the lone goal for Energy FC.

Wednesday's contest marks the 10th meeting between these two clubs. All-time, Energy FC owns a 6-2-1 record, including a 3-1-1 record in Oklahoma City. Last season, Energy FC took both matches in the series. This is the first of two meetings between the two clubs in 2018. Energy FC won't play Orange County again until September 8 in California.

The last match wasn't exactly what the doctor ordered for Energy FC. That marked just the fifth time in franchise history that the club surrendered four goals and just the third time a player has registered a hat trick against the Greens. Chris Cortez's three goals came in 49 minutes of playing time, the second fastest three goals scored by an opponent in franchise history.

This stretch of matches for Energy FC is among the toughest during the early season.

The club will play three matches in the span of eight days. Two of those matches are on the road and require travel to the West Coast.

Taft Stadium continues to be one of the toughest places to play in the USL. The win over Tulsa last Saturday was the team's fifth straight win at Taft (dating back to the 2017 season). The five straight regular season home wins ties a franchise record

In addition, the Greens have earned points in 10 straight home matches (dating back to last season) and are 8-0-2 in that stretch at home. The record of 12 straight home matches with a point was set May 23–Sept. 16, 2015, when the club went 9-0-3.

The Energy FC roster and technical staff continue to have an international flair as the team is represented by 11 different countries: United States, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha) brings the number of countries that have had players play for the OKC Energy FC to 18.







HEAD COACH & TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.
