Energy FC last played on March 31 on the road against Fresno FC. After a quick strike by Juan Caffa in the 15', the Greens responded with a goal of their own just six minutes later to knot the match at 1-1. Ema Twumasi floated a ball across the front of the net that was headed in by Jaime Siaj. The teams traded opportunities through the rest of the match until Fresno FC midfielder Rony Arugeta collected a loose ball inside the box and set it home for the winner in the 75'. The loss for Energy FC is their third straight.

Portland is in the midst of a three matches in eight-day stretch. They played last Saturday on the road against Real Monarchs SLC, then Wednesday on the road against Tulsa. Each of their matches this season have been played on the road. Their last match on April 4 in Tulsa resulted in a 0-0 draw.

The Portland side is looking to improve upon a rough season in 2017, which saw them post a 3-23-6 mark.

Saturday's match is the sixth meeting between Portland and Oklahoma City.

Energy FC owns a 4-1-0 mark all time, including a 2-0-0 record at home. The last meeting between the teams was June 16, 2017, on the road. The Greens benefited from two PK goals by Andy Craven en route to a 3-1 win. Philip Rasmussen added the other tally for OKC.

The loss to Fresno is the team's third straight following their season-opening win over Tulsa Roughnecks FC. Two of the three losses have been by one goal. One of the challenges during these last three matches has been shots toward goal. During the first match against Tulsa, Energy FC sent 21 shots goalward, the second most in franchise history. During the last three matches, Energy FC has sent a combined 20 shots goalward.

Although Energy FC lost their match against Fresno, they were able to control the pace of play and possession in the match.

According to the Opta Stats, Energy FC owned a 56%-44% advantage in possession for the match. That marked the first time this season that the Greens held an advantage in time of possessions and

were above the 50% mark. Their secondhalf possession time of 59% is the highest this season.

Energy FC enters this week's match against Portland riding a streak they'd sooner jettison. The three-match losing streak is the longest since a three-match skid during the 2015 campaign.

As the calendar inches closer to May, we also get closer to the start of the Energy FC U23s season. The PDL club announced recently the addition of 11 players, all from the state of Oklahoma, to play on the club this season. The list includes each of the last three Gatorade Players of the Year from Oklahoma. Players added include: Garrett McLaughlin, Daryl Dike, Josh Berney, Munashe Raranje, Cooper Clark, Dante Brigida, Butch Hampton, Omar Urquiza, Tyler Lacourse, Colton Haskin and Brandon Brus.

Energy FC U23s have drawn FC Wichita in the first round of the 2018 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. This marks the second straight season the U23s have qualified for the event. Last season they advanced to the second round with a win over Tulsa Athletic before falling to Tulsa Roughnecks FC.

The Energy FC roster and technical staff continue to have an international flair as the team is represented by 11 different countries: United States, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha) brings the number of countries that have had players play for Energy FC to 18.





Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.
