Energy FC last played on April 7 at home against the Portland Timbers 2. The 3-0 loss was the fourth straight setback for Energy FC. The first 20 minutes of the match saw Energy FC stymied on two different opportunities as the result of corner kicks. Defender Christian Ibeagha, up on the play, had the ball at his feet on both occasions, but struck the ball over the crossbar. Trailing 1-0 and looking for the equalizer, Energy FC were nearly rewarded off of another corner kick. On the service from Miguel González, Jaime Siaz flicked a header that went just wide of the cage in the 51st minute. Portland would tack on two additional tallies in the second half, including a penalty kick goal scored by OKC native Lamar Batista.

Saturday's match is the first meeting of the season between Energy FC and Saint Louis FC. All time, Energy FC is 0-1-5 against Saint Louis FC. That includes a 0-1-2 mark at Taft Stadium. After a 2-1 win by Saint Louis FC in April of 2015, the teams have played to five consecutive draws; however, the teams have not met since the season finale of

the 2016 season – a 2-2 draw in Oklahoma City. Of the five draws, two of them were 0-0 draws, two were 2-2 draws and the other a 1-1 draw. Not included in this list of matches is a 0-0 draw played during the 2017 preseason.

The last meeting between the two teams was September 24, 2016, in Oklahoma City. Timo Pitter staked the Greens to a 1-0 lead just 18 seconds into the match in the earliest goal scored in a match in franchise history. Saint Louis would answer with two goals just 2:08 apart to take a 2-1 lead. Energy FC would answer in the 26th minute on a tally by Danni Konig. All scoring was completed by the 26th minute. In the match, only two players presently on the Energy FC roster saw time in the match. Coady Andrews and Kyle Hyland each played 90 minutes in the match. From the Saint Louis side, Aeden Stanley is the only player on their roster from the last time the teams met. The draw was part of 13 played by Energy FC that season.

Saint Louis FC is coming off of a 1-0 win over LA Galaxy II. Joey Calistri's header in

the 46th minute proved to be the game winner. Goalkeeper Jake Fenalson made two saves in keeping a clean sheet.

Energy FC's loss to Portland was the team's fourth straight overall and second straight at home. The four straight losses is the second-longest losing streak in franchise history. Interestingly, both longer streaks came during the 2014 campaign, when the team lost six straight on two different occasions. The two straight home losses is the second-longest home losing streak in the brief franchise history. Twice during the 2014 season, the Greens lost three straight at home.

During the team's last match, a penalty kick was awarded for the first time during the 2018 season and it was awarded to Portland defender Lamar Batista. He promptly scored. That is the 16th penalty kick awarded to an opponent in franchise history, and opponents have converted 14 of those 16 chances. By comparison, Energy FC has been awarded 26 penalty kicks all time and converted on 15.

Augustine Williams' two assists puts him into a category that was previously occupied by just one other player. He joins Michael Nanchoff, interestingly from Portland, as the only players to have registered two assists in one match against Energy FC. Nanchoff turned the trick on August 8, 2015, in a match won by Energy FC 4-3. In that match, Danni Konig scored the first hat trick in Energy FC history and he did so in just under 15 minutes of play.

Energy FC's 1-4-0 start is not the start that the technical staff drew up before the season started. That doesn't mean that the season is lost though. The 2017 season saw the club start with a 1-4-1 mark through six matches. The team wound up making the postseason and playing in the Western Conference Finals. The 2016 season had a similar start as the team was 1-1-4 through six matches and qualified for the postseason.

Energy FC U23s have drawn FC Wichita in the first round of the 2018 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup on May 9. This marks the second

straight season the U23s have qualified for the event. Last season they advanced to the second round with a win over Tulsa Athletic before falling to Tulsa Roughnecks FC. The winner of the match against FC Wichita moves on to face Tulsa Roughnecks FC on May 16.

The U23s aren't the only team competing in the U.S. Open Cup. The first team plays the winner of the NTX Rayados / Fort Worth Vaqueros match during the second round of the tournament. Regardless of opponent,

the match will be played on the road at 7:30 p.m. on May 16.

The Energy FC roster and technical staff continue to have an international flair as the team is represented by 11 different countries: United States, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha) brings the number of countries that have had players play for Energy FC to 18.

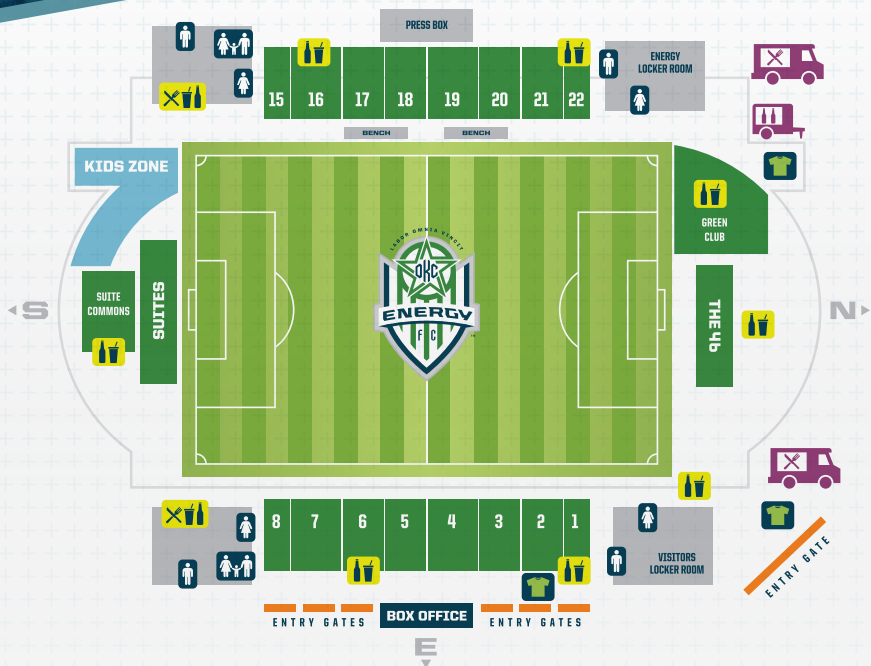

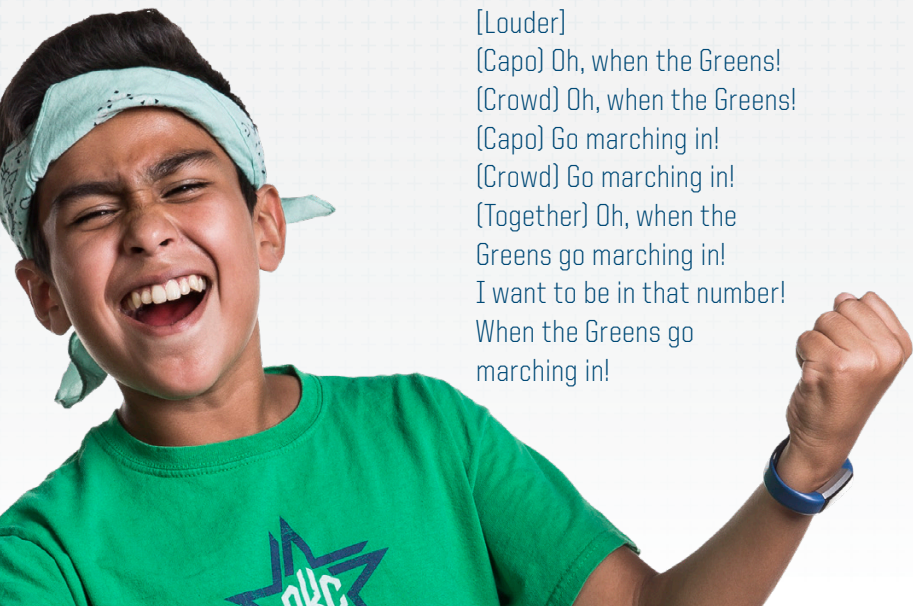

Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.

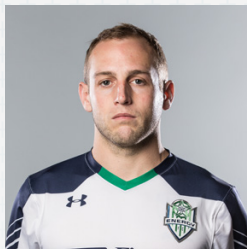

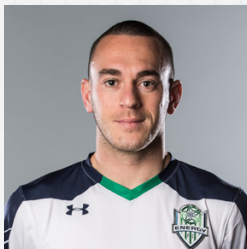

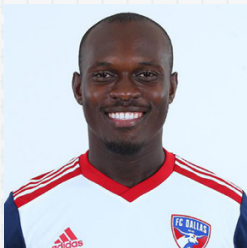
