Energy FC was downed 3-0 in their last regular season match on May 9 against Phoenix Rising. A rough first 20 minutes of play put the Greens into a 2-0 hole and they spent the rest of the match chasing the play. Phoenix forwards Jason Farrell and Jason Johnson each had a goal, while defender Mike da Fonte also scored. Alessandro Riggi had two assists on the evening.

The Green's last match was their first of the 2018 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. They entered the tournament in the second round against NTX Rayados. Energy FC trailed 1-0 before two quick strikes from Philip Rasmussen and Miguel González. A late penalty scored by NTX led to extra time. In the extra time, Rayados scored three goals en route to a 5-2 win.

Saturday marks the first of three meetings on the season between Colorado Springs and OKC. All time, Energy FC is 2-3-2 against Switchbacks FC. That includes a 1-1-1 mark in Oklahoma City. The teams meet again on July 7 in OKC and complete the three-match season series on August 4 in Colorado Springs.

After a rough first 20 minutes of their last match, Energy FC played better and was able to create some chances. However, they enter this regular season match riding a lengthy sequence without a goal. The team enters this match against Colorado Springs on a 519-minute goal-scoring drought, the longest in franchise history. The last goal scored by the Greens was by Jaime Siaz in the 21st minute of their match on March 31 against Fresno.

Goalkeeper Matt VanOekel was busy in the match against Phoenix. He made seven saves on the night, which is the second highest number of saves made by a goalkeeper in a single match in franchise history.

Another streak the team is looking to snap involves the loss column. Entering tonight's match, Energy FC has dropped eight straight regular season matches and five straight at home – both franchise records. Compounding the losing streak at home is a lengthy goal-scoring drought at home. Francis Atuahene's goal six minutes into the home opener on March 17 is the only goal scored by the Greens at home. The Greens

enter tonight looking to snap a 534-minute goal-scoring drought at Taft Stadium.

Despite the lengthy streak, it's not the longest in league history. Both streaks that were longer were both last season. Sacramento Republic FC went 592 minutes without a goal early last season, losing five of those matches.

They rebounded and made the playoffs. Penn FC (formerly Harrisburg City Islanders) own the league mark at 616 consecutive minutes without a goal.

Speaking of Jaime Siaj, he has been called up by the Jordan National team to play two friendly matches with the country. The first is May 20 in Amman, Jordan, against Cyprus and the second is May 26 against China in China. Siaj is the third player in Energy FC franchise history to earn a call up to a national team while a member of the club. He joins Cody Laurendi (Puerto Rico) and Coy Craft (USMNT U-20).

In an effort to spark the offense, Energy FC executed a transfer with Saint Louis

FC. Energy FC acquired forward Christian Volesky on transfer from Saint Louis FC. Volesky has been a member of Saint Louis FC for the last two seasons and has nine goals in 37 matches. Prior to joining Saint Louis, he played two seasons with the Rochester Rhinos, where he scored 20 goals in 50 matches.

The Energy FC U23s played their first round match of the 2018 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup on May 9 on the road against FC Wichita, losing 3-1. OKC native Josh Garcia scored the lone goal for the U23s. FC Wichita played Tulsa Roughnecks FC on Wednesday and downed them 4-3.

The Energy FC roster and technical staff continue to have an international flair as the team is represented by 11 different countries: United States, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha) brings the number of countries that have had players play for Energy FC to 18.

- » Timely and accurate information related to the game.

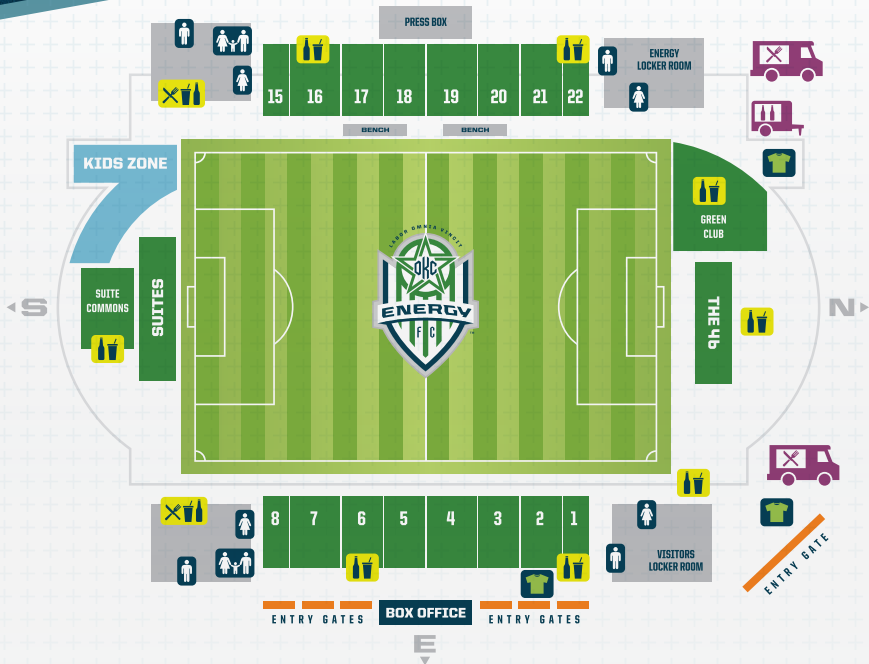

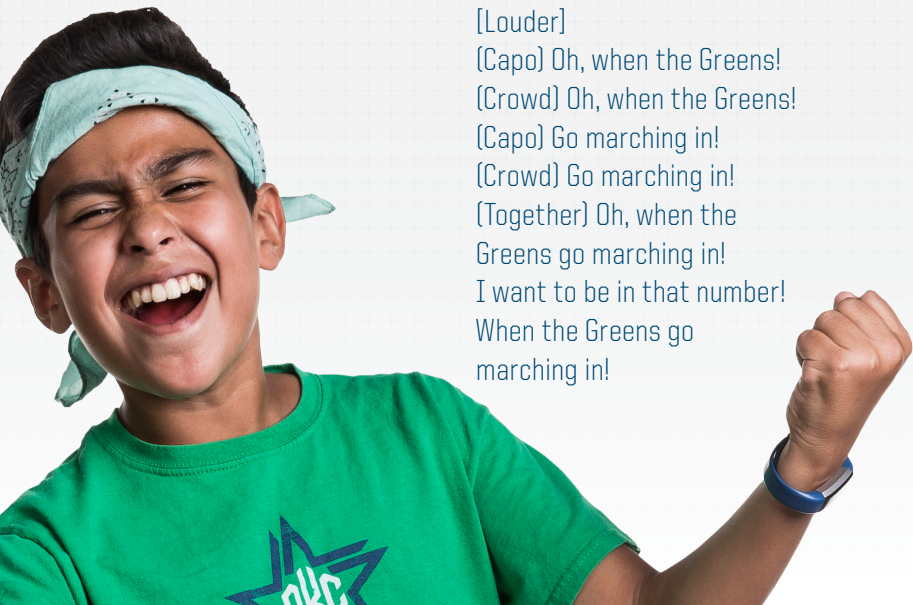

## HEAD COACH & TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

### Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.

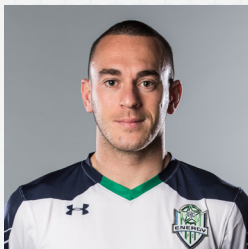
