## Match Preview

## OKC Energy FC

### SAT., JUNE 2, 2018 // 7:30 P.M. ENERGY FC FIELD AT TAFT STADIUM, OKLAHOMA CITY REGULAR SEASON MATCH: #13 HOME MATCH: #8 WATCH LIVE: ESPN+

Energy FC inched closer to securing The Wrench with a 1-1 draw against their in-state rival, Tulsa Roughnecks FC last Saturday in Tulsa. Christian Volesky got things going for Energy FC just 42 seconds in to the match when he broke free off a nifty feed from Alex Dixon to stake The Greens to a 1-0 lead. Tulsa would strike back just 15 minutes later on a goal by Jose Rivas in the 16th minute. The teams would trade opportunities during the rest of the match and would settle for the 1-1 draw.

The draw gives Energy FC four points in the contest for The Wrench, the traveling trophy in the Black Gold Derby. A draw or win in the final meeting between Tulsa and OKC on August 8 in Tulsa returns The Wrench to OKC for the third time in four years.

The meeting with Reno 1868 FC is the second and final of the regular season between these two clubs. The only previous meeting this season was April 28 in Reno, a 2-0 win for the Nevada club. This marks the fourth meeting all time between the clubs. Energy FC is 1-2-0 in those three matches, with the home team having won each match. Christian Volesky's goal 42 seconds into the match is the earliest goal scored by an Energy FC player this season. However, it is not the earliest goal scored in franchise history. Shockingly, there are two goals that have been scored within the first minute of a match. Last season, Jose Angulo scored 38 seconds into a 3-1 win over Sacramento. During the 2016 season, former Energy FC midfielder Timo Pitter scored just 18 seconds into a 2-2 draw with Saint Louis FC.

Energy FC has played Tulsa twice this season. Both matches have seen Energy FC stake themselves to an early 1-0 lead. Christian Volesky's goal 42 seconds into the match last Saturday is the earliest goal scored this season. During the team's first meeting, Francis Atuahene scored six minutes into the match.

Energy FC forward Miguel Gonzalez is eligible to return to the lineup Saturday evening. He was assessed a red card against Reno on April 28 and was given a threematch suspension. Now his suspension is served, he is able to be inserted in the lineup by Head Coach Steve Cooke.

From the department of stats that are interesting, but not necessarily important, the 1-1 draw for Energy FC was the team's first this season. OKC was the final team in the USL to have a match finish in a draw. By way of comparison, Tulsa and Rio Grande Valley FC each have seven draws in 11 matches, while Fresno FC and Penn FC each have six draws. During the 2016 campaign, Energy FC set a then league record with 13 draws. Last season, Ottawa Fury FC broke that record with 14 draws.

Saturday's matchup with Reno marks nearly the halfway mark of Energy FC's home schedule. Yes, it's difficult to have half of an odd number of matches...It is the eighth of 17 matches at Taft Stadium. By the end of July, Energy FC will have just three home matches remaining. By way of comparison, The Greens have played just four road matches, but play six of their last seven away from home.

Head Coach Steve Cooke added some depth at the midfield position with the signing of

Kalif Alhassan. The 27-year old native of Ghana has experience at the MLS level, where he played 93 matches with the Portland Timbers, scored five goals and added 12 assists. He is one of three players in MLS history to record an assist in each of his first three matches at home as a rookie.

The Energy FC U23s captured their first win of the season with a 2-0 win over AHFC Royals from Houston. Matt Puig and Tyler Lacourse scored the goals for the U23s. Nikolas Mertzokat posted a clean sheet. The next match is June 2 against FC Cleburne at Taft Stadium at 2 p.m.

The Energy FC roster and technical staff continues to have an international flair as the team is represented by 11 different countries including: United States, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha) brings the number of countries that have had players play for Energy FC to 18.



### HEAD COACH & TECHNICAL DIRECTOR **Steve Cooke**

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.





