During their last match, Energy FC dug deep and pulled out a 2-1 win over Portland Timbers 2. The Greens were staked to a 1-0 when Jaime Siaj scored his 2nd goal of the season. Kalif Alhassan split the defenders and sent Siaj on his way.

Energy maintained the lead until early in the first half when T2 forward Foster Langsdorf converted on a penlaty kick. Thirteen minutes later, Christian Ibeagha scored his 2nd of the season on a corner kick service from Philip Rasmussen. Goalkeeper Matt VanOekel made five saves on the night for his third win of the season.

Saturday's match against Rio Grande Valley FC is the first of two meetings this season between the two clubs and the only one in OKC. Energy FC is 0-3-2 all time against RGV, including a 0-1-1 mark in Oklahoma City. The last match against RGV was April 29, 2017 in Edinburg, TX. Energy FC, playing their first match in 18 days, was flat and lost 3-0.

The other dominoes have started to fall with regard to goals scored. During the match against Seattle on June 10, Alex Dixon scored his second goal of the season, which made him the first player

on the roster with multiple goals. Energy FC was one of two teams in the league with only one player with multiple goals. The scored against Portland by Jaime Siaj and Christian Ibeagha now give Energy FC three players with multiple tallies.

The positives to multiple tallies doesn't stop there. The two goals scored marked the first time this season Energy FC recorded multiple goals in a single match.

Energy FC goalkeeper Matt VanOekel was one of the busiest players on the field in the match against Portland. T2 fired 21 shots goalward and VanOekel had five saves. None more key than the 90th minute saves on Foster Langsdorf to preserve Energy FC's 2-1 lead. Only VanOekel's seven-save performance against Phoenix on May 9 was greater than his five-save performance from Wednesday.

Speaking of 21 shots goalward... that is the highest shot total by an opponent this season and the second highest by an Energy FC opponent in franchise history. Only the 22 shots for Tulsa during the match on September 6, 2015 and by LA Galaxy II on May 25, 2014 are greater.

This season, opposing goalkeepers have played in five matches in which they've recorded zero saves. By way of comparison, in the previous 118 matches, seven featured an opposing goalkeeper without a save recorded.

Corner kicks have been abundant against Portland this season for Energy FC. During the match Wednesday, they had seven corner kicks, the second highest total of the season. The highest? The nine corners against Portland in the meeting in Oklahoma City April 7. For the record, Portland had eight corner kicks in the match June 13, the most by an Energy FC opponent this season.

Head Coach Steve Cooke continues to make changes to the lineup. Last week, he added centerback Drew Beckie to the lineup. The four-year pro has played with Jacksonville, North Carolina FC and Ottawa Fury FC of the now-defunct NASL. He's appear in 86 matches over those four seasons, logged 6,174 minutes, scored one goal and added three assists. He also added first-year player Ryley Kraft to the roster. Kraft played most of last

season with Orlando City B. Energy FC also recently added veteran Kalif Alhassan.

From the stat that may or may not matter department, Energy FC has taken 81 corner kicks this season compared to their opponent's 52. When it comes to fouls, Energy FC and their opponents are equal. Energy FC has committed 187 fouls this season as have their opponents.

The Energy FC U23s captured their third win of the season last Sunday with a 4-1 win over Kaw Valley FC. Matt Puig scored a hat trick to lead the way for the U23s. The team's next match is June 16 on the road against Brazos Valley Calvary FC at 7:30 p.m.

With the 2018 World Cup underway, more eyes than ever turn to the sport of soccer. Energy FC has players on the roster/technical staff from six of the 32 countries represented in this year's World Cup. They include Miguel Gonzalez (Mexico), Juan Pablo Guzman, Juan Nino and Jose Angulo (Colombia), Philip Rasmussen (Denmark), Christian Ibeagha (Nigeria), Jose Barril and Jaime Siaj (Spain) and Callum Ross, Steve Cooke, Danny Stone, Alexis Vizarelis (England).







Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.
