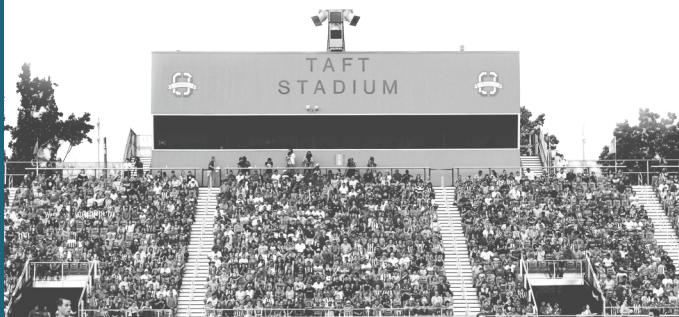

Energy FC won their second straight match and third in their last six with a 3-1 win over Rio Grande Valley FC last Saturday in OKC. After falling behind 1-0 early in the 15th minute, The Greens responded with a Jaime Siaz goal in the 21st minute. The goal was his team-leading third of the season. Energy FC continued their good play and were rewarded with a Callum Ross goal in the 53rd minute. Miguel Gonzalez capped it off with what amounted to an empty-net goal in the 90th minute to give The Greens the 3-1 win. Goalkeeper Matt VanOekel made six saves on the night.

Saturday's match against Los Dos is the first of two meetings between the clubs. All time, Energy FC is 2-4-3 against Los Dos. That includes a 2-2-1 mark in OKC. The last meeting between these clubs was October 1, 2017, a 3-0 win by Energy FC.

During the match Saturday, one streak was snapped while another began. Alex Dixon had scored goals in two straight matches heading into that match. Although he didn't score a goal,

teammate Jaime Siaz did, extending his goal-scoring streak to two matches.

Miguel Gonzalez scored his first goal of the season in the team's last match. That is his first since Energy FC's last match of the 2017 campaign.

Scoring first is monumental for success in soccer. Statistically speaking, when Energy FC scores first in a match, they win 73% of the time. By way of comparison, when they allow the first goal, they win only 12% of the time. The win in their last match was the first time this season they'd won a match after allowing the first goal.

Energy FC goalkeeper Matt VanOekel was one of the busiest players on the field in the last two matches. During those contests, opponents have fired 38 shots goalward. VanOekel has responded with 11 saves, including six against RGV.

One reason VanOekel was busy was the number of corner kicks by opponents. During the match Saturday, RGV had 12 corner kicks, a franchise record

for corner kicks by an opponent. The last two matches have seen Energy FC opponents have a total of 20 corner kicks.

After enduring a 600-minute goal-scoring drought and over six matches without a goal, Energy FC has rebounded and has scored in six straight contests. Interestingly, that is the third-longest streak in franchise history. The longest are an 11-game streak last season and a 14-game streak during the 2015 season.

Midfielder Philip Rasmussen is rounding into form. Since returning to the lineup, he has played the full 90 minutes in nearly all of his games played. He's also contributed on the scoresheet. He's recorded assists in each of the last two matches, both on set pieces.

Head Coach Steve Cooke continues to make changes to the lineup. Recently he's added defender Drew Beckie and midfielders Ryley Kraft and Kalif Alhassan. Following the match Saturday,

the team mutually agreed to terminate the contract of forward Jose Angulo.

With the 2018 World Cup underway, more eyes than ever turn to the sport of soccer. Energy FC has players on the roster/technical staff from six of the 32 countries represented in this year's World Cup. They include Miguel Gonzalez (Mexico), Juan Pablo Guzman, and Juan Niño (Colombia), Philip Rasmussen (Denmark), Christian Ibeagha (Nigeria), José Barril and Jaime Siaj (Spain) and Callum Ross, Steve Cooke, Danny Stone, Alexis Vizarelis (England).

The Energy FC roster and technical staff continues to have an international flair as the team is represented by 12 different countries including: United States, Canada, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha) and Canada (Drew Beckie) brings the number of countries that have had players play for Energy FC to 19.

MLS Code of Conduct

Actions that are unacceptable include, but are not limited to:

- » Leading, participating, and/or encouraging in inappropriate chants
- » Throwing any objects onto the field of play during a match

Every Green should expect to:

- » Watch the game in a safe, clean and healthy environment.
- » Be treated in a courteous, consistent and professional manner.
- » Be treated with dignity and respect by other spectators attending the game and those organizing the event.
- » "Passionately support" the Energy, provided that the support is in good taste and neither adversely impacts the event experience of fellow spectators nor negatively impacts the game.
- » Displays of good sportsmanship.
- » Timely and accurate information related to the game.

It is up to every fan to display what it means to be a Green and to utilize the OKC Standard and to ensure everyone does, as well. If you see individuals acting in a way that violates the OKC Standard, please inform them and us of their unacceptable behavior. Everyone must be held accountable for their individual actions.

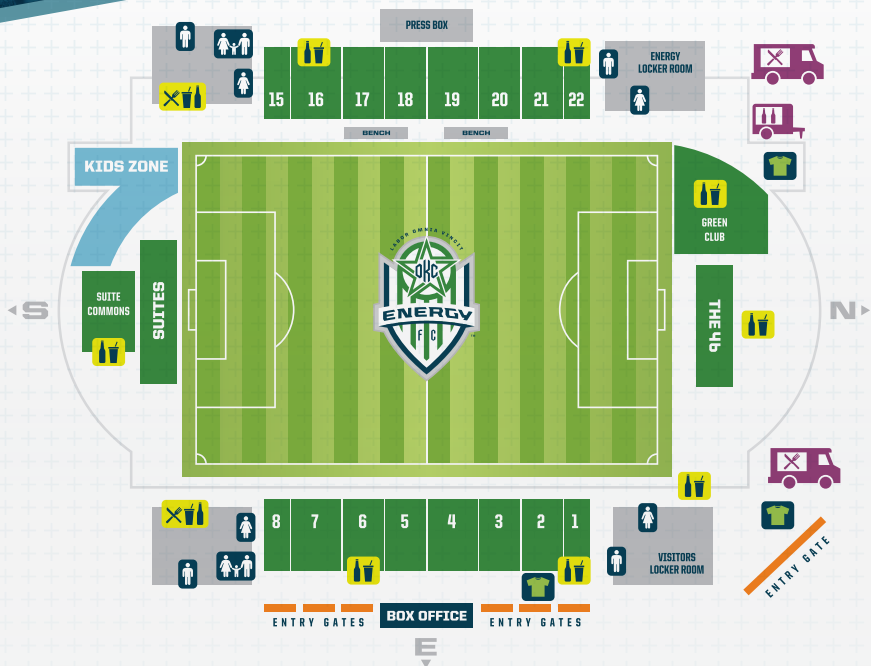

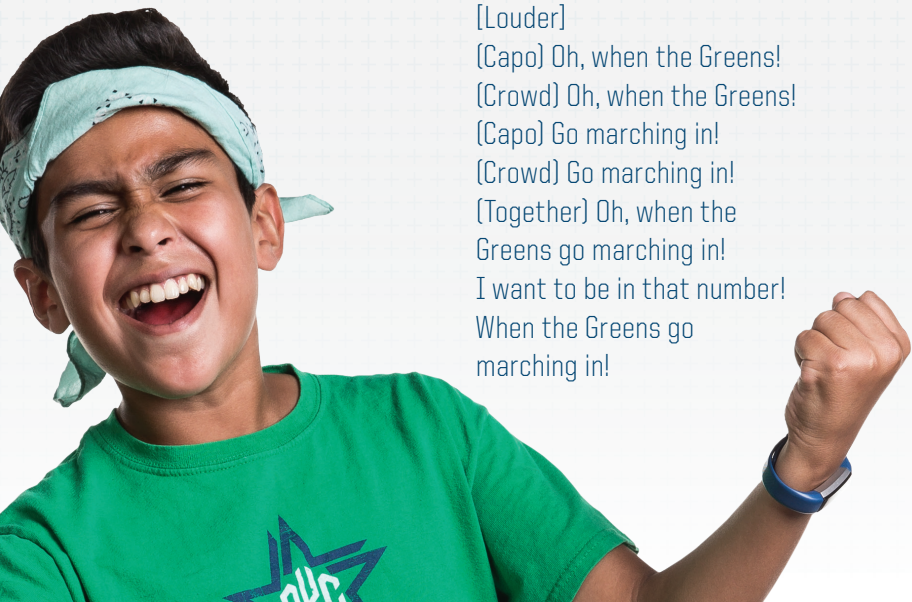

Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.

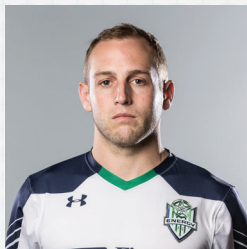

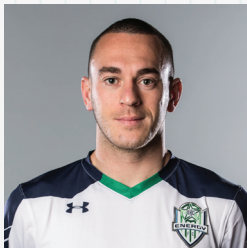
