After a 10-day break, Energy FC returned to action with a road contest against San Antonio FC. After a storm delayed the start of the match by one hour, the teams got under way and played to a 1-1 draw. Jose Barril scored a highlight reel goal in the 68th minute to stake The Greens to a 1-0 lead. San Antonio struck just nine minutes later on a goal by Alex Bruce. The teams traded opportunities in the latter part of the match, but the score remained tied at 1-1. Each goalkeeper made their share of saves during the match. Both Energy FC's Matt VanOekel and San Antonio FC keeper Matt Cardone made three saves during the match.

Saturday's matchup is the ninth regular season meeting all time between these two clubs. Energy FC has only played more matches against Tulsa (13), Phoenix (11) and LA Galaxy (10) than the nine against Colorado Springs. They've also played nine matches against Orange County and Sacramento. The matches against Colorado Springs have been even, with Energy FC owning a 3-3-2 mark in the previous eight matches. That included a 2-1-1 record in Oklahoma City. The teams met once earlier this season on May 19 in OKC. A Callum Ross goal in the 84th minute gave Energy FC a 1-0 win. The win snapped a lengthy losing and goal-scoring drought.

Jose Barril's goal was his first of this season and Energy FC's 14th of the campaign. He is the eighth player to record a goal for OKC this season. Twenty of the league's 32 teams have nine or 10 players that have scored a goal this season. Nashville and Seattle have the fewest players that have scored a goal with six.

The result of the last match against San Antonio was a bit disappointing for Energy FC, but not statistically odd. Energy FC has played San Antonio FC seven times during the regular season and has a 1-0-6 record against the club. After a draw in their first meeting, Energy FC came through with a road win May 21, 2016... the only win in the series. After that, the teams have played to a draw in each of their next five meetings. Three of the draws have been 0-0 affairs, while the other two have been 1-1 matches. The five-match streak of playing to a draw ties a franchise mark. Energy FC played Saint Louis FC to a draw

in five straight matches during the 2015 and 2016 seasons. Of Energy FC's 35 draws, 11 of them have come against San Antonio or Saint Louis. That's 31% of the draws.

Energy FC has endured some tough times on the field this season. On the heels of an eight-match losing streak, the team has posted a 4-2-2 record, including wins in three of the last four.

Part of the success in the standings has stemmed from a consistent slate of goal scoring. Energy FC has scored a goal in eight straight matches. That is the third longest streak in franchise history. The longest are an 11-game streak during the 2017 campaign and a 14-game streak during the 2015 season.

Alex Dixon's assist on Jose Barril's goal against San Antonio gives him two on the season. He joins Philip Rasmussen as players on the roster with multiple assists on the season. Rasmussen had his threematch assist streak snapped in the team's last match. Each of those three assists for Rasmussen came on game-winning tallies.

Head Coach Steve Cooke continues to make changes to the lineup. Within the

last three weeks, he's added defender Drew Beckie and midfielders Ryley Kraft and Kalif Alhassan. The team also signed defender Atiba Harris. The native of St. Kitts & Nevis in the Caribbean is a veteran of 276 matches in MLS. Most recently, he played 85 matches with FC Dallas from 2015-17. In addition to his MLS experience, he also has substantial international experience with his home nation. He's appeared in 60 matches and scored 14 goals.

The Energy FC U23s are knee-deep in their season. Following a match June 30 on the road against Corpus Christi FC, they play their final five matches during a 15-day stretch in July. That includes home matches July 6, 14 and 15.

With the 2018 World Cup underway, more eyes than ever turn to the sport of soccer. Energy FC has players on the roster and technical staff from six of the 32 countries represented in this year's World Cup. They include Miguel Gonzalez (Mexico), Juan Pablo Guzman, and Juan Nino (Colombia), Philip Rasmussen (Denmark), Christian Ibeagha (Nigeria), Jose Barril and Jaime Siaj (Spain) and Callum Ross, Steve Cooke, Danny Stone, Alexis Vizarelis (England).

- » Timely and accurate information related to the game.



HEAD COACH & TECHNICAL DIRECTOR **Steve Cooke**

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.
