Match Preview

The Greens returned to action for the first time in 10 days on the road in Sacramento. The first half was not fantastic for Energy FC. They were outshot 13-4, out-possessed by a 3-to-1 margin and were trailing 1-0. The second half was a bit more Energy FC-like, with possession nearly 50/50 and OKC outshooting Sacramento 6-3. The biggest stat was a Christian Volesky goal in the 78th minute on an assist from Callum Ross. The goal drew the teams even 1-1 and allowed for Energy FC to earn a point in a seventh-straight contest. Bryan Byars made four saves on the night in his second start of the season.

Wednesday's matchup is only the second meeting between these clubs and the first in OKC. The last time they both met was on March 31 in Fresno, with the home team coming away with a 2-1 win. During that match Jaime Siaj scored the lone goal for Energy FC.

The draw for Energy FC extended their streak of games with at least one point earned to seven (4-0-3). That is the longest streak this season for the Greens and is the longest such streak since an eight-game streak June 18-July 30, 2016, when the team went 4-0-4. Energy FC has reached an eight-match streak of earning a point four times previously in franchise history. The highwater mark for consecutive matches with at least one point is nine, was set between July 5-Aug. 29, 2015, when the team went 5-0-4.

Included in this seven-game stretch of earning a point is the team's 5-2-4 mark during its last 11 matches. A key to that success is scoring goals. During this 11-game stretch, the team has scored 19 goals while allowing only 14.

Part of the continued success for Energy FC is scoring goals. The team has scored a goal in 11 straight matches, tying the mark for the second-longest streak of consecutive games with a goal scored. The last 11-game streak was June 16-Aug. 12, 2017. The franchise record for consecutive games with a goal scored is 14 set March 28-June 27, 2015.

The first-half possession stat for Energy FC in their last contest was below expectations. The 32.1 percent possession time is the lowest first-half possession mark of the season and the second-lowest for any half of a match this season. Only a 29.8 percent mark at Reno on April 28 was lower. For the season, Energy FC's first- and second-half possession times are within .7 percentage points. First-half possession average is 48.5 percent, while second-half possession average is 49.2 percent.

Energy FC's schedule has been feast-orfamine for June and July. During mid-June, the team played three matches in a seven-day stretch from June 10-16. Following a match June 23, the team was off for 10 days. Beginning July 4, the team again played three matches in a seven-day stretch, then had 10 days between matches. Beginning July 21-28, the team will again play three matches in a seven-day stretch, have a few days off, then have another three-match stretch in early August. Following this week's home matches, Energy FC will have just three home matches remaining in the 2018 season, compared to nine matches away from the friendly confines of Taft Stadium.

Energy FC is one of two teams in the league that has not been awarded a penalty kick this season. They join Pittsburgh Riverhounds as the only club without a penalty attempt. Nashville and Pittsburgh have not allowed a penalty attempt this season. Energy FC's opponent Wednesday has been awarded two PKs and allowed two.

Energy FC's roster and technical staff continue to have an international flair, as the team is represented by 13 different countries: United States, Canada, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, St. Kitts & Nevis, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha), Canada (Drew Beckie) and St. Kitts & Nevis (Atiba Harris) brings the number of countries that have had players play for Energy FC to 20.







Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.


