The Greens returned to action for the second of a three-game stretch in an eight-day span. The match between teams closely matched in the standings was closely played on the field and ended in a 0-0 draw. The clean sheet for Energy FC goalkeeper Bryan Byars was his first as a member of Energy FC. The draw snapped a streak of 11 straight games that Energy FC had scored a goal. The good news is the draw extended the team's unbeaten streak to eight straight.

Saturday's match is the second of two regular-season meetings between San Antonio and Oklahoma City. The last match was played just 24 days ago in San Antonio. After a storm delayed the start of the match one hour, the teams got under way and played to a 1-1 draw. José Barril scored a highlight-reel goal in the 68th minute to stake the Greens to a 1-0 lead. San Antonio struck just nine minutes later on a goal by Alex Bruce. The teams traded opportunities in the latter part of the match, but the score remained tied 1-1. Each goalkeeper made their share of fantastic saves during the match. Both Energy FC's Matt Van Oekel and San Antonio FC keeper Matt Cardone made three saves during the match.

The draw for Energy FC extended their streak of games with at least one point earned to eight (4-0-4). That is the longest streak this season for the Greens and is the longest such streak since an eight-game streak June 18 - July 30,

2016, when the team also went 4-0-4. Energy FC has reached an eight-match streak of earning a point four times previously in franchise history. The high-water mark for consecutive matches with at least one point is nine, set July 5 - Aug. 29, 2015, when the team went 5-0-4.

Snapped in the 0-0 draw with Fresno was Energy FC's 11-game streak of scoring at least one goal in a match. That streak matched the second-longest in franchise history. The last time Energy FC failed to score was a May 9 loss to Phoenix Rising FC.

The series between San Antonio and OKC has, in a word, been ... close. Including the 1-1 draw in the last match, Energy FC has played San Antonio FC seven times during the regular season and has a 1-0-6 record against the club. After a draw in their first meeting during the 2016 season in OKC, Energy FC came through with a road win May 21, 2016 ... the only win in the series. After that, the teams have played to a draw in each of their next five meetings. Three of the draws have been 0-0 affairs, while the other two have been 1-1 matches. The five-match streak of playing to a draw ties a franchise mark. Energy FC played Saint Louis FC to a draw in five straight matches during the 2015 and 2016 seasons. Of Energy FC's 38 draws, 11 of them have come against San Antonio or Saint Louis. That's 29 percent of the draws total draws for the club.

Speaking of draws, the 0-0 draw in the last match was the 12th in franchise history. Seven of the 12 0-0 draws have come against San Antonio (3), Rio Grande Valley FC (2) or Saint Louis FC (2).

During the last match, Energy FC tied a season high for corner kicks in a game with nine. What is interesting is the results of the matches that the team has had the most corner kicks this season. The Greens have had three occasions with nine corner kicks in a match and three with seven. Their record in those contests is 1-4-1.

The Energy FC schedule features five stretches of three games in a seven-day-or-less span. The team has fared well in most of those stretches. The first was not good, as the team went 0-3-0 in matches March 24, 28 and 31. Subsequent stretches have seen the team go 2-1-0 in games June 10, 13 and 16, 1-0-2 in games July 4, 7 and 11. Heading into the final game of this stretch of matches July 21, 25 and 28, the team is 0-0-2. The Greens have one final three-matches-in-seven-days stretch Aug. 4-11, with matches on the road against Colorado Springs (8/4), on the road against Tulsa (8/7) and home against Real Monarchs SLC (8/11).

Following Saturday's home match, Energy FC has just three home matches remaining in the 2018 season, compared to nine matches away from the friendly confines of Taft Stadium.

The 0-0 draw against Fresno FC draws Energy FC to a place they've not been since a 1-0 loss to Orange County SC on March 28: at the .500 mark at home. The team has earned points in five straight matches at Taft Stadium, going 3-0-2 in that stretch.

Energy FC is one of two teams in the league that has not been awarded a penalty kick this season. They join Pittsburgh Riverhounds as the only club without a penalty attempt. Nashville and Pittsburgh have not allowed a penalty attempt this season. Energy FC's opponent Saturday has been awarded three PKs and allowed two.

With a season-ending injury to Matt Van Oekel, Head Coach Steve Cooke signed goalkeeper Cody Laurendi to a contract. Laurendi is the franchise leader in most goalkeeping categories including wins (18) and clean sheets (20).

The Energy FC roster and technical staff continues to have an international flair, as the team is represented by 13 different countries: United States, Canada, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, St. Kitts & Nevis, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha), Canada (Drew Beckie) and St. Kitts & Nevis (Atiba Harris) brings the number of countries that have had players play for Energy FC to 20.





Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.
