Energy FC claimed The Wrench for the third time in the last four seasons with a 3-0 win over Tulsa Roughnecks FC in the team's last match August 8. Although the team was out-possessed 55% to 44%, the Greens took advantage of their opportunities during the match. Adam Jahn (45'), Christian Volesky (49') and Alex Dixon (79') each scored, while goalkeeper Cody Laurendi made two saves in keeping a clean sheet. Energy FC took the season series over Tulsa 2-0-1 and brought the wrench back to OKC.

Saturday's matchup is the first of two meetings this season between Real Monarchs SLC and OKC Energy FC. Real Monarchs are the only team Energy FC has yet to play this season. All-time, Energy FC is 3-2-0 against Real Monarchs with all three wins coming at home.

This Saturday's match is the final match of Energy FC's schedule where they play three matches in eight (or fewer) days. Including their matches August 4 against Colorado Springs and August 8 against Tulsa, the Greens are 1-1-0 in the first two games of this set. The month of July had two such stretches. Energy FC was 1-0-2 in the first stretch and 0-1-2 in the second.

During the match Wednesday, goalkeeper Cody Laurendi returned to the pitch for the first time in 11 months. Last September, he

suffered a season-ending injury and has been working to return to game shape. He made two saves en route to the shutout win. The win was his 19th and his clean sheet was his 21st, extending his club record in both categories.

Cody Laurendi's start in net means Energy FC have used three different goalkeepers in matches this season. Matt Van Oekel played every minute of every match before his season-ending injury suffered July 7 against Colorado Springs. Following that, Bryan Byars started five straight matches. During the 2014 season, Energy FC utilized three different goalkeepers. Ray Clark, Samir Badr and Jon Kempin each started and won matches for Energy FC.

Following Saturday's match, Energy FC has just two home matches remaining in the 2018 season, compared to seven matches away from the friendly confines of Taft Stadium.

Alex Dixon was awarded and converted on a penalty kick in the 79th minute of the team's win over Tulsa. That was the team's first PK awarded this season. Energy FC was the final team in the league to be awarded a penalty kick. On the flip side, Pittsburgh is the only club in the league that has not conceded a penalty kick. Energy FC's opponent Saturday has been awarded two PKs and conceded six.

Alex Dixon's goal in the 79th minute allowed him to keep pace with Christian Volesky for the team lead in goals. Volesky scored his sixth goal of the season in the 49th minute of the match. Although Volesky has six goals, only five have come as a member of Energy FC. He scored one goal with Saint Louis FC (against Energy FC) before OKC acquired him May 8 in a trade with SLFC.

Newcomer Adam Jahn got on the board for Energy FC with a goal in the 45th minute of the team's last match. The veteran has 12 goals in 103 MLS matches. He is the 10th Energy FC player to record a goal with the club this season and the 47th all time.

Adam Jahn's goal made him the 10th player to score a goal for Energy FC this season. The highest number of players to score was 14 during the 2014 season. The fewest number of players to score was nine during the 2015 season.

Recently, Energy FC added two additional players to the roster. Adam Jahn joined Energy FC on loan from Columbus Crew, while midfielder Monty Patterson was signed to a contract. Patterson has played with the New Zealand national team at the U20, U23 and men's team level.

Energy FC's win over Tulsa was their third on the road against the Roughnecks. That is tied for the most road wins against one team. The Greens also have three road wins against Orange County and Portland. Energy FC has played 30 different teams during their five seasons in the league but has not visited each of those cities. Energy FC has played road games in 24 of those cities. That number will go to 25 on September 29 when Energy FC visits Las Vegas Lights FC for the first time in franchise history. Energy FC is at or above .500 against seven teams on the road: Dayton Dutch Lions, Orange County SC, Portland Timbers 2, San Antonio FC, Saint Louis FC, Swope Park Rangers and Tulsa Roughnecks FC.

Energy FC's roster and technical staff continues to have an international flair as the team is represented by 14 different countries including: United States, Canada, Jamaica, Colombia, Denmark, England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain, Wales, St. Kitts & Nevis, Ghana and Nigeria. The representation of Nigeria (Christian Ibeagha) and Canada (Drew Beckie), St. Kitts & Nevis (Atiba Harris) and New Zealand (Monty Patterson) brings the number of countries that have had players play for Energy FC to 21.

MLS Code of Conduct

Actions that are unacceptable include, but are not limited to:

- » Leading, participating, and/or encouraging in inappropriate chants
- » Throwing any objects onto the field of play during a match

Every Green should expect to:

- » Watch the game in a safe, clean and healthy environment.
- » Be treated in a courteous, consistent and professional manner.
- » Be treated with dignity and respect by other spectators attending the game and those organizing the event.
- » "Passionately support" the Energy, provided that the support is in good taste and neither adversely impacts the event experience of fellow spectators nor negatively impacts the game.
- » Displays of good sportsmanship.
- » Timely and accurate information related to the game.

It is up to every fan to display what it means to be a Green and to utilize the OKC Standard and to ensure everyone does, as well. If you see individuals acting in a way that violates the OKC Standard, please inform them and us of their unacceptable behavior. Everyone must be held accountable for their individual actions.

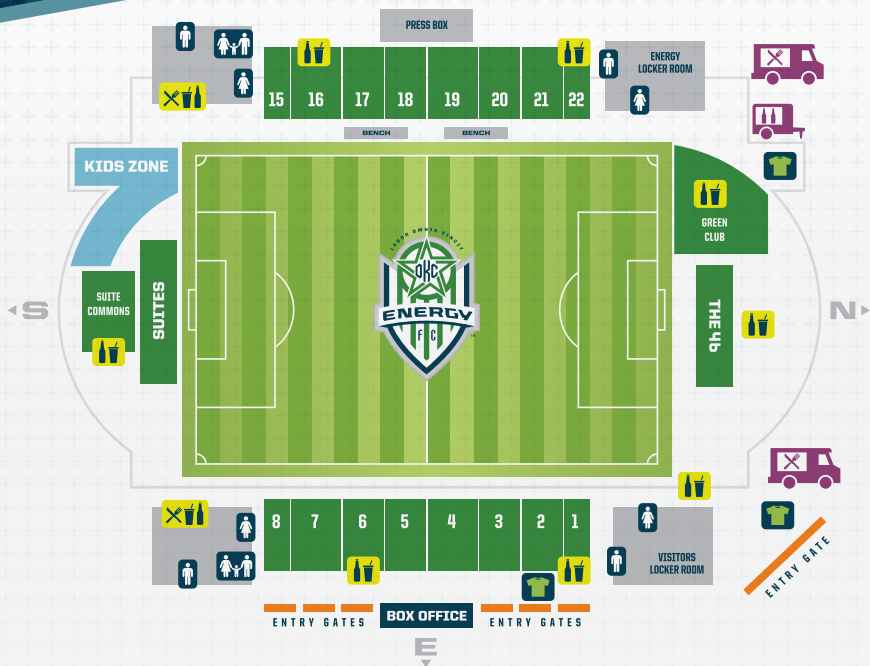

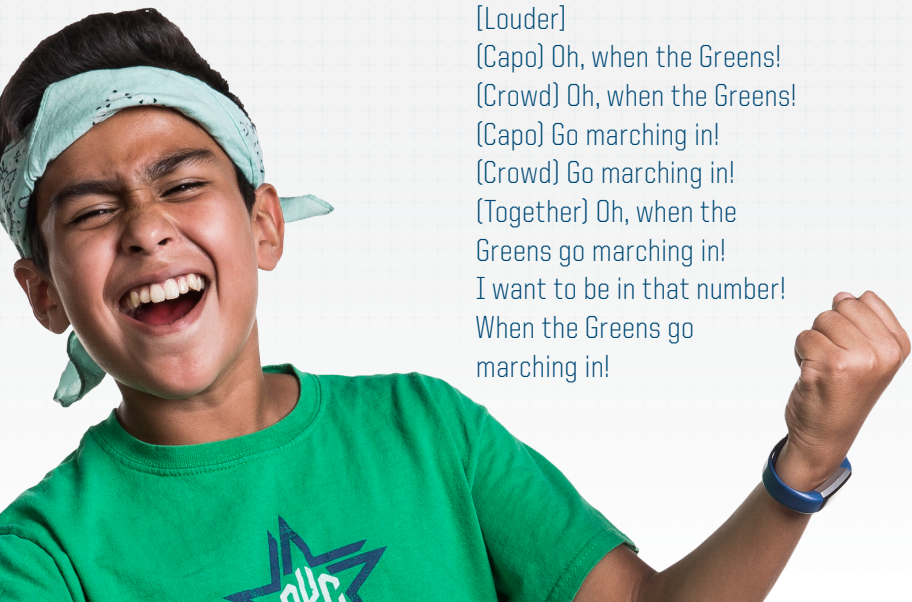

Steve Cooke

Steve Cooke is the second coach in Energy FC history and assumed his role as head coach and technical director in December 2017.

Most recently, Cooke served as a coach at several levels with the Colorado Rapids of MLS. His career with the Rapids began in 2010 when he was named technical director within their development academy. After two years, he added the title of assistant coach with the first team to his duties, which he held until the middle of the

2017 season when he was named interim head coach of the club.

Prior to joining the Rapids, the Sheffield, England, native worked as technical director for Neusport Football Club in Las Vegas from 2007-2010 and spent 10 years in Arizona as a director of coaching for Serano Soccer Club and SC Del Sol.

Cooke originally moved to the United States in 1996 after six years with Sheffield Wednesday Football Club, then of the English Premier League, as youth team coach and centre of excellence director.

A graduate of Carnegie College, England, he owns his UEFA "A" Coaching License, USSF "A" Coaching License and he recently completed his Pro License course. He is one of four coaches in the USL and one of 30 in total that have earned their Pro License from U.S. Soccer. In addition to those elite qualifications, Cooke was part of the first Elite Formation Coaches License course conducted by the French Football Federation in conjunction with Major League Soccer.

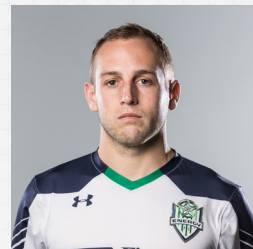

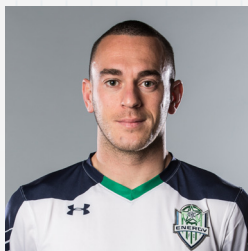

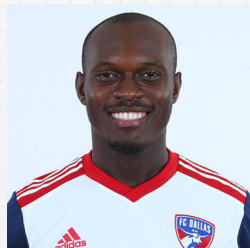
