THE PRESIDENT

William H. Sullivan, Jr.

W. H. (Bill) Sullivan, a late and fast riser in the business world, has a background of association with sports and was the natural man to head up Boston's entry into professional football.

A 1937 graduate of Boston College, Sullivan stayed at his alma mater to serve as publicity director for three seasons. When former Boston College Coach Frank Leahy went to Notre Dame in 1941, Sullivan was hired as Leahy's personal secretary.

Entering the Navy in 1942, he was assigned to the Aviation Division and then to the U.S. Naval Academy Sports Program.

After the War, he became publicity director of the Boston Braves baseball team, serving from 1946 to 1952. While with the Braves, he started the now-famed Jimmy Fund for cancer research.

In 1952, Sullivan joined Leahy and George Sargent, now a part-owner of the Patriots, in forming the All-Star Sports Corporation, a firm which made sports television films. He also coordinated Radio-TV publicity for the Little Leagues.

Sullivan entered the business world in 1955 when he was made Assistant to the President of the Metropolitan Coal and Oil Co. In three years he rose to the President's chair and has also become president of the Petroleum Heat and Power Co. and the Frost Coal and Oil Co.

Professional football for his beloved Boston was a dream of Sullivan for years, and he made frequent application for a franchise. The dream came alive with the American Football League.

THE OWNERS

Bill Sullivan shares equally with nine other men the ownership of the Boston Patriots. These are: George L. Sargent, John Ames, Joseph E. Sullivan, L. Edgar Turner, Daniel F. Marr, Dean Boylan, Paul Sonnabend, Edward McMann and Dom DiMaggio. In addition, the public snapped up 140,000 shares of Patriots stock, at \$5 a share, when the club put them up for sale in order to broaden the base of fan interest. The stock is non-voting.

THE GENERAL MANAGER

Ed McKeever

Frank Leahy once called Ed McKeever "the best procurer of football players in America." Named to the general manager's post of the Patriots in mid-January of this year, McKeever proved out Leahy's appraisal by touring the country searching out, and signing, top talent. The 49-year-old native of Lubbock, Texas, which still claims him, is a proven talent in football administration. Recently voted the outstanding athlete at Texas Tech of the last 25 years, McKeever was introduced to coaching as an assistant at Boston College. He was an assistant, then head coach at Notre Dame, Cor-

nell and the University of San Francisco, and also served as assistant at L.S.U. In the old All-American Conference, he was head coach of the Chicago Rockets. Until hired by the Patriots he was an executive with a Louisiana industrial firm, but kept his football hand in as a full-time player scout for a pro team.

THE HEAD COACH

Lou Saban

There was a flood of 73 applications for the Boston coaching job last winter, but among them the name of Lou Saban was missing. "I didn't apply," Saban explained later, "because I knew they'd want somebody pretty special."

Saban was right in his thoughts, but wrong in not applying. The intensive search led to this fast-rising 38-year-old who had just completed an unbeaten (9-0) season at Western Illinois.

Saban, a native of LaGrange, Ill., participated in track and football at Lyons Township High. He attended the University of Indiana and had the distinction, in separate seasons, of

being named All-Big Ten quarterback and All-Big Ten fullback. He was named most valuable player and captain of the 1943 team.

In 1946, he began his pro playing career with the Cleveland Browns of the All-America Conference. As captain of the team for all four of his playing seasons, he led the Browns to four straight Conference titles and was twice named All-Pro linebacker although he weighed only 200.

In 1950, Saban was named head coach at Case Institute, staying four seasons before going to assistant jobs at Washington and Northwestern. He took over as head coach at Western Illinois University in 1957, built successive won-lost-tied seasons of 5-4-1, 6-1-1, and 9-0.

THE ASSISTANTS

MICHAEL J. (MIKE) HOLOVAK — Also serves as Director of Player Personnel. The 40-year-old Holovak is a former fullback great at Boston College. He followed with three years pro ball for the Los Angeles Rams and Chicago Bears, returned to Boston College as freshman coach in 1949 and was named head coach in 1951. He stayed nine years, a record of tenure at B.C.

ROBERT N. (RED) MILLER \rightarrow A native of Macomb, Ill., where he earned 15 sports letters. At Western Illinois, he was named Most Valuable Player three years in succession (1947-1949) and was voted Little All-America in 1949. Despite his youth, he has been in coaching, both as assistant at Western Illinois and Carthage College and as high school head coach, for ten seasons.

JEROME A. (JERRY) SMITH — Former All-Big Ten guard at University of Wisconsin and pro player, as offensive guard and defensive end, for San Francisco and Green Bay. Was line coach at University of Dayton in 1959. Age: 29.

JOEL D. COLLIER — At 27, Collier is youngest member of a youthful Patriot staff. Native of Rock Island, Ill., he was a two-time All-Big Ten selection at Northwestern, serving as co-captain his senior season of 1953. Served four years as end coach at Western Illinois.

OFFICIAL ALL-LEAGUE TEAM

Thirty-two members of the press, radio and TV corps, all regulars at AFL games, were allowed to select the first official all-league team.

Their composite verdict showed a strong preference for the play of the league rookies, 23 of whom were named on the 44-man squad.

Offensively, there were seven rookies on the first team and seven on the second unit; defensively, there were four first-year men on the first unit and five on the second.

The divisional championship teams, Houston and Los Angeles, each put eight players on the squad to lead in player placement.

One unexpected development was the rise of lesser-known rookies to higher pro reputations than the more familiar All-America players. There were six members of the 1959 consensus All-America team, including the total backfield, in AFL play during 1960. Of these, only one — Houston halfback Billy Cannon of L.S.U. — won a spot on the All-AFL team, that on the second offensive unit.
