# **JAMES B. ORTHWEIN**



# Chairman Of the Board

\*\*\*\*\*

On May 11, 1992, James B. Orthwein became the New England Patriots' Chairman of the Board when he purchased the majority interest in the club from Victor K. Kiam II.

Upon purchasing the Patriots, Orthwein spoke of his intention to stabilize the New England Patriots franchise.

"I have stated previously that I will not be the Patriots' owner indefinitely and I have no plans to move the team to any other market," said Orthwein. "But on an interim basis, I will be involved actively in improving the franchise."

With that said, Orthwein has made it clear that he has three primary goals for the New England franchise:

- \* Continuing the rebuilding of the Patriots' franchise.
- \* Resolution of stadium issues that currently put the team at a disadvantage.
- \* Finding a buyer dedicated to keeping the team in New England.

The 68-year-old Orthwein will serve as Chairman and Chief Executive Officer for the St. Louis football franchise if one is awarded to that city. He is chairman of Huntleigh Asset Partners, a private investment partnership in Clayton, Missouri and is a lifelong resident of St. Louis. In addition, Orthwein is a member of the Board of Directors and a major shareholder of Anheuser-Busch Companies, Inc.

In July 1990, he joined the St. Louis NFL Partnership along with current Patriots President Francis W. Murray, Jerry G. Clinton and Walter J. Payton, the NFL's all-time leading rusher. The aim of the group is to bring an expansion franchise to St. Louis, which lost its team, the Cardinals, in 1988. Orthwein became the partnership's majority owner, chairman and chief executive officer in September 1991.

Orthwein began his business career with D'Arcy Advertising Co. in 1947 and worked in virtually every department. He was elected Chairman of the Board of D'Arcy in 1970, and following a merger with McManus, John & Adams, was elected President and Co-Chief Executive Officer. Beginning in 1976, he served as Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of DM&M Worldwide, Inc. until his retirement in 1983.

Under Orthwein's leadership, DM&M Worldwide, Inc. achieved billings of more than \$1 billion and was ranked among the top 12 advertising agencies in the world at the time he retired.

He has served as a member of the board of directors of civic and philanthropic organizations, including the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, the Missouri Historical Society and the United Way of Greater St. Louis.



Orthwein's hobbies include horseback riding, hunting and fishing. He rides and hunts frequently and has hunted at a St. Louis club for 55 years, including 35 years as master of foxhounds. In addition, he is a member of the Missouri Horseman's Hall of Fame and has helped raise more than \$1 million for horse show-related charities.

Orthwein has fished off the coast of Bimini, near the Bahamas, for over 50 years and holds three world records for bonefish: a 15-pounder caught on a four-pound tippett; a 12-pounder caught on a two-pound tippett and a 12-pounder caught on a two-pound tippett. All three fish were hooked near Bimini.

# FRANCIS W. MURRAY



# President

Francis W. Murray, as a result of James B. Orthwein acquiring Victor K. Kiam's interest on May 11, 1992, will continue as the minority partner of the New England Patriots.

He has served in that capacity since 1988 and now adds the title of President.

Murray originally acquired an option to buy the Patriots on April 6, 1986 from William H. Sullivan, Jr. and Kiam joined Murray to form KMS Ltd. to complete the purchase on October 28, 1988.

On March 1, 1989, Murray formed the St. Louis NFL Partnership with St. Louis-based Anheuser-Busch wholesaler, Jerry G. Clinton, in an effort to bring an expansion to that city. The co-founders were responsible for creating legislation that formed the basis of a successful \$250 million bond financing completed in August, 1991. A domed stadium in downtown St. Louis, that will also serve as an expansion of the St. Louis Convention Center, is a reality today with design development, land acquisition, and project financing already completed. The new stadium will be state-of-the-art and accomodate 70,000 fans in a configuration uniquely designed for football. Walter J. Payton, the NFL's all-time leading rusher, and Orthwein joined the St. Louis NFL Partnership later and represent as strong and diverse an ownership as any competing for an expansion franchise.

Murray is the sole shareholder of FWM Corporation, the entity which represents his interest in the New England Patriots. He is a 1965 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania's highly-regarded Wharton School. A Philadelphia native, Murray continues to have ties with his alma mater, serving on the University's Presidents Council as well as being an Associate Trustee.

His business career began while a student at Penn, serving as the Comptroller of a small Pennsylvania insurance company. Upon graduation, he took a management position



with the financial consulting firm of Horwath and Horwath. He then joined Certain-Teed Manufacturing Company as an assistant to the Vice President of Finance. These activities formed the basis for his pursuit of an entrepreneurial career.

Prior to his entry into football, Murray was president of a private New York investment firm that specialized in the acquistion of mid-sized companies and was involved in publishing, health care, chain restaurant development, franchising and real estate. He is now involved full-time in professional football and stadium development.

Although he is from Philadelphia, Murray has a solid commitment to the preservation of the Patriots for the New England region. His idea to acquire the franchise was two-fold: to succeed to its ownership and to guarantee its survival in New England.

In addition, James Busch Orthwein is committed to helping New England solve its long-term stadium problems and brings unique background and experience to the Patriots at a time when these attributes are most needed in the long-term interest of the football team and its fans.

Murray is confident his new partner shares the same objectives and combines to give the new stadium prospects the best chance for success.

Away from the business world, Murray breeds thoroughbred horses as an avocation - something he has been doing for 16 years. He is also a member of the Aronimink Golf Club in Newtown Square, Pennslyvania.

Murray and his wife, the former Patricia Anne Quinlan, have two sons. Francis Xavier and Timothy Patrick. Fran. a graduate of Cornell University, is an administrative executive with FWM Corporation. Tim will be a junior at the University of Pennsylvania this fall.

Jim Murray, Francis W. Murray's brother, is the former General Manager of the Philadelphia Eagles (1974-1983), A co-founder of the Ronald McDonald House (in 1972), Jim is president of the Ronald McDonald House International Advisory board. He received the Ray Kroc Award for his contribution to that program.

# SAM JANKOVICH



# Chief Executive Officer

On December 20, 1990, Sam Jankovich was selected as the Chief Executive Officer of the Patriots and the organization embarked on a new path for the 1991 season and

beyond.

"I'm saying to the players, the coaches, everybody in the organization, and our fans that we're going to find out what we're all about in 1992," said Jankovich. "We have a great base from which to build. Now we're going to have to take it to the next step. Everybody here is going to have to be obsessed with winning, and everybody will work with a great deal of professionalism and intensity to take this program to the next level."

The Patriots have realized significant improvements in many areas since Jankovich arrived. The team improved from 1-15 in 1990 to 6-10 last season thanks in large part to a 1991 draft that provided six rookies who made major contributions throughout the course of the season. Included were the AFC Offensive Rookie of the Year Leonard Russell and tackle Pat Harlow, who played every offensive snap of the season.

Jankovich orchestrated a pre-draft trade with the Dallas Cowboys that ultimately provided the Patriots with three new faces in the starting lineup: Russell, Harlow and veteran line-backer Eugene Lockhart.

During his eight years at the University of Miami, the 56-year-old Jankovich was in charge of a program which won seven national championships: football (1983, 1987 and 1989), baseball (1985), men's tennis (singles in 1987), women's golf (1984) and women's tennis (doubles in 1986).

In October of 1990, Jankovich led the way for Miami's entrance into the Big East Conference.

Because of Jankovich's extensive background in collegiate athletics as coach and administrator, NFL Commissioner Paul Tagliabue this past spring named Jankovich chairman of the league's College Relations Committee. In that role, Jankovich has worked as the NFL's liason with college coaches and athletic directors in an attempt to work through the mutual concerns of the colleges and the NFL.

Under Jankovich's leadership, the University of Miami added several new athletic buildings, including the Knight Sports Complex which houses the Hurricane men's and women's basketball programs.

In subsidizing the growth and expansion of facilities and nationally elite programs, Jankovich broke new ground in the challenging area of funding a major college program within a private institution. In cultivating the support of the South Florida community, Jankovich oversaw the development of the Hurricane Club into a financial foundation that increased its annual gift total from \$750,000 in 1982 to more than \$3 million in 1989-90.

Additional revenues were generated through Hurricane



appearances on national television. From 1986-90, Miami football, basketball and baseball teams made 74 network television appearances. During the 1989 and 1990 seasons, the football team played 13 of its 24 games on national television. Jankovich also negotiated radio and television contracts for UM coaches and staff.

His success earned Jankovich a great deal of national respect and recognition. He was President of the NCAA Division I-A Athletic Directors, First Vice-President of the National Association of College Directors of Athletics and was on the Executive Board of the College Football Association (CFA).

Prior to going to Miami, Jankovich served as athletic director at Washington State University. While competing in the PAC-10 Conference, his teams participated in their first bowl game in 50 years (1981 Holiday Bowl), made two NCAA basketball tournament appearances and captured a conference title in track.

Jankovich's coaching experience includes four seasons (1968-71) as Head Assistant Football Coach and Defensive Coordinator at Washington State University, Pullman, Washington. He also served as an assistant football coach for three seasons (1964-66) at Montana State University, Bozeman, Montana.

Jankovich, a native of Butte, Montana, and the former Patty Mullins have three children: Michael, Sue Ellen, and Sam Jr. They also have nine grandchildren.

# FRANCIS J. KILROY



#### **Vice President**

In 1992, Francis J. "Bucko" Kilroy will celebrate his 50th year in the National Football League. During that time, Kilroy has served in almost every conceivable capacity from player, to general manager to his current

position of Vice President for the Patriots.

As one of the club's vice presidents, Kilroy serves as the team's liason with the league office to ensure the team is adhering to league guidelines and player personnel procedures. Kilroy is also a member of the club's team of contract negotiators.

After serving as Patriots general manager from 1979-83, Kilroy was promoted to the position of Vice President on February 16, 1983.

Born in Philadelphia, Kilroy began his NFL career with his hometown Philadelphia Eagles in 1943 and played there for 13 straight seasons. During that time, he once played in 146 consecutive games (league record at the time) and was selected as an all-pro as both offensive guard (1947-49) and middle guard (1952-54). He gained additional honors for his pro grid exploits as he was elected to the NFL's all-decade team for the 1940's and inducted into the Helms Hall of Fame and the Temple Hall of Fame.

He made a gradual entry into the coaching ranks by serving the Eagles for three seasons as a player/coach before assuming the full-time role of line coach for six more NFL campaigns. In addition to coaching, he also served as the club's player personnel director, making him one of the five original talent scouts in the league.

Kilroy was one of the founders — along with Phoenix Cardinals owner William V. Bidwell — of the National Football Scouting combine, now in its 12th year. There are 16 teams that participate in the scouting service.

In 1962, Bucko was named Director of Player Personnel for the Washington Redskins and then moved to the Dallas Cowboys in 1965 to become a "super scout" with that organization. During Bucko's five-year tenure with the Cowboys, the team won five straight divisional championships.

Kilroy was named Player Personnel Director of the Patriots in 1971. He was appointed General Manager on April 6, 1979. In that capacity, he directed the Patriots' day-to-day business operations, was responsible for all contract negotiations and guided the implementation of a state-of-the-art computer system for the Patriots' operation.



# Vice President Player Operations

Joe Mendes, formerly a personnel scout and director of college scouting for the Patriots, was named the club's Director of Player Operations on March 24, 1990. He was promoted to his current position in

February, 1991.

Mendes, who spent three years as a personnel scout (1981-83) and six years (1983-89) as the team's director of college scouting, is responsible for the overall scouting of players, trade negotiations and player signings.

He began working in the National Football League in 1978 when he was hired by Dick Steinberg as a full-time scout for the Los Angeles Rams. In 1980, he followed Steinberg to New Orleans, where he worked one year as a scout for the Saints before coming to New England in 1981.

A native of Ferndale, California and an avid Boston Celtics fan, Mendes entered the field of scouting in 1977 when he worked for Pro Scout, Inc., a scouting service that evaluates propersonnel.

The 40-year-old Mendes (born June 25, 1952) graduated in 1974 from Chico State University and worked for a year on his alma mater's coaching staff. He then spent a season with the Hawaii franchise of the World Football League as a special assistant coach, after which he spent the 1976 season working with the football program at the University of California.

# Vice President Administration

Patrick Forte', who was the Phildelphia Eagles' Assistant to the President and Chief Operating Officer and Chief Contract Negotiator from 1986-90, joined the Patriots organization on January 8, 1991 as

Vice President of Administration.

In his current position, Forte' is responsible for the day-today administrative operation of the front office of the Patriots. Along with CFO James Hausmann and Controller Virginia Widmann, Forte' oversees the finances of the club. Forte' is also a member of the club's negotiating team that is comprised of himself, Bucko Kilroy, Joe Mendes, Tom Bass and Charley Armey.

Forte' is the team's liason with Foxboro Stadium Associates and has worked extensively in the area of facility improvements. He also has served as the Patriots' point man in talks regarding the team's lease with FSA



A native of Flint, Mich., Forte' worked in public relations for General Motors and Honeywell after attending college in Missouri (Lincoln University).

The 42-year-old Forte' (3/17/50) resides in Weston, Mass., with his wife, Christine, and their daughters, Brandi (11) and Jade (9).

# Vice President Player Assistance Pro Personnel

On February 26, 1991, Tom Bass was named the Patriots Vice President of Public Relations/Player Assistance. In January of 1992, Bass moved into the club's player person-

nel department and serves as Vice President for Player Assistance/Pro Personnel.

Until joining the Patriots, the 56-year-old Bass was President of Tom Bass Enterprises afterforming the company in 1985. The company was devoted to working in a variety of projects, each connected with the world of football.

Bass has served NFL Properties as a contributing editor to the Super Bowl program for eight different Super Bowls. In addition, Bass has produced books and articles for NFL Properties, including "Play Football The NFL Way" in 1989. Bass also created and designed a "Nintendo NFL Football Game" in 1988 which came on the market during the 1989 football season.

He has presented a "Tom Bass Football Seminar for Women Only" for the past 13 years and he just recently finished writing a book entitled, <u>A Women's Guide to Professional Football</u>. The book is based upon the hundreds of questions which he has received while conducting clinics.

Bass worked as a consultant on two different occasions in 1986 for the International Sports Marketing Division of Anheuser-Busch in the United Kingdom. He was asked to serve as their Ambassador-At-Large to the teams that then made up the Budweiser American Football League.

# **DICK MacPHERSON**



#### **Head Coach**

New England Patriots Head Coach Dick MacPherson enters his second season as an NFL head coach in1992 after guiding the Patriots to a 6-10 record in 1991.

MacPherson finished fifth in NFL Coach of the Year balloting after helping the Patriots improve from a 1-15 record in 1990.

"I don't think that there is any coach who could have come into this situation, assembled a staff full of people who know what the game is about and coach the team as fundamentally as Mac has," said Patriots Chief Executive Officer Sam Jankovich. "Mac has done a great job of taking all the different components and creating an atmosphere of tremendous attitude and chemistry."

MacPherson, named the 11th head coach in Patriots' history on January 7, 1991, led the Patriots to victories over three 1991 playoff teams -- Buffalo, Houston and the N.Y. Jets. In addition, the club lost three games by seven points or less in a season that saw New England, with a five-game upswing, tie with the Atlanta Falcons as the third-most improved team in the NFL. MacPherson attributed the improvement to a couple of different factors.

"Number one, the talent level in 1990 was not 1-15," said MacPherson. "Number two is Sam Jankovich being hired to bring this whole program around. The attitude of the players towards ownership that things are to be done the right way resulted in them being able to perform to the best of their abilities."

MacPherson turned around a struggling team by using his confidence and enthusiasm and the players responded by surpassing everybody's expectations for the 1991 season.

"Coach Mac is an upbeat person and it carries over," said Patriots wide receiver Irving Fryar. "It was an atmosphere where he came through with everything he promised and we were able to go out week-to-week and concentrate on playing football without the little things we used to worry about."

MacPherson became head coach of the Patriots after compiling a career record of 66-46-4 in 10 years at Syracuse University. MacPherson took over a Syracuse program in 1981 that had been to just one bowl game in 19 years and turned it into a perennial national power. He led the Orangemen to four consecutive bowl appearances (1987-90) and five in his last six years as coach.

MacPherson went to Syracuse from the Cleveland Browns where he was linebackers coach under head coach Sam Rutigliano from 1978-80.

After short stints as an assistant freshman coach at the University of Illinois and as head coach of wrestling and freshman football at the University of Massachusetts,




MacPherson was an assistant at the University of Cincinnati from 1961-65 before moving on to the University of Maryland as defensive backs coach for a season.

MacPherson broke into the NFL ranks in 1967 as line-backers and defensive backs coach with the Denver Broncos under head coach Lou Saban. He later became defensive coordinator with the Broncos and remained there through the 1970 season.

MacPherson left Saban's staff in 1971 to become head coach at the University of Massachusetts. He turned around what had been a struggling program, and in seven seasons with the Minutemen, MacPherson's teams won four Yankee Conference championships and compiled a record of 45-27-1. In addition, he led Massachusetts to victory in the 1972 Boardwalk Bowl.

MacPherson was inducted into the Maine Sports Hall of Fame in 1985 and the Springfield College Hall of Fame on November 5, 1988. In May of 1987, he gave the commencement address at Springfield and received an honorary Doctor of Humanics Degree.



Head Coach Dick MacPherson Led The Patriots To A 6-10 Record In 1991



A native of Old Town, Maine, MacPherson entered Maine Maritime Academy in 1948, but left after two years to join the Air Force. After spending four years in the service, he enrolled at Springfield (Mass.) College and received his B.S. in 1958. MacPherson did his graduate work at the University of Illinois, receiving a Master's degree in 1959.

While at Springfield, MacPherson was a center on the football team and earned three letters. He was a star on the 1956 undefeated squad and was captain of the team as a senior.

MacPherson and his wife, Sandra, have two daughters: Maureen, a graduate of Syracuse University Law School and a litigation attorney in Syracuse for the firm of Hiscock and Barclay, and Janet, a graduate of the College of Human Development at Syracuse. She now works in the University's office of Human Resources. The MacPhersons have one grandson -- Richard MacPherson Astralaga.



# Defensive Coordinator

COACHING: Collier rejoined the Patriots in 1991. He was a defensive backs coach for the Patriots under head coach Lou Saban in 1960-61 before moving on to the Buffalo Bills in 1962. Collier served as head coach of the Bills for three seasons (1966-68) before leaving to join Saban's staff at Denver. Collier stayed with the Broncos for 20 years, until the conclusion of the 1988 season. During his tenure, the Denver defense led the Broncos to three Super Bowls (1977, 1986 and 1987). He was out of football during the 1989 and 1990 seasons. Collier began his coaching career under Saban at Western Illinois University from 1957-59 and then followed him to Boston to coach the Patriots in 1960.

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Collier was an All-Big Ten selection for Northwestern University in 1954 and played in the Senior Bowl and East-West Shrine Game. The Rock Island, Ill. native was selected in the 1955 NFL draft by the New York Giants, but because of his military commitment, entered the Army instead. After his commitment was completed, he joined the coaching ranks at Western Illinois. The 60-year-old Collier was born on June 7, 1932 in Rock Island, Ill. He and his wife, Shirley, have two daughters, Julie (34) and Lisa (32), and one son Joel (28). Collier resides in Foxboro, Mass.

# **DICK COURY**



# Offensive Coordinator

**COACHING:** Coury begins his second season with the Patriots as offensive coordinator. He spent the 1986-90 seasons as quarterbacks coach with the Los Angeles Rams. Coury joined the Rams in 1986 after spending three seasons as a head coach in the United States Football League (USFL), including one season as head coach of the Boston Breakers in 1983. As quarterbacks coach with the Rams, Coury tutored quarterback Jim Everett, who has led the NFL in touchdown passes in two



of the past four seasons. In 1967, Coury became defensive coordinator for USC. During his three years at USC, the Trojans went to the Rose Bowl each year and won the national title in 1967. Coury then was head coach at Cal State-Fullerton in 1970 and 1971. Coury joined the Denver Broncos in 1972. After two years with the Broncos, Coury was named head coach and president in charge of operations for the Portland Storm of the World Football League (WFL). When the WFL folded, Coury became an assistant coach with the San Diego Chargers before becoming wide receivers/quarterbacks coach with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1976 and was part of the Eagles' 1981 trip to the Super Bowl. Coury moved to the USFL in the spring of 1983 as head coach of the Breakers and was named Coach of the Year

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Coury, a native of Athens, Ohio, was on the football squad at Notre Dame in 1950 as a quarterback. Asst. Running Backs Asst. Wide Receivers

**COACHING:** Collier, the son of Patriots defensive coordinator Joe Collier, begins his second season with the Patriots. Collier spent the 1990 season as an offensive assistant under Ray Perkins and Richard Williamson at Tampa Bay. He was a graduate assistant under current Patriots head coach Dick MacPherson at Syracuse University during the 1988 and 1989 seasons. Collier worked with the Orangemen quarterbacks and running backs.

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Collier was a four-year starter at inside linebacker at Northern Colorado from 1984-87. A native of Denver, Co., Collier was a three-time academic All-North Central Conference performer. Collier led the Bears in tackles during his 1985 sophomore season. He received his bachelor's degree in social science education from Northern Colorado in 1987. The 28-year-old Collier was born on December 25, 1963 in Buffalo, N.Y. Collier and his wife, Shirley Ann, reside in Foxboro, Mass.



# **IVAN FEARS**



#### Wide Receivers

COACHING: Fears begins his second season with the Patriots as wide receivers coach. He spent 11 years (1980-90) at Syracuse University as receivers coach, 10 of those years under current Patriots head coach Dick MacPherson. Eight of Syracuse's top 10 single season reception and yardage leaders have been coached by Fears, including Scott Schwedes and current New York Jets wide receiver Rob Moore. Fears began his coaching career at William and Mary College as receivers/tight ends coach in 1977. He then coached William and Mary's quarterbacks from 1978-79, before moving to Syracuse in 1980.

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Fears was a three-year letterman at William and Mary from 1973-75, but saw his career shortened by three knee operations. A native of Suffolk, Va., Fears starred at John Yates High in Suffolk, two times being named Outstanding Player of the Year. He was named to the All-State team after his senior season. The 37-year-old Fears was born on November 15, 1954 in Portsmouth, Va. He and his wife, Beverly, have two sons, Joshua (6) and Aaron (4). The family resides in Franklin, Mass.

# **NORM GERBER**



#### Inside Linebackers

**COACHING:** Gerber begins his second season with the Patriots as inside linebackers coach. He spent 10 seasons (1981-90) under current Patriots head coach Dick MacPherson at Syracuse University as defensive coordinator. Syracuse finished in the top 10 in every major defensive category at least once during his tenure. In addition, Gerber-coached defenses produced 17 players drafted by the NFL, including first-rounders Tim Green and Ted Gregory. Gerber went to Syracuse after spending the 1978-80 seasons as defensive coordinator at Dartmouth College. Gerber began coaching at the high school level (1958-64) before moving to Central Connecticut Univer-



sity as defensive coordinator in 1965. He was Columbia University's defensive coordinator from 1969-73, before serving in the same capacity at Boston College from 1974-77.

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Gerber was a three-year starter at tackle for the University of Connecticut from 1953-56. He earned All-Yankee Conference honors as a junior and senior and was captain of the squad during his final campaign. Gerber, a native of Turners Falls, Mass., was given Connecticut's Outstanding Senior Award in 1956. As a prep tackle at Turner Falls High, Gerber earned Massachusetts All-State honors in 1952. The 56-year-old Gerber was born on August 11, 1935 in Manchester, N.H. He and his wife, Jeanne, have three daughters, Fay (36), Lynn (33), and Mary (25), and three sons Mike (34), Jim (32), and Jonathon (28). Gerber resides in Hopedale, Mass.

#### **BOBBY GRIER**



#### **Running Backs**

**COACHING:** Grier begins his ninth season as running backs coach for the Patriots. He first came to the Patriots in 1981 under then-head coach Ron Erhardt. After one season, Grier moved to Northwestern University in the winter of 1982 to serve under Dennis Green as the offensive coordinator. He returned to the Patriots later that year to become a college scout. He served in that capacity until 1985 when Raymond Berry asked him to again become the Patriots' running backs coach. He has served in that role for six seasons and has remained in that capacity under Dick MacPherson. Grier began his coaching career as an assistant at Kettering (Mich.) High School. Following four years at Kettering, he was Head Coach at Martin Luther King High School in Detroit for four seasons. His 1973 team won the Detroit City title with a 9-1 record. In 1974, Grier joined George Mans' staff at Eastern Michigan as the offensive backfield coach. He was with Mans for two years and with Ed Chlebek for two years at Eastern Michigan. When Chlebek was named Head Coach at Boston College in 1978, Grier became backfield coach in charge of the offensive game plan. He remained at BC until moving to the Patriots in 1981.

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Grier was an outstanding running back at the University of Iowa, where he was a three-year starter and led the Hawkeyes in rushing as a senior. In addition, Grier was named honorable mention All-Big Ten as a junior and senior. The 49-year-old Grier was born on November 10th, 1942 in Detroit. He and his wife, Wendy, have two sons, Chris (22) and Michael (17). The family resides in Holliston, Mass.



#### **ROD HUMENUIK**



#### Offensive Line

COACHING: Humenuik begins his seventh season with the Patriots and coaches the offensive line under head coach Dick MacPherson. Humenuik is in his second stint with the Patriots, working under former Head Coach Raymond Berry from 1985 through 1988 and then rejoining the club in 1990 under Rod Rust. Humenuik began his pro coaching career with the CFL's Toronto Argonauts in 1973, serving as offensive line coach for two seasons before becoming offensive line coach for the Cleveland Browns from 1975 through 1982. He became offensive line and running game coach at Kansas City in 1983 and stayed with the Chiefs until after the 1984 season. From 1985 until 1988, Humenuik was the Patriots' assistant head coach and offensive line coach. In addition, he was the offensive coordinator from 1986-88. He spent the 1989 season as offensive line coach for the New York Jets and Head Coach Joe Walton. Humenuik's first coaching job was at Fullerton (Calif.) Junior College where he served as an assistant during the 1964 and 1965 seasons. He then served five years as an assistant coach under John McKay at Southern California from 1966-70 where the Trojans were National Champions in 1967 and represented the conference in four consecutive Rose Bowls. He was the Head Coach at Cal-State Northridge in 1971-72.

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: The 54-year-old Humenuik (born on June 17th, 1938 in Detroit, Mich.) was a standout offensive guard at Southern California from 1956 through 1958. After his collegiate career, he played three seasons of professional football with the San Diego Chargers and Winnipeg (CFL) under Bud Grant. A native of Los Angeles, Calif., he and his wife, Susie, have three daughters, Kim (31), Kerry (29) and Kelly (27), and one son, Mike (24). Humenuik and his wife live in Foxboro, Mass.

# **STAN JONES**



**Defensive Line** 

**COACHING:** Jones begins his second season with the Patriots as defensive line coach. He has coached in the NFL for the past



25 years with four different teams. Jones worked with the Cleveland Browns as strength and conditioning coach during the 1989 and 1990 seasons. He began his coaching career with the Denver Broncos in 1967 under head coach Lou Saban as defensive line coach. He followed Saban to Buffalo in 1972. In 1976, Jones rejoined the Broncos under head coach Red Miller and remained in Denver through the 1988 season. Jones was among the first strength coaches in the NFL, serving in a dual role with the Broncos until the advent of full-time strength coaches.

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Jones is entering his 39th consecutive year in pro football. He played 13 years in the league (1954-66), 12 with the Chicago Bears and one with the Washington Redskins. Jones was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio on July 27, 1991. A seventime Pro Bowler and an All Pro four times, he played both offensive guard and defensive tackle until 1963, when he played defensive tackle exclusively. Jones was an All-America tackle at the University of Maryland in 1953 and was named the nation's Lineman of the Year. In 1977, the Altoona, Pa. native, was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference's 25-year all-star team. He is a member of Pennsylvania's Sports Hall of Fame. The 60-year-old Jones was born on November 24, 1931 in Altoona, Pa. He and his wife, Darlis, have one daughter, Sherrie (34), and two sons, Kevin (33) and Tony (33). Jones resides in Walpole, Mass.

# **MYREL MOORE**



#### Outside Linebackers

COACHING: Moore begins his second season with the Patriots as outside linebackers coach. He spent the past two seasons out of football after spending seven seasons (1982-88) with the Denver Broncos. He worked as linebackers coach under Patriots defensive coordinator Joe Collier from 1983-88 after spending the 1982 season as offensive line coach. Moore began his coaching career at Santa Ana Junior College in 1959 before moving to the University of California as defensive coordinator in 1963. Moore then became Denver's offensive line and special teams coach in 1972 before taking over linebacker coaching duties in 1973. He was with the Oakland Raiders as linebackers coach from 1978-80 before returning to Denver as a scout in 1981. He returned to coaching with the Broncos in 1982 and remained in that capacity until leaving Denver following the 1988 season.



PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Moore was a tight end and line-backer at the University of California-Davis from 1954-57 and he earned All-Conference honors at linebacker in 1955 and 1956. He played defensive back for the Washington Redskins in 1957 and 1958 before beginning his coaching career. The 58-year-old Moore was born on March 9, 1934 in Sebastopole, Calif. Moore, a native of Calistoga, Calif., and his wife, Sondra, have three daughters, Michael (33), Meagan (15), and Mayce (13), and one son, Michael (30). The family resides in Foxboro, Mass.

He moved to lowa State in 1973, where he was offensive line and defensive backfield coach under Earle Bruce. He spent the 1975 and 1976 seasons at Southern Methodist University before becoming Pacific University's offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 1977. After spending one season (1979) at Northern Arizona, he returned to SMU in 1980 as offensive line coach. He remained there until moving to the Patriots in 1982.

PLAYING AND PERSONAL: Scarnecchia played offensive guard and center at California Western University, now U.S. International, from 1968-70. Scarnecchia began his collegiate career at Taft Junior College in 1966 before transferring to California Western. A native of Los Angeles, Calif., Scarnecchia holds a master's degree in physical education from U.S. International. The 44-year-old Scarnecchia was born on February 15, 1948 in Los Angeles. PRO CAREER: Patriots' second all-time leading receiver with 308 catches for 4,935 yards and 33 TDs ... also club's all-time leading punt returner with 206 for 2,047 yards (9.9 avg.) and three TDs. 1991- Played in 16 games with 15 starts ... had career-highs in receptions (68) and yards (1,014) ... became just the third player in Patriots history to have over 1,000 receiving yards in a season (Stanley Morgan and Harold Jackson were the others) ... moved into 10th place on the Patriots' alltime scoring list with 222 total points ... had three 100-yard receiving games to give him nine for his career ... had career-best nine receptions for a career-high 161 yards and earned Miller Lite Player of the Game honors vs. Minnesota (10/20) ... notched eight receptions for 143 yards and a touchdown (moving into 10th place on the scoring list) vs. N.Y. # HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

#### 1959

- Nov. 16 American Football League's eighth and final franchise is awarded to William H. Sullivan, Jr.
- Nov. 22 Northwestern RB Ron Burton is selected as first draft choice and Syracuse RB Gerhardt Schwedes is made first territorial choice.

#### 1960

- Feb. ρ Lou Saban is appointed first head coach.
- Feb 20 As the result of a public contest, the team nickname of Patriots is chosen. The Patriots also announce that the team colors will be red, white and blue
- April 1 Boston University Field is named as the Patriots' first home.
- April Patriots become first pro team in history to issue public stock.
- April 19 Uniformed Patriot centering football (creative work of Boston-Worcester cartoonist Phil Bissell) is adopted as team logo.
- Team opens first training camp at UMass, 350 players attend. July
- In the AFL's first ever preseason game, Patriots defeat Buffalo 28-7 at July 30 War Memorial Stadium. Patriots DE Bob Dee recovered fumble for the league's first TD.
- Aug. 14 Patriots play their first home game ever at Harvard Stadium, a 24-14 loss to the Dallas Texans before 11,000 fans.
- Sept. 9 In their first regular season game, the Patriots open with a 13-10 loss to Denver at B.U. Field before a crowd of 21,597
- Sept. 16 DB Chuck Shonta recovered a fumble on the final play of the game and ran for a TD to give the Patriots their first win ever by a 28-24 margin over the N.Y. Titans at the Polo Grounds in New York.

#### 1963

- Oct. 11 Dec. 28 Patriots play their first game in Fenway Park and beat Oakland 20-14.
- With a 26-8 victory over Buffalo, the Patriots win the AFL's Eastern Division title in the league's only playoff game ever held.

#### 1964

Jan. Lost AFL title game, 51-10, to the Chargers at San Diego.

#### 1970

April 4 Foxboro selected as new site of Patriots' home.

#### 1971

- Mar. 22 Team is renamed New England Patriots.
- Aug. 15 Sullivan Stadium, at the time known as Schaefer Stadium, is dedicated with Patriots first game there. Gino Cappelletti kicked a 36-yard FG for the first points scored in the stadium as the Patriots topped the NY Giants, 20-14, before 60,423 fans.

#### 1972

Feb. 17 Made financial history by paying first cash dividend of 15 cents per share

# 1973

Jan. 26 Chuck Fairbanks is named head coach and general manager.

#### 1975

Nov. 7 President William H. Sullivan, Jr. became the first majority owner in club history when he purchased additional voting stock to give him 88 per cent of the franchise's voting stock.

#### 1976

- July 10 Patriots open their training camp for the first time at Bryant College in Smithfield, RI after spending the summers of 1969-75 at UMass/ Amherst.
- Dec. 8 Non-voting stockholders approve offer of \$15 per share made by Billy Sullivan to purchase all non-voting stock.
- Dec 18 Lost AFC wild card playoff game to the eventual Super Bowl Champion Oakland Raiders, 24-21, in the final ten seconds of play.

#### 1977

Aug. 20 Work completed on installation of new surface (Super Turf) in Sullivan

#### 1978

- Sept. 3 Mrs. William H. (Mary M.) Sullivan, Jr. elected to the Patriots Board of Directors.
- Dec. 10 Patriots clinch their first outright divisional championship in the club's history with a last minute 26-24 victory over Buffalo at Foxboro.
- Dec 31 Patriots lose 31-14 to Houston in first playoff game ever played in Foxboro.

#### 1979

- April 2 Patriots announce that Head Coach and General Manager Chuck Fairbanks has been released from his contract to assume duties as Head Football Coach at the University of Colorado.
- April 6 Francis "Bucko" Kilroy named as the new general manager and former Patriots' offensive coordinator Ron "Fargo" Erhardt named as head coach.
- July 13 Patriots' Vice President Charles W. "Chuck" Sullivan is promoted to Executive Vice President of the club.
- Sept. 3 Former Patriots' wide receiver Darryl Stingley is named Executive Director of Player Personnel.
- Oct. 23 Jeanne Sullivan McKeigue is elected as member of the club's Board of Directors.
- Dec. 16 Patriots close out 1979 regular season with 27-23 victory over Minnesota. Harold Jackson (1,013) and Stanley Morgan (1,002) become first Patriot players ever to transcend 1,000-yard season receiving mark.

#### 1980

- Feb. 25 Paul Sonnabend resigns as Executive Director of the NFL Management Council and is appointed as Vice President and a member of the Board of Directors of the Patriots.
- April 8 William H. "Billy" Sullivan, Jr., President of the Patriots, is re-elected as Chairman of the Board of NFL Properties.

#### 1981

Nov. 29 FB Sam Cunningham, with 35 yards on nine carries against St. Louis at Foxboro, surpasses Jim Nance (5,323 yards on 1,323 carries) as the Patriots' all-time career rushing leader.

#### 1982

Jan. 15 Ron Meyer, Head Coach at SMU from 1976-81, is named the eighth Head Coach in club history.1983

#### 1983

- Jan. 8 In their first playoff appearance since 1978, the Patriots lose to the eventual AFC Champion Miami Dolphins at the Orange Bowl, 28-13.
- Feb. 16 General Manager Bucko Kilroy is promoted to the position of Vice President and Patrick Sullivan, Assistant General Manager for four years, is named General Manager.
- May 17 William F. Finucane and Jeannette Allen Keefe are elected to the Patriots' Board of Directors.
- May 23 Schaefer Stadium is renamed Sullivan Stadium in honor of the founder and driving force behind the Patriots franchise, William H. "Billy" Sullivan. Jr.
- June 29 Sullivan Stadium is officially re-dedicated and the Boston Pops performs a concert in the stadium that is open free-of-charge to the public.

#### 1984

- June 1 The Patriots organize a Fan Advisory Board, a group of season ticket holders who will help advise the Patriots on how to make Sullivan Stadium a more exciting and more pleasant place to bring a family to watch an NFL game.
- June 5 In the first-ever NFL Supplemental Draft, the Patriots selected slotback Ricky Sanders of the Houston Gamblers, running back Eric Jordan of the Oakland Invaders and quarterback Walter Lewis of the Memphis Showboats.
- Aug. 10 Work on a new turf, SuperTurf, is completed on the field. It is the second time that surface has been used at Sullivan Stadium. The original SuperTurf was installed in 1977.
- Oct. 25 Hall of Fame pass receiver Raymond Berry is named the head coach of



the Patriots, replacing Ron Meyer. Berry, a former Patriots assistant coach, becomes the team's ninth head coach.

#### 1985

- July 26 Patrick J. Sullivan, William H. Sullivan III and Mrs. Nancie Chamberlain are elected to the Patriots' Board of Directors.
- Oct. 13 Raymond Clayborn establishes a new team record for consecutive starts by starting his 111 straight game. Ray Hamilton had the old mark of 110, done from September 16, 1973to October26, 1980. (Clayborn's streak started on September 3, 1978. He ended the season with 121). Clayborn celebrated the record-setting day by scoring his first pro interception touchdown (27 yards).
- Dec. 28 The Patriots defeated the New York Jets, 26-14, at Giants Stadium (East Rutherford, N.J.) in the AFC Wildcard game. With the victory the Patriots win their first NFL playoff game (The Patriots had an 0-3 NFL playoff record prior to the game).

#### 1986

- Jan. 12 The Patriots beat the Miami Dolphins, 31-14, thus winning the AFC Championship. In doing so, the Patriots ended an 18-game losing streak at the Orange Bowl. It was also only the second time the Patriots won at the Orange Bowl (1966 was the other time).
- Jan. 26 The Patriots play in Super Bowl XX, going against the Chicago Bears in the Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans. The Bears win the game, 4610. The game, shown on NBC-TV, was the third-rated Super Bowl with a 48.3 rating and a 70 share (one rating point represents 859,000 TV households; a share is the percentage of sets in use). Only the 1982 and 1983 Super Bowls had higher ratings. It was the most widely-watched TV show ever—with 127 million viewers (topping the previous high of 121,600,000 who watched the final MASH show of February 28, 1983). The previous high Super Bowl in terms of viewers was Super Bowl XIX between the 49ers and the Dolphins (115,880,000). Also, 300 million people in China watched the game on tape delay.
- Jan. 27 Defensive end Julius Adams retires after 15 years (all with the Patriots). Adams, the team's number two draft choice in 1971 out of Texas Southern, was the oldest active defensive lineman in the league at age 37 when he retired. He started the final 12 games of the regular season, and all four post-season games in 1985. He has the club record for games played with 196 (John Hannah follows with 196).
- June 30 John Hannah, who was selected to the Pro Bowl a team record nine times (next nearest on team, six), announces his retirement from the game. Second in the team's record book for games-played with 183 (Julius Adams has lead with 196), the standout offensive guard had been selected to the All-NFL 25-year team (from 1960-84).
- June 12 Coach Raymond Berry, who led the Patriots to the AFC Championship and Super Bowl XX in his first full season as the team's head coach, signs new five-year contract.
- Sept. 7 1985 AFC Championship banner raised at Sullivan Stadium in pregame ceremony (prior to opening game vs. Indianapolis Colts). The banner is 10 feet wide and 15 feet long. Mr. William H. Sullivan, Jr. is joined by the governors from each of the New England states.
- Sept. 21 QB Tony Eason throws for team record 414 yards (400 previous record, done by Vito "Babe Parilli in 1964). The Patriots lost to Seattle, 38-31, in the game played in Foxboro. Eason was 26 of 45 with three TDs and no interceptions.
- Dec. 7 WR Stanley Morgan establishes a new team record for catches in one season with his 67th catch of the season (had five catches in the day). Morgan, who finished the season with 84 catches, broke Derrick Ramsey's previous mark of 66 catches, done in 1984.
- Dec. 31 NEP Partners purchase a three-year option to buy the Patriots.

#### 1987

- Sept. 13 Patriots become first NFL team to have its games on a French-speaking radio network on a regular basis. CKLM—a 50,000-watt station out of Laval, Quebec, Canada—was the flagship station (others were CJSA in Ste. Agatle, Que.; CKSL in St. Jovite, Que., and CJER in St. Jerome, Que.). Pierre Donais was the announcer.
- Sept. 13 Patriots begin four-year, five-million dollar contract with WHDH-Boston.
- Nov. 29 Cornerback Raymond Clayborn ends his streak of having played in 161 straight contests—and started in 147 consecutive games—when he couldn't play vs. Philadelphia at Sullivan Stadium due to knee injury



suffered week before vs. Indianapolis Colts on November 22nd. Clayborn, who went on IR on November 24th (spent rest of season on list), broke Gino Cappelletti's record of 152 consecutive games-played and Ray Hamilton's 110 consecutive starts.

#### 1988

- July 11 The Patriots retire the number 57 worn by 14-year linebacker Steve Nelson, who retired following the 1987 season. Nelson played in three Pro Bowls and led the team in tackles eight years.
- July 28 Victor K. Kiam II, the owner and chief executive officer (CEO) of Remington Products, Inc. of Bridgeport, Ct., agrees to purchase the team from William H. Sullivan, Jr.
- Oct. 28 Victor K. Kiam II becomes majority owner of the Patriots. He will be chairman of the team. Francis W. Murray, the minority owner, is the vice chairman. William H. Sullivan, Jr., the founder and previous owner, remains as the team's president. The Kiam, Murray and Sullivan team is known as KMS Limited.
- Dec. 4 Veteran wide receiver Stanley Morgan catches his 500th career pass, on a 19-yarder (26 seconds remaining in the first quarter) vs. Seattle.

#### 1989

Jan. 6 Running back John Stephens named the Old Spice/NFL Rookie of the Year.

#### 1990

- Feb. 27 Rod Rust is named the head coach of the Patriots, replacing Raymond Berry (who was relieved of his duties on Feb. 26). Rust, a former Patriots' defensive coordinator, becomes the team's tenth head coach.
- Mar. 14 Former Patriots offensive guard John Hannah and cornerback Mike Haynes are selected to the National Football League's All-1980's team, while current linebacker Andre Tippett named to second-team.
- Dec. 20 Sam Jankovich, the University of Miami's Athletic Director from 1982-90, is named the Chief Executive Officer of the Patriots.

#### 1991

- Jan. 7 Dick MacPherson is named head coach of the Patriots, replacing Rod Rust (who was relieved of his duties on Jan. 4). MacPherson, Syracuse University's head coach for the past 10 seasons, becomes the team's eleventh head coach.
- May 3 The installation of a natural grass playing surface at Foxboro Stadium is completed.
- July 27 Former Patriots offensive guard John Hannah is inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

#### 1992

- May 11 James B. Orthwein purchases the controlling interest of the Patriots from Victor K. Kiam. Orthwein becomes Chairman of the Board of the club while Francis W. Murray, the club's minority owner, becomes President. Sam Jankovich remains the Chief Executive Officer.
- May 21 Patriots begin two-year deal with WLVI-TV (Channel 56) that gives the station the right to televise the team's preseason games as well as a weekly in-seaon Patriots magazine show.



## **BRYANT COLLEGE**



Bryant College Smithfield, Rhode Island

Since 1976, the Patriots have conducted their summer training camp at Bryant College in Smithfield, Rhode Island. Situated on a beautiful 320-acre campus located 12 miles northwest of Providence, Bryant offers a bachelor of science degree in business administration at the undergraduate level, as well as graduate programs in business administration and taxation. Bryant's enrollment includes 3,000 full-time day students and 2,500 part-time students. More than 2,500 students reside on campus.

Bryant has a 129-year-old tradition of excellence in business education. The college relocated from a Providence campus in 1971. Since that time, the campus has expanded to accomodate a national and international body of students. The focal point of the campus is the award-winning Unistructure. It houses faculty and administrative offices and classrooms, a swimming pool, bank, U.S. Post Office, dining facilities and the Patriots' summer offices.

In 1981, a newly-completed Multipurpose Activities Center(MAC) was opened adjacent to the original physical education building. These structures provide the Patriots with expansive areas for their locker rooms, athletic training staff, equipment storage and the team's strength and conditioning center.

A new student union, the nationally recognized Bryant Center(pictured above), opened in November of 1986. A triangular, three-level structure, houses a variety of dining areas, several convenience stores, the campus bookstore, recreation rooms and student organization offices.


In 1987, the college opened a free-standing computer lab, the Koffler Technology Center.

Roger Begin, the Rhode Island Lieutenant Governor, is a 1976 Bryant College graduate. Also, pro golfer Jim Hallet is a 1983 graduate and Steve Crowley, the money editor for ABC-TV's Good Morning America, is a 1970 graduate.

Since moving their summer training site to Bryant, the Patriots have amassed a 125-109 regular season record (53.4%), indicative of the fine preseason training facilities offered at the Smithfield campus.
