Programs funded by the New York Jets Foundation look to positively influence the lives of young men and women in the tri-state area by supporting youth football, preventing bullying, and promoting fitness, particularly in disadvantaged communities.

From launching football teams at urban high schools to urging students to be active for at least 60 minutes every day to fostering positive school environments, the New York Jets invest in programs that make a difference in the lives of others. In addition to our focus on youth development, the Jets support the efforts of the Lupus Research Alliance, numerous established charitable organizations and causes sponsored by the NFL.

STAY HOME STAY STRONG

The New York Jets are proud to support COVID-19 relief efforts throughout New York and New Jersey, focusing on food insecurity, first responders and economic relief. During this difficult time, \$3 million was donated across seven organizations: United Way of New York City's COVID-19 Community Fund, the United Way of Northern New Jersey's ALICE Recovery Fund and the United Way of Long Island's United Together: A Response Fund for COVID-19, Food Bank of New York City, the EMS FDNY Help Fund, the Community Food Bank of NJ, and the New Jersey Pandemic Relief Fund.

"On behalf of my family and the Jets, we would like to extend our support to these organizations who battle daily against an unprecedented challenge," said Jets CEO Christopher Johnson. "No region in the country has been affected by COVID-19 more than ours and because of that, our resolve has only grown. These organizations continue to nourish the vulnerable and target the needs of those on our front lines. At no time has being a good teammate ever mattered more."

JETS PLAY FOOTBALL

The New York Jets are committed to growing the game of football, removing barriers of access and improving safety through a comprehensive outreach program designed to provide opportunities for underserved communities to play football.



FLAG FOOTBALL

The Jets fund and create thousands of flag football opportunities for children ages 5-18 to enjoy America's favorite sport. Players benefit by being physically active through non-contact, continuous action while learning the fundamentals of football, lessons in teamwork and sportsmanship.

In 2019, the New York Jets presented a combined donation of \$60,000 to New York City Police Athletic League (PAL) and New York City Parks and Recreation (Parks and Rec.) to operate an NFL FLAG Football program powered by USA Football. Through funding provided by the Jets Foundation, over 3,000 New York City youth have the opportunity to play flag football at no cost. All participants are given a free Jets NFL FLAG jersey and top teams from each program competed in a tournament hosted at the Jets practice facility.

Each year the Jets provide \$50,000 to support the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) Girls Varsity Flag Football League. The league created in 2011 by the PSAL and Jets has grown from 19 teams to now almost 60 schools participating. In 2019, the Jets hosted four flag teams from the PSAL at a minicamp practice. Following the practice, a ceremonial check presentation was held, and the teams scrimmaged on the Jets practice field.



Since 2007, the Jets have provided annual funding for the expansion of CHAMPS Middle School Flag Football League to more than 3,700 students at 111 programs throughout the New York City public school system. The CHAMPS Middle School Sports and Fitness League is an initiative of the New York City Department of Education that promotes student physical activity during the critical years of middle school. The name CHAMPS derives from the initials of the five characteristics that describe our participants: Cooperative, Healthy, Active, Motivated and Positive Students. PUBLIC SCHOOLS ATHLETIC LEAGUE

In 2001, the New York Jets formed a community partnership with the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) to provide support to New York City public school football programs. Through an annual matching grant from the NFL's Youth Football Fund, the New York Jets now donate \$100,000 to the PSAL's football programs. The funding offsets the cost of reconditioning every student-athletes' helmet and has helped to create 15 new and developmental football teams. Beyond these grants, the Jets support the PSAL in a variety of other ways including honoring the PSAL football champions at a home game during the NFL season.



SNY PLAY BALL: FOOTBALL WEEK

The New York Jets have teamed up with our television partner, SNY, to offer support for youth football leagues in our community through SNY Play Ball: Football Week. SNY Play Ball offers leagues the opportunity to receive new footballs, tickets to a Jets preseason game, attend an exclusive youth football clinic and volunteer with league projects in our local community. In addition, one eligible organization will receive a \$5,000 grant to be put towards new equipment for the upcoming season. The program will culminate in "Play Ball Week," where SNY will honor and highlight individuals and selected organizations daily on the television network and website. HIGH SCHOOL COACH of the WEEK

For 10 weeks during the football season, the Jets and Gatorade present the High School Coach of the Week award to a coach in the tri-state area. This coach serves the best interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to achieve, and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to his community, his school and his student-athletes. Gatorade and the Jets award each winner with a \$2,000 check for their high school's football program. In addition to the weekly award, a Coach of the Year is selected at the end of the high school season and awarded \$4,000. All winners receive a Gatorade cooler cart from the Jets and Gatorade and are honored on-field during a Jets regular season home game.

NEW YORK JETS 11-ON TOURNAMENT

Annually, the Jets host a 46-team high school 11-ON football tournament presented by Nike. The event occurs at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center over three days in June and is comprised of both a traditional 7on7 tournament, as well as a linemen challenge. The tournament is free of charge to all schools and participants receive a complimentary pair of Jets branded shorts and 11-ON shirts, courtesy of the Jets and Nike. The 7on7 and linemen challenge champions are invited to Jets home game and honored on-field prior to kickoff. Information for the 11-ON Tournament is made available in early spring. PLAY 60

The New York Jets have taken a stance in the fight against childhood obesity through fitness and nutrition programs under the Jets PLAY 60 platform, which encourages children to get 60 minutes of activity every day.

PLAY 60 EAT RIGHT, MOVE MORE

Launched in 2006, the New Jersey Department of Agriculture's Jets PLAY 60 Eat Right, Move More Program in partnership with the American Dairy Association Northeast (ADANE) encourages New Jersey school children to take advantage of healthy foods in their school cafeterias and become more active through grant incentives and Jets player visits.



The campaign encourages schools to challenge their students to get 60 minutes of physical activity every day and invites schools to submit their most creative cafeteria meal menus to determine which New Jersey schools each year go above and beyond state and federal guidelines. Annually, the Jets and ADANE provide \$30,000 to schools, which can be used for cafeteria infrastructure improvements and physical education equipment. One grand champion school receives a \$20,000 grant as well as a visit from a Jets player or Legend. Two division champion schools each receive a \$5,000 grant.

PLAY 60 FLAG FOOTBALL PROGRAM

The Jets PLAY 60 Flag Football Program encompasses 6th Grade students from six Morris County Schools where the Jets provided flag belts, jerseys and footballs to operate a flag football unit. All six participating schools, Chatham Middle School, Harding Middle School, LC Johnson Middle School, Madison Jr. School, Ridgedale Middle School and St. Vincent The Martyr School encouraged students to participate in at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day while learning the game of football. As a culmination, each school will compete in a tournament at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center.

FUEL UP TO PLAY 60 HOMETOWN GRANTS

Through the Fuel Up to PLAY 60 program, the New York Jets and American Dairy Association Northeast are offering two \$5,000 Hometown Grants to eligible schools in Nassau County and Suffolk County that best showcase how their students stay active for 60 minutes per day, as well as provide increased access to school breakfast and ensure their students are fueled to learn. Grants will be awarded to one school in each county to help facilitate sustainable physical activity and eating improvements. Schools not already enrolled in the Fuel Up to PLAY 60 program can enroll at WWW.FUELUPTOPLAY60.COM and email **Kristina Moher** at KMOHER@MILK4U.ORG for the online grant application. Fuel Up to Play 60 is an in-school nutrition and physical activity program launched by National Dairy Council and National Football League, with additional support from the US Department of Agriculture. The program encourages youth to consume nutrient-rich foods and achieve at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day. Proper nutrition and consistent physical activity are both necessities for maintaining a healthy child.

JETS TACKLE BULLYING

The Jets Tackle Bullying program presented by Bethpage Federal Credit Union is a collaboration with STOMP Out Bullying™ to tackle all forms of bullying by raising awareness, providing tools for educators and

preventing bullying for kids and teens. The Jets and Bethpage have made available a team branded STOMP Out Bullying Educator's Prevention Toolkit at no cost to schools in the tri-state area. This toolkit enables educators to create meaningful dialogue, educate students through proven Social Emotional Learning methods, adopt character building in schools and involve both students and faculty in working together to change school climate. In addition, the Jets have funded a digital training tool reaching every school throughout the New York City Department of Education.

Schools that sign up for the toolkit or complete the digital training course are invited to our annual Educator's Symposium designed to provide teachers and administrators resources to improve the culture at their schools. Schools that attend the symposium are then given additional opportunities to engage with the Jets through our Upstander of the Week and School Recognition programs.

The Upstander of the Week Program highlights one student per week during the season across our social media platforms and on the video boards during home games. "When you see someone being bullied and/or cyberbullied and you help them, you stop being a bystander and become an Upstander!" Our School Recognition Program focuses on schools who demonstrate and can articulate how their school combats bullying. Selected schools receive a fun filled assembly featuring a Jets player. MARTY LYONS COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

Named after 2013 Ring of Honor inductee, Marty Lyons, the Marty Lyons Award is presented each year to a New York Jets player that gives from the heart through charity and community involvement (as voted by Jets staff). Lyons played the entirety of his 12-year NFL career with the New York Jets as a member of the feared "Sack Exchange." In 1984, Lyons was named the National Football League's Man of the Year and in 1990 the New York Jets renamed their Outstanding Community Service Award because of Lyons' commitment to the community.

ATLANTIC HEALTH JETS TRAINING CENTER



The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, located at One Jets Drive in Florham Park, New Jersey has been the headquarters of the Jets since its official ribbon cutting on September 2, 2008. Designed by Skidmore Owings + Merrill, the 224,000 square-foot complex sits on nearly 100 acres of open space and provides players, coaches and staff with a best-in-class facility to learn, practice and work within 30 minutes of both MetLife Stadium and Newark Liberty International Airport.

UNDER THE SAME ROOF

Prior to the opening of the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the team's operations were split between two locations. Located on the campus of Hofstra University, Weeb Ewbank Hall housed the players, coaches and football support staff, while the business operations were located in New York City.

In the creation of the new facility, Chairman & CEO Woody Johnson looked to unite all elements of the franchise under one roof. In the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the organization now has a building that seamlessly combines the operations of both the football and business departments. Equipped with open-concept workstations and state-of-the-art technology to create an efficient and friendly work environment, the training center was a major contributing factor in the team being named one of Inc. Magazine's Top Small Company Workplaces in 2010. An outdoor terrace, which overlooks the practice fields, provides a business entertainment area for both the team and its corporate partners.



FOOTBALL FACILITIES

Featuring state-of-the-art training and medical facilities that combine the latest advances in rehabilitation pools, high-performance equipment and nutrition, the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center also has five full-size football fields: three natural grass, two Sportex synthetic turf field, one outdoors, and another indoors in the Field House, each with a permanent scoreboard. Additionally, the goalposts on two of the natural grass fields can be repositioned 90 degrees to help minimize some of the wear throughout the season. With a first floor that is all football, the facility houses a 5,500-square-foot locker room, an 11,000-square-foot weight room and a 10,000-square-foot cafeteria.

As a "graduate school for football" - an element that was important in the design of the building - the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center has more than 25,000 square feet of space dedicated to classrooms and instruction space, including 10 classrooms. The classroom also provides direct access to both the indoor and outdoor practice field, allowing for seamless transition between classroom and practice.

Since opening in 2010, MetLife Stadium has hosted nearly 500 major events and over 2,200 special events. In 2017, the Stadium was honored as the "Venue of the Year" at the StadiumBusiness Awards in Dublin.

MetLife Stadium bleeds green on Jets game days. Fans have many options for entertainment and tailgating before the game. They can catch the ESPN New York - 98.7FM pregame radio show broadcast live from the west plaza, head to the Kids Zone for family-fun activities and enjoy a vast array of food and beverages on the Stadium's multiple concourses. Fans can also find the latest gear at the team's 10,000 square-foot flagship plaza store. The intimate seating bowl, uncompromised sight lines, cutting-edge video boards, LED signage and state-of-the-art sound system all enhance the game-watching experience.

Naming-rights partner MetLife and the cornerstone partners – Bud Light, Dell Technologies | SAP, Pepsi and Verizon – are also integrated into the game experience with ample space to engage and entertain fans.

MetLife Stadium has 5 clubs – EY Coaches Club, Commissioner's Club, MetLife 50 Club, Toyota Club and United Rentals Club – which offer access to VIP reserved parking, a private club entrance, as well as a host of other amenities and benefits.

Last season, Johnson oversaw the hiring of Head Coach Adam Gase and General Manager Joe Douglas as well as the appointment of Hymie Elhai as team president. With the three in place, Johnson established a foundation based on his vision of a winning culture throughout the franchise, showing his commitment to building a durable, successful and united organization.

Before a 6-2 finish to the 2019 season, the unity of the team throughout their tough start resonated with Johnson. "The thing that's so encouraging is that there has never been a moment when somebody casts blame on somebody else," Johnson said in November of 2019. "I think that speaks very highly of the character of this team."

Since Week 10 of 2019, Gase has overseen on-field improvements on both sides of the ball as the Jets improved in almost every major offensive and defensive category. Douglas, hired in June of 2019, added 10 new players prior to the start of last season and has begun to overhaul a roster that currently has over 55 new players from the one he inherited.

Throughout his tenure as chairman & CEO, Johnson has developed a strong bond with his players, working closely with them to advance programs and initiatives important to them. Following the death of George Floyd, Johnson joined the team's virtual team meeting, addressing the group and discussing how they all – Johnson, coaches, executives and players – could use their powerful platform to impact positive change. A message that resonated with players like C.J. Mosley.

"That meant a lot to me and I'm sure to everybody else for him to talk to us," said Mosley of Johnson addressing the team. "He pretty much let us know that anything we needed, he was there to help. He gave out his personal information and he said any guy who wants to call, get together to work something out, he would help."

In a statement, Johnson's Jets expressed, "We will not waste this opportunity to create programs and partnerships of which we, along with the community, can look back on years from now and be proud."

In December of 2018, Johnson donated to five non-profit social justice organizations that aim to combat social inequality and reduce barriers to opportunity. Additionally, he matched donations by Jets players and coaches for charities focused on education, community/police relations, criminal justice reform, as well as other initiatives, including reducing poverty, racial equality and workforce development.

In 2017, Johnson regularly met with the team's leadership council to discuss social justice matters and serve as a resource. Moreover, he accompanied players to the Bronx public defender's office to learn about challenges facing the criminal justice system. In February 2018, he joined the players in sending a letter to New York Governor Andrew Cuomo advocating for bail reform.

As part of the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Johnson, his family, and the Jets donated \$3 million to support those in need in the New York and New Jersey areas. In March of 2020, they pledged \$1 million to support the United Way of New York City's COVID-19 Community Fund, the United Way of Northern New Jersey's ALICE Recovery Fund and the United Way of Long Island's United Together: A Response Fund for COVID-19. A month later, they donated \$2 million to organizations focused primarily on food insecurity, first responders and regional relief.

“No region in the country has been affected by COVID-19 more than ours and because of that, our resolve has only grown,” Johnson said of the donations. “We would like to extend our support to these organizations who battle daily against an unprecedented challenge. At no time has being a good teammate ever mattered more.”


In April of 2019, the organization unveiled three new uniforms, along with a refreshed logo, the first changes to both in over 20 years. “Our goal was to create a modern and innovative look for the future of our franchise,” said Johnson. “We believe these uniforms will appeal to fans of all ages and the design is one that both fans and players would be extremely proud to wear. I am extremely excited to usher in the next generation of the New York Jets.” In addition to the uniforms and logo, the team also added noticeable changes to the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center to reflect the re-brand and modified fan elements at MetLife Stadium for the 2019 season.

While engaged in all aspects of the organization, Johnson places an emphasis on the team’s year-round commitment to the community, primarily through the New York Jets Foundation. The Foundation funds programs that look to

positively influence the lives of young men and women in the tri-state area through the promotion of fitness, youth football support and the prevention of bullying, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the charities supported by the Foundation is the club’s trail-blazing anti-bullying program, Jets Tackle Bullying. The program aims to tackle all forms of bullying by raising awareness, providing tools for educators and preventing bullying for kids and teens.

A dedicated proponent of autism research and awareness, Johnson works closely with the Johnson Center for Child Health & Development. The center, named for his mother, the late Betty Wold Johnson, aims to advance the understanding of childhood development through clinical care, research and education, as well as raise awareness on Autism Spectrum Disorder and identify medical research to unlock better treatments for children and young adults affected by this condition.

Johnson is also active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, as well as encouraging public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies.

made. Following the Draft, Head Coach Adam Gase and his coaching staff were able to connect with the player and conduct their entire offseason program virtually.



JOE DOUGLAS begins his second season as general manager of the New York Jets after being named to the position in June of 2019. Now in his 21st season working in the league, Douglas continues to build a roster that includes over 55 new players from the one he inherited.

“A general manager must be more than just a talent evaluator. He must be able to build and sustain a winning culture,” Chairman & CEO Christopher Johnson said after announcing Douglas’ hire. “That includes a commitment to collaboration and earning the trust of his colleagues.”

After engaging with the entire organization, Douglas set expectations for his personnel staff, but has also joined with President Hymie Elhai and Head Coach Adam Gase to build the foundation Johnson envisioned in hiring the three.

“You better know what you’re looking for and know what you’re looking at.”

That was advice Douglas recalled from his mentor Ozzie Newsome and he knew what he was looking for from the beginning, making his priorities known the day he was hired.

“This is a game of wills and we are going to try to build a team that can impose their will on other teams and to do that you have to be strong up front,” Douglas said when introduced as the team’s GM, a point he echoed at the end of the 2019 season. “The line of scrimmage is always going to be a priority here and so it’s definitely going to be something that we’re going to look to improve every year.”

Since becoming GM, Douglas has added over 14 offensive linemen, including free agents George Fant, Connor McGovern and Greg Van Roten, as well as Alex Lewis, a trade acquisition during 2019 training camp and 2020 draft picks Mekhi Becton (first round) and Cameron Clark (fourth round).

The offensive line overhaul was just an element of his first free agency for the Jets. Douglas took a strategic and disciplined approach to filling the team’s holes, adding to the depth with players that could not only come in and contribute immediately, but would also fit the team’s culture. In addition to the offensive linemen acquired, he brought a

pair of veterans with a combined 27 years of NFL experience, reaching into his past with Super Bowl XLVII MVP Joe Flacco, while also adding the NFL’s third all-time leading rusher, Frank Gore.

Douglas also signed cornerback Pierre Desir, linebacker Patrick Onwuasor and wide receiver Breshad Perriman, while retaining key contributors on every level of the defense: linebacker Jordan Jenkins, cornerback Brian Poole and team captain and leader, defensive lineman Steve McLendon, who was extended during the 2019 season.

“It was important for us to bring in those quality players that have the right level of toughness, intelligence, versatility,” Douglas said in his recap of the team’s free agency decisions. “And then, bring them in on fair market deals.”

Despite the added wrinkle that his first draft as general manager was also the NFL’s first ever virtual draft as a result of COVID-19 global pandemic, Douglas showed no signs of being a rookie, while drafting from his home. He turned his seven draft picks in 2020, Leonard Williams’ expiring contract and a sixth-round pick the team previously acquired into 13 players, including 12 currently on the 2020 roster.

As a result of Douglas’ movement in the draft, nine draft picks joined the Jets in 2020 – Becton, wide receiver Denzel Mims, safety Ashtyn Davis, defensive lineman Jabari Zuniga, running back La’Mical Perine, quarterback James Morgan, Clark, cornerback Bryce Hall and punter Braden Mann. Of the nine, five were team captains in college, yet another illustration of Douglas’ commitment to character and culture.

Additionally, Douglas added four veteran players with his draft capital, including Lewis, cornerback Nate Hairston and wide receiver Demaryius Thomas during 2019 and defensive back Quincy Wilson during the draft.

While Douglas’ first season with the Jets did not end with the desired result, the roster showed resiliency as several players took on unexpected roles for a team that saw just two players start 16 games. The 2019 Jets were forced to use 73 players, including 15 different offensive starting lineups and 14 different defensive starting lineup combinations. Despite the injuries, Douglas buoyed a roster that finished 6-2 over the final eight weeks by acquiring players, in every available avenue possible, throughout the year.

JOE DOUGLAS



In adding three 10+ game starters after June, Douglas was true to his word that the search for players never stops. He added tight end Ryan Griffin as a free agent signing the day before training camp, Lewis in a 2019 training camp trade and Thomas in a Week Two trade with New England, the first such trade between the two franchises in over 25 years.

Lewis, who was re-signed in the 2020 offseason, went on to start 12 games in his first season with the Jets, as part of an offensive line that allowed the 10th fewest sacks in the league over the last eight games. Griffin, who earned a contract extension during the 2019 season, stabilized the tight end position after expected starter Chris Herndon was limited to just one game. Griffin caught five touchdown passes, tied for third in the conference and one of just eight tight ends in franchise history with at least five TD catches. Thomas became the team's third receiver, catching 36 passes for 433 yards while also providing valuable veteran leadership.

Douglas also brought in a number of other key contributors for the 2019 Jets, claiming wide receiver/punt returner Braxton Berrios – who saw action in all 16 games and ranked second in the league in punt return average – following roster reductions. He added Vyncint Smith from the Texans practice squad as the second-year wide receiver would make contributions receiving, running and returning in 13 games as a Jets. Safety Matthias Farley, a free agent signing prior to the start of the season, was a key contributor on special teams, while Hairston, a trade prior to the first game, started six games at cornerback.

Perhaps Douglas' biggest move during his first season with the Jets was the trade of Leonard Williams. Moved to the Giants at the trade deadline, the Jets received a third-round pick in the 2020 NFL Draft and ultimately a fifth-round choice in 2021.

Throughout his time in the league, Douglas has put in the work and paid his dues, working as both a pro and college scout in Baltimore, Chicago and Philadelphia, and helping shape three different Super Bowl championship rosters. Before joining the Jets, he spent the previous three seasons as the vice president of player personnel with the Eagles. In Philadelphia, he was a key component in acquiring many of the players that helped win Super Bowl LII, including the game's MVP, quarterback Nick Foles.

Using every avenue to help improve the team, Douglas was part of a front office that acquired the players who scored all but two of the team's postseason touchdowns, including four of the five scores in the Super Bowl. A trio of 2017 unrestricted free agent signings – LeGarrette Blount, Foles and Alshon Jeffery – as well as a pair of street free agents – Patrick Robinson and Torrey Smith – all contributed scores on the team's title run. The Eagles' leading receiver in the Super Bowl, running back Corey Clement, was signed as an undrafted free agent, while the team's leading rusher in the game, running back Jay Ajayi, joined the club as a midseason trade.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Douglas spent a season as the director of college scouting for Chicago (2015), first working with Gase, the then offensive coordinator for the Bears.

Entering the NFL as a player personnel assistant (2000) the year Baltimore won Super Bowl XXXV, Douglas ascended within the Ravens organization, holding various posts in the organization's scouting department, serving as a national scout (2012-15), Southeast area scout (2009-11), East Coast area scout (2008) and Northeast area scout (2003-07), helping add a number of prominent players via the draft, including the Super Bowl XLVII MVP, Flacco, as well as a number of Pro Bowl players – Ben Grubbs, C.J. Mosley, Justin Tucker and Marshal Yanda.

An All-Atlantic 10 selection, Douglas started 45 consecutive games at tackle for the University of Richmond. Following his collegiate playing career, he transitioned into a volunteer assistant coach role with the Spiders in 1999.

As an offensive and defensive lineman at Lee-Davis (VA) HS, Douglas was recognized as a two-time all-state honoree.

He and his wife, Shannon, have two daughters, Addison and Leighton, and a son, Thomas.

REX HOGAN

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER



Rex Hogan, now in his fourth season with the New York Jets, begins his second year as the team's assistant general manager after rejoining the organization last season, previously serving as the team's senior director, college scouting (2015-2017 drafts).

In his current role, Hogan assists General Manager Joe Douglas, with the day-to-day operations of the Jets Player Personnel Department. In addition, he will oversee the College and Pro Scouting departments while working directly on personnel decisions and evaluations. Under Douglas and Hogan, the roster has acquired over 55 new players from the one they inherited in June of 2019, including several that were catalysts for the team's 6-2 record over the final eight games of last season. The pair entered the 2020 NFL Draft with eight selections, and despite working virtually for the first time in the Draft's history, executed a series of trades to finish with 10 players, including nine draft picks and veteran cornerback Quincy Wilson, a 2017 second-round pick.

Prior to returning to the Jets, Hogan spent two seasons (2017-18) as the vice president of player personnel with Indianapolis, helping to construct a roster that saw the team return to the postseason in 2018. During his time with the Colts, the front office drafted a pair of rookie All-Pro selections in Quenton Nelson and Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year Darius Leonard. Additionally, he was a part of key veteran acquisitions, including the claims of cornerbacks Kenny Moore and

Pierre Desir as well as the signings of Denico Autry and tight end Eric Ebron, who made his first Pro Bowl appearance (2018).

Hogan previously worked with the Chicago Bears for 12 years, the last three seasons as a national scout, and was part of a team that reached Super Bowl XLI and the 2010 NFC Championship. In Chicago, he assisted in the draft selections of Matt Forte, Kyle Fuller, Devin Hester, Alshon Jeffery, Kyle Long and Greg Olsen.

Prior to entering the NFL, he spent one year working as the director of football operations at the University of Utah under former head coach Urban Meyer. He also worked with the University of Notre Dame's athletic department and football program (1998-2003) in various roles, including as a football intern, business intern and in football recruiting/operations. During his time at Notre Dame, the school produced several standouts and NFL Draft selections, including center Jeff Faine, tight end Anthony Fasano, running back Ryan Grant, tackle Ryan Harris, quarterback Brady Quinn, center John Sullivan, defensive end Justin Tuck and San Francisco Giants pitcher Jeff Samardzija.

Hogan received a degree in public relations from Austin Peay in 1995, where he was a four-year member of the football team. The Clarksville, TN native and his wife, Christy, have three children, McKenna, Ryan and Erin.



CHAD ALEXANDER

DIRECTOR PLAYER PERSONNEL



Chad Alexander is in his second season with the Jets as director, player personnel. Alexander works closely with both General Manager Joe Douglas and Assistant General Manager Rex Hogan in a collaborative effort to oversee the Player Personnel department.

Before joining the Jets, Alexander was a Ravens executive for 20 seasons, the last nine of which he served as the assistant director of pro personnel. He also worked as an area scout, pro personnel staff scout and a pro personnel assistant with Baltimore, after initially joining the organization in 1999.

Before entering the NFL, Alexander spent a year working with elementary students with behavior disorders at 'Power Of Relationships' in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

A four-year fullback at Wake Forest for four years, Alexander received a degree in communications.

Alexander and his wife, Liz, have three daughters, Morgan, Chloe, and Charlotte, and a son, Nicholas. His father, the late Hubbard 'Axe' Alexander, was a former wide receivers coach who won two National Championships as a coach at the University of Miami and three Super Bowls as a coach with the Dallas Cowboys.





PHIL SAVAGE

SENIOR FOOTBALL ADVISOR



Phil Savage is in his second season with the Jets as the team's senior football advisor. In his role, he evaluates college prospects and pro players, while providing valuable insight on the player personnel department's overall philosophy, grading system and annual approach to building the club's roster and practice squad.

Joining the team in June 2019, Savage brings over 20 years of NFL front office experience, including four seasons as senior vice president and general manager with the Cleveland Browns (2005-08). Prior to joining the Jets, he worked as the Reese's Senior Bowl executive director (2012-18) and served as the general manager of the Arizona Hotshots in the Alliance of American Football (2018-19).

Savage entered the league as a defensive assistant coach with the Browns (1991), before transitioning to scouting in 1994. He has held several positions with Cleveland (1991-95, 2005-08), Baltimore (1996-04) and Philadelphia (2010-12). During his nine seasons in Baltimore, the Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV and drafted ten Pro Bowl players, including Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees, Jonathan Ogden, Ray Lewis and Ed Reed. His tenure with the Browns was highlighted by a 10-win season in 2007 and the selection of perennial Pro Bowl offensive tackle Joe Thomas.

Prior to the NFL, Savage worked at the University of Alabama as a graduate assistant (1987) and the tight ends coach (1988-89) before transitioning to a similar role at UCLA (1990).

From 2009-17, he was the color commentator for the Crimson Tide Sports Network, when the Alabama Football program won five National Championships (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017). He was also a front office insider for ESPN (2013-17) and provided analysis for SiriusXM on their NFL and college conference channels (2013-19). In 2017, St. Martin's Press published Savage's first book, 4th and Goal Every Day, Alabama's Relentless Pursuit of Perfection.

Savage received a degree in English from the University of the South in Sewanee, TN. He played both football and baseball and was a three-time all-conference shortstop in baseball. He went on to receive a master's degree in physical education from the University of Alabama in 1989.

Savage and his wife, Dorothy, have a daughter, Honor, and a son, Ever.



DAVID SOCIE

SENIOR DIRECTOR FOOTBALL ADMINISTRATION



David Socie is in his fourth year with the Jets after returning to the organization in 2018 as the senior director, football administration. His primary responsibilities include working closely with General Manager Joe Douglas and Jets staff in matters regarding player contracts, the team's salary cap, the NFL Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) and NFL Rules. He previously served in this role with the Jets during the 2006 season.

Before rejoining the Jets, Socie worked at the National Football League office for over seven years. In that time, he served as Director of Labor Operations and Senior Director of Labor Operations in the NFL Management Council. His responsibilities included advising club executives on player contracts, the salary cap, player-related areas of the CBA, and NFL Rules. He also oversaw the approval process of all player contracts, monitored Clubs' compliance with the salary cap and participated in the CBA negotiation process.

Socie was an associate in the law firm of Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer, and Feld, LLP, in Washington, D.C., from 1997-2006. He provided extensive legal representation of the NFL Management Council and NFL Clubs on matters involving player contracts, the CBA, and NFL Rules, including numerous arbitration proceedings.

Socie began his NFL career as a scouting intern with the Buffalo Bills in 1991-92. After working as a sports producer at WIVB-TV in Buffalo, NY in 1992-94, he continued his NFL career as a law clerk with the NFL Management Council in 1996-97.

Born in Buffalo, NY, Socie is a graduate of University at Buffalo and St. John's University School of Law. He is a member of the New York State Bar.





JON CARR

DIRECTOR COLLEGE SCOUTING



Jon Carr is in his third season as the director, college scouting with the Jets after 11 seasons with the Texans, the last three as their director of college scouting. Prior to that he served as national and college scout with Houston.

In his current role, Carr manages the college scouting department and assigns responsibilities to the team's national and college scouts. He works directly with General Manager Joe Douglas on evaluating college prospects around the country and organizing the college free agency process. He also organizes and helps manage the personnel meetings leading up to the NFL Draft.

Prior to joining an NFL front office with the Texans, Carr worked as the wide receivers coach at the University of Toledo (2005-06) and as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Eastern Illinois (2003-04). He began his college coaching career at Tennessee State, first as an assistant coach (1997-99) and later as the offensive coordinator (2000-02).

During the summer of 2002, Carr was a member of the Oakland Raiders staff as part of the NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship and has participated in the 2006 NCAA Expert Coach's Academy in Miami, the NFL Stanford Program for Managers at the Stanford Graduate School of Business in 2012 and the 2018 NFL Career Development Symposium. He has also worked with the National Football League Properties as the program coordinator for Chicago and Detroit summer youth inner-city football camps.

Carr played quarterback at Southeast Missouri State from 1987-89 before transferring to Purdue, where he earned a degree in law and society in 1991.

Carr has one son, Corbyn, and two daughters, Kennedy and Kayla.



GREG NEJMEH

DIRECTOR PRO PERSONNEL



Greg Nejmeh is now in his 12th year with the Jets and his second as the pro personnel director. He has previously served as coordinator, pro scouting (2018), pro scout (2014-17) and a pro personnel assistant (2011-13) after initially joining the organization as a scouting intern in 2009.

In his current role, Nejmeh is responsible for the day-to-day operation of the pro personnel department, the oversight of the free agency process and all pro player evaluations, including potential signings from the CFL and other pro leagues.

In-season, Nejmeh manages all potential free agent signings, monitoring daily league transactions and NFL practice squads for potential signings or workouts. He also oversees free agency evaluations and cross-checks by both himself and his staff for the upcoming league year.

Working closely with the coaching staff, Nejmeh and the pro personnel staff scout upcoming opponents, preparing and presenting the weekly advance report.

Nejmeh also assists the football administration department on transaction negotiations as well as leads the communication from pro personnel to all other necessary departments in the organization.

A graduate of The College of New Jersey where he studied political science, Nejmeh played quarterback at TCNJ prior to becoming a student quarterback coach during his junior and senior year. He was inducted into Midland Park High School's Hall of Fame in 2016 after a three-year career playing quarterback that saw him set every school passing record.

Nejmeh and his wife, Melissa, currently reside in Bedminster, NJ, with their daughter, Kenzie, and son, Mack.





BRIAN SHIELDS

DIRECTOR FOOTBALL ANALYTICS



Brian Shields is now in his sixth year with the New York Jets and third heading the team's analytics, having been promoted this season to Director, Football Analytics. In his role, Shields oversees football research and data analysis for the club's player evaluation, roster management, in-game decision-making, and resource allocation strategies. He also has traditional pro and college scouting responsibilities. Prior to transitioning into analytics after the 2018 draft, he worked as a college Area Scout for three seasons, covering the West region.

Before joining the Jets, Shields spent a total of six seasons working in several roles for the St. Louis Rams, most recently as an Area Scout (2013-15), covering the West. He also cross-checked safeties as part of the team's yearly draft preparations.

Dan Zbojovsky is in his 14th year with the Jets and his second as the director, personnel operations. In his new role, he is responsible for implementing the protocols of the pro and college scouting departments. He works to develop scouting tools and manage player information used to facilitate the scouting process, including the scouting combine, free agency and the NFL Draft. Additionally, he evaluates players both in the NFL and at colleges throughout the country.

Originally joining the Jets in 2007 as a seasonal intern in the video department, Zbojovsky joined the scouting department as an intern in pro personnel the following year, before being hired as a player personnel assistant (2008), working in both the pro and college scouting departments and assisting the football administration department and

coaching staff. In his previous role, he was the coordinator, college scouting (2009-18), where he managed the day-to-day operations that led up to the NFL Draft and served in various scouting capacities for both the college and pro personnel departments.

Born in Trenton, NJ, Zbojovsky graduated Magna Cum Laude with a bachelor's degree in health and exercise science from The College of New Jersey (2007), where he spent three years as a video coordinator and one season as a student-assistant coach for the football team.

ZACH TRUTY

PLAYER PERSONNEL EXECUTIVE



Zach Truty enters his sixth season with the Jets and fourth as a player personnel executive, after initially serving as a national scout. Prior to joining the Jets, he spent three seasons with the Chicago Bears as an area scout (2012-14). Before that, he was the recruiting coordinator for Eastern Michigan's football program.

Truty began his career in professional football as an intern for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2006) before interning with the Detroit Lions (2008-09) and later serving as the director of player personnel for the Arizona Rattlers (AFL) (2011). As a student at the University of Michigan, he interned in both the recruiting and sports information departments, earning his BA in 2008.



KEVIN MURPHY

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR PRO PERSONNEL



Kevin Murphy is in his third season with the Jets and his second year as the assistant director, pro personnel after joining the organization as a pro scout (2018). Before the Jets, he worked in NFL pro departments with Buffalo and Houston for 10 seasons.

In his current role with the Jets, Murphy assists in the day-to-day operations of the pro personnel department, conducting assigned player evaluations for free agency throughout the season, while monitoring league transactions and NFL practice squads for potential signings or workouts. He also takes a key role in the advance scouting of future opponents for the coaching staff.

Prior to his time with the Jets, Murphy joined the Bills as a pro scout for two seasons (2015-16) before spending the previous eight years (2006-13) working with the Texans. During his

Evan Ardoin is in his fourth year with the New York Jets and his second as a pro scout, switching to pro personnel after initially joining the team as a college area scout.

In his current role, Ardoin evaluates players in free agency, cross-checking pending free agents for the upcoming league year. Additionally, he monitors league transactions and evaluates street free agents, practice squad players from other teams, and current developmental league players for signings or workouts. He also scouts upcoming opponents and prepares advance reports for the coaching staff.

Prior to joining the Jets, Ardoin spent his first 11 seasons in the league with St. Louis/Los Angeles (2007-17). With the Rams, he was responsible for evaluating college players in the Midwest region. His area included schools in Missouri, Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and Michigan.

RAY AGNEW

SCOUTING ASSISTANT



Ray Agnew III, now in his fourth season with the Jets, enters his second year as a scouting assistant, after initially starting as a seasonal assistant in the player personnel department. In his role, he assists in the day-to-day logistics of the pro personnel department, monitoring league transactions, evaluating players during final cuts and free agency, while also assisting in the weekly advance report for the coaching staff.

Before the Jets, Agnew worked at the Elite Football Academy in St. Louis, helping prepare and train high school football players for potential college football careers.

After entering the NFL as an undrafted free agent fullback, Agnew saw action in 12 games (nine starts) with Cleveland (2014), before spending time with Dallas in the offseason and the Washington practice squad the following year. He played 36 games for

Southern Illinois (2009-13), graduating with a degree in business management.

A native of St. Louis, MO, Agnew and his fiancé now reside in New Jersey. The son of Kathy and Ray, his father was an 11-year veteran with New England, the Giants and St. Louis and currently serves as the director of pro personnel for the Rams, while he has two brothers also in football, Malcolm, who serves as the running backs coach at North Dakota and, Keenan, a defensive tackle at Southern Illinois.





DOM GREEN

NATIONAL SCOUT



Dom Green is in his sixth year with the New York Jets, and third as a national scout after joining the organization in 2015. Prior to the Jets, he spent the previous six years with the Kansas City Chiefs (2009-14).

With Kansas City, Green was promoted to assistant director of college scouting after three years as the Eastern regional scout and one year as the Southeast area scout. He spent three seasons with Tampa Bay (2006-08) as the Southeast area scout before joining the Chiefs. He earned his first NFL job as a strength intern for the Miami Dolphins in 1996.

Green coached for seven years at Southwest Mississippi Community College (1999-2005), the last five as the head coach (2001-05). Prior to that, he had two stints with Middle Tennessee State as an assistant coach (1995, 1997-98) and was a graduate assistant at the University of Mississippi (1992-94).


Before the Jets, Mandolesi spent two years as an intern for the New England video department, during which time the Patriots won Super Bowl XXXVIII.

Johnathon Stigall, now in his seventh year with the New York Jets as an area scout, enters his 22nd season as a scout in the NFL.



ADAM GASE begins his second season as the head coach of the New York Jets after posting a 6-2 record over the final eight games, tied for the third most wins in the league over that span. Overall, he led the team to a 7-9 record, a three-win improvement from 2018.

Under Gase, starting quarterbacks have registered a 100+ passer rating 41 times, a number that would tie him for 10th among all NFL franchises since 2013. Additionally, six different quarterbacks (Sam Darnold, Peyton Manning, Jay Cutler, Ryan Tannehill, Matt Moore and Brock Osweiler) have produced a 100+ passer rating performance.

Beginning with his first season in Denver (2009), Gase has coached 17 different players to the Pro Bowl – a list includes 12 offensive players, with multiple players at offensive line, wide receiver and running back.

In his first season as the Jets head coach, Gase led a roster that used the third-most players in the league as a result of injury. Despite the consistent roster change, he oversaw improvements in almost every major category – offensively and defensively – over the season’s final eight weeks. In that span (Weeks Nine-17), the offense increased their third-down efficiency by a league-best 15%, allowing just 15 sacks (ninth best), a 22-sack improvement from the first eight weeks. Additionally, the Jets committed just eight turnovers in the last eight games, the 10th fewest in the league.

One of his main charges, quarterback Sam Darnold, improved in every category, as the second-year pro posted highs in completion percentage, yards per attempt, touchdown percentage, while decreasing his interception percentage and recording the league’s 10th best passer rating in compiling a 6-2 record to close the second half.

On opening drives, the Jets offense was one of the most proficient in the league, as Gase’s script helped the team score 40 points in 2019, tied for ninth in the league, with all 40 points

coming over the season’s final 10 weeks. On opening drives, Darnold finished top five in the league in completion percentage, yards per game, touchdowns, sacks taken and passer rating, while wide receiver Jamison Crowder tied for the league lead in receptions on opening drives.

Prior to his appointment as Jets head coach, Gase brought 16 seasons of experience as a coach in the NFL, the last six calling plays for three different franchises, including record-setting offensive output as the offensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos (2013), his first season calling plays in the NFL. In his last position, Gase spent three seasons (2016-18) as the head coach for the Miami Dolphins, where he compiled a 23-25 record and led the franchise to a postseason berth in his first season.

In his first season under Gase’s leadership (2016), quarterback Ryan Tannehill completed 67.1% of his passes for a 7.7 yards per attempt average and a 93.5 passer rating, all then career highs, while also leading the league with a red zone passer rating of 119.7 as the Dolphins broke an eight-year playoff drought.

Before his time in South Florida, Gase spent a season as the offensive coordinator with the Chicago Bears (2015), improving the team’s rushing yardage ranking from No. 27 the season before to No. 11. Under his tutelage, quarterback Jay Cutler finished the season with the highest passer rating (92.3) of his career, threw seven fewer interceptions than the previous season, and posted a single-season-best 2.3 percent interception rate.

Prior to Chicago, Gase served on the Broncos staff in a variety of roles, including offensive coordinator (2013-14), quarterbacks coach (2011-12) and wide receivers coach (2009-10) as Denver won four AFC West titles, three playoff games and an AFC Championship.



ADAM GASE

In two seasons as the offensive coordinator, Gase oversaw a record-setting offense that produced over 430 yards per game, including 315.8 yards per game passing and 34 points per game, all the best in the league over that span. In 2013, they set NFL single-season records for most points scored (606) and most passing yards (5,444), while five different players (three wide receivers, a tight end and a running back) all scored 10+ touchdowns.

Additionally, Manning established single-season NFL records in passing yards (5,477) and passing touchdowns (55), earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors for his efforts. In three seasons under Gase (2012-14), Manning posted a 131-to-35 touchdown to interception ratio, completing 67.7% of his passes for a passer rating of 107.8.

In his first season as the team's quarterbacks coach (2011), Gase oversaw quarterbacks Kyle Orton and Tim Tebow, as the latter helped guide the team to a division title and a postseason berth. Under Gase, Tebow ran for 660 yards and six touchdowns, at the time, the ninth-highest rushing total by a quarterback since the merger.

He initially served on Denver's staff as the team's wide receivers coach (2009-10). In those years, he coached a pair of Pro Bowlers, first wide receiver Brandon Marshall (2009), who produced 101 receptions for 1,120 yards and 10 touchdowns, and then wide receiver Brandon Lloyd (2010), who led the league with 1,448 yards on 77 receptions (18.8 average).

Before joining the Broncos staff, Gase spent one season with San Francisco as an offensive assistant under Offensive Coordinator Mike Martz, assisting an offense that saw running back Frank Gore produce over 1,000 yards rushing.


Gase entered the NFL ranks with the Detroit Lions in 2003, serving as scouting/coaching assistant for three seasons under Steve Mariucci before becoming an offensive quality control coach in 2006 and the quarterback's coach in 2007 under Rod Marinelli. In his season as quarterbacks coach, Jon Kitna posted 4,068 passing yards, the second-highest total of his 14-year career, finishing sixth in the league in passing yards.

Gase began his coaching career as a defensive graduate assistant at LSU in 2000. He spent the following two seasons on the recruiting staff for Head Coach Nick Saban, winning a Southeastern Conference championship in 2001 and helping recruit a group of players that won the BCS National Championship in 2003.

Gase attended Michigan State University from 1996-99 earning a bachelor's degree. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a daughter, McKenzie, and two sons, A.J. and Wyatt.

FRANK BUSH, now in his second season with the New York Jets, returns as the team's assistant head coach defense/linebackers. For Bush, this season marks his 29th season coaching in the NFL, continuing a career that began as a player in 1985.

In his first season with the Jets, Bush's group saw just two games combined from presumptive starters C.J. Mosley and Avery Williamson due to injuries. As a result, the unit saw five different starters in 2019, receiving the biggest contributions from James Burgess and Neville Hewitt.

Under Bush, Burgess, an offseason waiver claim, started the final 10 games of the season after initially starting the year on the practice squad, and finished second on the team in total tackles (90) according to coaching stats and was one of just five players to register 80+ tackles, five+ passes defended and five+ tackles for loss. Hewitt, in his second season with the Jets, started all 12 games that he played and finished third on the team with 78 tackles and as one of just seven players with two+ interceptions and two+ sacks last season after posting career highs in both.

Prior to joining the Jets, Bush served two seasons with the Dolphins, as the team's assistant head coach/linebackers coach. During the 2018 season, linebacker Kiko Alonso (125) finished tied for 10th in the league in total tackles after finishing 13th a season earlier (according to radar360). Another of his charges, linebacker Raekwon McMillan, in his first season on the field after missing his rookie season due to injury, also posted a 100-tackle season. Alonso and McMillan became one of just seven linebacker combos last season to each register 100+ tackles.

Bush spent four seasons as the Rams linebackers coach (2013-16), where he helped Alec Ogletree finish ninth among all NFL linebackers in total tackles (408) in just 52 games played in that span, while James Laurinaitis (335) finished 20th in just 48 games (2013-15). Ogletree's 11

forced fumbles were tied for the fourth most among all linebackers in that span, while his five interceptions ranked tied for eighth and his 33 passes defended were tied for second-most (all stats according to radar360). Additionally, Bush helped Mark Barron, selected seventh overall in 2012 as a safety, switch to linebacker in the middle of the 2015 season. That season, Barron finished with 117 tackles, second on the team.

Returning to the Oilers/Titans organization in 2011, Bush spent two seasons in Tennessee (2011-12) and helping two rookies, 2012 second-round pick Akeem Ayers and 2011 fourth-round selection Colin McCarthy, earn starting roles.

Bush spent four seasons with the Texans (2007-10), the first two as a senior defensive assistant, working primarily with the defensive line, before serving as the team's defensive coordinator (2009-10). During his time in Houston, he saw the emergence of defensive end Mario Williams and linebackers DeMeco Ryans and Brian Cushing as Pro Bowl players, with Cushing earning Defensive Rookie of the Year honors in 2009.

Before joining the Texans, Bush spent three seasons (2004-06) with Arizona as the linebackers coach, adding the assistant head coach title in 2006. While he was with the Cardinals, Karlos Dansby, a second-round rookie in 2004, produced three-year totals of 222 tackles, 17.0 sacks, five forced fumbles and four interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns. In that span, he was one of only four players to produce at least 200 tackles, 15.0 sacks, five forced fumbles and four interceptions and the only one to score multiple touchdowns.



FRANK BUSH

In his time with Denver (1995-2003), Bush earned two Super Bowl rings (XXXII and XXXIII), serving several different roles, including special teams coach (2001-03), secondary/nickel coach (2000) and linebackers coach (1995-99).

A three-year starter at North Carolina State, he was selected in the fifth round by the Oilers in the 1985 NFL Draft. A starter at linebacker as a rookie, Bush earned All-Rookie honors before an injury in his second season and subsequent diagnosis of a narrow spinal canal forced an early end to his playing career.

Following his on-field career with Houston, he joined the team as a college scout for five seasons (1987-91) before transitioning to the coaching staff, initially as the team's linebackers coach (1992) and then as the defensive quality control/linebackers coach (1993-94).

Born in Athens, GA, Bush is married to wife, Stephanie.

SHAWN JEFFERSON returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's assistant head coach/wide receivers. 2020 marks Jefferson's 16th season as a coach in the league, following a 13-year playing career.

In his first season with the Jets, Jefferson oversaw a group led by Robby Anderson and Jamison Crowder, as the duo was one of just seven league-wide to each post 50+ receptions, 700+ yards and five+ touchdowns. Anderson averaged 15.0 yards per catch, one of just 20 receivers in the league to do so, while Crowder posted a new single season best in reception (78), leading the team with six touchdown receptions. Additionally, Vyncint Smith, added by the Jets from the HST practice squad in-season, became one of just nine wide receivers in the league with at least three receptions of 20+ yards and at least 117 runs of 10+ yards.

Prior to joining the Jets, Jefferson's three seasons in Miami saw Dolphins wide receivers average 4.9 yards after catch, the fifth-best average in the league, and account for 52 touchdowns, tied for sixth most. Additionally, Miami wide receivers accounted for 70.8% of the team's receptions, the second-highest percentage in the league during that span.

In two seasons with Jefferson, wide receiver Jarvis Landry made two Pro Bowl appearances, pulling in 206 total receptions, the third-most of any player in the league, while wide receiver Kenny Stills posted 21 touchdowns in his three seasons under Jefferson, the ninth-most in the league.

Jefferson spent three seasons (2013-15) with the Titans as wide receiver Kendall Wright finished seventh in the league with 94 receptions in posting his first 1,000-yard season in just his second season (2013). Wide receivers Nate Washington (2013-14) and Justin Hunter (2013-14) each averaged at least 16.0 yards per catch during Jefferson's time in Tennessee.

Prior to Tennessee, Jefferson spent eight seasons on the Lions staff, beginning as a coaching assistant in 2005 and moving up to wide receivers coach where he served from 2008-12. During his time in Detroit, he helped wide receiver Calvin Johnson set an NFL single-season record with 1,964 yards receiving (2012). Johnson was selected for the Pro Bowl three times and led the NFL in receiving yardage twice, finishing with season averages of 88 receptions for 1,416 yards (16.1 average) and 10 touchdowns in five years with Jefferson as his position coach.

Jefferson began his coaching career shortly after a 13-season playing career during which the former Charger (1991-95), Patriot (1996-99), Falcon (2000-02) and Lion (2003) wide receiver caught 470 passes for 7,024 yards and 29 touchdowns after entering the league as a ninth-round selection in 1991.

Before entering the league, the Jacksonville, FL native played receiver for three years at Central Florida. He and his wife, Marla, have two daughters, Paige and Faith, and a son, Van, a former standout receiver at the University of Florida who was selected in the second round of the 2020 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Rams.

BRANT BOYER returns for his fifth season as the special teams coordinator of the New York Jets. In his four seasons guiding the Jets special teams, Boyer has transformed a unit considered by multiple metrics as one of the bottom third in the league to a top five unit in each of the last two seasons, according to FootballOutsiders.com, which compiles the numbers in five key elements of special teams.

Change has been a constant for Boyer, as the Jets have had a different primary player at kick returner, punt returner and kicker, as well as a different leading special teams tackler in each of his four seasons as coordinator. Despite the change, his unit has committed just 61 penalties, tied for the fourth fewest of any team in the league, while also posting top 10 rankings in total touchdowns (five), blocked punts (two), forced fumbles (three), kickoff return average (22.9) and kickoff return average against (21.3). His group is also one of just two in the league with an interception.

Last season, Boyer's group finished fourth in the league in special teams DVOA according to FootballOutsiders.com, their second consecutive season in the top five, despite new primary players at kicker (Sam Ficken), punt returner (Braxton Berrios) and kick returner (Ty Montgomery &

Vyncint Smith). Overall, the group ranked in the top five in coverage touchdowns (two), punt return average (11.4), kickoff return average against (19.3) and fumble recoveries (two).

Ficken, who kicked in three games over two seasons prior to 2019, posted career highs in every category, as he increased his field goal percentage from the previous season. Ficken also connected on a 44-yard game-winning kick, one of three game-winning/tying kicks in the last two minutes of the fourth quarter in Boyer's tenure – one of just three teams to connect on 100% of their three+ attempts. Berrios, a second-year player who missed his entire rookie season with injury before being claimed prior to the start of the regular season, finished second in the league in punt return average (11.4). The Jets, who averaged a league-low 6.8 yards per punt return from 2013-17 have now finished first and second in the league the last two seasons, as Boyer narrowly missed becoming the first coach to have two different returns lead the league in punt returns in consecutive seasons since the merger.

Boyer's special teams unit also saw a new leading tackler, as second-year undrafted free agent Frankie Luvu became the club's fourth different top tackler under him. Lachlan Edwards improved his net punting average for the fourth-consecutive season under Boyer, while the fourth-year punter again set a franchise record (41.6) and now holds the top three seasons in net punting average in franchise history. Additionally, in his four years under Boyer, Edwards had placed 108 punts inside the 20-yard line, the seventh most in the league during that span

In 2018, in addition to their number one ranking from both FootballOutsiders.com and Rick Gosselin, Boyer's group finished in the top five league-wide in kickoff return average (third; 26.9), punt return average (first; 13.0) and field goal percentage (fourth; 91.7%). The unit also blocked three kicks — a punt, a field goal and an extra point — one of just three teams with at least three blocked kicks and one of just two with a block of all three.

Among the many superlatives by the Jets special teams unit in 2018 were kicker Jason Myers earning a Pro Bowl selection after tying Nick Folk's field goal percentage franchise record, connecting on 33-of-36 field goals (91.7%) and finishing with the second-most made field goals and tying for the second-most points for a single season in franchise history. Additionally, Myers made all five of his attempts of 55+ yards last season, the most in a single year in NFL history, and now accounts for five of the 11 made field goals from 55+ yards in Jets history. Myers also became one of just eight players in league history with a seven-field-goal game after connecting on all seven attempts for 24 total points (second-most kicking points in a game in league history) vs. Indianapolis (10/14/18).

Wide receiver/return specialist Andre Roberts, who was named a first-team All Pro and selected to his first Pro Bowl in nine NFL seasons, led the league in punt return average (14.1) and finished second in kickoff return average (29.4) last season, one of just 12 qualifying players to finish in the top three in both in the same season since 1970. Additionally, Roberts registered 10

returns (three punt, seven kickoff) of 40+ yards in 2018, two of which accounted for touchdowns — a 78-yard punt return at Detroit (09/10/18) and a 99-yard kickoff return vs. Green Bay (12/23/18). For Roberts, the 10 returns of 40+ yards make him one of just five players to accomplish the feat since 2000.

Punter Lachlan Edwards, in his third season under Boyer, posted another franchise record in net punting average (40.8) last season. Long snapper Thomas Hennessy, an undrafted free agent acquired in 2017 just before the regular season, has snapped in every game for the Jets since joining the team, posting 16 tackles (11 in 2018) and a forced fumble on coverage while not allowing a blocked field goal, extra point or punt in his career. Running back Trenton Cannon, the 2018 sixth-round draft pick who was in competition with Roberts for the primary return job during preseason, remained a key special teams contributor, leading the team with 16 special teams tackles and finishing with the most special teams tackles in franchise history by a running back (since 2000; according to radar360).

In 2017, Boyer oversaw the first career year from Edwards, as the punter increased every statistic from his rookie season. Edwards, who established franchise records with 46.6 gross and 40.5 net punt averages, ranked third in the league with 33 punts inside the 20-yard line, the second most in Jets history. Additionally, kicker Chandler Catanzaro, a 2017 acquisition by the Jets, improved on his field goal percentage from 75% in 2016 to 83.3%, as well as connecting on 100% of his extra point attempts, the first time he had done so since his rookie season. Catanzaro also connected on a 57-yard field goal, the longest in team history, and set a franchise record with a 66.2% touchback rate.

Among Boyer's coverage units, the Jets allowed just 20.0 yards per kickoff return in 2017, the eighth lowest average in the league. Safety Rontez Miles led the NFL with 15 solo special teams tackles (according to radar360).

In his first season (2016), kicker Nick Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for the sixth best in the league that season and the fourth highest mark in team history. Additionally, Edwards matched a team rookie record with 75 punts.

Boyer joined the Jets after a four-year tenure in Indianapolis (2012-15), where he aided a Colts special teams unit that ranked in the top 10 league-wide during that span in net punting average (third), kickoff return average (fourth), kickoff touchbacks (fourth) and field goal percentage (seventh), despite using three different players as primary punt returners and four different kick returners in his four seasons.

During the 2015 season, the Indianapolis special teams unit established an NFL record with just 156 kickoff return yards allowed for the season, besting the previous mark of 254 set by Denver in 1992.

In 2014, both punter Pat McAfee and kicker Adam Vinatieri received Associated Press First-Team NFL All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors under Boyer as McAfee converted a career-high three inside kicks and set single-season franchise records for

punts pinned inside the 20-yard line (30), net punting average (42.8) and kickoff touchbacks (70), while Vinatieri made 30 of 31 field goals and also converted 35 consecutive attempts, the fourth-longest streak in NFL history.

In 2013, Boyer coached Matt Overton to his first career Pro Bowl selection, one year after discovering the long snapper at a specialists combine in Arizona and bringing him to Indianapolis for a workout prior to his signing in April 2012.

Prior to joining the Colts, Boyer was twice a training camp intern, first for the Cleveland Browns (2009) and later for the New York Giants (2010).

Before entering the coaching ranks, Boyer played linebacker and was a standout on special teams for the Miami Dolphins (1994), Jacksonville Jaguars (1995-2000) and Cleveland Browns (2001-03). He served as a special teams captain for both the Jaguars and Browns and led Cleveland in tackles in 2002 and 2003. Boyer was a two-time member of USA Today's All-Joe Team, once as a linebacker and once as a special teams player. In 2002, his teammates selected him for the Cleveland Browns Unsung Hero Award.

Boyer played in 129 career games and totaled 250 tackles, 13.0 sacks, six interceptions, one forced fumble and 15 passes defended. He originally entered the league as a sixth-round selection of the Miami Dolphins in the 1994 NFL Draft.

Before entering the NFL, Boyer was an inside linebacker and team captain at the University of Arizona as part of the school's "Desert Swarm" defense. He led the team in tackles during his senior season, helping the Wildcats to their first 10-win season in 90 years and a victory in the 1993 Fiesta Bowl, and earned a place in the school's Ring of Honor.

DOWELL LOGGAINS returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. Loggains is now in his 15th season as an NFL coach, serving as either an offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach since 2010.

In his first season under Loggains, quarterback Sam Darnold improved his numbers from his rookie season, increasing his win total, completion percentage, passing yards, touchdown passes and passer rating, while lowering his interceptions. Darnold finished the final eight games with a 93.3 passer rating, the 10th best in the league among qualified passers in that span. Over the same period, Darnold posted the 11th-highest touchdown percentage and the 10th- lowest interception percentage.

Additionally, Loggains was part of an offensive staff that was among the most proficient on opening drives. The Jets offense scored 40 points on their initial possession, tied for the ninth most in the league.

In compiling a 6-2 record over the final eight games, the offense improved in several key categories, including increasing their scoring by over 10 points per game and ranking top 10 in the league in both sacks allowed (ninth) and giveaways (10th).

Before joining the Jets, Loggains oversaw a Miami offense that averaged 4.68 yards per rush, the ninth-best mark in the NFL. The Dolphins also ranked second in the league with 14 passing touchdowns of 20+ yards. Additionally, he helped running back Kenyan Drake become one of just nine players to register four touchdowns rushing and receiving and produce over 1,000 scrimmage yards.

In three seasons with Chicago, first as the quarterbacks coach in 2015, Loggains helped Jay Cutler to a career season as the then 10-year veteran posted then single-season bests in passer rating and yards per attempt, all while reducing his interception total by seven from the previous season.

The following season (2016) he was promoted to offensive coordinator and helped running back Jordan Howard finish sixth in the league with 1,313 yards rushing as a rookie. In 2017, he helped Mitchell Trubisky, the second overall selection in the draft, transition to NFL starter, as the quarterback finished second among rookie passers in yards and passer rating in 12 starts. He also oversaw another rookie, fourth-round pick Tarik Cohen, as the running back became the first rookie since 1965 and first player since 1975 to record a rushing, passing, receiving and punt return touchdown in the same season. That season, both Howard and guard Josh Sitton earned Pro Bowl selections as Howard again produced 1,000+ yards rushing.

In one season with the Browns, Loggains helped quarterback Brian Hoyer to a career season as the then six-year veteran won seven games (in 13 starts) and threw for over 3,000 yards, while the offense produced 31 passes of 25+ yards, the 10th most of any team in the league.

Beginning his coaching career with the Titans in 2006, Loggains spent eight seasons in Tennessee in a variety of roles, ultimately serving as the offensive coordinator for the final five games of 2012 and all of 2013. In his first full season as the offensive coordinator, he helped wide receiver Kendall Wright and running back Chris Johnson become just the organization's fifth 1,000-yard receiving/rushing combo as Wright brought in 94 catches for 1,079 yards and Johnson gained 1,077 yards on the ground. He began his career with the Titans as a coaching administrative assistant (2006-07) and quality control coach (2008-09), before spending the next three seasons as the quarterbacks/passing game coordinator, helping quarterback Vince Young achieve a career-high passer rating in 2010, earning a Pro Bowl appearance.

Loggains gained his start in the NFL with Dallas, working as a scouting assistant where he helped with opponent film breakdown, self-scouting and statistical analysis to be used in game-plan preparation.

In college, Loggains walked on as a quarterback and holder at Arkansas before earning a scholarship and becoming a four-year letterman, appearing in 50 games. He and his wife, Beth, have three daughters, Reese, Aven and Connor, and one son, Ryne.

GREGG WILLIAMS returns for his second season with the New York Jets, leading the defense as the team's defensive coordinator. Now in his 30th season coaching in the league, Williams has served as a head coach for three years and a defensive coordinator for 18.

Williams' defenses have finished in the top 10 in total defense eight times in his 21 seasons as a head coach or defensive coordinator, including finishing seventh overall in his first season leading the Jets defense (2019). His defenses have twice made the Super Bowl, winning Super Bowl XLIV with the Saints, after holding a Colts team that finished seventh in the league in scoring to just 17 points. He also oversaw a defense that held a Rams offense that led the league in scoring and was the third-highest scoring offense in league history at the time to 10 points less than their season average in Super Bowl XXXIV. Additionally, he has helped 16 different defensive players earn trips to the Pro Bowl, 11 of whom made their first trips under him, including Myles Garrett, Aaron Donald and Sean Taylor.

In addition to the seventh overall finish in total defense in his first season as Jets defensive coordinator (2019), Williams oversaw a defense that finished second in the league in rushing defense, allowing just 3.34 yards per carry, a franchise record for a 16-game season. The defense held opponents to zero or negative yards an NFL-high 117 times in 2019. Williams received contributions from every level on defense as 11 different players registered interceptions, the most in the league and the second most in franchise history. Additionally, 16 different players registered at least a half-sack in 2019, the third most in a season in franchise history. Lastly, 10 different defensive players recorded at least five tackles for loss in 2019 (according to Radar360), the most in the league. Of those 10 players with at least five tackles for loss in 2019, seven registered single-season highs under Williams, while undrafted rookie free agent Kyle Phillips, the team's leader in tackles for loss (according to coaches' stats), finished in the top 10 among all rookies.

Contributing to the franchise single-season best 43 non-offensive points

scored by the Jets, Williams' defense scored via interception return (C.J. Mosley, Jamal Adams & Brian Poole), fumble recovery return (Adams) and safety (Poole & James Burgess). Those defensive scores are nothing new for Williams as over his last 10 seasons as a defensive coordinator (2008-11, 14-19), his defenses have provided 35 defensive scores, tied for the seventh most of any team in the league.

As the team compiled a 6-2 record over their last eight games, Williams' defense ranked in the top six league-wide in scoring defense (18.5), total defense (294.0), third-down defense (33.0%) and red zone touchdown defense (40.9%). The defense also increased their sack total over the final eight weeks.

Prior to joining the Jets, Williams took over as the interim head coach with Cleveland for the final eight games of the season (2018), leading the team to a 5-3 record en route to a 7-8-1 season, the best winning percentage by the franchise since 2007. In his two seasons as the defensive coordinator, the Browns saw production from several young players as Garrett produced 20.5 sacks in his first two seasons, earning a Pro Bowl selection in his second year, and Denzel Ward was selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie. Additionally, in his first season with Cleveland (2017), Joe Schobert and Christian Kirksey both finished in the top five in total tackles and Schobert was also selected to his first Pro Bowl.

Prior to his time in Cleveland, Williams spent three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense. Additionally, he oversaw the development of Aaron Donald, who was voted the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year and was selected to the Pro Bowl all three seasons under Williams (2014-16).

Before the Rams, Williams returned to Tennessee, serving as senior assistant defensive coach (2013) and helping the team make significant improvements in nearly every defensive category. The Titans improved in points per game (16th from 32nd), total defense (14th from 27th), pass defense (11th from 26th) and third down defense (7th from 21st).

Over his three seasons as the defensive coordinator (2009-11), the Saints advanced to the postseason each year, capturing two division titles and winning Super Bowl XLIV. In 2010, the Saints allowed the fewest touchdown passes (13) in the league. In his first season, the defense recorded 35 takeaways, returning seven for touchdowns.

Williams spent one season (2008) with Jacksonville as defensive coordinator/assistant head coach following four seasons (2004-07) as assistant head coach/defense with Washington. The Redskins had one of the NFL's top defenses over that span, allowing just 19.4 points per game and ranking sixth overall in defense during the four-season stretch. In 2005, the defense was a key factor in the club making its first postseason appearance in six seasons.

From 2001-03, Williams served as the head coach of the Buffalo Bills, helping six different players, five of whom were offensive players including quarterback Drew Bledsoe, earn Pro Bowl recognition. The defense improved each season, moving from 21st in the NFL to 15th to second in his three seasons.


Williams joined the NFL ranks in 1990 and spent 11 seasons with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans working his way up from defensive quality control coach (1990-92) to defensive coordinator (1997-2000). He also served as special teams coach (1993) and linebackers coach (1994-96). In 1999, he helped the Titans advance to Super Bowl XXXIV. In 2000, Tennessee led the NFL in total defense for the first time in franchise history and allowed 191 points, the third-fewest in league history since the adoption of the 16-game schedule in 1978. The Titans also set club records for sacks (55), fewest passing yards allowed (2,424) and fewest touchdowns allowed (17).

Prior to arriving in the NFL, Williams was a graduate assistant at the University of Houston from 1988-89. From 1984-87, Williams was the head coach at Belton (MO) HS after opening his coaching career at his alma mater, Excelsior Springs (MO) HS.

A graduate of Truman State University, Williams played quarterback and also played baseball. He later earned a master's degree from Central Missouri.

Since 2004, Williams has helped raise more than \$2 million for Excelsior Springs young people through the Gregg Williams Foundation. The money raised annually provides two scholarships for Excelsior Springs High School graduates and funds both school and local youth athletics. In January 2016, Williams was inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame. The induction celebrated his decorated NFL coaching career as well his unwavering commitment to his home state of Missouri and the mentorship of young men.

MACK BROWN returns for his second season with the New York Jets as a defensive assistant working with Frank Bush and the team's inside linebackers. For Brown, this marks his second season on the defensive side of the ball after previously coaching offense in college and high school.

In his first season with the Jets, Brown helped linebackers James Burgess and Neville Hewitt finish second and third on the team in total tackles respectively. Additionally, he was part of a defensive staff that ranked second in the league with just 3.34 yards per rush allowed, the lowest 16-game average in franchise history. Over the season's final eight games, the defense ranked in the top 10 league-wide in scoring defense (18.5 allowed), total defense (294.0), third-down defense (33.0%), red zone defense (40.9%) and sacks (22).

Prior to joining the Jets, Brown spent the last three seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Missouri State, helping the Bears increase their scoring average in consecutive seasons.

Before Missouri State, Brown served on staffs at Missouri, starting as a recruiting assistant before adding the role of offensive quality control and graduate assistant. He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at William Jewell College, before moving on as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Lawrence (KS) High School.

ANDRE CARTER returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's defensive line coach. A Pro Bowl 13-year veteran as a player, he enters his fourth season as a coach.

In his first season with the Jets, Carter oversaw a defensive line that was an integral part of the league's number two ranked run defense. The defense, which held opposing ball carriers to just 3.34 yards a carry, forced 117 opposing carries of zero or negative yards, the most in the league.

Several defensive linemen saw an increase in their production under Carter, including 10-year veteran Steve McLendon who posted single-season bests in tackles for loss and quarterback hits (according to Radar360), while Folorunso Fatukasi and Nathan Shepherd, both second-year players, saw increased playtime, with Fatukasi finishing third on the team in tackles for loss and Shepherd finishing top five on the team in both tackles for loss and quarterback hits after his return in Week Nine.

Additionally, Carter helped undrafted rookie Kyle Phillips finish first on the team in tackles for loss, while Phillips finished in the top 10 in tackles for loss among all rookies and sixth among rookie d-linemen in total tackles (stats according to Radar360).

Before joining the Jets, Carter spent two seasons in Miami as the assistant defensive line coach. In his two seasons there, defensive end Cameron Wake produced 16.5 sacks and 44 quarterback hits, both top 10 totals among AFC defensive linemen, despite being 35 and 36 in those seasons.

Between 2017-18, Carter's group produced 140 quarterback hits, the seventh-best total in the NFL, including seasons of 10 or more by four different players. Additionally, Dolphin defensive linemen accounted for 86 tackles for loss, tied for the ninth-most in the league.

Prior to his time in Miami, Carter was a Bill Walsh NFL Diversity Coaching Fellowship participant with San Francisco in 2016. He began his coaching career in 2015 as a graduate student assistant at his alma mater, California.

The seventh overall selection in the 2001 NFL Draft, Carter totaled 184 games (147 starts) for San Francisco (2001-05), Washington (2006-10), New England (2011, 2013) and Oakland (2012). He recorded career totals of 517 tackles (388 solo), 80.5 sacks, 18 forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries. His 80.5 sacks were the 13th most in the NFL during his 13 seasons from 2001-13, and he was selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011 at age 32.

At Cal, Carter was a unanimous All-American selection as a senior in 2000 and earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors twice (1999-2000) and won the Morris Trophy in 2000, awarded to the Pac-10's top defensive lineman.

Carter earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. His father, Rubin Carter, played at the University of Miami and had a 12-year NFL career as a defensive lineman with Denver (1975-86) before spending 28 seasons as a coach in high school, college and the NFL, including three seasons as a defensive line coach for the Jets (2001-03).

Carter and his wife, Bethany, have two children, Aysha and Quincy.

JIM BOB COOTER returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's running backs coach. Cooter has been an offensive coach in the league for the past 11 seasons, including three-and-a-half years as an offensive coordinator. He has been part of two staffs that reached the Super Bowl, the Denver Broncos in 2013 and the 2009 Indianapolis Colts.

In his first season with the Jets, Cooter helped free agent signing Le'Veon Bell produce 1,250 yards from scrimmage, one of just six Jets rushers with a 1,200+ scrimmage yards season in the last 20 years. Bell also finished as one of just 10 NFL running backs with 600+ rushing yards and 400+ receiving yards in 2019, while pulling in 66 receptions, one of just seven running backs with 65+ catches in 2019.

After initially joining the Lions as a quarterbacks coach (2014), Cooter was promoted to offensive coordinator in Week Eight of the 2015 season. During his time in Detroit, quarterback Matthew Stafford ranked in the top 10 in completion percentage (64.9%), passing yards (21,069), touchdowns (128) and passing plays of 25+ yards (151). Prior to his promotion to offensive coordinator, the offense under Stafford produced the third-most turnovers in the league. Following his appointment as offensive coordinator, the offense produced the fifth-fewest. In 2015, the offense led the NFL in red zone efficiency, while the 2016 offense produced eight fourth-quarter game-winning drives, with five different players catching at least 50 passes (only the fifth team in league history to do so).

Additionally, running backs in Cooter's offense ranked in the top four league-wide in both receptions and receiving yards in his time as offensive coordinator, while Theo Riddick's 211 receptions under him were the second most in the league in that span. Three different backs produced 25-catch seasons under him, including four by Riddick from 2015-18.

Prior to his time in Detroit, Cooter first worked with Gase as the Broncos offensive assistant (2013). That season, the Denver offense ranked first in the NFL in multiple categories, including total yards per game (465.3), total touchdowns (76) and points per game (37.9), and set an NFL single-season record with 606 points scored as the team earned its third-straight AFC West title.

In his lone season in Kansas City, Cooter was part of a Chiefs offensive staff that oversaw the fifth-ranked rushing offense in the league, producing 149.7 yards per game, as running back Jamaal Charles finished with 1,509 yards (fourth most in the league), earning Pro Bowl recognition.

Cooter entered the NFL coaching ranks with Indianapolis in 2009, serving the Colts staff in a variety of roles as the team won back-to-back AFC South titles in 2009 and 2010, earning a Super Bowl XLIV appearance.

A former quarterback at the University of Tennessee, Cooter got his coaching start at his alma mater as a graduate assistant from 2007-08.

JOHN DUNN returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's tight ends coach, his fourth season in the NFL.

In his first season with the Jets, Dunn was without presumptive starter Chris Herndon for all but one game, while veteran Ryan Griffin, signed by the team prior to training camp, posted 34 receptions for 320 yards and a single-season best five touchdowns. In addition to tying for third in the AFC with those five scores, Griffin also became the eighth tight end in franchise history with a season of at least five touchdowns.

Prior to joining the Jets, Dunn served as the offensive coordinator at the University of Connecticut, overseeing a Huskies offense that produced two 1,000-yard rushers (running back and quarterback), as the quarterback established a school rushing record for the position and the team saw a running back gain 1,000+ yards for the first time since 2011.

DEREK FRAZIER returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's assistant offensive line coach. After a 20-year college coaching career, Frazier begins his second season in the NFL.

Last season, Frazier and Offensive Line Coach Frank Pollack oversaw a group that was forced to use 11 different starters and nine different line combinations as a result of injury. Despite the consistent change, the offensive line allowed the ninth-fewest sacks in the league over the last eight games, a 22-sack difference from the season's first eight weeks.

Prior to joining the Jets, Frazier coached at Central Michigan (2015-18), Colorado State (2012-14), Fresno State (2003-04, 2006-11), Northern Arizona (2005), Adams State (2001) and Nichols College.

Along the way, Frazier has tutored Ty Sambrailo (Colorado State, 2012-14), Weston Richburg (Colorado State, 2012-13) and seven-time Pro Bowler Logan Mankins (Fresno State, 2003-04), all of whom were drafted in the second round or higher.

Additionally, his lines have protected Cooper Rush, allowing the quarterback to become Central Michigan's second-leading passer, and Kapri Bibbs, allowing the running back to produce 1,741 yards and 31 touchdowns in 2013 for Colorado State, tied for the fourth-most rushing touchdowns in a single season in NCAA history.

Earning four letters as an offensive lineman at Northern Colorado, Frazier was the starting center on the Bears NCAA Division II National Championship team in 1996, winning the team's Most Inspirational Offensive Player Award that season.

Frazier earned his bachelor's degree from Northern Colorado and his master's degree from Nichols College.

JEFF HAMMERSCHMIDT returns for his fifth season with the New York Jets as the team's assistant special teams coach. Over the last two seasons, Hammerschmidt and Special Teams Coordinator Brant Boyer have helped the special teams to a pair of top five rankings according to FootballOutsiders.com, which compiles the numbers in five key elements of special teams.

In Hammerschmidt's four seasons with the Jets, the special teams unit has committed just 61 penalties, tied for the fourth fewest of any team in the league, while also posting top 10 rankings in total touchdowns (five), blocked punts (two), forced fumbles (three), kickoff return average (22.9) and kickoff return average against (21.3). The group is also one of just two in the league with an interception.

Last season, Hammerschmidt helped the special teams finish fourth in the league in special teams DVOA according to FootballOutsiders.com, their second consecutive season in the top five, despite new primary players at kicker (Sam Ficken), punt returner (Braxton Berrios) and kick returner (Ty Montgomery & Vyncint Smith). Overall, the group ranked in the top five in coverage touchdowns (two), punt return average (11.4), kickoff return average against (19.3) and fumble recoveries (two).

Ficken, posted career highs in every category as he increased his field goal percentage from the previous season. Berrios, a second-year player who missed his entire rookie season with injury before being claimed prior to the start of the regular season, finished second in the league in punt return average (11.4). Linebacker Frankie Luvu, the team's leading special teams tackler, became the club's fourth different top tackler in the last four seasons, while punter Lachlan Edwards improved his franchise record net punting average for the fourth-consecutive season (41.6) and now hold the top three seasons in net punting average in franchise history.

In 2018, Hammerschmidt assisted a special teams unit that was widely regarded as the best in the league, receiving top honors from FootballOutsiders.com after finishing in the top five league-wide in kickoff return average (third; 26.9), punt return average (first; 13.0) and field goal percentage (fourth; 91.7%). Additionally, both kicker Jason

Myers, a waiver claim by the Jets shortly before the final preseason game, and wide receiver and return specialist Andre Roberts, a nine-year veteran offseason signing, both earned their first trips to the Pro Bowl with Roberts also earning first team All-Pro honors as a kick returner.

Among the many superlatives by the Jets special teams unit last season were Myers tying Nick Folk's field goal percentage franchise record after making 33-of-36 field goals (91.7%) and finishing with the second-most made field goals and tying for the second most points for a single season in franchise history. Additionally, Myers made all five of his attempts of 55+ yards last season, the most in a single year in NFL history, and now accounts for five of the 11 makes from 55+ yards in Jets history. Myers also became one of just eight players in league history with a seven-field-goal game after connecting on all seven attempts for 24 total points (second-most kicking points in a game in league history) vs. Indianapolis (10/14/18).

Roberts led the league in punt return average (14.1) and finished second in kickoff return average (29.4) last season, one of just 12 qualifying players to finish in the top three in both in the same season since 1970. Additionally, Roberts registered 10 returns (three punt, seven kickoff) of 40+ yards last season, two of which accounted for touchdowns — a 78-yard punt return at Detroit (09/10/18) and a 99-yard kickoff return vs. Green Bay (12/23/18). For Roberts, the 10 returns of 40+ make him one of just five players to accomplish the feat since 2000.

Edwards posted another franchise record in net punting average (40.8) in 2018. Long snapper Thomas Hennessy, an undrafted free agent acquired in 2017 just before the regular season, has snapped in every game for the Jets since joining the team, posting 16 tackles and a forced fumble on coverage while not allowing a blocked field goal, extra point or punt in his career. Running back Trenton Cannon, the 2018 sixth-round draft pick who was in competition with Roberts for the primary return job during preseason, remained a key special teams contributor, leading the team with 16 special teams tackles and finishing with the most special teams tackles in franchise history by a running back (since 2000; according to radar360).

In his second season with the Jets, Hammerschmidt helped coach a record-setting performance from Edwards, as the punter set franchise records with a 46.6 gross punting average and 40.5 net punting average while also placing 33 punts inside the 20-yard line, the second most in franchise history and the third most in the NFL in 2017. Additionally, kicker Chandler Catanzaro connected on the longest field goal in franchise history when he hit a 57-yard field goal at CLV (10/08/17). Overall, Catanzaro improved from his 75% field goal rate in 2016 as he connected on 25 of 30 attempts (83.3%), and he became one of just five kickers in the conference with at least 14 makes of 40+ yards that season.

In Hammerschmidt's first season, Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for sixth best in the league that season and the fourth-highest mark in team history. Additionally, Edwards, then a seventh-round rookie, matched a team rookie record with 75 punts.

Prior to joining the Jets, Hammerschmidt served as a special teams coordinator for his alma mater Arizona (2008-11) before working in the same capacity at Colorado State (2012-15). In his time with the Rams, both the punter and kicker received honorable mention all-conference honors, while punter Hayden Hurst was also a Ray Guy Award finalist in 2015.

Throughout his career, Hammerschmidt has coached every level of the defense (secondary, linebackers and defensive line) while also serving as a defensive coordinator for Southern Utah (1996-97), Saint Mary's (2000-02) and Montana (2003-04). He began his coaching career in 1992 as a graduate assistant at Arizona and has since worked with a handful of current and former NFL players, including Kris Dielman, Adewale Ogunleye, Antwaan Randle El and Brooks Reed.

A four-year letterman, three-year starting safety and first-team All-Pac-10 selection at Arizona, Hammerschmidt was a semifinalist for the 1989 Jim Thorpe Award after beginning his career as an option quarterback. Following his collegiate career, he signed as a free agent with the Los Angeles Rams (1991) and played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of the World League (1992). Hammerschmidt and his wife, Felicity, have two children, Bryn and Bode. He has a bachelor's degree in sociology from Arizona.

BO HARDEGREE returns for his second season with the New York Jets as an offensive assistant, his seventh season as a coach in the league.

In his first season with the Jets, Hardegree was part of an offensive staff that was among the most proficient on opening drives. The Jets offense scored 40 points on their initial possession, tied for the ninth most in the league. Additionally, over the last eight games, the offense improved in several key categories, including increasing their scoring by over 10 points per game and ranking top 10 in the league in both sacks allowed (ninth) and giveaways (10th).

Before joining the Jets, Hardegree spent three seasons (2016-18) in Miami coaching the quarterbacks. In his time there, Ryan Tannehill completed 65.9 percent of his passes, the ninth best among qualified quarterbacks in that span, for a 93.2 passer rating. In their first season together (2016), Tannehill set then career highs with a 93.5 passer rating, 7.7 yards per attempt and a 67.1 completion percentage before missing the final three games with an injury. Following Tannehill's injury, he helped backup quarterback Matt Moore win two of his three starts as the Dolphins earned a playoff berth, snapping an eight-year postseason drought.

Hardegree's first NFL position came as an offensive quality control coach in Denver (2014), where he first worked with Gase, then the Broncos offensive coordinator. He would follow Gase to Chicago the following year (2015), serving as a Bears offensive assistant.

Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, Hardegree spent three seasons at Duke (2008-10) as a graduate assistant before three seasons at LSU, where he worked on both sides of the ball, first as a defensive assistant (2011) and later as an offensive assistant (2012-13).

A quarterback at Tennessee, Hardegree was also a tennis student-athlete and earned All-SEC Academic team honors from 2004-07 before graduating with a degree in exercise science. A native of Jackson, TN, he is married to wife, Lauren.

FRANK POLLACK returns for his second season as the offensive line coach with the New York Jets. After playing the position for eight years in the league, Pollack has been guiding NFL offensive lines for the last 14 seasons, helping to produce All-Pros at center, guard and tackle.

In his first season with the Jets, Pollack's unit was forced to use 11 different starters and nine different offensive line combinations as a result of injury. The 11 different starting linemen were the second most in the league in 2019, while they had eight different linemen play at least 300 offensive snaps, tied for the most in the league. Despite the consistent change throughout the season, the line allowed the ninth fewest sacks over the season's final eight games, a 22-sack improvement from the first eight weeks.

In his lone season in Cincinnati before joining the Jets, Pollack oversaw an offensive line that was transitioning to four new starters from the start of the previous season, including a first-time starter in second-year undrafted guard Alex Redmond and rookie center Billy Price. Despite the change, the line finished in the top third of the league in sacks allowed while producing 4.69 yards per carry, the eighth-best average in the league and helped pave the way for running back Joe Mixon's 1,168 rushing yards and eight touchdowns rushing.

Pollack spent five seasons (2013-17) with the Cowboys, developing an offensive line regarded as one of the league's best. Despite ranking 31st in rushing offense before his arrival, his unit paved the way for an offense

that featured two league-leading rushers, DeMarco Murray (2014) and Ezekiel Elliot (2016), and averaged 4.73 yards per carry in those seasons, the best in the league. Additionally, the pass protection allowed the sixth-fewest sacks in that span.

A trio of offensive lineman achieved All-Pro status for the Cowboys under Pollack as tackle Tyron Smith, guard Zack Martin and center Travis Frederick each earned trips to four Pro Bowls under him. Additional offensive honors his line helped achieve were an Offensive Rookie of the Year award for Dak Prescott as well as Pro Bowl selections at every offensive position, including wide receiver Dez Bryant, running backs Elliott and Murray, tight end Jason Witten and quarterbacks Prescott and Tony Romo.

Prior to his time in Dallas, Pollack oversaw the offensive line in Oakland (2012), which, despite no first-round picks among the starters, protected Carson Palmer, allowing the quarterback to throw for over 4,000 yards while also allowing the fifth-fewest sacks that season.

Pollack began his NFL coaching career with the Texans, serving as the team's assistant offensive line coach for five seasons (2007-11). In his time with Houston, the offensive line only allowed 144 sacks, the seventh-fewest in the NFL over that span and ranked in the top 10 in rushing average in each of his final two seasons with the club (third in 2010, eight in 2011).

Beginning his coaching career at his alma mater, Northern Arizona, Pollack served as the assistant offensive line coach (2005) and then the offensive line coach (2006).

A sixth-round selection by San Francisco, Pollack played eight seasons in the league, appearing in 90 games at tackle and guard for the 49ers (1990-91, '94-98) and Broncos (1992), including Super Bowl XXIX with the 49ers.

An offensive lineman at Northern Arizona who graduated with a degree in advertising in 1990, he was an All-America and All-Big Sky selection in 1989 and was inducted into the school's athletic Hall of Fame in 2010. He and his wife, Wendy, have three sons, Frankie, Carter and Wilson.

CHIP VAUGHN begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as a defensive assistant on February 16, 2020. For Vaughn, this is his first full-time coaching position in the NFL following five years in college football working with defensive backs at Air Force, Fayetteville State and Winston-Salem State.

At Air Force, the team finished the 2019 season ranked in the Top 25 with two wins over Power 5 teams, including Washington State in the Cheez-It Bowl. The defense finished 17th in total defense and seventh in rush defense, while the secondary saw three players selected to All-Mountain West Conference teams, one of which earned an undrafted free agent contract with the Arizona Cardinals.

Vaughn was selected to the 2020 American Football Coaches Association 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute. A Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship coach with New Orleans during training camp in 2018, he was also one of 15 coaches selected to participate in the 2018 NFL-NCAA Coaches Academy.

A former fourth-round selection by New Orleans in 2009, Vaughn missed his rookie season and the Saints Super Bowl run, with an injury suffered in training camp. He appeared in three games the following season with Indianapolis before finishing his NFL career with Carolina's practice squad the next year.

A four-year defensive back at Wake Forest, Vaughn was named first team All-ACC as a senior and received honorable mention as a junior. He led the Demon Deacons in tackles his junior year and finished second as a

JOE VITT, an NFL coaching veteran for over 40 years, returns for his second season with the New York Jets as the team's senior defensive assistant/outside linebackers coach. This is the ninth franchise Vitt has worked with in the league after beginning his career in 1979 with the Baltimore Colts.

In his first season with the Jets, Vitt's group saw a career year from both Jordan Jenkins and Tarrell Basham. Jenkins, the fourth-year pro, led the team with a single-season high 8.0 sacks in 2019, becoming one of just eight players in franchise history with consecutive 7.0+ sack seasons. Basham, the third-year pro, saw his most extensive play time in 2019 as he set single-season bests in games played (16), games started (2) and total tackles (36), while registering the first interception, passes defended (team-leading nine), and fumble recovery of his career. In addition, Basham became one of just the only Jet since 1991 to register a sack, fumble recovery, an interception and blocked punt in the same season, when he accomplished the feat over his final three games.

Among Vitt's coaching stops in a five-decade career prior to the Jets were New Orleans (2006-16), St. Louis Rams (2004-05), Kansas City (2000-03), Green Bay (1999), Philadelphia (1995-98), Los Angeles Rams (1992-94), Seattle (1982-91) and the Baltimore Colts (1979-81). He has twice served as an interim head coach, leading the Saints during the 2012 campaign and the Rams for the final 11 games in 2005, while also holding the position of assistant head coach for his last 16 seasons as a coach. Before joining the Jets, Vitt spent a season in Miami as the senior director, football and player development.

In his last coaching position, Vitt was the assistant head coach/linebackers with New Orleans for 11 seasons (2006-16), part of a franchise that won 101 games, tied for the seventh most in the league in that span. During the 2012 season, Vitt served as the team's interim head coach. In his time there, six different Saints linebackers produced 90-tackle seasons (according to Radar360), including Jonathan Vilma, who did so from 2008-10, while twice earning Pro Bowl recognition.

Before he began his coaching career, Vitt played linebacker at Towson State, where he was part of the school's 1974 undefeated team. In 1976, he helped Towson finish as the NCAA Division III runner-up in just the program's eighth year of existence. An avid supporter of the United States Military, Vitt was the 2012 and 2013 nominee for the NFL's Salute to Service Award with New Orleans.

HINES WARD returns to the New York Jets for his second season, and his first as the team’s wide receivers coach after being promoted from offensive assistant this season. Initially joining the team during 2019 training camp as part of the NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship program, Ward was hired before the start of last season as an offensive assistant and is now in his third season as a coach in the NFL, following a 14-year Pro Bowl career as a wide receiver.

In his first season with the Jets, Ward was part of an offensive staff that saw improvement in several categories over the last eight games, including increasing their scoring by over 10 points per game. Additionally, wide receivers Robby Anderson and Jamison Crowder became only the third duo in the AFC to each register 50+ receptions and 700+ receiving yards.

Before joining the Jets, Ward served as a player relations executive for the Alliance of American Football. In his former role he helped the AAF as they looked to give players a platform to begin, extend or revitalize

their careers. In 2017, Ward was a coaching intern throughout training camp for the Steelers.

After retiring from his playing career, Ward worked as a football analyst for NBC Sports (2012-2015), where he was highlighted by his role during the Sunday Night Football pregame show, Football Night in America before joining CNN as a studio analyst from 2016-19.

A third-round pick (92 overall) in the 1998 NFL Draft, Ward played the entirety of his career with the Steelers. He played in 217 games recording career totals of 12,083 receiving yards, 428 rushing yards, 86 touchdowns and five two-point conversions. In 2006, Pittsburgh captured their fifth Super Bowl title with Ward earning MVP honors after finishing the night with five receptions for 123 yards and a touchdown. The four-time Pro Bowler left his mark on the franchise, holding the Steelers record for receptions (1,000) and receiving yards (12,083).

At Georgia, Ward played quarterback, running back and wide receiver. With the Bulldogs, Ward completed 72 of 120 passes for 918 yards and three touchdowns. He rushed 204 times for 1,066 yards and five touchdowns and caught 144 passes for 1,965 yards and 11 scores. His 12 catches for 122 yards against Wisconsin in the 1998 Outback Bowl set a school record for the number of receptions in a bowl game.

Ward and his wife, Lindsey, have one son, Jaden.

TODD WASHINGTON returns for his season with the New York Jets as an offensive assistant. For Washington, this season marks his eighth season coaching in the NFL following eight years as a player. As a coach, he has spent time in three other professional leagues, including this iteration of the XFL (prior to the league’s start), the AAF and the UFL.

In his first season with the Jets, Washington was part of an offensive staff that was among the most proficient on opening drives. The Jets offense scored 40 points on their initial possession, tied for the ninth most in the league. Additionally, over the last eight games, the offense improved in several key categories, including increasing their scoring by over 10 points per game and ranking top 10 in the league in both sacks allowed (ninth) and giveaways (10th).

Prior to joining the Jets, Washington worked in both the XFL as a tight end/offensive tackle assistant for the Washington D.C. franchise prior to the league’s launch in 2020. Earlier in 2019, he served as the offensive line coach for the Alliance of American Football’s Orlando Apollos, helping the team to a league-best 7-1 record before operations were suspended.

In his last full-time position in the NFL, Washington was the assistant offensive line coach in Baltimore (2011-16) and was part of the Ravens’ Super Bowl XLVII-winning team that finished with the six-most rushing touchdowns in the league. Additionally, over his six seasons, three different Ravens offensive linemen were selected to the Pro Bowl, including guard Marshal Yanda who was selected each year under Washington.

Following his stint in Baltimore, he spent consecutive training camps as a Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship interns, first for the Bears (2017) and then for the Dolphins (2018).

Washington spent a season (2010) as the offensive line coach for the Hartford Colonials of the United Football League, helping coach a team that finished the season ranked first in total offense and rushing offense. He began his coaching career at the University of San Diego, initially as the team’s offensive line coach (2007-08) before being promoted to offensive coordinator (2009).

An eight-year NFL veteran, Washington entered the league as a fourth-round selection by Tampa Bay (1998). He appeared in 97 games as a guard/center for the Buccaneers (1998-2002) and Texans (2003-05) and was a member of Tampa Bay’s Super Bowl XXXVII-winning team in his final season with the club. A four-year letterman at Virginia Tech (1994-97), he earned his degree in physical education and health.

Washington and his wife, Shannon Elizabeth Keller, have three children, Cameron, Ava, and, Zane.

BLAKE WILLIAMS returns for his second season with the New York Jets as a defensive assistant working with Andre Carter and the team's defensive line. For Williams, 2020 marks his 14th year coaching football, including 11 as a coach in the NFL.

In his first season with the Jets, Williams helped defensive linemen Kyle Phillips, Steve McLendon and Folorunso Fatukasi each finish in the top three in tackles for loss, as a key part of a defense that forced 117 opposing carries of zero or negative yards, the most in the league. Additionally, the defensive line was a key contributor to a defense that ranked second in the league with just 3.34 yards per rush allowed, the lowest 16-game average in franchise history.

Prior to joining the Jets, Williams served as the linebackers coach with the Browns for two seasons (2017-18), helping coach Joe Schobert to a Pro Bowl season in 2017 as the linebacker tied for the league-lead in total tackles (144). Cleveland increased its run defense ranking from 31st in 2016 to seventh in 2017, as Schobert and Christian Kirksey were two of just three players in the NFL to play every defensive snap.

During the 2016 season, Williams worked at the NFL league office following three seasons at the collegiate level, first as the defensive coordinator for William Jewell in Missouri for two years and then as the defensive coordinator for Southeastern Louisiana University for a year.

Initially joining the Rams staff as the team's linebackers coach in 2012, Williams also served as the team's defensive coordinator that season, overseeing a defense that tied for the NFL lead with 52 sacks while also intercepting 18 passes, four of which were returned for touchdowns.

In 2009, he joined the Saints staff as an offensive assistant, helping the team win Super Bowl XLIV, before serving as the team's assistant linebackers coach the next two seasons (2010-11).

DENNARD WILSON returns for his fourth season with the New York Jets and his second as the team's passing game coordinator/defensive backs.

Last season, Wilson again oversaw a First Team All-Pro and Pro Bowl season from Jamal Adams as the third-year safety was again voted Curtis Martin Team MVP by his teammates, the first defensive player in franchise history with consecutive Team MVP honors. Adams finished top three on the team in every statistical category leading the team in tackles, quarterback hits, forced fumbles, fumble recoveries and defensive touchdowns. Additionally, safety Marcus Maye returned from injury the previous season and started all 16 games, one of just two defensive players to start every game. Both Adams and Maye finished among the top six in completion percentage allowed among safeties with at least 300 coverage snaps last season (according to Next Gen Stats). Cornerback Brian Poole, signed by the team in the offseason, ranked in the top 20 among all NFL corners with at least 400 coverage in both passer rating and completion percentage allowed, while finishing with the seventh best coverage success rate as the nearest defender (according to Next Gen Stats).

Additionally, over the last seven weeks of 2019, Wilson's group saw increased contributions from cornerbacks Arthur Maulet (six defensive snaps prior to Week 10), Bless Austin (returned from NFI in Week 10) and Maurice Canady (claimed in Week 10). In that stretch, the Jets defense ranked in the top third of the league in completion percentage allowed

(59.2%), passing yards per game allowed (227.4) and passer rating allowed (83.1).

In 2018, Wilson coached Adams to his first Pro Bowl after registering 115 tackles, the second most by a Jets safety since 2000, and finished in the top three among league safeties in tackles, tackles for loss, sacks, quarterback hits, passes defended, forced fumbles and fumble recoveries. Additionally, cornerback Trumaine Johnson posted a 73.3 passer rating allowed since his return from injury in Week 10, the fifth best among NFL corners with at least 400 defensive snaps in that span (according to radar360). Cornerback Morris Claiborne led the team with 14 passes defended, a single-season best, while also registering a career-best two interceptions, one of which was returned for a touchdown.

In his first season with the team, Wilson helped integrate the Jets first- and second-round draft picks at safety, Adams and Marcus Maye. The duo became the first pair of rookie safeties in league history to start all 16 games, leading all rookie defensive backs in tackles and finishing third and fourth respectively among all rookies (according to NFL.com statistics). Additionally, Claiborne led the defense with 11 passes defended, while cornerback Buster Skrine posted multiple forced fumbles and fumble recoveries, one of just 10 cornersbacks to do so since 2011, while finishing second with 10 passes defended. Additionally, Skrine finished as one of just three cornersbacks in the league that season with an interception, forced fumble, fumble recovery, and a sack.

With the Rams, Wilson held the defensive backs coach position for two seasons, overseeing a passing defense that improved from 23rd in 2015 to ninth overall in 2016. Since 2015, cornerback Trumaine Johnson has picked off eight passes, tied for the fifth most in the league and third most among corners. Before spending two seasons as the defensive backs coach, Wilson worked as the Rams defensive quality control coach after joining the team in 2012.

Wilson entered the NFL coaching ranks with the Rams after four years as a pro scout with the Chicago Bears, evaluating pro players and scouting opponents.

Before the NFL, Wilson coached at both of his former schools, first as a defensive backs coach/passing game coordinator for DeMatha (MD) HS (2004-06) and then as a graduate assistant at the University of Maryland (2007-08).

A three-year starter at Maryland, Wilson played four years as a defensive back and was selected as captain for the 2002-04 seasons, earning All-Atlantic Coast Conference honorable mention in 2004. After Maryland, he signed with the Washington Redskins as an undrafted free agent, joining the team as a member of the practice squad before suffering a season-ending injury.

Wilson graduated from the University of Maryland in 2004 with a degree in communications. He is married to his wife, Taihitia, and the couple have a daughter, Riley, and a son, Reece.

For Martin, he called Bell to congratulate the new Jets running back after the deal and said that he took Bell's praise as "a huge compliment" in comments to ESPN.com, adding that Bell, "Has a lot of natural athletic attributes, but what I value most is the vision that he has. He can be patient and set up his blocks."

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON: His son, Frank Gore, Jr., also a running back, will be an incoming freshman at Southern Mississippi this season after a high school senior year that saw him rush for 1,111 yards and 13 touchdowns on just 113 carries.

“My son’s a good player. He’s just gotta keep grinding,” the elder Gore told the New York Post this offseason. “He’s got my genes, he’s got my blood.”

It was the elder Gore, that consulted the younger Gore before decided to continue his NFL career.

“I asked my son what he think I should do,” the elder Gore told reporters after signing with the Jets. “And he said, ‘Daddy, I think you can go one more,’ and I said alright, I’m going to go (another year).”

"It was really hard to find a school that was going to let me pursue football as well. When I visited Cal, the track staff was totally fine with me doing that, so it was just the right fit."


