PROFESSIONAL CAREER

NBA Regular Season: Three-year pro has appeared in 126 games (40 starts) with the Utah Jazz and Memphis Grizzlies... Has averaged 8.5 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 19.0 minutes while shooting 42.3 percent from the field, 38.1 percent from 3-point range and 83.2 percent from the free throw line... Has officially missed 58 games due to injury, one game for rest, four games for health and safety protocols, 25 games as a DNP (Coach's Decision) and 13 games while on assignment to the NBA G League... Has scored in double figures 45 times, including 12 games with at least 20 points, two games with at least 30 points and one game with at least 40 points... His longest streak of consecutive games scoring in double figures is six (Aug. 2-11, 2020).

NBA Playoffs: Has competed in two postseason games as a reserve and has averaged 4.5 points in 7.0 minutes for the Utah Jazz... DNP (Coach's Decision) three times.

NBA G League: Has started all of his 12 games in one NBA G League season and has averaged 16.3 points, 2.7 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.00 steals in 30.7 minutes while shooting 46.3 percent from the field, 40.5 percent from 3-point range and 73.5 percent from the free throw line with the Salt Lake City Stars... Has scored in double figures 11 times, including four games with at least 20 points... Has appeared in one postseason game, totaling 37 points, six rebounds and five assists in 38 minutes.

NBA Transactions: Selected by the Utah Jazz in the first round (21st overall) of the 2018 NBA Draft on June 21, 2018... Signed a multi-year contract with the Utah Jazz on July 2, 2018... Traded by the Utah Jazz with Jae Crowder, Kyle Korver, the draft rights to Darius Bazley (23rd overall in 2019) and a protected future first round draft pick to the Memphis Grizzlies for Mike Conley on July 6, 2019.

2020-21 (Memphis): Appeared in 50 games (38 starts) and averaged 10.6 points, 3.2 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 25.2 minutes while shooting 41.8 percent from the field and 39.1 percent from 3-point range in his third NBA season... Set career highs for points per game, rebounds per game, assists per game and free throw percentage... Missed 22 games... Sidelined 15 games due to injury, including one game (Jan. 1) with a left ankle sprain, four games (Feb. 28-March 10) while in the NBA concussion protocol, one game (March 31) with left hip soreness, two games (April 30-May 1) with a left hand injury and seven games (May 6-16) with left abdominal soreness... Missed four games (Jan. 30-Feb. 4) for health and safety protocols... Missed one game (Feb. 20) for rest... DNP (Coach's Decision) twice... Scored in double figures 24 times, including eight games with at least 20 points and one game with at least 30 points... Had multiple 3PM in 10 consecutive games (Jan. 13-Feb. 17), the third-longest streak in franchise history (**Jaren Jackson Jr.** and **Mike Miller**, 13 games)... Recorded a career-high six assists on Feb. 19 vs. Detroit... Grabbed a career-high eight rebounds on March 20 vs. Golden State... Tallied a career-high four steals on March 27 at Utah... Scored a season-high 30 points (10-18 FG, 3-9 3P, 7-8 FT) on April 7 at Atlanta... Scored 26 points (9-13 FG, 7-10 3P, 1-2 FT) on April 17 at Milwaukee, setting a career high for 3-pointers made... **Play-In:** Averaged 6.0 points and 2.0 rebounds in 15.0 minutes in two play-in games.

2019-20 (Memphis): Appeared in 38 games as a reserve and averaged 8.7 points, 2.2 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 18.9 minutes while shooting 46.6 percent from the field, 40.4 percent from 3-point range and 86.7 percent from the free throw line in his second NBA season... Missed 35 games... Sidelined 34 games due to injury, including nine games (Nov. 4-19) with left ankle soreness, five games (Dec. 11-18) with right ankle soreness and 20 games (Jan. 26-March 10) with a left hip displacement sustained on Jan. 24 at Detroit... DNP (Coach's Decision) once... Scored in double figures 16 times, including two games with at least 20 points... Notched 12 points and a career-high tying seven rebounds on Dec. 4 at Chicago... Averaged 13.6 points (.507 FG/.480 3P) in 27.8 minutes during the Grizzlies' eight-game seeding schedule at Walt Disney World in Orlando, matching or setting his season high in scoring four times... Scored a season-high 20 points (7-10 FG, 6-8 3P), setting a career high for 3-pointers made, on Aug. 5 at Utah... Matched his season high with 20 points in a season-high 34 minutes on Aug. 9 at Toronto... Recorded three points and five rebounds in 23 minutes in the Grizzlies' play-in on Aug. 15 vs. Portland.

2018-19 (Utah): Appeared in 38 games (two starts) and averaged 5.6 points in 10.9 minutes while shooting 37.6 percent from the field, 32.3 percent from 3-point range and 75.0 percent from the free throw line in his rookie season... Missed a total of 44 games... Sidelined nine games (Dec. 25-Jan. 11) with a right ankle sprain... DNP (Coach's Decision) 22 times... Away from the team 13 games while on assignment to the NBA G League's Salt Lake City Stars... Scored in double figures five times, including two games with at least 20 points and one 40-point effort... Led the Jazz in scoring twice... Made his NBA debut with seven points in 11 minutes on Oct. 22 vs. Memphis... Scored a career-high 40 points (11-30 FG, 5-13 3P, 13-14 FT) in 41 minutes in the regular season finale on April 10 at LA Clippers, which was the second-highest single-game scoring output by a 2018-19 rookie (**Trae Young**, 49 points on March 1)... Also set a career high with seven rebounds and tied a personal best with four assists in the regular season finale... **NBA Playoffs:** Appeared in two games as a reserve during the First Round of the Western Conference Playoffs against the Houston Rockets and averaged 4.5 points in 7.0 minutes... DNP (Coach's Decision) three times... **NBA G League (Salt Lake City):** Started all 12 of his appearances with the Salt Lake City Stars and averaged 16.3 points, 2.7 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.00 steals in 30.7 minutes while shooting 46.3 percent from the field, 40.5 percent from 3-point range and 73.5 percent from the free throw line... Scored in double figures 11 times, including four games with at least 20 points... **NBA G League Playoffs:** Scored 37 points (11-15 FG, 6-8 3P, 9-12 FT) in 38 minutes in the Stars' postseason loss to the Oklahoma City Blue on March 26.

COLLEGE CAREER

Played four seasons at Duke University (2014-18)... Appeared in 142 games (97 starts) for the Blue Devils and averaged 14.2 points, 3.2 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.04 steals in 28.1 minutes while shooting 43.0 percent from the field, 38.0 percent from 3-point range and 83.4 percent from the free throw line... Named All-ACC Third Team and AP All-American Honorable Mention as a senior... Selected to the All-ACC First Team, AP All-American Third Team, NABC All-American Third Team and Sporting News All-American Second Team after averaging 21.6 points, 4.6 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.31 steals in 36.6 minutes as a sophomore... Named to the 2015 NCAA Tournament Final Four All-Tournament Team as a freshman after helping Duke capture its fifth national championship.

Born Oct. 8, 1995 in Jacksonville, Fla... Son of William and Sherry Allen... One of only three Duke Blue Devils to receive All-ACC Academic honors in all four years, joining **Quin Snyder** and **Amile Jefferson**... Zachary Z. Kleiman, General Manager & Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations, finishes his sixth season with the Memphis Grizzlies. As the Grizzlies' lead basketball operations executive and personnel decision-maker, Kleiman oversees and manages all basketball matters, including professional and amateur scouting, draft preparations, player acquisitions, salary cap management, team operations and sports medicine programming.

Shortly after his promotion to lead Basketball Operations in April 2019, Kleiman hired Taylor Jenkins as head coach and acquired Ja Morant and Brandon Clarke in the 2019 NBA Draft. Morant, the 2019-20 NBA Rookie of the Year, and Clarke were each named to the 2019-20 NBA All-Rookie First Team, and the duo represented the Grizzlies alongside 2018-19 NBA All-Rookie First Team selection Jaren Jackson Jr. at the NBA Rising Stars as part of NBA All-Star Weekend 2020.

Kleiman served the Grizzlies as Assistant General Manager during the 2018-19 season. In this role, he participated in strategic efforts of the front office (including those related to salary cap management and the Collective Bargaining Agreement), handled various negotiations on behalf of the group and served as the team's primary liaison to the NBA on basketball operations-related matters.

Kleiman joined the organization in 2015 as the team's in-house legal counsel and worked in this capacity in addition to his responsibilities with the basketball operations department. In his role as team counsel, he was responsible for drafting, reviewing and negotiating agreements and providing guidance in connection with a broad range of business and basketball matters.

Prior to joining the Grizzlies, Kleiman practiced law at Proskauer Rose LLP, an international law firm based in New York. At Proskauer, Kleiman represented clients in the sports industry – including the National Basketball Association, Major League Soccer, Major League Baseball and the Buffalo Bills – in connection with a wide array of corporate matters, including team acquisitions and sales, financings, media rights, sponsorships and other commercial transactions.

Kleiman began his career in professional sports with internships with the then-Charlotte Bobcats (Basketball Operations), Oakland Raiders (Legal), Los Angeles Lakers (Public Relations) and New York Knicks (Basketball Operations).

Kleiman earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Southern California and his J.D. from the Duke University School of Law.

TAYLOR JENKINS

Head Coach

Taylor Jenkins completes his second season as head coach of the Memphis Grizzlies after being named to the position on June 11, 2019.

In his second season, Jenkins guided the Grizzlies to the NBA Playoffs for the first time since 2017 while setting regular season franchise records for points per game and 3-pointers made per game. Memphis led the NBA in points in the paint for the second straight season and paced the league in second chance points, fast break points and steals while ranking third in deflections and points off turnovers. Under Jenkins, the Grizzlies earned their way into the playoffs by defeating the San Antonio Spurs and Golden State Warriors in the NBA Play-In Tournament.

During his first season on the sidelines, he led one of the NBA's youngest rosters to a play-in game for the final spot in the 2020 Western Conference Playoffs at the NBA restart in Orlando. At age 35, Jenkins was named Western Conference Coach of the Month for January 2020 after Memphis went 11-4 and established a single-month franchise record for scoring average (118.9).

Jenkins joined the Grizzlies after serving the 2018-19 season as an assistant coach under two-time NBA Coach of the Year Mike Budenholzer with the Milwaukee Bucks, helping guide the team to the NBA's best regular season record (60-22), a trip to the 2019 Eastern Conference Finals and the league's highest-scoring offense (118.1 points per game). He was an assistant coach for Team Giannis in the 2019 NBA All-Star Game.

Before his time with the Bucks, Jenkins spent five seasons (2013-18) as an assistant coach under Budenholzer with the Atlanta Hawks, where he helped coach the team to four postseason appearances, including the 2015 Eastern Conference Finals. He was an assistant coach for the 2015 NBA Eastern Conference All-Star Team.

Jenkins' previous experience includes one season (2012-13) as head coach of the Austin Toros (now Spurs), the NBA G League affiliate of the San Antonio Spurs, where he led the team to the NBA G League Playoffs. Jenkins had spent four seasons (2008-12) as an assistant coach with the Toros, working under head coaches Quin Snyder and Brad Jones, and was a member of the club's 2012 championship team and playoff runs in 2009 and 2010. He interned with San Antonio's basketball operations department during the 2007-08 season.

Jenkins attended The Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania and graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics while concentrating in Management and minoring in Psychology. He and his wife, Chantall, have three sons and one daughter.

Ahearn previously served three seasons as head coach of the NBA G League's Austin Spurs, where he guided the team to the 2018 NBA G League championship. Prior to his time in Austin, Ahearn served one season as head coach of his high school alma mater, De Smet Jesuit, and one season as head coach at Clayton High School, both in St. Louis.

Ahearn played professionally for eight seasons, including three in the NBA with the Miami Heat (2007-08), San Antonio Spurs (2008-09) and Utah Jazz (2011-12). During his time in the NBA G League, Ahearn was named the NBA G League Rookie of the Year (2008), a two-time NBA G League First Team selection (2009, 2012) and won the 2015 NBA G League championship as a member of the Santa Cruz Warriors. He also played professionally in Spain, Italy, China, Ukraine and Puerto Rico.

The St. Louis native played collegiately at Missouri State University (2003-07), where he was named the Missouri Valley Conference Freshman of the Year and earned All-MVC First Team honors during his junior and senior seasons. Ahearn is the NCAA's all-time leader in free throw percentage, connecting on 94.6 percent (435-of-460) of his shots from the foul line, and holds the single-season NCAA record, shooting 97.5 percent (117-of-120) as a freshman.

BRAD JONES

Assistant Coach

Brad Jones completes his third season in the Memphis Grizzlies organization and his first as an assistant coach under head coach Taylor Jenkins. Jones served as head coach of the Memphis Hustle, the Grizzlies' NBA G League affiliate, during the 2018-19 season, leading the club to its first playoff appearance and victory during its run to the 2019 Western Conference Semifinal round.

Prior to joining the Grizzlies organization, Jones served as General Manager of the NBA G League's Iowa Wolves and as a pro scout for the NBA parent club, the Minnesota Timberwolves, from 2016-18. Jones won an NBA G League championship in 2012 as head coach of the then Austin Toros (now Spurs) and also led the Utah Flash to the 2009 NBA G League Finals. In five combined seasons with the two teams (Utah, 2007-10; Austin, 2010-12), Jones compiled a 148-118 (.556) record, submitting a winning record for both teams and winning two Western Conference titles. Jones still owns Austin's franchise record for wins in a regular season (33).

Jones' experience also extends to the NBA coaching ranks, spending four seasons with the Utah Jazz (2012-16) where he worked his way from assistant coach for player development to Quin Snyder's lead assistant coach for his final two seasons in Salt Lake City.

Jones began his coaching career in 1990 at his alma mater of Lambuth University in Jackson, Tennessee and served as the Eagles' head coach from 1996-2001. As a senior at Lambuth, he was the captain of the basketball team and was named the school's Male Athlete of the Year and Scholar Athlete of the Year. He earned his master's degree in kinesiology from the University of Memphis.

Jones and his wife Lori have three children: Justin, Isabella and Jackson.

DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ

Assistant Coach

Darko Rajaković finishes his first season with the Memphis Grizzlies as an assistant coach under head coach Taylor Jenkins.

Rajaković joins the Grizzlies after spending the 2019-20 season as an assistant coach under head coach Monty Williams with the Phoenix Suns, where he helped guide the team to its highest winning percentage (.466) since the 2014-15 season and a perfect 8-0 record during the NBA restart at Walt Disney World in Orlando.

Prior to his time in Phoenix, Rajaković served seven seasons (2012-19) with the Oklahoma City Thunder, spending the last five seasons as an assistant coach. The Thunder averaged 49 wins during his five seasons as an assistant coach with four playoff appearances, including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals. In addition, he served as the Thunder's head coach at NBA Summer League in Las Vegas in 2014 and 2015.

Rajaković initially joined the Thunder in 2012 as head coach of the team's then-NBA G League affiliate, the Tulsa 66ers, becoming the first head coach born outside North America in NBA G League history. In two seasons (2012-14) as Tulsa's head coach, Rajaković recorded a 51-49 record (.510) and a trip to the 2013 NBA G League semifinals. While serving as Tulsa's head coach, he was included as one of the Thunder's assistant coaches at the 2014 NBA All-Star Game in New Orleans.

A native of Serbia, Rajaković served as an assistant coach for Serbia's national team at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China. Serbia finished fifth at the event, including a win over the United States in the classification round. His international coaching career also includes three seasons (2009-12) as head coach of Espacio Torrelodones in Spain, where he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid in his first season.

Rajaković began his coaching career at 16 years old with the Borac Čačak Youth Team in his hometown of Čačak, Serbia. After three seasons (1996-99) with Borac Čačak, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade and led Red Star to two Serbian championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007). Rajaković received a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

DAVID McCLURE

Assistant Coach

David McClure completes his second season with the Memphis Grizzlies as an assistant coach under head coach Taylor Jenkins.

McClure joins the Grizzlies after spending three seasons (2016-19) under head coach Nate McMillan as an assistant coach leading the player development department for the Indiana Pacers, where he was a part of three straight playoff appearances in 2017, 2018 and 2019. He spent two previous seasons (2014-16) as a player development quality assurance assistant for the San Antonio Spurs, where he worked with Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich.

A graduate of Duke University, the Connecticut native played five years (2004-09) for head coach Mike Krzyzewski and was a member of the Blue Devils' ACC title teams in 2005, 2006 and 2009.

After leaving Duke, McClure played the 2009-10 season with the NBA G League's Austin Toros (now Spurs) and was coached by Jenkins, who was an assistant in Austin under current Utah Jazz head coach Quin Snyder. He also played professionally for four years (2010-14) in the Lithuanian Basketball League.

JAMES “SCOONIE” PENN

Assistant Coach

James “Scoonie” Penn finishes his second season with the Memphis Grizzlies as an assistant coach for head coach Taylor Jenkins following two seasons (2017-19) as director of player development at his alma mater of The Ohio State University.

Penn originally attended Boston College where he was named the 1995-96 Big East Rookie of the Year selected to the 1996-97 All-Big East First Team. He then transferred to Ohio State, where he was named the 1998-99 Big Ten Player of the Year and led the Buckeyes to the 1999 NCAA Final Four.

A two-time All-American and All-Big Ten selection while at Ohio State, Penn scored 1,076 points for the Buckeyes, and his 123 points scored in NCAA Tournament play rank seventh in program history.

Voted into The Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2013, the Massachusetts native was drafted by the Atlanta Hawks in the second round of the 2000 NBA Draft and enjoyed an 11-year professional career in Europe.

SONIA RAMAN

Assistant Coach

Sonia Raman completes her first season with the Memphis Grizzlies as an assistant coach under head coach Taylor Jenkins.

Raman comes to Memphis following 12 seasons (2008-20) as the head women’s basketball coach at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), where she led the Engineers to the program’s first two New England Women’s and Men’s Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) championships (2018, 2019) and the 2020 championship game. MIT enjoyed unprecedented success under Raman, whose tenure produced two NCAA Tournament berths and a 91-45 record (.669) over her final five seasons.

In September 2017, Raman was selected to serve a two-year term on the Coaches Council for the Alliance of Women Coaches, dedicated to leading the field of women coaches at all levels by providing support, resources, events and programs which address the needs and interests of its members.

Prior to her arrival in Cambridge, Raman served six seasons (2002-08) as the top assistant coach at Wellesley College, where she scouted opponents, assisted with practice and game planning, managed individual player skill and leadership development and served as the Blue’s primary recruiter.

Raman began her intercollegiate coaching career with a two-year stint as an assistant coach at her alma mater, Tufts University. A four-year player and a captain for the Jumbos, she graduated in 1996 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in International Relations. Raman went on to receive a Juris Doctor from Boston College Law School in 2001.

VITALY POTAPENKO

Assistant Coach

Vitaly Potapenko finishes his third season with the Memphis Grizzlies as an assistant coach and his second with head coach Taylor Jenkins.

Before joining the Grizzlies prior to the 2018-19 season, Potapenko served five seasons (2013-18) as the assistant director of player development for the Cleveland Cavaliers. Prior to his time in Cleveland, Potapenko spent one season (2012-13) as an assistant coach with the NBA G League’s Santa Cruz Warriors, helping guide the team to its first G League Finals appearance. He also was as an assistant coach for the Dakota Wizards during the 2011-12 season before the franchise relocated to Santa Cruz.

Potapenko served an assistant coach for the Indiana Pacers during the 2010-11 season after serving as an assistant coach for the G League’s Fort Wayne Mad Ants in 2009-10.

Selected by Cleveland with the 12th overall pick in the 1996 NBA Draft, Potapenko appeared in 610 games (189 starts) with four teams and averaged 6.5 points and 4.5 rebounds in 19.0 minutes over 11 seasons (1996-2007).

Before playing in the NBA, Potapenko played for Budivelnik (Ukraine) from 1992-1994 and finished his career playing for MMT Estudiantes in the Spanish ACB during the 2007-2008 season. Nicknamed “The Ukraine Train,” the Kiev native played two seasons collegiately at Wright State University where he was named All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference.

GRIZZLIES 2020-21 GAME NOTES

NXT UP: The Grizzlies are back in the NBA Playoffs for the first time since 2017 as the No. 8 seed against the No. 1 seed Utah Jazz... Memphis has been the eighth seed twice before, winning once.

TABLES TURNED: **Ja Morant** came up big with 35 points (including 15 in the fourth quarter and overtime), six rebounds, six assists and four steals in the May 21 play-in final against the Golden State Warriors (*ESPN*).

SECOND HALF SCHEDULE: The Grizzlies face a packed schedule during the Second Half of the regular season.

* 20 of Memphis' final 32 regular season games will be played on the road.

** Memphis' final 11 regular season games are being played over a 17-day span..

POINTS PER GAME BREAKDOWN: Despite ranking in the middle of the league in overall scoring average, the Grizzlies appeared at or near the top of the leaderboard in virtually every scoring sub-category.

APRIL OFFENSE: Memphis posted the second-highest scoring average for a calendar month in franchise history in April... The only other time the Grizzlies have ever scored even 115 points per game in a single month was when they averaged 119.0 points in January 2020.

JONAS PER: **Jonas Valančiūnas** recorded the highest single-season PER in franchise history this season... Valančiūnas is the Grizzlies' all-time leader in the category (23.4).

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE, PART 1: **Jonas Valančiūnas** ranked tied for third in the NBA in double-doubles this season.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE, PART 2: **Jonas Valančiūnas** set a new career high for double-doubles in a season and ranked third in franchise history for single-season double-doubles.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE, PART 3: Had the season been longer, **Jonas Valančiūnas** may have had a chance at setting the franchise record for double-doubles... His double-double rate (.790) was the highest in a single season in Grizzlies history.

JV AND Z-BO: **Jonas Valančiūnas** posted a career-high tying 34 points and a season-high 22 rebounds, including a career-best 12 offensive rebounds, on April 11 vs. Indiana... Valančiūnas joined **Zach Randolph** as the only players in franchise history with multiple 30-20 performances.

Valančiūnas is also tied with Randolph for the most 25-point, 20-rebound games in franchise history (4).

OPENING ACT: **Ja Morant** scored 44 points (18-27 FG) in Memphis' regular season opener on Dec. 23 vs. San Antonio, finishing one point shy of **Mike Miller's** franchise record for points in a game (45 on Feb. 21, 2007 at Golden State)... Morant also tied **Bryant Reeves'** single-game franchise record for field goals made (18 on April 19, 1997), and his 34 points in the second half tied **Jaren Jackson Jr.'s** club record for points in any half (34 on Dec. 13, 2019).

Perhaps most impressive, Morant (21 years, 135 days) became the youngest player in NBA history to score 40 points in a team's regular season opener (*see table*)... His 44 points are the second-most in NBA history by a player in the first game of his second season (**Elgin Baylor**, 52 on Oct. 18, 1959).
