Named to the NBA All-Rookie Second Team. Oklahoma City went 11-9 during his 20 starts. On Jan. 29, named to the BBVA Compass Rising Stars Challenge as part of All-Star Weekend. Registered a blocked shot in 37 games. Recorded first career double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds at Detroit (11/8). Made first career start at LA Clippers (11/13). Scored in double figures three times. Set a career-high with four blocks vs. Memphis (2/3). Set a career-high with six steals at Dallas (3/24). One DNP-CD.

PLAYOFFS

During the 2014 postseason, appeared in 18 games and averaged 3.9 points, 4.1 rebounds and 1.3 blocks in 18.4 minutes. Recorded 10 points (5 of 7 shooting) and 11 rebounds in a career-best 40 minutes during a series-clinching win at the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 6 of the Western Conference Semifinals.

COLLEGE

2012-13 (Freshman): Named to the Big East All-Rookie Team as a freshman. Named Big East Preseason Rookie of the Year. Started in all 32 of his career games played. Ranks first all-time at Pitt in field goal percentage (.571), second in blocked shots (63), and sixth in rebounds for freshman seasons (192). Ranked first on team in rebounds (6.3 rpg) and blocks (2.0 bpg). Ranked fifth on team in scoring with 7.2 points per game. Scored in double figures on six occasions. Scored a career-high 16 points along with 10 rebounds against Bethune Cookman. Grabbed a season-high 14 rebounds along with eight points against Duquesne. Scored 13 points along with 11 rebounds in an NCAA Tournament game against



Wichita State. Blocked a career-high five shots against South Florida.

PERSONAL

First lottery pick and first-round pick to come out of New Zealand in NBA Draft history. One of 18 siblings, six of whom played basketball for New Zealand. All of his brothers stand around 6-10 to 6-11 and his sisters 6-5 to 6-6. His half-sister is a 2008 Olympic champion and three-time world champion in the shot put.

Recorded five straight double-doubles for the first time in his career (1/8 vs. Memphis – 1/19 at Denver). Received the NBA's Player of the Week honors for the West Conference on five separate occasions. Scored 38 points including all 13 of OKC's triple overtime points to go along with a career-high 15 rebounds during OKC 3OT win at New Jersey on 12/1. Became the sixth player and just the second guard (Vince Carter) in the last 20 years to record 35+ points, 15+ rebounds and 9+ rebounds in a single game. Netted a career-high 43 points (13-14 FGs; 17-18 FTs) during OT win at Indiana (11/26). **2009-10:** One of four players to start all 82 games for Oklahoma City. Recorded 24 double-doubles on the season. Set a career-high with 16 assists 4/4 vs. Minnesota. Thunder went 23-5 when Westbrook recorded 10+ assists. Posted team-high assists totals in 67-of-82 games. Tallied 20+ points 24 times and 30+ points 4 times. Posted second career triple-double at Minnesota (2/21). In 38 minutes, tallied 22 points, 10 rebounds and 14 assists. Came one rebound shy of triple-double and finished with 31 points and 10 assists for his 12th double-double of the season at NY (2/20). Participated in T-Mobile Rookie-Sophomore Challenge and Youth Jam at All-Star Weekend in Dallas and led all scorers with 40 points on 18-29 FGs. Named NBA player of the week for contests played between February 1-7. During the seven day span Westbrook helped lead Oklahoma City to a 3-0 week, including two wins on the road (Golden State & New Orleans) while averaging 19.7 points, 9.7 assists, 8.0 rebounds and 3.3 steals. Posted double-figure assist totals in four straight games (12/28 – 1/4) and becomes first OKC player to accomplished the feat since Gary Payton did so in January of 2002 (1/3/02 – 1/10/02). Recorded 8th double-double of the season on 1/2 at Milwaukee with 17 points and 13 assists. With zero turnovers vs. the Bucks

he recorded the most assists (13) without a turnover (in franchise history) since April 8, 2001 (Gary Payton; 15 assists, 0 TO's). On 12/26 vs. Charlotte, tallied 22 points and game-high six assists while committing zero turnovers in 35 min. Notched 4th double-double in OKC win at San Antonio (19 pts/11 ast) on 11/14. With his 11 assists and zero turnovers, matched NBA season-high for most assists without a TO (Andre Miller). Recorded a then career-high with 13 assists during season opener 10/28 vs. Sacramento. With his 13 assists, he matched the entire assist total for the entire Kings' team. Recorded back-to-back double-doubles (pts/ast) in first two games of season. On 11/6 at Houston, set career-high with 14 made field goals and finished with a game-high 33 points. On 11/8 vs. ORL, recorded third double-double of the season (17 points, 10 assists) and matched career-high with three made 3-point FG's. **2008-09:** Named to NBA's All-Rookie First Team. Ranked among rookie league-leaders in a number of statistical categories including scoring (4th, 15.3), assists (2nd, 5.3) steals (2nd, 1.36), minutes played (4th, 32.5), rebounds (7th, 4.9) and field-goal percentage (10th, .398). 10 or more points 71 times. 20-plus points 18 times. 30-plus points six times. 10 or more rebounds four times. 10 or more assists nine times. Ten double-doubles. One triple-double. Five-plus steals three times. Scored 10+ points in 25 consecutive games (1/16 vs. Detroit through 3/14 at PHX). Recorded first triple-double in Thunder franchise history with 17 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists vs. Dallas (3/2). Career-high 12 assists at Minnesota 1/7. Career-high 34 points including career-high 20 free throw makes (20-22 FT) at Sacramento (2/1). The 20 free throw makes represent the most a Kings' opponent since they moved to Sacramento. Was named NBA T-Mobile Rookie of the Month in December and February.

Appeared in 64 games (64 starts) and averaged 24.1 points, 6.0 rebounds, 6.7 assists and 1.8 steals in 37.8 minutes. **2014:** During the 2014 postseason, appeared in 19 games (19 starts) and averaged 26.7 points, 7.3 rebounds, 8.1 assists and 2.2 steals in 38.7 minutes. Recorded three triple-doubles (only player in 2014 playoffs to record a single triple-double), eight double-doubles, 16 games of 20+ points and six games of 30+ points. Dished out a franchise postseason-record 16 assists vs. Memphis on May 3. **2013:** Underwent successful surgery on Apr. 27 to repair a lateral meniscus tear which was suffered in Game 2 vs. Houston in the opening round. Appeared in two games (two starts) during 2013 playoffs and averaged 24.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 7.0 assists and 3.0 steals in 34.0 minutes. Recorded one double-double with 19 points to go along with 10 assists and eight rebounds during Game 1 vs. HOU. Nine DNP - lateral meniscus tear. **2012:** Posted a playoff career-high with 43 points on 20-of-32 shooting during Game 4 of the Finals at Miami. During the Thunder's second round series vs. the L.A. Lakers, Westbrook played a total of 178 minutes and committed a total of four turnovers. Recorded a 2012 playoff-high 12 assists during Game 5 win at San Antonio in the Western Conference Finals. Scored 20+ points 11

times during the 2012 playoffs. **2011:** Recorded a triple-double in Game 7 of the second round vs. Memphis with 14 points, 14 assists (playoff career-high) and 10 rebounds (playoff career-high) in 35 minutes. Westbrook becomes the fifth player in NBA history to register a triple-double in a playoff Game 7 (Scottie Pippen, James Worthy, Larry Bird and Jerry West). Scored a playoff career-high 40 points during Game 4 - triple overtime victory over Memphis. Scored 20+ points 11 times while scoring 30+ on five occasions.

ALL-STAR

Named to third Western Conference All-Star team in 2013. In his three All-Star appearances, averaged 15.7 points, 4.7 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.0 steals in 20.0 minutes.

USA BASKETBALL



In London, Westbrook appeared in all eight games and posted averages of 8.5 points, 1.6 assists and 1.6 rebounds. In 2010, helped lead the USA Men's National Team to a gold medal during the 2010 FIBA World Championships played in Turkey. Westbrook received player of the game honors during the US win over Lithuania and proved to be integral part of the United States perfect 9-0 mark at the World Championships. He appeared in all nine games and averaged 9.1 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists per contest.

Named Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year as a sophomore. Earned Third Team All-Pac-10 honors and was named to the conference All-Defensive Team. **2007-08 (Sophomore):** Averaged 12.7 ppg, a team-leading 4.3 apg, 3.9 rpg and 1.6 spg. Played 1,318 minutes, the most by a Bruin since 1979 (when minutes began being tracked as a statistic). Led team with a career-high 22 points vs. Memphis in the Final Four on 4/5. Posted first career double-double with 14 points and a career-high-tying 11 rebounds vs. Western Kentucky in the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament on 3/27. Tallied 16 points, four rebounds, five assists and a career-high five steals vs. Oregon on 2/23. Dished out a career-high nine assists vs. Youngstown State on 11/12. SAM PRESTI
EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT &
GENERAL MANAGER



Sam Presti enters his eighth season with the Oklahoma City Thunder after being named the 11th General Manager in club history on June 7, 2007. A year into his tenure with the Thunder, Presti was promoted to Executive Vice President and General Manager by Professional Basketball Club Chairman, Clayton Bennett.

During his seven-plus seasons with the Thunder, Presti has worked diligently to assemble the building blocks for long term success both on and off the court. This past season, Presti and his staff oversaw a fourth straight Northwest Division Championship as the Thunder finished the year with the second best record in the NBA. The Thunder's four straight division titles are tied for the longest such current streak in the NBA and over the last 25 seasons only two teams have ever gone onto capture more than four consecutive division titles.

After finishing the 2013-14 regular season with a record of 59-23, the Thunder became one of just two teams (San Antonio) to register a winning percentage of .610 (equivalent to 50 wins) in each of the last five seasons.

Presti's consistent focus has been to utilize the NBA Draft to establish the foundation for sustained success on the floor and in the community. Commencing with the 2007 draft, Presti selected Kevin Durant, the University of Texas standout with the team's No. 2 overall pick. This past season, Durant was named the NBA's Most Valuable Player after leading the NBA in scoring for a fourth time in the past five seasons.

Other significant draft selections for Presti include taking Russell Westbrook and Serge Ibaka with the 4th and 24th selections, respectively in the 2008 draft. Westbrook has since become a three-time All-Star, and Serge Ibaka became just the second player in NBA history to lead the NBA in blocks for four consecutive seasons (2010-2014). Most recently, Steven Adams was named to the All-Rookie Second Team after being selected by the Thunder with the 12th overall pick in the 2013 NBA Draft.

After moving to Oklahoma City in July of 2008, Presti has stressed the importance of community involvement for both Thunder players and staff. Under his leadership, Thunder players have made nearly 1,500 community appearances in and around Oklahoma City. Presti has also made it policy for every new player and staff member to tour the Oklahoma City Memorial and Museum soon after joining the organization.

Under Presti's guidance, the Thunder has advanced to postseason play in each of the last five seasons. At the end of the 2012-13 season, Oklahoma City became just the second team in NBA history (Boston Celtics; 1955-1960) to increase its winning percentage for five consecutive seasons (while maintaining a winning percentage of .700 or better in two of those seasons). Dating back to the 2011-12 season, the Thunder became Western Conference Champions on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which the Thunder became the youngest team in the prior quarter century to reach the NBA's Western Conference Finals.

During the 2009-10 season, Presti's third year at the helm, Oklahoma City experienced one of the largest turnarounds in NBA history. A year after winning 23 games, the Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season with a 50-32 record (.610) and captured the franchise's first playoff berth in Oklahoma City. The 27-win improvement was tied for the eighth largest improvement in NBA history. Presti was named NBA Executive of the Year by The Sporting News at the conclusion of the season.

Presti has been on the NBA's Instant Replay Committee since 2009 and has served on the league's Competition Committee dating back to the 2011-12 season.

Prior to joining the Thunder, the 37-year-old Presti held a variety of roles with the San Antonio Spurs. After starting in 2000 as a video intern for Gregg Popovich, Presti moved up through the front office ranks in San Antonio before being elevated to the position of Vice President and Assistant General Manager. As a member of the Spurs, Presti was part of NBA Championship teams in 2003, 2005 and 2007, as well as five division titles.

Presti earned his bachelor's degree in 2000 in communications, politics and law and a minor in psychology from Emerson College in Boston, where he was the first Rhodes Scholar nominee in school history. The Concord, Mass. native served as team captain of the Emerson College basketball team during both his junior and senior seasons. In addition, Presti earned All-Academic honors two times and was twice selected to the Great Northeast Athletic Conference All-Tournament team. He was honored with the Emerson College Young Alumnus Award in 2005. Presti also completed Harvard University's Continuing Education program on leadership and decision making this past offseason.

Presti currently resides on the board of the Oklahoma City National Memorial and with the support of the Thunder has established the Forward Thinking Leadership Development Program within the Oklahoma City public schools. Presti was recognized as Oklahoma City University's 2012-13 recipient of the Abe Lemons/Paul Hansen Award for Sports Excellence and also won the Oklahoma March of Dimes Sports Headliner Special Award for 2013.

Additionally, Presti is actively involved with PeacePlayers International (PPI), a global outreach program focused on bringing children and communities together through the game of basketball. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Shooting Touch, an organization that grants graduating college seniors the opportunity to travel the world and use the platform of basketball to help foster education and influence positive social change in third world global communities.

An accomplished drummer, Presti has produced three music CDs with all proceeds benefiting the Extra Ordinary Needs Fund at Children's Hospital in Boston. Also, Presti established the Keenan Smith-Anthony Halls Scholarship Fund at his former high school, Concord-Carlisle, to assist students with their college tuition.

Presti's wife, Shannon, serves as the Director of Teen Leadership Initiatives for the YMCA of Greater Oklahoma City.

TROY WEAVER

VICE PRESIDENT/ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Troy Weaver begins his seventh season with Oklahoma City and his fifth as the team's Vice President/Assistant General Manager. Weaver joined the Thunder in May of 2008 and assists General Manager Sam Presti with roster development and day-to-day basketball operations. In addition, he coordinates the team's player personnel matters including NBA Draft preparation, player free agency and summer league roster.

Weaver held the position of director of player personnel for the Utah Jazz in 2007-08. He spent three seasons (2004-07) as head scout for the Jazz before his promotion to director of player personnel.

Prior to joining the Jazz, Weaver was an assistant coach at Syracuse University for four seasons (2000-04). The Orangemen won the 2003 NCAA National Championship led by Weaver recruit Carmelo Anthony. In addition to his experience at Syracuse, Weaver spent time as an assistant coach at New Mexico (1999-2000) and Pittsburgh (1996-99).

Prior to his collegiate coaching days, Weaver amassed an 85-17 record as an AAU coach in Washington, D.C. He guided the DC Assault to the 1996 AAU Tournament of Champions.

Weaver graduated with an associate's degree from Prince George's Community College (MD) in 1991, where he also played one season of basketball.



MICHAEL WINGER

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER & TEAM COUNSEL

The 2014-15 season is Michael Winger's fifth in Oklahoma City. Winger assists Executive Vice President & General Manager Sam Presti on all facets of roster planning, player acquisition, salary cap and strategic management. Winger is chiefly responsible for operational and player acquisition process development, progressive salary cap strategy implementation, tactical CBA application and maneuverability, contract and trade negotiation and preparation, legal and administrative processes and execution.

Prior to joining the Thunder, Winger spent five seasons (2005-06 through 2009-10) in the front office with the Cleveland Cavaliers, earning several promotions during his tenure. Winger began his career in Cleveland as its Basketball Operations Coordinator. Winger was promoted to Basketball Operations Manager / Team Counsel, and shortly thereafter to the Cavaliers' Director of Basketball Operations & Team Counsel. Winger's role in Cleveland was extensive, and included instituting organizational processes and working closely with Cavaliers' management and ownership on all team matters. He joined the Cavaliers in July of 2005 after spending two years working for renowned sports agent and attorney, Ron Shapiro in Baltimore, Maryland.

Originally from Cleveland, Ohio, Winger is a graduate of Miami University (OH) and holds a law degree, having attended both The University of Toledo College of Law and the University of Maryland School of Law.



SCOTT BROOKS
HEAD COACH



Scott Brooks enters his seventh season as head coach of the Thunder a year after leading Oklahoma City to a fourth consecutive Northwest Division title and a spot in the Western Conference Finals for the third time in the past four seasons.

During the 2013-14 season, the Thunder finished with the second best record in the NBA and Oklahoma City is currently one of just two teams (San Antonio) to record a .610 or better winning percentage (equivalent to 50 wins) in each of the last five seasons.

Dating back to the start of the 2009-10 season, Brooks is the third-most winningest active coach in the NBA, as the Thunder has claimed 271 victories during this span. After defeating the Atlanta Hawks this past season on December 10, Brooks claimed his 250th career head coaching victory.

After posting the top record in the Western Conference through the first half of last season, Brooks represented the Thunder by coaching the 2014 Western Conference All-Stars in New Orleans. The All-Star coaching honor marked the second of Brooks' career (Brooks and his staff also coached the 2012 All-Star Game in Orlando).

Oklahoma City has qualified for the postseason in each of the last five seasons and since taking over as Thunder head coach on November 22, 2008, Oklahoma City has registered a mark of 293-170 (.632).

During the 2012-13 season, the Thunder claimed the top spot in the Western Conference after finishing with a record of 60-22. On the year, Oklahoma City posted the largest point differential in the NBA in more than five seasons (9.2 points per game). In fact, Oklahoma City won 44 games by double figures, including 19 games of 20 or more (both tops in the NBA). The Thunder finished the season as the third highest scoring team in the NBA (105.7 points per game) while holding the opposition to the second worst field goal shooting percentage (42.5%).

At the end of the 2012-13 season, the Thunder became just the second team in NBA history to increase its winning percentage for five consecutive seasons (while maintaining a winning percentage of .700 or better in two seasons).

During the 2011-12 season, Brooks guided the Thunder to the NBA Finals after finishing the regular season with a record of 47-19.

In 2010-11 Brooks led the Thunder to 55 wins and a spot in the Western Conference Finals after Oklahoma City captured playoff series victories over the Denver Nuggets and Memphis Grizzlies. After the late-season acquisition of Kendrick Perkins from the Boston Celtics in mid-March, Brooks guided the Thunder to a 13-4 mark in the final 17 games of the regular season.

Brooks, the 16th head coach in franchise history received the 2009-10 Red Auerbach NBA Coach of the Year award after his second season as head coach. During his first full year at the helm of the Thunder, Brooks oversaw one of the biggest turnarounds in NBA history. A year after winning 23 games, the Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season with a record of 50-32 (.610). The 27-win improvement was tied for the eighth largest in NBA history.

In the 2010 postseason, the eighth-seeded Thunder took the eventual NBA Champion Los Angeles Lakers to a Game 6 in what proved to be one of the more entertaining first round playoff series in recent memory.

Brooks was named interim head coach of the Thunder 13 games into the 2008-09 season and was later named head coach on April 15, 2009 prior to the team's final game of the season. A day after being awarded his first NBA head coaching position, Brooks led the Thunder to their most lopsided victory of the year in the team's season finale, a 126-85 win versus the Los Angeles Clippers at STAPLES Center.

Prior to his appointment as interim head coach on November 22, 2008 Brooks joined P.J. Carlesimo and the Thunder coaching staff at the start of the 2007-08 season.

Before joining the Thunder organization, Brooks spent the 2006-07 season working as an assistant coach with the Sacramento Kings. His NBA coaching career began with the Denver Nuggets, where he served as an assistant coach from 2003-06. Brooks helped lead the Nuggets to the playoffs in each of his three seasons with the club.

Brooks enjoyed an 11-year (1988-99) playing career in the NBA, appearing in 680 regular season games with Philadelphia, Minnesota, Houston, Dallas, New York, Cleveland and the Los Angeles Clippers. Brooks' teams advanced to the postseason six of his 11 NBA seasons, and in 1994, he was a member of the NBA Champion Houston Rockets. Brooks holds career averages of 4.9 points and 2.4 assists per game.

In 2000, Brooks was a player/assistant coach with the Los Angeles Stars of the ABA. The following season, he served as the head coach of the Southern California Surf of the ABA, guiding the club to a 23-14 record. A native of Lathrop, California, Brooks began his collegiate career at Texas Christian University, where he played one season. He then transferred to San Joaquin Delta College for his sophomore season, before spending his final two years at UC Irvine, where he averaged 23.8 points per game as a senior.

REX KALAMIAN ASSISTANT COACH

With two decades of NBA experience on his side, Rex Kalamian is set to begin his sixth season with the Thunder and his second as Scott Brooks' lead assistant. Prior to arriving in Oklahoma City, Kalamian had previous coaching tenures with the Sacramento Kings, Minnesota Timberwolves, Denver Nuggets, Philadelphia 76ers and the Los Angeles Clippers.

During July of 2013, Kalamian served as head coach of the Thunder's summer league team in Orlando where he guided the squad to a perfect 5-0 record en route to becoming Summer League Champions.

As an assistant with the Thunder, Kalamian is chiefly responsible for game preparation and player development.

Prior to joining the Thunder's bench, Kalamian spent two years as an assistant coach with the Sacramento Kings after a two year stint with the Minnesota Timberwolves. Before his time in Minnesota, Kalamian spent one season with the Denver Nuggets where he worked as an assistant coach/player development. Kalamian served previously as a West Coast scout for the Philadelphia 76ers during the 2003-04 season before assuming his coaching duties in Denver.

Kalamian's NBA career began with the Los Angeles Clippers where he spent nine years serving the organization in various capacities. After starting as an assistant to the scouting department in 1992, Kalamian was later promoted to assistant coach by Bill Fitch in 1995.

Prior to joining the Clippers, Kalamian worked as an assistant coach for his former school, East Los Angeles College for two seasons. While in college, Kalamian was named team captain at East Los Angeles where he led the South Coast Conference in three point shooting accuracy during the 1988-89 season.

A graduate of Cal Poly Pomona, Kalamian earned a bachelor's degree in business management.



ROBERT PACK ASSISTANT COACH

Robert Pack enters his second season on the Thunder's bench after previously serving as an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Clippers for each of the three prior seasons.

Pack's NBA coaching experience dates back to 2009 when he served as an assistant coach with the New Orleans Hornets.

After going undrafted out of the University of Southern California, Pack enjoyed a 13-year NBA playing career in which he averaged 8.9 points, 4.6 assists and 2.0 rebounds in 552 career games with the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Washington Wizards, New Jersey Nets, Dallas Mavericks, Minnesota Timberwolves and the New Orleans Hornets.

Nicknamed "Pac-Man", Pack was a member of the 1991-92 Portland team that advanced to the NBA Finals and was a member of the 1993-94 Denver Nuggets' squad that made NBA history as the first No. 8 seed to defeat a No. 1 seed in the first round of the NBA Playoffs.

Pack was the runner-up in the 1994 NBA All-Star Slam Dunk Contest in Minneapolis. Upon the conclusion of his NBA playing career, Pack played overseas in Lithuania and Spain from 2004-2006 before pursuing a career in coaching.

A one-time college standout at USC, Pack finished his college career ranking fourth on the Trojans all-time assists list (319) in just two seasons, while becoming the fourth player in school history to record back-to-back 100 assist seasons. In two years at Southern California, he averaged 13.4 points and 5.6 assists per game.

MARK BRYANT ASSISTANT COACH

Mark Bryant enters his eighth season as a Thunder assistant coach in 2014-15. During July of 2012, Bryant served as Head Coach of the Thunder's summer league team.

Prior to joining the Thunder's coaching staff, Bryant served as assistant coach/player development with the Orlando Magic from 2005-07.

Before his time in Orlando, Bryant spent the 2004-05 season with the Dallas Mavericks as a member of its player development staff.

Bryant enjoyed a 15-year playing career as the New Jersey native was a member of 10 different teams during his NBA playing tenure (1988-2003). Originally selected by Portland in the first round (21st pick overall) of the 1988 NBA Draft, Bryant helped the Blazers reach the NBA Finals in 1990 and 1992. He appeared in 797 regular season games during his NBA career with Portland, Houston, Phoenix, Chicago, Cleveland, Dallas, San Antonio, Philadelphia, Denver and Boston, averaging 5.4 ppg and 3.8 rpg in 16.9 mpg. Bryant also appeared in 79 career playoff games, averaging 3.5 ppg and 2.5 rpg in 12.2 mpg.

Bryant was a First Team All-Big East selection as a senior at Seton Hall in 1987-88, averaging 20.5 ppg and 9.1 rpg for the Pirates. The 6-9 forward led the school to its first-ever berth into the NCAA Tournament.



MIKE TERPSTRA ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Terpstra is set to begin his second season as an assistant coach with the Thunder. Terpstra brings over 20 years of experience to Oklahoma City after working in various capacities at the college, junior college and high school levels, with additional experience in the NBA Development League and the CBA.

Terpstra's experience in the CBA came as an assistant coach/director of player development under former NBA veteran Joe Wolf with the Idaho Stampede during the 2005-06 season. The following season, Terpstra worked on a part-time basis with the coaching staff of the Colorado 14ers who would go on to win the Western Division championship before falling to the Dakota Wizards in the D-League championship.

Prior to his time with the Stampede and 14ers, Terpstra served as head coach at his alma mater, Northwest Nazarene University, in Nampa, Idaho during the 2004-05 season. While there, Terpstra accumulated a 17-10 record, which was the best record in school history at the Division II level. Terpstra also served as the head coach of California State Stanislaus from 2000-03, where he led the Warriors to a 41-39 record over his three year stint in Turlock. During a three-year stint as the head coach of Modesto Junior College from 1997-00, Terpstra compiled a 60-36 record, including a school record 27 wins during the 1999-00 season.

Before earning his Masters Degree in Sports Science from the University of Pacific in May 1996, Terpstra was responsible for the development of the team's big men as an assistant coach for the Tigers men's basketball program from 1994-95. Terpstra started his coaching career with Ripon Christian High School, where he won three California state championships, two as a head coach (1992, 1994) and one as an assistant (1988).

Following his college playing career at Northwest Nazarene where he was team MVP in his junior and senior seasons, Terpstra played professionally in Turkey and England.



DARKO RAJAKOVIC ASSISTANT COACH

Darko Rajakovic (RYE-ahk-oe-vich) enters his third season with the Oklahoma City Thunder organization and first as assistant coach. A Serbian native, Rajakovic spent the past two seasons as head coach of the Tulsa 66ers and was the first head coach born outside of North America in NBA D-League history. The 35-year-old boasts a diverse coaching background with an emphasis in player development.

Rajakovic holds a career NBA D-League record of 51-49. During his two seasons with the 66ers, Tulsa has been assigned seven players from Oklahoma City a total of 50 times (the most in the league during that stretch).

Rajakovic has also seen five of his 66ers players receive NBA GATORADE Call-Ups to the NBA, including four to the Thunder (Grant Jerrett, Daniel Orton, Mustafa Shakur and Reggie Williams). He coached 11 Tulsa players over the past two years who were on an NBA roster in the 2013-14 season.

Prior to joining the 66ers, Rajakovic had spent the previous three years as the head coach of Espacio Torrelodones of the Spanish EBA League.

Rajakovic began his coaching career at 16 years old with BC Borac Cacak in Cacak, Serbia where he coached the club to two national tournaments.

Rajakovic received a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

ADAM HARRINGTON SHOOTING COACH

The 2014-15 season marks Harrington's first season with the Oklahoma City Thunder. In his role as shooting coach, Harrington will assist the Thunder coaching and player development staffs.

Harrington joins the Thunder after spending the last several years building Aspire Basketball Training, a curriculum based company specializing in individual shooting technique and physical balance.

Harrington has enjoyed a diverse basketball background. He played his first collegiate season at North Carolina State University before transferring and playing his next two seasons at Auburn University. After his junior season at Auburn, Harrington began his professional playing career. Harrington spent one season in the NBA (2002-03) playing for the Cavaliers, Mavericks, and Nuggets. Beginning with the 2003-04 season, Harrington spent the next seven seasons playing overseas in various professional leagues in Europe and Asia. Harrington's playing career also included a stint with the Tulsa 66ers during the 2007-2008 season.



VIN BHAVNANI

MANAGER OF ADVANCED SCOUTING/PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Vin Bhavnani enters his seventh season with Oklahoma City and his fifth as Manager of Advanced Scouting/Player Development. Bhavnani spent the previous two years serving as the team's Video Coordinator. Prior to joining the Thunder, Bhavnani spent two seasons with the San Antonio Spurs as the Assistant Video Coordinator. He started his NBA career with the Los Angeles Clippers as an intern in the video department in 2004.

Prior to joining the Clippers, Bhavnani spent one season as an assistant coach for the women's basketball team at Santa Monica Junior College. The Los Angeles, California native is a 2003 graduate of the University of Southern California.



PAUL RIVERS

DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS

Paul Rivers enters his eighth season with the Oklahoma City Thunder and his third as the team's Director of Basketball Operations. Prior to assuming his elevated position with the Thunder, Rivers spent the previous three seasons with the club serving as Director of Basketball Administration & Technology.

In his current role with the team, Rivers works closely with various facets of the front office and basketball operations while overseeing both long term and day to day initiatives for the club. Rivers also oversees all aspects of the Thunder technology program and works closely with the Thunder coaching staff and leadership team to keep the organization on the cutting edge of technological advances.

Will Dawkins begins his seventh year with the Thunder organization and his third as the team's Director of College Player Personnel. Dawkins first joined the Thunder as a front office intern in the summer of 2008 and has since served as assistant video coordinator and scouting coordinator before assuming his current position. In his current capacity, Dawkins is responsible for overseeing the college and international scouting departments in preparation for the NBA draft.

DR. DONNIE STRACK DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL SERVICES

Dr. Strack begins his seventh season in Oklahoma City as the Director of Medical Services. He is responsible for leading the medical staff in providing comprehensive, evidence-based services for Thunder players through innovation, research, and integration of multiple health care professionals.

From 2005-2008, Dr. Strack was in private practice as a physical therapist at Orthopaedic Physical Therapy Services in Wellesley Hills, Mass. Dr. Strack graduated with a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2005. He earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2002 and was awarded the Athletic Training Department Performance Award that same year.

Dr. Strack's first role with an NBA team came in the sixth grade as a ball-boy for the Indiana Pacers. He later served as a Graduate Assistant athletic trainer for the Indiana Pacers from 2002-2005. Dr. Strack also served as an athletic trainer during the 2002 World Basketball Championships in Indianapolis and the RCA Tennis Championships in 2001 and 2002.

The Oklahoma City Thunder's NBA D-League affiliate, the Oklahoma City Blue, will begin its first season in the state's capital. Originally purchased in 2008 by the Professional Basketball Club, LLC, the Thunder's D-League affiliate has played the last six seasons as the Tulsa 66ers before being relocated to Oklahoma City in 2014.

The Thunder has displayed a strong history of utilizing its D-League affiliate and developing both players and staff. Since Oklahoma City entered a single-affiliate relationship before the 2008-09 season, the Thunder has assigned a player to its affiliate 63 times - the most assignments by an NBA team during that span. Fourteen different Thunder players have been assigned in the past six seasons.

Oklahoma City has been active in "calling up" players from its D-League affiliate. The Thunder has called up a player from its affiliate on 10 occasions since 2008 - the most call-ups between affiliated teams in that stretch.

The Thunder has also utilized its D-League team to develop NBA coaches and other staff members. The past three coaches of the Thunder's D-League affiliate have received "call-ups" to the NBA coaching ranks. Darko Rajakovic (2012-14) is an assistant coach with Oklahoma City and Dale Osbourne (2011-12) and Nate Tibbets (2009-11) are both assistants with Portland.

Last season, Thunder guard Andre Roberson was assigned to the Tulsa 66ers eight times, averaging 15.9 points, 9.6 rebounds, 1.6 assists, 2.5 steals and 1.3 blocks in 31.6 minutes in 17 games (all starts). The Thunder also worked in developing non-Thunder-roster players through its affiliate, with Mustafa Shakur and Reggie Williams each receiving 10-day contracts with OKC and Grant Jerrett signing with the Thunder following the 2013-14 D-League season.

The Blue will play its inaugural season in Oklahoma City at the Cox Convention Center.

MARK DAIGNEAULT

HEAD COACH

Mark Daigneault (DAYG-nalt) is in his first season as head coach of the Oklahoma City Blue. Daigneault comes to Oklahoma City after spending the past four years working under Billy Donovan at the University of Florida, where he most recently held the position of assistant to the head coach.

Throughout his tenure at Florida, the Gators compiled a record of 120-30 (.800), won three SEC titles and advanced to the Elite Eight each year. In his final season with UF (2013-14), the Gators became the first SEC team to go 18-0 in conference play and went on to win the SEC Championship and advance to the Final Four.

Prior to his time at Florida, Daigneault spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Holy Cross. During Daigneault's tenure, the Crusaders went 21-21 (.500) in conference play and finished as runner-up of the Patriot League Championship in 2008-09.

A 2007 graduate of the University of Connecticut, Daigneault served as a student manager with the Huskies under Jim Calhoun from 2003-07. While at UCONN, the Huskies won the 2004 NCAA Championship and claimed three Big East titles, posting a combined record of 103-32 (.763).

A native of Leominster, Mass., Daigneault holds a master's degree in sports management from the University of Florida.



BRANDON BARNETT

DIRECTOR OF MINOR LEAGUE OPERATIONS/PRO SCOUT

Brandon Barnett begins his seventh season with the Thunder organization. Barnett oversees the D-League operations for the Blue, including scouting talent, player contracts and working to execute the Thunder system at the D-League level. In 2012, Barnett was also named a pro scout by Oklahoma City, scouting NBA games for the Thunder basketball operations staff in addition to his duties with the Blue.

Barnett joined the organization after working for the NBA League office in New York City for the previous five years. With many sightings, the legend grew through the years, of a mighty bison, with remarkable powers, roaming the hills alone.



While it is managed by SMG, Chesapeake Energy Arena is owned by the City of Oklahoma City and was the premier project of its visionary capital improvement program (MAPS) to finance new and upgraded sports, entertainment, cultural and convention facilities with a one-cent sales tax.

IMPROVEMENTS

Oklahoma City voters overwhelmingly approved a one-cent sales tax in 2008 to fund major upgrades to Chesapeake Energy Arena. A series of renovations to the facility were completed in 2013. Upgrades include new state-of-the-art digital signage, a grand entrance, renovated concourses, new concession and restaurant options, team offices and a kids zone.







NBA PLAYOFF STRUCTURE/ATTENDANCE





BRIAN DAVIS

THUNDER PLAY-BY-PLAY

Brian Davis is entering his seventh season as the television voice for the Oklahoma City Thunder. He serves as part of a Thunder broadcasting team on FOX Sports Oklahoma that has been awarded three regional Heartland Emmy Awards since 2008.

A veteran basketball broadcaster, Davis returned to the NBA in 2004 as host of Seattle Sonics broadcasts. He regularly covered the Chicago Bulls during the Michael Jordan era and became a contributor to NBA Radio, hosting game broadcasts and serving as sideline reporter for the network during the Playoffs, including the NBA Finals. He later hosted Bulls broadcasts on FSN Chicago and occasionally called Sonics games in Seattle. He has an extensive play-by-play resume at the college level, including the Big Ten, Pac-10, Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference.

Davis has called games at the professional level in three other sports: football, as radio voice of the Seattle Seahawks; hockey, in a reserve role with Chicago Blackhawks; and soccer, with Major League Soccer's Chicago Fire. He has also worked as a preseason play-by-play announcer for the NFL's Arizona Cardinals.

As a sports anchor for CBS Radio and its Chicago all-news affiliate, Davis covered major events including the Olympics, NBA Finals and Stanley Cup Finals. His resume includes play-by-play on national college football broadcasts for Westwood One Radio. He is an accomplished interviewer and talk show host and has won several professional awards, including one for investigative journalism during his days as a news reporter in Chicago.

Davis holds a journalism degree from Northwestern University. He and his wife, Judy, have two adult children and make their home in Oklahoma City.



MICHAEL CAGE

THUNDER TELEVISION ANALYST

Michael Cage joins the Thunder broadcasting team in 2014 as its television analyst for all FOX Sports Oklahoma broadcasts.

Cage played 15 seasons from 1984-2000 as a power forward in the NBA with the Los Angeles Clippers, Seattle Supersonics, Cleveland Cavaliers, Philadelphia 76ers and New Jersey Nets. He led the NBA in rebounding in 1988, capturing the title by grabbing 30 rebounds in the final game of the regular season.

A native of West Memphis, Ark., Cage was a first-round draft pick of the Clippers in 1984 following a successful career at San Diego State University. At SDSU he was named a second-team All-American in 1984 and twice was selected as Western Athletic Conference Player of the Year. The Aztecs retired his jersey (No. 44) in 1984. He was also a member of the gold-medal winning 1983 United States team in the Pan American Games, and he is a member of both the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame and the San Diego State Hall of Fame.

Following his playing career, Cage has worked as both a broadcaster and a high school and AAU basketball coach. His broadcasting experience includes serving as TV analyst for the Memphis Grizzlies, FOX Sports West, Prime Ticket and Westwood One radio. Cage coached Mater Dei High School in Los Angeles to back-to-back state titles in 2013-14 and a national championship in 2014. He also served as a guest coach for the Cleveland Cavaliers at the 2013 NBA Summer League in Las Vegas.

Cage has a long history of giving back to the community during and after his NBA playing career. The Michael Cage Foundation works with young athletes to mentor, teach and share life lessons.



LESLEY McCASLIN

THUNDER COURTSIDE TELEVISION AND WEB REPORTER

Lesley McCaslin joined the Thunder in 2012 as the team's courtside TV reporter on FOX Sports Oklahoma and web reporter for Thunder.NBA.com.

McCaslin came to the Thunder from Dallas, where she has worked as an anchor and reporter on FOX Sports Southwest, covering the Dallas Mavericks, Texas Rangers, and Big 12 and Conference USA football. Her career also includes Texas high school football broadcasts and local TV sports reporting in Texas markets Austin and Abilene. She grew up in west Texas and graduated from the University of Texas at Austin.

THUNDER RADIO BROADCASTER

Oklahoma City Thunder radio broadcaster Matt Pinto is a veteran NBA play-by-play announcer who has been with the franchise since 2007. The 2014-15 season is his 25th as an NBA play-by-play broadcaster.

Prior to joining the franchise, Pinto was in Los Angeles, where he has served as the radio voice of the NBA's Clippers for two seasons. From 1997-2005, Pinto was on the Dallas Mavericks' broadcast team, serving as the radio play-by-play voice from 1997-2001 and the television voice from 2001-05. While in Dallas, Pinto also worked as a talk show host for KESN radio and was the play-by-play announcer of the NCAA Division IAA regional game of the week for The Football Network. In 1997, Pinto was named best play-by-play announcer for the state of Texas by the Associated Press.

From 1990-97, Pinto was the radio play-by-play voice of the NBA's Charlotte Hornets, where he was recognized in 1992 as the Premier Sportscaster in North Carolina by the Charlotte Observer. Pinto was also the television play-by-play voice of UNC-Charlotte basketball games and was an occasional host of ESPN national sports talk shows, as well as serving as the play-by-play voice of Westwood One college basketball.

Before joining the NBA ranks, Pinto worked in the sports broadcasting field in Honolulu, Boston, Los Angeles and Amarillo, Texas.

During his time with the Thunder, Pinto has been twice honored with a Heartland Regional Emmy Award for his contributions to Oklahoma City Thunder telecasts. The broadcaster has four children, Tamara, Daryl, Nash and Gabriela.

THUNDER SPANISH RADIO PLAY-BY-PLAY ANNOUNCER

Eleno Ornelas joined the Thunder in 2009 as the Spanish radio play-by-play announcer, calling all Thunder home games.

Ornelas also serves as the Texas Rangers coordinator of Spanish broadcasting and the play-by-play announcer for all Rangers Spanish radio broadcasts. He joined the Rangers Spanish radio broadcast team in 2000, contributing both play-by-play and analysis before becoming the full-time play-by-play announcer in 2003. He has done radio play-by-play for the Dallas Mavericks and covered the Dallas Cowboys.

PARKING is available on a limited basis and can be requested by calling the Basketball Communications Department. Please confirm your credential and parking spot prior to arriving at the game. Media parking is located in the Cox Convention Center parking garage located just north of the Chesapeake Energy Arena. INTEGRIS Thunder Development Center

The Oklahoma City Thunder began calling the INTEGRIS Thunder Development Center home just prior to the start of the 2011-12 season. The 53,000 square foot state-of-the-art practice facility features two full-sized basketball courts, a 27-seat team classroom and a hydrotherapy area which was designed to benefit the Thunder's medical and training staff in the prevention and rehabilitation of injuries.

Funding for the construction of the practice facility and renovations to the team's Chesapeake Energy Arena comes from a one-cent sales tax approved by Oklahoma City voters on March 4, 2008. The 15-month tax took effect on

January 1, 2009 and ran through March 31, 2010. As part of the lease agreement, the Thunder will make an annual rent payment to the City of Oklahoma City.

During the groundbreaking ceremony in August of 2009, Oklahoma City Mayor

Mick Cornett commented, "Having the Thunder in Oklahoma City has been a tremendous sense of pride for our community. When the citizens of Oklahoma City passed the Big League



City initiative to renovate the city's downtown arena and build an NBA-leading practice facility, we all looked forward to this day."
