





HOW ACQUIRED/DRAFT BACKGROUND

Originally drafted by the New Orleans Hornets in the first round of the 2010 NBA Draft (No. 11 overall) then traded to Oklahoma City along with Morris Peterson in exchange for the draft rights to Craig Brackins (21st overall) and Quincy Pondexter (26th overall).

CAREER AVERAGES

In two NBA season appeared in 44 games and averaged 1.7 points and 1.9 rebounds in 7.1 minutes per game.

2011-12 AVERAGES

Appeared in 26 games and averaged 2.2 points and 1.8 rebounds in 6.7 minutes.

2011-12 SEASON

Recorded 39 DNP – Coach's Decisions. One NWT – Personal. Recorded a career-high seven rebounds and three blocked shots on 3/3 at ATL.

D-LEAGUE

During the 2010-11 season, appeared in 21 games (21 starts) for the Tulsa 66ers and recorded averages of 10.3 points, 8.6 rebounds and 2.6 blocks in 29.3 minutes per game. During his time in Tulsa the 66ers posted a 19-4 record. Recorded seven double-doubles.

COLLEGE

Owens the Kansas school record for blocks in a season (125) and second on the career blocked shots list. Never lost in Allen Fieldhouse, posting a three-year record of 55-0. An AP Third Team All-American as a junior. The Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and All-Big 12 First Team for two straight seasons. Named Honorable Mention AP All-American as a sophomore. A member of Kansas' national title team as a freshman in 2007-08.

COLLEGE:

2009-10 (Junior season): Averaged 11.2 points and 9.8 rebounds with 15 double-doubles. Ranked 25th nationally and second in the Big 12 in rebounds per game. Blocked 125 shots to record a Kansas single-season record and ranked fifth in the nation and second in the conference in total swats. Named All-Big 12 First Team and Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year. Honored as Third Team All-America by the Associated Press. Helped lead Kansas to a 33-3 season in which it won the Big 12 regular-season, Big 12 postseason championships and was ranked No. 1 for 15 weeks. Registered 12 points, 18 rebounds and three blocks at Texas Tech. Posted 16 points, 14 rebounds and five blocks at Colorado. Posted 12

points, 16 rebounds and seven blocks vs. Missouri. Totaled 13 points, 16 rebounds and three blocks vs. Alcorn State. **2008-09 (Sophomore season):** An All-Big 12 First Team selection who averaged a double-double (14.9 ppg, 11.1 rpg). Named the college basketball most improved player by Athlon and NBCSports.com. Other honors included Associated Press All-America Honorable Mention, Big 12 Co-Defensive Player of the Year and Big 12 All-Defensive Team. Led the Big 12 in blocked shots with 2.7 per game (12th nationally). His 94 blocked shots ranked second on the KU single-season list. Ranked second in the Big 12 in rebounding (11.1 rpg), which was 10th nationally. Finished second in the Big 12 in field goal percentage at .598 (15th nationally) and 10th in free throw percentage at .792. Recorded the first official triple-double in KU history against Dayton with 13 points, 20 rebounds (tied a career high) and a career-best 10 blocked shots. Also had 20 rebounds with 15 points at Oklahoma. Scored a career-high 24 points against Siena, adding 13 rebounds and four blocks. Had six blocks vs. Tennessee. **2007-08 (Freshman season):** Averaged 2.8 points and 3.0 rebounds in 8.3 minutes over Kansas' national championship season. Ranked third on the team with 34 blocked shots. Tied a career-high with 17 minutes in the national semifinal against North Carolina where he recorded eight points, seven rebounds and a career-high four blocked shots. Registered the first double-double of his career with 11 points and 11 rebounds against Texas Tech on Senior Night. Tied for a team-high with six rebounds and scored six points in 10 minutes of play in his KU debut against Loyola-Marymount.

HIGH SCHOOL

McDonald's All-American who averaged 22.9 points, 17.6 rebounds and 3.8 blocked shots for state quarterfinalist Jefferson High School in 2006-07. Finished the McDonald's All-American game with six points, eight rebounds and four blocks for the West in its 114-112 victory. Named state player of the year by the St. Paul Pioneer Press and Minneapolis Star-Tribune following his senior campaign. Associated Press named Aldrich the Minnesota Defensive Player of the Year his sophomore, junior and senior seasons, the first to receive the honor three straight years. Holds Jefferson single-season and career records in scoring, blocks and rebounding. Numerous awards

include three-time all-state, three-time all-metro, and four-time all-conference. Named Minnesota's Player of the Year his senior season. Four-year letterwinner. Named ABCD camp All-Star in 2006 and 2007. HoopScoop ranked Aldrich the 10th-best player in the 2007 recruiting class.

PERSONAL

Participated in the NBA's Basketball Without Borders program this past summer in Johannesburg, South Africa. Named the ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year as a junior. Lost front tooth during sophomore year in college during a game against Kansas State.

During month of December, helped lead the Thunder to an 11-5 mark (best in the Northwest Division) while averaging a league-best 29.4 points. Connected on 16-of-16 free throws for second time this year on 11/15 at Utah and converted 16-of-17 FTs 11/22 vs. Minnesota. Appeared in his 300th career NBA game 3/18 vs. Charlotte. At the time only two active players scored more points than Durant (7,760) in their first 300 games (Shaquille O'Neal and LeBron James). SAM PRESTI
EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT &
GENERAL MANAGER



Sam Presti is in his sixth season with the Oklahoma City Thunder after being named the 11th General Manager in club history on June 7, 2007. A year into his tenure with the Thunder, Presti was promoted to Executive Vice President and General Manager by Professional Basketball Club Chairman, Clayton Bennett.

During his five seasons with the Thunder, Presti has worked diligently to assemble the building blocks for long-term success both on and off the court.

This past season, Presti and his staff oversaw the Thunder's 47-win season (.712) as Oklahoma City claimed a second consecutive Northwest Division Championship and reached the NBA Finals. This occurred on the heels of the 2010-11 season, when the Thunder became the youngest team in the last quarter century to reach the NBA's Western Conference Finals.

During the 2009-10 season, Presti's third year at the helm, Oklahoma City experienced one of the largest turnaround in NBA history. A year after winning 23 games, the Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season with a 50-32 record (.610) and captured the franchise's first playoff berth in Oklahoma City. The 27-win improvement was tied for the eighth largest improvement in NBA history. Presti was named NBA Executive of the Year by The Sporting News at the conclusion of the season.

Presti's consistent focus has been to utilize the NBA Draft to establish the foundation for sustained success on the floor and in the community. Commencing with the 2007 draft, Presti selected Kevin Durant, the University of Texas standout with the team's No. 2 overall pick. Since then, Durant has blossomed into one of the premiere players in the NBA. This past season, Durant became just the seventh player in NBA history to lead the league in scoring for three consecutive seasons.

Presti went on to select UCLA guard Russell Westbrook and Serge Ibaka with the 4th and 24th selections in the 2008 draft, and a year later nabbed Arizona State standout James Harden 3rd overall in the 2009 draft.

Since moving to Oklahoma City in July of 2008, Presti has stressed the importance of community involvement for both Thunder players and staff. Under his leadership, the Thunder players have made more than 920 community appearances in and around Oklahoma City.

Presti has been on the NBA's Instant Replay Committee since 2009, and this past season was selected as one of four NBA general managers to serve on the newly reconstituted Competition Committee.

Prior to joining the Thunder, the 35-year-old Presti held a variety of roles with the San Antonio Spurs. After starting in 2000 as a video intern for Gregg Popovich, in 2005 Presti was promoted to the role of vice president and assistant general manager and held that role until 2007. As a member of the Spurs, Presti was part of NBA Championship teams in 2003, 2005, and 2007, as well as five division titles.

Presti earned his bachelor's degree in 2000 in communications, politics and law from Emerson College in Boston, where he was the first Rhodes Scholar nominee in school history. The Concord, Mass. native served as team captain of the Emerson College basketball team during both his junior and senior seasons. In addition, Presti earned All-Academic honors two times and was twice selected to the Great Northeast Athletic Conference All-Tournament team. He was honored with the Emerson College Young Alumnus Award in 2005.

Presti currently resides on the board of the Oklahoma City National Memorial and with the support of the Thunder has established the Forward Thinking Leadership Development Program within the Oklahoma City public schools.

Additionally, Presti is actively involved with PeacePlayers International (PPI), a global outreach program focused on bringing children and communities together through the game of basketball. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Shooting Touch, an organization that grants graduating college seniors the opportunity to travel the world and use the platform of basketball to help foster education and influence positive social change in third world global communities.

An accomplished drummer, Presti has produced three music CDs with all proceeds benefiting the Extra Ordinary Needs Fund at Children's Hospital in Boston. In addition, Presti established the Keenan Smith-Anthony Halls Scholarship Fund at his former high school, Concord-Carlisle, to assist students with their college tuition.

This past summer, Presti married the former Shannon O'Connor. Shannon serves as the Director of Teen Leadership Initiatives with the YMCA of Greater Oklahoma City.

TROY WEAVER
VICE PRESIDENT/ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Troy Weaver begins his fifth season with Oklahoma City and his third as the team's VP/Assistant General Manager. Weaver joined the Thunder in May of 2008 and assists Executive VP & General Manager Sam Presti with roster development and day-to-day basketball operations. In addition, he coordinates the team's player personnel matters including NBA Draft preparation, player free agency and summer league roster.

Weaver held the position of Director of Player Personnel for the Utah Jazz in 2007-08. He spent three seasons (2004-07) as head scout for the Jazz before his promotion to Director of Player Personnel.

Prior to joining the Jazz, Weaver was an assistant coach at Syracuse University for four seasons (2000-04). The Orangemen won the 2003 NCAA National Championship led by Weaver recruit Carmelo Anthony. In addition to his experience at Syracuse, Weaver spent time as an assistant coach at New Mexico (1999-2000) and Pittsburgh (1996-99).

Prior to his collegiate coaching days, Weaver amassed an 85-17 record as an AAU coach in Washington, D.C. He guided the DC Assault to the 1996 AAU Tournament of Champions.

Weaver graduated with an associate's degree from Prince George's Community College (MD) in 1991, where he also played one season of basketball.



MICHAEL WINGER
ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER /LEGAL & ADMINISTRATION

Michael Winger begins his third season with the Oklahoma City Thunder, having joined the team in July 2010. In Winger's current capacity, he is chiefly responsible for strategic and process development, salary cap planning and management, Collective Bargaining Agreement interpretation and application, contract and trade negotiation and preparation, and basketball operations legal and administration systems and analysis.

Prior to joining the Thunder, Winger spent five seasons in the front office with the Cleveland Cavaliers in a variety of positions, beginning as its Basketball Operations Coordinator, and ultimately becoming its Director of Basketball Operations & Team Counsel. Winger's role in Cleveland was expansive, and included instituting organizational processes and working closely with Cavaliers' management and ownership on all team matters. He joined the Cavaliers in July of 2005 after spending two years working for renowned sports agent and attorney, Ron Shapiro in Baltimore, Maryland.

Originally from Cleveland, Ohio, Winger is a graduate of Miami University (OH), and earned his J.D. from The University of Toledo College of Law. He also attended the University of Maryland School of Law during his time in Baltimore.

Winger is a licensed attorney and has focused primarily within the area of sports management.



SCOTT BROOKS
HEAD COACH



Scott Brooks concluded his fourth season as Head Coach of the Thunder by leading Oklahoma City to a second consecutive Northwest Division title and a trip to the NBA Finals. Under Brooks, the Thunder has claimed 152 wins during the past three seasons and only San Antonio's Gregg Popovich (161) has coached his team to more victories during that span.

Oklahoma City has qualified for the postseason in each of the last three seasons and since taking over as Thunder Head Coach on November 22, 2008, Oklahoma City has registered a mark of 174-125 (.582).

Brooks was named the NBA's Western Conference Coach of the Month in February of 2012 after guiding the Thunder to an NBA-best 12-3 mark. The Oklahoma City franchise had not won 12 or more games in the month of February since 1972. After posting the best record in the Western Conference through games played on February 15th, Brooks and his staff represented the Thunder by coaching the Western Conference All-Stars in Orlando this past season. With Brooks at the helm, the Western Conference All-Stars captured a 152-149 victory over the Eastern Conference.

During the 2010-11 season Brooks led the Thunder to 55 wins and a spot in the Western Conference Finals after Oklahoma City captured playoff series victories over the Denver Nuggets and Memphis Grizzlies. After the late-season acquisition of Kendrick Perkins from the Boston Celtics in mid-March, Brooks guided the Thunder to a 13-4 mark in the final 17 games of the regular season.

Brooks, the 16th head coach in franchise history received the 2009-10 Red Auerbach NBA Coach of the Year award after his second season as head coach. During his first full year at the helm of the Thunder, Brooks oversaw one of the biggest turnarounds in NBA history. A year after winning 23 games, the Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season with a record of 50-32 (.610). The 27-win improvement was tied for the eighth largest in NBA history.

In the 2010 postseason, the Thunder took the eventual NBA Champion Los Angeles Lakers to a Game 6 in what proved to be one of the more entertaining first round playoff series in recent memory. During the 2009-10 season, Brooks was awarded NBA Coach of the Month honors in February after the Thunder wrapped-up the month with a 9-2 (.818) mark. The .818 winning percentage for the OKC franchise was the highest in a given month since January of 1997.

Brooks was named interim head coach of the Thunder 13 games into the 2008-09 season and was later named head coach on April 15, 2009 prior to the team's final game of the season. A day after being awarded his first NBA head coaching position, Brooks led the Thunder to their most lopsided victory of the year in the team's season finale, a 126-85 win versus the Los Angeles Clippers at STAPLES Center.

Prior to his appointment as interim head coach on November 22, 2008 Brooks joined P.J. Carlisemo and the Thunder coaching staff at the start of the 2007-08 season.

Before joining the Thunder organization, Brooks spent the 2006-07 season working as an assistant coach with the Sacramento Kings. His NBA coaching career began with the Denver Nuggets, where he served as an assistant coach from 2003-06. Brooks helped lead the Nuggets to the playoffs in each of his three seasons with the club. During his brief tenure with the Nuggets, Denver amassed a 136-110 (.560) regular season record.

Brooks enjoyed an 11-year (1988-99) playing career in the NBA, appearing in 680 regular season games with Philadelphia, Minnesota, Houston, Dallas, New York, Cleveland and the Los Angeles Clippers. Brooks' teams advanced to the postseason six of his 11 NBA seasons, and in 1994, he was a member of the NBA Champion Houston Rockets. Brooks holds career averages of 4.9 points and 2.4 assists per game.

In 2000, Brooks was a player/assistant coach with the Los Angeles Stars of the ABA. The following season, he served as the head coach of the Southern California Surf of the ABA, guiding the club to a 23-14 record.

A native of Lathrop, California, Brooks began his collegiate career at Texas Christian University, where he played one season. He then transferred to San Joaquin Delta College for his sophomore season, before spending his final two years at UC Irvine, where he averaged 23.8 points per game as a senior.

BASKETBALL OPERATIONS



MAURICE CHEEKS
ASSISTANT COACH

Cheeks enters his fourth season with Oklahoma City after spending three-plus seasons (2005-08) as head coach of the Philadelphia 76ers.

Cheeks brings more than 30 years of NBA experience to the Thunder bench including seven-plus seasons as a head coach with Portland and Philadelphia. As an NBA head coach, Cheeks compiled a 284-286 (.498) record.

Prior to joining the Sixers, Cheeks spent three-plus seasons as head coach of the Portland Trail Blazers (2001-05). During his time in Portland, he posted a 162-139 (.538) mark, accounting for the fourth-highest win total in Blazers coaching history. He helped the Blazers reach the NBA Playoffs twice, and his 2002-03 squad tied for second in the Pacific Division with a 50-32 record.

Before joining Portland in 2001, Cheeks spent seven seasons as an assistant coach for the Sixers, working under head coaches John Lucas (1994-96), Johnny Davis (1996-97), and Larry Brown (1997-2001). In 2000-01 under Brown, Cheeks helped guide the 76ers to a record of 56-26 (.683) and a spot in the NBA Finals.

Cheeks played 15 seasons in the NBA, the first 11 with Philadelphia, before stints with San Antonio, New York, Atlanta and New Jersey. He was selected to the NBA's All-Defensive Team five times (First Team: 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986; Second Team: 1987) and played in four All-Star games (1983, 1986, 1987, 1988). He was a member of 76ers 1983 World Championship team. In addition, Cheeks is one of seven former Sixers players to have his number retired by the club (No. 10).

As an NBA player, Cheeks compiled career averages of 11.1 ppg, 6.7 apg and 2.1 spg in 1,101 games over 15 seasons while shooting .523 from the field and .793 from the free throw line. A native of Chicago, he began his coaching career with the Quad City Thunder of the CBA. In his only season with Quad City, Cheeks helped guide the club to the CBA Championship.

The 1978 West Texas State (currently West Texas A&M) graduate was a four-year starter and three-time MVP in college. He finished his collegiate career third on the Buffs' all-time scoring list, averaging 16.8 points per game while shooting 56.8 percent from the field as a senior. Cheeks was selected in the second round of the 1978 NBA Draft (36th overall by the Sixers).



REX KALAMIAN
ASSISTANT COACH

With nearly 20 years of NBA experience, Rex Kalamian is set to begin his fourth season with the Thunder after previous coaching tenures with the Sacramento Kings, Minnesota Timberwolves, Denver Nuggets, Philadelphia 76ers and the Los Angeles Clippers.

As an assistant with the Thunder, Kalamian is chiefly responsible for game preparation and player development. During his time in Oklahoma City, much of Kalamian's focus has been on the Thunder's offensive efforts. During the 2011-12 season, the Thunder finished the year as the third highest scoring team in the NBA (averaged 103.1 points per game).

Prior to joining the Thunder's bench, Kalamian spent two years as an assistant coach with the Sacramento Kings after a two year stint with the Minnesota Timberwolves. Before his time in Minnesota, Kalamian spent one season with the Denver Nuggets where he worked as an assistant coach/player development. Kalamian served previously as a West Coast scout for the Philadelphia 76ers during the 2003-04 season before assuming his coaching duties in Denver.

Kalamian's NBA career began with the Los Angeles Clippers where he spent nine years serving the organization in various capacities. After starting as an assistant to the scouting department in 1992, Kalamian was later promoted to assistant coach by Bill Fitch in 1995.

Prior to joining the Clippers, Kalamian worked as an assistant coach for his former school, East Los Angeles College for two seasons. While in college, Kalamian was named team captain at East Los Angeles where he led the South Coast Conference in three point shooting accuracy during the 1988-89 season.

A graduate of Cal Poly Pomona, Kalamian earned a bachelor's degree in business management.



MARK BRYANT

ASSISTANT COACH

Mark Bryant enters his sixth season as a Thunder assistant coach in 2012-13. This past July, Bryant served as Head Coach of the Thunder's summer league team. In five summer league contests, Bryant guided the Oklahoma City team to a record of 3-2 during the Orlando Airtran Airways Pro Summer League.

Prior to joining the Thunder's coaching staff, Bryant served as assistant coach/player development with the Orlando Magic from 2005-07.

Prior to his time in Orlando, Bryant spent the 2004-05 season with the Dallas Mavericks as a member of its player development staff.

Bryant enjoyed a 15-year playing career as the New Jersey native was a member of 10 different teams during his NBA playing tenure (1988-2003). Originally selected by Portland in the first round (21st pick overall) of the 1988 NBA Draft, Bryant helped the Blazers reach the NBA Finals in 1990 and 1992. He appeared in 797 regular season games during his NBA career with Portland, Houston, Phoenix, Chicago, Cleveland, Dallas, San Antonio, Philadelphia, Denver and Boston, averaging 5.4 ppg and 3.8 rpg in 16.9 mpg. Bryant also appeared in 79 career playoff games, averaging 3.5 ppg and 2.5 rpg in 12.2 mpg.

Bryant was a First Team All-Big East selection as a senior at Seton Hall in 1987-88, averaging 20.5 ppg and 9.1 rpg for the Pirates. The 6-9 forward led the school to its first-ever berth into the NCAA Tournament.



BRIAN KEEFE

ASSISTANT COACH

Brian Keefe enters his sixth season with the Thunder and his fourth as assistant coach. During his first two years with Oklahoma City, Keefe served as a player development coach.

From 2005-07, Keefe worked with the San Antonio Spurs as an assistant video coordinator. Prior to joining the Spurs, Keefe was an assistant coach at NCAA Division II Bryant University in Smithfield, R.I. for four seasons (2001-05), highlighted by a trip to the Division II Championship in 2005. He also served one season as a graduate assistant at the University of South Florida (2000-01).

Keefe began his collegiate playing career at UC Irvine, where he was appointed team captain as a sophomore and named All-Big West Second Team in 1995-96 after leading the team in scoring. After transferring to UNLV for his final two seasons, Keefe helped the Running Rebels win the Western Athletic Conference Tournament and earn an NCAA berth. He was named to the WAC All-Tournament Team after making a tournament-record 13 three-pointers. During his senior season in 1998-99, Keefe was named team captain and helped lead UNLV to an NIT appearance.



MAZ TRAKH

ASSISTANT COACH

Trakh enters his third season with the Thunder after spending the previous 23 years coaching the game of basketball in varying capacities. After playing at Southern Utah University, Trakh served as an assistant coach at Long Beach State, Riverside Community College and UC Irvine before being named Head Coach at Cabrillo College in Aptos, CA.

During Trakh's coaching career which has spanned more than two decades, he has coached professionally in the Continental Basketball Association (CBA), American Basketball Association (ABA) and oversees. Most recently, Trakh spent the last five years in Asia as a head coach in the Jordan Basketball League before joining the Thunder sideline. In 2005, he helped lead Jordan Fastlink (now Zain) to the FIBA Asia Club Championship. His team became the first Jordanian team to ever win the championship.



VIN BHAVNANI

MANAGER OF ADVANCE SCOUTING/PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Vin Bhavnani enters his fifth season with Oklahoma City and his third as Manager of Advanced Scouting. Bhavnani spent the previous two years serving as the team's Video Coordinator. Prior to joining the Thunder, Bhavnani spent two seasons with the San Antonio Spurs as the Assistant Video Coordinator. He started his NBA career with the Los Angeles Clippers as an intern in the video department in 2004.

Prior to joining the Clippers, Bhavnani spent one season as an assistant coach for the women's basketball team at Santa Monica Junior College. The Los Angeles, California native is a 2003 graduate of the University of Southern California.



PAUL RIVERS

DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS

Paul Rivers enters his sixth season with the Oklahoma City Thunder and his first as the team's Director of Basketball Operations.

In his current role with the team, Rivers will work closely with various facets of the front office and basketball operations while overseeing both long term and day to day initiatives for the club. Rivers also oversees all aspects of the Thunder technology program and works closely with the Thunder coaching staff and leadership team to keep the organization on the cutting edge of technological advances.

The Broomfield Hills, MI. native was an integral part of the design and construction of the new Integrus Health Thunder Development Center in Northeast Oklahoma City. Rivers oversaw the layout design and overall construction of the facility on behalf of the Thunder organization.

Rivers served as a video coordinator with the Detroit Pistons from 2005-07, assisting the coaching staff during practices and games while also handling all of the club's video operations and footage.

Rivers began his NBA career with the San Antonio Spurs as a video coordinator during the 2004-05 season. Prior to joining the Spurs, he spent two years at Michigan State University. Rivers served as video coordinator under head coach Tom Izzo and the men's basketball team in 2003-04, and for the Spartans' women's basketball team during the 2002-03 season.



WILL DAWKINS

DIRECTOR OF COLLEGE PLAYER PERSONNEL

Will Dawkins begins his fifth year with the Thunder organization and his first as the team's Director of College Player Personnel. Dawkins first joined the Thunder as a front office intern in the summer of 2008 and has since served as assistant video coordinator and scouting coordinator before assuming his current position. In his current capacity, Dawkins is responsible for overseeing the college and international scouting departments in preparation for the NBA draft.

A native of Springfield, MA Dawkins led the High School of Commerce to the Division I State Championship, while earning the honor of Western Massachusetts Player of the Year. He went on to graduate from Emerson College with a degree in Broadcast Journalism. While at Emerson he served as captain of the men's basketball team and became a two time Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar.



DR. DONNIE STRACK
DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL SERVICES

Dr. Strack begins his fifth season in Oklahoma City as the Director of Medical Services. He is responsible for leading the medical staff in providing comprehensive, evidence-based services for Thunder players through innovation, research, and integration of multiple health care professionals.

From 2005-2008, Dr. Strack was in private practice as a physical therapist at Orthopaedic Physical Therapy Services in Wellesley Hills, Mass. Dr. Strack graduated with a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2005. He earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2002 and was awarded the

Athletic Training Department Performance Award that same year.

Dr. Strack's first role with an NBA team came in the sixth grade as a ball-boy for the Indiana Pacers. He later served as a Graduate Assistant athletic trainer for the Indiana Pacers from 2002-2005. Dr. Strack also served as an athletic trainer during the 2002 World Basketball Championships in Indianapolis and the RCA Tennis Championships in 2001 and 2002.

In 2010, Dr. Strack completed his post doctorate fellowship in manual therapy from Regis University. He is board certified in Orthopaedic Physical Therapy (OCS) by the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties and is a Fellow in the American Academy of Orthopaedic Manual Physical Therapists (FAAOMPT). In addition to being a licensed physical therapist and athletic trainer, he is also a certified strength and conditioning specialist.

Dr. Strack is active in the Oklahoma City community, serving on the Board of Directors for Special CARE, a early intervention and specialized care school serving children with and without special needs. He lives in Edmond with his wife, Sarah, and their 3 children – Ellabeth (5), Anderson (3), and Lilajeane (2).



JOE SHARPE
HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER

Joe Sharpe enters his fifth season as the head athletic trainer for the Thunder. Before joining the Thunder organization, Sharpe spent four seasons as head athletic trainer for the Charlotte Bobcats. Prior to Charlotte, Sharpe was the head strength and conditioning coach/assistant athletic trainer with the Minnesota Timberwolves for two seasons, which included the team's Midwest Division title and run to the Western Conference Finals.

This past summer Sharpe served as an Athletic Trainer for the gold medal winning men's USA Basketball Olympic team. In London, Sharpe joined Thunder players Kevin Durant, James Harden and Russell Westbrook as the United States team went a perfect 8-0 en route to the gold medal.

On July 31, 2008, the Professional Basketball Club, LLC., owners of the Oklahoma City Thunder NBA franchise, purchased the Tulsa 66ers of the NBA Development League from Southwest Basketball, LLC. In 2008, Oklahoma City became the third NBA team to purchase an NBA D-League affiliate as sole owners of their affiliates.

Last season, the 66ers claimed sixth place in the D-League's Western Conference with a record of 23-27. The 66ers saw D-League assignments for Oklahoma City Thunder players Reggie Jackson and Lazar Hayward in the 2011-12 season.

Tulsa's season also featured forward Ryan Reid receiving a GATORADE call-up to the Thunder as Reid appeared in five NBA games with Oklahoma City. In his 25 games with the 66ers, Reid averaged 11.9 points per game and scored in double digits 17 times.

The 66ers were led by center Marcus Lewis, who collected a team-best 34 double doubles. Lewis averaged 15.1 points per game and led the D-League with an average of 12.7 rebounds. Tulsa guard Jerome Dyson boasted a team-best 17.8 points per game – good for the league's ninth-best scoring average. Both Lewis and Dyson represented Tulsa as starters on the Western Conference All-Star team.

In addition to developing players on the court, the 66ers have been successful in developing coaches for the NBA level. In August of 2012, Tulsa Head Coach Dale Osbourne was named an assistant coach with the Portland Trail Blazers. Osbourne became the second 66ers coach to join the NBA ranks in a nine month period. Former 66ers Head Coach Nate Tibbetts was hired as an assistant coach with the Cleveland Cavaliers in December of 2011.

The 66ers play their home games in the SpiritBank Event Center in Bixby/South Tulsa. Built in 2008, the 4,500 seat Center is located within Regal Plaza Shopping Center at 104th and Memorial. The state-of-the-art building has hosted acts such as Lynyrd Skynyrd, ZZ Top, John Legend, Willie Nelson and Miranda Lambert.





The three division winners and the team with the next-best record from each conference will receive the top four seeds and will be ranked Nos. 1-4 according to their regular-season records. The remaining four teams in each conference will be seeded 5-8 according to their won-lost records. In each round of the playoffs, the team with the better regular-season won-lost record gets the home-court advantage.

All rounds of the playoffs are a best-of-seven series. Each best-of-seven series will play 2-2-1-1-1 format except for the NBA Finals, which is a 2-3-2 format.

BRIAN DAVIS TELEVISION PLAY-BY-PLAY ANNOUNCER

Brian Davis is in his fifth season as the television voice of the Thunder on Fox Sports Oklahoma. He and analyst Grant Long are part of a broadcast team that won regional Emmy awards for game broadcasts in 2009 and 2010. Davis joined the Thunder in 2008 after serving as host and sideline reporter for Seattle SuperSonics' broadcasts on FSN Northwest.

An NBA veteran, Davis regularly covered the Chicago Bulls during the Michael Jordan era and became a contributor to NBA Radio, hosting game broadcasts and working the sidelines during the playoffs. He later hosted Bulls broadcasts on FSN Chicago and occasionally called Sonics games in Seattle. He also worked as pre-season play-by-play announcer for the NFL's Arizona Cardinals.

As a sports anchor for CBS Radio and its Chicago all-news affiliate, Davis covered major events including the Olympics, NBA Finals and Stanley Cup Finals. His college football resume includes play-by-play in the Big 12, SEC, Big Ten, Pac-10 and MAC. He still handles national radio assignments for Westwood One. An accomplished interviewer and talk show host, he has won several professional awards, including one for investigative journalism during his days as a news reporter in Chicago.

Davis holds a journalism degree from Northwestern University. He and his wife, Judy, have two children and make their home in the Oklahoma City area.

Chesapeake Energy Arena sits in the heart of a downtown renaissance, just steps away from the Cox Convention Center, as well as hotels, restaurants and entertainment venues in downtown Oklahoma City and Bricktown.

PARKING is available on a limited basis and can be requested by calling the Basketball Communications Department. Please confirm your credential and parking spot prior to arriving at the game. Media parking is located in the Cox Convention Center parking garage located just north of the Chesapeake Energy Arena. Media with confirmed parking should enter the Cox Center parking garage off Robinson street just north of Reno.

TELEPHONES are provided in the media workroom and, on a limited basis, courtside. A request for a dedicated phone line can be made by calling the public relations department 24 hours prior to tip-off.

INTEGRIS Health Thunder Development Center

The Oklahoma City Thunder recently transitioned to the INTEGRIS Health Thunder Development Center just prior to the start of the 2011-12 season. The 53,000 square foot state-of-the-art practice facility features two full-sized basketball courts, a 27-seat team classroom and a hydrotherapy area which was designed to benefit the Thunder's medical and training staff in the prevention and rehabilitation of injuries.

Funding for the construction of the practice facility and renovations to the team's Chesapeake Energy Arena comes from a one-cent sales tax approved by Oklahoma City voters on March 4, 2008. The 15-month tax took effect on

January 1, 2009 and ran through March 31, 2010. As part of the lease agreement, the Thunder will make an annual rent payment to the City of Oklahoma City.

During the groundbreaking ceremony in August of 2009, Oklahoma City Mayor Mick Cornett commented, "Having the Thunder in Oklahoma City has been a tremendous sense of pride for our community. When the citizens of Oklahoma City passed the Big League City



initiative to renovate the city's downtown arena and build an NBA-leading practice facility, we all looked forward to this day."
