As a member of the Spanish National Team, won a gold medal at the 2011 FIBA Europe Under-18 Championship, a bronze medal at the 2012 FIBA Europe Under-20 Championship, and a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.



Scored 12 points and 11 rebounds at Philadelphia (3/18). Matched a scoring career-high with 17 points alongside 10 boards at Portland (1/10). Recorded his first double-double of the season with 11 points and 12 rebounds vs. Portland (12/16). 25 games of double-digit scoring. 12 games of double-digit rebounds. Nine games with three-plus blocked shots. Six double-doubles. Led team in scoring once and rebounds 11 times. Two games DNP – Right Elbow Strain.

NBA CAREER

2014-15: Selected to participate in the BBVA Compass Rising Stars Challenge at All-Star Weekend for the second consecutive season. Set a career-high for blocked shots with six blocks vs. Houston on 11/16. Blocked multiple shots in three consecutive games from 11/14 to 11/18, a career-best multi-block streak. Secured a then-career-high 15 rebounds alongside 16 points in a win at San Antonio (12/25). Pulled down a career-best 20 rebounds at Washington (1/21). Career-best streak of four consecutive double-doubles from 3/18 to 3/25. Ten double-doubles. Grabbed 10-plus rebounds in 24 games. Scored in double figures 22 times. Missed one game due to a migraine. Missed 11 games due to right hand, fourth metacarpal fracture. **2013-14:** Appeared in 81 games (20 starts) and averaged 3.3 points, 4.1 rebounds (9th among NBA rookies) and 0.70 blocks (9th among NBA Rookies) in 14.8 minutes. Named to the NBA All-Rookie Second Team. Oklahoma City went 11-9 during his 20 starts. On 1/29, named to the BBVA Compass Rising Stars Challenge as part of All-Star Weekend. Registered a blocked shot in 37 games. Recorded first career double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds at Detroit (11/8). Made first career start at LA Clippers (11/13). Scored in double figures three times. Set a

career-high with four blocks vs. Memphis (2/3). Set a career-high with six steals at Dallas (3/24). One DNP-Coach's Decision.

Appeared in 36 games (18 starts) and averaged 7.0 points, 6.8 rebounds and 1.1 blocks in 24.6 minutes. **2016:** In 18 games (18 starts), averaging 10.1 points, 9.5 rebounds and 0.9 blocks in 30.7 minutes. Recorded nine consecutive games of double-digit rebounds, from Game 5 of the opening round vs. Dallas (4/25) to Game 2 of the Western Conference Finals (5/18). Notched 16 points (6-of-8 shooting) with 11 boards and two blocks vs. San Antonio on 5/8. Pulled down a playoff career-high 17 rebounds while scoring 12 points in a win at San Antonio on 5/2. Scored 15 points with 10 boards vs. Dallas on 4/25. Six double-doubles. **2014:** Appeared in 18 games and averaged 3.9 points, 4.1 rebounds and 1.3 blocks in 18.4 minutes. Recorded 10 points (5 of 7 shooting) and 11 rebounds in a career-best 40 minutes during a series-clinching win at the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 6 of the Western Conference Semifinals.


COLLEGE

rebounds for freshman seasons (192). Ranked first on team in rebounds (6.3 rpg) and blocks (2.0 bpg). Ranked fifth on team in scoring with 7.2 points per game. Scored in double figures on six occasions. Scored a career-high 16 points along with 10 rebounds against Bethune Cookman. Grabbed a season-high 14 rebounds along with eight points against Duquesne. Scored 13 points along with 11 rebounds in an NCAA Tournament game against Wichita State. Blocked a career-high five shots against South Florida.

PERSONAL

First lottery pick and first-round pick to come out of New Zealand in NBA Draft history. One of 18 siblings, six of whom played basketball for New Zealand. All of his brothers stand around 6-10 to 6-11 and his sisters 6-5 to 6-6. His half-sister, Valerie, is a 2008 and 2016 Olympic champion and four-time world champion in the shot put.

Recorded his sixth triple-double in an eight game stretch with 29 points, 12 assists and 10 boards vs. Minnesota (3/14). First player since Jason Kidd (2007-08) to have eight or more triple-doubles in a season. Scored a career-high 54 points with nine rebounds and eight assists at Indiana (4/12). Posted team-high assists totals in 67-of-82 games. Tallied 20+ points 24 times and 30+ points 4 times. Posted second career triple-double at Minnesota (2/21). In 38 minutes, tallied 22 points, 10 rebounds and 14 assists. Came one rebound shy of triple-double and finished with 31 points and 10 assists for his 12th double-double of the season at NY (2/20). Participated in T-Mobile Rookie-Sophomore Challenge and Youth Jam at All-Star Weekend in Dallas and led all scorers with 40 points on 18-29 FGs. Named NBA player of the week for contests played between February 1-7. During the seven day span Westbrook helped lead Oklahoma City to a 3-0 week, including two wins on the road (Golden State & New Orleans) while averaging 19.7 points, 9.7 assists, 8.0 rebounds and 3.3 steals. Posted double-figure assist totals in four straight games (12/28 – 1/4) and becomes first OKC player to accomplish the feat since Gary Payton did so in January of 2002 (1/3/02 – 1/10/02). Recorded 8th double-double of the season on 1/2 at Milwaukee with 17 points and 13 assists. With zero turnovers vs. the Bucks he recorded the most assists (13) without a turnover (in franchise history) since April 8, 2001 (Gary Payton; 15 assists, 0 TO's). On 12/26 vs. Charlotte, tallied 22 points and game-high six assists while committing zero turnovers in 35 min. Notched 4th double-double in OKC win at San Antonio (19 pts/11 asst) on 11/14. With his 11 assists and zero turnovers, matched NBA season-high for most assists without a TO (Andre Miller). Recorded a then career-high with 13 assists during season opener 10/28 vs. Sacramento. With his 13 assists, he matched the entire assist total for the entire Kings' team. Recorded back-to-back double-doubles (pts/asst) in first two games of season. On 11/6 at Houston, set career-high with 14 made field goals and finished with a game-high 33 points. On 11/8 vs. Orlando, recorded third double-double of the season (17 points, 10 assists) and matched career-high with three made 3-point FG's. **2008-09:** Named to NBA's All-Rookie First Team. Ranked among rookie league-leaders in a number of statistical categories including scoring (4th, 15.3), assists (2nd, 5.3) steals (2nd, 1.36), minutes played (4th, 32.5), rebounds (7th, 4.9) and field-goal percentage (10th, .398). 10 or more points 71 times. 20-plus points 18 times. 30-plus points six times. 10 or more rebounds four times. 10 or more assists nine times. Ten double-doubles. One triple-double. Five-plus steals three times. Scored 10+ points in 25 consecutive games (1/16 vs. Detroit through 3/14 at Phoenix). Career-high 34 points including career-high 20 free throw makes (20-22 FT) at Sacramento (2/1). The 20 free throw makes represent the most a Kings opponent since they moved to Sacramento. Was named NBA T-Mobile Rookie of the Month in December and February.

Appeared in 82 games (82 starts) and averaged 24.5 points, 6.2 rebounds, 7.6 assists and 1.9 steals in 37.7 minutes. **2016:** In 18 games (18 starts), averaging 26.0 points, 11.0 assists, 6.9 rebounds and 2.6 steals in 37.7 minutes. Became the first player with a 35-point postseason triple-double vs the defending champions since Jerry West in 1969 - posting 36 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists in Game 4 vs. Golden State (5/24). Scored 19 points in the third quarter of Game 1 of the Western Conference Finals (5/16) – the most points scored in a quarter by a Thunder player during the OKC era. In the same game, swiped a seven steals – a career-high and franchise record. Totaled 10 points, four rebounds and three assists in the fourth quarter of Game 5 at San Antonio (5/10), finishing with 35 points, 11 boards and nine assists. The first player since Isaiah Thomas in 1985 to score 25 points with 15 assists in back-to-back playoff games with 26 points and 15 assists at Dallas on 4/21 followed by 25 points and 15 assists two nights later. Six games of 30+ points. Thirteen games of 20+ points. One triple-double. Fifteen double-doubles. Twelve games of 10+ assists, including three with 15+ assists. Four games of 10+ rebounds. **2014:** During the 2014 postseason, appeared in 19 games (19 starts) and averaged 26.7 points, 7.3 rebounds, 8.1 assists and 2.2 steals in 38.7 minutes. Recorded three triple-doubles (only player in 2014 playoffs to record a single triple-double), eight double-doubles, 16 games of 20+ points and six games of 30+ points. Dished out a franchise postseason-record 16 assists vs. Memphis on 5/3. **2013:** Underwent successful surgery on Apr. 27 to repair a lateral meniscus tear which was suffered in Game 2 vs. Houston in the opening round. Appeared in two games (two starts) during 2013 playoffs and averaged 24.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 7.0 assists and 3.0 steals in 34.0 minutes. Recorded one double-double with 19 points to go along with 10 assists and eight rebounds during Game 1 vs. HOU. Nine DNP - lateral meniscus tear. **2012:** Posted a playoff career-high with 43 points on 20-of-32 shooting during Game 4 of the Finals at Miami. During the Thunder's second round series vs. the L.A. Lakers, Westbrook played a total of 178 minutes and committed a total of four turnovers. Recorded a 2012 playoff-high 12 assists during Game 5 win at San Antonio in the Western Conference Finals. Scored 20+ points 11 times during the 2012 playoffs. **2011:** Recorded a triple-double in Game 7 of the second round vs. Memphis with 14 points, 14 assists (playoff career-high) and 10 rebounds (playoff career-high) in 35 minutes. Westbrook becomes the fifth player in NBA history to register a triple-double in a playoff Game 7 (Scottie Pippen, James Worthy, Larry Bird and Jerry West). Scored a playoff career-high 40 points during Game 4 triple overtime victory over Memphis. Scored 20+ points 11 times while scoring 30+ on five occasions.

ALL-STAR

Selected to appear on the Western Conference All-Star team five times and started in his most recent appearance. Named the All-Star MVP in both 2015 and 2016, the first time a player has received the award two consecutive years since Bob Pettit who won it outright in 1958 and shared the honor with Elgin Baylor in 1959. In his five All-Star appearances, averaged 23.8 points, 5.4 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 2.2 steals in 21.4 minutes.

USA BASKETBALL

Won a gold medal in 2012 as a member of the United States Olympic team as the US squad went a perfect 8-0 during Olympic competition. In London, Westbrook appeared in all eight games and posted averages of 8.5 points, 1.6 assists and 1.6 rebounds. In 2010, helped lead the USA Men's National Team to a gold medal during the 2010 FIBA World Championships played in Turkey. Westbrook received player of the game honors during the US win over Lithuania and proved to be integral part of the United States perfect 9-0 mark at the World Championships. He appeared in all nine games and averaged 9.1 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists per contest.

COLLEGE

Named Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year as a sophomore. Earned Third Team All-Pac-10 honors and was named to the conference All-Defensive Team. **2007-08 (Sophomore):** Averaged 12.7 points, a team-leading 4.3 assists, 3.9 rebounds and 1.6 steals in each game. Played 1,318 minutes, the most by a Bruin since 1979 (when minutes began being tracked as a statistic). Led team with a career-high 22 points vs. Memphis in the Final Four on 4/5. Posted first career double-double with 14 points and a career-high-tying 11 rebounds vs. Western Kentucky in the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament on 3/27. Tallied 16 points, four rebounds, five assists and a career-high five steals vs. Oregon on 2/23. Dished out a career-high nine assists vs. Youngstown State on 11/12. Pulled down a career-high-tying 11 rebounds vs. Stanford in the title game of the Pac-10 Tournament on 3/15. **2006-07 (Freshman):** Averaged 3.4 points and 0.7 assists in 9.0 minutes in each game. Scored a season-high 11 points twice. Recorded season highs of five rebounds, four assists and two steals in 32 minutes at West Virginia in his first career start on 2/10.

SAM PRESTI
EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT &
GENERAL MANAGER



Sam Presti enters his 10th season with the Oklahoma City Thunder after being named the 11th General Manager in club history on June 7, 2007. A year into his tenure with the Thunder, Presti was promoted to Executive Vice President and General Manager by Professional Basketball Club Chairman, Clayton Bennett.

During his nine seasons with the Thunder, Presti has worked diligently to assemble the building blocks for long term success both on and off the court. Dating back to the start of the 2009-10 season, Presti and his staff have watched the Thunder amass the second best record in the NBA (.665; 371-187) during this span (behind only San Antonio).

With Presti at the helm, the Thunder has captured five Northwest Division Championships and has finished the regular season with a winning percentage of .610 (equivalent to 50 wins) in six of the last seven seasons. Additionally, the Thunder has finished with a top five record in four of the last five seasons.

Presti's consistent focus has been to utilize the NBA Draft to establish the foundation for sustained success on the floor and in the community. He selected Russell Westbrook with the 4th overall in the 2008 draft. Westbrook has since become a five-time All-Star, and this past year became the first player to win back-to-back All-Star MVP awards since Bob Pettit in 1958 and 1959. Meanwhile, Steven Adams was named to the two consecutive BBVA Rising Stars teams after being selected by the Thunder with the 12th overall pick in the 2013 NBA Draft. Most recently, Presti acquired the second overall pick in the 2013 NBA Draft, Victor Oladipo, also a member of two consecutive BBVA Rising Stars teams.

After moving to Oklahoma City in July of 2008, Presti has stressed the importance of community involvement for both Thunder players and staff. Under his leadership, Thunder players have made more than 1,950 community appearances in and around Oklahoma City. Presti has also made it policy for every new player and staff member to tour the Oklahoma City Memorial and Museum soon after joining the organization.

Under Presti's guidance, the Thunder has advanced to postseason in six of the last seven seasons including five straight years (2010-2014) and at the conclusion 2012-13 season. Oklahoma City became just the second team in NBA history (Boston Celtics; 1955-1960) to increase its winning percentage for five consecutive seasons (while maintaining a winning percentage of .700 or better in two of those seasons). Dating back to the 2011-12 season, the Thunder became Western Conference Champions on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which the Thunder became the youngest team in the prior quarter century to reach the NBA's Western Conference Finals.

During the 2009-10 season, Presti's third year at the helm, Oklahoma City experienced one of the largest turnarounds in NBA history. A year after winning 23 games, the Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season with a 50-32 record (.610) and captured the franchise's first playoff berth in Oklahoma City. The 27-win improvement was tied for the eighth largest improvement in NBA history. Presti was named NBA Executive of the Year by The Sporting News at the conclusion of the season.

Presti has been on the NBA's Instant Replay Committee since 2009 and has served on the league's Competition Committee dating back to the 2011-12 season.

Prior to joining the Thunder, the 39-year-old Presti held a variety of roles with the San Antonio Spurs. After starting in 2000 as a video intern for Gregg Popovich, Presti moved up through the front office ranks in San Antonio before being elevated to the position of Vice President and Assistant General Manager. As a member of the Spurs, Presti was part of NBA Championship teams in 2003, 2005 and 2007, as well as five division titles.

Presti earned his bachelor's degree in 2000 in communications, politics and law and a minor in psychology from Emerson College in Boston, where he was the first Rhodes Scholar nominee in school history. The Concord, Mass. native served as team captain of the Emerson College basketball team during both his junior and senior seasons. In addition, Presti earned All-Academic honors two times and was twice selected to the Great Northeast Athletic Conference All-Tournament team. He was honored with the Emerson College Young Alumnus Award in 2005. Presti has also completed Harvard University's Continuing Education program on leadership and decision making.

Presti currently resides on the board of the Oklahoma City National Memorial and served as chairman of the Oklahoma Standard campaign, a movement built on the foundation of resilience, compassion, consistent acts of honor, service and kindness.

With the support of the Thunder, Presti has established the Forward Thinking Leadership Development Program within the Oklahoma City public schools. Additionally, Presti is actively involved with PeacePlayers International (PPI), a global outreach program focused on bringing children and communities together through the game of basketball. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Shooting Touch, an organization that grants graduating college seniors the opportunity to travel the world and use the platform of basketball to help foster education and influence positive social change in third world global communities.

This past summer, Presti was presented with the Humanitarian Award from the Oklahoma Center for Community and Justice. Presti was recognized as Oklahoma City University's 2012-13 recipient of the Abe Lemons/Paul Hansen Award for Sports Excellence and he also won the Oklahoma March of Dimes Sports Headliner Special Award for 2013.

An accomplished drummer, Presti has produced three music CDs with all proceeds benefiting the Extra Ordinary Needs Fund at Children's Hospital in Boston. Also, Presti established the Keenan Smith-Anthony Halls Scholarship Fund at his former high school, Concord-Carlisle, to assist students with their college tuition.

Presti and his wife, Shannon, have a son, Nicholas Ruben. Shannon continues to serve as the Director of Teen Leadership Initiatives for the YMCA of Greater Oklahoma City.



TROY WEAVER

VICE PRESIDENT / ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Troy Weaver begins his ninth season with Oklahoma City and his seventh as the team's Vice President/Assistant General Manager. Weaver joined the Thunder in May of 2008 and assists General Manager Sam Presti with roster development and day-to-day basketball operations. In addition, he coordinates the team's player personnel matters including NBA Draft preparation, player free agency and summer league roster.

Weaver held the position of director of player personnel for the Utah Jazz in 2007-08. He spent three seasons (2004-07) as head scout for the Jazz before his promotion to director of player personnel.

Prior to joining the Jazz, Weaver was an assistant coach at Syracuse University for four seasons (2000-04). The Orangemen won the 2003 NCAA National Championship led by Weaver recruit Carmelo Anthony. In addition to his experience at Syracuse, Weaver spent time as an assistant coach at New Mexico (1999-2000) and Pittsburgh (1996-99).

Prior to his collegiate coaching days, Weaver amassed an 85-17 record as an AAU coach in Washington, D.C. He guided the DC Assault to the 1996 AAU Tournament of Champions.

Weaver graduated with an associate's degree from Prince George's Community College (MD) in 1991, where he also played one season of basketball.



MICHAEL WINGER

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER & TEAM COUNSEL

The 2016-17 season is Michael Winger's seventh in Oklahoma City. Winger assists Executive Vice President & General Manager Sam Presti on all facets of roster planning, player acquisition, salary cap and strategic management. Winger is chiefly responsible for operational and player acquisition process development, progressive salary cap strategy implementation, tactical CBA application and maneuverability, contract and trade negotiation and preparation, legal and administrative processes and execution.

Prior to joining the Thunder, Winger spent five seasons (2005-06 through 2009-10) in the front office with the Cleveland Cavaliers, earning several promotions during his tenure. Winger began his career in Cleveland as its Basketball Operations Coordinator. Winger was promoted to Basketball Operations Manager / Team Counsel, and shortly thereafter to the Cavaliers' Director of Basketball Operations & Team Counsel. Winger's role in Cleveland was extensive, and included instituting organizational processes and working closely with Cavaliers' management and ownership on all team matters. He joined the Cavaliers in July of 2005 after spending two years working for renowned sports agent and attorney, Ron Shapiro in Baltimore, Maryland.

Originally from Cleveland, Ohio, Winger is a graduate of Miami University (OH) and holds a law degree, having attended both The University of Toledo College of Law and the University of Maryland School of Law.



BILLY DONOVAN

HEAD COACH



Billy Donovan is set to embark on his second season as Thunder head coach after leading Oklahoma City to a 55-win season, a Northwest Division title and a spot in the Western Conference Finals during his first NBA campaign.

By winning 55 games during the 2015-16 season, Donovan became the only first-year NBA head coach in league history to accomplish such a feat after coming directly from the college ranks. Additionally, Donovan became just the third first year head coach in the last 15 years to win 55 or more games during his first season (Kerr & Thibodeau).

After being named head coach on April 30, 2015, Donovan became the third head coach in Thunder history after enjoying an incredibly successful college coaching career that spanned more than two decades.

During the previous 19 years as head coach at the University of Florida, Donovan led the Gators to two National Championships and four trips to the Final Four while amassing a record of 467-186 (.715). During the 2014-15 season, Donovan became the second youngest coach in NCAA history (Bob Knight) to claim 500 wins.

During his tenure at Florida, Donovan led the program to 16 straight 20-win seasons, three 30-win seasons, 17 consecutive trips to the postseason and six SEC Championships. Under Donovan, Florida advanced to the Elite Eight in six of the past 10 seasons.

Donovan concluded his time at Florida with the second most wins for a SEC program (467) in the history of the conference. Additionally, his 35 NCAA tournament wins rank as the most all-time among SEC coaches. Donovan's win total is more than twice that of any other coach in Florida history.

After winning back-to-back national championships (2006 and 2007), Donovan led Florida to 18 straight postseason wins, the longest run for any program since John Wooden led UCLA to 28 straight postseason wins.

Donovan has been the recipient of numerous collegiate coaching awards including ESPN.com's National Coach of the Year (2001), the Wooden Award's "Legends of Coaching" Honor (2010) and SEC Coach of the Year (2011, 2013, 2014).

In addition to his responsibilities at Florida, Donovan has served as head coach of USA Basketball's U18 and U19 National Teams in previous summers. As a head coach with USAB, Donovan's teams have captured three gold medals while going a perfect 19-0 during national team competition. Prior to leading the 2014 FIBA Americas U18 Team to the gold medal last summer in Colorado Springs, CO, Donovan guided the 2013 USA U19 World Championship Team to a perfect 9-0 record and the gold medal in Prague, Czech Republic, and the 2012 USA U18 National Team to a 5-0 slate and gold in Sao Sebastião do Paraiso, Brazil.

Donovan's coaching experience dates back to the 1989-90 season where he served as a graduate assistant coach at Kentucky. After five years with the Wildcats, Donovan was hired as head coach at Marshall, where he spent two years before leaving for Florida.

Prior to joining the coaching ranks, Donovan enjoyed a four-year playing career at Providence where he helped lead the Friars to their best season in school history and a trip to the Final Four in 1987. In addition, Donovan appeared in 44 games as a member of the New York Knicks during the 1987-88 season.



ADRIAN GRIFFIN

ASSISTANT COACH

Adrian Griffin is set to begin his first season with the Thunder after previously serving as assistant coach with the Orlando Magic during the 2015-16 season.

Griffin spent five seasons (2010-15) as an assistant coach with Chicago. During the summer of 2014, he worked with the USA Basketball Men's National Team that captured the gold medal at the FIBA Basketball World Cup. Prior to joining the Bulls, he served as assistant coach/player development for two seasons (2008-10) with Milwaukee.

As a player, Griffin appeared in 477 career NBA games (179 starts) during nine seasons with Boston, Dallas, Houston, Chicago and Seattle, averaging 4.0 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 16.8 minutes. He also played in 48 career playoff outings, averaging 3.4 points and 3.0 rebounds in 13.2 minutes and helped Dallas reach the 2006 NBA Finals. Griffin also played one season in Italy and three seasons with Connecticut of the CBA. In 1998-99, he was named CBA Most Valuable Player and also earned CBA Finals MVP, leading Connecticut to the league championship.

Born on July 4, 1974 and a native of Wichita, Kansas, Griffin was a three-year starter at Seton Hall University. He has two daughters, Vanessa and Aubrey, and two sons, Alan and Adrian, Jr.



MAURICE CHEEKS

ASSISTANT COACH

Maurice Cheeks is set to begin his second year after returning to the Thunder bench after the start of the 2015-16 season. Cheeks brings more than 30 years of NBA experience to the Thunder bench. Cheeks, who spent four seasons on the Thunder's staff from 2009-2013, returned to Oklahoma City after serving as the head coach of the Detroit Pistons during the 2013-14 season. Overall, Cheeks has amassed a head coaching record of 305-315 (.492) with the Pistons, Philadelphia 76ers and Portland Trail Blazers.

Before joining the Thunder in 2009, Cheeks served as head coach of the 76ers from 2005-2009, amassing a record of 122-147 and securing a playoff appearance in Philadelphia's 2007-08 campaign. Prior to joining the Sixers, Cheeks spent three-plus seasons as head coach of the Portland Trail Blazers (2001-05). During his time in Portland, he posted a 162-139 (.538) mark, accounting for the fourth-highest win total in Blazers coaching history. He helped the Blazers reach the NBA Playoffs twice, and his 2002-03 squad tied for second in the Pacific Division with a 50-32 record.

Preceding his work in Portland, Cheeks spent seven seasons as an assistant coach for the Sixers, working under head coaches John Lucas (1994-96), Johnny Davis (1996-97), and Larry Brown (1997-2001). In 2000-01 under Brown, Cheeks helped guide the 76ers to a record of 56-26 (.683) and a spot in the NBA Finals.

A 15-year NBA veteran, Cheeks retired from the NBA as its all-time leader in steals after playing with Philadelphia, San Antonio, New York, Atlanta and New Jersey. He was selected to the NBA's All-Defensive Team five times (First Team: 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986; Second Team: 1987) and played in four All-Star games (1983, 1986, 1987, 1988). A member of the 76ers' 1983 World Championship team, Cheeks was honored by the club through having his number (10) retired.

As an NBA player, Cheeks compiled career averages of 11.1 ppg, 6.7 apg and 2.1 spg in 1,101 games while shooting .523 from the field and .793 from the free throw line. A native of Chicago, he began his coaching career with the Quad City Thunder of the CBA. In his only season with Quad City, Cheeks helped guide the club to the CBA Championship.

The 1978 West Texas State (currently West Texas A&M) graduate was a four-year starter and three-time MVP in college. He finished his collegiate career third on the Buffs' all-time scoring list, averaging 16.8 points per game while shooting 56.8 percent from the field as a senior. Cheeks was selected in the second round of the 1978 NBA Draft (36th overall by the Sixers).



ANTHONY GRANT

ASSISTANT COACH

Anthony Grant enters his second year on the Thunder bench after spending the previous nine years serving as head coach at the University of Alabama and Virginia Commonwealth University. In nine seasons at Alabama and VCU, Grant compiled a record of 193-110 (.637) at the two schools.

During the past six years at Alabama, Grant amassed a record of 117-85 (.579) while guiding the Crimson Tide to the 2012 NCAA tournament, their first tournament berth since the 2006 season. Alabama also advanced to the NIT

tournament on three occasions during Grant's tenure.

In addition to leading Alabama to three straight 20-win campaigns, Grant also led the Tide to a winning record in SEC play for three consecutive seasons (2011-13). It marked the first time since the 1994-1996 seasons that Alabama had compiled three consecutive winning seasons in conference play.

Prior to Alabama, Grant spent three seasons as the head coach of VCU where he led the Rams to a 76-25 (.752) record while winning three consecutive Colonial Athletic Association Championships. Grant's time at VCU was highlighted by a pair of NCAA tournament appearances and a 45-9 (.833) mark in CAA games.

A Miami native, Grant spent 10 years at the University of Florida (1996-2006) where he served under Billy Donovan. Grant helped lead the Gators to their first national title in 2006 before departing for VCU.

Prior to joining the coaching ranks, Grant enjoyed a successful collegiate playing career at the University of Dayton (1983-87). The Flyers went 70-49 (.588), with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT berth during Grant's time in uniform. In 105 games at Dayton, Grant averaged 11.6 points and 6.7 rebounds per game and was named the team's most valuable player as a senior.



MARK BRYANT

ASSISTANT COACH

Mark Bryant is set to enter his tenth season as a Thunder assistant coach. During July of 2012, Bryant served as Head Coach of the Thunder's summer league team.

Prior to joining the Thunder's coaching staff, Bryant served as assistant coach/player development with the Orlando Magic from 2005-07.

Before his time in Orlando, Bryant spent the 2004-05 season with the Dallas Mavericks as a member of its player development staff.

Bryant enjoyed a 15-year playing career as the New Jersey native was a member of 10 different teams during his NBA playing tenure (1988-2003). Originally selected by Portland in the first round (21st pick overall) of the 1988 NBA Draft, Bryant helped the Blazers reach the NBA Finals in 1990 and 1992. He appeared in 797 regular season games during his NBA career with Portland, Houston, Phoenix, Chicago, Cleveland, Dallas, San Antonio, Philadelphia, Denver and Boston, averaging 5.4 ppg and 3.8 rpg in 16.9 mpg. Bryant also appeared in 79 career playoff games, averaging 3.5 ppg and 2.5 rpg in 12.2 mpg.

Bryant was a First Team All-Big East selection as a senior at Seton Hall in 1987-88, averaging 20.5 ppg and 9.1 rpg for the Pirates. The 6-9 forward led the school to its first-ever berth into the NCAA Tournament.



DARKO RAJAKOVIC

ASSISTANT COACH

Darko Rajakovic enters his fifth season with the Oklahoma City Thunder organization and third as assistant coach. A Serbian native, Rajakovic spent his first two seasons with the organization as head coach of the Tulsa 66ers. Rajakovic became the first head coach born outside of North America in NBA D-League history. The 36-year-old boasts a diverse coaching background with an emphasis in player development.

Rajakovic holds a career NBA D-League record of 51-49. During his two seasons with the 66ers, Tulsa has been assigned seven players from Oklahoma City a total of 50 times (the most in the league during that stretch).

Rajakovic has also seen five of his 66ers players receive NBA GATORADE Call-Ups to the NBA, including four to the Thunder (Grant Jerrett, Daniel Orton, Mustafa Shakur and Reggie Williams). He coached 11 Tulsa players over the past two years who were on an NBA roster in the 2013-14 season.

Prior to joining the 66ers, Rajakovic had spent the previous three years as the head coach of Espacio Torrelodones of the Spanish EBA League.

Rajakovic began his coaching career at 16 years old with BC Borac Cacak in Cacak, Serbia where he coached the club to two national tournaments.

Rajakovic received a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from BK University in Belgrade in 2006. Rajakovic speaks Serbian, Croatian and Bosnian languages as native, but is also fluent in English, Spanish and basic Greek.



VIN BHAVNANI

ASSISTANT COACH

Vin Bhavnani enters his ninth season with Oklahoma City and his first as an assistant coach. Bhavnani spent his past five years with the Thunder organization as Manager of Advance Scouting/Player Development and his first two years serving as the team's Video Coordinator. Prior to joining the Thunder, Bhavnani spent two seasons with the San Antonio Spurs as the assistant video coordinator. He started his NBA career with the Los Angeles Clippers as an intern in the video department in 2004.

Prior to joining the Clippers, Bhavnani spent one season as an assistant coach for the women's basketball team at Santa Monica Junior College. The Los Angeles, California, native is a 2003 graduate of the University of Southern California.



ROYAL IVEY

ASSISTANT COACH

Royal Ivey is set to begin his first season with the Oklahoma City Thunder as an assistant coach after spending the 2015-16 season as a player development assistant and the 2014-15 season as an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Blue of the NBA Development League. In his role as a player development assistant, Ivey became the first former Oklahoma City player to join the Thunder's coaching ranks.

During his season with the Blue, Ivey helped guide the team to a 28-22 record and an appearance in the NBA D-League Playoffs.

Ivey enjoyed a 10-year NBA playing career that included 61 appearances as a member of the Oklahoma City Thunder. In 492 career NBA games (114 starts) with Oklahoma City, Atlanta, Milwaukee and Philadelphia, Ivey averaged 3.3 points, 1.1 rebounds and 1.1 assists. Ivey was a member of the Thunder for a combined 208 regular season and playoff games. After playing Oklahoma City in 2010-11 and 2011-12, Ivey most recently joined the Thunder via a 10-day contract during the 2013-14 season.

Ivey was originally selected with the 37th overall pick in the 2004 NBA Draft by the Atlanta Hawks.

Born in New York City, Ivey attended the University of Texas as a four-year starter for the Longhorns basketball team. He holds a bachelor's degree in applied learning and science.



BILLY SCHMIDT

QUALITY CONTROL COACH

Billy Schmidt is set to begin his second season with the Thunder as a quality control coach after spending the past two decades coaching at the collegiate level.

Most recently, Schmidt spent the 2014-15 season at the University of Florida where he served under Billy Donovan as assistant to the head coach.

Before making the move to Gainesville, Schmidt spent the prior three seasons at Georgia Tech and eight seasons at the University of Dayton.

During his tenure at Dayton, Schmidt was named associate head coach prior to the start of the 2009-10 season. This came shortly after Schmidt was voted the Atlantic 10's top assistant coach in a poll of league coaches. During his eight seasons with Dayton, Schmidt helped lead the Flyers to 172 victories, two NCAA Tournament appearances and three NIT berths.

Schmidt moved to Dayton after nine seasons coaching in the SEC, Big East and Big Ten. Schmidt enjoyed a pair of coaching stops under Tommy Amaker at Seaton Hall and Michigan.

Prior to Seton Hall, Schmidt worked under former Kevin O'Neill at Northwestern, where he was an assistant coach from 1997-2000, and at Tennessee from 1994-1997. Schmidt joined the Volunteer staff as an administrative assistant in 1994 and was promoted to an assistant coach in 1996.

A native of Stamford, Conn., Schmidt began his coaching career in the high school ranks, serving as an assistant coach to Steve Smith at Oak Hill Academy in Mouth of Wilson, Virginia, for two years (1992-94). During his tenure, Oak Hill won back-to-back national championships.

Schmidt graduated with honors from Wake Forest in 1992 with a Bachelor of Science degree in secondary education. While at Wake Forest, Schmidt was a manager and coaches' aide for the Demon Deacons program for four years (1988-92). He holds a Master's Degree in Sport Management from the University of Tennessee.



PAUL RIVERS

DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS

Paul Rivers enters his ninth season with the Oklahoma City Thunder and his fourth as the team's Director of Basketball Operations. Prior to assuming his elevated position with the Thunder, Rivers spent the previous three seasons with the club serving as Director of Basketball Administration & Technology.

In his current role with the team, Rivers works closely with various facets of the front office and basketball operations while overseeing both long term and day to day initiatives for the club. Rivers also oversees all aspects of the Thunder technology program and works closely with the Thunder coaching staff and leadership team to keep the organization on the leading edge of technological advances.

The Bloomfield Hills, MI, native was an integral part of the design and construction of the Integris Thunder Development Center in Northeast Oklahoma City. Rivers oversaw the layout design and overall construction of the facility on behalf of the Thunder organization.

Rivers served as a video coordinator with the Detroit Pistons from 2005-07, assisting the coaching staff during practices and games while also handling all of the club's video operations and footage.

Rivers began his NBA career with the San Antonio Spurs as a video coordinator during the 2004-05 season. Prior to joining the Spurs, he spent two years at Michigan State University. Rivers served as video coordinator under head coach Tom Izzo and the men's basketball team in 2003-04, and for the Spartans' women's basketball team during the 2002-03 season.



WILL DAWKINS

DIRECTOR OF COLLEGE PLAYER PERSONNEL

Will Dawkins begins his ninth year with the Thunder organization and his fourth as the team's Director of College Player Personnel. Dawkins first joined the Thunder as a front office intern in the summer of 2008 and has since served as assistant video coordinator and scouting coordinator before assuming his current position. In his current capacity, Dawkins is responsible for overseeing the college and international evaluation departments in preparation for the NBA draft.

A native of Springfield, MA Dawkins led the High School of Commerce to the Division I State Championship, while earning the honor of Western Massachusetts Player of the Year. He went on to graduate from Emerson College with a degree in Broadcast Journalism. While at Emerson he served as captain of the men's basketball team and became a two time Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar.

Dawkins and his wife, Tara currently reside in Edmond.



DR. DONNIE STRACK
DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL SERVICES

Dr. Strack begins his ninth season in Oklahoma City as the Director of Medical Services. He is responsible for leading the medical staff in providing comprehensive, evidence-based services for Thunder players through innovation, research, and integration of multiple health care professionals.

From 2005-2008, Dr. Strack was in private practice as a physical therapist at Orthopaedic Physical Therapy Services in Wellesley Hills, Mass. Dr. Strack graduated with a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2005. He earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2002 and was awarded the

Athletic Training Department Performance Award that same year.

Dr. Strack also served as an athletic trainer during the 2002 World Basketball Championships in Indianapolis and the RCA Tennis Championships in 2001 and 2002.

In 2010, Dr. Strack completed his post doctorate fellowship in manual therapy from Regis University. He is board certified in Orthopaedic Physical Therapy (OCS) by the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties and is a Fellow in the American Academy of Orthopaedic Manual Physical Therapists (FAAOMPT). In addition to being a licensed physical therapist and athletic trainer, he is also a certified strength and conditioning specialist.

Dr. Strack is active in the Oklahoma City community, serving on the Board of Directors for Special CARE, an early intervention and specialized care school serving children with and without special needs. JOE SHARPE
HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER

Joe Sharpe enters his ninth season as head athletic trainer for the Thunder. Before joining the Thunder organization, Sharpe spent four seasons as head athletic trainer for the Charlotte Bobcats. Prior to Charlotte, Sharpe was the head strength and conditioning coach/assistant athletic trainer with the Minnesota Timberwolves for two seasons, which included the team's Midwest Division title and run to the Western Conference Finals.

Sharpe has been an active participant in the USA Basketball program dating back to 2002. During the summer of 2012 and 2016, Sharpe won a gold medal while serving as athletic trainer for the men's USA Basketball Olympic team.

Sharpe was previously the head basketball athletic trainer at the University of Connecticut during a nine-year stint with the Huskies that included its 1999 NCAA Championship season.

David Howarth is set to begin his third season with the Thunder where he serves as Athletic Performance Coordinator. The Oklahoma City Blue will begin its ninth season as the Thunder's NBA D-League affiliate. Originally purchased in 2008 by the Professional Basketball Club, LLC, the Thunder's development team played its first six seasons as the Tulsa 66ers before being relocated to Oklahoma City in 2014.

The Thunder has displayed a strong history of utilizing its D-League affiliate and developing both players and staff. Since Oklahoma City entered a single-affiliate relationship before the 2008-09 season, the Thunder has assigned a player to its D-league club 102 times – the most assignments by an NBA team during that span. Eighteen different Thunder players have been assigned in the past eight seasons.

Oklahoma City has been active in "calling up" players from its D-League affiliate. The Thunder has called up a player from this club on 12 occasions since 2008 – the most call-ups between associated teams in that stretch.

The Thunder has also utilized its D-League team through developing NBA coaches. The past three coaches of this team have received "call-ups" to the NBA ranks. Darko Rajakovic (2012-14) is an assistant coach with Oklahoma City and Dale Osbourne (2011-12) and Nate Tibbets (2009-11) are both assistants with Portland. This past season, current Head Coach Mark Daigneault was elevated to the Thunder bench on Feb. 17 and the Blue finished the season playing under Jarell Christian.

Throughout last season, Thunder forwards Mitch McGary and Josh Huestis and guard Cameron Payne were assigned to the Blue. Huestis was on assignment for 25 games where he averaged 12.7 points, 5.3 rebounds and 1.4 blocks in 32.0 minutes of play. McGary was assigned for 26 games, averaging 14.7 points, 8.8 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 24.9 minutes while shooting 45.7 percent from the floor. Payne appeared in two games and averaged 23.5 points, 7.0 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals in each game. The Blue also worked in developing non-Thunder-roster players this year with guard Jean-Pierre Tokoto signing with the New York Knicks on Aug. 1.

The Blue will host 24 home games this upcoming season, with 23 games at the Cox Convention Center and a contest across the street at Chesapeake Energy Arena.



MARK DAIGNEAULT HEAD COACH

Mark Daigneault (DAYG-nalt) returns for his third season as head coach of the Oklahoma City Blue after being elevated to the Thunder bench midway through the 2015-16 season. In his first season at the helm of the Thunder's NBA D-League team, Daigneault led the Blue to a 28-22 record and an appearance in the NBADL Western Conference Semifinals. Under his watch, the Blue had four players called up to NBA rosters (Josh Huestis, Dwight Buycks, Reggie Williams and Jean-Pierre Tokoto) and four Thunder players assigned a combined 37 times (Grant Jerrett, Mitch McGary, Josh Huestis and Cameron Payne).

Daigneault came to Oklahoma City after spending his previous four years working under Billy Donovan at the University of Florida, where he most recently held the position of Assistant to the Head Coach. Throughout his four years at Florida, the Gators totaled a record of 120-30 (.800), won three SEC titles and advanced to the Elite Eight each year. In his final season with UF (2013-14), the Gators became the first SEC team to go 18-0 in conference play and went on to win the SEC Championship and advance to the Final Four.

Prior to his time at Florida, Daigneault spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Holy Cross. During Daigneault's tenure, the Crusaders finished as runner-up of the Patriot League Championship in 2008-09.

A 2007 graduate of the University of Connecticut, Daigneault served as a student manager with the Huskies under Jim Calhoun from 2003-07. While at UCONN, the Huskies won the 2004 NCAA Championship and claimed three Big East titles, posting a combined record of 103-32 (.763). A native of Leominster, Mass., Daigneault holds a master's degree in sports management from the University of Florida.





An NBA executive since 1997, Danny Barth has served in his current position of executive vice president and chief administrative officer of the Oklahoma City Thunder since the team's inaugural season in 2008. 



All rounds of the playoffs are a best-of-seven series. Each best-of-seven series will play 2-2-1-1-1 format.



BRIAN DAVIS THUNDER BROADCASTER

Brian Davis is entering his ninth season as the television voice for the Oklahoma City Thunder. He serves as part of a Thunder broadcasting team on FOX Sports Oklahoma that has been awarded four regional Heartland Emmy Awards since 2008.

A veteran basketball broadcaster, Davis returned to the NBA in 2004 as host of Seattle Sonics broadcasts. He regularly covered the Chicago Bulls during the Michael Jordan era and became a contributor to NBA Radio, hosting game broadcasts and serving as sideline reporter for the network during the Playoffs, including the NBA Finals. He later hosted Bulls broadcasts on FSN Chicago and occasionally called Sonics games in Seattle. He has an extensive play-by-play resume at the college level, including the Big Ten, Pac-10, Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference.

Davis has called games at the professional level in three other sports: football, as radio voice of the Seattle Seahawks; hockey, in a reserve role with Chicago Blackhawks; and soccer, with Major League Soccer's Chicago Fire. He has also worked as a preseason play-by-play announcer for the NFL's Arizona Cardinals.

As a sports anchor for CBS Radio and its Chicago all-news affiliate, Davis covered major events including the Olympics, NBA Finals and Stanley Cup Finals. His resume includes play-by-play on national college football broadcasts for Westwood One Radio. He is an accomplished interviewer and talk show host and has won several professional awards, including one for investigative journalism during his days as a news reporter in Chicago.

Davis holds a journalism degree from Northwestern University. He and his wife, Judy, have two adult children and make their home in Oklahoma City.



MICHAEL CAGE THUNDER TELEVISION ANALYST

Michael Cage joined the Thunder broadcasting team in 2014 as its television analyst for all FOX Sports Oklahoma broadcasts.

Cage played 15 seasons from 1984-2000 as a power forward in the NBA with the Los Angeles Clippers, Seattle SuperSonics, Cleveland Cavaliers, Philadelphia 76ers and New Jersey Nets. He led the NBA in rebounding in 1988, capturing the title by grabbing 30 rebounds in the final game of the regular season.

A native of West Memphis, Arkansas, Cage was a first-round draft pick of the Clippers in 1984 following a successful career at San Diego State University. At SDSU he was named a second-team All-American in 1984 and twice was selected as Western Athletic Conference Player of the Year. The Aztecs retired his jersey (No. 44) in 1984. He was also a member of the gold-medal winning 1983 United States team in the Pan American Games, and he is a member of both the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame and the San Diego State Hall of Fame.

Following his playing career, Cage has worked as both a broadcaster and a high school and AAU basketball coach. His broadcasting experience includes serving as TV analyst for the Memphis Grizzlies, FOX Sports West, ESPN, Prime Ticket and Westwood One radio. Cage coached Mater Dei High School in Los Angeles to back-to-back state titles in 2013-14 and a national championship in 2014. He also served as a guest coach for the Cleveland Cavaliers at the 2013 NBA Summer League in Las Vegas.

Cage has a long history of giving back to the community during and after his NBA playing career. The Michael Cage Foundation works with young athletes to mentor, teach and share life lessons.



LESLEY MCCASLIN THUNDER BROADCAST HOST AND SIDELINE REPORTER

Lesley McCaslin joined the Thunder in 2012 and serves as the team's broadcast host and sideline reporter on FOX Sports Oklahoma.

McCaslin came to the Thunder from Dallas, where she has worked as an anchor and reporter on FOX Sports Southwest, covering the Dallas Mavericks, Texas Rangers, and Big 12 and Conference USA football. Her career also includes Texas high school football broadcasts and local TV sports reporting in Texas markets Austin and Abilene. She grew up in Lubbock, Texas, and graduated from the University of Texas at Austin. In addition to her duties with the Thunder, she covers college football as a sideline reporter for FOX Sports.

MATT PINTO THUNDER RADIO BROADCASTER

Oklahoma City Thunder radio broadcaster Matt Pinto is a veteran NBA play-by-play announcer who has been with the franchise since 2007.

Prior to joining the franchise, Pinto was in Los Angeles, where he has served as the radio voice of the NBA's Clippers for two seasons. From 1997-2005, Pinto was on the Dallas Mavericks' broadcast team, serving as the radio play-by-play voice from 1997-2001 and the television voice from 2001-05. While in Dallas, Pinto also worked as a talk show host for KESN radio and was the play-by-play announcer of the NCAA Division IAA regional game of the week for The Football Network. In 1997, Pinto was named best play-by-play announcer for the state of Texas by the Associated Press.

From 1990-97, Pinto was the radio play-by-play voice of the NBA's Charlotte Hornets, where he was recognized in 1992 as the Premier Sportscaster in North Carolina by the Charlotte Observer. Pinto was also the television play-by-play voice of UNC-Charlotte basketball games and was an occasional host of ESPN national sports talk shows, as well as serving as the play-by-play voice of Westwood One college basketball.

Before joining the NBA ranks, Pinto worked in the sports broadcasting field in Honolulu, Boston, Los Angeles and Amarillo, Texas.

During his time with the Thunder, Pinto has been twice honored with a Heartland Regional Emmy Award for his contributions to Oklahoma City Thunder telecasts. The broadcaster has four children, Tamara, Daryl, Nash and Gabriela.



ELENO ORNELAS THUNDER SPANISH RADIO PLAY-BY-PLAY ANNOUNCER

Eleno Ornelas joined the Thunder in 2009 as the Spanish radio play-by-play announcer, calling all Thunder home games.

Ornelas also serves as the Texas Rangers coordinator of Spanish broadcasting and the play-by-play announcer for all Rangers Spanish radio broadcasts. He joined the Rangers Spanish radio broadcast team in 2000, contributing both play-by-play and analysis before becoming the full-time play-by-play announcer in 2003. He has done radio play-by-play for the Dallas Mavericks and covered the Dallas Cowboys.

INTEGRIS Thunder Development Center

The Oklahoma City Thunder began calling the INTEGRIS Thunder Development Center home just prior to the start of the 2011-12 season. The 53,000 square foot state-of-the-art practice facility features two full-sized basketball courts, a 27-seat team classroom and a hydrotherapy area which was designed to benefit the Thunder's medical and training staff in the prevention and rehabilitation of injuries.

Funding for the construction of the practice facility and renovations to the team's Chesapeake Energy Arena comes from a one-cent sales tax approved by Oklahoma City voters on March 4, 2008. The 15-month tax took effect on January 1, 2009 and ran

through March 31, 2010. As part of the lease agreement, the Thunder will make an annual rent payment to the City of Oklahoma City.

During the groundbreaking ceremony in August of 2009, Oklahoma City Mayor

Mick Cornett commented, "Having the Thunder in Oklahoma City has been a tremendous sense of pride for our community. When the citizens of Oklahoma City passed the



passed the Big League City initiative to renovate the city's downtown arena and build an NBA-leading practice facility, we all looked forward to this day."

INTEGRIS is the official health care provider of the Oklahoma City Thunder.
