win at Indiana (11/26). **2009-10:** One of four players to start all 82 games for Oklahoma City. Recorded 24 double-doubles on the season. Set a career-high with 16 assists 4/4 vs. Minnesota. Thunder went 23-5 when Westbrook recorded 10+ assists. Posted team-high assists totals in 67-of-82 games. Tallied 20+ points 24 times and 30+ points 4 times. Posted second career triple-double at Minnesota (2/21). In 38 minutes, tallied 22 points, 10 rebounds and 14 assists. Came one rebound shy of triple-double and finished with 31 points and 10 assists for his 12th double-double of the season at NY (2/20). 

SAM PRESTI
EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT &
GENERAL MANAGER



Sam Presti is entering his seventh season with the Oklahoma City Thunder after being named the 11th General Manager in club history on June 7, 2007. A year into his tenure with the Thunder, Presti was promoted to Executive Vice President and General Manager by Professional Basketball Club Chairman, Clayton Bennett.

During his six seasons with the Thunder, Presti has worked diligently to assemble the building blocks for long-term success both on and off the court.

This past season, Presti and his staff oversaw a third straight Northwest Division Championship as the Thunder claimed its first ever 60-win season (.732) in the Oklahoma City era. Under Presti's guidance, the Thunder recently became the second team in NBA history to increase its winning percentage for five consecutive seasons (while maintaining a winning percentage of .700 or better in two seasons).

Dating back to the 2011-12 season, the Thunder became Western Conference Champions on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which the Thunder became the youngest team in the last quarter century to reach the NBA's Western Conference Finals.

During the 2009-10 season, Presti's third year at the helm, Oklahoma City experienced one of the largest turnarounds in NBA history. A year after winning 23 games, the Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season with a 50-32 record (.610) and captured the franchise's first playoff berth in Oklahoma City. The 27-win improvement was tied for the eighth largest improvement in NBA history. Presti was named NBA Executive of the Year by The Sporting News at the conclusion of the season.

Presti's consistent focus has been to utilize the NBA Draft to establish the foundation for sustained success on the floor and in the community. Commencing with the 2007 draft, Presti selected Kevin Durant, the University of Texas standout with the team's No. 2 overall pick. Since then, Durant has blossomed into one of the premiere players in the NBA. This past season, Durant led the NBA in total points scored for a fourth consecutive season.

Other significant draft selections for Presti include taking Russell Westbrook and Serge Ibaka with the 4th and 24th selections, respectively in the 2008 draft. Westbrook has been named to the Western Conference All-Star team in each of the last three seasons and Serge Ibaka recently became just the second player in NBA history to lead the NBA in blocked shots for three consecutive seasons.

After moving to Oklahoma City in July of 2008, Presti has stressed the importance of community involvement for both Thunder players and staff. Under his leadership, Thunder players have made more than 1,200 community appearances in and around Oklahoma City. Presti has also made it policy for every new player and staff member to tour the Oklahoma City Memorial and Museum soon after joining the organization.

Presti has been on the NBA's Instant Replay Committee since 2009, and during the 2011-12 season, Presti was selected as one of four NBA general managers to serve on the reconstituted Competition Committee.

Prior to joining the Thunder, the 36-year-old Presti held a variety of roles with the San Antonio Spurs. After starting in 2000 as a video intern for Gregg Popovich, Presti moved up through the front office ranks in San Antonio before being elevated to the position of Vice President and Assistant General Manager. As a member of the Spurs, Presti was part of NBA Championship teams in 2003, 2005 and 2007, as well as five division titles.

Presti earned his bachelor's degree in 2000 in communications, politics and law and a minor in psychology from Emerson College in Boston, where he was the first Rhodes Scholar nominee in school history. The Concord, Mass. native served as team captain of the Emerson College basketball team during both his junior and senior seasons. In addition, Presti earned All-Academic honors two times and was twice selected to the Great Northeast Athletic Conference All-Tournament team. He was honored with the Emerson College Young Alumnus Award in 2005.

Presti currently resides on the board of the Oklahoma City National Memorial and with the support of the Thunder has established the Forward Thinking Leadership Development Program within the Oklahoma City public schools. This past year, Presti was recognized as Oklahoma City University's 2012-13 recipient of the Abe Lemons/Paul Hansen Award for Sports Excellence and also won the Oklahoma March of Dimes Sports Headliner Special Award for 2013.

Additionally, Presti is actively involved with PeacePlayers International (PPI), a global outreach program focused on bringing children and communities together through the game of basketball. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Shooting Touch, an organization that grants graduating college seniors the opportunity to travel the world and use the platform of basketball to help foster education and influence positive social change in third world global communities.

An accomplished drummer, Presti has produced three music CDs with all proceeds benefiting the Extra Ordinary Needs Fund at Children's Hospital in Boston. In addition, Presti established the Keenan Smith-Anthony Halls Scholarship Fund at his former high school, Concord-Carlisle, to assist students with their college tuition.

Presti's wife, Shannon, serves as the Director of Teen Leadership Initiatives with the YMCA of Greater Oklahoma City.

BASKETBALL OPERATIONS



TROY WEAVER

VICE PRESIDENT/ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Troy Weaver begins his sixth season with Oklahoma City and his fourth as the team's VP/Assistant General Manager. Weaver joined the Thunder in May of 2008 and assists General Manager Sam Presti with roster development and day-to-day basketball operations. In addition, he coordinates the team's player personnel matters including NBA Draft preparation, player free agency and summer league roster.

Weaver held the position of director of player personnel for the Utah Jazz in 2007-08. He spent three seasons (2004-07) as head scout for the Jazz before his promotion to director of player personnel.

Prior to joining the Jazz, Weaver was an assistant coach at Syracuse University for four seasons (2000-04). The Orangemen won the 2003 NCAA National Championship led by Weaver recruit Carmelo Anthony. In addition to his experience at Syracuse, Weaver spent time as an assistant coach at New Mexico (1999-2000) and Pittsburgh (1996-99).

Prior to his collegiate coaching days, Weaver amassed an 85-17 record as an AAU coach in Washington, D.C. He guided the DC Assault to the 1996 AAU Tournament of Champions.

Weaver graduated with an associate's degree from Prince George's Community College (MD) in 1991, where he also played one season of basketball.



MICHAEL WINGER

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER /LEGAL & ADMINISTRATION

The 2013-14 season is Michael Winger's fourth in Oklahoma City. Winger assists Executive Vice President & General Manager Sam Presti on all facets of roster planning, player acquisition, salary cap and strategic management. Winger is chiefly responsible for operational and player acquisition process development, progressive salary cap strategy implementation, tactical CBA application and maneuverability, contract and trade negotiation and preparation, legal and administrative processes and execution.

Prior to joining the Thunder, Winger spent five seasons (2005-06 through 2009-10) in the front office with the Cleveland Cavaliers, earning several promotions during his tenure. Winger began his career in Cleveland as its Basketball Operations Coordinator. Winger was promoted to Basketball Operations Manager / Team Counsel, and shortly thereafter to the Cavaliers' Director of Basketball Operations & Team Counsel. Winger's role in Cleveland was extensive, and included instituting organizational processes and working closely with Cavaliers' management and ownership on all team matters. He joined the Cavaliers in July of 2005 after spending two years working for renowned sports agent and attorney, Ron Shapiro in Baltimore, Maryland.

Originally from Cleveland, Ohio, Winger is a graduate of Miami University (OH) and a licensed attorney, attending both The University of Toledo College of Law and the University of Maryland School of Law.



SCOTT BROOKS
HEAD COACH



Scott Brooks enters his sixth season as Head Coach of the Thunder after leading Oklahoma City to a third consecutive Northwest Division title and the Thunder's first ever 60+ win year during the 2012-13 season.

Over the past four seasons, Brooks is the third-most winningest coach in the NBA, as the Thunder has claimed 212 victories since the start of the 2009-10 season.

Oklahoma City has qualified for the postseason in each of the last four seasons and since taking over as Thunder Head Coach on November 22, 2008, Oklahoma City has registered a mark of 234-147 (.614). With Brooks at the helm, the Thunder became just the second team in NBA history to increase its winning percentage five consecutive seasons (while maintaining a winning percentage of .700 or better in two seasons).

This past season, Oklahoma City claimed the top spot in the Western Conference after finishing with a record of 60-22. On the year, Oklahoma City posted the largest point differential in the NBA in more than five seasons (9.2 points per game). In fact, Oklahoma City won 44 games by double figures, including 19 games of 20 or more (both tops in the NBA). The Thunder finished the season as the third highest scoring team in the NBA (105.7 points per game) while holding the opposition to the second worst field goal shooting percentage (42.5%). Oklahoma City is currently one of just two teams (San Antonio) to record a .600 or better winning percentage in each of the last four seasons.

During the 2011-12 season, Brooks guided the Thunder to the NBA Finals after finishing the regular season with a record of 47-19. After posting the best record in the Western Conference through games played on February 15th, Brooks and his staff represented the Thunder by coaching the Western Conference All-Stars in Orlando. With Brooks at the helm, the Western Conference All-Stars captured a 152-149 victory over the Eastern Conference.

In 2010-11 Brooks led the Thunder to 55 wins and a spot in the Western Conference Finals after Oklahoma City captured playoff series victories over the Denver Nuggets and Memphis Grizzlies. After the late-season acquisition of Kendrick Perkins from the Boston Celtics in mid-March, Brooks guided the Thunder to a 13-4 mark in the final 17 games of the regular season.

Brooks, the 16th head coach in franchise history received the 2009-10 Red Auerbach NBA Coach of the Year award after his second season as head coach. During his first full year at the helm of the Thunder, Brooks oversaw one of the biggest turnarounds in NBA history. A year after winning 23 games, the Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season with a record of 50-32 (.610). The 27-win improvement was tied for the eighth largest in NBA history.

In the 2010 postseason, the Thunder took the eventual NBA Champion Los Angeles Lakers to a Game 6 in what proved to be one of the more entertaining first round playoff series in recent memory. During the 2009-10 season, Brooks was awarded NBA Coach of the Month honors in February after the Thunder wrapped-up the month with a 9-2 (.818) mark. The .818 winning percentage for the OKC franchise was the highest in a given month since January of 1997.

Brooks was named interim head coach of the Thunder 13 games into the 2008-09 season and was later named head coach on April 15, 2009 prior to the team's final game of the season. A day after being awarded his first NBA head coaching position, Brooks led the Thunder to their most lopsided victory of the year in the team's season finale, a 126-85 win versus the Los Angeles Clippers at STAPLES Center.

Prior to his appointment as interim head coach on November 22, 2008 Brooks joined P.J. Carlesimo and the Thunder coaching staff at the start of the 2007-08 season.

Before joining the Thunder organization, Brooks spent the 2006-07 season working as an assistant coach with the Sacramento Kings. His NBA coaching career began with the Denver Nuggets, where he served as an assistant coach from 2003-06. Brooks helped lead the Nuggets to the playoffs in each of his three seasons with the club. During his brief tenure with the Nuggets, Denver amassed a 136-110 (.560) regular season record.

Brooks enjoyed an 11-year (1988-99) playing career in the NBA, appearing in 680 regular season games with Philadelphia, Minnesota, Houston, Dallas, New York, Cleveland and the Los Angeles Clippers. Brooks' teams advanced to the postseason six of his 11 NBA seasons, and in 1994, he was a member of the NBA Champion Houston Rockets. Brooks holds career averages of 4.9 points and 2.4 assists per game.

In 2000, Brooks was a player/assistant coach with the Los Angeles Stars of the ABA. The following season, he served as the head coach of the Southern California Surf of the ABA, guiding the club to a 23-14 record. A native of Lathrop, California, Brooks began his collegiate career at Texas Christian University, where he played one season. He then transferred to San Joaquin Delta College for his sophomore season, before spending his final two years at UC Irvine, where he averaged 23.8 points per game as a senior.

BASKETBALL OPERATIONS



REX KALAMIAN ASSISTANT COACH

With two decades of NBA experience on his side, Rex Kalamian is set to begin his fifth season with the Thunder after previous coaching tenures with the Sacramento Kings, Minnesota Timberwolves, Denver Nuggets, Philadelphia 76ers and the Los Angeles Clippers.

This past July, Kalamian served as head coach of the Thunder's summer league team in Orlando where he guided the squad to a perfect 5-0 record en route to becoming Summer League Champions.

As an assistant with the Thunder, Kalamian is chiefly responsible for game preparation and player development. During his time in Oklahoma City, much of Kalamian's focus has been on the Thunder's offensive efforts. During the 2012-13 season, the Thunder finished the year as the third highest scoring team in the NBA (averaged 105.7 points per game).

Prior to joining the Thunder's bench, Kalamian spent two years as an assistant coach with the Sacramento Kings after a two year stint with the Minnesota Timberwolves. Before his time in Minnesota, Kalamian spent one season with the Denver Nuggets where he worked as an assistant coach/player development. Kalamian served previously as a West Coast scout for the Philadelphia 76ers during the 2003-04 season before assuming his coaching duties in Denver.

Kalamian's NBA career began with the Los Angeles Clippers where he spent nine years serving the organization in various capacities. After starting as an assistant to the scouting department in 1992, Kalamian was later promoted to assistant coach by Bill Fitch in 1995.

Prior to joining the Clippers, Kalamian worked as an assistant coach for his former school, East Los Angeles College for two seasons. While in college, Kalamian was named team captain at East Los Angeles where he led the South Coast Conference in three point shooting accuracy during the 1988-89 season.

A graduate of Cal Poly Pomona, Kalamian earned a bachelor's degree in business management.



ROBERT PACK ASSISTANT COACH

Robert Pack joins the Oklahoma City Thunder coaching staff for the 2013-14 season after serving as an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Clippers for each of the last three seasons. Pack was also the head coach of the Clippers' 2012 Summer League team. His NBA coaching experience dates back to 2009 when he served as an assistant coach with the New Orleans Hornets.

After going undrafted out of the University of Southern California, Pack enjoyed a 13-year NBA playing career in which he averaged 8.9 points, 4.6 assists and 2.0 rebounds in 552 career games with the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Washington Wizards, New Jersey Nets, Dallas Mavericks, Minnesota Timberwolves and the New Orleans Hornets.

Nicknamed "Pac-Man", Pack was a member of the 1991-92 Portland team that advanced to the NBA Finals and was a member of the 1993-94 Denver Nuggets' squad that made NBA history as the first No. 8 seed to defeat a No. 1 seed in the first round of the NBA Playoffs.

Pack was the runner-up in the 1994 NBA All-Star Slam Dunk Contest in Minneapolis. Upon the conclusion of his NBA playing career, Pack played overseas with BC Kauno Zalgiris in Lithuania from 2004 through 2005.

A one-time college standout at USC, Pack finished his college career ranking fourth on the Trojans all-time assists list (319) in just two seasons, while becoming the fourth player in school history to record back-to-back 100 assist seasons. In two years at Southern California, he averaged 13.4 points and 5.6 assists per game.

MARK BRYANT ASSISTANT COACH

Mark Bryant enters his seventh season as a Thunder assistant coach in 2013-14. During July of 2012, Bryant served as Head Coach of the Thunder's summer league team. In five summer league contests, Bryant guided the Oklahoma City team to a record of 3-2 during the Orlando Summer League.

Prior to joining the Thunder's coaching staff, Bryant served as assistant coach/player development with the Orlando Magic from 2005-07.

Prior to his time in Orlando, Bryant spent the 2004-05 season with the Dallas Mavericks as a member of its player development staff.

Bryant enjoyed a 15-year playing career as the New Jersey native was a member of 10 different teams during his NBA playing tenure (1988-2003). Originally selected by Portland in the first round (21st pick overall) of the 1988 NBA Draft, Bryant helped the Blazers reach the NBA Finals in 1990 and 1992. He appeared in 797 regular season games during his NBA career with Portland, Houston, Phoenix, Chicago, Cleveland, Dallas, San Antonio, Philadelphia, Denver and Boston, averaging 5.4 ppg and 3.8 rpg in 16.9 mpg. Bryant also appeared in 79 career playoff games, averaging 3.5 ppg and 2.5 rpg in 12.2 mpg.

Bryant was a First Team All-Big East selection as a senior at Seton Hall in 1987-88, averaging 20.5 ppg and 9.1 rpg for the Pirates. The 6-9 forward led the school to its first-ever berth into the NCAA Tournament.



BRIAN KEEFE ASSISTANT COACH

Brian Keefe enters his seventh season with the Thunder and his fifth as assistant coach. During his first two years with Oklahoma City, Keefe served as a player development coach.

From 2005-07, Keefe worked with the San Antonio Spurs as an assistant video coordinator. Prior to joining the Spurs, Keefe was an assistant coach at NCAA Division II Bryant University in Smithfield, R.I. for four seasons (2001-05), highlighted by a trip to the Division II Championship in 2005. He also served one season as a graduate assistant at the University of South Florida (2000-01).

Keefe began his collegiate playing career at UC Irvine, where he was appointed team captain as a sophomore and named All-Big West Second Team in 1995-96 after leading the team in scoring. After transferring to UNLV for his final two seasons, Keefe helped the Running Rebels win the Western Athletic Conference Tournament and earn an NCAA berth. He was named to the WAC All-Tournament Team after making a tournament-record 13 three-pointers. During his senior season in 1998-99, Keefe was named team captain and helped lead UNLV to an NIT appearance.



MIKE TERPSTRA ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Terpstra brings over 20 years of experience to the Thunder after working in various capacities at the college, junior college and high school levels, with additional experience in the NBA Development League and the CBA.

Terpstra's experience in the CBA came as an assistant coach/director of player development under former NBA veteran Joe Wolf with the Idaho Stampede during the 2005-06 season. The following season, Terpstra worked on a part-time basis with the coaching staff of the Colorado 14ers who would go on to win the Western Division championship.

Prior to his time with the Stampede and 14ers, Terpstra served as head coach at his alma mater, Northwest Nazarene University, in Nampa, Idaho during the 2004-05 season. While there, Terpstra accumulated a 17-10 record, which was the best record in school history at the Division II level. Terpstra also served as the head coach of California State Stanislaus from 2000-03. During a three-year stint as the head coach of Modesto Junior College from 1997-00, Terpstra compiled a 60-36 record, including a school record 27 wins during the 1999-00 season.

Before earning his Masters Degree in Sports Science from the University of Pacific in May 1996, Terpstra was responsible for the development of the team's big men as an assistant coach for the Tigers men's basketball program from 1994-95. Terpstra started his coaching career with Ripon Christian High School, where he won three California state championships, two as a head coach (1992, 1994) and one as an assistant (1988).

Following his college playing career at Northwest Nazarene where he was team MVP in his junior and senior seasons, Terpstra played professionally in Turkey, England and Australia.

VIN BHAVNANI MANAGER OF ADVANCED SCOUTING/PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Vin Bhavnani enters his sixth season with Oklahoma City and his fourth as Manager of Advanced Scouting/Player Development. Bhavnani spent the previous two years serving as the team's Video Coordinator. Prior to joining the Thunder, Bhavnani spent two seasons with the San Antonio Spurs as the Assistant Video Coordinator. He started his NBA career with the Los Angeles Clippers as an intern in the video department in 2004.

Prior to joining the Clippers, Bhavnani spent one season as an assistant coach for the women's basketball team at Santa Monica Junior College. The Los Angeles, California native is a 2003 graduate of the University of Southern California.



PAUL RIVERS

DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS

Paul Rivers enters his seventh season with the Oklahoma City Thunder and his second as the team's Director of Basketball Operations. Prior to assuming his elevated position with the Thunder, Rivers spent the previous three seasons with the club serving as Director of Basketball Administration & Technology.

In his current role with the team, Rivers works closely with various facets of the front office and basketball operations while overseeing both long term and day to day initiatives for the club. Rivers also oversees all aspects of the Thunder technology program and works closely with the Thunder coaching staff and leadership team to keep the organization on the cutting edge of technological advances.

The Bloomfield Hills, MI. native was an integral part of the design and construction of the new Integris Health Thunder Development Center in Northeast Oklahoma City. Rivers oversaw the layout design and overall construction of the facility on behalf of the Thunder organization.

Rivers served as a video coordinator with the Detroit Pistons from 2005-07, assisting the coaching staff during practices and games while also handling all of the club's video operations and footage.

Rivers began his NBA career with the San Antonio Spurs as a video coordinator during the 2004-05 season. Prior to joining the Spurs, he spent two years at Michigan State University. Rivers served as video coordinator under head coach Tom Izzo and the men's basketball team in 2003-04, and for the Spartans' women's basketball team during the 2002-03 season.



WILL DAWKINS

DIRECTOR OF COLLEGE PLAYER PERSONNEL

Will Dawkins begins his sixth year with the Thunder organization and his second as the team's Director of College Player Personnel. Dawkins first joined the Thunder as a front office intern in the summer of 2008 and has since served as assistant video coordinator and scouting coordinator before assuming his current position. In his current capacity, Dawkins is responsible for overseeing the college and international scouting departments in preparation for the NBA draft.

A native of Springfield, MA Dawkins led the High School of Commerce to the Division I State Championship, while earning the honor of Western Massachusetts Player of the Year. He went on to graduate from Emerson College with a degree in Broadcast Journalism. While at Emerson he served as captain of the men's basketball team and became a two time Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar.

DR. DONNIE STRACK DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL SERVICES

Dr. Strack begins his sixth season in Oklahoma City as the Director of Medical Services. He is responsible for leading the medical staff in providing comprehensive, evidence-based services for Thunder players through innovation, research, and integration of multiple health care professionals.

From 2005-2008, Dr. Strack was in private practice as a physical therapist at Orthopaedic Physical Therapy Services in Wellesley Hills, Mass. Dr. Strack graduated with a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2005. He earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2002 and was awarded the Athletic Training Department Performance Award that same year.

Dr. Strack's first role with an NBA team came in the sixth grade as a ball-boy for the Indiana Pacers. He later served as a Graduate Assistant athletic trainer for the Indiana Pacers from 2002-2005. Dr. Strack also served as an athletic trainer during the 2002 World Basketball Championships in Indianapolis and the RCA Tennis Championships in 2001 and 2002.

In 2010, Dr. Strack completed his post doctorate fellowship in manual therapy from Regis University. He is board certified in Orthopaedic Physical Therapy (OCS) by the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties and is a Fellow in the American Academy of Orthopaedic Manual Physical Therapists (FAACMPT). In addition to being a licensed physical therapist and athletic trainer, he is also a certified strength and conditioning specialist.

Dr. Strack is active in the Oklahoma City community, serving on the Board of Directors for Special CARE, an early intervention and specialized care school serving children with and without special needs. JOE SHARPE HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER

Joe Sharpe enters his sixth season as the head athletic trainer for the Thunder. Before joining the Thunder organization, Sharpe spent four seasons as head athletic trainer for the Charlotte Bobcats. Prior to Charlotte, Sharpe was the head strength and conditioning coach/assistant athletic trainer with the Minnesota Timberwolves for two seasons, which included the team's Midwest Division title and run to the Western Conference Finals.

TULSA 66ERS BASKETBALL OPERATIONS



DARKO RAJAKOVIC HEAD COACH

Darko Rajakovic (DAR-ko RYE-ah-koe-vich) enters his second season as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers. A Serbian native, Rajakovic is the first head coach born outside of North America in NBA D-League history. The 34-year-old boasts a diverse coaching background with an emphasis in player development.

In 2012-13, Rajakovic worked closely with the Thunder staff in developing Oklahoma City players on a record 40 NBA D-League assignments. Rajakovic led the 66ers to a 27-23 record, tying the franchise record for most wins under a first-year head coach. By winning times in the first 43 games, Rajakovic became the fastest Tulsa coach to achieve 25 career

wins with the 66ers

Prior to joining the 66ers, Rajakovic served for three years as the head coach of Espacio Torrelodones of the Spanish EBA League. In his first season (2007), Rajakovic led Torrelodones to the Primera Division de Baloncesto title, promoting the team to the Liga EBA. During Rajakovic's tenure, Torrelodones saw numerous players receive invitations to the youth national teams of Spain, Serbia, Montenegro, Denmark and Congo.

Rajakovic began his coaching career at 16 years old with BC Borac Cacak in Cacak, Serbia. As the youngest head coach in the team's history, Rajakovic coached Borac Cacak to two national tournaments. Multiple Borac Cacak players represented Serbia in international youth tournaments and two of Rajakovic's players were selected to Serbia's Senior National Team, competing at the European Championship and World Championship.

Following his three year stint in Cacak, Rajakovic was named the head coach of the U-20 and U-18 teams of Red Star Belgrade in Serbia's capital and largest city. At 19 years old, Rajakovic was again the youngest head coach in team history. The Serbian native focused his coaching efforts on developing and preparing his players to compete for Red Star's top team. Rajakovic also scouted and signed many of the players in Red Star's system. During his eight-year stint in Belgrade, Rajakovic led Red Star to two Serbian championships and several international club tournaments.

In 2007, Rajakovic left Red Star to begin his own basketball academy in Belgrade, focusing on individual development. Rajakovic would work with European players during their off months to improve their skills, primarily shooting, through video analysis and individual and group workouts. After three years of owning and managing the academy, Rajakovic accepted the head coach position with Espacio Torrelodones and moved to Madrid.

The Serbia native has also been active in many international tournaments and events including Basketball Without Borders, NBA and FIBA Camp and the Eurocamp in Treviso, Italy, in 2003 and 2004. In addition to his experience in Europe, Rajakovic has served as an assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs' NBA Summer League teams since 2004.

In his free time, Rajakovic enjoys jazz music, theatre and hiking. He received a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from BK University in Belgrade in 2006. Rajakovic speaks Serbian, Croatian and Bosnian languages as native, but is also fluent in English, Spanish and basic Greek.

On July 31, 2008, the Professional Basketball Club, LLC., owners of the Oklahoma City Thunder NBA franchise, purchased the Tulsa 66ers of the NBA Development League from Southwest Basketball, LLC. In 2008, Oklahoma City became the third NBA team to purchase an NBA D-League affiliate as sole owners of their affiliates.

Last season, the 66ers advanced to the NBA D-League semifinals for the third time in the past four seasons after posting a regular-season record of 27-23 under first-year head coach Darko Rajakovic.

Throughout the season, the Thunder and 66ers set an NBA D-League record with 40 different assignments from Oklahoma City to Tulsa. Five Thunder players made the trip to Tulsa throughout the year as Reggie Jackson, Perry Jones, Jeremy Lamb, DeAndre Liggins and Daniel Orton all donned 66ers uniforms.

Orton led the Thunder assignments with 29 games as a 66er. Reggie Jackson lead all OKC assignees in D-League averages with 28.0 points, 8.3 rebounds and 7.3 assists in his three appearances. The 66ers had at least one Oklahoma City assignee in uniform for 34 of their 50 regular-season games.

Tulsa's season also featured a pair of GATORADE Call-Ups when Orton joined the Thunder in early November and guard Chris Quinn signed with the Cleveland Cavaliers in March. Prior to his call-up, Quinn had averaged 12.7 points, 6.1 assists, 2.6 rebounds and 1.3 steals in 25 games.

66ers guard Andy Rautins broke the NBA D-League three-point record by sinking 152 field goals from behind the arc on .437 percent shooting in 2012-13. Rautins also claimed the 2013 NBA D-League Showcase Three-Point Shootout while teammate Dominique Sutton won the event's Slam Dunk Contest.

The 66ers play their home games in the SpiritBank Event Center in Bixby/South Tulsa. Built in 2008, the 4,500 seat Center is located within Regal Plaza Shopping Center at 104th and Memorial. The state-of-the-art building has hosted acts such as Lynyrd Skynyrd, ZZ Top, John Legend, Willie Nelson and Miranda Lambert.






Thunder Alley and Loud City have become a destination of pride for a core of energetic fans, while the Devon Thunder Kids Club is one of the most popular paid memberships in the league. Activation of the Blue Alliance, KIA Thunder Rewards Zone, a robust social media platform and diverse community programs serve to unite fans in the Thunder experience.

Previously, Byrnes served as executive vice president of business operations for the NHL's Phoenix Coyotes. In Phoenix, Byrnes led several initiatives to stimulate growth in ticket sales, ticket revenue, suite leases and corporate partnerships. He was also the catalyst for rebranding the organization with a new corporate identity, logos and team uniforms.

Prior to joining the Coyotes, Byrnes built nearly 10 years of experience with the NHL's Dallas Stars and MLB's Texas Rangers. 

CHESAPEAKE ENERGY ARENA is located in downtown Oklahoma City at the corner of Reno Avenue and Robinson Avenue. Chesapeake Energy Arena sits in the heart of a downtown renaissance, just steps away from the Cox Convention Center, as well as hotels, restaurants and entertainment venues in downtown Oklahoma City and Bricktown.

PARKING is available on a limited basis and can be requested by calling the Basketball Communications Department. Please confirm your credential and parking spot prior to arriving at the game. Media parking is located in the Cox Convention Center parking garage located just north of the Chesapeake Energy Arena. Media with confirmed parking should enter the Cox Center parking garage off Robinson street just north of Reno.

TELEPHONES are provided in the media workroom and, on a limited basis, courtside. A request for a dedicated phone line can be made by calling the public relations department 24 hours prior to tip-off.

MEDIA SEATING is located on the scorer's table, the second row scorer's table, section 116 and section 103. Media seats will be assigned by the Basketball Communications department and we ask that you please do not switch assigned seats without prior approval from the Basketball Communications department. Seating charts can be found in the media workroom.

MEDIA DINING is provided to working media and will be served in the media dining area 2.5 hours prior to tip-off on game day.

PHOTOGRAPHERS can find photo charts with their assigned spots in the media workroom. All lanes are assigned and photographers cannot switch assigned lanes without approval from a member of the Basketball Communications department. Please be considerate of fans seated directly behind you. For the safety of players, and in accordance with league rules, rubber lenses must be used and photographers are not allowed on the floor at anytime during the game. Remote cameras and tripods are not allowed on the floor. Use of a flash bulb is prohibited. **PHOTOGRAPHERS ARE PROHIBITED TO SHOOT FROM THE GRANDSTAND AREA WITHOUT PRIOR APPROVAL FROM THE PUBLIC RELATIONS DEPARTMENT.**

INTEGRIS Health Thunder Development Center

The Oklahoma City Thunder began calling the INTEGRIS Health Thunder Development Center home just prior to the start of the 2011-12 season. The 53,000 square foot state-of-the-art practice facility features two full-sized basketball courts, a 27-seat team classroom and a hydrotherapy area which was designed to benefit the Thunder's medical and training staff in the prevention and rehabilitation of injuries.

Funding for the construction of the practice facility and renovations to the team's Chesapeake Energy Arena comes from a one-cent sales tax approved by Oklahoma City voters on March 4, 2008. The 15-month tax took effect on

January 1, 2009 and ran through March 31, 2010. As part of the lease agreement, the Thunder will make an annual rent payment to the City of Oklahoma City.

During the groundbreaking ceremony in August of 2009, Oklahoma City Mayor

Mick Cornett commented, "Having the Thunder in Oklahoma City has been a tremendous sense of pride for our community. When the citizens of Oklahoma City passed the Big League City



initiative to renovate the city's downtown arena and build an NBA-leading practice facility, we all looked forward to this day."
