# SKY IN THE COMMUNITY

## **BEING ACTIVE IN THE COMMUNITY IS A HIGH PRIORITY FOR THE CHICAGO SKY.**

The Sky participates in numerous community projects throughout the year and focuses on building relationships with community groups and organizations. By getting involved in communities throughout the Chicagoland area, the Sky hopes to inspire fans to get involved.

### **WNBA Fit**

WNBA Fit encourages girls and women of all ages to learn more about their bodies and the importance of physical fitness through programs related to health, fitness, nutrition and self-esteem. Programming inspires girls and women to get started on “being fit” through small changes in their daily routine. The content of the program is communicated and delivered through a ‘Team’ of Spokespeople and National and Local Events. 2012 programming includes Sky players, coaches and staff running instructional basketball clinics throughout the year. A Chicago Sky Cares Fitness Festival will also take place prior to the July 13th game.

The fitness festival plus an in-game experience are designed to show youth age seven to sixteen different ways to get active. The Sky Cares Foundation works with local girl-serving organizations (Girls in theGame, Girls on the Run, GoGirlGo Chicago, Step Up Women’s Network, Chicago Park District and the Mayor’s Fitness Council as well as Chicago Public Schools) to identify youth from low income areas of Chicago and welcome them into an inspiring community of positive role-model volunteers. During the fitness festival various organizations show the kids how to get moving whether it’s play-

ing a sport, dancing or jumping double-dutch. At each station, the kids will watch and participate in demonstrations and interact with instructors, with the goal of helping them make a fitness plan. Following an afternoon at the fitness festival, the kids will participate in the excitement of a Chicago Sky game which affords an unforgettable opportunity for these kids to witness first hand the power and poise of professional female athletes and provides a motivating message of what can be accomplished through dedication, determination and discipline.

### **WNBA Cares Week of Service**

On May 11th the Chicago Sky, its Foundation – Sky Cares, the Chicago Sky Legacy Partners will join Samaritan’s Feet to provide one thousand new shoes for children in need in Chicago’s Austin community. Dedicated to providing children in need with new athletic shoes and socks, Samaritan’s Feet strives to instill both shoe recipients and volunteers with a life changing message of hope and respect for all people.

### **Anti-Bullying**

On June 13th the Sky will host a pre-game anti-bullying workshop with the Anti-Defamation League. The workshop will focus on how to become an ally when it comes to all forms of bullying.

### **Breast Health Awareness**

For sixteen years, the WNBA Breast Health Awareness program has focused on generating awareness and educating women about breast cancer in addition to raising funds for the initiative. The WNBA and its teams have raised over \$2.5 million to aid in the fight against breast cancer. The Chicago Sky will host its Breast Health Awareness game on September 20th.

As part of the day’s festivities, the Sky players will wear pink uniforms, and the Sky encourages all fans to wear pink in an effort to “pink out” the arena. At the game, breast cancer survivors will be honored guests, and a silent auction will take place where fans will have a chance to bid on the pink game jerseys, numerous sports experiences and autographed memorabilia from teams and athletes from the Chicagoland area as well as the WNBA.

### **Get Served By the Sky**

During the Olympic Break (Date TBD) the Chicago Sky players, coaches and staff will wait tables and bartend to collect tips to be donated directly to the American Diabetes Association. During this public event Sky fans will have the chance to get autographs and photos, all for a tip. The team will also host a raffle where fans can win unique autographed Sky memorabilia

# MICHAEL ALTER

## MICHAEL ALTER CHAIRMAN/PRINCIPLE OWNER



Sky owner Michael Alter, a Chicago native with a deep commitment to the city, is dedicated to his franchise and sees it as a way to encourage opportunities for young women in professional athletics. He holds strong beliefs that Chicago is the best sports town in the country, which is a big reason why he decided Chicago needed a WNBA team. Alter's values include hard work, education, excellence and sportsmanship, all characteristics he believes that will lead the Sky to succeed as both an organization and a team. Alter, who was recognized in the Crain's Chicago Business 40 under 40 list in 2000, is the President of Chicago-based The Alter Group, one of the nation's 10 largest commercial real estate developers. Since becoming President in 1995, he has transformed his family's company from a strong, regional office and industrial developer into one of the nation's preeminent privately held full-service real estate companies.

Today, the company has 6,700,000 square feet of space worth \$712,000,000 under development in 25 different markets across the nation, from Washington D.C. to Orange County, CA. Alter has created three new companies under The Alter Group umbrella in the last 7 years -- Alter+Care, EnTrust Realty Advisors and Alter Construction Group -- each of which has become a strong entity in its respective field.

In 1994, Alter founded City Year Chicago, a cutting-edge, non-profit, national-service program which is best known for its signature program, the City Year Youth Service Corps. The goal of the program is to bring together approximately 1,000 people ranging in age from 17-24 from diverse backgrounds and hold them to a full-time commitment of a year of community service, leadership development and civic engagement where they mentor children. During City Year's existence, more than 1 million hours

of service in local communities has been logged. When asked why he thought to bring a WNBA franchise to Chicago, Alter stated, "For me, it was like meeting Ernie Banks or Bill Russell in their prime. I was so impressed, not only by the WNBA players' prowess as athletes but their intelligence, their passion, their dignity and their power to inspire. After meeting these amazing women and learning more about the WNBA, it did not make sense to me that the third largest city in the country, and frankly, in my opinion, the best sports town in the country, did not have a WNBA team."

Alter has a Bachelor of Arts degree in government from Harvard University and a law degree from the University of Chicago. He and his wife Ellen are parents of three children, all of whom are interested in sports and keep their parents very busy. They live in Winnetka, IL.

# MARGARET STENDER

## MARGARET STENDER CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY OWNER



As the first employee, Margaret Stender served as the founding President and CEO of the Chicago Sky for the first six years of this WNBA franchise. She led the team development from a vision and a dream to a thriving multifaceted professional organization. Margaret has overseen several milestones: a growing passionate fan base, partnerships with many diverse businesses, the venue move to Allstate Arena, a monumental T.V. broadcast schedule, the creation of the Chicago Sky Cares Foundation plus an exceptional athlete roster which includes three WNBA all-stars, one who also plays on Team USA.

“We have been proud to introduce our world-class athletes as exceptional role models,” said Stender. “It has been rewarding to showcase strong accomplished women as an inspiration and a force for positive social change.”

Margaret experienced corporate success prior to joining the Sky throughout her 22 years in business while holding positions that included: President of the Juice Drinks for PepsiCo, President for Quaker Oats Ready-To-Eat Cereals and Senior VP/GM of Travel Solutions for Rand McNally.

Stender attended the University of Richmond where she was a three sport student athlete and was elected co-captain of the basketball team for three years. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education and Masters Degree in Business Administration from the University of Virginia.

Margaret, originally from Virginia, resides on the north side of Chicago with her two school-aged children. She serves on the Boards of The Latin School of Chicago and the Girl Scouts of Greater Chicago & Northwest Indiana. She is also a member of The Chicago Network.

## ADAM FOX PRESIDENT AND CEO



In his second year as President and CEO of the Chicago Sky, Adam Fox oversees team operations in all matters pertaining to the day-to-day functioning of the franchise on the administrative side of the organization.

Adam Fox is the Sky's second Chief Executive Officer since the company's formation in 2005 and brings nearly 20 years of executive sports experience to the top of the Sky front office. He was promoted to the position on October 1, 2010. Fox had joined the team in October 2007 as Chief Operating Officer.

Fox's plans to have the Sky focused on winning basketball games and growing the fan base have had tremendous results. In 2011 the Sky's attendance increased by an impressive 29%, and he intends to further that momentum through ticket sales, sponsorship sales, and creating large-scale awareness.

"We have built a solid foundation here on which to expand," said Fox. "Moving forward our short term goal is to continue to keep the upward trend we have going. Long term it's about making the Sky and women's basketball part of the regular sports fabric in this city and beyond."

Prior to joining the Sky, Fox spent 14 years with the Chicago Wolves of the American Hockey League. During his time with the Wolves, the '02, '00 and '98 AHL Champions, Fox took on a variety of roles including ticket sales, managing merchandise, sponsorships sales, directing game operations and ultimately leading the front office as the Executive Vice President of Business Operations for his final eight years with the team.

For five years leading up to his time with the Wolves, Fox worked in sales and sports marketing. For three years Fox worked for Elite Sports Marketing, operating temporary sports memorabilia stores at major sporting events around the country. Fox also spent two years as district manager for Retail Star, Inc.

Fox graduated from Indiana University in 1989 with a degree in speech. He and his wife Brooke have two daughters and live in the northern suburbs.

## **POKEY CHATMAN** **HEAD COACH/GENERAL MANAGER**



Now in her second season coaching in the WNBA, Pokey Chatman is driven to bring success to the Sky organization.

Chatman was named head coach of the Chicago Sky on Oct. 29, 2010. In the 2011 season, Chatman led a young Sky squad to a 14-20 record with a winning record at home for only the second time in the organization's history. Through sheer determination, she rallied the team to beat several of the most talented teams in the league. An expert at guiding young, talented players, the organization's future looks promising.

Chatman came to the Sky after coaching professional women's basketball in Russia and 15 years on the coaching staff at Louisiana State University (LSU), her alma mater.

She served two seasons as an assistant coach for the Russian Spartak Moscow Region before being promoted to head coach in 2010. That year, she led her team to a perfect 16-0 record in Euroleague, the most competitive European basketball league, and also claimed the esteemed 2010 Euroleague Championship.

Chatman also helped coach the traditionally unsuccessful Slovakian national women's team narrowly miss a spot in the FIBA World Championship.

Chatman was named head coach of the LSU Lady Tigers in the 2003-2004 season, when Sue Gunter was forced to take medical leave mid-season. Chatman went a remarkable 47-3 in her first 50 games as head coach, the second best starting record in women's basketball history. She later took the Tigers to three consecutive finished in the Final Four. In her first full season as head coach, she was named the U.S. Basketball Writers Association National Coach of the Year, Women's Basketball Coaches Association National Coach of the Year, Naismith National Coach of the Year, and the Victor Award Female Coach of the Year. Chatman earned a coaching record of 90-14 with the Lady Tigers in three seasons as head coach and 15 seasons overall.

She has earned two gold medals with USA basketball, one as a player for the Junior National Team in 1987 and another as an assistant coach of the World University Team in 2005.

As an LSU point guard from 1987-1991, Chatman led the Lady Tigers to their first ever SEC Tournament title in 1991, and earned recognition as the tournament's MVP. In her college career, she was named All-SEC three times, named Kodak All-American in 1991, and set 20 school records.

Chatman earned her Bachelor's Degree from LSU in December of 1991. She is originally from Ama, Louisiana.

# ASSISTANT COACHES

## JEFF HOUSE ASSISTANT COACH



Jeff House returns to Chicago for his second season, bringing over 25 years of basketball coaching experience at the NBA, WNBA, college and high school levels.

House started his professional basketball career in New York as a member of the Knicks game night video staff in 1998. That same year, he served the New York Liberty under Nancy Darsch as video coordinator and advance scout. When Richie Adubato took over as head coach of the Liberty in 1999, House was promoted to assistant coach and took on that role full time. He served the team in that position until 2004, and was an instrumental part of the team's 1999, 2000, and 2002 Eastern Conference Championships.

House joined the Washington Mystics as its top assistant coach in 2005. After one season, House took the recruiting coordinator and assistant coaching position at the University of Virginia. House helped propel the Virginia women's basketball program to the top of the Atlantic Coast Conference by bringing in top-ranked recruiting classes in each of his four years with the program. House was instrumental in the recruiting development of Monica Wright, who was chosen by the Minnesota Lynx as the second overall pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft. He also played a role in recruiting 2009 draft picks Aisha Mohammed (Minnesota) and Lyndra Littles (Connecticut). Relocating to Virginia in 2006,

House started his own basketball website, AllBasketballReview.com. He has also acted as an outside consultant for several college basketball teams, helping elevate aspects of their program including practice and recruiting as well as their players. House works in the Virginia Basketball Academy on the development of a Pre-K through 4th grade league that launched in 2011, focusing on character development through the game of basketball.

House's coaching career began while he was still in college, getting his start in 1985 under former Houston Rockets Head Coach Jeff Van Gundy at McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester, NY. Since then, he has had the opportunity to work with a number of top coaches, later coaching at UMass Lowell under current Orlando Head Coach Stan Van Gundy, and Bob Wenzel at Rutgers University. House played college basketball at Nazareth College in Rochester, NY before suffering a career-ending injury.

House received his bachelor's degree from Nazareth in 1987 in art education. He earned a master's degree in teaching, guidance and counseling from Jackson University in 1991. House and his wife, Ann Leonard-House, who is the former Head Coach of women's volleyball at UMass-Lowell and Rutgers, reside in Virginia in the off-season with their two children.

## CHRISTIE SIDES ASSISTANT COACH



Christie Sides returns to the Sky for her second season to coach side by side once again with Pokey Chatman. She has nine years of coaching experience at the college, international and professional levels. Over this past off-season Sides coached overseas with head coach Pokey Chatman in Russia for Spartak Moscow Region.

Since 2008, Sides has been an assistant on Spartak Moscow Region in Russia, where she helped Head Coach Pokey Chatman lead Spartak to consecutive FIBA EuroLeague Championships in 2008 and 2009. Sides has also served as an assistant on the Slovakian Women's National Team coaching staff since 2008 helping the team qualify for the European Championships in 2009, 2010 and 2011. The Slovaks took eighth place in 2009, their highest finish of Sides' tenure.

From 2004-2007 Sides was an assistant on the Louisiana State University staff also under Coach Chatman. She helped guide the Lady Tigers program to three Final Fours and two Southeastern Conference regular season titles in her three seasons with the team. Prior to LSU, Sides spent the 2003-04 season at Louisiana Tech as an assistant coach.

Sides began her coaching career as the head junior varsity coach and assistant varsity coach at Ruston (La.) High School where she served under Ricky Durrett. While at Ruston, Sides helped guide the Lady Bearcats to consecutive state playoff appearances.

Athletically, Sides played her first two collegiate seasons at Ole Miss for Hall of Fame coach Van Chancellor and helped the Rebels to a 34-22 overall record. She then transferred to Louisiana Tech where she finished her playing career for fellow Hall of Fame coach Leon Barmore. Sides helped the Lady Techsters to a 61-6 record in two seasons, including a trip to the 1999 Final Four. She holds the career record at Tech for three-point field goal percentage and ranks seventh in three-pointers made and eighth in three-pointer attempted.

Earlier in her playing career, Sides led Central Private High School to the state championship her senior season while earning the Louisiana Gatorade Player of the Year award and all-state honors. She ended her high school playing career ranked No. 1 in school history with 3,375 points.

Sides is a native of Baton Rouge, Louisiana.



On April 24, 1996, women's basketball announced "We Got Next" as the NBA Board of Governors approved the concept of a Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) to begin play in June 1997.

Since that day in 1996, there have been many firsts for the WNBA:

Val Ackerman -- the first president of the WNBA  
Sheryl Swoopes -- the first player signed to the WNBA

Cynthia Cooper -- the league's first Most Valuable Player

Houston Comets -- the first WNBA Champions  
Lisa Leslie -- the first WNBA player to dunk

(7/30/02 vs. Miami)

Lauren Jackson -- the first international player to win MVP (2007)

Candace Parker -- the first rookie to earn the league's MVP honor (2008)

Sylvia Fowles -- the first goaltending call (6/3/2008 vs. LA)

The inaugural WNBA season tipped off on June 21, 1997, with the New York Liberty taking on the Los Angeles Sparks at the Great Western Forum in Inglewood, Calif. A crowd of 14,284 watched as Sparks guard Penny Toler scored the first basket in WNBA history. The Liberty defeated the Sparks, 67-57.

Fifteen years later, in a rematch of those same two teams at Staples Center in Los Angeles, the increased skill, talent, and athleticism of WNBA players was evident as the Sparks, led by center/forward Candace Parker, defeated the Liberty 96-91. In 2011, the league also selected its "Top 15 Players of All Time." Voting was conducted among fans, media, and current players and coaches. Those named to the list were Sue Bird,

## A GROWING GAME

The influence of the WNBA can be seen in the explosive growth of organized women's basketball over the past 14 seasons. An estimated 100 million women play basketball worldwide, and the league reflects this trend, featuring 20 international players from 13 countries and territories at the end of the 2010 season. Female AAU youth basketball participation has increased 277 percent since 1991 (from 28,840 to 108,758 players). Female high school basketball participation has increased 17 percent since 1991 (from 387,802 to 456,967 players). And female NCAA basketball participation has increased 43 percent since 1991 (from 10,551 to 15,096 players).

The San Antonio Silver Stars and the AT&T Center hosted the 2011 WNBA All-Star Game presented by adidas in San Antonio on Saturday, July 23, 2011.

The first WNBA All-Star Game was held in New York at Madison Square Garden in 1999. The Garden also hosted the event in 2003 and in 2006. Washington's Verizon Center (2002, 2007) is the other venue to host the game multiple times. Other All-Star Games were played in Phoenix (2000), Orlando (2001), and at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. (2009). Due to the Olympics, no All-Star Game was held in 2004 and 2008, although Radio City Music Hall in New York City was the site of an exhibition game on August 5, 2004, as the U.S. National Team, comprised mainly of WNBA greats, faced a squad of WNBA All-Stars in "WNBA vs. USA Basketball: The Game at Radio City." In 2010, the WNBA held a special event called "WNBA vs. USA Basketball: The Stars at the Sun" at Mohegan Sun Arena in order to accommodate the FIBA World Championship schedule.

## INSPIRING WOMEN

The Inspiring Woman Award is an annual honor that celebrates an individual who, on a daily basis, demonstrates her ability to inspire others through her commitment, passion and dedication to work, family, and community. Past honorees include Emmy-award winning news anchor Katie Couric (2011), U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Susan Rice (2010), Emmy-award winning journalist Cokie Roberts (2009), Good Morning America's Robin Roberts (2008), Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice (2007), and the WNBA All-Decade Team (2006).

## DAWN STALEY AWARD

The Dawn Staley Community Leadership Award was announced in 2006 and is now presented annually to the player who best exemplifies the characteristics of a leader in the community and reflects Staley's contagious leadership, spirit, charitable efforts, and love for the game. Winners include Charde Houston (2010), Chamique Holdsclaw (2009), Tamika Raymond (2008), and Tamika Catchings (2007). A member of the WNBA's All-Decade Team, Staley, who retired following the 2006 season, established herself as one of the greatest ambassadors in women's basketball history, while also demonstrating outstanding leadership qualities as a coach on the collegiate level and as a philanthropist and humanitarian.

## MARKETING

The WNBA maintains marketing, promotional, and media partnerships with a variety of top companies, each with varying levels of activation and integration in league operations.

The WNBA's marketing partners utilize the league to support women's sports and reach its strong fanbase of women, families, and young girls through advertising in WNBA nationally

televised games, national promotions, player endorsements, and special events.

On Aug. 22, 2011 the WNBA and Boost Mobile, an industry leader in no-contract wireless service, announced a landmark multiyear marketing partnership that makes Boost Mobile the first leaguwide marquee partner of the WNBA. As the league's most prominent partner, Boost Mobile is tied closely to the WNBA brand on a national level. As part of this partnership, the Boost Mobile brand is prominently featured on the front of the game jerseys of 10 teams. Additionally, special programming highlighting the "WNBA's Top 15 Moments presented by Boost Mobile" is included as part of the league's 15th season celebration.

The WNBA has an extensive, highly integrated relationship with adidas. The sporting goods and apparel giant has served as the official outfitter of the WNBA, having unveiled new uniforms across the league in 2007 and again in 2011. In 2008, adidas became the first-ever presenting partner of the WNBA's entire postseason, including both the playoffs and Finals, and was the presenting partner for the 2011 WNBA All-Star Game.

Five WNBA teams have entered the league's Marquee Partnership program, which includes multiyear deals featuring branded sponsorship of game jerseys – the Phoenix Mercury partnering with LifeLock, the Los Angeles Sparks with Farmers Insurance Group, the Seattle Storm with Microsoft search engine Bing, the New York Liberty with Foxwoods Resort Casino, and the Washington Mystics with Inova Health System. the Washington Mystics with Inova Health System.

# WNBA HISTORY

## ATTENDANCE/ TV RATINGS

In 2011, WNBA attendance increased for the fifth consecutive year and regular-season TV viewership on ESPN2 reached its highest level since 2005, as fans responded to one of the most compelling seasons in the league's 15-year history.

Viewership for the league's showcase events also increased. Viewership for the WNBA All-Star Game on ABC was up 46 percent vs. the last All-Star on ABC in 2009 (there was no All-Star Game in 2010). Viewership for the 2011 WNBA Finals was up four percent over the 2010 championship series. U.S. ratings for the first round of the 2011 WNBA Draft on ESPN increased 47 percent vs. the first round of 2010 Draft on ESPN2.

The WNBA's broadcast coverage in 2011 included more than two dozen high-definition regular-season playoffs and Finals games on ESPN2 and ABC, as well as 70 regular-season games and up to six playoff games on NBA TV. In addition, all WNBA games were available online via WNBA

LiveAccess unless: (a) They were televised on ABC or ESPN2 – in which case they streamed live on ESPN3.com and were later archived to WNBA.com, or (b) Their game window fell within a national broadcast window on ABC or ESPN2.

In July 2007, the WNBA signed a new, eight-year TV deal with ESPN that tipped off in 2009 and runs through 2016, the WNBA's 20th season. The agreement, which calls for ABC, ESPN, and ESPN2 to telecast WNBA games, includes rights fees, a first for any women's professional team sports league in the U.S.

## DIGITAL / SOCIAL MEDIA

WNBA Digital assets continued to increase in popularity as WNBA.com saw continued growth during the 2011 season, with daily unique visits up 13 percent and overall visits up 11 percent. WNBA games streamed online at WNBA.com via LiveAccess saw a 55 percent increase in unique users. In terms of social media, the WNBA YouTube channel experienced a 35 percent increase in video views this season. The WNBA Facebook page ([HYPERLINK "http://www.Facebook.com/wnba"](http://www.Facebook.com/wnba) [www.Facebook.com/](http://www.Facebook.com/)

wnba) saw an 11 percent increase in fans.

## GLOBAL REACH

The WNBA has a wide impact on overseas markets. In 2011, WNBA games and programming reached a record 203 countries in 25 languages. In addition, for the sixth consecutive year, fans around the globe are able to view WNBA action via live Webcasts on WNBA.com.

End-of-season 2011 WNBA rosters featured 15 international players from seven countries and territories. Among the league's international contingent are the three-time MVP, Seattle Storm forward/center Lauren Jackson (Australia), the Indiana Fever's Tammy Sutton-Brown (Canada), the San Antonio Silver Stars' Sophia Young (St. Vincent), the Los Angeles Sparks' Ticha Penicheiro (Portugal), and Tulsa's Liz Cambage (Australia), whom the Shock selected with the No. 2 overall pick in the 2011 Draft.



The 2012 WNBA Draft presented by Boost Mobile took place on April 16 at ESPN headquarters in Bristol, Conn. It was the second straight year in which the league's draft was held on the ESPN campus. The Los Angeles Sparks selected Stanford University forward Nnemkadi Ogumike as the No. 1 overall pick. The Seattle Storm selected Shekinna Stricklen second, the Minnesota Lynx tabbed Devereaux Peters third, the Tulsa Shock chose Glory Johnson fourth, and the San Antonio Silver Stars took Jantel Lavender fifth to round out the first five selections. In 2011, Maya Moore, selected No. 1 overall by the Lynx, went on to become the fifth top pick in the past six seasons to win Rookie of the Year honors.

## OWNERSHIP

Six WNBA teams now fall under the independent ownership model: the Atlanta Dream, Chicago Sky, Connecticut Sun, Los Angeles Sparks, Seattle Storm, and Tulsa Shock.

The Tulsa Shock (formerly Detroit), which began play in Tulsa in 2010, is owned by Tulsa Pro Hoops L.L.C. The Connecticut Sun, which began operation in 2003 after relocating from Orlando, is owned by the Mohegan Tribe. The Chicago Sky is owned by Michael Alter.

## KEY HIGHLIGHTS

Entering the 2012 season, 10 women also serve as majority or minority owners of WNBA teams: Dr. Sheila Johnson (Washington Mystics); Paula Madison, Kathy Goodman and Carla Christofferson (Los Angeles Sparks); Mary Brock and Kelly Loeffler (Atlanta); and Dawn Trudeau, Ginny Gilder, and Lisa Brummel of Force 10 Hoops L.L.C. (Seattle Storm). A 10th, musical artist Michelle Williams, formerly of "Destiny's Child," is a minority owner of the Chicago Sky.

On, Aug. 26, 2011, retired three-time league

MVP Lisa Leslie became the first former WNBA player to become part owner of a team when she joined the existing ownership group of the Los Angeles Sparks led by Paula Madison and investors Kathy Goodman and Carla Christofferson.

In 2010, Tina Thompson of the Los Angeles Sparks became the all-time scoring leader with 6,413 points, surpassing her former teammate, Lisa Leslie (6,263) who retired following the 2009 season.

Tina Charles won the 2010 WNBA Rookie of the Year award after averaging 15.5 ppg, 11.7 rpg, and 1.7 bpg, while also setting league records for most rebounds (398) and doubles-doubles (22) in a season.

Lauren Jackson won the 2010 WNBA MVP presented by Kia Motors award and also took home 2010 WNBA Finals MVP honors.

Jackson also became the third player to earn WNBA MVP honors three times (2003, 2007, 2010), joining the Sparks' Lisa Leslie (2001, 2004, 2006) and the Houston Comets' Sheryl Swoopes (2000, 2002, 2005). Houston's Cynthia Cooper earned the award twice (1997, 1998). The others to capture MVP honors are the Sacramento Monarchs' Yolanda Griffith (1999), the Sparks' Candace Parker (2008, when she became the first rookie in league history to earn the award), and the Phoenix Mercury's Diana Taurasi (2009).

Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks became the first – and only – WNBA player to capture the regular-season, All-Star, and Finals MVP awards in the same season (2001).

Candace Parker became the first WNBA player to win Rookie of the Year and Most Valuable Player in the same season (2008). The first selection in the 2008 WNBA Draft, she earned

both honors after leading the league in double-doubles and rebounds per game, while also ranking second in blocks per game and fourth in points per game.

Lauren Jackson became the WNBA's youngest (26 years, 77 days) and fastest (209 games) to score her 4,000th career point on July 27, 2007. Diana Taurasi subsequently surpassed Jackson as the fastest to 4,000 points in terms of fewest games played when she reached the milestone on July 27, 2009 in just 197 games.

Taurasi rewrote the WNBA scoring records in 2006 when she led the league with 25.3 points per contest, became the first WNBA player to top 800 points in a single season (860), and the single-season mark for three-point field-goals (121), and the single-game mark for points (47, a number later equaled by the Storm's Lauren Jackson in 2007).

Sheryl Swoopes, who earned MVP and Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2000 and 2002, recorded the league's first triple-double (14 points, 15 rebounds, 10 assists) vs. the Detroit Shock on July 27, 1999.

Lisa Leslie became the first player to dunk in a WNBA game when she did so on July 30, 2002 versus the Miami Sol. Candace Parker, also of the Sparks, was the second, dunking versus the Indiana Fever on June 22, 2008.

## WNBA CARES

Through the WNBA Cares initiative, the league is deeply committed to creating programs that improve the quality of life for all people, with a special emphasis on promoting health and wellness, youth and family development, and education. WNBA teams and players donate countless dollars and hours each year through league programs including WNBA FIT, Breast Health Awareness, and WNBA Green.
