

## SKY IN THE COMMUNITY

### **BEING ACTIVE IN THE COMMUNITY IS A HIGH PRIORITY FOR THE CHICAGO SKY.**

The Sky participates in numerous community projects throughout the year and focuses on building relationships with community groups and organizations. By getting involved in communities throughout the Chicagoland area, the Sky hopes to inspire fans to get involved.

#### **WNBA Fit**

WNBA Fit encourages girls and women of all ages to learn more about their bodies and the importance of physical fitness through programs related to health, fitness, nutrition and self-esteem. The WNBA Fit programming inspires girls and women to start “being fit” through small changes in their daily routine. The content of the program is communicated and delivered through a “Team” of spokespeople and national and local events. In 2013, Sky players, coaches and staff will run instructional basketball clinics throughout the year. On June 9, the Sky will host a Move-A-Palooza event for the Girl Scouts. A Youth Sports Night will take place prior to Sky’s June 29 game against the Los Angeles Sparks.

This programming plus an in-game experience is designed to show youth, ages 7 to 18, how to get active. The Sky Cares Foundation works with local girl-serving organizations (Girls in the Game, Girls on the Run, GoGirlGo Chicago, Step UP Women’s Network, the Chicago Park District, the Mayor’s Fitness Council and Chicago Public Schools) to identify youth from low-income areas of Chicago and welcome them into an inspiring community of positive role models. During the Move-A-Palooza and Youth

Sports events various organizations will introduce the kids to a variety of different sports and ways to stay active. Following each event, the kids will participate in the excitement of a Chicago Sky game. This affords them an unforgettable opportunity to witness firsthand the power and poise of professional female athletes. It also sends a motivating message of what can be accomplished with dedication, determination and discipline.

#### **WNBA Cares Week of Service**

On May 22, the Chicago Sky, its Foundation — Sky Cares and the Chicago Sky Legacy Partners will join No Kid Hungry and Greater Chicago Food Depository to work a “Choice Market” at Beidler Elementary School. There, approximately 100 families in need will have the opportunity to shop for groceries and interact with the Sky players and coaches.

#### **No Kid Hungry Illinois**

The Chicago Sky has partnered with No Kid Hungry for the 2013 season. In addition to the May 22 Cares Week Service event, the Sky will host a food truck meet-up in the parking lot of Allstate Arena. The meet-up will take place prior to the June 2 game against the Tulsa Shock. A portion of food purchased at the event will go to No Kid Hungry Illinois. Players will also participate in the No Kid Hungry Summer Feeding Program throughout the season. To learn more

#### **Breast Health Awareness**

For over 16 years, the WNBA Breast Health Awareness program has generated awareness, educated women about breast cancer and raised funds for the initiative. The WNBA and its teams have raised over \$2.5 million to aid in the fight against breast cancer. This season, the Chicago Sky has partnered with the American Cancer Society. As part of this partnership, the Sky has created a “Pink Ticket” package. The package includes a ticket to the Aug. 23 game against New York and a pink Sky t-shirt. The Chicago Sky will donate \$5 dollars to the American Cancer Society for every “Pink Ticket” package sold.

As part of the day’s festivities, the Sky players will wear pink uniforms. We encourage all fans to also wear pink in an effort to “pink out” the arena. At the game, breast cancer survivors will be honored guests. During a silent auction, fans will have a chance to bid on the pink game jerseys, future sports experiences and autographed memorabilia from teams and athletes from the Chicagoland area and the WNBA.



## MICHAEL ALTER

### MICHAEL ALTER CHAIRMAN/PRINCIPLE OWNER



Sky owner Michael Alter, a Chicago native with a deep commitment to the city, is dedicated to his franchise and sees it as a way to encourage opportunities for young women in professional athletics. He holds strong beliefs that Chicago is the best sports town in the country, which is a big reason why he decided Chicago needed a WNBA team. Alter's values include hard work, education, excellence and sportsmanship, all characteristics he believes that will lead the Sky to succeed as both an organization and a team. Alter, who was recognized in the Crain's Chicago Business 40 under 40 list in 2000, is the President of Chicago-based The Alter Group, one of the nation's 10 largest commercial real estate developers. Since becoming President in 1995, he has transformed his family's company from a strong, regional office and industrial developer into one of the nation's preeminent privately held full-service real estate companies.

Today, the company has 6,700,000 square feet of space worth \$712,000,000 under development in 25 different markets across the nation, from Washington D.C. to Orange County, CA. Alter has created three new companies under The Alter Group umbrella in the last 7 years -- Alter+Care, EnTrust Realty Advisors and Alter Construction Group -- each of which has become a strong entity in its respective field.

In 1994, Alter founded City Year Chicago, a cutting-edge, non-profit, national-service program which is best known for its signature program, the City Year Youth Service Corps. The goal of the program is to bring together approximately 1,000 people ranging in age from 17-24 from diverse backgrounds and hold them to a full-time commitment of a year of community service, leadership development and civic engagement where they mentor children. During City Year's existence, more than 1 million hours

of service in local communities has been logged. When asked why he thought to bring a WNBA franchise to Chicago, Alter stated, "For me, it was like meeting Ernie Banks or Bill Russell in their prime. I was so impressed, not only by the WNBA players' prowess as athletes but their intelligence, their passion, their dignity and their power to inspire. After meeting these amazing women and learning more about the WNBA, it did not make sense to me that the third largest city in the country, and frankly, in my opinion, the best sports town in the country, did not have a WNBA team."

Alter has a Bachelor of Arts degree in government from Harvard University and a law degree from the University of Chicago. He and his wife Ellen are parents of three children, all of whom are interested in sports and keep their parents very busy. They live in Winnetka, IL.

## MARGARET STENDER

### **MARGARET STENDER** **CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY OWNER**



As the first employee, Margaret Stender served as the founding President and CEO of the Chicago Sky for the first six years of this WNBA franchise. She led the team development from a vision and a dream to a thriving multifaceted professional organization. Margaret has overseen several milestones: a growing passionate fan base, partnerships with many diverse businesses, the venue move to Allstate Arena, a monumental TV broadcast schedule, the creation of the Chicago Sky Cares Foundation plus an exceptional athlete roster which includes three WNBA all-stars, one who also plays on Team USA.

"We have been proud to introduce our world-class athletes as exceptional role models," said Stender. "It has been rewarding to showcase strong accomplished women as an inspiration and a force for positive social change."

Margaret experienced corporate success prior to joining the Sky throughout her 22 years in business while holding positions that included: President of the Juice Drinks for PepsiCo, President for Quaker Oats Ready-To-Eat Cereals and Senior VP/GM of Travel Solutions for Rand McNally.

Stender attended the University of Richmond where she was a three sport student athlete and was elected co-captain of the basketball team for three years. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education and Masters Degree in Business Administration from the University of Virginia.

Margaret, originally from Virginia, resides on the north side of Chicago with her two school-aged children. She serves on the Boards of The Latin School of Chicago and the Girl Scouts of Greater Chicago & Northwest Indiana. She is also a member of The Chicago Network.

## ADAM FOX

### ADAM FOX PRESIDENT AND CEO



In his third year as President and CEO of the Chicago Sky, Adam Fox oversees team operations in all matters pertaining to the day-to-day functioning of the franchise on the administrative side of the organization.

Adam Fox is the Sky's second Chief Executive Officer since the company's formation in 2005 and brings nearly 20 years of executive sports experience to the top of the Sky front office. He was promoted to the position on October 1, 2010. Fox had joined the team in October 2007 as Chief Operating Officer.

Fox's plans to have the Sky focused on winning basketball games and growing the fan base have had tremendous results. In 2011 the Sky's attendance increased by an impressive 29%, and he intends to further that momentum through ticket sales, sponsorship sales, and creating large-scale awareness.

"We have built a solid foundation here on which to expand," said Fox. "Moving forward our short term goal is to continue to keep the upward trend we have going. Long term it's about making the Sky and women's basketball part of the regular sports fabric in this city and beyond."

Prior to joining the Sky, Fox spent 14 years with the Chicago Wolves of the American Hockey League. During his time with the Wolves, the '02, '00 and '98 AHL Champions, Fox took on a variety of roles including ticket sales, managing merchandise, sponsorships sales, directing game operations and ultimately leading the front office as the Executive Vice President of Business Operations for his final eight years with the team.

For five years leading up to his time with the Wolves, Fox worked in sales and sports marketing. For three years Fox worked for Elite Sports Marketing, operating temporary sports memorabilia stores at major sporting events around the country. Fox also spent two years as district manager for Retail Star, Inc.

Fox graduated from Indiana University in 1989 with a degree in speech. He and his wife Brooke have two daughters and live in the northern suburbs.







## HEAD COACH/GENERAL MANAGER

### **POKEY CHATMAN** **HEAD COACH/GENERAL MANAGER**



Now in her third season coaching in the WNBA, Pokey Chatman is driven to bring success to the Sky organization.

Chatman was named head coach of the Chicago Sky on Oct. 29, 2010. In the 2011 season, Chatman led a young Sky squad to a 14-20 record with a winning record at home for only the second time in the organization's history. In 2012 Chatman's squad went through its share of injuries on its way to another 14-20 record, barely missing the playoffs. Through sheer determination, she rallied the team to beat several of the most talented teams in the league. Finally, in 2013, with the right pieces in place, Chatman led the Sky to its first winning season and its first ever playoff appearance. The Sky finished the season with a 24-10 record, good for a first place finish in the Eastern Conference. She is now the winningest coach in the franchise history with a 52-50 record.

Chatman came to the Sky after coaching professional women's basketball in Russia and 15 years on the coaching staff at Louisiana State University (LSU), her alma mater.

She served two seasons as an assistant coach for the Russian Spartak Moscow Region before being promoted to head coach in 2010. That year, she led her team to a perfect 16-0 record in Euroleague, the most competitive European basketball league, and also claimed the esteemed 2010 Euroleague Championship.

Chatman also helped coach the traditionally unsuccessful Slovakian national women's team narrowly miss a spot in the FIBA World Championship.

Chatman was named head coach of the LSU Lady Tigers in the 2003-2004 season, when Sue Gunter was forced to take medical leave mid-season. Chatman went a remarkable 47-3 in her first 50 games as head coach, the second best starting record in women's basketball history. She later took the Tigers to three consecutive finishes in the Final Four. In her first full season as head coach, she was named the U.S. Basketball Writers Association National Coach of the Year, Women's Basketball Coaches Association National Coach of the Year, Naismith National Coach of the Year, and the Victor Award Female Coach of the Year. Chatman earned a coaching record of 90-14 with the Lady Tigers in three seasons as head coach and 15 seasons overall.

She has earned two gold medals with USA basketball, one as a player for the Junior National Team in 1987 and another as an assistant coach of the World University Team in 2005.

As an LSU point guard from 1987-1991, Chatman led the Lady Tigers to their first ever SEC Tournament title in 1991, and earned recognition as the tournament's MVP. In her college career, she was named All-SEC three times, named Kodak All-American in 1991, and set 20 school records.

Chatman earned her Bachelor's Degree from LSU in December of 1991. She is originally from Amite, Louisiana.

Rollins has served as assistant coach to the Orlando Magic, Washington Wizards and Indiana Pacers. He was named the head coach of the Greenville Groove, of the NBA D-League, in 2002. Rollins’ joined the Washington Mystics coaching staff as assistant in 2006 before being named head coach in 2007. He has also worked with post players during Memphis Grizzlies’ training camp and served as head coach of the American Basketball League (ABL) team the Hartland Eagles out of in Sebring, Florida.

Rollins was taken as the 14th overall pick of the 1977 draft by the Atlanta Hawks. He had a successful 18-year NBA career playing for the Atlanta Hawks, Cleveland Cavaliers, Detroit Pistons, Houston Rockets and Orlando Magic. In Rollins’ 1,156 game appearances, he averaged 2.2 blocked shots per game and received NBA All-Defensive First and Second Team honors. He advanced to the playoffs in 15 of his 18 seasons and currently ranks ninth all-time in career blocked shots (2,542). He is the all-time leader in blocks in Atlanta Hawks history with 2,283 and ranked among the top ten shot blockers in each of his first nine seasons. In 1983, he led the league in shot blocking with 4.3 blocks per game and 343 total blocks.

In 1997 he joined former NBA players Dale Davis and Dikembe Mutombo on the NBA’s South Africa Tour. The tour involved youth basketball camps, clinics and motivational speeches.

He attended Clemson University where he was ranked one of the Top 10 ACC Basketball Players three years in a row (1974-1977). He is the only Clemson basketball player to average a double-double four straight seasons and was the first athlete in any sport at Clemson to have their jersey retired. In 2003, Rollins was named to the 50th Anniversary ACC Men’s Basketball Team.

Other career honors for Tree include being inducted into the South Carolina State Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002, the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame in 2007, and the African American Ethnic Sports Hall of Fame in 2007. His high school, Crisp County High School in Georgia, also retired his jersey in 2008.

Rollins is a native of Winter Haven, Florida.

## ASSISTANT COACHES

### **CHRISTIE SIDES** **ASSISTANT COACH**



Christie Sides is back with the Sky for her third season to coach side by side once again with Pokey Chatman. She has nine years of coaching experience at the college, international and professional levels. Over this past off-season Sides coached overseas with head coach Pokey Chatman in Russia for Spartak Moscow Region.

Since 2008, Sides has been an assistant on Spartak Moscow Region in Russia, where she helped Head Coach Pokey Chatman lead Spartak to consecutive FIBA EuroLeague Championships in 2008 and 2009. Sides has also served as an assistant on the Slovakian Women's National Team coaching staff since 2008 helping the team qualify for the European Championships in 2009, 2010 and 2011. The Slovaks took eighth place in 2009, their highest finish of Sides' tenure.

From 2004-2007 Sides was an assistant on the Louisiana State University staff also under Coach Chatman. She helped guide the Lady Tigers program to three Final Fours and two Southeastern Conference regular season titles in her three seasons with the team. Prior to LSU, Sides spent the 2003-04 season at Louisiana Tech as an assistant coach.

Sides began her coaching career as the head junior varsity coach and assistant varsity coach at Ruston (La.) High School where she served under Ricky Durrett. While at Ruston, Sides helped guide the Lady Bearcats to consecutive state playoff appearances.

Athletically, Sides played her first two collegiate seasons at Ole Miss for Hall of Fame coach Van Chancellor and helped the Rebels to a 34-22 overall record. She then transferred to Louisiana Tech where she finished her playing career for fellow Hall of Fame coach Leon Barmore. Sides helped the Lady Techsters to a 61-6 record in two seasons, including a trip to the 1999 Final Four. She holds the career record at Tech for three-point field goal percentage and ranks seventh in three-pointers made and eighth in three-pointer attempted.

Earlier in her playing career, Sides led Central Private High School to the state championship her senior season while earning the Louisiana Gatorade Player of the Year award and all-state honors. She ended her high school playing career ranked No. 1 in school history with 3,375 points.

Sides is a native of Baton Rouge, Louisiana.
