## DIRECTIONS TO MOHEGAN SUN ARENA

### From New York

From I-95 North to Exit 76/I-395 North. Take Exit 79A (Route 2A) East and follow to Mohegan Sun Boulevard.

### From Boston

Take I-90 (Mass. Pike) West to I-395 South. Take Exit 79A (Route 2A) East and follow to Mohegan Sun Boulevard.

### From Hartford

Take I-84 East to Route 2 East to I-395 South. Take Exit 79A (Route 2A) East and follow to Mohegan Sun Boulevard.

### From Providence

From I-95 South to Exit 84N (Route 32 North). Take Route 32 North to I-395 North. Take Exit 79A (Route 2A) East and follow to Mohegan Sun Boulevard.

## Unless otherwise specified, the Sun will practice at the Charles B. Luce Field House at Connecticut College.

## DIRECTIONS TO THE CHARLES B. LUCE FIELD HOUSE

### From New York

From I-95 North take exit 83. Make a left at the light at the end of the exit. Go to the next light, and turn right past the entrance to the Coast Guard Academy onto Route 32 North. Turn right at the third stoplight, you will see a sign for the complex.

### From Boston

Take I-90 (Mass. Pike) West to I-395 South. Take exit 78 (left exit) and get onto Route 32 South. Continue on Route 32 South, under the pedestrian bridge and make a left at the light into the complex.

### From Hartford

Take Route 2 East to the end onto Route 395 South (Exit 28S). Travel approximately eight miles to exit 78 (left exit) and get onto Route 32 South. Continue on Route 32 South, under the pedestrian bridge and make a left at the light into the complex.

### From Providence

From I-95 South take exit 84 N. This will bring you onto Route 32 North. At the third stoplight, turn right. You will see a sign for the complex.

## TRAINING CAMP/PRACTICE INFORMATION

- The last 30 minutes of each practice will be open to the media, unless otherwise posted by the Sun Media Relations Department. **Media planning to attend a practice should call that morning to check that practice times have not been changed, or that practice has not been canceled.**
- All interviews will be conducted after practice sessions. The only exceptions will be after prior clearance has been received from the Sun Media Relations Department. Players and coach are both available after the morning session, while only the coach will be available after the evening session.

## WNBA MEDIA ACCESS POLICIES

### DAY OF GAME

**Shootarounds:** All shootarounds will be closed to the media, but all players and the head coach will be available for a 15-minute interview session in a designated interview area. For home games, the Sun usually shoot at 10:00 a.m. at Mohegan Sun Arena. There will be a 15-minute media access period following shootaround. As with all home games, interviews will take place in the gym area. There is no locker room access at the practice facility. For road games, media should contact the Sun Media Relations Department to verify shootaround times and media access periods. Should the team not have a shootaround, it is not required to have a media "shootaround" interview session.

**Pre-Game:** The league will retain the policy of a 30-minute open locker room beginning 90 minutes before the game. All head coaches must make themselves available for a minimum of 15 minutes beginning anywhere from 15 minutes prior to the open locker room period through the end of the open locker room period.

**Post-Game:** No later than 10 minutes following the game, all coaches must make themselves available to the media. Following a five-minute window for coaches, all locker rooms will be open to the media.

### OFF DAY ACCESS

**Practice:** The Sun will follow WNBA guidelines regarding coach and player availability. Please check with the media relations department regarding open practice times for that day. No interviews will take place prior to practice without advance arrangements being made through the media relations department. All interviews will take place on the court at the Sun's practice facility (No Locker Room Access).

## CREDENTIALS

### PRESEASON / REGULAR SEASON GAMES

Media credentials are issued to working media only. Media will-call is located at Window #1 of the Mohegan Sun Arena Box Office. Media will-call opens two hours prior to game time. All credentials are non-transferable and any unauthorized use will subject bearer to ejection from Mohegan Sun Arena and confiscation of the pass. NOTE: All personal items are subject to search upon entering Mohegan Sun Arena. **Individual game credentials should be requested through the Sun Media Relations Department a minimum of 24 hours prior to game time or by 3:00 p.m. Friday for all Saturday, Sunday and Monday contests.**

Single game credentials will be issued on a space available basis. Members of the media that have a WNBA pass, please check in at the will-call window to pick up a single game credential. WNBA-issued passes will not be accepted at security checkpoints. Credentials are good for admittance to the arena, press working area, media seating and both locker rooms. Media access to the locker rooms will follow the guidelines stated above.

### ABSOLUTELY NO AUTOGRAPHS DURING THE MEDIA ACCESS PERIOD.

Interviews that need advance preparation or special accommodation should be arranged by contacting the Sun's Media Relations Department. This includes all live television interviews for pre- and post-game. Photo credentials will be issued in the same manner as other passes. Newspapers and magazines on assignment may obtain passes by having the photo editor request a single game credential. No freelance photographer credentials are issued without an assignment sheet from an accredited publication.

An anchor for the country's first all-sports radio station – New York City's WFAN – Heussler has over 25 years of experience as a basketball play-by-play announcer. He is the radio voice of Fairfield University basketball, a backup play-by-play radio announcer for the New Jersey Nets, and is a former radio play-by-play announcer for UConn basketball and football.

He has worked as a network anchor for ESPN Radio, and currently serves as an instructor of student broadcasters at both Yale and Fairfield University.

## **MITCHELL ETESS**

### **CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER**

In his eighth year as CEO of the Connecticut Sun, Mitchell Grossinger Etesse oversees team operations on behalf of the Mohegan Tribe, representing the ownership in all matters pertaining to the day-to-day functioning of the franchise on both the administrative and basketball sides of the organization.

Born into a family of hoteliers, Etesse brings literally a lifetime of experience in the hospitality industry to his role as Chief Executive Officer of the Mohegan Tribal Gaming Authority (MTGA) and President and CEO of Mohegan Sun. Etesse joined Mohegan Sun as a member of the casino's pre-opening team in 1996 as Senior Vice President of Marketing, and was responsible for marketing, food and beverage, sports and entertainment and hotel operations.

In 2004, Etesse was promoted to President and CEO to oversee the overall management and operation of Mohegan Sun, the Northeast's premier entertainment destination. In 2006, Etesse was appointed CEO of the MTGA, assuming responsibility of the overall management and operation of Mohegan Sun and its sister entities, including Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs – Pennsylvania's first slots casino and harness race track in Wilkes-Barre – and five off-track wagering facilities in Pennsylvania.

Prior to his position at Mohegan Sun, he served as Vice President of Marketing at Players Island Resort-Casino-Spa in Nevada. From 1988 to 1994, Etesse was employed at Trump Plaza Hotel & Casino in Atlantic City, rising through the ranks from Public Relations Manager to Senior Vice President of Marketing. Before that, Etesse was a partner in the advertising and public relations firm of Gordon Etesse Associates in Pinehurst, N.C., working there after serving as General Manager at CCA/Holly Inn in Pinehurst.

Before 1985, Etesse worked in virtually every capacity at his family-owned Grossinger's Hotel in Grossinger, N.Y. It was here that Etesse, raised at the hotel, received his early training in the hospitality industry.

A graduate of Columbia University, Etesse resides in East Lyme with his wife Karen. They have two daughters, Piper and Maxie.



## **JEFF HARTMANN**

### **CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER**

In his eighth year as COO of the Connecticut Sun, Jeffrey E. Hartmann is responsible for overseeing the team's finance department, monitoring all aspects of team finances and ensuring that all WNBA league financial reporting requirements are met.

Hartmann is also the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of the Mohegan Tribal Gaming Authority and Mohegan Sun, where he has been employed since December of 1996. In this position, Hartmann oversees External Development, Construction Management, Information Technology, MTGA Corporate finance and SEC reporting. In addition, he is responsible for daily operations of Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs, located in Wilkes Barre, Penn.

Prior to his most recent promotion, Hartmann was the Executive Vice President of Finance and Chief Financial Officer of Mohegan Sun from 1996-2004, supervising day-to-day management of the accounting, financial reporting to the Securities Exchange Commission and bondholder and bank relations.

Hartmann has 18 years of experience in the casino and hotel industry. Prior to joining the Mohegan Tribal Gaming Authority, he served as Vice President of Finance at Foxwoods Management Company from August 1991 until December of 1996. A certified public accountant, Hartmann was employed by PricewaterhouseCoopers, LLP, as an Audit Manager, from 1984 to 1991.

A graduate of Rutgers University, Hartmann resides in Old Lyme, Connecticut with his wife Marisa and their four children.



## **RAYMOND PINEAULT**

### **ALTERNATE GOVERNOR**

In his five years with Mohegan Sun, Raymond Pineault, Senior Vice President of Casino Operations, has been responsible for overseeing areas varying from the legal department, risk management, human resources, supply chain management, and security and surveillance and his current responsibilities include oversight and management of Mohegan Sun gaming operations including table games management, slot, racebook and keno operations as well as poker operations. In his current position, Pineault is a member of the senior Executive Committee and duties including department budget approval, staffing, business planning and strategic plan development. He is in his first season as an alternate governor for the Connecticut Sun.

Prior to joining the Mohegan Sun in 2005, Pineault was Senior Staff Attorney for the Mohegan Tribe where he was responsible for reporting to the Tribal Council on all matters related to business development, financial reporting, debt structure, as well as bond and bank financing. In addition, in his role with the Tribe, Pineault provided legal services to several of the Tribes departments, including, the Housing Authority, Planning and Development Department and the Tribal Employment Rights Office. From August 1999 to March 2001 Pineault worked in the financial services industry providing legal advice on regulatory compliance and mortgage finance.

A graduate of the University of Connecticut with a Bachelor of Arts and Quinnipiac College School of Law, Pineault resides in Glastonbury, Conn. with his wife Allyson and three children Ashley, Ryan and Morgan.

## **CHRIS SIENKO** **VICE PRESIDENT AND GENERAL MANAGER**

Entering his eighth season with the Connecticut Sun, Chris Sienko is the Vice President and General Manager, directing the business and basketball operations for one of the most successful franchises in the WNBA. As part of his day-to-day responsibilities Sienko also oversees Sponsorship and Regional Marketing on behalf of Mohegan Sun.

Working closely with Sun coach Mike Thibault, Sienko has been extremely aggressive during each off-season, using trades and free agent signings to build a team that has been a perennial contender, qualifying for the playoffs in six of its first seven seasons since relocating from Orlando following the 2002 WNBA season.

Missing the post-season in 2009 was unfamiliar territory and drastic changes were made to bring a new direction to the team, including the blockbuster trade in January that brought Renee Montgomery and the No. 1 pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft to Connecticut in exchange for Lindsay Whalen and the No. 2 pick. The Sun used their No. 1 pick to select UConn star Tina Charles. Unrestricted free agent Kara Lawson was also added in the off-season to help solidify the backcourt along with DeMya Walker, who was picked in the Sacramento dispersal draft.

Twelve of the 14 trades in franchise history have happened while Sienko has been the GM of the Sun. Previous trades have netted Margo Dydek, Asjha Jones and Whalen.

Sienko was charged with overseeing a hectic transition period that began when the Mohegan Tribe purchased the Orlando Miracle on Jan. 28, 2003. In the days between that announcement and the Sun's first preseason game against the New York Liberty, Sienko traded for Connecticut icon Rebecca Lobo, hired coach Mike Thibault and the rest of the Sun front office staff, helped negotiate the team's radio and television contracts and managed all of the other day-to-day business functions of the franchise, including player contracts and personnel moves for the team. In addition to his role as GM for the Sun at that time, Sienko was concurrently directing all sporting events for the property, including boxing, wrestling, college and professional basketball, bowling, billiards and more.

Sienko was the impetus behind the creation of the Connecticut Sun Foundation, a not-for-profit founded in 2007. The Foundation awards an annual Bright Horizons Scholarship to one deserving Connecticut high school senior, and it helps high-risk individuals in our community. He has served on the board of the Foundation since its inception.

Sienko sits on several different committees for the WNBA including the Competition Committee, Rules and Regulations, Marketing, Advertising and Sponsorship committees. He is also on an advisory committee, made up of all the COOs in the league. Outside of the league, Sienko also sits on the Board of Directors for the not-for-profit Channel 3 Kids Camp based in Andover, CT.

This summer, Chris will be overseeing his third All-Star game – this year versus the United States National Team (core players who will make up the 2012 Olympic team) – to be hosted at Mohegan Sun Arena in July.

Prior to joining Mohegan Sun, Sienko was an integral part in the start up of another professional sports team, the ABL's New England Blizzard, where he served as vice president of marketing, then general manager. He also was president of the Arthur Robert Group, a small advertising agency in Connecticut for eight years, as well as vice president of marketing for thePit.com, which was successfully sold to Topps, Inc. in 2000.

Sienko is a graduate of the University of Connecticut.





## MIKE THIBAULT

### HEAD COACH

Returning for his eighth season with the Connecticut Sun, Mike Thibault is firmly established as one of the premier coaches in the WNBA.

Currently the longest-serving coach in the league, Thibault is a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year who has compiled a 143-95 regular season record. His .601 winning percentage is first among active coaches, and fifth all time. On July 22, 2007, Thibault became the third fastest coach in league history to win 100 games, reaching the milestone in just 159 games.

Last year, Connecticut's bid for a seventh straight trip to the playoffs unraveled late in the season as the Sun struggled without All Star forward and leading scorer Asjha Jones, who missed the final 11 games with a strained Achilles tendon. The Sun also lost Tamika Whitmore for 10 games midway through the season because of a knee injury, and Amber Holt for eight games at the start of the season with a broken right hand. The Sun were not eliminated until the second to last game of the year, a loss at Atlanta on Sept. 11th, finishing with a 16-18 record.

In the off-season, Thibault began planning an overhaul that would eventually lead to a blockbuster trade that sent veteran point guard Lindsay Whalen and the No. 2 pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft to Minnesota in exchange for second-year guard Renee Montgomery and the No. 1 pick in 2010. The Sun used that pick to select UConn star Tina Charles, and also executed a draft day trade with Minnesota that netted Nebraska star Kelsey Griffin with the No. 3 pick in the draft. Additionally, Connecticut signed veteran free agent Kara Lawson and selected veteran forward DeMya Walker in the dispersal draft for the Sacramento Monarchs.

The decision to trade Whalen was a typically bold move for Thibault. Twelve of the 14 trades in franchise history have been made during his tenure, including the deal that originally enabled the Sun to draft Whalen with the fourth overall pick in the 2004 WNBA Draft. Asjha Jones and Margo Dydek are other notable players brought to Connecticut through trades.

Named WNBA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career in 2008, Thibault led the third-youngest team in the league to 21 victories, a sixth straight winning season and a sixth straight berth in the playoffs.

Connecticut's youth, combined with the offseason departure of veteran All Stars Katie Douglas, Nykesha Sales and Margo Dydek led to predictions the Sun would struggle in 2008. Instead, the team jumped out to an 8-1 start, matching its best record over the first nine games of a season in franchise history. Connecticut was the last team in the league to lose on the road, the last to lose two games in a row, and the first to qualify for the playoffs, earning a spot in the postseason with a win at Atlanta on August 29th.

Despite starting two rookies in 28 of 34 games in 2008, the Sun established new records for total points (2,690), scoring average (79.1 ppg.), made threes (221) and three-point shooting percentage (33.0) while becoming the third team in franchise history to win more than 20 games in a season.

Eleven different players, including five rookies, started at least one game for the Sun in 2008. A total of 14 players – Connecticut added Erin Phillips and Svetlana Abrosimova to the roster following the Olympic break – logged minutes.

Thibault's accomplishments were particularly impressive considering he was in the midst of completing a commitment to USA Basketball that began in February of 2006, when he was named an assistant coach on the staff of Anne Donovan. Thibault helped the USA Women's Basketball team win the bronze medal at the World Championships in Sao Paolo, Brazil in September of 2007, and the gold medal at the Summer Olympic Games in Beijing in August of 2008.

Named head coach of the Connecticut Sun on March 7, 2003 – following a four-year stint with the Milwaukee Bucks – Thibault inherited a squad that had never finished above .500. He guided his first team, picked to finish last in the Eastern Conference by many pundits, to an 18-16 record and the first playoff series win in franchise history, a sweep of the favored Charlotte Sting.

From 2003 through 2008, Connecticut won 127 regular season games, tied with Detroit for the most victories in that six-year span. Connecticut and Sacramento were the only teams to have six straight winning seasons during that time while Connecticut, Sacramento and Detroit were the only teams to reach every postseason.

In 2006, Thibault earned his first Coach of the Year Award after leading Connecticut to its second straight 26-8 season, its third straight Eastern Conference regular season title and its fourth straight trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. No other Eastern Conference team has ever won 26 games in a season.

During the 2005 and 2006 seasons, Connecticut was 52-16 (.764) in the regular season. Only Los Angeles and Houston have ever won more games in consecutive seasons. The Sun won 12 straight games from July 16-August 9 of 2006, the third longest winning streak in league history. Ten of those wins came without Nykesha Sales, who was out with an Achilles tendon injury. The Sun were 11-1 overall without Sales, and also went 2-0 without Taj McWilliams-Franklin.

In 2005, Thibault guided the Sun to the best regular season record ever posted by an Eastern Conference team, a 26-8 mark that included a remarkable 13-1 record against the Western Conference. Connecticut's 12-2 start over 14 games was one of the quickest in WNBA history, topped only by Houston's 13-1 start in 1998. The Sun clinched their second straight Eastern Conference regular season title with five games remaining on their schedule. Not since 2001 had a team won as many regular season games as Connecticut did in 2005.

Connecticut went on to repeat as Eastern Conference Champions, sweeping Detroit and Indiana before falling to Sacramento in the WNBA Finals, the first playoff series in league history played under a best-of-five format.

In 2004, Thibault led a Sun team that was a near-unanimous preseason pick to finish last to within one made basket of a WNBA championship. After finishing first in the Eastern Conference during the regular season for the first time in franchise history, the Sun beat Washington and New York on the way to their first Eastern Conference Championship. Connecticut won the first game of the WNBA Championship series with Seattle before eventually falling in three games.

Connecticut's 2004 run was surprising to some because Thibault had rebuilt the team following a 2003 run to the Eastern Conference Finals. Concluding the Sun needed to get younger and more athletic, Thibault risked taking a temporary step back to get better. He carried five rookies on the 2004 roster, lowering the average age of his team from 28.4 to 24.2. Among those rookies was Whalen, who averaged more than 30 minutes per game as the starting point guard.

The Sun also excelled despite losing starting forward Brooke Wyckoff to a season-ending knee injury on May 3, 2004. Wyckoff and the five other veterans who did not return to the team averaged a combined 30 points, 13.5 rebounds and 7.6 assists per game in 2003.

Thibault entered the NBA ranks in 1978 as a scout for the Los Angeles Lakers, and was promoted to director of scouting and assistant coach in 1980. The Lakers won two World Championships (1980, 1982) during his tenure. From 1982-1986, he was an assistant coach and director of scouting for the Chicago Bulls during a period when the franchise drafted Michael Jordan and Charles Oakley, while also acquiring John Paxson.

From 1987-88 Thibault was the general manager and head coach of the Calgary 88's of the World Basketball League (WBL), earning WBL Coach of the Year honors in 1988.

In 1989, Thibault began a remarkable eight-year run as general manager and head coach of CBA's Omaha Racers. The Racers made the playoffs each season (1989-97) under his watch, bringing home a CBA title in 1993, and a return to the finals in 1994. Thibault was named 1993 Sportsman of the Year by the Omaha sportscasters, and ranks sixth on the CBA all-time coaching victory list (236).

In March of 1995, he coached the silver medal winning USA National Team at the Pan American Games, and in August of 1993, he served as head coach of the gold medal-winning USA National Team at the World Championship Qualifying Tournament in Puerto Rico.

He spent the 1997-98 season as a scout for the Seattle Sonics.

Mike and his wife Nanci are active participants in the community, and have been staunch supporters of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation since Mike's days with the Omaha Racers. In 2007, the Thibaults were co-chairs of GREAT STRIDES, the primary fundraiser of the CF Foundation's Connecticut Chapter. Mike and Nanci have two children. Eric is a graduate of the University of Missouri, and a graduate assistant coach for the women's basketball team. He has also been a member of the Sun coaching staff. Carly will be a sophomore at Monmouth University next fall, attending on a basketball scholarship.





## **SCOTT HAWK**

### **ASSISTANT COACH**

Returning for his eighth season as an assistant coach with the Connecticut Sun, Scott Hawk works primarily with the team's post players, and is also responsible for preparing game plans, and scouting opponents and college players.

In 2009, second-year center Sandrine Gruda doubled her rebound (6.3 rpg) and scoring averages (13.5 ppg) while center Chante Black led all WNBA rookies in average blocks per game, finishing second on the team with a total of 27. Before she was forced to miss the final 11 games of the season with an injury, Asjha Jones was on track to surpass her single-season career high for

rebounds (201), a mark she set in 2008.

Ranked 13th in rebound percentage, 14th in total rebounds, 14th in total defensive rebounds and 11th in total offensive rebounds in 2003, Connecticut steadily improved under Hawk's guidance, finishing the 2006 season ranked first in total defensive rebounds and second in total rebounds. Connecticut has continued to be one of the top rebounding teams in the league, even as new players have been rotated into the starting frontcourt.

Hired on March 27, 2003, Hawk brought more than 20 years of experience coaching men's and women's basketball to the Sun staff. Beginning in 1980, Hawk worked as a teacher, head coach and assistant in some of Nebraska's top high school programs, including Omaha Cathedral, Bellevue West, Plattsmouth and his alma mater, Omaha Creighton Prep. Hawk guided his teams to a pair of Nebraska state championships, and he was twice named Coach of the Year.

Hawk also served as a Director of the Omaha Crusaders, a 501 C3 non-profit corporation created to benefit young people in Nebraska and western Iowa that also happens to be the parent organization of one of the largest high school summer basketball programs in Nebraska. Hawk earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Nebraska (Omaha).

He lives in Connecticut with his daughters Maggie and Clare.



## **BERNADETTE MATTOX**

### **ASSISTANT COACH**

In her eighth season as an assistant coach with the Connecticut Sun, Bernadette Mattox works primarily with the team's wing players, and is also responsible for preparing game plans as well as scouting opponents and college players.

Connecticut led the WNBA in assist-per-turnover ratio (1.34) for the second straight season and the fourth time since 2005. The Sun have not ranked lower than third in this category since the 2003 season. Connecticut also topped 600 assists for the fourth straight season, finishing with 608. The Sun ranked second in the league in assists per game.

Lindsay Whalen emerged as an All Star under the tutelage of Mattox, collecting a franchise-record 964 career assists at Connecticut with a lofty 2.1 assist-to-turnover average during that time. She was just the second player in WNBA history to average at least 10 points, five assists and five rebounds in a season, accomplishing that in 2008.

In 2007, Whalen and Katie Douglas became the first backcourt tandem in franchise history to each compile 100 assists in a season.

Hired by head coach Mike Thibault on March 27, 2003, Mattox brought 18 years of Division I and international coaching experience with her when she accepted an assistant coaching position with the Connecticut Sun. Prior to her arrival in Connecticut, Mattox made NCAA history when she became the first female to serve as a Division I assistant for a men's team, beginning a four-year stint under coach Rick Pitino at Kentucky in 1990. During the four seasons Mattox was on Pitino's staff, the Wildcats were 108-24 with a Final Four appearance in 1993. She also served as an assistant athletic director at UK from 1994-95.

In 1995, Mattox became the first African American to coach the Kentucky Women's basketball program, guiding the Wildcats for eight seasons. During her tenure as UK's head coach, she led the Wildcats to an NCAA Tournament berth in 1999. She also served as an assistant coach on the 1998 USA Basketball Women's World Championship team, which posted a 9-0 record on the way to winning the Gold Medal in Germany.

Mattox graduated from the University of Georgia, where she was a standout women's basketball player, earning the program's first All-American designation in 1979-80, when she averaged 20.6 points, 4.6 assists and 4.2 steals per game as a junior. Mattox was also the first player in Georgia women's basketball history to earn Academic All-American honors, and she finished her career averaging 15 points per game. She went on to work as an assistant to Georgia head coach Andy Landers for five years.

Mattox lives in Lexington, Ky. with her husband Vince and son Vincent.



## JEREMY NORMAN

### ATC/L, CES, HFI, HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER

Jeremy Norman returns for his fifth season as Head Athletic Trainer of the Connecticut Sun. His duties include evaluation and treatment of injuries, and formulating rehabilitation programs specific to each athlete. He manages the Connecticut Sun Medical Staff.

Prior to joining the Sun, Jeremy worked at Procare Physical Therapy, while also serving as the Head Athletic Trainer at Mitchell College. In 2004, he served as the volunteer assistant athletic trainer with the Connecticut Sun. From 1999-2003,

Jeremy was a Shift Manager at Mohegan Sun Employee Center where he supervised members of the employee Fitness Center.

During the off season Jeremy assists the Mohegan Sun Arena medical staff and the Department of Athletic Regulations at various sporting events, including the CT High School basketball championships, WWE, Mixed Martial Arts, AVP beach volleyball, and National Women's Basketball League events.

Jeremy is a certified member of the National Athletic Trainers' Association, the National Academy of Sports Medicine and the American College of Sports Medicine.

A 1988 Ledyard High School graduate, Jeremy completed a bachelor in sports medicine from Keene State College in 1992. He resides in New London with his wife Julie.



## ERIC THIBAUT

### ASSISTANT TO THE COACHING STAFF

Returning for his fourth season on the Connecticut Sun coaching staff, Thibault is responsible for preparing scouting reports on personnel, working as a practice player, participating in individual workouts with players and charting game statistics.

The son of Connecticut head coach Mike Thibault, he graduated Cum Laude in English from the University of Missouri. Thibault was a graduate assistant for the Missouri women's basketball program this past season.

A 2006 graduate of East Lyme High School, Thibault was a co-captain of both the basketball and golf teams. He helped East Lyme reach the semifinals of the CIAC Class M state basketball tournament as a senior, and was also the individual medalist for the ECC Large School Golf Tournament.



## JON WHITKIN

### VIDEO COORDINATOR

Jon Whitkin returns for his fifth season with the Connecticut Sun. His duties include breaking down game film, helping the coaching staff game plan, organizing and updating the team's DVD library, and coordinating video exchange with other WNBA teams.

Whitkin breaks down Sun games live, providing various edits for players and coaches at halftime, and will also supply customized edits for Sun players. In addition, Whitkin assembles and organizes game footage of college players to help the Sun coaching staff prepare for the WNBA Draft.

Whitkin has worked with the New Jersey Nets as a part time statistical analyst focusing on defense, and he has also served as a regional NBA scout for Marty Blake.

Prior to joining the Sun, Whitkin worked in the basketball operations department at Harvard for both the men's and women's programs. He oversaw the breaking down of opponent film, the updating of the recruiting data base, organizing team travel and marketing efforts.

Whitkin was also an assistant video coordinator with the Philadelphia 76ers during the 2004-05 season, coordinating video research of high school, college and international players for the 2005 NBA Draft. Additionally, he helped with video breakdown of opposing teams for scouting purposes.

Whitkin worked as an associate baseball scout in the northeast region for the Toronto Blue Jays from 2003 to 2004, aiding with statistical analysis and player evaluation.

A Swampscott, Mass. native, Whitkin graduated cum laude from Elon University in 2002 with degrees in sports management and business.



## ABBY GORDON

### EQUIPMENT MANAGER & TRAVEL COORDINATOR

Abby Gordon returns for her fourth season as the equipment manager and travel coordinator for the Connecticut Sun. She is responsible for team travel arrangements involving team practices, flights, hotels, and buses as well as all team equipment needs.

Gordon graduated from the University of Connecticut in May of 2007 with a degree in Exercise Science. While at UConn, Gordon served as team manager for the women's basketball, softball and soccer programs.

She also worked in the athletic communications and athletic facilities and operations departments.



## JOANNA (JODI) HOPKINS

### STRENGTH & CONDITIONING COACH

Jodi Hopkins returns for her fourth season with the Connecticut Sun after spending four seasons in the same position with the Charlotte Sting. She develops and oversees programs for the players that will improve their speed, strength, agility and quickness.

Prior to the WNBA, Hopkins worked at the University of North Carolina for six years, overseeing a year-round training program as the strength and conditioning coach for the women's basketball team. Hopkins also worked closely with the Olympic sports programs of field hockey, women's golf, gymnastics, women's lacrosse,

softball, tennis and track. She also assisted with the strength and conditioning program for the football team from 1996-00.

The Sun also select Danielle McCray of Kansas in the first round (7th overall), Allison Hightower of LSU in the second round (15th overall) and Johannah Leedham from Franklin Pierce in the third round (27th overall). Connecticut also trades its first round pick in the 2011 WNBA Draft and Tulsa's second round pick in 2011, received in a trade the previous day, to the Minnesota Lynx for Kelsey Griffin. Griffin was selected by the Lynx with the No. 3 pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft.

**APRIL 7, 2010** – The Sun trade guard/forward Amber Holt and center Chante Black to the Tulsa Shock for the Shock's first round selection (7th overall) in the 2010 WNBA Draft and Tulsa's second round selection in the 2011 WNBA Draft.

**FEBRUARY 2, 2010** – Connecticut signs former Sacramento Monarchs guard Kara Lawson to a three-year contract.

**JANUARY 27, 2010** – WNBA President Donna Orender announces that Connecticut will host the 2010 WNBA All-Star Game against the USA Women's National Team on July 10th. It is the second consecutive year that Connecticut will host the All-Star Game and the third overall.

**JANUARY 12, 2010** – The Sun complete one of the biggest trades in WNBA history, sending All-Star point guard Lindsay Whalen and the second overall pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft to the Minnesota Lynx in exchange for Renee Montgomery and the No. 1 pick in 2010.

**SEPTEMBER 1, 2009** – The Sun lose their 17th game of the season at Sacramento, meaning that for the first time since the team relocated to Connecticut prior to the 2003 season, it will not have a winning season.

**JULY 25, 2009** – Connecticut hosts the WNBA All-Star Game for the second time in its history. Asjha Jones represents the Sun on the Eastern Conference team.

**JUNE 6, 2009** – The Sun open their seventh season at home against Washington, falling 82-70 to the Mystics.

**APRIL 9, 2009** – The Sun select Chante Black of Duke with their first round pick (10th overall) in the 2009 WNBA Draft. In the second round (17th overall) Connecticut selects Virginia's Lyndra Littles. Also selected was Alba Torrens of Spain in the third round (36th overall).

**FEBRUARY 3, 2009** – WNBA President Donna Orender announces that Connecticut will host the 2009 WNBA All-Star Game on July 25th.

## 2008

**OCTOBER 3, 2008** – Lindsay Whalen is named to the All-WNBA First Team, finishing second in the MVP voting. She is joined by Asjha Jones, who earned All-WNBA Second Team honors and Amber Holt, who earned a spot on the All-Rookie Team.

**AUGUST 31, 2008** – The Sun registered their third sellout of the season in an 80-76 victory over Seattle, marking the first time that the team has filled Mohegan Sun Arena more than twice in one season. It was the 12th sellout since moving to Connecticut in 2003.

**AUGUST 29, 2008** – Connecticut clinches its sixth consecutive trip to the WNBA Playoffs with a 98-72 victory in Atlanta.

**JULY 1, 2008** – Lindsay Whalen becomes Connecticut's all-time assist leader during a 78-68 victory over the Houston Comets.

**MAY 17, 2008** – Connecticut opens its sixth season of play with a 100-67 victory over the expansion Atlanta Dream in Mohegan Sun Arena.

**APRIL 9, 2008** – With two picks in the first round of the 2008 WNBA Draft, the Sun choose Amber Holt from Middle Tennessee State (9th overall) and UConn guard Ketia Swanier (12th). Also selected was Jolene Anderson of the University of Wisconsin in the second round (23rd overall) and Lauren Ervin of the University of Arkansas in the third round (37th overall).

**MARCH 14, 2008** – The Sun trade forward Kristen Rasmussen to the Minnesota Lynx for forward Tamika Raymond as well as the option to trade second round picks in the 2009 WNBA Draft.

**MARCH 12, 2008** – The Sun announce a multi-year partnership to broadcast games throughout Connecticut on WCTX/MyTV9.

**MARCH 11, 2008** – Veteran guard/forward Nykesha Sales announces she will take a one-year hiatus from WNBA play.

**MARCH 7, 2008** – The Connecticut Sun host the CIAC Girls Basketball Tournament Luncheon for the third consecutive year at the Aqua Turf Club in Plantsville, Conn.

**MARCH 6, 2008** – Connecticut trades guard Megan Mahoney to the Houston Comets for guard/forward Barbara Turner.

**FEBRUARY 19, 2008** – The Sun trade veteran guard Katie Douglas to the Indiana Fever for forward Tamika Whitmore, the rights to guard Jessica Foley and the Fever's first round selection (12th overall) in the 2008 WNBA Draft.

**FEBRUARY 6, 2008** – The Sun lose forward Erika de Souza to the Atlanta Dream in the Expansion Draft.

## 2007

**SEPTEMBER 5, 2007** – Katie Douglas is named to the All-WNBA Second Team.

**AUGUST 24, 2007** – Katie Douglas is named to the WNBA All-Defensive First Team for the third consecutive year. She was joined by Margo Dydek, who earned a spot on the All-Defensive Second Team for the second straight year.



**AUGUST 23, 2007** – The Sun made their fifth consecutive trip to the playoffs with a 93–88 triple overtime victory over the Indiana Fever in Mohegan Sun Arena.

**AUGUST 19, 2007** – The Sun close out the 2007 regular season in front of a sellout crowd in Mohegan Sun Arena. It is the 10th sellout in team history.

**JULY 26, 2007** – Rebecca Wilcox received the first Bright Horizons scholarship awarded through the Connecticut Sun Foundation.

**JULY 22, 2007** – With an 81–79 victory over Houston, Head Coach Mike Thibault became the third-fastest coach in WNBA history to reach 100 career regular season wins. He achieved the milestone in just 159 games.

**JULY 15, 2007** – Katie Douglas and Asjha Jones were Eastern Conference reserves at the 2007 WNBA All-Star Game.

**MAY 19, 2007** – The Sun open their fifth season of play with an 89–80 victory at Washington.

**APRIL 4, 2007** – With consecutive picks in the first round of the 2007 WNBA Draft, the Sun chose Temple forward Kamesha Hairston (12th overall) and French center Sandrine Gruda (13th). The Sun completed their day by taking Georgia guard Cori Chambers in the second round (26th overall) and Nebraska guard Kiera Hardy in the third round with the 39th overall pick.

**FEBRUARY 21, 2007** – The Sun trade veteran Taj McWilliams-Franklin to the Los Angeles Sparks for center Erika de Souza and the Sparks' first selection (12th overall) in the 2007 WNBA Draft.

**FEBRUARY 8, 2007** – USA Basketball announces that Mike Thibault will remain assistant coach for the Women's Senior National Team program through the 2008 Olympics.

## 2006

**AUGUST 30, 2006** – Sun guard Katie Douglas is named to the All-WNBA First Team. It is the first time in franchise history that a player has received the honor. Sun forward Taj McWilliams-Franklin is named to the second team.

**AUGUST 27, 2006** – The Sun lose to the Detroit Shock, 79–55, in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Finals and fail to reach the WNBA Finals for the first time in three years.

**AUGUST 20, 2006** – Sun Head Coach Mike Thibault is named the WNBA Coach of the Year prior to Game 2 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals. The Sun go on to defeat the Washington Mystics, 68–65, at Mohegan Sun Arena and advance to the Eastern Conference Finals for the fourth straight year.

**AUGUST 17, 2006** – Katie Douglas is named to the WNBA's All-Defensive first team for the second straight year. Margo Dydek is also named to the second team.

**AUGUST 13, 2006** – The Sun set a league record for defensive rebounds in a season with 926. The previous record was 851, set by the Detroit Shock in 2003.

**AUGUST 11, 2006** – The Sun close out the 2006 home schedule in front of a sellout crowd at Mohegan Sun Arena. It is the eighth sellout in franchise history.

**AUGUST 9, 2006** – The Sun establish a team record with their 12th consecutive victory, a 71–63 win at Indiana. The 12-game winning streak is the third longest in WNBA history.

**JULY 22, 2006** – With a win at San Antonio, the Sun clinch the Eastern Conference regular season title for a third consecutive season.

**JULY 12, 2006** – The Sun have a WNBA-record five players named to the All-Star Team. Nykesha Sales, Lindsay Whalen, Katie Douglas, Taj McWilliams-Franklin and Margo Dydek are selected to represent the Eastern Conference in the seventh annual All-Star Game, held this year at Madison Square Garden. The East, coached by Head Coach Mike Thibault, win for the first time ever, 98–82. Katie Douglas takes home the MVP award.

**JULY 8, 2006** – In front of a sellout crowd at Mohegan Sun Arena, the Sun bounce back from a 17-point first half deficit to defeat the Phoenix Mercury 82–77. The sellout crowd is the seventh in Sun history.

**MAY 20, 2006** – The Sun tip off their fourth season with a win against the New York Liberty at Mohegan Sun Arena. It marks the first time in franchise history that the team has won its season opener.

**FEBRUARY 16, 2006** – Head Coach Mike Thibault is named to the coaching staff of the 2006 USA Women's World Championship team that will compete for a gold medal at the FIBA Women's World Championship in September 2006 in Sao Paulo, Brazil. The team will be led under the direction of Head Coach Anne Donovan.

## 2005

**NOVEMBER 16, 2005** – The Sun lose veteran forward Brooke Wyckoff to the Chicago Sky in the Expansion Draft.

**SEPTEMBER 20, 2005** – The Sun fall to Sacramento, 62–59, in Game 4 of the WNBA Finals.

**SEPTEMBER 14, 2005** – The Connecticut Sun play in the WNBA Finals for the second consecutive year, competing in the league's first-ever best-of-five postseason series.

**SEPTEMBER 10, 2005** – The Sun win the Eastern Conference Championship for the second consecutive year with a sweep of the Indiana Fever.

**JULY 9, 2005** – The Connecticut Sun host the 2005 WNBA All-Star game at Mohegan Sun Arena. Mike Thibault is the coach for the Eastern Conference team that includes Nykesha Sales and Taj McWilliams-Franklin.



**MAY 21, 2005** – The 2004 Eastern Conference Champion Connecticut Sun hold a banner-raising ceremony prior to the home opener against the Phoenix Mercury. A sellout crowd watches the Sun defeat the Mercury, 85-68.

**APRIL 16, 2005** – In a Draft Day trade, the Sun acquire Margo Dydek from the San Antonio Silver Stars in exchange for Katie Feenstra and the Sun's first pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft.

## 2004

**OCTOBER 12, 2004** – The Sun fall to the Seattle Storm, 74-60, in Game 3 of the WNBA Finals.

**OCTOBER 8, 2004** – The Sun make their first appearance in the WNBA Finals, defeating the Seattle Storm, 68-64, before a sellout crowd at Mohegan Sun Arena.

**OCTOBER 3, 2004** – The Sun win the first Eastern Conference Championship in franchise history with a sweep of the New York Liberty.

**SEPTEMBER 29, 2004** – The Sun rally from a game down against the Washington Mystics in the opening round of the Eastern Conference playoffs, earning their second straight trip to the conference championship series with a 76-56 win in Game 3 at Mohegan Sun Arena.

**SEPTEMBER 19, 2004** – The Sun clinch their first ever regular season Eastern Conference title with a win at home versus the Indiana Fever.

**SEPTEMBER 12, 2004** – The Sun announce that the 2005 WNBA All-Star game will be played at 4 pm on July 9th at the Mohegan Sun Arena and broadcast nationally on ABC.

**AUGUST 5, 2004** – Taj McWilliams-Franklin, Nykesha Sales and rookie Lindsay Whalen are selected to play on the WNBA All-Star team that faced the U.S. Olympic Team in a tune-up game at Radio City Music Hall in New York.

**MAY 22, 2004** – For the second straight season, the Sun open at home with a sellout crowd of 9,341, hosting Phoenix in a nationally televised game at Mohegan Sun Arena.

**APRIL 17, 2004** – The Connecticut Sun use their first pick in the 2004 WNBA Draft, fourth overall, to select Minnesota guard Lindsay Whalen.

**MARCH 25, 2004** – The Connecticut Sun acquire former UConn star Asjha Jones for the eighth pick in the 2004 WNBA Draft from the Phoenix Mercury in a three-team deal that also involves the Washington Mystics.

**JANUARY 28, 2004** – The Sun trade four-time WNBA All-Star point guard Shannon Johnson along with their second- and third-round picks (21 and 34, respectively) in the 2004 WNBA Draft to San Antonio for the Silver Stars' 4th, 16th and 29th picks.

**JANUARY 6, 2004** – The Sun trade their eighth pick in the WNBA Dispersal Draft to the Houston Comets in exchange for Houston's second-round pick (24th overall) in the collegiate draft.

## 2003

**SEPTEMBER 7, 2003** – The Sun are eliminated from the Eastern Conference Finals by the eventual WNBA champion Detroit Shock.

**AUGUST 30, 2003** – The Sun win their first postseason series, defeating the Sting 68-62 at the Charlotte Coliseum to complete a two-game sweep.

**AUGUST 25, 2003** – The Sun clinch a playoff berth with a win over the Indiana Fever in the final game of the regular season.

**JULY 12, 2003** – Nykesha Sales and Shannon Johnson represent the Connecticut Sun at the WNBA All-Star Game in New York City.

**JUNE 7, 2003** – The Sun win their first regular-season home game, defeating Houston 65-58 at Mohegan Sun Arena.

**JUNE 1, 2003** – The Sun win the first game in team history, defeating the Houston Comets, 91-83, on the road.

**MAY 24, 2003** – The Sun host their first regular season game at Mohegan Sun Arena, falling 82-71 to the two-time defending champion Los Angeles Sparks before a sellout crowd of 9,341.

**MAY 13, 2003** – The Sun win their first-ever preseason game, pulling out a 65-64 victory over the Charlotte Sting on a last-second shot by Taj McWilliams-Franklin.

**MARCH 27, 2003** – The Sun reveal new logo and colors featuring a fiery orange sunburst, a WNBA basketball and a blue ribbon with four white semicircular domes, which is a modern interpretation of an ancient Mohegan symbol and represents the four corners of the earth under the sky dome. Assistant coaches Bernadette Mattox and Scott Hawk are hired.

**MARCH 7, 2003** – General Manager Chris Sienko names Mike Thibault, a 34-year coaching veteran with two NBA titles as an assistant coach/director of scouting (1980 and '82) for the Los Angeles Lakers, as the first head coach for the franchise. Thibault has coached the 1995 silver medal Pan American Games team, served as head coach for the Omaha Racers, spent four years as an assistant coach under

George Karl in Milwaukee, and was a scout for the Atlanta Hawks and the New York Knicks.

**FEBRUARY 14, 2003** – Connecticut Sun acquire former UConn star Rebecca Lobo from the Houston Comets in exchange for its second-round (23rd overall) draft pick.

**JANUARY 30, 2003** – The Sun announce their 2003 regular season schedule, which includes a nationally broadcast season opener on ABC against two-time defending WNBA champion Los Angeles Sparks.

**JANUARY 28, 2003** – Mohegan Sun hosts a fan festival to announce Connecticut as the new destination for the former Orlando Miracle franchise. The team will be named the Sun, a reference to the team's new owners – Mohegan Sun. This is the first franchise in league history to be owned independently.

## 2002

**OCTOBER 21, 2002** – Orlando Miracle announce that the team will relocate to a city to be announced for the 2003 season.

**JULY 15, 2002** – Shannon Johnson and Nykesha Sales are named reserves for the Eastern Conference at the 2002 WNBA All-Star game in Washington, D.C.

**JULY 8, 2002** – The Orlando Miracle trade Elaine Powell and their first-round pick in the 2003 WNBA Draft to the Detroit Shock in exchange for Wendy Palmer and the Shock's second-round pick in the 2003 Draft.



**JUNE 8, 2002** – The Orlando Miracle and the Cleveland Rockers square off for the longest game in WNBA history. The Miracle win, 103-99, in triple overtime in a game that lasted 2 hours, 57 minutes.

**APRIL 19, 2002** – The Orlando Miracle select Davalyn Cunningham from Rutgers in the second round (23rd overall) with their first pick in the 2002 WNBA Draft.

The Miracle hire two assistant coaches, Vonn Read and Valerie Still.

**APRIL 18, 2002** – Dee Brown makes the first trade in franchise history, sending the Miracle's first round selection in the 2002 Draft to the Charlotte Sting in exchange for Clarisse Machanguana.

**APRIL 5, 2002** – Former Orlando Magic guard Dee Brown was named as the Miracle's new head coach/director of player personnel. Brown retired after 12 NBA seasons and served as Special Assistant to Orlando Magic Operations. The NBA veteran, who has played for Boston, Toronto and Orlando, averaged 11.2 ppg and 2.6 rpg throughout his career. In addition, he led the NBA in three-point field goals made (135) and attempted (349) in 1998-99. Brown also won the Slam Dunk Championship at the 1991 NBA All-Star Weekend in Charlotte.

**APRIL 3, 2002** – Miracle GM/Head Coach Carolyn Peck resigned and accepted the women's basketball head coaching position at the University of Florida. Peck served as the Miracle's GM/Head Coach since April 1, 1999, and compiled a 44-52 record over three seasons, including a trip to the 2000 WNBA Playoffs.

**MARCH 6, 2002** – Shannon Johnson was one of six athletes chosen to train with the 2002 USA Basketball Women's World Championship Team in hopes of securing one of the remaining six roster spots.

**2001**

**JULY 16, 2001** – The Orlando Miracle host the third annual WNBA All-Star Game. Nykesha Sales and Taj McWilliams-Franklin are selected as reserves for the Eastern Conference Team.

**JUNE 23, 2001** – The Miracle Makers, the team charity of the Orlando Miracle, makes the largest donation in franchise history by awarding more than \$70,000 to local non-profit agencies. Recipients include Harbor House, Good Shepard Services of Orlando, Inc., Center for Independence, Technology and Education and Mustard Seed of Central Florida, Inc.

**JUNE 20, 2001** – Adrienne Johnson was named the WNBA's first-ever Hometown Hero for her outstanding efforts in the Orlando community during the off-season. The award recognizes a WNBA player who demonstrates excellent community service.

**JUNE 17, 2001** – Miracle veterans Nykesha Sales and Taj McWilliams-Franklin both eclipsed the 1,000 point mark in the June 16 game versus Phoenix.

**MAY 7, 2001** – Miracle guard Adrienne Johnson suffered a season-ending Achilles tendon tear in her right leg.

**APRIL 20, 2001** – The Orlando Miracle select Katie Douglas in the first round (10th overall), Brooke Wyckoff in the second round (26th overall), Jaclyn Johnson in the third round (42nd overall) and Anne Thorius in the fourth

round (58th overall) of the 2001 WNBA Draft.

**MARCH 28, 2001** – Michael Peck, younger brother of Carolyn Peck, was named as the Miracle's newest assistant coach. Prior to joining the Miracle, Peck served as the assistant women's basketball coach at Penn State University for three seasons.

**JANUARY 31, 2001** – Nykesha Sales and Tracy McGrady were selected to compete in the 2ball competition at the 2001 NBA All-Star Game in Washington, D.C. on February 9. This marks the first time Orlando has been selected to participate in the event.

**2000**

**OCTOBER 17, 2000** – The WNBA announces that the 2001 All-Star Game will be hosted by the Orlando Miracle.

**AUGUST 24, 2000** – The WNBA announced that it will conduct a postseason tour in four U.S. cities – Des Moines, Iowa; St. Louis, Missouri; Little Rock, Arkansas and New Orleans, Louisiana. Miracle GM/Head Coach Carolyn Peck will coach the Eastern team while Minnesota's Brian Agler will coach the Western team. Nykesha Sales and Shannon Johnson will be among the players to compete in the postseason tour.

**AUGUST 15, 2000** – The Cleveland Rockers defeat the Miracle, 72-43, in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals.

**AUGUST 11, 2000** – The Orlando Miracle win the first postseason game in franchise history, defeating the Cleveland Rockers, 62-55, at home in Game 1 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals.

**JULY 17, 2000** – Taj McWilliams, Shannon Johnson and Nykesha Sales are selected to represent the East in the 2000 WNBA All-Star Team in Phoenix.

**JULY 12, 2000** – Shannon Johnson, Taj McWilliams and Nykesha Sales were named to the 2000 Eastern Conference All-Star team for the second consecutive year. McWilliams was voted in as a starter by the fans, while Johnson and Sales were named as reserves.

**APRIL 25, 2000** – The Miracle select Brazil's Cintia dos Santos with their first selection (4th overall) in the 2000 WNBA Draft.

**1999**

**DECEMBER 15, 1999** – The Miracle lose center Tari Phillips to the Portland Fire and forward/center Yolanda Moore to the Miami Sol in the Expansion Draft.

**SEPTEMBER 2, 1999** – Shannon Johnson is named to the All-WNBA Second Team.

**JULY 14, 1999** – The inaugural WNBA All-Star Game is played at Madison Square Garden in front of a sellout crowd of 18,649. Three Miracle players, Shannon Johnson, Nykesha Sales and Taj McWilliams represent the Eastern Conference.

**JUNE 15, 1999** – The Miracle win the first regular season game in franchise history, defeating the Los Angeles Sparks, 88-86, at home.

**JUNE 10, 1999** – The Miracle tip-off its first-ever regular season game versus the two-time defending WNBA Champion Houston Comets.



**MAY 11, 1999** – Charlene Thomas-Swinson was named as an assistant coach for the Miracle. Prior to joining the Miracle, Thomas-Swinson served as the head coach at St. John's University for three years.

**MAY 4, 1999** – The Orlando Miracle select Tari Phillips from the University of Central Florida with their first pick (8th overall) in the 1999 WNBA Draft.

**MAY 3, 1999** – Shannon Johnson, a 5'6" guard, was allocated to the Orlando Miracle. Johnson was a member of the two-time defending American Basketball League (ABL) champion Columbus Quest. She averaged 11.0 ppg and 4.9 apg during the 1997-98 ABL season. The South Carolina graduate is a three-time All-SEC First Team selection and is ranked second in school history in points scored (2,230).

**APRIL 12, 1999** – The Miracle unveiled its new uniforms at the Magic FanAttic. On hand to help present the uniforms were Carolyn Peck, GM/Head Coach, Nykesha Sales, Mary Lou Johnston, Seminole County Player of the Year and 10 youth from Eccleston Elementary. The front of the jersey features the stylized "Miracle" name and player number while the back has player name and number. The uniform consists of micro-mesh and the dazzle material.

**APRIL 6, 1999** – In the 1999 WNBA Expansion Draft the Miracle added four more players to its roster. In the first round, the Miracle selected Andrea Congreaves, a 6'2" forward, from the Charlotte Sting. New York Liberty's Kisha Ford, a 5'10" guard, was picked up in the second round. Yolanda Moore, a 6'0" forward, from the two-time defending WNBA Champion Houston Comets was chosen in the third round. In the fourth and final round, the Miracle selected Adrienne Johnson, a 5'10" guard, from the Cleveland Rockers.

**MARCH 25, 1999** – A coin toss was held by the league to determine who would receive the option of having the first choice of an allocated player or selecting first in the WNBA Expansion Draft. The Miracle won the coin toss and elected to take the first choice of an allocated player.

## 1998

**DECEMBER 15, 1998** – The league announces that Orlando's nickname is the Miracle and its colors will be Miracle Blue, Quick Silver and WNBA Orange.

**DECEMBER 7, 1998** – Orlando WNBA General Manager/Head Coach Carolyn Peck announces that college coaching veteran Rick Stukes has been named as assistant coach with the team. Stukes last served as an assistant coach at Auburn (1994-1996).

**SEPTEMBER 22-25, 1998** – A WNBA team featuring several of the league's leading players, including Lisa Leslie (Los Angeles Sparks), Nikki McCray (Washington Mystics), Rebecca Lobo (New York Liberty) and Cynthia Cooper (Houston Comets) begin three days of training at the RDV Sportsplex in Orlando in preparation for the WNBA's upcoming Brazil Tour. Orlando's inaugural player Nykesha Sales also participates. While in Orlando, the players also visit local schools, hospitals and community centers, while also taking part in autograph sessions open to season ticket holders and general public. The autograph session at the RDV Sportsplex draws nearly 4,000 fans.

**SEPTEMBER 15, 1998** – University of Connecticut All-American and all-time leading scorer Nykesha Sales is named Orlando's inaugural player.

### HISTORY

On April 24, 1996, women's basketball announced "We Got Next" as the NBA Board of Governors approved the concept of a Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) to begin play in June of 1997.

Since that day in 1996 there have been many firsts for the WNBA:

**Val Ackerman** – the first president of the WNBA

**Sheryl Swoopes** – the first player signed to the WNBA

**Cynthia Cooper** – the league's first Most Valuable Player

**Houston Comets** – the first WNBA Champions

**Lisa Leslie** – the first WNBA player to dunk (7/30/02 vs. Miami)

**Lauren Jackson** – the first international player to win MVP (2007)

**Candace Parker** – the first rookie to earn the league's MVP honor (2008)

**Sylvia Fowles** – the first goaltending call (vs. LA 6/3/2008)

The inaugural WNBA season tipped off on June 21, 1997, with the New York Liberty taking on the Los Angeles Sparks at the Great Western Forum in Inglewood, California. A crowd of 14,284 watched as Sparks' guard Penny Toler scored the first basket in WNBA history. The Liberty defeated the Sparks, 67-57.

### A GROWING GAME

The influence of the WNBA can be seen in the explosive growth of organized women's basketball over the past 12 seasons. An estimated 100 million women play basketball worldwide, and our league reflects this trend, featuring 23 international players from 16 countries and territories at the end of the 2008 season. Female AAU youth basketball participation has increased +277 percent since 1990 (from 28,840 to 108,758 players). Female high school basketball participation has increased 18 percent since 1990 (from 387,802 to 456,967 players). And female NCAA basketball participation has increased 43 percent since 1990 (from 10,551 to 15,096 players).

### ALL-STAR GAME

This summer's marquee event "*WNBA vs. USA Basketball: The Stars at the Sun*" will showcase the world's best female basketball players under one roof when the WNBA's top talent faces the USA Basketball Women's National Team. This special event, hosted by the WNBA and the Connecticut Sun, will take place at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, CT on Saturday, July 10. ESPN will broadcast the game with tip-off set for 3:30 p.m. ET. The USA Basketball squad will be coached by Geno Auriemma.

The 2009 WNBA All-Star Game was held at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. on Saturday, July 25. It was the ninth such game in league history, and second played at Mohegan Sun, and was played in front of a sellout crowd of 9,518. The West beat the East 130-118 in the highest scoring All-Star Game in WNBA history. Swin Cash of the Seattle Storm claimed MVP honors. Cash, who tallied an All-Star record 22 points on 10-of-16, was one of five former UConn Huskies who were participating in the game.

### INSPIRING COACH

The Inspiring Coach Award is an annual honor introduced in 2007 to honor coaches who have positively influenced athletes across numerous levels and whose achievements leave an indelible mark on sports as a whole. The University of Tennessee's Pat Summitt earned the honor in 2009 for her profound impact on female athletes and her demonstrated commitment, passion, and dedication to work, family, and community. Previous winners include Kay Yow and Jody Conradt.



## INSPIRING WOMEN

The Inspiring Woman Award is an annual honor that celebrates an individual who, on a daily basis, demonstrates her ability to inspire others through her commitment, passion and dedication to work, family, and community. Past honorees include Emmy-award winning journalist Cokie Roberts, *Good Morning America's* Robin Roberts, Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice, and the WNBA All-Decade Team.

## DAWN STALEY AWARD

The Dawn Staley Community Leadership Award was announced in 2006 and is now presented annually to the player who best exemplifies the characteristics of a leader in the community and reflects Staley's contagious leadership, spirit, charitable efforts and love for the game. Tamika Catchings won the inaugural award in 2007 while Tamika Raymond was named the winner for 2008. A member of the WNBA's All-Decade Team, Staley, who retired following the 2006 season, established herself as one of the greatest ambassadors in women's basketball history, while also demonstrating outstanding leadership qualities as a coach on the collegiate level and as a philanthropist and humanitarian.

## MARKETING

The WNBA maintains marketing, promotional, and media partnerships with a variety of top companies, each with varying levels of activation and integration in league operations.

New partners in 2008 included such major companies as Kia Motors, IHOP and Pitney Bowes. HP, Starwood Hotels and Resorts and "Got Milk?" all joined the WNBA as partners for the 2009 season.

The WNBA's marketing partners utilize the league to support women's sports and reach its strong fan base of women, families, and young girls through advertising in WNBA nationally televised games, national promotions, player endorsements, and special events. Through the WNBA's extensive, highly integrated relationship with adidas, the sporting goods and apparel giant not only serves as the official outfitter of the WNBA – having unveiled new uniforms across the league in 2007 – but also as the presenter of the 2007, 2008, and 2009 WNBA Drafts and in 2008 became the first-ever presenting partner of the WNBA's entire postseason, including both the playoffs and Finals.

Two WNBA teams entered the 2009 season as forerunners in the league's Marquee Partnership program, which includes multiyear deals featuring branded sponsorship of game jerseys – the Phoenix Mercury partnering with LifeLock, a giant in the identity theft industry, and the Los Angeles Sparks partnering with Farmers Insurance Group.

## ATTENDANCE/TV RATINGS

The WNBA concluded the 2009 regular season with its third consecutive year of increased attendance and second consecutive year of increased viewership on ESPN2. The WNBA regular season on ESPN2 concluded with an average of 269,000 viewers, up 8 percent versus 2008 (248,000 viewers). Regular-season games on ESPN2 saw increases in key demographics, including men 18-34 (+9 percent), men 18-49 (+14 percent), and men 23-54 (+23 percent).

For the 2009 WNBA Finals presented by adidas, average viewership on ESPN2 jumped 76 percent from 2008. The five-game series featuring the Indiana Fever and Phoenix Mercury also featured three sellouts and the highest total attendance figure (82,018) in WNBA Finals history.

The WNBA has one of the top five Facebook fanbases among sports leagues, with more than 275,000 fans ([www.Facebook.com/wnba](http://www.Facebook.com/wnba)).

The WNBA's broadcast coverage in 2009 included live national telecasts of 29 regular-season and postseason contests on ESPN2 and ABC, and another 50 games on NBA TV, as well as games streamed on ESPN360.com.

In addition, fans watched more than two million streams of live and archived games through WNBA LiveAccess, a new feature on WNBA.com that provided fans with free access to more than 200 live game Webcasts – the league's most comprehensive offering – throughout the season.

In July 2007, the WNBA signed a new, eight-year TV deal with ESPN that tips off in 2009 and runs through 2016, the WNBA's 20th season. The agreement, which calls for ABC, ESPN and ESPN2 to telecast WNBA games, includes rights fees, a first for any women's pro team sports league in the U.S.

## GLOBAL REACH

Now in its second decade, the WNBA has a wide impact on overseas markets. In 2009, for the third straight year, WNBA games and programming reached a record 203 countries in 32 languages, surpassing the previous total of 198 countries. Included were television agreements in six new countries: Argentina, Bulgaria, Jamaica, Pan Africa, South Korea and China. In addition, for the fourth consecutive year, fans in China were able to view WNBA action via live Webcasts on [NBA.com/china](http://NBA.com/china).

WNBA rosters for the 2009 season featured 18 international players from 11 countries and territories. Among the league's international contingent are the Seattle Storm's Lauren Jackson (Australia), Indiana Fever's Tammy Sutton-Brown (Canada), San Antonio Silver Stars' Sophia Young (St. Vincent), and Los Angeles Sparks' Ticha Penicheiro (Portugal).

## OWNERSHIP

Seven WNBA teams now fall under the independent ownership model: the Atlanta Dream, Chicago Sky, Connecticut Sun, Los Angeles Sparks, Seattle Storm, Tulsa Shock and Washington Mystics.

With the announcement on Oct. 20, 2009 that the Detroit Shock would relocate to Tulsa, Okla., Tulsa Pro Hoops L.L.C. will begin play in 2010 and is led by Bill Cameron and David Box. Force 10 Hoops, L.L.C., the entity owned by Seattle businesswomen and civic leaders Anne Levinson, Ginny Gilder, Lisa Brummel and Dawn Trudeau, purchased the Seattle Storm on Feb. 28, 2008. In October 2009, Kathy Betty purchased the Atlanta Dream. In addition, the Los Angeles Sparks opened the 2007 season with new ownership after Kathy Goodman and Carla Christofferson, two long-time season ticket holders, bought the Sparks on Dec. 7, 2006. They joined Sheila Johnson's Washington Mystics, Michael Alter's Chicago Sky, and the Mohegan Tribe's Connecticut Sun as independently owned WNBA franchises.

Seven women serve as owners of WNBA teams: Dr. Sheila Johnson (Washington Mystics); Kathy Goodman and Carla Christofferson (Los Angeles Sparks); Kathy Betty (Atlanta); and Anne Levinson, Ginny Gilder, Lisa Brummel and Dawn Trudeau (Seattle Storm). An eighth, musical artist Michelle Williams, formerly of "Destiny's Child," is a minority owner of the Chicago Sky.



Johnson, a co-founder of Black Entertainment Television, became the WNBA's first African-American female owner on May 24, 2005 when she joined Ted Leonsis' Lincoln Holdings LLC, which in turn purchased the Washington Mystics from Washington Wizards' owner Abe Pollin.

### KEY HIGHLIGHTS

Diana Taurasi won both the 2009 WNBA MVP award and the 2009 WNBA Finals MVP award. Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks became the first WNBA player to capture the regular-season, All-Star and Finals MVP awards during the 2001 season.

In 2008, Candace Parker became the first WNBA player to win Rookie of the Year and Most Valuable Player of the Year in the same season. The first selection in the 2008 WNBA Draft, she earned both honors after leading the league in double-doubles and rebounds per game, while also ranking second in blocks per game and fourth in points per game. She also became just the second player (Lisa Leslie), to dunk in a WNBA game.

While Diana Taurasi of the Phoenix Mercury won her first WNBA MVP award in 2009, there have been several repeat honorees. Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks earned the award in 2006, 2001, and 2004. Leslie joined the Houston Comets' Sheryl Swoopes as the only players in WNBA history to capture MVP honors three times. Two players have won the award twice in a career: Houston's Cynthia Cooper (1997, 1998) and Seattle's Lauren Jackson (2003, 2007). The others to capture MVP honors are Yolanda Griffith (then with Sacramento in 1999) and Los Angeles' Candace Parker (2008, when she became the first rookie in league history to earn the award).

Taurasi rewrote the WNBA scoring records in 2006 when she led the league with 25.3 points per contest, became the first WNBA player to top 800 points in a single season (860),

and the single-season mark for three-point field-goals (121) and the single-game mark for points (47, a number later equaled by the Storm's Lauren Jackson in 2007).

There is only one player who has reached 6,000 points in her WNBA career. Lisa Leslie, who retired following the 2009 season, ranks at the top of the WNBA's all-time scoring leaders with 6,263 points. The players who have passed the 5,000 point plateau are Tina Thompson, Katie Smith, and Lauren Jackson.

Lauren Jackson became the youngest (26 years, 77 days) and fastest (209 games) to score her 4,000th career point on July 27, 2007. However, that record was broken when Diana Taurasi reached the same milestone on July 27, 2009 in just 197 games.

Sheryl Swoopes, who earned MVP and Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2000 and 2002, made WNBA history with the league's first triple-double (14 points, 15 rebounds, 10 assists) vs. the Detroit Shock on July 27, 1999.

### WNBA CARES

Through the WNBA Cares initiative, the league is deeply committed to creating programs that improve the quality of life for all people, with a special emphasis on promoting a healthy lifestyle and positive body image, breast health awareness, youth and family development, and education. WNBA teams and players donate countless dollars and hours each year through league programs including Breast Health Awareness, WNBA Green Week, Go Red For Women, WNBA Fit, and Read to Achieve.

### 1996

**APRIL 24, 1996** Women's basketball announces "We Got Next" as the NBA Board of Governors approves the concept of a WNBA.

**AUGUST 7, 1996** Val Ackerman is named first president of the WNBA.

**OCTOBER 23, 1996** Houston Comets forward Sheryl Swoopes becomes the first player signed by the WNBA.

**OCTOBER 30, 1996** WNBA announces eight teams to compete in the inaugural season – Charlotte, Cleveland, Houston, Los Angeles, New York, Phoenix, Sacramento and Utah.

### 1997

**JANUARY 22, 1997** The league's first 16 players are allocated to teams, an elite group comprised of Olympians and collegiate stars.

**APRIL 19, 1997** WNBA and Spalding introduce the league's official orange-and-oatmeal game ball during WNBA Pre-Draft Camp at Disney's Wide World of Sports complex in Orlando.

**APRIL 28, 1997** Tina Thompson is the first No. 1 draft pick, selected by the Houston Comets in the inaugural WNBA Draft.

**JUNE 21, 1997** The New York Liberty and the Los Angeles Sparks tip-off the first WNBA game at the Great Western Forum in Los Angeles. Sparks guard Penny Toler scores the league's first basket at 19:01. New York wins 67-57.

**JUNE 23, 1997** Utah Starzz becomes first team to pass the 100-point mark in a 102-89 victory over the Los Angeles Sparks.

**JULY 2, 1997** New York Liberty center Rebecca Lobo wins her 100th consecutive personal victory when the Liberty defeat the Houston Comets 70-67. Winning streak comprises Lobo's 35-0 senior season at the University of Connecticut,

60-0 as member of U.S. Olympic Team and 5-0 as a member of the Liberty. The streak ends at 102.

**AUGUST 30, 1997** The Houston Comets become the first WNBA Champions, employing the unstoppable Cynthia Cooper and a suffocating defense for a 65-51 victory over the New York Liberty at The Summit.

**OCTOBER 1, 1997** The WNBA announces that franchises in Detroit and Washington will join the fold as expansion teams for the 1998 season.

### 1998

**APRIL 22, 1998** The league announces the addition of expansion teams in Orlando and Minnesota for the 1999 season, bringing the total number of teams to 12.

**JUNE 19, 1998** Los Angeles Sparks center Lisa Leslie sets a WNBA record by pulling down 21 rebounds in the Sparks' victory over the New York Liberty.

**JUNE 21, 1998** Lisa Leslie notches her seventh-straight double-double, setting a WNBA record.

**JULY 18, 1998** Houston's Cynthia Cooper becomes the first player to reach 1,000 points during Comets' 75-44 rout of the Sacramento Monarchs.

**JULY 29, 1998** Sacramento Monarchs guard Ticha Penicheiro dishes out 16 assists in a 75-67 loss vs. the Cleveland Rockers to set a WNBA record.

**AUGUST 29, 1998** In Game 2 of the WNBA Finals, the Houston Comets, trailing the Phoenix Mercury 1-0 in the best-of-three series, erases a 12-point deficit in the final 7:24 to force overtime. Houston wins the series and claims its second of four titles.



## 1999

**APRIL 29, 1999** The WNBA and WNBA reaches final accord as the league's first Collective Bargaining Agreement is signed.

**JUNE 7, 1999** WNBA announces the addition of four expansion teams for the 2000 season – Indiana, Miami, Portland and Seattle. The WNBA family now includes 16 teams.

**JUNE 29, 1999** The Sacramento Monarchs and the Minnesota Lynx combine for a WNBA-record 21 three-pointers (10 by Sacramento, 11 by Minnesota) in the Monarchs' 86-72 victory over the Lynx.

**JULY 14, 1999** Whitney Houston sings the National Anthem in front of an electrified crowd on hand at Madison Square Garden to witness the Inaugural WNBA All-Star Game. The West defeats the East 79-61 and Lisa Leslie is named MVP.

**JULY 27, 1999** Sheryl Swoopes records the WNBA's first triple-double with 15 points, 14 rebounds and 10 assists in an 85-46 win over Detroit at the Compaq Center.

**SEPTEMBER 4, 1999** New York Liberty guard Teresa Weatherspoon nails a shot from beyond the midcourt line with 2.4 seconds remaining to give the Liberty a 68-67 victory over the Houston Comets in Game 2 of the WNBA Finals. The shot sends the series to a decisive Game 3, which the Comets win to claim their third straight WNBA title.

## 2000

**JUNE 7, 2000** Cleveland Rockers forward Eva Nemcova ends her record-streak of 66 consecutive free throws with a miss against Orlando. Nemcova did not miss from the foul line from June 14, 1999 to June 5, 2000.

**JULY 17, 2000** The West defeats the East 73-61 at the 2000 WNBA All-Star Game, hosted by the Phoenix Mercury at America West Arena. Houston's Tina Thompson captures MVP honors.

**AUGUST 25, 2000** Cleveland Rockers guard Suzie McConnell Serio is named the recipient of the first Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award presented by American General, named in honor of Houston's Kim Perrot, who died of cancer in 1999.

**AUGUST 26, 2000** Cynthia Cooper turns in a clutch performance to earn her fourth WNBA Finals MVP as the Houston Comets claim fourth straight title by defeating the New York Liberty. In Game 1 at Madison Square Garden, Cooper converts a crucial three-point play with 25.4 seconds remaining to push the Comets' lead to five. In Game 2, she scores six of her 25 points in overtime and nine of Houston's final 18 points. It marks Cooper's last appearance in the WNBA Finals. She retires as the WNBA's all-time scoring leader.

## 2001

**JUNE 2, 2001** Houston's Van Chancellor becomes first WNBA coach to record 100 victories as the Comets defeat the Detroit Shock 74-73.

**JUNE 7, 2001** Utah Starzz center Margo Dydek records the WNBA's second triple-double, setting a league record for blocked shots in the process as her 12 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks leads Utah to an 82-79 win over Orlando.

**JULY 3, 2001** Washington and Seattle battle through quadruple overtime – the longest game in WNBA history – before the Mystics edge the Storm 72-69.

**JULY 7, 2001** Minnesota Lynx guard Katie Smith sets the WNBA single-game scoring record with a 46-point performance, including six three-pointers, in a 100-95 overtime loss to Los Angeles.

**JULY 14, 2001** The West wins the 2001 WNBA All-Star Game in Orlando, defeating the East 80-72. Lisa Leslie earns her second All-Star MVP award.

**JULY 30, 2001** Lisa Leslie scores her 2,538th point to become the WNBA's career scoring leader, surpassing Cynthia Cooper.

**AUGUST 10, 2001** Katie Smith scores 22 points in Minnesota's 65-51 win over Seattle to break the WNBA single-season scoring record of 686 points set by Cynthia Cooper in 1999.

**AUGUST 11, 2001** Los Angeles becomes the first team to go undefeated at home for an entire season, finishing 16-0 at the STAPLES Center.

**AUGUST 27, 2001** The Charlotte Sting, after dropping the opener of the Eastern Conference Finals at home, go into Madison Square Garden and take both games against the Liberty to derail New York's hopes of making a third consecutive trip to the WNBA Finals. Charlotte advances to the Finals after a 1-10 season start.

**SEPTEMBER 1, 2001** The Los Angeles Sparks claim their first WNBA Championship to give the city of Los Angeles a sweep of professional basketball titles in 2001. Lisa Leslie becomes the first WNBA player to capture all three MVP awards in the same season, joining NBA greats Shaquille O'Neal, Michael Jordan and Willis Reed as the only pro hoopsters to accomplish this feat.

Sparks coach Michael Cooper becomes the first person to claim NBA and WNBA titles, having won five championships as a player with the Lakers.

The WNBA welcomes its 10 millionth fan prior to Game 2 of the WNBA Finals at the STAPLES Center.

**NOVEMBER 13, 2001** The Seattle Storm win the first pick in the 2002 WNBA Draft in the inaugural WNBA Draft Lottery.

## 2002

**JUNE 4, 2002** Katie Smith becomes the WNBA's all-time career leader for three-pointers (233), surpassing Cynthia Cooper (232).

**JUNE 5, 2002** Teresa Weatherspoon becomes the first WNBA player to record 1,000 assists during the Liberty's 60-59 victory over the Detroit Shock at Madison Square Garden.

**JUNE 8, 2002** The Orlando Miracle and the Cleveland Rockers square off for the longest game in WNBA history. The Miracle claims a 103-99 victory in the 2:57 contest that spans three overtime periods.

**JUNE 22, 2002** Utah Starzz forward Natalie Williams records the first 20/20 performance in WNBA history when she scores 22 points and grabs 20 rebounds in Utah's 77-61 win over the Sacramento Monarchs at ARCO Arena.

**JULY 15, 2002** The West earns its fourth straight victory in the 2002 WNBA All-Star Game in Washington, D.C., edging the East 81-76. Lisa Leslie takes All-Star MVP honors for the second straight year and third time in her career.

**JULY 22, 2002** Lisa Leslie becomes the first WNBA player to record 3,000 points during the Sparks' 92-84 victory over Orlando at the STAPLES Center. Leslie records 24 points and 21 rebounds (tying the league record she set on 6/19/98) in the victory.

**JULY 30, 2002** Lisa Leslie becomes the first WNBA player to dunk in a game when she throws down a one-handed breakaway layup with 4:44 remaining in the first half in Los Angeles' 82-73 loss to Miami at the STAPLES Center.

**AUGUST 9, 2002** Margo Dydek becomes the first WNBA player to record 500 career blocks.



**AUGUST 15, 2002** Washington Mystics forward Chamique Holdsclaw becomes the first player to lead the league in both scoring (19.9 ppg) and rebounding (11.6 rpg) in a single season.

**AUGUST 29, 2002** Los Angeles Sparks rookie guard Nikki Teasley nails the game-winning shot in the waning seconds of Game 2 of the WNBA Finals to give the Sparks their second consecutive WNBA Championship, defeating the New York Liberty.

Lisa Leslie earns WNBA Finals MVP honors for the second straight year.

**OCTOBER 8, 2002** The NBA Board of Governors votes to restructure the WNBA to allow individual team ownership, to allow teams to be owned by non-NBA owners and to be located in non-NBA markets.

**OCTOBER 21, 2002** The WNBA announces that the Miracle will be relocated from Orlando to a city to be designated by the WNBA.

**NOVEMBER 27, 2002** The Miami Heat organization elects not to assume ownership of the Sol.

**DECEMBER 5, 2002** The WNBA announces that the Utah Starzz will relocate to San Antonio for the 2003 season.

**DECEMBER 30, 2002** The Portland Trailblazers organization elects not to assume ownership of the Fire.

## 2003

**JANUARY 10, 2003** San Antonio announces "Silver Stars" as its official team name.

**JANUARY 28, 2003** The Connecticut Sun join the WNBA for 2003, as the Mohegan Tribe of Indians become the first non-NBA owner in league history. The Orlando Miracle become the Connecticut Sun.

**APRIL 24, 2003** The WNBA holds the second annual Draft Lottery and a Dispersal Draft to disseminate players from the Miami Sol and Portland Fire. The Cleveland Rockers win the lottery, while the Detroit Shock make Ruth Riley, formerly of the Sol, the first selection in the Dispersal Draft.

**APRIL 25, 2003** At 3 a.m., the WNBA and the WNBA sign the league's second Collective Bargaining Agreement. The agreement is for four years, with a league option for a fifth, and gives WNBA players the first free agency rights in the history of women's professional team sports.

**APRIL 25, 2003** The league holds the 2003 WNBA Draft, and Cleveland takes Mississippi State's LaToya Thomas as the first overall pick.

**MAY 23, 2003** Chamique Holdsclaw breaks the WNBA record for rebounds in a game grabbing 24 in the Washington Mystics season-opening win over the Charlotte Sting. She also added 22 points and become the first WNBA player to record two 20-point, 20-rebound performances in a career.

**JUNE 7, 2003** Seattle Storm center Lauren Jackson becomes the youngest player in WNBA history to reach the 1,000 point milestone at age 22.

**JUNE 10, 2003** Minnesota's Katie Smith becomes the first WNBA player to record 300 three-point field goals in her career.

**JULY 12, 2003** The West captures its fifth straight WNBA All-Star victory at New York's Madison Square Garden by defeating the East All-Stars 84-75, while Los Angeles's Nikki Teasley earns MVP honors.

**AUGUST 25, 2003** Nikki Teasley finishes the year averaging 11.5 points, 6.3 assists, and 5.1 rebounds becoming the first player in WNBA history to average more than ten points, five assists, and five rebounds in a season.

**SEPTEMBER 14, 2003** Seattle's Lauren Jackson becomes the first international player to win the WNBA's Most Valuable Player award.

**SEPTEMBER 16, 2003** The Detroit Shock win their first WNBA title against the Los Angeles Sparks in front of a sell-out crowd and record attendance of 22,076. Detroit's Ruth Riley records a career high 27 points in Game Three and earns the series MVP.

**SEPTEMBER 23, 2003** Rebecca Lobo, one of three original WNBA players, (together with Sheryl Swoopes and Lisa Leslie) signed by the league, retires after a seven-year career.

**DECEMBER 3, 2003** The Phoenix Mercury win the first pick in the WNBA Draft in the 2004 WNBA Draft Lottery.

**DECEMBER 17, 2003** The Board of Governors announces three rules changes. The three-point line moves from 19' 9" to 20' 6", and the lane is widened from 12' to the NBA width of 16'. The 30-second shot clock resets to 20 seconds (as opposed to 30 seconds under the previous rule) when a defensive foul or other defensive violation occurs with less than 20 seconds remaining on the shot clock.

## 2004

**JANUARY 6, 2004** The WNBA holds a Dispersal Draft to disseminate the players from the Cleveland Rockers. The Phoenix Mercury select forward Penny Taylor with the first overall selection.

**APRIL 17, 2004** The league holds the 2004 WNBA Draft, and Phoenix takes the University of Connecticut's Diana Taurasi as the #1 overall pick.

**JUNE 17, 2004** Ticha Penicheiro passes Teresa Weatherspoon to take over the number one spot in career assists.

**JULY 29, 2004** Lisa Leslie scores her 4,000th career point and becomes the first WNBA player to reach the milestone.

**AUGUST 2-31, 2004** The WNBA stops play to give players the opportunity to compete in the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.

**AUGUST 5, 2004** USA Basketball defeats the WNBA All-Stars 74-58 as the two teams face-off in the historic game at Radio City Music Hall in New York City. The game was a send off for the US Women's National Team as they prepared to compete in the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens.

**SEPTEMBER 10, 2004** Lisa Leslie records the WNBA's third triple-double, tying Margo Dydek's record for blocked shots in the process as her 29 points, 15 rebounds and 10 blocked shots leads Los Angeles to an 81-63 victory over the Detroit Shock.

**OCTOBER 12, 2004** The Seattle Storm win their first WNBA title against the Connecticut Sun before a sell-out crowd of 17,072. For the first time in WNBA history, all three games of the WNBA Finals were sell-outs. Seattle guard Betty Lennox averaged 22.3 points for the three games on her way to earning the series MVP.

**DECEMBER 1, 2004** The Charlotte Sting beat the odds to win the first pick in the 2005 WNBA Draft in the fourth annual WNBA Draft Lottery. Charlotte had only a 9.7 percent chance of capturing the first pick.

## 2005

**FEBRUARY 8, 2005** NBA Commissioner David Stern announces that the WNBA will be expanding to Chicago for the 2006 season. The Chicago Sky becomes the second WNBA team to be owned and run by an entity outside of the NBA. In 2003, the Connecticut Sun became the first independently owned and operated WNBA team.



**FEBRUARY 15, 2005** Donna Orender is appointed by David Stern as the second president of the WNBA.

**APRIL 16, 2005** The league holds the 2005 WNBA Draft, and Charlotte takes the University of Minnesota center Janel McCarville as the #1 overall pick.

**MAY 24, 2005** Sheila Johnson, co-founder of Black Entertainment Television, becomes the WNBA's first African-American female owner when she joined Ted Leonsis' Lincoln Holdings LLC, which in turn purchased the Washington Mystics from Washington Wizards' owner Abe Pollin.

**JULY 13, 2005** Katie Smith becomes the first woman in U.S. basketball history to score 5,000 points in her professional career (WNBA and ABL).

**AUGUST 18, 2005** Anne Donovan becomes the first female WNBA coach – and fourth overall in the league – to win 100 games.

**SEPTEMBER 18, 2005** Sheryl Swoopes becomes the first three-time WNBA Most Valuable Player in league history.

**SEPTEMBER 20, 2005** The Sacramento Monarchs clinch the 2005 WNBA Championship, bringing the city of Sacramento their first basketball title.

**OCTOBER 24, 2005** The Minnesota Lynx beat the odds to win the first pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft in the fifth annual WNBA Draft Lottery. Minnesota had only a 16.7 percent chance of capturing the first pick.

## 2006

**FEBRUARY 1, 2006** The WNBA announces the 2006 WNBA Draft and Pre-Draft Camp will be held in Boston, site of the NCAA Women's Final Four. The WNBA events will conclude a week-long celebration of women's basketball emanating from Boston.

**APRIL 5, 2006** The league holds the 2006 WNBA Draft, and Minnesota takes the Louisiana State University's Seimone Augustus as the #1 overall pick.

**JUNE 13, 2006** The WNBA All-Decade Team is selected by fans, a panel of national and WNBA-market media and the league's current players and coaches. The team is comprised of the 10 best and most influential players from its first 10 years of play. Players named are: Sue Bird, Tamika Catchings, Cynthia Cooper, Yolanda Griffith, Lauren Jackson, Lisa Leslie, Katie Smith, Dawn Staley, Sheryl Swoopes and Tina Thompson. Van Chancellor, who led the Houston Comets to consecutive WNBA championships in the league's first four seasons, was named the WNBA's Coach of the Decade.

**JULY 12, 2006** The 2006 WNBA All-Star Game takes place at New York City's Madison Square Garden. Four rookies – Seimone Augustus, Cappie Pondexter, Sophia Young and Candice Dupree – are named All-Stars. The East squad, led by All-Star MVP Katie Douglas of the Connecticut Sun, earns its first-ever victory with a 98-82 decision. Off the court, the inaugural All-Star Salute: Celebrating Inspiration Luncheon is a key highlight of the festivities as former Secretary of State Madeleine Albright is the keynote speaker.

**JUNE 23, 2006** In a game against the San Antonio Silver Stars, Los Angeles Sparks center Lisa Leslie scores the 5,000th point in her WNBA career and becomes the first player in WNBA history to reach that milestone.

**AUGUST 10, 2006** Diana Taurasi scores a WNBA single-game record 47 points in a triple-overtime game against Houston. Taurasi would also finish the 2006 season with new WNBA records for most points in a single-season (860) and highest scoring average in a single season (25.3).

**AUGUST 30, 2006** As part of the League's 10th Anniversary season, the WNBA Greatest Moment presented by AOL.com is unveiled during Game 1 of the 2006 WNBA Finals. Fans, who were able to log on to [www.aol.com/wnba](http://www.aol.com/wnba), voted Teresa Weatherspoon's half-court, buzzer-beater – a shot that propelled the New York Liberty to victory in Game 2 of the 1999 WNBA Finals and on to a deciding Game 3 against the Houston Comets – as their favorite moment in the WNBA's 10-year history.

**SEPTEMBER 3, 2006** Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks is named MVP for the third time in her career after having also earned the honor in 2001 and 2004. Leslie joined the Houston Comets' Sheryl Swoopes as the only players in WNBA history to capture MVP honors three times.

**SEPTEMBER 9, 2006** The 2006 WNBA Finals see the Detroit Shock earn their second league championship when they topped the Sacramento Monarchs in the first WNBA Finals match up ever to reach a fifth and deciding game. The historic game featured a sellout crowd of 19,671 at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, the second highest Finals crowd in WNBA history. Detroit's Deanna Nolan is named Finals MVP.

**OCTOBER 26, 2006** The Phoenix Mercury wins the sixth annual Draft Lottery and earns the top pick in the 2007 WNBA Draft. It marks the first time that the team whose odds of winning the top pick were mathematically the smallest actually came away with the #1 pick.

**NOVEMBER 7, 2006** The WNBA announces the creation of the Dawn Staley Community Leadership Award. The award will be presented to the player who best exemplifies the characteristics of a leader in the community and will reflect Staley's contagious leadership, spirit, charitable efforts and love for the game.

**DECEMBER 7, 2006** The WNBA Board of Governors approves the sale of the Los Angeles Sparks to an investment group led by Katherine E. Goodman and Carla J. Christofferson.

**DECEMBER 13, 2006** The Charlotte Bobcats Organization announces that it will no longer operate the Charlotte Sting.

## 2007

**JANUARY 8, 2007** The WNBA holds a Dispersal Draft to disseminate the players from the Charlotte Sting. The Chicago Sky select guard Monique Currie with the first overall selection.

**JANUARY 30, 2007** Rule changes are announced for the 2007 season and include the following: the backcourt rule requires offensive teams to bring the ball across the mid-court line within eight seconds rather than 10 seconds; the timeout rule requires that officials grant requests for a timeout (full or 20-second) by a player in the game or the head coach; and the teams will now be able to designate 11 active players and up to two inactive players on playoff rosters, with the ability to activate any inactive players on a game-by-game basis.

**JANUARY 31, 2007** The WNBA Board of Governors approves the sale of the Houston Comets to Hilton Koch/Hilton Acquisitions, LLC.

**FEBRUARY 16, 2007** Electronic Arts announces that six WNBA players are featured in a new videogame *NBA STREET Homecourt*. Sue Bird, Tamika Catchings, Lauren Jackson, Lisa Leslie, Sheryl Swoopes and Diana Taurasi are the first female professional athletes to ever be featured and go head-to-head with their male counterparts in a videogame.

**MARCH 31, 2007** Former University of Texas Head Coach Jody Conradt becomes the inaugural recipient of the WNBA Inspiring Coach Award.



**APRIL 4, 2007** The 2007 WNBA Draft presented by adidas takes place in Cleveland, marking the second straight year that the draft was held immediately following the NCAA Women's Division I Championship Game and conducted in the same city as the Final Four. The Phoenix Mercury make Lindsey Harding the top overall pick before trading her to the Minnesota Lynx in exchange for Tangela Smith. The fast-paced draft earned a place in league history when Jessica Davenport, the second overall pick, was subsequently traded from San Antonio to New York in exchange for all-star guard Becky Hammon and a future selection. It marked the first time in WNBA history that the top two picks were traded on Draft Day.

**JULY 15, 2007** The 2007 WNBA All-Star Game, the league's eighth such contest, is played in front of a sellout audience on July 15 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C. A crowd of 19,487 fans witnessed the East defeat the West, 103-99, as Cheryl Ford of the Detroit Shock clinched the MVP honors. A key highlight of the All-Star festivities in 2007 was the second annual All-Star Salute: Inspiring Women Luncheon, featuring keynote speaker and Secretary of State Dr. Condoleezza Rice.

**JULY 15, 2007** Signaling a major milestone in its second decade, the WNBA reaches an eight-year agreement with ESPN to have ABC, ESPN and ESPN2 televise games through the 2016 season. The agreement was announced in conjunction with the 2007 WNBA All-Star Game by Donna Orender, WNBA President, and John Skipper, ESPN Executive Vice President, Content. The agreement extends the WNBA's relationship with ESPN, which began with the league's inaugural season in 1997, to 20 seasons.

**JULY 24, 2007** Seattle's Lauren Jackson scores 47 points in a 97-96 overtime loss to the Washington Mystics, tying Diana Taurasi for the WNBA record for most points in a single game.

**JULY 27, 2007** Lauren Jackson scores her 4,000th career point during a 89-75 win over the Indiana Fever, becoming the youngest and fastest player in league history to reach the milestone. Jackson reaches the milestone in 209 games.

**SEPTEMBER 5, 2007** Lauren Jackson is named MVP of the league for the second time in her career after having also earned the honor in 2003. Jackson led the WNBA in scoring, rebounding and double-doubles and was also named the WNBA's Player of the Week on five occasions. Jackson joined Lisa Leslie, Sheryl Swoopes and Cynthia Cooper as the only players in WNBA history to capture multiple MVP honors.

**SEPTEMBER 16, 2007** The 2007 WNBA Finals see the Phoenix Mercury win their first-ever championship behind the play of Diana Taurasi, Penny Taylor and Cappie Pondexter, who was named Finals MVP. The Mercury capped the most exciting WNBA season ever by defeating the defending champion Detroit Shock in five games. It marked the first time that a WNBA Championship has been won on the road, and Mercury head coach Paul Westhead became the first head coach to win both a WNBA title and an NBA title (1980, Los Angeles Lakers). Total attendance for the 2007 WNBA Finals between the Phoenix Mercury and the Detroit Shock was 74,178, establishing a new all-time WNBA Finals record. In addition, Game 5's crowd of 22,076 at The Palace of Auburn Hills tied the all-time, single-game attendance record for the WNBA Finals (also set on Sept. 16 2003 of the 2003 WNBA Finals, Los Angeles at Detroit).

**OCTOBER 17, 2007** WNBA President Donna Orender announces that the City of Atlanta was awarded a WNBA expansion team for the 2008 season. The new team will be owned and operated by Atlanta businessman J. Ronald Terwilliger.

**OCTOBER 23, 2007** The Los Angeles Sparks win the seventh annual Draft Lottery and earned the top pick in the 2008 WNBA Draft. The Sparks won the lottery for the first time in franchise history, after tying the Minnesota Lynx for fewest wins in 2007.

## 2008

**JANUARY 23, 2008** The Atlanta expansion franchise unveils their team name, logo and colors. The Atlanta Dream's color scheme will consist of sky blue and red.

**JANUARY 28, 2008** The WNBA and the WNBAPA sign the league's third collective bargaining agreement covering six seasons, commencing with the 2008 season and continuing through 2013.

**JANUARY 29, 2008** Rule changes are announced for the 2008 season and include the following: the inbound rule will permit a player to pass the ball anywhere (frontcourt or backcourt) on the court during the final minute of the fourth period and the final minute of any overtime period; players not occupying lane spaces shall now remain behind the three-point line (above the free-throw line extended) during free-throws; and instant-replay rules will now require automatic video reviews by the officiating crew in the case of flagrant fouls that result in ejections and other player altercations.

**FEBRUARY 6, 2008** The WNBA holds an Expansion Draft to build the inaugural roster of the Atlanta Dream. The Dream selected one player from each team, including Betty Lennox, Katie Feenstra, Erika DeSouza and Kristin Haynie. The Dream also orchestrated trades for Iziaine Castro Marques and Ivory Latta.

**FEBRUARY 28, 2008** Force 10 Hoops, L.L.C., the entity owned by Seattle businesswomen and civic leaders Anne Levinson, Ginny Gilder, Lisa Brummel and Dawn Trudeau, purchases the Seattle Storm. Seven WNBA teams now fall under the independent ownership model: the Atlanta Dream, Chicago Sky, Connecticut Sun, Houston Comets, Los Angeles Sparks, Seattle Storm and Washington Mystics.

**APRIL 4, 2008** North Carolina State Head Coach Kay Yow is honored with the WNBA's Inspiring Coach Award during the Women's Final Four activities in Tampa, Florida.

**APRIL 9, 2008** The 2008 WNBA Draft presented by adidas takes place in Tampa, marking the third year that the draft was held immediately following the NCAA Women's Division I Championship Game and conducted in the same city as the Final Four. Candace Parker, Sylvia Fowles and Candice Wiggins were selected as the top three overall picks.

**MAY 17, 2008** Candace Parker of the Los Angeles Sparks nearly posts a triple-double in her pro debut vs. Phoenix. She had 34 points, 12 rebounds and 8 assists. Her 34 points broke the record for a rookie in a debut game.

**MAY 29, 2008** On May 29 in a double-overtime loss at Indiana, Candace Parker becomes the first player in WNBA history to record a 5x5, which is a total of five or more in five different categories. Parker had 16 points, 16 rebounds, six blocks, five assists and five steals.

**JUNE 6, 2008** Tina Thompson of the Houston Comets becomes just the second player in WNBA history to reach the 5,000 point milestone, joining Lisa Leslie.

**JUNE 22 & 24, 2008** Candace Parker dunks in back-to-back games, joining Lisa Leslie as the only players to have dunked in a WNBA game.



**JUNE 28, 2008** Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks becomes the first WNBA player to record 3,000 career rebounds.

**JULY 30, 2008** Robin Roberts, co-anchor of ABC News' *Good Morning America*, is honored as the recipient of the 2008 WNBA Inspiration Award. Roberts is the keynote speaker at the WNBA Inspiring Women Luncheon in San Francisco, an event that also honored the U.S. Olympic Women's Basketball Team and served as a final send-off to the Beijing the Olympic Games.

**JULY 28–AUG. 27, 2008** The WNBA stops play to give players the opportunity to compete in the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China. The U.S. Olympic Women's Basketball Team defeated Australia in the gold medal game, while Russia defeated China for the bronze. The United States has now won four consecutive Olympic gold medals.

**AUGUST 31, 2008** Katie Smith of the Detroit Shock reaches the 5,000 career point milestone, joining Lisa Leslie and Tina Thompson.

**SEPTEMBER 5, 2008** Ticha Penicheiro of the Sacramento Monarchs becomes the first player in WNBA history to record 2,000 career assists.

**OCTOBER 3, 2008** Los Angeles Sparks forward Candace Parker is named the Hanns-G 'Go Beyond' Rookie of the Year as well as the WNBA Most Valuable Player presented by T-Mobile. It marks the first time a rookie won both awards in the same year. The top overall pick in the 2008 WNBA Draft, Parker capped a season in which she also earned All-WNBA First Team honors, two Hanns-G 'Go Beyond' Rookie of the Month Awards (May and July), one Player of the Week Award (Aug. 31) and the Peak Performer Rebounding Award.

**OCTOBER 5, 2008** The 2008 WNBA Finals see the Detroit Shock sweep the San Antonio Silver Stars in three games. The Shock earned their third championship in six years. Detroit's Katie Smith was named Finals MVP.

**DECEMBER 2, 2008** The League announces that the Houston Comets, an original member of the WNBA, would suspend operations.

**DECEMBER 9, 2008** The WNBA holds a Dispersal Draft of the Houston Comets players. Teams drafted in inverse order of their regular-season finish in 2008. The Atlanta Dream selected Sancho Lyttle with the first pick, the Washington Mystics chose Matee Ajavon with the second selection and the Chicago Sky took Mistie Williams with the third pick.

**DECEMBER 9, 2008** The Atlanta Dream win the eighth annual WNBA Draft Lottery and earned the top pick in the 2009 WNBA Draft. The winning team had 420 chances out of 1,000 to receive the first overall selection. The lottery went exactly according to odds for the first time in WNBA history.

## 2009

**FEBRUARY 5, 2009** The WNBA Board of Governors votes to allow the expanded use of instant replay by game officials. The two modifications will allow referees to use instant replay 1.) to determine at any point during a game whether a field goal was correctly scored as a two- or three-point field goal, and, for the purposes of awarding the correct number of free throws, whether a shooter was fouled while taking a two- or three-point attempt and 2.) when the game clock malfunctions during a play concluding with no time remaining on the clock (0:00) at the end of any quarter or overtime period.

**APRIL 7, 2009** University of Tennessee head coach Pat Summit is named the recipient of the WNBA's Inspiring Coach Award.

**APRIL 9, 2009** The 2009 WNBA Draft presented by adidas takes place at the NBA Entertainment studios in Secaucus, NJ. Angel McCoughtry, Marissa Coleman and Kristi Toliver were selected as the top three overall picks

**MAY 13, 2009** *WNBA LiveAccess*, a new feature on WNBA.com that provides fans with free access to more than 200 live game Webcasts, is launched and allows fans around the world to access live game Webcasts on individual team Web sites.

**JUNE 1, 2009** The Phoenix Mercury announces a groundbreaking marquee partnership with LifeLock to launch the first-ever branded jersey in WNBA or NBA history. The LifeLock name will appear on the front of Phoenix Mercury player jerseys and on warm-up suits through the 2011 season.

**JUNE 5, 2009** The Los Angeles Sparks reach an agreement with the Farmer's Insurance Group of Companies to become the second team to secure a marquee partnership and wear branded jerseys. The Farmer's Insurance Group of Companies name and logo will appear on player jerseys.

**JUNE 14, 2009** Tamika Raymond is named the recipient of the 2009 Dawn Staley Community Leadership Award.

**JULY 17, 2009** Sue Bird of the Seattle Storm reaches the 3,000-point plateau, becoming just the third player in league history to score 3,000 points and hand out 1,000 career assists. (Shannon Johnson and Vickie Johnson)

**JULY 29, 2009** Cokie Roberts, political commentator for ABC News, senior news analyst for NPR News, and bestselling author, is honored as the recipient of the 2009 WNBA Inspiration Award. Roberts served as the keynote speaker at the WNBA Inspiring Women Luncheon in Chicago.

**AUGUST 10, 2009** Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks becomes the first player in WNBA history to record 6,000 career points.

**AUGUST 15, 2009** Lauren Jackson of the Seattle Storm scores her 5,000th point against the Atlanta Dream, becoming the youngest and fastest player in league history to reach the milestone. Jackson joins Lisa Leslie, Tina Thompson and Katie Smith as the WNBA's 5,000 point scorers.

**SEPTEMBER 5, 2009** Diana Taurasi of the Phoenix Mercury scores her 4,000th point, eclipsing Lauren Jackson as the youngest and fastest player in league history to reach the milestone. Taurasi accomplishes the feat in 197 games.

**SEPTEMBER 26, 2009** Lisa Leslie tallies 22 points and 9 rebounds in the final game of her WNBA career as the Los Angeles Sparks are defeated by the Phoenix Mercury in the Western Conference Finals. Leslie had previously announced that 2009 would be her final season, and retires as the all-time WNBA leader in points (6,263) and rebounds (3,307).

**SEPTEMBER 29, 2009** The Mercury's Diana Taurasi wins the WNBA Most Valuable Player Award presented by Kia Motors, marking the first MVP honor of her professional career. Taurasi tallied 20.4 points per game and recorded 20+ points in 20 games in 2009.

**OCTOBER 9, 2009** The Phoenix Mercury defeats the Indiana Fever to clinch the WNBA Championship for the second time in three years. Finals MVP Diana Taurasi, Cappie Pondexter and Penny Taylor led the Mercury and held off a late rally by the tenacious Indiana Fever for a 94-86 victory in the deciding Game 5. The 2009 WNBA Finals also featured three sellouts plus the highest total attendance figure (82,018) in WNBA Finals history. Overall, average attendance for the 2009 WNBA Playoffs increased 18.5% over 2008 (9,979 vs. 8,420).

**OCTOBER 20, 2009** The Detroit Shock relocates to Tulsa, Oklahoma under the ownership of Bill Cameron, David Box and Tulsa Pro Hoops, LLC. Nolan Richardson is named the team's general manager and head coach.

**OCTOBER 29, 2009** Kathy Betty becomes managing partner of the Atlanta Dream after the investment group Dream Too, LLC purchases the team from Terwilliger.

**NOVEMBER 5, 2009** The Minnesota Lynx win the ninth annual WNBA Draft Lottery and earned the top pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft. Minnesota had 428 chances out of 1,000 to receive the first overall selection by virtue of owning New York's combinations (261) in addition to its own (167).

**NOVEMBER 20, 2009** The Maloof Family announces that they will no longer operate the Sacramento Monarchs.

**DECEMBER 4, 2009** The WNBA Competition Committee and Board of Governors approves the expanded use of instant replay by game officials in the following situations: 1.) To determine at any point during the game whether a 24-second shot clock violation occurred prior to the release of a successful field goal attempt or prior to a foul being committed and 2.) To determine during the last minute of regulation play and the last minute of any overtime period which player last touched the ball prior to it going out-of-bounds or whether the ball was last touched simultaneously by two opponents.


**DECEMBER 14, 2009** The WNBA holds a Dispersal Draft of the Sacramento Monarchs players. The New York Liberty selected Nicole Powell with the first pick while the Minnesota Lynx chose Rebekkah Brunson second and the Connecticut Sun took DeMya Walker with the third selection. The Chicago Sky selected Courtney Paris and the San Antonio Silver Stars took Laura Harper to round out the top five picks. Teams drafted in inverse order of their regular-season finish in 2009.


