New WNBA Playoff Format

In a new playoff format that debuted in the 2016 season, conference affiliations became irrelevant. The league's top two overall seeds earn a bye into the best-of-five WNBA Semifinals (Sept. 12-21).

Teams seeded 5th through 8th participate in first-round elimination games on Wednesday, Sept. 6. Winners battle the No. 3 and No. 4 seeds in second-round elimination games on Sunday, Sept. 10.

Winners of second-round games will reach the WNBA Semifinals (Sept. 12-21); semifinal winners will advance to the WNBA Finals (Sept. 24-Oct. 4).

CREDENTIALS

All requests should be made via e-mail to the Sparks Communications Department at least 24 hours **PRIOR** to the game you wish to cover. **NO CREDENTIAL REQUESTS WILL BE HONORED ON GAME DAY.** Please make certain all requests for credentials are confirmed by Sparks Public Relations prior to arriving at STAPLES Center. Credentials may be picked up at the primary entrance adjacent to 11th street (between Figueroa and Georgia streets) beginning two hours prior to game time. Credentials must be worn and visible at all times and are non-transferrable.

CHICK HEARN PRESS ROOM

The Chick Hearn Press Room is located near the primary media entrance adjacent to 11th street on the Event Level. The stairway from the primary entrance as well as the elevator leads directly to the press room.

PRE AND POST GAME INTERVIEWS

In accordance with WNBA policy, the Sparks and the visitors' locker rooms will be open to members of the media for 30 minutes ending 1 hour before the start of the game (e.g., media access shall be granted from 6:00–6:30 p.m. for a 7:30 p.m. game).

Locker rooms are re-opened to the media after the game following a 10-minute cooling down period and will remain open for 30 minutes. Players and coaches are available for interviews at those times. Only working members of the press with valid credentials will be admitted to the locker rooms. **ABSOLUTELY NO AUTOGRAPHS OR PERSONAL PHOTOS ALLOWED DURING MEDIA ACCESS PERIOD.**

GAME NOTES AND STATISTICS

Game notes, rosters and stats are available in the press room two hours prior to game time. Statistics are distributed to the working media at the conclusion of each quarter as well as first half boxes and final boxes. Post-game notes and quotes are distributed following the game.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Limited space is available for still photographers along each baseline, with exact locations to be determined on game day. **ABSOLUTELY NO TRIPODS ALLOWED.** Photographers must stay in their designated areas, and are asked to be considerate of print media and fans directly in their viewing area.

Beverages and snacks will be available in the Chick Hearn Press Room before and during the game.

OWNER, LOS ANGELES SPARKS



Earvin “Magic” Johnson has become the most powerful African-American businessman in the world. Having left the basketball court for the boardroom, today Mr. Johnson is Chairman and CEO of Magic Johnson Enterprises (MJE), which provides high-quality products and services that focus primarily on ethnically diverse and underserved urban communities through strategic alliances, investments, consulting and endorsements. The business mogul has successfully parlayed his skills and tenacity on the court into the

business world, propelling his company to the status of #1 Brand in Urban America.

The conglomerate is comprised of multiple business entities and partnerships that include Yucaipa Johnson, a \$500 million dollar private equity fund, ASPIRE, an African-American television network, SodexoMAGIC, a food service and facilities management company, Magic Johnson Bridgescape Academies, a high school drop-out prevention program, Clear Health Alliance, a health-care provider with a specialty plan for HIV/AIDS patients, Magic

Airport Holdings including Magic Johnson Sports, and Inner City Broadcasting Corporation.

In 2012, as a member of Guggenheim Baseball Management (GBM), he became an owner of the Los Angeles Dodgers, a Major League Baseball Franchise and in 2014 with some of the partners from GBM purchased the Los Angeles Sparks of the WNBA.

Mr. Johnson also serves as Chairman and Founder of the Magic Johnson Foundation, where his unwavering commitment to transform Urban America continues through HIV/AIDS Awareness & Prevention Programs, Community Empowerment Centers, and the Taylor Michaels Scholarship Program. The Foundation currently has 160 students on scholarship through their Taylor Michaels Scholarship Program, 18 empowerment centers that helps to bridge the digital divide, 5 HIV/AIDS Clinics assisting all patients regardless of their ability to pay and has tested over 40,000 individuals. Mr. Johnson is committed to bringing jobs and brand-named businesses to underserved communities. What he BELIEVES is reflected in what he DOES – and what he has and continues to do is to make a difference in the lives of urban America.

MARK R. WALTER

OWNER, LOS ANGELES SPARKS



Mr. Walter is the Chairman and controlling owner of the Los Angeles Dodgers. Mr. Walter is also Chief Executive Officer and a member of the Board and Executive Committee of Guggenheim Capital, LLC. Mr. Walter serves as a trustee/director of several organizations including the Solomon R. Guggenheim Foundation, Security Benefit Corporation and the EquiTrust Life holding company. He is also a controlling shareholder of Delaware Life Holdings. Mr. Walter grew up in Iowa and received a B.S. from Creighton University and a J.D. from Northwestern University.

STAN KASTEN

OWNER, LOS ANGELES SPARKS



Stan Kasten became president and CEO of the Los Angeles Dodgers on April 30, 2012. For more than three decades, Kasten has been a highly-respected sports figure and has developed a reputation for creating winning sports franchises.

In 1999, Kasten became the first sports figure to hold the title of president of three different teams in three different major sports simultaneously. He accomplished this unique feat with Major League Baseball's Atlanta

Braves, the National Basketball Association's Atlanta Hawks and the National Hockey League's Atlanta Thrashers. Kasten's professional career is highlighted by the Braves' 1995 World Championship. During his tenure, the Braves and Hawks made a combined 30 post-season appearances and claimed 15 division titles, including 12 in a row in the Braves' unprecedented run from 1991-2003. He was president of the Washington Nationals from 2006-10, where he worked to re-energize a dormant baseball fan base and simultaneously established a crown jewel franchise in Washington, D.C.

Kasten has been a member of numerous MLB, NBA and NHL ownership committees during his professional career, including NBA committees on marketing, player pensions and expansion and the NBA Board of Governors, MLB's owners negotiating committee and chairman of the Player Personal Development Committee, and the NHL's Board of Governors and its executive committee. He is also a former trustee of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. Throughout his impressive sports career, Kasten has relied on three pillars - scouting and player development, enhancing the fan experience and community outreach - to establish franchises built for long-term success on and off the field. In 1979, at age 27, Kasten became the youngest general manager in NBA history with the Hawks. He held the position until 1990. Kasten became the Hawks' president in 1986.

During his lengthy tenure in the Hawks' front office, Kasten became the first -- and only -- NBA executive to win back-to-back Executive of the Year awards in 1986-87. With the help of future NBA Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins, Kasten was able to build Atlanta into a perennial playoff contender, posting four consecutive 50-win seasons from 1986-89, and set franchise attendance records. In the 1990s, Kasten guided Atlanta to a stretch of seven consecutive playoff appearances, including three 50-win seasons.

Kasten also became president of the Braves in 1986. From 1987-2003, the Braves won more games than any other team in MLB. As president of the Braves, Kasten helped assemble talented teams that consistently competed for a world championship. Led by manager Bobby Cox, the Braves teams of that era were built around a deep pitching staff that featured Greg Maddux, Tom Glavine, Steve Avery and John Smoltz. The cornerstone of the Braves' lineup was All-Star third baseman Chipper Jones. From 1991-2005, the Braves won 14 consecutive division titles, five National League pennants and the 1995 World Series. In 1999, when the NHL awarded Atlanta an expansion team, Kasten added the title of president of the Thrashers, as well as chairman of the newly constructed Philips Arena. He was also involved in the design and construction of Turner Field. Kasten held all three positions until 2003, when he stepped down.

On Jan. 24, 2014, Kasten was elected to the LA84 Foundation's board of directors. LA84 is the legacy of the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles and primary funder of youth athletics in Southern California. Four days later, on Jan. 28, he was named 2013 Sports Executive of the Year by the Los Angeles Sports Council.

A native of Lakewood, N.J., Kasten is a graduate of New York University and Columbia University Law School. Kasten and his wife, Helen, have four children: Alana, Corey, Sherry and Jay.

Todd Boehly is a partner of Guggenheim Baseball Management. He became part owner of the Los Angeles Dodgers on April 30, 2012. Boehly is also president of Guggenheim Partners, a privately held, global financial services firm with more than \$180 billion in assets under management, and member of the Firm's Executive and Management Committees.

Mr. Boehly joined Guggenheim in 2001 in order to build and manage the firm's credit investing activities. He also led several transactions for Guggenheim,

its shareholders, and its clients such as the demutualization and recapitalization of Security Benefit, Guggenheim's acquisition and integration of Rydex, the media transaction for the Los Angeles Dodgers, the acquisition of Dick Clark Productions, and the creation of Guggenheim Media.

Robert L. Patton, Jr. is a partner of Guggenheim Baseball Management. He became part owner of the Los Angeles Dodgers on April 30, 2012. Patton resides in Fort Worth, Texas, where he was born and raised. Patton principally operates oil and gas properties in Texas and Kansas and has additional investments in many other sectors, including ranching and insurance. Patton serves on the Board of Security Benefit Corporation and the Advisory Council of the University of Texas College of Liberal Arts.

Patton received a B.B.A. from the University of Texas as well as a J.D. from St. Mary's University and LLM from Southern Methodist University.

Christine Simmons is President & Chief Operations Officer of the three-time WNBA Champion Los Angeles Sparks. Celebrating its 21st season in Los Angeles, the Sparks are one of three founding teams from the league's inception in 1997 and are the reigning WNBA champions.

Simmons is in her third season leading all aspects of the team's business operations including ticket and sponsorship sales and service, marketing, game operations, communications, community relations and finance. Under her leadership the team has seen

Prior to joining the Sparks, she was an Executive Vice President with Magic Johnson Enterprises where she would evaluate investment opportunities and was responsible for business development. With over a decade of leadership experience in creating strategic alliances, leading business development and driving corporate initiatives, Christine has worked with many Fortune 500 corporations and multi-million dollar companies.

She is an active member of the Los Angeles community, serving on the Board of Directors for the LA Sports Council, the Positive Coaching Alliance and on the NBA's Global Inclusion Council. Her dedication and passion for giving back has earned her a number of honors including the LA African American Women's Public Policy Institute's 2015 Women in Action honoree. She was also named to the LA Business Journal's 2016 list of 500 most influential in Los Angeles.

A proud UCLA graduate, she serves as President of the Board of the UCLA Alumni Association and was recently named one of the inaugural Remarkable Women of UC in 2017.

PENNY TOLER

Executive Vice President & General Manager



Penny Toler has had many shining moments throughout her 21 years with the Sparks franchise as a player, General Manager and even interim head coach in 2014. She has a keen eye for talent and year after year has assembled world class Los Angeles Sparks teams that have earned three WNBA Championships under her leadership in 2001, 2002 and last season 2016. Penny is the winningest and longest tenure GM in the WNBA league. After losing nearly half of the 2016 season championship team (Evgeniia Belyakova, Ana Dabovic, Jelena Dubljevic, Ann Wauters) to oversee commitments. Toler has once again kept the team at the top of the leader board by

restructuring over half the 2016 team by adding key players like Odyssey Sims, Riquna Williams, Tiffany Jackson Jones, Maimouna Diarra, and Sydney Wiese (1st Round Draft pick.) Furthermore, with the unexpected free agency departure of Kristi Toliver, Penny didn't panic. She quickly orchestrated a trade to acquire one of the best point guards in the WNBA in Odyssey Sims, via a trade acquisition with the Dallas Wings giving the Sparks arguably one of the best front/back court combos in all the WNBA and simultaneously in that same trade she acquired a first-round draft pick for the 2017 Draft so that the Sparks could continue to build for the future. Chemistry is crucial in assembling a competitive team. Despite not having any of the players from the 2016 Championship team available during training camp, Penny with her depth of experience at judging talent was still able to acquire the right chemistry of players to keep the Sparks at the top of the leader board. This year marks the 16th playoff appearance in her 18th year as General Manager of the Sparks. Penny has re-signed all the Sparks core players (Candace Parker, Jantel Lavender and Nneka Ogumike) in the off season to multi-year deals to stay with the Sparks team, ensuring the Sparks will be competitive for many years to come and compete for future WNBA Championships.

In 1997, Toler scored the first basket in the WNBA and in 2014, she became the only female in professional sports to have consecutively been a player, executive and head coach for the same team when she took over the reins as head coach midway through the season.

Toler stepped in as head coach with 12 games remaining in the 2014 regular season, guiding the Sparks to a 6 - 6 (.500) record and leading the Sparks to its record-setting 14th WNBA postseason appearance. Following the end of the 2014 season, she hung up her coaching board to return to her dual role as general manager/executive vice president heading into the 2015 season.

Toler has served as the general manager/executive vice president with the team since 2012, and as general manager/vice president since her retirement as a player in November 1999. Her skills at roster-building and keen sense of basketball operations are complemented by her years as a professional athlete, making her one of the most respected general managers in the game.

In her 16 seasons as general manager, Toler has guided the team to two WNBA titles (2001,2002), three conference championships (2001-2003) and to 14 postseason appearances (1999-06 and 2008-10, 2012-14). Named general manager just prior to the 2000 season, she compiled back-to-back WNBA Championship teams two seasons into her tenure, to give Los Angeles titles in 2001 and 2002. Among all professional men and women

sports leagues, Toler became the fastest person to go from a player to general manager status to winning a championship in two years.

As a player, she scored the first basket in WNBA history on June 21, 1997 vs. the New York Liberty, and finished the inaugural season as the Sparks' second leading scorer with 13.1 points per game. The following season, she shot an impressive 41.7% from three-point range to rank second in the WNBA while finishing fifth in the league in assists at 4.8 per game.

After three seasons, she hung up her basketball shoes following the 1999 season with WNBA career averages of 10.0 points, 2.8 rebounds and 4.0 assists in 88 games played. She retired from playing professional basketball with a combined 13 years overseas/WNBA experience.

In addition to the Sparks, she was also a member of the USA Basketball Women's Competition Committee where she assisted in the selection of three gold medal winning teams: the 2002 World University Championship games, the 2004 Olympic team and the 2008 Olympic team. In an effort to advance the women's game, she was also a strong advocate in implementing the 24- second shot clock and turning the two, 20-minute halves into four, 10-minute quarters.

In 2006, she again made history when the Sparks retired #11 in recognition of her playing and management career, becoming the first female athlete to have her jersey retired at STAPLES Center.

Toler graduated from Long Beach State University in 1989 where she set several school records including career assists (513) and career free-throw percentage (.795). A member of two Final Four teams, (1987 and 1988) under Coach Joan Bonvicini, she earned Kodak All-America honors, Pacific Coast Athletic Association Player of the Year and Co-Big West Player of the Year recognition in 1988 and 1989. She scored 2,193 points in three seasons of play at LBSU (sitting out the 1985-86 season after transferring from San Diego State). Toler's impressive collegiate career was recognized with her induction into the LBSU Hall of Fame in 1995 and a jersey retirement ceremony in 2007 by the Forty-Niner Athletics Department.

Beyond the WNBA, Toler combined her sense of community and business savvy and began her "Points from Penny" program in 1998. The goal of the program is to teach youth in the Los Angeles and Las Vegas areas the fundamentals of basketball, the importance of teamwork and the value of competition. The program was nominated for several awards during its tenure including: the American Express Entrepreneurial Spirit Award. Since that time she has focused on bringing the same type of community-oriented programs to the Sparks front office.

Toler's hobbies include going to the movies, getting interior design tips from HGTV and working with underprivileged youth. She also sits on the Long Beach State Advisory Committee for the sports management program. Raised in Washington D.C. with three brothers and four sisters, Toler currently resides in Los Angeles.

Head Coach



On Jan. 5, 2015, Agler became the 12th head coach in Los Angeles Sparks history, bringing with him over 30 years of head-coaching experience, including 11 in the WNBA. In his first season with LA, Agler led the Sparks to a league-best 15th postseason appearance. Just one year later he led them to a 26-8 regular season mark and the 2016 WNBA championship, the third league title in the franchise's history.

Along the way, three Sparks players earned major WNBA awards in 2016 -- Nneka Ogumike (league MVP); Candace (Finals MVP); and Jantel Lavender (Sixth Woman of the Year). The 2016 championship, when coupled with the one captured by his Seattle Storm in 2010, made Agler the first head coach in WNBA history to guide two different

franchises to a title.

The all-time winningest coach in women's professional basketball history in the U.S. with 296 regular-season victories, Agler enters the 2017 campaign with 224 wins as a WNBA head coach and 72 from his tenure in the ABL. On June 6, 2017, when the Sparks faced the Chicago Sky at the Staples Center, Head Coach Brian Agler notched his **300th regular season career win as a head coach**.

Immediately prior to joining the Sparks, Agler spent seven seasons (2008-14) at the helm of the Storm, guiding Seattle to the playoffs in each of his first six campaigns and compiling an overall regular-season record of 136-102 (.571) during his tenure there. In 2010, when Agler was recognized as the WNBA Coach of the Year, his Storm -- led by league MVP Lauren Jackson and All-Star Sue Bird -- captured the franchise's second WNBA title with an impressive regular 28-6 season record and a 7-0 run through the postseason.

Agler first joined the WNBA as Head Coach and GM of the expansion

Minnesota Lynx from 1999-2002, where he compiled a 42-54 (.438) record. Following that, Agler was an assistant with the Phoenix Mercury in 2004 before spending 2005-07 as an assistant with the San Antonio Stars.

Agler's move to the WNBA's Lynx in 1999 followed three seasons as head coach of the ABL's Columbus Quest from 1996-1999, when his teams compiled a 72-18 regular-season record and a 10-4 mark in the postseason. Agler led the Quest to back-to-back ABL championships in 1997 and 1998 and was the ABL Coach of the Year for the 1996-97 campaign.

Agler spent 15 seasons coaching in the collegiate ranks, including 13 seasons as a head coach. He posted an impressive collegiate record of 248-135 (.648 winning percentage). From 1993-96 he served as the head women's basketball coach at Kansas State. In 1998, Agler took over as the head women's coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In five seasons at UMKC, Agler was 85-54 and took the Kangaroos from a 9-16 record in 1988-89 to four straight winning seasons. Under his direction, UMKC led the NCAA in scoring defense three straight seasons (1990-93). In 1991, UMKC set an NCAA record, allowing just 51.8 points per game.

As the head women's basketball coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M Junior College from 1984-88, Agler compiled a 124-42 record. In 1985-86, NEO A&M ranked second nationally at 30-2.

Agler attended Wittenberg University (Springfield, Oh.), where he starred on the basketball team, leading the Tigers to their only NCAA Division III basketball championship in basketball as a freshman. He started all 112 games during his career, leaving the school as the all-time assist leader (481). Agler was the MVP of the Ohio Athletic Conference and first-team All-America as a senior. In 1995, he was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Honor.

TONYA EDWARDS

Assistant Coach



In her second season as assistant coach with the Los Angeles Sparks, Tonya Edwards works primarily with the team's perimeter players and is also responsible for scouting opponents and preparing practice and game plans. Edwards brings 19 years of coaching experience to the WNBA.

Edwards is reunited with head coach Brian Agler whom she played for in both the ABL (Columbus Quest) and the WNBA (Minnesota Lynx). Drafted in 1999 by Agler, then head coach of the Lynx, she was named a

WNBA All-Star as a rookie, and went on to play five seasons in the league with Minnesota, Phoenix, and Charlotte before finishing her playing career overseas.

Edwards served as the head coach of Alcorn State University (2008-15), where she led the Lady Braves to the SWAC Championship game in 2012 and was named 2010-11 SWAC Coach of the Year. Prior to Alcorn State, Edwards served as an assistant coach at the University of Detroit-Mer-cy (2006-08), the Chicago Blaze (2005) of the National Women's Basketball League and two seasons at Mott Community College. (1990-92).

Her coaching career began at her alma mater, Northwestern Community High School, where she earned a 78-23 record in four seasons (1991-94), winning a state title in 1993 while subsequently being named the Michigan High School Coach of the Year.

Edwards attended the University of Tennessee (1986-1990), where she won two national championships with the Lady Vols (1987, 1989) and was named most valuable player in the 1987 NCAA Tournament. She finished her career with 1,309 points and was inducted into the UT Hall of Fame in 2006.

BOBBIE KELSEY

Assistant Coach



Bobbie Kelsey, enters her first season as an WNBA assistant coach. Kelsey was named as a Los Angeles Sparks assistant coach on April 3, 2017. Coach Kelsey has been working with developing guards Odyssey Sims and Riquna Williams and is also responsible for scouting opponents and preparing game plans. Kelsey brings 20 years of college coaching experience to the WNBA.

Kelsey's first head coaching job was as the head coach for Wisconsin from 2011-2016. In 2011, Bobbie Kelsey returned to

her alma mater, Stanford University and spent four seasons (2007-2011) as an assistant coach under Hall of Fame head coach Tara VanDerveer. Prior to returning to Stanford, Kelsey spent three seasons at Virginia Tech, helping guide the Hokies to three consecutive

postseason appearances, including NCAA Tournament berths in 2005 and 2006. From 2002-04, Kelsey served as an assistant coach at Western Carolina. In addition, Kelsey spent the 2000-02 seasons as the top assistant and recruiting coordinator at Evansville. Prior to her time with the Aces, she was an assistant coach at the University of Florida for two seasons where she was responsible for film exchange, scouting and coaching the posts. Kelsey served as a practice player for the Atlanta Glory of the American Basketball League for one year and as an assistant at Boise State in 1996-97.

Kelsey was a four-year letter winner at Stanford from 1992-96 and graduated with a bachelor's degree in communications. As a player, Kelsey helped the Cardinal to three Final Four appearances in five years, including the 1992 NCAA championship. In 2010, she earned her master's degree in Sports Leadership from Duquesne University's School of Leadership and Professional Advancement.




