



The winningest coach in San Antonio Stars history, Dan Hughes returns for his ninth season in 2014. In his dual appointment as head coach and general manager, Hughes oversees the Stars' basketball staff, the team's roster development and all player acquisitions, while also coaching the team. Hughes stepped aside as head coach to assume a full-time general manager role for the 2010 season and resumed his dual roles in 2011.

In 13 years as a head coach – of the Charlotte Sting, the Cleveland Rockers and San Antonio – Hughes has led his teams to nine playoff appearances, four Western Conference Finals and one WNBA Final. He has collected the third most wins in WNBA history and also is the winningest coach in the history of both the San Antonio and the Cleveland Rockers franchises.

Hughes is the only coach in WNBA history to take three different franchises to the playoffs. He guided the 2008 Silver Stars to a 24-10 mark, earning the best record in the league and the franchise's first Western Conference Championship and its first trip to the WNBA Finals. Additionally, Hughes has been named WNBA Coach of the Year – most recently in 2007 – or finished as runner-up four times.

A member of the five-person USA Basketball Selection Committee for the 2010 World Championships and the 2012 Olympics, Hughes is also serving as a member of the selection committee for the Kay Yow Award. He has also spent time working as a broadcaster on San Antonio Spurs telecasts, as well as on men's and women's college games.

During his eight seasons with San Antonio Hughes guided the Stars to six-consecutive postseason appearances. In total, he has helped Stars players earn 14 WNBA All-Star nods, seven All-WNBA honors, five All-Rookie Team selections, three WNBA All-Defensive Team accolades, two Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Awards and a WNBA Top 15 selection.

In his role as general manager, Hughes is responsible for assembling the foundation of the Stars franchise - he selected now four-time WNBA All-Star and three-time All-WNBA selection Sophia Young in the 2006 WNBA Draft and orchestrated the 2007 trade that brought now seven-time WNBA All-Star and WNBA Top 15 honoree Becky Hammon to the Alamo City. During offseason free agency, Hughes has picked up notable veterans including Tully Bevilaqua, Chamique Holdsclaw, Vickie Johnson, Delisha Milton-Jones and Tangelia Smith while acquiring the likes of Ruth Riley and now-perennial Sixth Woman of the Year contender Jia Perkins in trade scenarios. He also utilized San Antonio's draft position to select Jayne Appel – who earned WNBA All-Star recognition as a rookie – and 2011 All-Rookie Team selections Danielle Adams and Danielle Robinson.

Prior to joining the Stars, Hughes spent a year as the Mid-American Conference (MAC) Assistant Commissioner for Men's Basketball Operations. Before joining the MAC's athletic office, he served as the head coach of the now-defunct Cleveland Rockers from 2000-03.

During his four-year stint with the Rockers, Hughes posted a 66-64 record with three trips to the playoffs. His overall record with the Rockers made him the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season in Cleveland, Hughes directed the team's resurgence from a 7-25 season in 1999 to a 17-15 finish in 2000 and was voted WNBA Coach of the Year runner-up. The following year, Hughes was named 2001 WNBA Coach of the Year after leading the Rockers to a 22-10 record and to their second straight playoff appearance. The 2001 Rockers were one of the best defensive teams ever, posting defensive statistics that still rank amongst the best in the WNBA record books. Cleveland led the league in three defensive categories during the 2001 season, including opponents' points per game (55.9 ppg, first in league history), opponents' field goal percentage (.381, second in league history) and opponents' total rebounds (27.84 rpg). The Rockers finished second in point differential (+6.8 ppg) and opponents' defensive rebounds (18.56 drpg). Hughes' Rockers kept 11 teams to 50 points or less, three teams to fewer than 40 points and five teams to their franchise low, including a WNBA record 34 points vs. Washington on May 31, 2001.

Hughes earned his first shot at coaching in the WNBA with the Charlotte Sting. While serving as an assistant coach during the 1999 season, Hughes took over as head coach midway through the season; he helped the Sting improve their standing in the Eastern Conference from fourth to second place, posting a 10-10 record. He led the team to its third consecutive playoff appearance and its first ever playoff series victory. In addition to his coaching responsibilities in Charlotte, Hughes was a scout for the Charlotte Hornets during the offseason.

More than thirty-two of Hughes' former players and assistant coaches from his 13 years as a WNBA head coach have gone on to join the coaching ranks at the high school, college and professional levels, as well as internationally. Hughes' former athletes who went on to become Division I head coaches are: Tricia Bader Binford (Montana State), Suzie McConnell-Serio (Duquesne), Wendy Palmer-Daniel (North Carolina-Greensboro), Jennifer Rizzotti (Hartford), Charlotte Smith (Elon) and Dawn Staley (South Carolina). Six of Hughes' former players and assistants are currently coaching professional in the WNBA and NBA: Brian Agler (Head Coach - Seattle), Cheryl Reeve (Head Coach - Minnesota), Sandy Brondello (Assistant Coach - Los Angeles), T.R. Dunn (Assistant Coach - Minnesota Timberwolves), Vickie Johnson (Assistant Coach - San Antonio) and Stephanie White (Assistant Coach - Indiana).

A native of Lowell, Ohio, Hughes has been involved in coaching basketball at almost every level in the Buckeye State. Prior to joining the Sting, he served as the assistant coach with the University of Toledo's women's basketball program (1996-97) and men's basketball program (1991-96). During his tenure with the Rockets' women's team, they posted a 27-4 record, winning the MAC Championship, and made an NCAA Tournament appearance. He also served assistant coaching stints with the men's teams at Mount Union College (1982-84 and 1985-91) and Baldwin-Wallace College (1984-85).

During the 1977-78 season, Hughes served as a graduate assistant at Miami of Ohio, helping the team to a MAC Championship and an appearance in the NCAA Regionals.

Hughes graduated with a degree in physical education and history from Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio, in 1977. He earned a Master's Degree in education from Miami University of Ohio in 1978.

Hughes and his wife, Mary, have two children, Bryce and Sara. Sara coaches high school volleyball and basketball is married to Captain Craig Bayer of the United State Air Force , the couple reside in Omaha, Neb. with their son, Logan.

A two-time WNBA All-Star, Vickie Johnson returns for her fourth season as assistant coach in 2014 after beginning her coaching career with the Stars in 2011.

During her three seasons as assistant coach, Johnson mentored the Stars guards to two of their most productive seasons in franchise history. The San Antonio backcourt set a record for total assists (642), assists per game (18.9), assist to turnover ratio (1.45) and total steals (302) in 2012 while setting the standard for fewest turnovers in a season (434) in 2011. Under Johnson's tutelage, point guard Danielle Robinson earned unanimous selection to the WNBA All-Rookie team after leading league rookies in assists per game (3.9) in 2011, earned WNBA All-Defensive Team honors in 2012 and was named to the WNBA All Star Team in 2013. Veteran guard Becky Hammon earned her seventh WNBA All-Star selection in 2011 and finished the season ranked second in the WNBA in total assists (176) and assists per game (5.30) in 2012.

The first player in WNBA history to record 4,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists in a career, Johnson finished with 4,243 points, 1,641 rebounds and 1,205 career assists. Johnson played 13 WNBA seasons, nine with the New York Liberty and four with the San Antonio Silver Stars, retiring as the league's all-time leader in games (410) and minutes played (12,435). She was one of 10 players voted to the Silver Stars All-Decade Team in 2012, as part of the team's 10th season in San Antonio.

Johnson posted career averages of 10.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game in her 13 seasons, averaging double-digit points in seven seasons. She started all but two of her 410 career games, including amassing a 159 consecutive-games started streak which currently ranks eighth in WNBA history.

A native of Coushatta, La. Johnson was originally selected by the New York Liberty in the second round (12 overall) of the WNBA Elite Draft on February 27, 1997 and became the first player in league history to play 300 games on July 7, 2006 vs. Houston. She signed with San Antonio as a free agent on February 9, 2006, becoming the first building block of Dan Hughes' 2008 Western Conference Champion squad. Johnson helped lead the Silver Stars to its first WNBA Finals appearance and earned the Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award following the 2008 season.

Johnson was a two-time All-American and Sun Belt Conference MVP at Louisiana Tech. She led Tech to the 1994 Final Four, was named Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year in 1995 and earned Louisiana Player of the Year honors in 1996. She finished her collegiate career with 1,891 career points and 831 rebounds and was inducted into the Louisiana Tech Hall of Fame.

Johnson – who also played professionally in Israel, France, Hungary and Turkey – retired from the WNBA following the 2009 season.







Now in his 19th season as Chairman and CEO ... he and his wife, Julianna Hawn Holt, bought into the Spurs ownership group in 1996 ... since that time the organization has enjoyed unprecedented growth and success ... four NBA championships, a successful campaign for a new arena and two new San Antonio-based sports franchises are among the accomplishments achieved during Holt's tenure ... thanks in part to the AT&T Center – which opened in November of 2002 – the organization is now known as Spurs Sports and Entertainment ... with over 250 fulltime employees, Spurs Sports & Entertainment runs four professional sports franchises – the Spurs (NBA), Stars (WNBA), Rampage (AHL Hockey) and the Austin Toros (NBA Development League) – while also managing the day-to-day operations of the AT&T Center ... over the last 17 seasons (since Tim Duncan joined the team in 1997–98) the Spurs have posted a regular season record of 888-376 ... the team's winning percentage of .703 during that span is the best of any team in the four major sports (MLB, NBA, NFL and NHL) ... during the Duncan era the Spurs have captured four NBA championships (1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007) ... the Spurs organization has twice been named the best franchise in professional sports (2003 and 2005) and been ranked the top NBA franchise six times in the annual ESPN The Magazine Ultimate Standings survey (each year the Ultimate Standings ranks every professional team in a formula using analysis of team financial data combined with fan feedback in which over 55,000 fans judge teams by eight factors including players, bang for the buck, ownership, and stadium experience ... the Ultimate Standings debuted in 2003 and the Spurs are the only franchise to have been named the top overall team twice among the four major sports since ESPN introduced its annual survey) ... Holt was ranked as the "Ultimate Boss" among all sports owners in the 2012 standings based on the criteria of honesty, commitment to their communities and loyalty to their core players ... in June of 2007 SS&E purchased the Austin Toros of the NBA Development League, the first NBA team to have sole ownership over its NBA D-League affiliate (the Spurs are one of six NBA teams – Cleveland (Canton Charge), Philadelphia (Delaware 87ers), L.A. Lakers (L.A. Defenders), Golden State (Santa Cruz Warriors), Oklahoma City (Tulsa 66ers) – to own and operate their own D-League team) ... the great-grandson of Benjamin Holt, developer of the first practical track-type tractor and one of the two predecessor companies that formed Caterpillar Inc. ... serves as the CEO of San Antonio-based HOLT CAT (the firm still displays several of Ben Holt's early tractors outside its headquarters) which is the largest Caterpillar dealership in the United States ... born in Peoria, Illinois ... lived in San Antonio as a child before moving to Corpus Christi, where he graduated from high school ... served two years in the U.S. Army during which time he earned a Silver Star, three Bronze Stars and a Purple Heart from his one-year tour of duty in Vietnam ... ended his military service as a Sergeant E5 ... actively involved in an effort to construct an education center under the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C. ... a staunch believer in community service ... is proud of the Spurs commitment to South Texas and its residents (in 2000 the Spurs earned the Pro Team Community Award presented by the World Sports Humanitarian Hall of Fame, an award presented annually to the professional sports franchise that best illustrates exceptional community involvement and fosters community pride and spirit) ... among the Spurs community efforts are the Spurs Youth Basketball League, the annual countywide United Way campaign and a variety of educational outreach programs which service over 85 percent of the elementary schools in Bexar County (during the 2010–11 season over 200,000 area students were touched by the various SS&E education programs) ... Holt's own efforts include a lengthy list of community service positions ... appointed to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission by Governor Rick Perry in 2003 and served as chairman from 2007 – 2011 ... a member of the World Presidents' Organization, the Free Trade Alliance San Antonio and the San Antonio Economic Development Foundation ... is the Business Chair of the Consortium of Partners for San Antonio's 2012 No Kill initiative ... 2009 recipient of Woodrow Wilson Award for Public Service ... serves as board member of the Bexar County Performing Arts Center Foundation ... serves on the advisory board of the McCombs School of Business at the University of Texas ... past chairman of the United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County ... named to the Texas Business Hall of Fame in 2004 ... APRIL 14, 2014 - San Antonio selects Notre Dame guard Kayla McBride with the third overall pick in the 2014 WNBA Draft. The Stars also draft Astou Ndour of Spain and Bri Kulas of Missouri with their second and third round picks.

JANUARY 14, 2014 - San Antonio Stars reveal new logo and wordmark, dropping "Silver" from their name to be known as the San Antonio Stars. The franchise also announced marquee sponsorship with local grocer, H-E-B.

2013

APRIL 15, 2013 - With the No. 8 pick in the 2013 WNBA Draft, the San Antonio Silver Stars selected Kayla Alexander from Syracuse. The Silver Stars also selected Arizona's Davellyn Whyte (16th overall), France's Diandra Tchachouang (20th overall) and Oklahoma's Whitney Hand (32nd overall)

MARCH 7, 2013 - San Antonio signs 13-year WNBA veteran Delisha Milton-Jones.

FEBRUARY 11, 2013 - San Antonio re-signs veteran guard Jia Perkins to a multi-year contract.

JANUARY 14, 2013 - Head coach and general manager Dan Hughes and the Silver Stars agree on a two-year contract extension.

2012

SEPTEMBER 28, 2012 - Danielle Robinson and Sophia Young are named to the WNBA All-Defensive Team. It marks the first time in franchise history that multiple players earn All-Defensive Team honors in the same season.

SEPTEMBER 27, 2012 - San Antonio makes its sixth-consecutive playoff appearance, facing off against the Los Angeles Sparks at USC's Galen Center. The Sparks would prevail, 2-0, in the best-of-three series.

SEPTEMBER 23, 2012 - San Antonio netted 13 3-point field goals in a 99-84 win against Minnesota, tying the franchise single-game record. Shenise Johnson set the franchise rookie record for 3-point field goal percentage in the win, going 4-for-4 from beyond the arc.

SEPTEMBER 18, 2012 - The Silver Stars defeated the New York Liberty, 77-66, in a nationally televised game on ESPN2 cementing the teams fourth 20-win season in franchise history.

AUGUST 25, 2012 - The Silver Stars defeat Tulsa, 91-71, at the AT&T Center to earn their franchise-record ninth-straight home win

AUGUST 21, 2012 - San Antonio defeats Washington, 75-72, to earn its franchise-record 12th-consecutive win. The streak is the longest in the WNBA during the 2012 season and is tied for third-best in league history with the Connecticut Sun's 2006 12-game streak.

AUGUST 19, 2012 - The Silver Stars defeat Phoenix, 89-47, at the US Airways Center to earn their franchise-record seventh-consecutive road victory.

JULY 5, 2012 - San Antonio posted the largest comeback and largest turnaround in franchise history with its 88-72 win at Indiana. The Silver Stars rallied from an 18-point

deficit to a 16-point win for a 34-point turnaround.

APRIL 16, 2012 - San Antonio selects University of Miami guard Shenise Johnson with the fifth overall pick in the 2012 WNBA Draft.

SEPTEMBER 18, 2011 - Center Ruth Riley is named co-winner of the Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award, along with Seattle's Sue Bird ... Riley is the second Silver Star to earn the honor, following Vickie Johnson in 2008.

MARCH 3, 2011 - The WNBA announces that San Antonio will host the 2011 WNBA All-Star Game at the AT&T Center for the first time in franchise history on Saturday, July 23 at 2:30 p.m. CT.

JANUARY 28, 2011 - The Silver Stars announce that Dan Hughes will resume his dual roles as head coach and general manager in 2011 after stepping down as head coach for the 2010 season.

2010

AUGUST 26, 2010 - The Silver Stars made their fourth-consecutive playoff appearance, losing game one of the Western Conference semifinals, 106-93, to the Phoenix Mercury.

JUNE 30, 2010 - A franchise record and league-high four Silver Stars are selected to the 2010 WNBA All-Star Team. San Antonio's Jayne Appel, Becky Hammon, Michelle Snow and Sophia Young are all among the top 10 vote getters, earning a spot on the All-Star squad.

WNBA PLAYOFF FORMAT

The top four teams from each conference will qualify for the 2012 WNBA Playoffs. The first and fourth-place teams, and the second and third-place teams, will each play a best-of-three conference semifinal series. The winners of the semifinal series in each conference will then play in a best-of-three conference final.

Tiebreaker Procedure

The following tiebreak procedure shall be used to break ties for playoff eligibility, home court advantage and draft order. In determining draft order, non-playoff teams will always select before playoff teams.

Two-Way Tie Between Teams In The Same Conference

1. Better record in head-to-head games
2. Better winning percentage in own conference
3. Better winning percentage against all teams with .500 or better record at the end of the season
4. Better point differential in games head-to-head
5. Coin toss

Two-Way Tie Between Teams In The Different Conference

In order to break a tie, the following criteria will be utilized in the order set forth:

1. Better record in head-to-head games
2. Better winning percentage against teams in the opposite conference
3. Better winning percentage against all teams with .500 or better record at the end of the season
4. Better point differential in games head-to-head
5. Coin toss

More Than Two Teams Tied

As many teams as possible will be eliminated at each step. As soon as one or more teams are eliminated at any step, the process must begin again from step (1).

1. Better winning percentage among all head-to-head games involving tied teams
2. Better winning percentage against teams in own conference (if all teams are from the same conference) or better record against teams in the opposite conference (if one or more teams are in different conferences)
3. Better winning percentage against all teams with .500 or better record at the end of the season
4. Better point differential in games involving tied teams
5. Coin toss

Scheduling

Conference Semifinals

The first and second place teams in each conference will have home court advantage in the Conference Semifinals and will host Game 1 and, if necessary, Game 3 of the series.

Conference Finals

The team with the better regular season record will have home court advantage in the Conference Finals and will host Game 1 and, if necessary, Game 3 of the series.

WNBA Finals

The team with the better regular season record will have home court advantage in the WNBA Finals. The championship series will be played in a 2-2-1 format with the higher seed hosting the first two games and the final game, if necessary.



SAN ANTONIO SPURS

In the summer of 1973 a group of local investors leased the Dallas Chaparrals and relocated the team to San Antonio. Midway through their first season in the Alamo City the group purchased the team outright, and the Spurs have been a mainstay in San Antonio culture ever since. The Silver and Black played their first three seasons in the ABA before joining the NBA in the summer of 1976, along with the Nets, Nuggets and Pacers.

Over the last 17 years the Silver and Black have enjoyed a tremendous amount of success. Since Tim Duncan joined the team in 1997-98 the Spurs have captured four NBA Championships and have posted the best regular season winning percentage (.706, 950-396) of any team in the four major sports (MLB, NBA, NFL and NHL). During that time San Antonio has posted the NBA's best record five times (1998-99, 2000-01, 2002-03, 2011-12 and 2013-14) and has won 11 division titles. The Spurs record during that span ranks as the best 17-year run of any team in NBA history. Since the 2000-01 season, San Antonio has posted 50-or-more wins in 15 consecutive seasons, the longest such streak in NBA history.

In September 2012, ESPN the Magazine named the Spurs the "Team of the Decade" in its annual Ultimate Standings survey. The Silver and Black have twice been named the best franchise in professional sports (2003 and 2005) and is the only franchise to rank in the Top 10 every year since ESPN introduced its annual survey in 2003.

The Spurs are led by head coach Gregg Popovich who has been at the helm for the past 18 seasons. The longest tenured coach with the same team in all four major professional sports, Popovich holds the third-best winning percentage (minimum 250 games coached) in NBA history (.681, 967-443). His 967 victories with the Spurs rank second all-time in NBA history for most wins with one team behind Jerry Sloan (Utah Jazz, 1,127).

On the court the Spurs are led by the trio of Tim Duncan, Tony Parker and Manu Ginobili who have won three NBA titles together and have a combined 23 All-Star appearances among them. GREGG POPOVICH

In his 18th season as the Spurs head coach ... the longest tenured coach with the same team among the 122 NBA, NFL, NHL and MLB franchises ... has led the Spurs to four NBA Championships (1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007) ... he and Eric Spoelstra are the only two active coaches with multiple NBA titles ... one of five coaches in history with four-or-more NBA Championships (along with Red Auerbach, Phil Jackson, John Kundla and Pat Riley) ... finished the 2012-13 season with a career mark of 905-423 ... career winning percentage of .681 ranks third in NBA history (behind Jackson and Billy Cunningham) ... ranks 12th in NBA history in career victories (among active coaches trails only Rick Adelman) ... his 905 wins with one team rank second all-time in NBA history behind Jerry Sloan (1,127) ... posted his 900th career win vs. Utah on March 22, 2013 ... his 133 playoff wins rank third in NBA history (behind Jackson and Riley) and his playoff career winning percentage of .616 (133-83) is the third best in league history ... named NBA Coach of the Year in both 2003 and 2012 ... has been named the NBA Coach of the Month 14 times (4/99, 3/01, 3/02, 1/03, 3/03, 12/03, 12/05, 3/06, 3/07, 11/07, 11/10, 12/10, 2/12, 3/12), the most in league annals ... has led San Antonio to the NBA's best regular season record four times (1998-99, 2000-01, 2002-03 and 2011-12) ... the Western Conference All-Star coach in 2005, 2011 and 2013 ... the Spurs all-time leader in both regular season and playoff wins ... a 1970 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy with a degree in Soviet studies ... played four seasons at the Air Force Academy ... as a senior was the team's captain and leading scorer ... following his graduation in 1970 served his five-year military commitment ... during that time toured Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union as a member of the U.S. Armed Forces Team ... selected to represent the U.S. on the national AAU Team touring the Soviet Union ... in 1972 was the captain of the Armed Forces team, which won the AAU Championship ... earned an invitation to the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team Training Camp ... in 1973 returned to the Air Force Academy as an assistant coach ... spent six years at Air Force during which time he obtained his master's degree in physical education and sports sciences from the University of Denver ... in 1979 was named the head coach at Pomona-Pitzer in Claremont, California ... spent the next eight seasons at Pomona ... during the 1985-86 season led the team to its first conference championship in 68 years and to a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament ... while at Pomona was an active member of the school's academic community, working as an associate professor, chairing the college's Student Life committee, serving on the Women's Commission and even - for one year - living in a dorm with his family ... moved to the NBA in July of 1988, joining the Spurs as an assistant coach as a member of Larry Brown's staff ... spent the next four seasons in San Antonio with a Spurs team that won a pair of Midwest Division titles ... in the summer of 1992 was named an assistant coach on Don Nelson's staff with Golden State ... spent the next two seasons with the Warriors ... returned to San Antonio on May 31, 1994, as the Spurs executive vice president of basketball operations/general manager (served as GM for eight seasons before turning the job over to R.C. Buford on July 1, 2002) ... named the Spurs head coach in December of 1996 ... served as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's Men's Senior Team for three consecutive summers (at the 2002 World Basketball Championship, the 2003 FIBA America Men's Olympic Qualifying Tournament and the 2004 Olympic Games) ... a very active member of the San Antonio community ... in 1991 teamed with Frank Martin to create the Spurs Youth Basketball League ... today the league plays at 75 locations in San Antonio and through-out South Texas ... over 15,000 boys and girls, ages 7 to 16, played in the league in 2011-12 ... prior to every game, each participant takes a pledge, promising to remain drug and alcohol free while showing good sportsmanship and fair play ... the league was honored with a Daily Point of Light Award by President Bush in February of 1992 ... is involved in several charities in the San Antonio area including the San Antonio Food Bank, Roy Maas Youth Alternatives, Boys and Girls Club and The Miracle League ... honored by the Air Force Academy with its Distinguished Graduate Award in 2007 ... he and his wife of 38 years, Erin, have been blessed with two children, Micky and Jill.





American Hockey League



Head Coach

SAN ANTONIO RAMPAGE

The San Antonio Rampage serve as the top American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate for the National Hockey League's Florida Panthers. They play in the West Division of the AHL's Western Conference. Originally a joint venture between Spurs Sports & Entertainment and the Panthers, SS&E bought the team from Florida on June 30, 2005 and assumed full ownership of the franchise. Before their affiliation with the Panthers, the Rampage spent six seasons (2005-11) as the AHL affiliate to the Phoenix Coyotes (now known as the Arizona Coyotes). They entered into a new agreement with Florida on June 29, 2011. The Rampage finished the 2013-14 season with a 30-37-3-6 record, though they posted the winningest Rodeo Road Trip in franchise history, going 7-2-0-1 through the month of February. On that trip, they set a franchise record 12-game point streak, a franchise record eight-game point streak on the road, and a franchise record six-game winning streak on the road. Three players (Jonathan Racine, Vince Trocheck, and Garrett Wilson) made their NHL debut with the Panthers, while five others (Bobby Butler, Quinton Howden, Dylan Olsen, Alex Petrovic, and Colby Robak) earned recalls to the big club. Forward Bobby Butler led the team in goals (22) and points (47), while Vince Trocheck and Drew Shore topped all skaters in assists (26). For the fourth consecutive season, the Rampage finished top 10 in league-wide attendance, averaging 7,001 fans per game during the 2013-14 campaign. Overall, the Rampage welcomed 266,053 fans through 38 home games. The fourth annual Pink in the Rink game raised \$36,200 to benefit breast health awareness, and saw a crowd of 15,251 that marked a third-best attendance in franchise history. The NHL made its first stop in the 11-year history of AT&T Center on Sept. 20, 2013, as the Florida Panthers and Dallas Stars faced off in a preseason game. Anointed with the 'C' for the first time in his nine-year professional career, Rampage forward Greg Rallo finished the 2013-14 season top five all-time in four different Rampage categories: third in games played (207), fourth in goals (55), fifth in assists (61), and fifth in points (115). For the second straight season, the Rampage finished the year with a loss to a team that would cease to exist at the conclusion of the season, as the Houston Aeros became the Iowa Wild in summer of 2013, and the Abbotsford Heat will relocate to Glens Falls, N.Y. for the 2014-15 season. Tom Rowe became the ninth head coach in the team's 13-year history when he replaced Peter Horachek on Nov. 8, 2013. The Rampage are one of 30 teams that compete for the Calder Cup, and won their first playoff series in 2011-12, knocking out the Chicago Wolves in five games to advance to the Western Conference semifinals. They were named the Ticket Sales Department of the Year in 2011-12, and were presented with the AHL President's Award following the 2010-11 season for their success in all areas off the ice. In operation since 1936, the AHL continues to serve as the top developmental league for all 30 NHL teams, and more than 87 percent of today's NHL players are AHL graduates. Tom Rowe

Tom Rowe enters his second season as head coach of the San Antonio Rampage, when he became the ninth head coach in the 13-year history of the franchise on Nov. 8, 2013. During the annual Rodeo Road Trip in February, the Rampage pulled off their best trip in club history, going 7-2-0-1 under Rowe's leadership, setting a franchise record 12-game point streak as well as a franchise record six-game win streak on the road.

Before coming to the Rampage, Rowe, 58, coached Yaroslavl Lokomotiv of the Kontinental Hockey League, leading the club to a 34-18-0 record and a place in the Conference Quarterfinals during the 2012-13 season. He began his coaching career in the American Hockey League, serving as assistant coach for three seasons (2001-04) with the Lowell Lock Monsters (now the Albany Devils) before being promoted to head coach.

As the New Jersey Devils switched their affiliation, Rowe took the reins of the Albany River Rats (now the Charlotte Checkers), and owned an 80-66-14 record, seeing first round playoff action both years of his tenure (2006-08). He served as Paul Maurice's assistant coach for three seasons with the Carolina Hurricanes (2008-11).


The Lynn, Mass. native was drafted in the third round (37th overall) of the 1976 NHL Entry Draft by the Washington Capitals after playing three seasons with the London Knights of the Ontario Hockey League. In 357 career NHL games, he posted 85 goals and 100 assists, and became the first American-born player to net 30 goals in a season when he scored 31 for Washington during the 1978-79 season.

After retiring at the conclusion of the 1983-84 season, Rowe was a part-time color commentator for Hartford in 1989, becoming the full-time broadcaster in 1990 and staying in that position until the end of the season. He continued to work in Hartford management, being appointed assistant general manager in June of 1991 and remaining there until September 1993, when he made the switch to scouting. Rowe was a professional scout for the Whalers until June 1995.

He skated in 112 AHL games between Adirondack, Binghamton, Hershey, Moncton, and Springfield, posting 66 goals and 43 assists in that time. He resides in San Antonio with his wife.

AUSTIN TOROS

The Austin Toros began the 2013-2014 season with a new look... Brian Pauga was named General Manager of the Austin Toros after Sean Marks joined the San Antonio Spurs coaching bench... Assistant Coach Ken McDonald replaced Head Coach Taylor Jenkins, who accepted a position with the Atlanta Hawks. Mike Miller and Anthony Carter joined the staff as assistant coaches... Flip Murray finished sixth in the D-League averaging 21.3 points per game. Courtney Fells earned an Honorable Mention award for the 2013-14 All D-League team... The Spurs assigned four players to the Toros over the course of the season. Assignee Malcolm Thomas joined the Toros for 10 games averaging 15.2 points and 9.4 rebounds. Aron Baynes and Nando De Colo, who both spent time with the Toros during the 2012-2013 season returned to the team early on. In eight games, De Colo averaged 23.3 points, 6.1 rebounds and 5.9 assists. Baynes averaged 22.5 points and 10.5 rebounds in two games ... In February, 2014 the Spurs acquired forward Austin Daye who played one game with the Toros recording a double-double with 27 points and 13 rebounds in 40 minutes... The Toros finished the 2013-2014 season with a 19-31 record.

The Austin Toros advanced to the 2012-13 NBA D-League semi-finals under Taylor Jenkins in his first year as head coach... the team finished the season posting a record of 29-25. The Spurs assigned guards Cory Joseph and Nando De Colo, and center Aron Baynes to the Toros a combined 10 times during the season. Kawhi Leonard was also assigned once to the team during his injury rehab. Cory Joseph was named to the 2013 NBA D-League All-Star Prospects team and received Second Team, All D-League honors.

The Austin Toros enjoyed their best season in franchise history in 2011-12, highlighted by winning their first NBA D-League Championship defeating the Los Angeles in a best-of-three series ... the Toros posted a franchise-best 33-17 during the regular season and were a league-best 18-4 at on their home floor at the Cedar Park Center ... five Toros players received GATORADE Call-Ups during the season ... Eric Dawson (San Antonio, twice), Justin Dentmon (San Antonio and Toronto), Lester Hudson (Cleveland and Memphis), Carldeell Johnson (New Orleans) and Lance Thomas (New Orleans, twice) all saw NBA action ... Dentmon was named NBA D-League Most Valuable Player for the 2011-12 season and was selected to the All-NBA D-League First Team ... he was named NBA D-League Player of the Month in January and represented the Toros in the 2012 NBA D-League All-Star Game ... Dawson was named NBA D-League Impact Player of the Year and was selected to the All-NBA D-League Second Team ... the Spurs assigned rookie guard Cory Joseph to the Toros on three occasions throughout the season and playoffs ... he earned NBA Development League Performer of the Week for games played March 19-25, after posting a triple-double with 15 points, 17 rebounds and 12 assists in a 112-82 win over the Maine Red Claws on March 23 ... the Toros broke their all-time franchise attendance record on March 3, when 7,708 fans came out to watch the Toros take on the Texas Legends ... the Toros joined the D-League on May 4, 2005, when the Columbus Riverdragons moved from Georgia to Texas ... Spurs Sports & Entertainment purchased the team on June 28, 2007 ... former Toros head coaches are the late Dennis Johnson (2005-07), who was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010, Quin Snyder (2007-10), who is now an assistant coach with the Atlanta Hawks and Utah Jazz assistant coach Brad Jones (2010-12) ... Taylor Jenkins accepted an assistant coach position with the Atlanta Hawks for the 2013-14 season. The NBA D-League, founded in 2001, is the NBA's official minor league ... featuring 18 teams with direct affiliations to NBA franchises, the NBA D-League is a proven developer of talent: 30 percent of players in the NBA at the conclusion of the 2013-14 season boasted NBA D-League experience, and the league continues to develop coaches, referees, and front-office staff for the NBA and its teams ... for more information on the Toros contact the team's front office at (512) 236-8333.

AT&T CENTER

As the premier entertainment venue in South Texas, the AT&T Center opened in November of 2002. The AT&T Center was built by the initiatives of a public-private venture amongst Bexar County, the Coliseum Advisory Board, the San Antonio Livestock Show & Rodeo and Spurs Sports & Entertainment.

The facility hosts four anchor tenants: the NBA Spurs, the AHL Rampage, the WNBA Stars and the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo. Additionally, the venue attracts a multitude of concerts, family shows and special events. In 10 years of operation, the AT&T Center has hosted over 1,000 events with entertaining in excess of 15 million guests. George Strait, the Rolling Stones, Billy Joel & Elton John, The Police, Luciano Pavarotti, George Lopez, Cirque du Soleil, Lady Gaga, Justin Bieber, and Bon Jovi are just a few of the musical acts that have visited the AT&T Center. Other events include NCAA Basketball, WWE Royal Rumble, Walking with Dinosaurs, and the Harlem Globetrotters.

The AT&T Center offers diverse events to the San Antonio community and all of South Texas thanks in part to its various seating capabilities, building configurations, curtaining system and technology upgrades. Configurations from an ice show, to basketball, to rodeo, to boxing, to theater can all be accomplished at the AT&T Center. Complementing every event held at the venue is a 360 in-arena LED ring, four video/scoring panels to the Scoreboard, two Lobby LED Color Matrix displays and over six hundred LCD HDTVs throughout the arena.

To leverage its ancillary meeting spaces and exhibition/trade configurations, the AT&T Center offers MSEs, Meetings and Special Events, throughout the year. This additional amenity further illustrates the facility's full-service approach and has resulted in non-traditional bookings such as Toyota's 2007 National Dealer Meeting and Product Launch, Ford's Customer Appreciation Concert with Toby Keith, and AT&T's 2007 National Leadership Meeting.

Built in a "ranch tech" style, the AT&T Center is designed to present a sense of place, both inside and out. The external view, in addition to its distinctive architecture, features park-like landscaping that's both visually appealing and environmentally friendly. Inside, the design continues to capture the South Texas ambiance with festive colors and imaginative details. MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS

Preseason/Regular Season Games

Media credentials are issued to working media only. All single-game credentials may be picked up at the desk located inside the Southeast VIP Entrance of the AT&T Center beginning two hours prior to tip-off. All credentials are non-transferable and any unauthorized use will subject bearer to ejection from the AT&T Center and confiscation of the pass. NOTE: All personal items are subject to search upon entering the AT&T Center. **Individual game credentials should be requested through the Stars Public Relations Department a minimum of 24 hours prior to game time or by 4 p.m. on Friday for all Saturday, Sunday and Monday contests.**

Media members covering the Stars on a regular basis will be issued full season credentials. Media with season credentials are still required to reserve seating for all games via phone (210-444-5738) or email (ppetri@attcenter.com). Reserved seating requests should be made to the communications office by the above mentioned deadline.

Single-game credentials will be issued on a space available basis. Credentials are good for admittance to the arena, media workroom, media hospitality and both locker rooms.

ABSOLUTELY NO AUTOGRAPHS DURING THE MEDIA ACCESS PERIOD.

Interviews that need advance preparation or special accommodation should be arranged by contacting the Stars Communications Department. This includes all live television interviews for pre- and post-game.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

All photographers are required to wear a "PHOTO" credential to gain access to the arena floor. The photography areas of the AT&T Center are located along the baselines of both ends of the court. Photographers are prohibited from entering the sideline areas in front of or behind the team benches and in front of press row. In addition, photographers are asked to observe WNBA rules for player escape routes - an open area approximately five feet on both sides of the basket.

MEDIA ENTRANCE AND PARKING

The media entrance is located at the Southeast VIP entrance of the AT&T Center. All media members must enter the building through this entrance. WNBA and Stars season passes will be honored and single-game credentials will be available at the will call desk for pickup. The press doors open two hours prior to tip-off. For those media members who receive season parking privileges, the media parking is located in Lot 3. Media covering Stars on a game-by-game basis can request a parking pass along with their single-game credential.

MEDIA WORKROOM

The media workroom and media hospitality room are located on the event level in the southeast corner of the AT&T Center and are accessible only with a valid credential. Both rooms are open two hours prior to game time. The professional intent of the media workroom is to provide a meeting and working area for writers, reporters, broadcasters and game personnel. Family members and guests will not be admitted. Any abuse of the media workroom and/or press privileges will result in forfeiture of credentials. The media workroom is equipped with electrical outlets and telephones. For additional phone needs please call Shane Skaggs at 210-444-5153.

MEDIA SEATING

Reserved media seating has been designated at either the courtside press table or in the overflow press seating located on the Plaza Level in sections 101-103 and 126-28. All seats are reserved for each individual media member. Seating charts are posted at the media check-in desk and in the press room. Electrical outlets and telephones are placed on press row for your convenience. In addition, stat monitors, which also show the in-house TV feed, are also available on press row. If a media member is in need of an individual phone, please contact the Stars Communications Department for assistance. Statistics and out of town scores will be distributed throughout the game. Media are asked to finish and file stories in the media workroom to facilitate changeover in the AT&T Center.

WNBA MEDIA ACCESS POLICIES

Day of Game

Shootarounds: All shootarounds will be open to the media for the last 30 minutes of the workout. Interviews at the Antioch practice facility will all take place on the court as there is no locker room access at the practice facility. For road games, media should contact the Stars Communications Department to verify shootaround times and media access periods. Should the team not have a shootaround, it is not required to have a media "shootaround" interview session.

Pre-Game: The league will retain the policy of a 30-minute open locker room beginning 90 minutes before the game. All head coaches must make themselves available for a minimum of 15 minutes beginning anywhere from 15 minutes prior to the open locker room period through the end of the open locker room period.

Post-Game: Following a 10-minute cooling off period, head coach Dan Hughes will be available to the media and the locker room will be open to the media for 30 minutes.

Off Day Access

Practice: All Stars practices are open to the media. Please check with the communications staff regarding open practice times for that day. No interviews will take place prior to practice without advance arrangements being made through the public relations department. All interviews will take place on the court at the Antioch practice facility.
