Royal Brougham Pavilion

The 2010 WNBA season marks the first year for the Seattle Storm in their new practice facility, Royal Brougham Pavilion at Seattle Pacific University (SPU).

On December 7, 2009, the Storm announced that they had signed an agreement to use the facility for five years. As part of the agreement, a new professional-length court was put in place in the lower level of the pavilion. The Storm is the primary users of the new court during the WNBA season, and in the offseason the court is used by SPU. The Storm and SPU also collaborate in putting on basketball clinics for kids and coaches.

Prior to this season, the Storm had used the Furtado Center as their practice facility for 10 years. The Center was purchased by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and is now used for the foundation's headquarters.

2010 WNBA PLAYOFFS MEDIA INFORMATION

Welcome to the 2010 WNBA Playoffs and the Seattle Storm's seventh consecutive postseason berth. The following media guidelines have been established to assist in your coverage of the Storm and to provide a professional, comfortable working environment for all members of the media. **If you have any questions, please contact the Storm PR Hotline at 206-281-5847.**

KeyArena is located on the grounds of Seattle Center. From I-5 (north or southbound) take the Mercer Street exit and follow the signs marked "Seattle Center." The arena is approximately 25 minutes north of SEA-TAC airport. The arena's **Media Entrance** is located through Parking Lot 4 on the south side of KeyArena (at the corner of Warren Street and Thomas Street).

Credentials may be requested by calling the Storm public relations department at least 24 hours prior to the game. Credentials are issued to accredited members of the media who are on assignment to cover a specific game. Please confirm your credential request prior to arriving at the game. Credentials should be used for work at all times and are non-transferable. Unauthorized use of a credential may subject the bearer to ejection from the arena and forfeiture of the credential.

Parking is available on a limited basis and can be requested by calling the Storm public relations department.

Telephones are provided in the media workroom and on a limited basis at courtside. If you need a dedicated phone line, call the Storm public relations department to make arrangements.

Seating is located courtside and on the second level of the west side of the arena. Please do not switch seats without prior approval from a member of the Storm public relations department. Seating charts may be found at the media entrance and in the media workroom.

Photographers may find photo charts with their assigned spots at the media entrance, in the media workroom and on the basket stanchions. All lanes are assigned and photographers are asked to not switch lanes without approval from a member of the Storm public relations department. Please be considerate of season ticket holders seated directly behind you. For the safety of players and in accordance with league rules, photographers must remain at least four feet behind the baseline at all times. Remote cameras and tripods are not permitted. Use of a flash is prohibited. Rubber lens shades are required on all lenses for photographers and broadcasters, as well as news, video and film crews.

The Media Room is located on the lower west concourse, directly above the visiting team's locker room. The room opens two hours prior to each game and is equipped with telephones, outlets, a fax machine, Storm game notes, league statistics and scores from other WNBA games.

Locker Rooms are located on the west side at floor level. In accordance with WNBA policy, locker rooms will be open for a 30-minute period ending one hour before the start of a game. Locker rooms are reopened to the media after the game no later than 10 minutes following the game's conclusion and remain open for a minimum of 30 minutes. Following the 30-minute media access period, locker rooms will be closed for a 20 to 30 minute period to allow players to shower and dress. Afterward, the locker rooms may again be opened to the media if necessary.

Interview Requests requiring special accommodations should be made ahead of time by calling Jennifer Carroll at 206-272-2706.

Game Notes and Statistics are available in the media room two hours before each game, during the game and postgame. Statistics are distributed to the media seating area after each half.

Practice Times and Policies may be obtained by contacting the Storm public relations department. The Storm practice at Royal Brougham Pavilion (the Storm training facility) at 3414 Third Ave. W., Seattle, WA 98119 (on the campus of Seattle Pacific University).

Brian Agler Head Coach & Director of Player Personnel

The 2010 WNBA season marks Brian Agler's third campaign as the Seattle Storm head coach, and his sixth year as a head coach in the WNBA. Agler was introduced as the Storm's head coach on Jan. 8, 2008 and is the third coach in Storm history. He also assumed the role of Director of Player Personnel.

Prior to joining the Storm last year, Agler was the head coach and general manager of the expansion team Minnesota Lynx from 1999-2002, where he compiled a 48-67 (.417) record. Before being named the first coach of the Lynx, Agler served as the head coach of the Columbus Quest of the now-defunct American Basketball League (ABL) from 1996-1999, compiling an 82-22 record.

Before being named the first coach of the expansion Lynx, Agler served as the head coach of the Columbus Quest of the ABL from 1996-1999, compiling an 82-22 record. He led the Quest to back-to-back ABL championships in 1997 and 1998 and was named the ABL Coach of the Year for the 1996-97 season.

Agler completed his third season as an assistant coach for the San Antonio Silver Stars in 2007. Prior to joining San Antonio, he served as assistant coach with the Phoenix Mercury and helped guide the team to a 17-17 record after the Mercury finished with an 8-26 record in 2003.

Agler spent 15 seasons coaching among the college ranks, including 13 seasons as a head coach. He posted an impressive collegiate record of 248-135 (.648 winning percentage). From 1993-96 he served as the head women's basketball coach at Kansas State.

In 1988, Agler took over as the head women's coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In five seasons at UMKC, Agler was 85-54 and took the Kangaroos from a 9-16 record in 1988-89 to four straight winning seasons with 17 or more victories. Under his direction, UMKC led the NCAA in scoring defense three consecutive seasons from 1990-93. In 1991, UMKC set an NCAA team record, allowing 51.8 points per game.

As the head women's basketball coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M Junior College from 1984-88, Agler compiled a 124-42 record (.747 winning percentage). In 1985-86, NEO A&M was ranked second nationally and posted a 30-2 record.

Agler attended Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where he starred on the basketball team for four seasons. He led the Tigers to their only NCAA Division III Championship in basketball as a freshman. He started all 112 games during his college career, leaving the school as the all-time assist leader (481). Agler helped lead his team to a 91-21 record during his four years with the Tigers, and was named most valuable player in the Ohio Athletic Conference and first-team All-American as a senior. In 1995, he was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Honor.

In 1980, Agler graduated with a degree in special education and physical education. He received his master's degree in education from Pittsburg State University (Pittsburg, Kansas) in 1985. Agler and his wife Robin, have one son, Bryce, and one daughter, Taylor.

Nancy Darsch **Assistant Coach**

Nancy Darsch, in her third season as an assistant coach for the Seattle Storm, has coached women's basketball at both the professional and Division I college levels.

As head coach for the WNBA's New York Liberty during the inaugural season in 1997, she led them to the championship game and a 17-11 record. She compiled a 36-24 record with New York over two seasons. Darsch took over the reigns for the Washington Mystics in 1999. After two seasons as head coach of the Mystics, Darsch became an advance scout for the team for three seasons. She later joined the Minnesota Lynx as an assistant coach from 2003-2005.

In 2006 and 2007 Darsch was an assistant coach at Boston College, helping lead the Eagles to a 13-16 campaign in 2006-07, and a 20-11 record in 2007-08, including a berth in the post-season WNIT.

Prior to her WNBA experience, Darsch was the head coach at Ohio State University for 12 seasons. She compiled a record of 234-125 (.652) while at Ohio State. Darsch led the Buckeyes to four Big Ten Conference Championships and seven NCAA tournament appearances. In 1993, Darsch led Ohio State to an impressive 24-4 record, a Big Ten Championship and the NCAA championship game. Before her arrival at Ohio State, Darsch was an assistant coach at Tennessee for seven seasons under head coach Pat Summitt.

Darsch has also been involved with USA Basketball since 1984. She has won two Olympic gold medals as an assistant coach for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles and the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta.

A native of Plymouth, Mass., Darsch is a 1973 graduate of Springfield College. She earned her master's degree in physical education from the University of Tennessee.



Jenny Boucek **Director of Player Development and Scouting**

Boucek joins the Storm in her first season as the director of player development and scouting. Boucek served as an assistant coach for the Storm under Anne Donovan during the 2003, 2004 and 2005 seasons and was an integral part of the 2004 WNBA championship team. Additionally, Boucek served as the head coach for the now-defunct Sacramento Monarchs and compiled a record of 40-41 during her two-plus seasons (2007-2009) with the organization.

After beginning her WNBA coaching career began in 1999 as an assistant with the Washington Mystics, Boucek spent three seasons as an assistant with the Miami Sol. She played professional basketball for two years before joining the coach ranks. In 1997, the WNBA's inaugural season, Boucek was a member of the Cleveland Rockers. Boucek also played in Iceland in 1998 and was voted the country's best player after averaging 23 points, seven rebounds and six assists. She returned to Cleveland for the 1998 season but was forced to retire due to a career-ending back injury.

A four-year starter at the University of Virginia (1992-96), Boucek helped lead the Cavaliers to four regular-season ACC Championships and three NCAA Elite Eight appearances. She was a two-time GTE Academic All-America team member and two-time ACC selection. Boucek twice earned team Defensive Player of the Year honors and finished her career at Virginia as a member of the 1,000-point club. She also competed in the U.S. Olympic Festival in 1993.



Missy Bequette
Director of Basketball Operations

A member of the 2000 inaugural Storm staff, Missy Bequette celebrates her 11th season with the club and has been the director of basketball operations since the 2001 season. She is responsible for all travel arrangements, housing and practice scheduling, in addition to assisting with the draft, scouting and

player personnel.

A native of Crystal City, Mo., Bequette graduated from the University of Missouri-Columbia before earning a master's degree in education with an emphasis in sport management from the University of Arkansas. While at Arkansas, Bequette served as the Lady Razorbacks assistant coach during the 1985-86 season.

After a year at the Arkansas School of Law, Bequette returned to the University of Missouri as an assistant coach from 1988 through 1997. Bequette's responsibilities at Missouri included evaluation and recruitment, a task at which she achieved great success by bringing in two Big 8 Freshmen of the Year and several all-conference athletes.

Bequette began her career in professional basketball with the Portland Power (ABL) in 1997, assisting former Storm Head Coach Lin Dunn. The Power won the ABL Western Conference with eventual WNBA players Natalie Williams, DeLisha Milton, Elaine Powell and Sylvia Crawley.

Prior to joining the Storm in March 2000, Bequette was a teacher and basketball coach at Southridge High School in Beaverton, Ore.



Tom Spencer
Athletic Trainer, C. PTA

Tom Spencer, in his third season as the head athletic trainer for the Seattle Storm, graduated from Central Washington University in 1990 with a degree in individualized studies: sports medicine and adaptive physical education.

Spencer worked for the Milwaukee Brewers for one summer as the Head Athletic Trainer for the Peoria Brewers of the Arizona summer league in 1988. From 1989-1999, Spencer worked for the Cincinnati Reds as a Head Minor League Athletic Trainer at many different levels from Rookie ball to Double A. Spencer went back to school to become a Physical Therapist Assistant in 2002 and since then he has been working for Peak Sports and Spine Physical Therapy. A precocious talent, Svetlana Abrosimova was named the MVP of the European Championships at age 16 while representing Russia. She subsequently came to the U.S. to play college basketball for the University of Connecticut, spending three years alongside Storm teammates Sue Bird and Swin Cash and helping the Huskies win the 2000 NCAA Championship. The No. 7 overall pick of the 2001 WNBA Draft, Abrosimova spent seven seasons with the Minnesota Lynx, including two playing for Storm Head Coach Brian Agler. After a brief stint with the Connecticut Sun following the 2008 Olympics, Abrosimova took the 2009 WNBA campaign off but returned to the league with the Storm in 2010.

Throughout her basketball career, success has been synonymous with Sue Bird. When the Storm won the 2004 WNBA Championship, Bird became just the sixth player ever to win an NCAA Championship, a WNBA Championship and an Olympic gold medal. In addition, Bird also won a national high-school championship at Christ the King High School and has won Euroleague and Russian Superleague titles. A three-time All-WNBA First Team pick, Bird has been one of the vanguards of a new breed of female point guards who are as dangerous scoring the basketball as they are passing it. During the 2003 season, Bird set a WNBA record with seven point-assist double-doubles. Despite suffering a broken nose early in the Storm's 2004 playoff run, Bird continued to star with a protective facemask, handing out a WNBA Playoffs record 14 assists in the Storm's Game 3 victory over Sacramento in the Western Conference Finals. In 2006, after just four full seasons in the league, Bird was voted to the WNBA's All-Decade Team. She has twice led the league in assists, in 2005 and 2009, and became just the third player in WNBA history to reach 3,000 career points and 1,000 assists.

SEASON NOTES

THE RECORD-BREAKING STORM

By winning their final game at home against the Los Angeles Sparks, the Storm set two WNBA records. They tied the WNBA record for most victories in a season. The record is 28 wins, set by Los Angeles in 2001 when the WNBA season was just 32 games. (That Los Angeles team went on to win the WNBA Championship.)

In addition, the Storm have the best home record in WNBA history after beating the Sparks, completing a perfect 17-0 season for the Storm at KeyArena. The previous best home record in league history is 16-0, set by the same 2001 Los Angeles team. No other WNBA team has ever gone undefeated at home over the course of a season

A DYNASTY IN THE MAKING

The Storm victory over the Tulsa Shock on July 25 marked three straight seasons with 20-plus wins. That has only been done by four other franchises in WNBA history:

- Detroit Shock (2006-08)
- Houston Comets (1998-2000)
- Indiana Fever (2005-07)
- Los Angeles Sparks (1999-2004)

WORKING OVERTIME

Seattle's 111-107 victory over the Phoenix Mercury on July 14 was the WNBA's fifth triple-overtime game in league history. The 111 points scored by the Storm were the team's most this season, just 5 short of tying the WNBA record. They did tie the franchise record for points in a game, which was set against the Mercury in 2007.

Diana Taurasi's 44 points were three fewer than the WNBA record for individual points in a game, a record Taurasi herself shares with Seattle's Lauren Jackson.

Seattle set team highs for the season for points, rebounds (57) and assists (26).

The Storm have had to put in extra effort recently against the Mercury. Four of the last five games between the two teams have gone to overtime, including two this year, both of which were won by the Storm.

AGLER REACHES 100 WINS

The Storm Head Coach and Director of Player Personnel Brian Agler reached 100 wins during his WNBA coaching career with the Storm's 92-84 victory over the New York Liberty on June 18, 2010. Agler is the eighth coach in league history to reach at least 100 wins.

"I think it's great. Brian, he's been with a couple of teams, but I feel like he's always had a really good ability to get the best out of his players and produce winning teams. I think that's what this milestone means," said Storm guard Sue Bird.

The Storm signed Head Coach and Director of Player Personnel Brian Agler to a new contract on Sept. 14. The new two-year contract runs through 2011 with an option for a third year. Named the third head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2008, Agler has led the Storm to back-to-back 20 win seasons. He was instrumental in the team extending Sue Bird's contract and re-signing Lauren Jackson prior to the 2009 season.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Lauren Jackson has earned the Western Conference Player of the Month award in May, June and July of 2010.

Jackson also has earned the Conference's Player of the Week award four times in the first seven weeks of the season, surpassing Lisa Leslie in the process for the most such honors in a career (18).

Over 10 games in June, the native of Australia averaged 22.1 ppg, second overall behind Diana Taurasi of the Phoenix Mercury (22.9 ppg). The two-time WNBA Most Valuable Player also ranked second in the West and fifth overall with 9.3 rebounds per game.

Jackson, who posted four double-doubles and scored 20-or-more points five times in June, opened and closed the month with her best scoring efforts of the season, a 32-point output vs. Atlanta on June 1 and a 31-point effort vs. San Antonio on June 29. The latter game also included a season-high 15 rebounds by the tenth year pro.

THE ROAD TO 1,500

Sue Bird became the second player in WNBA history to reach 1,500 career-assists milestone on Sunday, June 20 in Seattle. Bird played in a total of 276 games, averaging 5.6 assists per game. Bird currently has 1,531 career assists and is second on the all-time list to Los Angeles Sparks guard Ticha Penicheiro, who holds the record with 2,270 over 388 career games.

2010 STORM REGULAR SEASON REVIEW

MONTH-BY-MONTH RECAP

MAY (5-1):

The Storm opened the 2010 season with two games at KeyArena and won both, easily defeating Los Angeles and coming from behind in the fourth quarter to edge Minnesota. The team then went on the road to Phoenix and won a barn-burner, 95-89, before returning home to beat Washington to get off to a perfect 4-0 start. The streak was broken in the next game, a road loss to Chicago. But the Storm responded in their next game by clamping down defensively on San Antonio, allowing just 56 points in a 28-point road blowout.

JUNE (9-1):

Lauren Jackson scored 32 points in an 18-point win against previously unbeaten Atlanta to open the month, a sign that the Storm's success in May was no fluke. They followed that by eking out a narrow victory against Los Angeles in a game that was played outdoors at the Home Depot Center Tennis Stadium, the second outdoor game in WNBA history. The Storm easily won their next two games by more than 20 points each. Indiana then held Seattle to a season-low 65 points, handing the Storm just their second loss – and their last loss for a long time. At New York the Storm rallied with 30 points in the fourth quarter to win, before returning home to blow out San Antonio and avenge their loss against Indiana. The Storm finished the month with comfortable victories on the road over Tulsa and at home over San Antonio again. In their last 5 games of the month, the Storm scored at least 80 points.

JULY (8-0): The Storm began what would prove to be a perfect month with a win at Los Angeles. They then defeated New York at home on Kid's Day before embarking on a three-game road trip against Western Conference rivals. The first game on the trip was the wildest of the year – a triple-overtime 111-107 win against Phoenix. The Mercury's Taurasi scored 44 points, but Lauren Jackson countered with 31 to go with 18 rebounds. Seattle pulled down 57 rebounds as a team, a season high. After that marathon in the desert, it didn't get any easier, as Minnesota and San Antonio each gave Seattle a challenge but both would fall. The Storm finished the month with three home games, two of which were blowouts. The other was yet another close, high-scoring victory over Phoenix.

AUGUST (6-4):

After a 13-game winning streak the Storm magic began to fade just a bit in August. A one-point, last-second loss at Minnesota ended the team's hopes of reaching the longest winning streak in WNBA history. The Storm next shockingly lost at league-worst Tulsa and barely escaped with a one-point victory over Connecticut at home. When Tulsa came to KeyArena, Seattle was ready for revenge, and they achieved it with a 111-65 mauling that set a WNBA record for largest margin of victory. A comeback road victory over Atlanta gave the Storm home-court advantage through the entire playoffs, and after that there was little to play for. A largely reserve team lost the next two games on the road. But the Storm finished strong, winning three straight games – each by 5 points or less – to close out the season.

2007 – Phoenix 2, Seattle 0

POSTGAME NOTES (5/22/10; 95-89 1OT WIN)

- With a 95-89 overtime victory over Phoenix, Seattle now stands atop the Western Conference as the only undefeated team with a 3-0 record. Phoenix falls to 1-1 on the season.
- The Storm snapped the Mercury's three-game winning streak between the two clubs and improves to 21-15 all-time vs. the Mercury. The last time Seattle won vs. Phoenix was on June 21, 2009 when the Storm walked away with a 93-84 victory in Phoenix.
- Prior to tonight's overtime loss, Phoenix had won eight consecutive regular season overtime games and two consecutive vs. Seattle. The Mercury's last overtime loss came at home vs. San Antonio (72-80) on June 26, 2004.
- Seattle was able to win the battle inside, outrebounding Phoenix 48-38 and scoring 22 more points in the paint (54-32).
- With 13 points tonight, Diana Taurasi extended her double-digit scoring streak to 22 games, the longest active such streak in the WNBA and third-longest in franchise history (Cappie Pondexter, 36).
- The Mercury turned the ball over 24 times resulting in 31 Seattle points. Conversely, the Storm committed just 11 errors for seven Mercury points.
- Lauren Jackson led the Storm with a game-high 25 points on 10-of-24 (.417) shooting and eight rebounds.
- Along with Jackson, Seattle had three other players reach double-figure scoring: Swin Cash added 18 and Camille Little and Tanisha Wright contributed 14 each.

POSTGAME NOTES (6/6/10; 97-74 WIN)

- Lauren Jackson, Camille Little and Swin Cash scored 16 points each to lead the Seattle Storm to the 97-74 victory.
- The Storm won its fourth straight game and improved to 6-0 at home.
- Seattle pushed the lead to 41 points early in the fourth quarter, when both teams played mainly reserves.
- Phoenix had cut a 28-14 deficit late in the first quarter to five points, but the Storm led 50-35 at halftime.
- Taurasi shot 3 of 11 from the field, including 1 of 7 on 3-pointers.
- DeWanna Bonner and Taylor Lilley scored 12 points to lead the Mercury.
- Seattle outrebounded the Mercury 47-32 and had more assists, 26-17.
- The Storm's five starters combined for 73 of their 97 points, all adding 12 or more points.

POSTGAME NOTES (7/14/10; 111-107 WIN)

- The Seattle Storm won in triple overtime against Phoenix.
- This overtime marks the second time that the two teams have faced extra periods of play during the 2010 season. The teams have also played extra periods in four of the last five meetings.
- The Storm are 4-0 in games decided by four points or less, while Phoenix is 2-7.
- Dana Taurasi, the league's leading scorer, had a game-high 44 points to lead Phoenix.
- With 5:55 remaining in the game, the Mercury went on a 15-6 run to force the game into overtime. Taurasi scored 7 of the Mercury's last 15 points.
- Lauren Jackson led the Storm with 31 points and 18 rebounds.
- Jackson sank two free-throws with 2.6 seconds left in the first overtime to send it into a second.
- Tied at 107 and with 49 seconds remaining in the third overtime, Sue Bird made a three-pointer to give the Storm the lead. Jackson made a free-throw with 1.8 seconds left to seal the victory.
- Storm guard Tanisha Wright had a season-high 20 points, while all five starters for the Storm contributed with points in double figures.
- The Storm clinches the series versus the Mercury for 2010 with two games still remaining in their series.

POSTGAME NOTES (7/27/10; 91-85 WIN)

- The win is the Storm's 12th straight, extending the longest streak in franchise history. There were 17 lead changes in the game including 10 in the second quarter.
- With the win, the Storm secured the No. 1 overall seed in the Western Conference and home-court advantage through two playoff rounds.
- The Storm has never been the No. 1 seed before in franchise history.

- Lauren Jackson scored a season-high 33 points, her fourth time with 30-plus, and added 11 rebounds for her seventh double-double of 2010.
- Sue Bird's five steals tied a season high.
- Diana Taurasi led Phoenix with 27 points.
- The Storm improved to 12-0 at home this season and 16-0 against Western Conference foes.
- Phoenix's 56 first-half points were the most allowed by the Storm in a half this season. The Mercury's eight third-quarter points were a season low.
- Phoenix had 13 fast-break points in the first half and none after halftime. The Mercury also had no points off turnovers in the second half.
- The 18-point comeback was the Storm's largest this season. The team is now 10-2 when trailing after three quarters.
- The Storm improved to 4-0 against the Mercury this season. It's the first time ever the Storm has defeated Phoenix four times head to head.

POSTGAME NOTES (8/21/10, 78-73 WIN)

- Jana Vesela scored a season-high 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting.
- Swin Cash and Tanisha Wright joined Vesela as the only Storm players in double figure scoring with 13 and 10 points respectively.

- Sue Bird finished the game with 20 points and seven assists for Seattle. She shot 60% from both the field and the three-point line (6-of-10 FGM, 3-of-5 3FGM).
- Trailing by 10 with 3:14 remaining in the third quarter, Seattle went on a 9-1 run to finish the quarter just two points behind the Silver Stars (57-55). The run was led by Sue Bird with five points.
- Becky Hammon led the Silver Stars with a team-high 10 assists and three steals. The 10 assists ties Hammon's career high and her three steals tie her season high.
- Four of the Silver Stars starters finished the game in double-figure scoring: Chamique Holdsclaw – 16, Sophia Young – 18, Michelle Snow – 16, and Roneeka Hodges with 11.
- San Antonio shot only 69.2% from the free throw line.
- San Antonio outscored Seattle in the paint 32 (16-of-31) to 18 (12-of-20).

POSTGAME NOTES (5/16/10; 81-67 WIN)

- The Storm won their first regular season game and handed Los Angeles their first loss.
- Center Lauren Jackson led the Storm with 23 points, scoring 17 of them in the first half.
- Swin Cash and Tanisha Wright added 17 points for the Storm, which got all but two points from their starters.
- Seattle outscored Los Angeles 22-5 in the final 8 minutes.
- Bird's 3-pointer with 7:49 left pulled Seattle even at 62 and another 3-pointer 2 minutes later pushed the advantage to six.
