Cleveland Cavaliers: Champions on the Court and in the Community

The Quicken Loans Arena and Cleveland Cavaliers Organization – including the AHL's Cleveland Monsters and AFL's Cleveland Gladiators – strives to set the standard for being champions not only on the field of play, but out in the community as well. The organization is deeply committed to **making a positive impact on the lives of children and families in Northeast Ohio**. Throughout the year, the teams support a full roster of community outreach initiatives that address important social issues, with an emphasis on **education, youth and family services, health and wellness, volunteerism and entrepreneurship**.

Each year the Cavaliers are able to **reach more than 130,000 children in Cleveland** and across several counties in Northeast Ohio through the team's many programs.



- Several of those focus on **the importance of education** at all levels, kindergarten through high school: the Cavs coordinate reading initiatives in schools through **"Read to Achieve;"** recognize hardworking teachers and students with **"Head of the Class," "All-Star Kids" and "Straight 'A' All-Stars;"** and partner with Huntington Bank to award **college scholarships**
- With health and wellness being a pillar of the Cavs community efforts, players, coaches and other staff can often be found leading kids through basketball clinics, talking about living a healthy lifestyle, and even practicing yoga with Cleveland-area kids, thanks to the team's **"Fit as a Pro"** initiative
- The team also **hosts awareness nights** at games throughout the season to help support important causes, including breast cancer, colon cancer and autism. In addition, the Cavs organization also holds two major events each year to benefit The Children's Tumor Foundation.
- Understanding the positive influence they can have on our youth and others in the Greater Cleveland community, **Cavaliers players and coaches make an average of 200 community appearances each year**, including hospital visits, serving meals to the less fortunate, distributing toys during the holidays and much more



With more than **\$42 million total in community, civic and charitable giving**, a wide range of local non-profit organizations and charities have benefited from the Cavs in the 20-plus years the team has been in downtown Cleveland.

- The Cavaliers Youth Fund, the charitable arm of the Cavs organization, has made grants totaling more than **\$23 million** to deserving groups in the area
- The Cavs have also provided more than **\$19 million in community gifts and contributions**
- Most recently:
 - The **team distributed more than \$750,000 to several local charitable organizations as a result of the 2016 NBA Championship playoff run**. The money was collected through 100% of admissions to road game watch parties, plus additional funds were raised through 50/50 raffles and auctions.
 - Over the last two years, the team has **donated more than \$150,000 to the Greater Cleveland Food Bank, resulting in over 500,000 meals provided to those in need**. Through grants from the Cavaliers Youth Fund, the Cavs have also supported the Food Bank's "BackPacks for Kids" program, providing school children with food to take home in order to sustain them over a weekend.
 - The team hosts two events each year – Flashes of Hope's Big Shots & Little Stars and Cupid's Undie Run – to **benefit the Children's Tumor Foundation** to help them in their fight to end Neurofibromatosis, raising well **over \$1 million** between the two every year.
 - The past two years, the Cavs have participated in the **#BestSchoolDay**, a nationwide initiative through DonorsChoose.org that allows people to fund supplies and resources for classrooms. The team has **donated \$25,000 per year to schools in Cuyahoga County**, helping provide teachers and students with what they need to succeed.



\$60 Million Secured to Fight Blight

Dan Gilbert and the Cavaliers' family of companies have helped lead the recent local fight against blight by playing a core lobbying role in securing federal Hardest Hit Funds to fight blight in Ohio. Specifically, Cuyahoga County received \$60 million in 2015 to initiate a demolition program for 5,000 blighted homes. The Cavaliers also **contributed \$50,000** this past year to help launch the initial phase of the local Western Reserve Land Conservancy program also **working towards local blight elimination**.

Tickets Donated Annually

The Cavaliers organization provides the opportunity for thousands of children and families to attend home games at The Q every year. **The Cavs donate approximately 15,000 tickets per season to organizations that include local charities, non-profits and schools.** This also includes a player ticket program where Cavs players personally purchase tickets, food vouchers and t-shirts to donate to non-profit groups.

In addition, on a daily basis the Cavs also send giveaway, auction and raffle items to various organizations throughout Northeast Ohio to help them with their own fundraising efforts. The team **fulfills approximately 5,000 requests** each year.

In an effort to provide children in the Northeast Ohio region with **better access to books and technology**, the Cavaliers create **Reading & Learning Centers** and **Learn & Play Centers** in community-based organizations and schools. This allows a qualified non-profit organization to improve the condition of its current facility as well as to improve the quality of its literacy and educational programming.

- Since 2004, the Cavaliers have **created 17 Reading & Learning Centers and Learn & Play Centers** at multiple Boys & Girls Clubs, schools, leadership academies and other organizations

The Cavs also aim to lift spirits and **provide everyday necessities** to those in our community. Since 2008, the Cavaliers have completed **six “Legacy Projects”** that are designed to **provide children and families in Northeast Ohio with safe places to live, learn and play.**

- The team has funded and constructed a home for Habitat for Humanity; provided an outdoor basketball court at East End Neighborhood House; built an outdoor sports court at Cleveland Clinic Children's Hospital for Rehabilitation; refurbished the family lounge at Cleveland Clinic Children's Hospital for Rehabilitation; redone the family room and resource center at Ronald McDonald house of Greater Cleveland; and renovated the activity center at Cleveland Clinic Children's.



Quicken Loans Arena, A Promise That Keeps On Giving

In October of 1994, a new era of sports and entertainment began in Northeast Ohio when Quicken Loans Arena (then Gund Arena) opened its doors in the heart of downtown Cleveland and the NBA Cleveland Cavaliers came back home after 20 seasons in suburban Richfield. Fast forward 23 years later and Quicken Loans Arena and the Cavaliers have lived up to the promise of being a world-class attraction and an essential building block for the economy of all of Northeast Ohio

Thanks to a unique public/private partnership between civic and business leaders and with the support of Cuyahoga County voters, in 1990 the decision was made to build Quicken Loans Arena and Progressive Field (then Jacobs Field), home to the MLB Cleveland Indians, side-by-side on the former Central Market site in downtown Cleveland. The project formed a centerpiece of the Gateway development, to be known as the Gateway District.

The Central Market site, located on the southern end of the city, was a desolate part of downtown and perhaps the area of highest disinvestment. Logistically, it was the entry way into Cleveland that consisted of primarily empty commercial buildings and underutilized surface parking lots, with only six full service restaurants and no hotels or residential properties.

Today, the Gateway District is a vibrant live, work and play destination. It is now the focal point of downtown Cleveland and has been the beneficiary of **over \$1 BILLION in completed, underway or funded**

retail, residential and hotel development. The Gateway District consists of 25 residential properties, nine hotels, and over 70 full-service restaurants and eateries that service it's nearly 2,000 residents and five million visitors each year. In addition, four properties are under construction or in design/development for additional housing, hotel and retail.

The First 20 Years, Just the Beginning

For two decades, Quicken Loans Arena (The Q) has provided Cleveland with a modern-day sports and entertainment venue that spurred an era of dramatic economic growth and renewal. The Q hosts close to 200 events and welcomes more than two million guests each year. It is a must-stop destination for major concert tours and family shows, and in addition to the 2016 NBA Champion Cavaliers, The Q is home to the American Hockey Leagues' and 2016 Calder Cup Champion Cleveland Monsters, the American Football Leagues' Cleveland Gladiators and the Mid-American Conference Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments.

With its full calendar of events, The Q has helped to stimulate dozens of job-creating restaurants and new hotels to downtown Cleveland. Those developments have had a cascading effect, resulting in more downtown residents and new businesses that are attracted by the downtown vibe.

In 2016 alone, The Q generated:

- Over \$44 million of tax revenue annually (city, county and state).
 - \$18 million in tax revenue to the City of Cleveland.
 - \$5 million in tax revenue to Cuyahoga County.
- Plus, an estimated \$245 million in direct spending, which creates and retains jobs within the county.

In addition, much in part to the arena's amenities and accommodations, Cleveland has become a competitor for attracting events of national and international interest, which infuses millions of dollars into the economy and shines a global spotlight on the city.

The list of the arena's credits include hosting the 2016 Republican National Convention, the second largest media event in the world; the 1997 NBA All Star Game, 2007, 2015 and 2016 NBA Finals, the 2007 NCAA Women's Final Four, the 2000 and 2009 United States Figure Skating Championships, the second and third rounds of the 2011 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championships, participating venue for the 2013 Senior Games, opening ceremony for the 2014 Gay Games, and the 2015 NCAA Men's

Twenty-three years later, the vision of what building a world-class arena in downtown Cleveland would mean to the city and the region has become a reality that keeps on giving. Quicken Loans Arena continues to serve its community.



2016-17 Cavaliers Fan Engagement Metrics

Taking Care of Business: The Cavs are proud to be selected by Sports Business Journal (SBJ) as one of five finalists for 2016 “Sports Team of the Year” as part of SBJ’s 10th annual Sports Business Awards. The four other teams selected as finalists this year are the Chicago Cubs, Golden State Warriors, Miami Dolphins and Toronto FC. The Cavs have been a finalist for this award three times over the past decade, which is tied for the most by any team.



On the BrinQ of History!: The Cavaliers continued to pack every game at Quicken Loans Arena to sold-out capacity (20,562) during the 2016-17 regular season with an average attendance of 20,562 fans (843,042 in total attendance in 41 home games), tied for the best attendance in franchise history. This season’s home attendance average ranks second in the NBA behind the Chicago Bulls, who have a larger arena capacity. To date, including regular season (422) and playoffs (55), there have been 476 sellouts at The Q and a franchise-record 143 consecutive sellouts dating back to the start of the 2014 season.

NBA’s Top Overall Draw: The Cavaliers were not only the hottest ticket in Cleveland this season – but across the entire NBA. On the road, the team was a major attraction with an average road attendance of 19,021 fans, ranking first in the league. The Cavaliers’ combined home and road average attendance of 19,791 fans during the 2016-17 season was second in the NBA, behind the Chicago Bulls (19,856) and second in franchise history, behind only the 2009-10 (19,881) season.

The Digital Age: The Cavaliers are committed to fan engagement across multiple digital platforms and continue to explore new ways to give an ever-growing digital audience exclusive access to the Wine & Gold both on and off the court. Here’s a look at the continued growth of Cavaliers digital:

- Cavs.com, the comprehensive team website for all things Cavaliers, continues to be one of the NBA’s most viewed sites. From July 2016 through March 2017, the team’s site had nearly 30 million page views and was visited over 11 million times by fans across the globe. The Cavs rank in the Top 5 in the NBA in both desktop and mobile page views, unique visitors, time spent and video starts.

Getting Social: The Cavaliers thriving social community ranks in the TOP 5 of the NBA in overall followers and TOP 3 in overall social engagement. The Cavs are approaching 17 million followers across Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Weibo, with the total follower base across accounts growing by nearly 4 million followers year-over-year. In addition, the official Cavs Mobile App has been downloaded nearly 500,000 times by users around the world.



As Seen on TV: The Cavaliers appeared on 39 nationally televised broadcasts this year, up seven from a year ago during the 2015-16 season. Cleveland appeared on ESPN and TNT 11 times, NBA TV ten times, and six times on ABC.



Broadcasting Bonanza: During the 2016-17 season, fans across the country were tuning into Cavs games at a record rate:

- Through 82 locally and nationally broadcast games on FOX Sports Ohio (FSO), TNT, ESPN, NBATV, WUAB and ABC this season, the Cavaliers have an overall local TV average rating of 8.6, equating to approximately 320,000 people watching each game locally.
- FOX Sports Ohio, the official TV home of the Cavaliers, carried the maximum amount (70) of Cavs games eligible for local broadcast during the 2016-17 regular season. The Cavs 70 games on FSO averaged a rating of 7.3.
- Serving the rapidly-growing Northeast Ohio Hispanic market, the Cavaliers broadcast all games in Spanish on 87.7 FM La Mega. Led by veteran broadcaster, Rafael Hernandez Brito, the Cavs are one of only six NBA teams to provide Spanish coverage of all home and road matchups live from the site of the game.



The World is Watching: Fans across the globe are tuning in to the Wine & Gold. Based on a geographical report spanning the entire season, 2016-17 Cavaliers games are broadcast in 192 countries (out of 196 countries in the world) and 13 territories throughout the world. On the web, 26 percent of traffic to Cavs.com comes from international users and 181 countries have had visitors on the team's site. Top countries (other than the United States) by visitors include: Philippines, Canada, Australia, Israel, United Kingdom, Brazil, Germany, France and Taiwan.



A Celebration of Cultures: The Cavaliers paid homage to both Hispanic and Chinese cultures with special themed nights during the 2016-17 regular season. The Cavaliers hosted its second annual Los Cavs Noche Latina on March 6th celebrating Hispanic culture with themed in-game entertainment, videos and more. On January 27th, the Cavs honored the "Year of the Rooster" during its Chinese New Year game that paid tribute to the NBA's largest international fan base.



Quicken Loans Arena and Cavaliers Technology and Features

HUMONGOTRON: The four-sided scoreboard is one of the largest center-hung screens in any arena in the country. It features enormous HD video displays that are tilted and uniquely curved to provide optimal viewing angles for all fans in the arena. (Two sideline screens measure 31.50' high x 56.69' wide and feature greater-than-HD video. The two high-resolution baseline screens measure 29.92' high x 33.07' wide)

In addition, the arena control system for the scoreboard and related LED displays allows for full integration of live video, team and player statistics, social media information, fan messages, closed captioning of arena announcements, and more.



LED DISPLAYS: The Q is illuminated with a grand total of more than 11,682 square feet of LED displays in the arena's seating bowl.

SOUND SYSTEM: The arena's sound system provides fans with cutting-edge clarity that replicates touring concert ability. The system features advanced audio digital processing, six line array speaker clusters and additional speakers under Humongotron.

3-D COURT PROJECTION: The team's award-winning game presentation features Quince Imaging's innovative projection image mapping technology. Using powerful media servers, the technology transforms the court into a giant three-dimensional video screen. The Cavs are one of few NBA teams to have this technology.



QUIET SPACE: In March 2017, Quicken Loans Arena teamed up with KultureCity to become the first NBA arena certified by KultureCity as Sensory Inclusive. KultureCity is a non-profit organization dedicated to rethinking accessibility to create acceptance and inclusion for all individuals. This new initiative promotes a positive and accommodating experience for all fans and guests with sensory sensitivities who attend Cavs games and other events at The Q. The certification process includes Cleveland Cavaliers and Quicken Loans Arena full and part-time team member sensory awareness training, and the implementation of enhanced services that features a new Quiet Space Sensory Room.



A NEW SOCIAL NETWORK: In March 2017, the Cavaliers launched the Wine & Gold Nation Community, a new online social network that gives legions of Cavs fans a personalized platform to engage with each other and the team like never before. Developed by the Cavs in partnership with Drund, a Youngstown, Ohio-based software company, the new community is equipped with all the modern social tools and more that fans have embraced from other established social platforms. The Wine & Gold Nation Community platform, leveraging the Drund software, is the first of its kind in professional sports.



VIRTUAL REALITY (VR): The Cavaliers are one of the few teams in the NBA to offer virtual reality videos that give fans an inside, fully immersive look at the team. When watching these videos on a mobile device via the Cavs App, either as a 360-degree video or enclosed in a VR headset, fans feel like they are in the environment they are viewing. With the technology, fans can pan and rotate their device or headset to view the panoramic videos from different angles and perspectives, simulating a real-life experience.

BEACON TECHNOLOGY: The Cavaliers feature Gimbal beacon technology, a location and proximity-based mobile engagement platform, inside The Q. The beacons provide fans with engaging messaging directly to their mobile devices as they travel throughout the arena. For example, beacons are located at every entrance of The Q to prompt fans to view an interactive “fan guide” on their mobile device as they enter the arena. The guide provides fans with helpful and interesting information for the game, including: contests and promotions to watch for during the event, articles related to the night’s matchup, a map of popular destinations inside The Q, and much more.



CAVS MOBILE APP: The Cavaliers teamed up with Yinzcam, an interactive technology company, to develop the dynamic Cavs mobile application. The app provides an immersive experience for fans, giving them unparalleled access to the Cavs, anywhere, anytime - all in the palm of their hand. The free official app is available for download via the Apple App Store and Google Play Store and is compatible on all Apple and Android smartphone and tablet devices. For fans in-arena who are connected to The Q's FREE Wi-Fi network, the Cavs app will showcase a multitude of captivating second-screen features, including:

- Live play-by-play coverage, enhanced game-tracking stats, extended box scores, in-game shot charts and heat maps for each team through the GameTracker feature
- Quick replays of all Cavalier possessions from multiple angles on the court
- Following the game, fans will have the opportunity to relive their game day experience with video highlights and postgame interviews.
- A portal that gives fans in Wine & Gold United, the team's official membership club, the ability to manage their membership, quickly connect with their designated rep and add to their in-arena member experience.



SOCIAL MEDIA ZONE: The main concourse of The Q is home to a state-of-the-art digital headquarters, aka the Social Media Zone, geared to provide a gathering space for fans to interact with the team and each other. The Social Zone features (1) 84" 4K touch-enabled digital display flanked on either side by (2) 46" portrait display touch-screens. The displays are ripe with social content captured from fans in the arena and around the world. The Cavs are the first team in the NBA to introduce user-generated social content to a physical in-arena digital centerpiece.

- Shot .714 from the free throw line
- Scored in double figures on six occasions
- Dished out at least three assists nine times, including a career-best four three times
- Swiped two or more steals four times, including a career-high three once (Feb. 25 versus Chicago)
- Made NBA debut on Oct. 29 against Orlando, scoring two points in five minutes of action
- Tallied a career-high 14 points on 4-8 (.500) shooting and a perfect 2-2 clip from deep, three rebounds, a career-high tying four assists and two steals in 23 minutes on Dec. 14 at Memphis
- Poured in 13 points on 5-6 (.833) shooting from the field, two assists and two steals in 19 minutes versus Charlotte on Dec. 31
- Drained a career-best six field goals to finish with 12 points and two assists in 22 minutes on Jan. 2 against New Orleans
- Led or tied for the team lead in assists two times, steals five times and blocks five times
- Missed one game on Oct. 25 due to the concussion protocol
- Was a DNP-CD 18 times and on the Inactive List 22 times
- Also appeared in 11 games (all starts) for the Canton Charge, the Cavaliers' exclusively owned and operated D-League team, where he averaged 29.9 points, 3.4 rebounds, 6.0 assists and 1.5 steals in 36.1 minutes; scored at least 25 points in all 11 contests
- Tallied a D-League career-high 41 points, going 11-20 (.550) from the field, 6-9 (.667) from downtown and a perfect 13-13 on free throws, five assists and a D-League career-best four steals on Mar. 4 versus Fort Wayne

SEASON IN REVIEW

CLEVELAND CAVALIERS 2016-17 SEASON NOTES

SEASON MARKS

The reigning NBA Champion Cleveland Cavaliers finished the 2016-17 season tied for the 2nd best record in the Eastern Conference at 51-31, which includes a 31-10 mark at Quicken Loans Arena (2nd best home mark in NBA).

- **50 WINS:** The Cavs won 50 games in a single season for the 10th time in team history (88-89, 91-92, 92-93, 05-06, 06-07, 08-09, 09-10, 14-15, 15-16 & 16-17).
- **PLAYOFF BOUND:** For the 3rd straight season, the Cavaliers are headed to postseason after clinching a spot in their 125-120 win over the Lakers on March 19.
- **CENTRAL CROWN:** Also for the 3rd straight season, the Cavaliers clinched the Central Division title after defeating Charlotte 112-105 on March 24. It marked the Cavs' 6th division crown in franchise history (75-76, 08-09, 09-10, 14-15, 15-16, 16-17).
- **ATLANTIC DOMINANCE:** The Cavaliers went 16-2 against the Atlantic Division this season (3-1 vs. TOR, 3-0 vs. PHI, 4-0 vs. NYK, 3-1 vs. BOS, 3-0 vs. BKN).
- **DOWN THE STRETCH:** When tied or leading after three quarters, the Cavs finished 46-5.

EXPLOSIVE OFFENSE

The Cavs averaged 110.3 points per game this past season (1st in the East, 4th-best in NBA). It was the FIRST TIME Cleveland has led the conference in scoring. They have scored at least 100 points in 62 of 82 games (including in 34 of 41 home contests) and at least 120 points on 24 occasions. They also shot at least .500 from the field on 30 occasions (27-3) and ranked 5th in the NBA in FG% (.470).

- **110+ & 120+ POINTS:** The Cavs went 39-8 this season when they reached at least 110 points and 21-3 when scoring 120 points (Cavs had nine 120-point games in 2015-16). In a Feb. 6 overtime win at Washington (140-135), Cleveland had a season-high 140 points, which was their most in a game since April 9, 1992 (141 points vs. CHA) and the franchise's most ever in a road game (prev. 137 on 2/28/84 at Kansas City Kings).
- **HOW ABOUT 130 POINTS?** Cleveland scored at least 130 points on 5 occasions this past season, which is a franchise record for a single season (prev. 4 times in 1979-80). They also had back-to-back games with 130-plus points for the first time in franchise history (132 at IND on Feb. 8 and 140 at WAS on Feb. 6) when they also became the 1st team in NBA history to win consecutive road games against teams that had a winning streak of 7 games or longer (WAS-7, IND-7). (Elias)
- **40 POINTS IN A QUARTER:** The Cavs scored at least 40 points in a quarter on 9 occasions in 2016-17. On Nov. 23 against Portland, Cleveland tied their franchise record for points in a quarter with 46 in the first.
- **HIGHEST SCORING MONTH EVER:** Cleveland finished 9-2 in February after averaging 117.4 points, which is the highest scoring month in Cavaliers history (no games minimum). The previous mark was 117.2 points (11 games) in October 1979. (Elias)

HIGH Q

Cleveland was tied for the 2nd-best home record in the NBA at 31-10 (.756) and averaged 112.7 points at The Q, which includes 13 contests with 120 points or more. Since March 25, 2014, Cleveland is 83-9 when scoring at least 100 points at The Q (29-5 this season). They have also won 48 straight home games when shooting at least .500 from the field (17-0 this season).

- **THE Q VS. THE WEST:** The Cavs finished 12-3 against the West at home this season. Going back to mid-January 2015, the Cavs have won 32 of their last 38 home games against the Western Conference.
- **128 POINTS IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES:** The Cavs had back-to-back games with at least 128 points on three occasions this season (Nov. 1-3, Nov. 23-25, Feb. 6-8), including twice at home (Nov. 1-3, Nov. 23-25). Prior to this season, Cleveland has never had consecutive games with at least 128 points. (Elias)
- **137 POINTS IN REGULATION AT THE Q:** The Cavs had a high scoring night at home against Portland on Nov. 23, scoring 137 points, the most any team has ever scored in regulation at The Q (prev. Golden State, 132 on 1/18/16). The last time Cleveland has reached that mark in a home game was 4/9/92 against Charlotte (141 points). The Cavs also scored 81 points in the first half, which were just two shy of the franchise record for any half (83 in 2nd H on 1/19/93 vs. Indiana).
- **50-40-90:** In a 128-90 home win over Dallas on Nov. 25, Cleveland shot over 50% from the field (.506), 40% from the three-point line (.465) and 90% from the foul line (.917). It marked just the fourth time since the 2000-01 season the Cavs have had a 50-40-90 game (4/5/16 vs. MIL, 3/13/07 vs. SAC, 12/11/01 vs. HOU). Cleveland also accomplished that feat in a Feb. 8 win at Indiana.
- **86.7% FROM THE FIELD IN A QUARTER:** In a 128-120 home win over Houston on Nov. 1, Cleveland scored 43 points in the fourth quarter, which was three points shy of their team record for points in a period (46, three occasions). In the final period, the Cavs shot 13-15 (.867) from the field, which was their highest field goal percentage in a quarter since Dec. 15, 1999, when they went 15-17 (.882) in the fourth at New Jersey. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **UNDEFEATED AT HOME ON XMAS:** By defeating Golden State on Christmas Day (109-108), the Cavaliers improved to 6-0 at home all-time on Christmas Day, which is the best home record of any NBA team on Christmas (Miami is 5-0).

SEEING STARS

Kyrie Irving (starter), LeBron James (starter) and Kevin Love (reserve) were selected to the Eastern Conference roster in the 2017 NBA All-Star Game. It marked the first time the Cavs had multiple starters in the event and the third time that three Cavs players were selected to an All-Star roster (Brad Daugherty, Larry Nance and Mark Price in 1989 and 1993). In the 192-182 win for the West this year, Irving (22 PTS, 14 ASTS, 7 REBS, 3 STLS) and James (23 PTS) had strong performances.

- **NO. 13 FOR LEBRON:** James was the top overall vote-getter in the conference among all three voting groups (fans, media, players) and had the most fan votes in the NBA (1,893,751). His 2017 All-Star appearance marked the 13th consecutive (all starts) for the two-time NBA All-Star Game MVP (2006 and 2008). He became the fifth player in league history to start at least 13 All-Star Games, joining Kobe Bryant (15), Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (13), Bob Cousy (13) and Michael Jordan (13). He also tied Bob Cousy for most consecutive All-Star starts in NBA history (13). In the 2017 All-Star Game, James finished with 23 points (10-17 FG) and three rebounds in 19 minutes, while also becoming the first NBA player to score 300 points in All-Star Game history with his 9th point of the night. In 13 All-Star appearances, James has averaged 24.2 points, 6.0 rebounds, 5.8 assists and 1.3 steals in 29.4 minutes while shooting .518 (129-249) from the floor. Among all-time leaders in All-Star Game history, he ranks first in points scored (314), first in field goals made (129), first in three-pointers made (31), fourth in scoring average (24.2, min. 2 games), sixth in assists (76) and tied for 12th in steals (17). He also has the most 20-point games in All-Star history with 10 (next closest is Oscar Robertson, eight).
- **NO. 4 FOR KYRIE:** It marked Irving's fourth All-Star selection (2013, 2014 and 2015) and second as a starter (2014). In the 2017 All-Star Game, Irving nearly had a triple-double after tallying 22 points, a 6-8 (.750) mark from beyond the arc, seven rebounds, a game-high 14 assists and three steals in 22 minutes. In his four All-Star outings, he has averaged 19.8 points on .653 (32-49) shooting from the field, a .538 (14-26) mark from beyond the arc, 5.3 rebounds and 9.3 assists (3rd-most all-time, min. 2 games) in 24.9 minutes. In addition to earning MVP honors in the 2014 NBA All-Star Game in New Orleans, Irving won the 2013 Foot Locker Three-Point Contest at All-Star Weekend in Houston and was named MVP of the 2012 BBVA Rising Stars Challenge at All-Star Weekend in Orlando. He also finished second in this year's JBL Three-Point Contest (Eric Gordon, first place).
- **NO. 4 FOR KEVIN:** Despite not playing due to injury, the 2017 All-Star selection was the fourth for Love, who was previously named as a reserve in 2011 and 2012 and as a starter in 2014.

HISTORICAL YEAR FROM LONG DISTANCE

Cleveland led the East in three-pointers made (1,067 3FG, 2nd in NBA), three-pointers made per game (13.0, 2nd in NBA) and three-point percentage (.384, 2nd in NBA). The Cavs hit at least 10 treys in 65 of 82 games and shot at least .400 from long distance 33 times (27-6).

- FRANCHISE-RECORD 1,067 3FGM:** The Cavs set a franchise single season record for three-pointers made with 1,067. They are the 3rd NBA team to ever hit 1,000 triples in a season. Cleveland also recorded franchise records for three-pointers per game (13.), number of games with at least 10 three-pointers (65), 15 three-pointers (27) and 20 three-pointers (4).
- 15 THREES:** The Cavs made at least 15 triples on 27 occasions this season (most in franchise history). Cleveland nailed 15 or more three-pointers in a franchise regular season record four straight contests from Feb. 1-8.
- NBA-RECORD 25 THREE-POINTERS:** The Cavs set an NBA regular season record for three-pointers in a single game, going 25-46 (.543) from deep in their 135-130 win at Atlanta on March 3. It marked the fourth time in team history the Cavs have connected on at least 20 three-pointers in a regular season game, all coming this season. Also in the win at Atlanta, six Cavs players made at least three triples, which had never happened in NBA history prior to that night. Cleveland also holds the all-time playoff record for threes in a game (also 25 vs. ATL on 5/4/16).
- FIRST NBA TEAM TO EVER RECORD BACK-TO-BACK GAMES WITH 20 TRIPLES:** The Cavs became the first team in NBA history to have consecutive regular season games with 20 three-pointers or more after knocking down a then franchise record 21 threes against Portland on Nov. 23 and 20 versus Dallas on Nov. 25. Cleveland is also the first team to accomplish this feat in the playoffs as well (2016 Semifinals versus Atlanta: 25 3FGM in Game 2 and 21 3FGM in Game 3).
- NBA-RECORD 16 THREES IN A HALF:** Cleveland set an NBA record for threes made in a half with 16 triples in the first half in a 137-125 win over Portland on Nov. 23 (later tied by Denver on 2/13/15 vs. GSW). The Cavs finished with a Quicken Loans Arena regular season record for three-pointers in a single game, knocking down 21-36 (.583) shots from deep.

TOP NOTCH TRIO

Kyrie Irving (25.2), LeBron James (26.4) and Kevin Love (19.0) averaged a combined 70.6 points per game. The Cavs were one of two teams in the NBA with three players averaging at least 19.0 points in 2016-17 (GSW). The three Cavs players scored at least 20 points apiece in the same game 16 times this season (13-3 record). Since the beginning of the 2014-15 season, the trio of Irving, James and Love have each scored 20 points or more in a regular season game 26 times (22-4 record).

- FRANCHISE-RECORD 101 POINTS (IRVING/JAMES/LOVE):** In a 125-120 road win over the Lakers on March 19, Kyrie Irving (46 pts, 15-21 FG, 6-10 3FG, 10-10 FT), LeBron James (34 pts, 13-22 FG, 6 reb, 7 asts) and Kevin Love (21 pts, 15 reb) combined for 101 points, which were the most combined points scored by any three players in Cavaliers history. The last NBA team to have three players score at least 101 points were the Chicago Bulls, who did it with four overtimes on Dec. 18, 2015 (Jimmy Butler-43, Derrick Rose-34, Pau Gasol-30).
- DUO EACH AVERAGES 25.0 PPG IN A SINGLE MONTH (IRVING/JAMES):** In February, Kyrie Irving (25.4 PPG) and LeBron James (25.9 PPG) each averaged at least 25.0 points per game. In January, Irving (25.5 PPG) and James (25.7) also put up 25.0-plus points per game. Prior to January 2017, no pair of Cavs teammates ever averaged 25.0 points or more in a single month in franchise history. The two players also did it in March and April. No pair of Cavs teammates had ever averaged 25.0 points each for an entire season, with Irving and James being the first to accomplish that feat. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- 20+ IN THREE STRAIGHT GAMES (IRVING/JAMES/LOVE):** Irving, James and Love each scored at least 20 points in three straight games from December 5-9. The last Cavs trio to have 20 points or more in three straight games were Austin Carr, John Johnson and Bingo Smith in games played in February 1972 (2/23/72 to 2/27/72). (Elias Sports Bureau)
- 30-POINT DOUBLE-DOUBLES (IRVING/LOVE):** According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Kyrie Irving (32 points, 12 assists) and Kevin Love (30 points, 15 rebounds) became just the fourth duo in Cavs history to post a double-double and score 30 or more points in the same game in a 124-118 win over Boston on Dec. 29. It also happened in 1971 (Walt Wesley and Butch Beard), 1980 in a quadruple-overtime game (Randy Smith and Dave Robisch) and 1991 (Brad Daugherty and Larry Nance).
- 15 ASSISTS & 15 REBOUNDS WITH 15 POINTS (JAMES/LOVE):** In a Jan. 13 win at Sacramento, Kevin Love (15 pts, 18 reb) and LeBron James (16 pts, 15 asts) became just the 3rd set of teammates in Cavaliers history in which one totaled at least 15 points and 15 rebounds while another registered 15 or more points and 15 or more assists: Tyrone Hill (16 pts, 15 reb)/Andre Miller (18 pts, 15 asts) in 2002 at CHI and Zydrunas Ilgauskas (28 pts, 18 reb)/Jeff McInnis (16 pts, 15 asts) vs. MIL in 2005. (Elias)
- ONE SCORES 40 POINTS, ANOTHER GETS A TRIPLE-DOUBLE (THREE TIMES):** The Cavs have had one player score 40-plus points and another record a triple-double in the same game on three occasions this season. In the Nov. 23 win over Portland, Love tallied 40 points and James posted a triple-double with 31 points, 10 rebounds and 13 assists. At New Orleans on Jan. 23, Irving finished with 49 points while James registered 26 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists. At Atlanta on April 9, Irving had 45 points and James tallied 32 points, 16 rebounds and 10 assists.
- 12 ASSISTS FOR TWO CAVS PLAYERS (IRVING/JAMES):** In the Feb. 1 win over Minnesota, the Cavs dished out a season-high 37 assists. Kyrie Irving (14) and LeBron James (12 assists) accounted for 26 dishes and became the first Cavs teammates with at least 12 assists apiece in a game since April 6, 2010 vs. Toronto (L. James-13, M. Williams-12).
- 35 POINTS & 8 ASSISTS APIECE (IRVING/JAMES):** According to the Elias Sports Bureau during a March 3 win at Atlanta, Irving (43 points, 9 assists) and James (38 points, 8 assists) became just the 3rd pair of NBA teammates to each score at least 35 points and hand out eight assists in a non-overtime game and both other instances occurred in the 1965-66 season. Wilt Chamberlain (39 points, 10 assists) and Hal Greer (38, 10) did it for Philadelphia in a game against Cincinnati; and Oscar Robertson (38, 12) and Jerry Lucas (35, 8) did it for Cincinnati against Detroit.

Kyrie Irving scored at least 20 points in 60 of his 72 games in 2016-17, which includes a career-high 21 consecutive games with 20+ points from Feb. 6-March 25. He also had 12 30-point games and four 40-point performances.

- CAREER BEST SEASON:** In 2016-17, Irving averaged a career-high 25.2 points (11th in NBA) on a career-high .471 shooting, 3.2 rebounds and 5.8 assists (22nd in NBA) in 35.1 minutes. He shot .401 from deep and a career-high .905 from the foul line (3rd in NBA) and had a career-high 8 double-doubles.
- BIG QUARTERS:** Irving scored at least 15 points in a single quarter on a team-high 11 occasions this season, which included a 20-point third quarter performance against Brooklyn on Jan. 27. He also scored 11 points in an OT win at WAS on Feb. 6.
- GOOD POINT:** In a win over Detroit on Nov. 18, Irving became the second NBA player since 1963 to post a stat line of 25+ points, 11+ assists, zero turnovers and a .733+ field goal percentage, joining John Stockton, who did so on Dec. 28, 1989 vs. Portland (33 pts/15 asts/0 TOs/.857 FG%).
- 8,000 POINTS AND 700 THREES:** At Denver on March 22, Irving reached his 8,000th career point and made his 700th career three-pointer, joining LeBron James and Mark Price as the only Cavs to ever record 8,000 points and 700 triples.
- A WONDERFUL CHRISTMAS:** In a win over Golden State on Christmas Day, Irving hit the game-winning shot with 3.4 seconds remaining and also became the first player in Cavaliers history to record at least 25 points, 10 assists and seven steals in a single game. Irving's career-high seven steals were also the most ever by any NBA player in a single game on Christmas Day. (Elias)
- 6+ STEALS IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES:** With six steals against Brooklyn on Dec. 23 and seven steals against Golden State on Dec. 25, Irving became the first Cavs player to swipe at least six steals in consecutive games since Fooths Walker in 1978 (11/24/78 and 11/28/78). (Elias Sports Bureau)
- 35 POINTS IN A HALF AND SEASON-HIGH 49 TOTAL:** Kyrie Irving tied the franchise record for points in a half (LeBron James, 35 in 1st H vs. NYK on 2/6/10) by putting up 35 points in the second half at New Orleans on Jan. 23. Irving finished the night with his 8th career 40-point game, tallying a season-high 49 points on 15-28 (.536) shooting, including a season-high 8-14 (.571) from beyond the arc and 11-11 mark from the foul line, four assists, two steals and a block in 42 minutes.

T-TOP

Tristan Thompson's consecutive games played streak ended at 447 games this season. The streak started on Feb. 10, 2012 and lasted through April 4, 2017. It remains the LONGEST STREAK IN FRANCHISE HISTORY.

- 10+ BOARDS:** Thompson pulled down 10 or more rebounds on 38 occasions and averaged 9.2 rebounds (15th best in NBA) to go with his 8.1 points (career-high .600 FG%) in 30.0 minutes in 2016-17. He also recorded 19 double-doubles (tied-23rd in NBA), one 20-rebound game (20 at NYK on 12/7/16) and one 20-10 game (season-high 22 points and 12 rebounds at WAS on 2/6/17) this season.
- DOING WORK:** His team-high 3.7 offensive rebounds per game ranked 6th in the NBA and he grabbed at least four offensive rebounds 39 times this season. Thompson also averaged 1.08 blocks, having swatted at least two shots on 21 occasions, including a career-high four blocks four times.

K-LOVE-ING IT

Kevin Love averaged 19.0 points and 11.1 rebounds (8th in NBA), including 8.6 defensive boards (10th in NBA), in 31.4 minutes per game this season. He had 41 double-doubles (tied-12th in NBA) and shot .373 from deep and .871 from the foul line (18th in NBA). Love won the Eastern Conference Player of the Week award for Nov. 21-27, his first time winning the award as a Cav (3rd of career).

- 19-10 CLUB:** Love was one of five NBA players averaging at least 19.0 points and 10.0 rebounds this season (A. Davis, R. Westbrook, K. Towns, D. Cousins), but the only Eastern Conference player with those numbers. Love had 21 20-10 games this season. He pulled down at least 10 rebounds on 42 occasions, including 15 boards or more 14 times.
- 20-POINT OUTINGS:** Love scored 20 or more points 27 times this season, including in a season-high 6 consecutive games from Dec. 5-17. He also had three 30-point games and one 40-point game in 2016-17.
- 6,000 BOARDS:** Kevin Love pulled down his 6,000th career rebound against Atlanta on Nov. 8, becoming just the 5th active player to record 6,000 boards and 700 three-pointers (LeBron James, Paul Pierce, Carmelo Anthony, Dirk Nowitzki).
- MOST EVER:** Love has an NBA-record 23 career games with at least 25 points, 15 rebounds and three three-pointers, including 4 times this season..
- FIRST CAV WITH 30 PTS, 15 REBS & 6 3FGM:** In a win over Boston on Dec. 29, Kevin Love became the first player in franchise history to record 30 points, 15 rebounds and six three-pointers in a single game.

ALL-TIME GREAT SHOOTER

Kyle Korver, who was acquired by the Cavs on January 7, is one of the top three-point shooters in NBA history. He is currently tied for 5th all-time in three-pointers made with 2,049 triples. This season, he shot .451 from deep (1st in NBA, 162-359 3FG). It was his fourth time leading the league in three-point percentage (2009-10, 2013-14 and 2014-15).

- **HOT IN CLEVELAND:** In 35 games with the Cavs, Korver shot .485 (97-200) from deep and averaged 10.7 points and 2.8 rebounds in 24.5 minutes. He scored 10-plus points on 19 occasions with Cleveland. Between the Cavs and Hawks, he made 121 three-pointers off the bench, which was tops in the Eastern Conference.
- **SIX THREES IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES:** Korver nailed six threes against Indiana on Feb. 15 and followed that up with six more triples versus New York on Feb. 23. It marked the first time in his career he had back-to-back games with at least six three-pointers. He is also the first player in Cavaliers history to make six or more three-pointers in consecutive games off the bench.
- **LIGHT IT UP:** In a win at Indiana on Feb. 8, Korver tied his career high with 8 three-pointers and finished with 29 points and five rebounds in 26 minutes off the bench. By going 8-9 (.889) from deep against the Pacers, Korver had the highest three-point percentage for any Cavs player ever with at least 8 made threes and tied the team's record for three-pointers off the bench (C.J. Miles-8 on 12/29/12). Korver's 29 points were also the most he's scored in a game since Feb. 21, 2007 (31 points vs. NYK).

KING OF THE COURT

In 2016-17, LeBron James averaged 26.4 points (8th in NBA) on .548 shooting from the field (10th in NBA), a .363 mark from beyond the arc, a career-high 8.6 rebounds (17th in NBA), a career-high 8.7 assists (6th in NBA) and 1.23 steals in 37.8 minutes. According to Elias, he is the FIRST player in NBA history to average at least 25.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 8.0 assists while shooting .540 or better from the field in a single season. James also had 42 double-doubles (11th in NBA), a career-best 13 triple-doubles (3rd in NBA) and an East-best plus/minus of +482 (7th in NBA).

- **PRODUCTIVITY:** LeBron James was the ONLY player in the NBA with at least 25.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 8.0 assists and a .500 FG%. James had at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists 55 times this season. He also shot over .500 from the field on 54 occasions.
- **DOUBLE-DIGIT STREAK:** LeBron James' double figure scoring streak reached 791, the second-longest in NBA history. James scored at least 10 points in all of his 74 appearances this past season, which includes 61 games of at least 20 points, 23 games of at least 30 points and 2 games of at least 40 points (41 vs. IND on 4/2 and 44 vs. CHA on 12/10).
- **10+ ASSISTS AND REBOUNDS:** LeBron James had at least 10 assists on 29 occasions this season, which is the most he has had in a single campaign (prev. 24 games in 2009-10). James had a career-high 17 assists on 2/6/17 at Washington. He also grabbed 10 or more rebounds in 26 games, including a season-high 17 boards against Miami on March 6.

- **WEEKLY AWARD WINNER:** LeBron James opened the 2016-17 season with back-to-back Eastern Conference Player of the Week awards and won the award 4 times this past season (weeks ending Oct. 30, Nov. 6, Dec. 11 and Feb. 12). James is the first player in Cavaliers history to win the award in the opening week of an NBA season, and his latest honor was his 57th Player of the Week award, the most since the award began in 1979.
- **34th POM:** LeBron James was named the Kia NBA Eastern Conference Player of the Month twice this past season, for games played in October/November and February. His latest honor marked the 22nd time a Cavs player has earned Player of the Month honors and James' 34th, the most in NBA history.
- **TOP 25 ALL-TIME IN POINTS & ASSISTS:** LeBron James is currently the ONLY player in NBA history to rank in the Top 10 in points and Top 15 in assists. James moved all the way up to 7th all-time in scoring and 12th all-time in assists.
 - **7TH IN SCORING:** James moved past Shaquille O'Neal (28,596) for 7th all-time in scoring with a free throw late in the fourth quarter at Chicago on March 30.
 - **8TH IN SCORING:** At Milwaukee on Dec. 20, James passed Moses Malone (27,409) for 8th place on the league's all-time scoring list with his first basket of the night.
 - **9TH IN SCORING:** On Dec. 9 against Miami, James moved past Elvin Hayes (27,313) for 9th place on the NBA's all-time scoring list.
 - **10TH IN SCORING:** James passed Hakeem Olajuwon (26,946) for 10th all-time in scoring with his first basket at Philadelphia on Nov. 5.

CAVALIERS KEY DATES

October 25 – The Cleveland Cavaliers open up the 2016-17 season in style with a 117-88 win over New York. Cleveland began the evening by receiving their championship rings and raising the 2016 NBA Champions banner to the rafters in a pregame ceremony. LeBron James posted his first triple-double of the season with 19 points, 14 assists and 11 rebounds in 32 minutes, becoming the first NBA player to post a triple-double in a season opener since 2006 (Jason Kidd).

October 28 – The Cavs record their first road victory of the season, winning 94-91 at Toronto. Kyrie Irving scored a team-high 26 points in 38 minutes, including the game winning three-pointer with 44 seconds left. Irving also moved passed Wesley Person (550) for the fourth most three-pointers in Cavaliers history. LeBron James passes Patrick Ewing (9,702) for 15th all-time in field goals made.

October 29 – In a 105-99 win over the Magic at The Q, LeBron James becomes the franchise all-time leader in defensive rebounds, surpassing Brad Daugherty (4,020). J.R. Smith moved into 16th place in three-pointers made all-time, passing Steve Nash (1,685).

October 31 – LeBron James is named Eastern Conference Player of the Week for games played Tuesday, October 25 through Sunday, October 30. He helped the Cavs to a perfect 3-0 mark, averaging 21.0 points, 8.3 rebounds and 10.0 assists in 36.7 minutes. He also becomes the first Cavalier to earn the award in the opening week of an NBA season.

November 1 – The Cavs shoot .867 (13-15) from the field in the fourth quarter and score 43 points to outlast the Rockets 128-122 at The Q and improve to 4-0. The .867 mark from the field in the final period is their highest franchise field goal percentage in a quarter since Dec. 15, 1999, when they went 15-17 (.882) in the fourth quarter at New Jersey. Kyrie Irving scored a game-high 32 points.

November 3 – Cleveland scores 128 points for the second straight game, topping Boston 128-122. Prior to the start of the season, the Cavaliers never had consecutive games with 128 points in team history.

November 5 – Against Philadelphia, Channing Frye drains the game winning three-pointer with 1:05 left to give the Cavs a 102-101 win over the 76ers and improve to 6-0. LeBron James passed Hakeem Olajuwon (26,946) for 10th place in NBA history in points scored with a layup at the 6:02 mark of the first period. The Cavs also had 40 fast break points in the win, setting a franchise record for the most fast break points in a game since the NBA began tracking the stat in 1996-97.

November 7 – For the second time in as many weeks, LeBron James is named Eastern Conference Player of the Week for games played Monday, October 31 through Sunday, November 6. He averaged a near triple-double of 24.7 points, 11.3 assists and 9.3 rebounds in 36.0 minutes to secure the award for the 55th time in his career.

November 8 – Against Atlanta, Kevin Love grabs the 6,000th rebound of his career.

November 10 – The Cavs are honored for their 2016 NBA Championship by President Barack Obama during a ceremony at the White House.

November 11 – In Cleveland's 105-94 win over Washington, LeBron James becomes the youngest player in NBA history to reach 27,000 career points (31 years and 317 days).

November 13 – Channing Frye scores 11 of his 20 points in the fourth quarter, connecting on a season-high six three-pointers, to lead the Cavs past the Hornets 100-93. Cleveland limits Charlotte to .379 (36-95) shooting, including a .326 (14-43) mark in the second half. The Cavs also hit 14 three-pointers in the victory, setting the NBA record for consecutive games with 10 or more made trifectas to start a season to nine (prev. record was held by Houston, first eight games in 2014-15).

November 15 – The Cavs improve to 9-1 on the season with a 121-117 win over the Raptors, tying the best 10-game start in franchise history.

November 18 – Cleveland limits Detroit to just .312 (29-93) shooting from the field in a 104-81 win at The Q. Kyrie Irving records his first double-double of the season with 25 points on 11-15 (.733) shooting, a game-high 11 assists and zero turnovers in 29 minutes. He became the second NBA player since 1963 to post a stat line with 25 points, 11 assists, zero turnovers and a .733 field goal percentage (John Stockton, 12/28/89).

November 23 – Kevin Love scores a franchise-record 34 points in the first quarter, leading the Cavs to a 137-125 win over the Trail Blazers. Love's first quarter outburst was the most points scored in the first quarter in NBA history and second most in a single quarter all-time (Klay Thompson, 37). Love goes on to finish with a Cavalier career-high 40 points in 32 minutes. The Cavs also set a then franchise regular season-high with 21 three-pointers made in the victory.

LeBron James moves past Guy Rodgers (6,917) for 17th all-time in career assists.

November 25 – Cleveland sets a franchise best start through 14 games (12-2) with a 128-90 win over Dallas at The Q. The Cavs knocked down 20 threes, becoming the first team in NBA history to make 20 or more three-pointers in back-to-back games. In the 1,000th game of his career, LeBron James records his eighth double-double of the season with 19 points and a game-high 11 assists in 29 minutes.

November 28 – Kevin Love is named Eastern Conference Player of the Week for games played Monday, November 21, through Sunday, November 27. Love averaged 30.7 points, 9.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 1.3 steals in 29.3 minutes of action, leading Cleveland to a 3-0 mark during the week.

December 1 – For the second time in his career, LeBron James is selected as Sportsperson of the Year by Sports Illustrated, after leading the Cavs to their first title in franchise history and breaking Cleveland's 52-year title drought.

Later that day, James is also named Kia NBA Eastern Conference Player of the Month for games played in October and November. In the 15 contests he appeared in, James averaged 23.5 points, 8.1 rebounds and 9.3 assists in 35.9 minutes as the Cavs posted a 13-2 mark.

With his first assist of the night against the Clippers, James moves into 16th place on the NBA's all-time assists list, passing Bob Cousy (6,955).

December 2 – Head Coach Tyronn Lue is named NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for games played in October and November for the first time in his career. The Cavs averaged an Eastern Conference leading 111.3 points during that stretch, posting a conference-best 13-3 (.813) record.

With his third made three-pointer at Chicago, Kevin Love passes Damon Jones (344) for 10th place in three-pointers made in Cavs history.

December 5 – LeBron James tallies 34 points, eight rebounds and a team-high tying seven assists in 42 minutes, leading Cleveland to a 116-112 win at Toronto. James also records his 5,000th career assist as a Cavalier.

December 7 – In a 126-94 win at New York, the Cavs make 22 three-pointers to break their previous franchise mark of 21 set earlier in the season on 11/23 against Portland. Tristan Thompson pulls down a season-high 20 rebounds.

December 9 – For the third straight game, Kyrie Irving, LeBron James and Kevin Love all score at least 20 points. In the win over Miami, Love finishes with game highs of 28 points and 15 rebounds in 31 minutes. James adds 27 points and Irving finishes with 23 points. The trio becomes the first group of Cavaliers to score 20 points or more in three consecutive games since Austin Carr, John Johnson and Bingo Smith, who did so in games played from 2/23/72 to 2/27/72 (Elias Sports Bureau).

James moves into ninth place on the NBA's all-time scoring list, passing Elvin Hayes (27,313) with a layup at the 6:57 mark of the third quarter.

December 10 – In a 116-105 victory over Charlotte at The Q, LeBron James tallies in a season-high 44 points on 17-24 (.708) shooting, nine rebounds, 10 assists and a game-high tying three steals in 42 minutes. James becomes the first NBA player to post a stat line of at least 44 points, nine rebounds, 10 assists and a .700 field goal percentage since Wilt Chamberlin on 3/18/68 (53 pts, 32 reb, 14 asts, .828).

Kyrie Irving drains his 600th career three-pointer and LeBron James dishes out his 7,000th career assist.

December 12 – For the third time in the 2016-17 season, LeBron James is named the Eastern Conference Player of the Week for games played Monday, December 5, through Sunday, December 11. James led the Cavs an Eastern Conference best 4-0 record on the week, averaging a NBA high 32.5 points, 7.8 rebounds, 8.0 assists and 2.3 steals in 38.5 minutes.

December 13 – Kevin Love notches his 15th double-double of the season with game highs of 29 points and 13 rebounds in 35 minutes in a 103-86 win over the Grizzlies. He also drained the 800th three-pointer of his career, with his first trifecta at the 2:23 mark of the first quarter. J.R. Smith adds a season-high 23 points.

December 17 – Kevin Love scores a team-high 27 points and pulls down a season-high 17 rebounds in 33 minutes to lead Cleveland past the Lakers 119-108. J.R. Smith moves past Craig Ehlo (381) for eighth place on the Cavs' all-time three-point list.

December 20 – In a Cavs' 114-108 overtime win at Milwaukee, LeBron James moves into eighth place on the all-time scoring list, passing Moses Malone (27,409) with his first basket of the night.

December 21 – Kyrie Irving scores a game-high 31 points and adds a game-high 13 assists in 35 minutes, leading the Cavs past the Bucks 113-102 at The Q. Irving also becomes just the ninth player in franchise history to reach 7,000 career points.

December 23 – Tristan Thompson (16 pts, 11 reb), Kevin Love (14 pts, 15 reb) and Kyrie Irving (13 pts, 10 ast) all record double-doubles in a 119-99 win over Brooklyn at The Q. In all, a season-high seven players (James-19, Thompson-16, Dunleavy-14, Love-14, Irving-13, Frye-12, Felder-11) reach double figures for Cleveland.

December 25 – Cleveland erases a 14-point fourth quarter deficit and Kyrie Irving hits a fadeaway jumper with three seconds left to lead the Cavs past the Warriors 109-108. Irving finishes the game with his third straight double-double, tallying 25 points (14 in 4th Q), six rebounds, a game-high 10 assists and a career-high seven steals in 44 minutes. He also becomes the first player in Cavs history to record at least 25 points, 10 assists and seven steals in a game and also the first Cavs player to post six steals or more in back-to-back games since Fooths Walker on 11/24/78 and 11/28/78

With a free throw in the first quarter, Kevin Love records his 10,000th career point.

December 26 – Tristan Thompson appears in his 400th consecutive game, becoming the first player to do so in franchise history.

December 29 – Cleveland wins their eighth consecutive home game, with a 124-118 victory over the Celtics. Kyrie Irving posts his fifth double-double in seven games with a game-high 32 points on 12-17 (.706) shooting, five rebounds, a game-high 12 assists and a team-high three steals in 42 minutes. LeBron James adds 23 points, eight rebounds, 11 assists and a team-high three blocks in 44 minutes. It was the first time since 1/27/09 vs. Sacramento that two Cavs players had 20 points, 10 assists and five rebounds in a game (Mo Williams and LeBron James)

January 2 – The Cavs hold New Orleans to 13 points on .200 (4-20) shooting in the fourth quarter in a 90-82 victory. LeBron James finishes with 26 points, seven rebounds, a team-high six assists and two steals in 39 minutes and also passes Dominique Wilkins (9,963) for 14th on the NBA's all-time made field goals list. Richard Jefferson posts his first double-double as a Cavalier with 12 points and a team-high 12 rebounds in 29 minutes off the bench.

January 4 – LeBron James appears in his 724th career game as a Cavalier, moving past Danny Ferry (723) for sole possession of second place in games played.

January 6 – LeBron James and Kyrie Irving score 36 and 32 points respectively to lead the Cavs past the Nets in Brooklyn 116-108. Kevin Love moves past J.R. Smith (385) for eighth place in franchise history in three-pointers made with his third trey of the game.

Cleveland acquires their own 2018 first round draft pick from Portland in exchange for the Cavaliers' 2017 first round draft pick.

January 7 – The Cavs acquire Kyle Korver from the Atlanta Hawks in exchange for Mike Dunleavy, Mo Williams, cash considerations and a protected first round draft pick.

January 8 – With his second field goal of the game, LeBron James becomes just the 14th player in NBA history to reach 10,000 career made field goals, leading the Cavs to a 120-116 victory over the Suns. Tristan Thompson registers the 4,000th point of his career.

January 11 – At Portland, LeBron James moves into 15th place on the all-time assists list, passing Tim Hardaway (7,095) with his second assist of the game.

January 16 – With his first rejection of the night against Golden State, Tristan Thompson moves past Mark West (325) for 10th place in franchise history in blocks. Kyle Korver also appears in his 1,000th career game.

January 19 – In a 118-103 win over the Suns at The Q, Channing Frye posts his first double-double as a Cavalier with 18 points and 10 boards in 30 minutes off the bench.

Kyrie Irving passes Larry Nance (7,257) for 8th place in franchise history for points scored with a three in the third quarter.

LeBron James and Irving are announced as starters for the 2017 NBA All-Star Game. James will make his 13th appearance (all starts) in the game and Irving's fourth selection and second start. It marks the eighth time that at least two Cavaliers have been selected to the All-Star roster (1972, 1989, 1992, 1993, 2005, 2009 and 2015).

January 21 – Against San Antonio, Tristan Thompson passes Jim Brewer (2,259) for 8th place in franchise history in defensive rebounds with his sixth defensive board.

January 23 – Kyrie Irving scores a season-high 49 points on 15-28 (.536) shooting from the field and 8-14 (.571) from downtown, to go along with four rebounds and two steals in 42 minutes against New Orleans. In the second half, Irving pours in a franchise record tying 35 points, including 19 in the third quarter. LeBron James adds his fourth triple-double of the season with 26 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists in 44 minutes.

January 25 – LeBron James posts his second straight triple-double with a team-high 24 points, a game-high 13 rebounds, 11 assists and two steals in 45 minutes versus Sacramento. It's the first time James has recorded back-to-back triple-doubles since March 2009, when he had three in a row (3/7/09 – 3/12/09).

January 26 – Kevin Love is selected as a reserve for the 2017 NBA All-Star Game, marking his fourth appearance in the game. Love joins teammates Kyrie Irving and LeBron James as representatives from the Cavaliers, marking the third time in franchise history the Cavs have had three players in the game (Brad Daugherty, Larry Nance and Mark Price in 1989 and 1993).

January 27 – Three players record double-doubles (James – 31 pts, 11 ast; Love – 13 pts, 14 reb; Thompson – 10 pts, 10 reb) as the Cavs best the Nets 124-116 at The Q. LeBron James also passes Terry Porter (7,160) for 14th place on the all-time assists list with his first helper of the night. Kyrie Irving adds 28 points in 31 minutes, including a season-high 20-point scoring outburst in the third quarter.

January 29 – LeBron James becomes the first player in Cavalier history to reach 20,000 points as the Cavs top the Thunder 107-91. James scored his milestone point in the second quarter and finished with 25 points, a game-high 14 rebounds and eight assists in 37 minutes. Tristan Thompson adds 19 points, 12 rebounds (six offensive), a career-high four steals and a career-high tying four blocks in 34 minutes, becoming the first player in team history to score at least 19 points, pull down 12 or more rebounds, record at least four steals and block four or more shots in a game.

February 1 – The Cavs limit the Timberwolves to an opponent season-low 37 points in the second half in a 125-97 victory at The Q. Kyrie Irving scores 14 points and adds a career-high 14 assists (career-best eight in the first quarter) in 31 minutes, for his career-high eighth double-double of the season. LeBron James adds a game-high 27 points on 11-14 (.786) shooting, eight rebounds and 12 assists in 34 minutes, while Tristan Thompson pours in 18 points and pulls down 14 rebounds (eight offensive) in 39 minutes. Kyle Korver chips in with 20 points off the bench.

February 4 – LeBron James becomes the youngest player in NBA history to reach 28,000 career points in 111-104 Cavalier victory at New York. He finishes the contest with a game-high 32 points on 12-20 (.600) shooting, a game-high tying 10 assists and five rebounds in 40 minutes. Kevin Love added his 29th double-double of the season with 23 points and a game-high 16 rebounds (five offensive) in 35 minutes.

February 6 – The Cavs best the Wizards 140-135 in an overtime thriller in Washington. The 140 points for the Wine and Gold is a franchise record for points scored in a road game. Kyrie Irving drains the game-winning three with 35 seconds left in OT and finishes with 23 points, including 11 in overtime, and five assists in 44 minutes. LeBron James posts his 24th double-double with 32 points on 12-18 (.667) shooting and a 6-8 (.750) clip from deep, a career-high 17 assists, two steals and two blocks in 42 minutes. Kevin Love tallied 39 points, six treys, a perfect 11-11 clip from the free throw line, and 12 rebounds in 41 minutes. Tristan Thompson added a season-high 22 points on 10-13 (.769) shooting and 12 rebounds in 41 minutes.

James passes Lenny Wilkens (7,211) for 13th place on the all-time assists list with his second helper of the game.

February 8 – Kyle Korver scores his most points as a Cavalier with 29, draining a career-high tying eight three pointers to lead Cleveland past the Pacers 132-117. He also passes Jason Kidd (1,988) for 7th place all-time in three-pointers made. The Cavs overcame a 15-point (largest of season) first quarter deficit, outscoring Indiana 75-54 in the second half, including a 40-18 edge in the third quarter.

February 9 – The Cavaliers sign Derrick Williams to a 10-day contract.

February 11 – LeBron James passes Brad Daugherty (5,227) for second place in franchise history in rebounds as the Cavs top the Nuggets 125-109 at The Q.

February 13 – For the 4th time of the season and record 57th time in his career, LeBron James is named the NBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Week for games played Monday, February 6, through Sunday, February 12. In four games, James led the Cavaliers to a 3-1 record after averaging 25.5 points on .580 (40-69) shooting, including a .600 (9-15) clip on three-pointers, 5.8 rebounds, 11.3 assists, 1.8 steals and 1.3 blocks in 38.5 minutes.

The Cavs trade Chris Andersen and cash to Charlotte for a protected second round pick.

February 14 – Channing Frye posts his second double-double as a member of the Cavaliers with 21 points and 10 rebounds in 33 minutes as the Cavs post a 116-108 win at Minnesota. LeBron James tallies his 26th double-double of the season with a team-high tying 25 points on 10-14 (.714) shooting, eight rebounds and 14 assists in 40 minutes. Kyrie Irving also scores 25 points in 37 minutes and Derrick Williams adds 13 points on 5-7 (.714) shooting in 23 minutes off the bench.

February 15 – Cleveland closes out the first half of the season with a 113-104 win over the Pacers at The Q. LeBron James tallies a game-high 31 points on 12-17 (.706) shooting from the field in 33 minutes. Kyle Korver adds 22 points in 25 minutes and becomes the 7th player in NBA history to reach 2,000 career three-pointers.

February 19 – Kyrie Irving and LeBron James each start for the Eastern Conference in the 2017 NBA All-Star game. Irving tallies 22 points on 8-12 (.667) shooting and a 6-8 (.750) clip from deep, a team-high seven rebounds, a game-high 14 assists and a team-best three steals in 22 minutes. James adds 23 points and three rebounds in 19 minutes, while tying Bob Cousy for the most consecutive All-Star starts in NBA history (13).

February 22 – The Cavs resign Derrick Williams to a second 10-day contract.

February 23 – For the second time on the season, seven players score in double figures (Irving-23, Korver-20, James-18, Frye-14, Jefferson-14, Thompson-10, Williams-10) as the Cavs complete their second straight season sweep of the Knicks with a 119-104 victory at The Q. Kyle Korver drains six threes and finishes with 20 points in 31 minutes off the bench, while becoming the first player in franchise history to make six three-pointers in back-to-back games off the bench. LeBron James finishes with his sixth triple-double of the season with 18 points, 13 rebounds, 15 assists and a season-high tying three blocks in 37 minutes.

February 27 – Kyrie Irving becomes the 8th player in franchise history to record 2,000 career assists as the Cavs defeat the Bucks 102-95 at The Q. Irving finishes with 25 points and a game-high nine assists in 37 minutes. Derrick Williams scores his most points (14) and pulls down his most rebounds (7) as a member of the Cavaliers.

The Cavs sign Deron Williams.

March 1 – Against Boston, LeBron James tallies his career-high tying seventh triple-double of the season with 28 points, 13 rebounds and 10 assists in 40 minutes.

The Cavs waive Jordan McRae.

March 2 – LeBron James is named KIA NBA Eastern Conference Player of the Month for games played in February 2017 for the second time on the season and NBA record 34th time of his career. He led the Cavs to a 9-2 record, which was the best record in the league. In 10 games, he averaged 25.6 points, 7.2 rebounds and 10.6 assists in 37.5 minutes, while posting seven double-doubles and one triple-double.

Cleveland signs Andrew Bogut.

March 3 – The Cavs set a NBA regular season record with 25 three-pointers in a 135-130 victory over the Hawks in Atlanta. Six Cavalier players nailed at least three treys, which is the first time the feat has been accomplished in NBA history. Kyrie Irving poured in 43 points and nine assists in 36 minutes, while LeBron James notched 38 points, a game-high 13 rebounds and eight assists in 39 minutes.

March 4 – The Cavs sign Derrick Williams for the remainder of the season.

March 9 – LeBron James posts his career-high eighth triple double of the season and 50th of his career with 29 points, 14 rebounds and 10 assists in 39 minutes against the Pistons.

March 11 – At Orlando, LeBron James tallies his 2nd straight triple-double (9th of season) with 24 points, 12 rebounds and a game-high 12 assists in 37 minutes as Cleveland tops the Magic 116-104. Kyrie Irving adds 22 points, nine rebounds and seven assists in 36 minutes and moves past Brad Daugherty (2,028) for sixth place in franchise history in assists. For the third time on the season, seven players reach double figures for the Wine and Gold (James-24, Irving-22, Shumpert-15, Thompson-14, Frye-12, Smith-11, Deron Williams-10).

March 12 – With his second block of the contest against the Rockets, Tristan Thompson moves into ninth place in franchise history for blocks, passing Jim Brewer (353).

March 13 – The Cavaliers sign Larry Sanders and waive Andrew Bogut.

March 14 – In a 128-96 win over Detroit at The Q, the Cavs shot a season-high .597 (46-77) from the field and a season best .633 (19-30) mark on three-pointers. Cleveland made 23 of their first 26 field goals attempts and also drained their first 10 three-pointers in the win. Iman Shumpert poured in a season-high 18 points, Richard Jefferson tied his season-high with 16 points and Deron Williams added 13.

March 16 – LeBron James scores or assists on 20 of the Cavs' 24 points in the fourth quarter, leading Cleveland to a 91-83 victory over the Jazz at The Q. James finishes with 33 points (17 in 4th Q.) on 13-20 (.650) shooting, a team-high 10 rebounds and six assists in 38 minutes. The Cavaliers also break a franchise single season record in three-pointers made, draining their 881st trifecta of the season in the first quarter.

March 19 – Cleveland clinches a playoff spot for the third straight season after a 125-120 win over the Lakers in Los Angeles. Kyrie Irving paces Cleveland with a game high 46 points, going 15-21 (.714) from the field, 6-10 (.600) from deep and a perfect 10-10 from the charity stripe in 38 minutes. The trio of Irving, LeBron James (34 pts) and Kevin Love (21 pts) combine for 101 points, which is the most by any Cavs trio in a single game in franchise history.

March 22 – At Denver, Kyrie Irving becomes the 8th player in franchise history to reach the 8,000-point mark. He also drains the 700th three-pointer of his career and extends his streak of games with at least 20 points to a career-high 19 after tallying 33 points.

March 24 – The Cavaliers clinch their third straight Central Division title with a 112-105 victory over Charlotte. LeBron James tallies his career-high tying 36th double-double of the season with a game-high 32 points, nine rebounds and 11 assists in 40 minutes.

March 25 – With his 7th assist of the night against Washington, LeBron James passes Maurice Cheeks (7,392) for 12th place on the NBA's all-time assists list. Cleveland also hits its 934th three-pointer of the season, moving past the 2013-14 Houston Rockets (933) for the third most made threes in NBA single season history.

Kyrie Irving scores at least 20 points for the 21st consecutive game with 23 points.

March 30 – With a free throw in the fourth quarter against Chicago, LeBron James passes Shaquille O'Neal (28,596) for 7th place on the NBA's all-time scoring list. Iman Shumpert also connects on the 1,000th field goal of his career.

April 2 – Cleveland outlasts the Pacers 135-130 in a double overtime thriller at The Q. LeBron James records his career-high 11th triple double of the season with 41 points, a game-high 14 rebounds, a game-high tying 11 assists, two steals and a block in 52 minutes. The Cavs score over 130 points for a franchise record 5th time on the season.

J.R. Smith passes Mo Williams (414) for 8th place in franchise history for made threes. Smith also passes Peja Stojakovic (1760) for 15th all-time in three-pointers in league history.

April 4 – For the 3rd time on the season, LeBron James posts back-to-back triple-doubles as the Cavaliers top Orlando 122-102 at The Q. James finishes with 18 points, a game-high tying 11 rebounds and 11 assists in 37 minutes. James also scored in double figures for the 788th straight game, passing Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (787) for the 2nd longest streak in NBA history.

Cleveland becomes just the 3rd team in NBA history to hit 1,000 three-pointers in a season.

April 5 – All five started reach double figures as Cleveland defeats the Celtics in Boston 114-91. LeBron James leads the way with his team-high 41st double-double of the season with a game-high 36 points on 14-22 (.636) shooting, 10 rebounds and a game-high tying six assists in 39 minutes.

April 9 – LeBron James tallies career-best 13th triple-double of the season with 32 points, a game-high 16 rebound and a game-high 10 assists in 47 minutes against the Hawks. Kyrie Irving adds a game-high 45 points, including an 8-12 (.667) mark from deep and nine assists in 45 minutes. Irving becomes just the 7th player in franchise history to record 3,000 made field goals.

The Cavs waive DeAndre Liggins.

April 10 – At Miami, Deron Williams tallies a season-high 35 points, seven rebounds and a game-high tying nine assists (all Cavalier career-bests) in 46 minutes. Kevin Love adds his 41st double-double of the season with 25 points and a team-high 10 rebounds in 36 minutes.

April 12 – Cleveland waives Larry Sanders and signs Dahntay Jones and Walter 'Edy' Tavares.

The Cavaliers play the Toronto Raptors in their season finale and finish with a 51-31 record, including a 31-10 mark at The Q. Their home record was tied for the second-best in the entire NBA. In his first game as a Cavalier, Edy Tavares tallied six points, 10 rebounds and six blocks in just 24 minutes off the bench (all in the second half). He tied the Quicken Loans Arena record for blocks in a half (6 blocks in a half on four occasions, most recently by Philadelphia's Theo Ratliff on Dec. 2, 2000 in first half) and had the most blocks in a game by a Cavs player Zydrunas Ilgauskas on Nov. 16, 2017 (7 blocks vs. Utah).

2016 PLAYOFFS RECAP

HOW IT ALL STARTED:

Cleveland opened up their 20th playoff appearance on April 17, 2016 against Detroit. The Cavs swept the Pistons, 4-0, in the First Round to advance to the Eastern Conference Semifinals for the 10th time in franchise history. They followed that up with a 4-0 sweep over Atlanta to get to the Eastern Conference Finals for the 6th time ever. The Cavs defeated Toronto, 4-2, to make it to the NBA Finals for the second year in a row and third time in team history (2007, 2015, 2016). **THE CAVS DEFEATED GOLDEN STATE 4-3 FOR THEIR FIRST EVER NBA TITLE**, improving to 100-89 all-time in the postseason (16-5 in 2016), including 63-31 at home.

2016 NBA CHAMPIONS:

The Cavaliers won their **first ever NBA championship** after defeating the Golden State Warriors, 4-3. Below are a few notes on their Finals win:

- **DROUGHT IS OVER:** The Cavs' 1st championship in franchise history ended a 52-year drought by major pro sports teams from Cleveland (Dec. 27, 1964-Browns).
- **ROAD WIN IN GAME 7:** Cleveland became just the 4th team to win an NBA Finals Game 7 on the road (4-15) and the first since Washington Bullets beat the Seattle SuperSonics in 1978. The Cavs also clinched each of their four playoff series in 2016 on the road, becoming just the 3rd team to do so since the current playoff format began in 1984, joining San Antonio (1999) and Detroit (1989).
- **DOWN 3-1:** Cleveland became the **first team to overcome a 3-1 deficit in the Finals**. Each of the 32 previous teams to trail 3-1 lost in the Finals. Overall, the Cavs are the 11th team to climb back and win after trailing any playoff series 3-1.
- **FORCING A FINALS GAME 7:** The Cavs were just the 3rd team in NBA history to force a Finals Game 7 after trailing 3-1 (1951 New York Knicks and 1966 Los Angeles Lakers).
- **100TH PLAYOFF WIN IN GAME 7:** Cleveland's 93-89 victory in Game 7 of the Finals was also the **100th playoff victory in team history (100-89)**.
- **5TH GAME 7 IN CAVS HISTORY:** It was Cleveland's first ever NBA Finals Game 7 and their fifth overall Game 7 in franchise postseason history: 1976 Semifinals vs. Washington (4-3), 1992 Semifinals vs. Boston (4-3), 2006 Semifinals vs. Detroit (3-4) and 2008 Semifinals vs. Boston (3-4).
- **WON 4 OF LAST 5 VS. GSW:** The Cavaliers **won 4 of the final 5 games against the Warriors (including last 3)**, outscoring them by an average of 10.4 points (107.4-97.0) per contest during that span.
- **2016 NBA FINALS MVP:** LeBron James won his 3rd Finals MVP after averaging 29.7 points (208), 11.3 rebounds (79), 8.9 assists (62), 2.57 steals (18) and 2.29 blocks (16). He became the **first player in NBA history to lead all players in all five categories for an entire playoff series**. No other player in NBA history has also ever produced 208 points, 79 rebounds and 62 assists in one NBA Finals series.
- **CLEVELAND'S DYNAMIC DUO:** LeBron James averaged 29.7 points per game in this year's NBA Finals and Kyrie Irving scored an average of 27.1 points, becoming just the 4th set of teammates to each average at least 27.0 points in the Finals. The only other pairs of teammates who each averaged more than 27 points per game in an NBA Finals series were Elgin Baylor and Jerry West, who did it for the Lakers in both 1962 (40.6 and 31.1, respectively) and 1963 (33.8 and 29.5, respectively), and Cliff Hagan (29.4) and Bob Pettit (28.4) for the St. Louis Hawks in 1961. (Elias)
 - **25.0 PPG FOR ENTIRE POSTSEASON:** Irving (25.2 ppg) and James (26.3 ppg) also became the **5th teammates to average 25.0+ points in a single postseason**: Kevin Durant/Russell Westbrook (2014, 2016), Kobe Bryant/Shaquille O'Neal (2001-2003), Charles Barkley/Kevin Johnson (1994) and Elgin Baylor/Jerry West (1962-63, 1966, 1968). (ESPN)
 - **40 POINTS APIECE:** In a 112-97 win over Golden State in Game 5 of the NBA Finals on June 13, LeBron James (41 pts, 16-30 FG, 4-8 3FG, 16 reb, 7 asts, 3 stls, 3 blks) and Kyrie Irving (41 pts, 17-24 FG, 5-7 3FG, 6 asts) became the **first teammates in NBA Finals history to score 40 points apiece** and the **5th set of teammates to do so in any playoff game**. James and Irving scored or assisted on 97 points, matching the scoring output of the Warriors as a team. The Cavs' final 25 made FG were either scored or assisted by James or Irving.
 - **FIRST CAVS TEAMMATES WITH 30+ AND 40+ POINTS IN PLAYOFFS:** Before they each topped 40 points in Game 5 of the NBA Finals, Kyrie Irving (30 points) and LeBron James (32 points) became the **first pair of Cavalier teammates to score 30 points each in a Finals game** after doing so in Game 3 vs. Golden State on June 8. J.R. Smith added 20 points that night, also marking the **first time three Cavs players scored 20 points apiece in a Finals game**.

- **UNDERDOG WINS THE TITLE:** The Cavaliers (57-25) won 16 fewer games than the Warriors (73-9) did during the regular season. The team with the better regular-season record won each of the ten previous NBA Finals in which one team produced at least 13 more regular-season wins than its opponent. **Before this year, the only NBA Finals series won by a team that had at least 12 fewer regular-season wins than its opponent was in 1975**, when Golden State (48-34) swept Washington (60-22), four games to none. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **MIDSEASON MOVE:** Tyronn Lue became the **3rd coach to win NBA title after taking over a team mid-season**; The others are Pat Riley (2006 and 1982) and Paul Westhead (1980) (ESPN Stats & Info)
 - **LUE AND JEFFERSON ARE FIRST SINCE RILEY AND ABDUL-JABBAR:** Tyronn Lue was a teammate of Richard Jefferson with the Bucks in 2008-09. Lue is the first head coach to win an NBA title with a former teammate on his championship roster since Pat Riley won four titles for the Lakers with Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (1982, 1985, 1987, and 1988). Riley and Abdul-Jabbar were teammates with the Lakers in 1975-76. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **DEFENSE VS. GSW:** Defensively, Cleveland held Golden State to .431 shooting from the field, including just .395 over the last five Finals games (4-1).
 - **LAST 3 GAMES:** The Cavs limited the Warriors to a combined .383 shooting from the field in the last three games (all wins).
 - **GAME 6 FIRST QUARTER:** In Game 6, the Cavs outscored the Warriors 31-11 in the first quarter. Golden State's 11 points (5-22 FG) marked the **fewest ever in a first quarter in post-shot clock NBA Finals history**. The previous Finals first quarter post-shot clock low was 13, twice: by Fort Wayne vs. Syracuse on April 2, 1955 (first year of shot clock, Game Two) and by Milwaukee at Boston, May 3, 1974 (Game Three).
 - **GAME 7 FOURTH QUARTER:** The Cavaliers stifled the Warriors in the fourth quarter of Game 7, outscoring them 18-13 in the final period (**0 points in last 4:39**). Golden State's 13 points were the **fewest for any NBA team during the fourth quarter of a Game 7 of an NBA Finals during the shot-clock era (since 1954-55)**.
- **30-POINT WIN IN FINALS GAME 3:** The Cavs had a 120-90 wire-to-wire victory over the Warriors in Game 3 of the NBA Finals at The Q, which was their 100th consecutive home sellout (regular and postseason). The 30-point win was the **Cavs' largest margin of victory in a Finals game**, and the **3rd time winning by 30 or more points this postseason**. In Game 3, Cleveland set **franchise highs for a Finals game in points (120), field goals made (48) and three-point percentage (.480)**, while tying their marks in three-point field goals (12).

2016 PLAYOFFS RECAP (CONT.)

STRONG AT THE Q:

Cleveland finished 9-1 at home in the 2016 Playoffs, which was their best mark in franchise postseason history. They won their first eight home games of the 2016 Playoffs, which is the longest in franchise postseason history (previously 7 straight home wins from 5/10/08-5/7/09). Going back to the 2015 postseason, the Cavs have won 11 straight games at The Q over Eastern Conference opponents.

- **HOME STATS:** Over their franchise playoff-best 9-1 mark at Quicken Loans Arena during the 2016 Playoffs, the Cavs outscored opponents by an average of 17.9 points (111-93.2) and shot .499 from the field, including a .431 mark from the three-point line. Cleveland also averaged 23.3 assists over that stretch. Defensively at home this postseason, the Cavaliers held their opponents to under 100 points seven times and a combined field goal percentage of .418.

WHAT A START:

Cleveland (16-5) set a franchise playoff record for wins in a postseason (prev. 14 in 2015) and opened the 2016 Playoffs winning its first 10 playoff games, the longest winning streak in franchise postseason history (prev. 8 in 2016 and 2009).

- **FOURTH NBA TEAM EVER:** Cleveland became the 4th team in NBA postseason history to start 10-0 and the first team to do so since the 2012 Spurs (10 straight wins). The Cavs are the first Eastern Conference team to accomplish the feat. (Elias)
- **LUE START:** Cavs Head Coach Tyronn Lue became the first NBA coach to win his first 10 playoff games, passing Pat Riley (nine straight wins in 1982) for the most consecutive playoff wins to begin a coaching career. (ESPN Stats & Info)
- **BEAST OF THE EAST:** The Cavs won 17 straight playoff games against Eastern Conference opponents from 5/10/15 to 5/19/16. That is the longest win streak within a conference playoffs in NBA history. The previous record was the Lakers' 16 straight playoff wins against the West from 2000-2002. (Elias)

GETTING OFFENSIVE:

Cleveland went undefeated at 15-0 when scoring 100 points or more this past postseason. The Cavs opened the 2016 Playoffs with a franchise postseason-record 10 straight games scoring at least 100 points.

- **POINT DIFFERENTIAL:** The Cavs had the 2nd-highest points per game differential in the 2016 Playoffs (8.6).
- **+177:** The Cavs outscored the opponents by 177 points (1,497-1,320) through the first three rounds of the 2016 Playoffs, which tied the 1985 Lakers for the 2nd-biggest margin entering the NBA Finals. The biggest is +180 by the 1987 Lakers.
- **10-0 & 100 PTS:** The Cavs became the 1st team in NBA history to start a postseason 10-0 and score 100 points in each game (previous record was 9-0 record and nine straight games with 100+ points by Lakers in 1982). (Elias)
- **120+:** Cleveland topped 120 points on three occasions in the 2016 Playoffs. They scored 120 points or more in back-to-back games from May 4-6 against Atlanta, which was the first time in franchise playoff history doing so.

WORKING THE GLASS:

The Cavs outrebounded opponents, 43.3 to 38.0 (+5.3), the 3rd-biggest differential among all 16 postseason teams.

- **+20 DIFFERENTIAL:** Cleveland has had at least a 20-rebound advantage on four occasions in the 2016 Playoffs: May 6 at ATL (55-28), May 17 vs. TOR (45-23), May 25 vs. TOR (48-27), June 8 vs. GSW (52-32).
- **BIGGEST REBOUND MARGIN IN TEAM PLAYOFF HISTORY:** Cavs had a +27 (55-28) advantage in rebounding in Game 3 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 6, which was their biggest in a playoff game in franchise history (prev. 23, 46-23, on 5/9/09 at ATL). The last NBA team to have at least a +27 margin on the glass in a playoff game was Washington's +39 edge (62-23) against Indiana on May 13, 2014. (Elias)

KEEP THEM UNDER 100:

The Cavs held opponents to under 100 points in 14 of their 21 games in the 2016 postseason. Their opponents' 96.1 ppg ranked 4th in the playoffs.

- **LATE GAME DEFENSE:** In the fourth quarter of games the Cavs allowed 21.5 points (the lowest in 2016 Playoffs).

LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY IN FRANCHISE PLAYOFF HISTORY:

Cleveland's 38-point win (116-78) over Toronto in Game 5 of the ECF on May 25 was their largest in franchise postseason history (previously 31 point-win over Toronto on May 17, 2016). It was also tied for the 5th-largest margin of victory in Conference Finals history. (ESPN Stats & Info)

FIRST HALF DOMINATION:

The Cavs have had two 30-point halftime leads in postseason franchise history, both coming in the 2016 Playoffs.

- **31-POINT HALFTIME LEAD:** In Game 5 of the ECF against Toronto on May 25, the Cavaliers held a 65-34 (+31) lead at halftime. Cleveland's 31-point lead marked the largest halftime lead in a Conference Finals game in NBA history.
- **36-POINT HALFTIME LEAD:** In Game 2 of the Second Round against Atlanta on May 4, the Cavaliers held a 74-38 (+36) lead over the Hawks through two quarters, tying the second-largest halftime advantage for any team in NBA playoff history. The Pistons were ahead of the Bullets by 40 points at the half in a first-round game in 1987, and the Bucks had a 36-point lead over the 76ers at intermission in a first-round game in 1970. The Cavs also set the franchise playoff record for points in a half that night (prev. 68 points twice). (Elias)

BALL SAFETY:

Cleveland averaged 12.5 turnovers in the 2016 Playoffs and had less than 10 miscues four times.

- **1 TO IN 1ST HALF:** In the Game 1 win over Atlanta on May 2, Cleveland committed one turnover in the first half. The last time the Cavs had only one turnover in a half of a playoff game was in the first half against the Orlando Magic on May 20, 2009 (one turnover in the first half). The Cavs also had just one turnover in the first half in Game 3 of the ECF at Toronto on May 21 this postseason. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **25 ASSISTS & 5 TO IN POSTSEASON:** In the Game 1 win over Detroit on April 17, the Cavaliers dished out 25 assists to only five turnovers. The five turnovers committed by the Wine and Gold tied a franchise playoff low for turnovers in a game. The only other time Cleveland recorded five turnovers in a playoff match was on April 18, 2009, which was also against the Pistons. Prior to the Cavs tallying 25 assists and just five turnovers in the Game 1 win over Detroit on April 17, the last NBA team to have at least 25 assists and no more than five turnovers in a playoff game was the Chicago Bulls on April 19, 2010 (25 assists, 4 turnovers). Cleveland had never done so in the playoffs before Game 1 against the Pistons.
- **25 ASSISTS & 5 TO IN REGULAR SEASON:** Prior to April 17, the last time Cleveland had 25 assists and five or fewer miscues in any game (regular and post) prior to the win over Detroit on April 17 was March 29, 2009 against Dallas (28 assists, 4 turnovers).

2016 PLAYOFFS RECAP (CONT.)

LET IT RAIN:

The Cavaliers made 258 three-pointers last postseason, which were the 2nd-most threes hit in a single playoffs in NBA history (behind only 2016 GSW-306). In the 2016 Playoffs, Cleveland ranked 2nd in both three-point percentage (.406) and three-point makes per game (12.3).

- **12 OR MORE...AND 20 OR MORE:** Cleveland drained 12 or more three-pointers 12 times in the 2016 Playoffs, including in an NBA playoff record eight straight games from April 17-May 8. CLEVELAND ALSO NAILED AT LEAST 20 THREE-POINTERS ON THREE OCCASIONS DURING THE 2016 POSTSEASON, WHICH IS ALSO AN NBA SINGLE PLAYOFF RECORD.
 - **RARE AIR:** Prior to 2016, only three teams had ever made 20 threes in the 2,647 playoff games played since the NBA laid down its first three-point arc in 1979. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **FLYING OVER THE HAWKS:** Cleveland connected on 77 three-pointers in their four-game sweep over Atlanta, averaging 19.3 threes per game. Their 77 triples are the highest for any playoff series that lasted six or fewer games.
 - **FIRST EVER:** The Cavs became the first team in NBA history to make at least 15 three-pointers in four straight games (regular season and playoffs) after doing so in each game of the 2016 Semifinals. (ESPN Stats & Info)
 - **50.7 PERCENT:** The Cavaliers shot .507 (77-152) from beyond the arc against Atlanta, producing the same total of points that would be produced by shooting 76 percent on two-point attempts. The Cavaliers more than doubled the NBA playoff record for the most three-point attempts in a series in which a team made at least half of those attempts; the previous record was held by Utah, which made 39 of 75 three-point tries (.520) in a Semifinals series against the Spurs in 1996 (when the three-point arc was closer to the basket). (Elias)
 - **CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH 20 TRIPLES:** After connecting on 21-39 (.538) shots from beyond the arc in Game 3 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 6, the Cavs became the first team in NBA history to have consecutive games with 20 or more three-pointers (regular and postseason). Their 46 three-pointers in that two-game stretch were also the most threes in a two-game span in league history (regular and postseason). (Elias)
- **NBA RECORD-25 THREE-POINTERS:** In a 123-98 win over Atlanta in Game 2 of the Second Round on May 4, the Cavs connected on 25-45 (.556) shots from the three-point line, setting the NBA record for three-pointers in any game (regular and postseason).
 - **18 TRIPLES IN A HALF:** Cleveland also knocked down 18 three-pointers in the first half in Game 2 against Atlanta, setting the NBA record for threes in any half (regular and postseason). The previous NBA record (regular and postseason) for three-pointers in a half was 15, set by Golden State twice (March 8, 2016 and November 27, 2015). Cleveland's previous playoff record for three-pointers in a half was 11 in the first half of Game 2 vs. Detroit on April 20, 2016.
 - **10 TRIPLES IN A QUARTER:** The Cavs knocked down eight three-pointers in the first quarter in Game 2 against Atlanta, setting the franchise playoff record for threes in a quarter. Cleveland followed that up with 10 three-pointers in the second quarter, setting the NBA postseason record for threes in a quarter. The NBA's previous playoff record for three-pointers in a quarter was nine twice (Atlanta-April 28, 2014 and Orlando-April 20, 2008). The previous franchise playoff record for threes in a quarter was six on six different occasions.
 - **10 CAVS PLAYERS HIT A THREE THAT NIGHT:** The Cavs had 10 players knock down at least one three-pointer in Game 2 against the Hawks, becoming the first team in NBA history with 10 players with a three-pointer in a playoff game. The only team to do that in a regular season game is Atlanta on March 30, 2016. (Elias)
- **PLAYOFF LAUNCH:** The Cavs made 57 three-pointers in their First Round series against Detroit, averaging 14.3 threes per contest. Cleveland shot 20-38 (.526) from the three-point line in their 107-90 win in Game 2 of the First Round on April 20, setting a then franchise playoff record.

ACCURATE SHOOTERS:

The Cavs had six players making at least .380 of their shots from long range this past postseason.

CLEAN SWEEP:

The Cleveland Cavaliers advanced to the Eastern Conference Semifinals after a 4-0 series sweep over the Detroit Pistons and followed that up with a 4-0 sweep over Atlanta to make it to the ECF. **Cleveland has gone on to sweep an opponent each time when leading 3-0 in a series** (2007 First Round vs. WAS, 2009 First Round vs. DET, 2009 Semifinals vs. ATL, 2015 First Round vs. BOS and 2015 Conference Finals vs. ATL, 2016 First Round vs. DET and 2016 Semifinals vs. ATL).

- **12 STRAIGHT PLAYOFF WINS OVER DETROIT:** After their 4-0 First Round sweep over Detroit, the Cavaliers have won 12 straight playoff contests over the Pistons (four straight in 2009 First Round and four straight in the 2007 Conference Finals). **It is tied for the longest winning streak by an NBA team against a single opponent in playoff history.**
- **12 STRAIGHT PLAYOFF WINS OVER ATLANTA:** Cleveland has won 12 straight playoff games against Atlanta, which is tied for the longest streak over an opponent in NBA playoff history. **The Cavs are 12-0 all-time against the Hawks in postseason play, breaking an NBA record.** Previously, only one other team in NBA history had won its first 10 playoff games against a particular opponent: Boston was 10-0 in playoff games against Chicago from 1981 to 1987. (Elias Sports Bureau)

2016 PLAYOFFS RECAP (CONT.)

THREE'S COMPANY:

Kyrie Irving, LeBron James and Kevin Love each poured in at least 20 points in the same game six times in the 2016 Playoffs after having two such instances during the 2015-16 regular season (1/29 vs. DET, 1/30 vs. SAS).

- **DO IT AGAIN:** Irving, James and Love totaled at least 20 points apiece in back-to-back games twice during the 2016 postseason (May 6-8, May 25-27). No other trio had back-to-back games of that kind in the 2016 postseason. The last time a trio achieved that feat in consecutive games of the Conference Finals was in 1982, when the Lakers' Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Bob McAdoo, and Norm Nixon reached 20 points in back-to-back games against the Spurs. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **4 PLAYERS WITH 20-PLUS PTS:** In Game 3 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 6, Channing Frye (27), Kyrie Irving (24), LeBron James (24) and Kevin Love (21) each scored over 20 points. It marked just the second time in franchise playoff history the Cavs had four players score 20 points or more. The only other time was April 26, 1990 at Philadelphia (Brad Daugherty-21, Larry Nance-20, Mark Price-21 and John Williams-23). (Elias Sports Bureau)

POSTSEASON K-LOVE:

Kevin Love had 10 double-doubles (3rd-most in 2016 Playoffs), including five 20-10 games, and averaged 14.7 points and 8.8 rebounds (tied-13th in 2016 Playoffs) in 30.6 minutes. He also ranked 5th in the NBA Playoffs with 46 three-pointers made.

- **EIGHT IN A ROW:** Love notched 8 straight double-doubles from April 17-May 8, setting a franchise playoff record for consecutive double-doubles at any point of a single playoffs. The last NBA player to accomplish the feat in one postseason was Blake Griffin (10 straight in 2015). (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **BIG VS. ATLANTA:** Love posted four double-doubles in four games against the Hawks in the Second Round, averaging 19.0 points, including a .475 (19-40) mark from deep, 13.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists in 32.8 minutes.
 - **8 TRIPLES:** In Game 4 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 8, Love had a game-high 27 points, a game-high 13 rebounds and four assists in 37 minutes. He also shot 8-15 (.533) from deep, which tied the Cavs' playoff record for threes in a game.
- **FORCE AGAINST DETROIT:** Love notched a double-double in each game of the First Round against Detroit and finished the series with averages of 18.8 points and 12.0 rebounds in 35.8 minutes per game. Love was only one of five players this playoffs to notch four double-doubles in the opening round.

THE J.R. WAY:

J.R. Smith made a team-high 65 three-pointers in the 2016 Playoffs, which ranked 3rd in the NBA this past postseason. His 65 triples set a new Cavaliers single postseason record (prev. 51 by Smith during the 2015 Playoffs). He made at least five three-pointers six times this postseason, including two games with seven triples or more.

- **3-POINT RECORD FOR HALF:** In Game 2 of the Second Round against Atlanta, Smith shot 7-13 (.538) from three-point territory for 23 points in 28 minutes. Smith set the Cavs playoff record for three-pointers in a half, after knocking down six shots from deep in the first half (previous record was five, four times).

T-TOP:

In the 2016 Playoffs, Tristan Thompson averaged 9.0 rebounds, including 4.1 offensive rebounds, which ranked 3rd in the 2016 Playoffs. He pulled down at least five offensive boards on eight occasions this past postseason, including a playoff career-high nine offensive rebounds at Atlanta on May 6. During the 2016 NBA Finals, Thompson had three double-doubles and averaged 10.3 points on .636 (28-44) shooting from the field and 10.1 rebounds in 32.3 minutes. His 16 rebounds in Game 6 were the most he's ever had in The Finals and one shy of career Playoff high (17 at Chicago, May 14, 2015; Game Six of East Semis).

KYRIE'S PLAYOFF SHOW:

Kyrie Irving scored at least 20 points in 18 of the 21 playoff games in 2016 and averaged 25.2 points (7th-best in 2016 Playoffs), including a .440 mark from deep, 3.0 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 1.71 steals in 36.8 minutes. He has also topped at least 30 points a team-high six times in the 2016 Playoffs and ranked 4th in the postseason in three-pointers made (51).

- **FINAL RUN:** In the 2016 NBA Finals, Irving averaged 27.1 points, 3.9 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 2.14 steals in 39.0 minutes. He was the 2nd-highest scorer in this year's NBA Finals. He also shot .405 from beyond the arc and .939 (31-33) from the foul line.
 - **2ND PLAYER IN FINALS HISTORY:** After pouring in a playoff career-high 41 points on 17-24 (.708) shooting from the field in Game 5 of the NBA Finals on May 13, Irving became just the 2nd player in NBA Finals history to shoot at least 70% in a 40-point game, joining Wilt Chamberlain, in a Game 6 win over the Knicks in 1970 (45 points, 74%). (
 - **3 STRAIGHT FINALS GAMES WITH 30 POINTS BEFORE AGE 25:** Irving scored 30+ points in three straight Finals games (Games 3-5), joining Rick Barry (1967) and Dwyane Wade (2006) as the only players in the last 50 years to score 30+ points in three straight NBA Finals games before the age of 25. (STATS, Inc.)
- **STAY AT IT:** In the Conference Finals versus Toronto, Irving averaged 24.2 points, 3.3 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 1.8 steals in 35.0 minutes.
- **SECOND ROUND PLAY:** Irving had a solid second round performance against Atlanta, averaging 21.3 points on .484 shooting, including .667 (12-18) from three-point territory, 6.3 assists and 1.3 steals in 34.8 minutes.
- **GETTIN' IT DONE:** Irving led the Cavs in the First Round against Detroit after averaging a team-high 27.5 points (highest in 2016 First Round among all NBA players), a .471 clip from beyond the arc, 2.3 rebounds, 4.8 assists and 1.3 steals in 37.8 minutes. He scored at least 20 points in each of the four games.

2016 PLAYOFFS RECAP (CONT.)

BIG GAME JAMES:

LeBron James averaged a team-high 26.3 points (ranked 5th in 2016 Playoffs) on .525 shooting, 9.5 rebounds (6th in 2016 Playoffs), 7.6 assists (3rd in 2016 Playoffs), 2.33 steals (5th in 2016 Playoffs) and 1.29 blocks (16th in 2016 Playoffs) in 39.1 minutes. He had a 2016 Playoff-high +209 plus/minus and posted a team-best 13 double-doubles, the 3rd time he has reached at least 10 double-doubles in a postseason (2012, 2015).

- **500 POINTS**: James recorded **552 points in the 2016 Playoffs**. It is the 6th postseason he has tallied 500 or more points, second to Michael Jordan (8 postseasons).
- **.500+ FG%**: James shot at least .500 from the field or better 15 times this past postseason.
- **MR. MULTI-STEALS**: James swiped at least two steals in 18 of the 21 playoff games.
- **25 IN A ROW**: James scored at least 20 points in 25 consecutive playoff games from May 20, 2015-June 2, 2016, which was the longest of his playoff career (prev. 24 straight from May 12, 2008-April 25, 2010).
- **BACK IN THE FINALS**: James became the 8th player in NBA history to play in 6 straight NBA Finals (1st in 50 years), joining Bill Russell, Sam Jones, K.C. Jones, Satch Sanders, Tom Heinsohn, Frank Ramsey and Bob Cousy. He is also the 2nd player to play in at least three NBA Finals with two different teams, joining Dennis Rodman (Pistons and Bulls).
 - **2016 NBA FINALS MVP**: LeBron James won his 3rd Finals MVP after averaging 29.7 points (208), 11.3 rebounds (79), 8.9 assists (62), 2.57 steals (18) and 2.29 blocks (16). He is the **first player in NBA history to lead all players in all five categories for an entire playoff series**.
 - **3 FINALS MVPS**: LeBron James became the 5th player to win three Finals MVPs; the others are Michael Jordan, Shaquille O'Neal, Tim Duncan and Magic Johnson.
 - **FINALS MVPS WITH DIFFERENT TEAMS**: LeBron James joined Kareem Abdul-Jabbar as the only players in NBA history to win Finals MVP with multiple teams.
 - **3 FINALS MVPS & 4 REG. SEASON MVPS**: LeBron James is the 4th player to win 3 Finals MVPs and 4 regular season MVPs joining Michael Jordan, Bill Russell and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar.
 - **DOMINANCE IN 7 GAMES**: James's 29.7 points-per-game average in this year's Finals is the highest by a player on the winning team in any seven-game Finals series in NBA history. The seven players who averaged 30 points per game in a seven-game Finals series all played on the losing team: Bob Pettit with the St. Louis Hawks in 1957, Elgin Baylor and Jerry West with the Lakers in 1962, West again in 1966, 1969 and 1970, and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar with the Bucks in 1974. The previous record for the highest scoring average by a player on the winning team in a seven-game Finals series was 28.6 PPG by Kobe Bryant against the Celtics in 2010.
 - **TRIPLE-DOUBLE IN GAME 7**: After tallying 27 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists in Game 7, James became the 3rd player to have a triple-double in Game 7 of the NBA Finals (James Worthy 1988, Jerry West 1969). James' seven career triple-doubles in NBA Finals competition only trails Magic Johnson (8) for the most all-time.
 - **GAMES 5 & 6**: James' points, rebounds, and assists over the last two games of the Finals: 82, 24, and 18. It's the 3rd time in NBA Finals history that a player had at least 80 points, 20 rebounds, and 15 assists over a two-game span, joining Michael Jordan in Games 2 and 3 of the 1993 Finals against the Suns (86 points, 21 rebounds, and 15 assists) and James last year in Games 1 and 2 (83, 24, and 17). (Elias Sports Bureau)
 - **40-15-5**: In Game 5 of the NBA Finals, James had 41 points on 16-30 (.533) shooting, including 4-8 (.500) from deep, a game-high 16 rebounds, seven assists, three steals and three blocks in 43 minutes. He joined Shaquille O'Neal (2001), Magic Johnson (1980) and Cliff Hagan (1961) as the only players in NBA history to score at least 40 points, grab 15 rebounds and dish out at least five assists in a Finals game. (Elias Sports Bureau)
 - **BACK-TO-BACK 40-POINT GAMES IN FINALS**: In Game 6 of the NBA Finals on June 16, James tallied 41 points on 16-27 (.593) shooting, eight rebounds, 11 assists, four steals and three blocks in 43 minutes. It was his 17th 40-point night of his postseason career (5th in a Finals contest). It was also his second straight 40-point contest, the second time he has recorded back-to-back 40+ scoring games in the Playoffs (first time was 41-44 points for Cavs vs. Orlando in Games 3 and 4 of 2009 Eastern Conference Finals (May 24-26, 2009).
 - **5TH PLAYER EVER**: James is just the 5th player with at least 40 points in consecutive NBA Finals games (Games 5-6), joining Jerry West (1965 and 1969 Lakers), Rick Barry (1967 Warriors), Michael Jordan (1993 Bulls, doing so in four straight games), and Shaquille O'Neal (2000 Lakers).
 - **TIES SHAQ**: James has five NBA Finals games with at least 40 points in his career, tied with Shaquille O'Neal for the third-highest total behind Jerry West (10) and Michael Jordan (six).
 - **UNDER PRESSURE**: James is the second player with multiple 40-point games in the NBA Finals with his team facing elimination (over the course of an entire career, not just in one postseason), joining Elgin Baylor. Baylor did so three times, all against the Celtics: Game 7 in 1961 (41 points), Game 5 in 1963 (43), and Game 5 in 1966 (41). (Elias Sports Bureau)
 - **FROM DEEP IN THE FINALS**: After connecting on two three-pointers in Game 1 of the NBA Finals at Golden State on June 2, James became the all-time NBA Finals leader in threes (57), one more than Robert Horry and Ray Allen. He currently has 68 triples for his NBA Finals career.
 - **30-10-5 IN THE FINALS**: James has 8 career games with at least 30 points, 10 rebounds and five assists in The Finals (two in 2016 Finals); the most all-time.
 - **MOST 20-PT GAMES**: James now has the most 20-point games in NBA postseason history (176), passing Michael Jordan (173) in Game 5 of the NBA Finals.
- **ROAD WARRIOR**: After the Game 6 win at Toronto on May 27, James won a road game for the 25th straight series, breaking a tie with Michael Jordan (24) for longest streak in NBA history. The Cavs' Game 5 road win in the 2016 NBA Finals was his 26th straight series winning at least one game on the road. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **TAKING DOWN TORONTO**: In the ECF against the Raptors, James averaged 26.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 6.7 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.0 block in 36.5 minutes. His .622 (61-98) shooting percentage was just shy of breaking his highest field goal percentage in a playoff series (.627 in 2013 First Round). (Elias)
 - **MOST 20-PT TRIP-DUBS**: James now has the most 20-point triple-doubles in league postseason history with 14, passing Magic Johnson (12) on May 19 against Toronto.
- **EFFICIENT NIGHT AND FIRST CAV TO 100**: In his franchise-high 100th playoff game wearing the Wine and Gold jersey on May 17, which was Game 1 of the ECF against Toronto, James shot 11-13 (.846) from the field for 24 points in 28 minutes. In the first half, James shot a perfect 7-7 (1.000) from the floor, marking the first time in his postseason career he shot perfect from the field in any half. His .846 mark for the game was the highest field-goal percentage in a playoff game for James and the 3rd-highest for any Cavaliers player in a playoff game in which he took at least 10 shots from the field. Larry Nance went 11-for-12 in Game 3 versus Chicago in 1993; and Drew Gooden shot 11-for-12 from the field in Game 2 versus Washington in 2006. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- **FIRST TWO ROUNDS**: James had a solid First Round series against Detroit, posting three double-doubles and averaging 22.8 points, 9.0 rebounds, a team-high 6.8 assists and 1.8 steals in 41.2 minutes. Against the Hawks in the Second Round, he averaged 24.3 points on .507 shooting, including .421 (8-19) from deep, 8.5 rebounds, 7.8 assists and 3.0 steals in 36.5 minutes per game.
 - **BUILDING BLOCKS**: With his lone block in Game 4 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 8, James surpassed Larry Nance (93) for the most blocks in franchise playoff history.

LeBron James closed out the 2016 Playoffs ranking among all-time postseason leaders in triple-doubles (16, 2nd), free throws made (1,355, 2nd), assists (1,348, 3rd), scoring average (28.0, 5th, min. 5 games), points (5,572, 4th), field goals made (1,965, 6th), steals (354, 4th), three-pointers made (287, 5th) and rebounds (1,758, 9th). In Game 1 of the NBA Finals on June 2, James became the **ONLY** player to rank in the Top 10 in points, rebounds and assists in **playoff history** after grabbing five boards to move past Larry Bird (1,683) for 10th place in rebounds.

The Cleveland Cavaliers Basketball Communications Team welcomes you to the 2017 NBA Playoffs. It is our goal to provide a professional and productive working environment. To assist in your coverage of the Cavaliers, please note the following:

CREDENTIALS: You must have a Cavaliers credential (season or single-game) to be admitted to Quicken Loans Arena, and your credential must be visibly worn at all times. Credentials should be requested through the Cavaliers Basketball Communications Team.

If you have already received a **season credential** from us, it will be honored for the first three rounds of the 2017 NBA Playoffs. Please remember that your credential must be clearly displayed at all times upon entry of Quicken Loans Arena.

Single-game credentials must be requested to Cherome Owens and Alyssa Dombrowski via e-mail at cowens@cavs.com and adombrowski@cavs.com for each game NO LATER than 5:00 p.m. the day before a game (5:00 p.m. on Friday for weekend and Monday games). Due to the volume of requests, this policy will be more strictly enforced than during the regular season.

Your credential does not guarantee a seat. Season and single-game credentials are non-transferable and any unauthorized use will subject the bearer to ejection from Quicken Loans Arena and the forfeiture of the credential. No autographs are allowed during media access periods.

MEDIA ENTRANCE: All members of the media must enter Quicken Loans Arena through the media entrance, which is located on the east side of the arena (across from Gateway East Garage) and opens three hours prior to game time. A photo ID is required to obtain your single-game credential.

If you are coming out of the Gateway East parking garage, crossing East 6th Street, you will see the Cavaliers Team Shop and main box office entrance. The media gate is located just to the left (south) of the Team Shop. Several available options for parking are in close proximity to The Q.

MEDIA WORKROOMS: During the playoffs, there will be two separate media workrooms in addition to a work area for photographers. All print media members who regularly cover the team should use their existing workspace located on the event level. The media workroom for additional media members is located in the press conference area on event level. The photography work room is also positioned on the event level near the press conference area.

Media workspace will open three hours before game time and remain open until the last member of the media is finished working. In order to provide the proper working environment, friends, relatives or guests of the media will not be permitted access to the media workrooms.

SERVICES: A pregame meal will be available to working media at the cost of \$10.00. Meals will be available starting two and a half hours prior to tipoff and will be located in the Full Court Room on Level 2 of the arena.

SEATING: Working media seats are located in Section C126, the Section 128 platform, Section 130 and Section 101 (additional locations may be added for later rounds). All locations are equipped with electrical power. These seats are assigned and members of the media should sit in their respective assigned seats for the game. While our team attempts to provide seating for members of the media generally in the same area for each game, seats may be moved for a specific game based on availability and other factors.

All full season and single-game credentialed media members must e-mail Cherome Owens at cowens@cavs.com and Alyssa Dombrowski at adombrowski@cavs.com for each game NO LATER than 5:00 p.m. the day before a game (5:00 p.m. on Friday for weekend and Monday games) to request a seat in the media seating areas. All seats will be on a reserved basis.

Media members who are not granted a seat will be able to watch the game on the TVs in the media room locations on Level 1.

TV AND RADIO: Visiting television broadcast positions will be courtside, adjacent to the visitors' bench. Radio broadcast positions will be in the "Joe Tait Perch" (radio booth) in Section C126. If statisticians are desired, please make arrangements with the Cavaliers Basketball Communications Team at least 24 hours before game time. All requests for pregame or postgame interviews should be directed to the Cavaliers Basketball Communications Team.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: For media utilizing photography, if you are granted a photo lane for a playoff game, you are required to wear one of the photo vests provided by the Cavaliers Basketball Communications team.

Per NBA league-wide regulations, very limited space is available at each end of the court for photographers and will be specifically assigned by the NBA and the Cavaliers Basketball Communications team. In some instances, outlets that had a floor spot during the regular season will either be moved to the concourse level or need to share a spot with other outlets. Photographers are asked to keep off of the side courts and to be considerate of the ticket holders seated directly behind them.

Also, photographers are asked to wear rubber-soled shoes to protect the basketball floor and must have rubber lens shades for their cameras.

Additional photographer spots will be assigned as needed in designated areas of Sections 128 and 106.

PLAYER/COACH AVAILABILITY: Practices/Shootarounds: In general, the final 30 minutes of practice are open to the media with interviews afterward. To confirm practice/shootaround times, please contact the Basketball Communications Team at (216) 420-2350 or cmr@cavs.com. Typically, shootarounds will be held at Cleveland Clinic Courts for the Cavaliers and Quicken Loans Arena for visiting teams.

Pregame: In accordance with NBA policy, the Cavaliers' and visitors' locker rooms will be open to members of the media 75 minutes before each game for a 30-minute period. The Cavaliers' locker room is located at the northeast corner of Quicken Loans Arena, while the visitors' locker room is located on the east side of Quicken Loans Arena.

Postgame: Locker rooms will be open approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of each game. Cavaliers Head Coach Tyronn Lue will do his postgame interviews in the press conference area. In addition, at least one player from each team will be available in the press conference area.

CELL PHONE USE IN LOCKER ROOMS: Per NBA policy, media members are not permitted to place cell phone calls in the locker room. Still photography on cell phones is strictly prohibited within the locker room.

PARKING: Complimentary media parking is very limited and playoff parking passes will be assigned. For those media members who receive parking privileges, the media parking area will be located in the Gateway East garage. Due to space limitation, if you had complimentary media parking during the 2016-17 regular season, it does not guarantee parking in the postseason.

**** Attention television stations: If you park on the Gateway Plaza between The Q and Progressive Field without the proper parking permit, your vehicle could be towed. ****

TRANSPORTATION: There is public transportation via Rapid Transit Authority (RTA) to Quicken Loans Arena, with bus service to the arena, as well as RTA service (from Cleveland Hopkins Airport) to Tower City. There is a covered, underground walkway from Tower City to Quicken Loans Arena.


To Section C126: Access to this section is off the **fourth floor** of the arena. Head down the stairs in the vomitory marked C125/C126 and the seating area is in the first three rows of the section on the right.

To Section 128: Access to this section is off the **third floor** of the arena by entering the section 128/130 vomitory. The media section will be on your left. It is also accessible by taking the stairs up section 128 (off the floor) and then entering the section 128/130 vomitory on the **third floor**.

To Section 130: Access to this section is off the **third floor** of the arena by entering the section 128/130 vomitory. The media section will be in the top half of the section on the right. It is also accessible by taking the stairs up section 128 (off the event floor) and then entering the section 128/130 vomitory on the **third floor**.

To Section 101: Access to this section is off the **third floor** of the arena by entering the section 100/101 vomitory. The media section will be in the top half of the section on your right. It is also accessible by taking the stairs up section 128 (off the event floor) and then entering the section 100/101 vomitory on the **third floor**.

One of the three elevators located on the **third** and **fourth** floors on the east side of The Q will be reserved for media. The elevators will be reserved for working media from two minutes before and after halftime and two minutes before and after the end of the game. Please show your credential to gain access to the elevator.


