COACHING STAFF



MILES SIMON HEAD COACH

Returning for his second season on Luke Walton's staff, Miles Simon will lead the charge for this year's summer league campaigns in both Sacramento and Las Vegas. Simon was a member of the staff that took home the 2017 Las Vegas Summer League title and spent last season as an assistant coach on the Lakers bench.

During his first season on the staff, Simon played an important role in the development of the young Lakers, including all-rookie selections Lonzo Ball and Kyle Kuzma. At the conclusion of the season, Simon took the reins of the team's pre-draft workout process, while continuing his development work with current Lakers players.

Simon first joined the Lakers staff after serving as head coach of the 2017 USA Junior National Select Team for the Nike Hoops Summit, leading the USA to a victory over the World Select Team. Simon won gold medals as an assistant for the 2016 USA Men's U17 World Championship Team, as well as the 2015 USA Men's U16 National Team.

In addition to his work with USA Basketball, Simon spent nine NBA off-seasons from 2008-16 working in a player development role with some of the league's top talent and has served as the Director of the Nike Basketball Academy since 2015. Simon has also worked in broadcasting, serving as a college basketball analyst for ESPN.

The Arizona alumnus was the 1997 NCAA Tournament Most Outstanding Player after leading the Wildcats to a National Championship as a junior. Upon graduation, Simon played one season for the Orlando Magic (1998-99), before spending time overseas and in the Continental Basketball Association. At the conclusion of his playing career, Simon spent three seasons (2005-08) as an assistant coach at Arizona on Lute Olson's staff.

Simon and his wife Kristy reside in North Tustin with their three children: Kiana (17), Sasha (seven) and Cameron (five).



MARK MADSEN

ASSISTANT COACH

A two-time NBA Champion as a player with the Lakers (2001 and 2002), fan favorite Mark Madsen has spent the last five seasons in a coaching capacity with Los Angeles and has been a member of each of the last three summer league staffs.

Selected 29th overall by the Lakers in the 2000 NBA Draft, Madsen played three seasons in L.A. and was a member of back-to-back championship teams in his first two seasons. He then signed with Minnesota as a free agent prior to the 2003-04 campaign and played six seasons with the Wolves. In 453 games (70 starts) over nine seasons, he averaged 2.2 points, 2.6 rebounds and 11.8 minutes per game.

Following his playing career, Madsen served as an assistant coach during the 2009-10 season with the Utah Flash of the NBA G League before returning to his alma mater, Stanford University, where he earned his MBA from the Stanford Graduate School of Business in 2012. That same year, he was named an assistant coach on Stanford Head Coach Johnny Dawkins's staff and spent the 2012-13 season working in recruiting, opponent game planning and player skill development.

A native of Danville, CA, Madsen, 42, earned his undergraduate degree in economics in 2000. He attended San Ramon Valley High School and served a two-year Mormon mission in Spain following his graduation from high school.

He and wife Hanna have one son, William, who was born in December 2017.



CLAY MOSER

ASSISTANT COACH

Clay Moser is the longest-tenured member of the summer league staff, having spent seven seasons with the Lakers. For the last two years, Moser has served as Assistant Coach/Director of Basketball Strategy after four seasons as the team's Head Advance Scout.

Moser has more than 30 years of professional basketball management and coaching experience, spending time in a plethora of leagues, including the NBA, NBA G League, CBA, NCAA, NJCAA and USBL, along with various summer pro leagues.

The University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse graduate got his start at NC State under the legendary Jim Valvano, before joining the Sioux Falls Skyforce of the CBA. Moser would then go on to work for the Idaho Stampede, Reno Bighorns, Rio Grande Valley Vipers, Golden State Warriors, New Orleans Hornets, San Antonio Spurs, Orlando Magic, Cleveland Cavaliers, South Bay Lakers and Los Angeles Lakers.

Spending parts of his offseason in Crosslake, MN, Moser resides in El Segundo with his wife, Angela, and their children: Chandler, Lily and Carter.



COBY KARL ASSISTANT COACH

Coby Karl concluded his second season as head coach of the South Bay Lakers in 2017-18. Among his latest accolades, Karl advanced his team to the Western Conference Finals, earned G League Coach of the Month after guiding South Bay to the best start in franchise history, developed three NBA Gatorade Call-Ups and helped L.A. Lakers center Thomas Bryant earn All-NBA G League First Team honors.

In his first season, he helped guide the Lakers to their first Pacific Division title with a record of 34-16, second best in team history, and was named head coach of the Western Conference All Star Team. He guided the Lakers to a 24-6 start to the year, which is tied for the best 30-game start to a season in G League history.

Karl began his coaching career as an assistant with the G League's Westchester Knicks in 2015-16, helping the team to improve their record by 18 wins from a season prior en route to their first playoff berth in franchise history.

A former player for the South Bay organization, Karl appeared in 17 games for the team during the 2007-08 season while on assignment from the Lakers. On February 19, 2008, he became the second player in league history to play in an NBAGL and NBA game in the same day. As a player, Karl saw action with the Lakers, Cleveland Cavaliers and Golden State Warriors of the NBA, while also playing internationally in Spain, Italy and Germany.

A native of Great Falls, MT, and son of NBA veteran coach George Karl, the younger Karl attended Homestead High School in Mequon, WI, before graduating from Boise State University with a B.A. in communications. He earned First Team All-WAC honors in 2007 after averaging 14.8 points and 4.0 assists during his senior season.



BRIAN WALSH ASSISTANT COACH

Brian Walsh concluded his third season as an assistant coach with the South Bay Lakers in 2017-18, where he continues to play an integral role in the game-planning, opponent breakdown and scouting duties of one of the league's most successful franchises. He has been with the team since 2015-16, when the then-Los Angeles D-Fenders finished one win away from the NBA G League Championship.

A teacher of the game at virtually every level, Walsh's coaching experiences have taken him all over the world, from a variety of domestic stops to countries such as Venezuela, Belarus, China and Vietnam.

His notable coaching experiences have included a stay as head coach of the Al Ahli Professional Sports Club in 2009-10, where he won the SBL U19 Championship while reaching the semi-finals of the Arab Nations Cup. Walsh also spent the 2007-08 season as associate head coach for the G League's Rio Grande Valley Vipers and closed out the season as interim head coach, ultimately leading the Vipers to a 4-0 record to conclude the season, a mark that gives Walsh the highest winning percentage of any coach in G League history. In 2006, he got his first head coaching experience with Gambusinos De Fresnillo (Mexico) before taking the reins of the Nebraska Cranes of the United States Basketball League, where he won the USBL championship. He has also held coaching positions with the International Basketball League's New Mexico Slam, the G League's Dakota Wizards and Colorado 14ers, Baylor University and Albuquerque High School.



WILL SCOTT

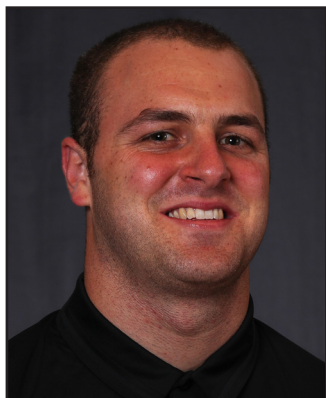
ASSISTANT COACH

Will Scott returns for his third season as the team's head video coordinator, after assisting the Lakers in the video room since the 2011-12 season, while simultaneously working for the South Bay Lakers.

The Los Angeles native manages the video department to ensure coaching and front office staffs are fully supported, while assisting in game preparation and individual player development. Scott was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator with the South Bay Lakers in 2015-16, where his responsibilities grew to include scouting upcoming opponents and individual growth as the team reached the G

League Finals. During the summers of 2014 and 2015, Scott served as the head video coordinator of the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks, where he developed scouting reports on opponents and was intimately involved in daily coaching operations.

A graduate of Indiana University with a B.S. in sports marketing and management, Scott was a student manager for the Indiana men's basketball team from 2009-11, assisting the coaching staff and players with all day-to-day functions of the team.



JONAH HERSCU

ASSISTANT COACH

Jonah Herscu spent the 2017-18 season as assistant video coordinator for the Los Angeles Lakers, focusing on game film preparation, scouting and on-court player development.

Herscu has more than 10 seasons of experience at the professional level, having worked with the NBA, NBA G League and WNBA. Since his start with the Fort Wayne Mad Ants in 2013, Herscu has worked in an assistant coaching or video coordinating role for the Mad Ants, Chicago Sky, Chicago Bulls and Los Angeles Lakers.

The Amherst, MA native graduated from Lake Forest College with a degree in Coaching: Personal Identity, Sports Psychology and Leadership. Herscu earned his Master's Degree in Sports Science, with a focus on coaching, in 2016 from the United States Sports Academy and resides in Redondo Beach.
